## Before Using the TV/VCR 5

### Putting Batteries in the Remote Control

1

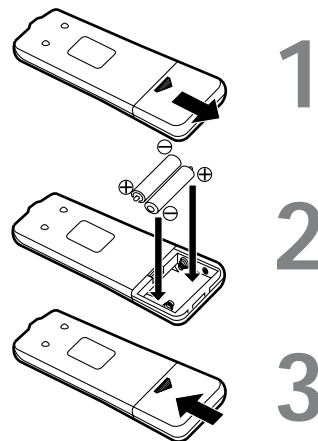
Remove the battery compartment lid on the bottom of the remote control by sliding it in the direction of the arrow.

2

Place two AA batteries inside the battery compartment with their + and - ends aligned as indicated.

3

Replace the battery compartment lid.



### Using the Remote Control

- Point the remote control at the TV/VCR's remote sensor.
- Do not put objects between the remote control and the TV/VCR.

### Erase Prevention

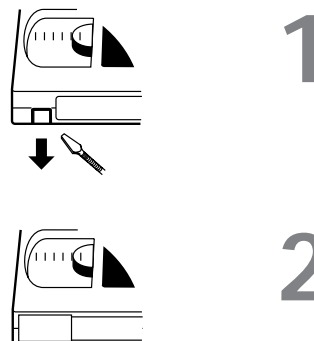
Video cassette tapes have record tabs to ensure that recordings are not accidentally erased.

1

To prevent accidental erasure, break off the tab with a screwdriver.

To record again, cover the hole with cellophane tape.

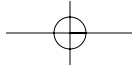


### TV/VCR Maintenance

- In this TV/VCR, use only tapes with the **VHS** mark.
- Make sure any light adhesive stick-on notes are removed from the video cassette tape before putting the tape in the TV/VCR. Removable labels like these can jam the TV/VCR.
- Periodic maintenance is required to maintain your TV/VCR's excellent performance. This TV/VCR has an automatic head cleaning system. However, the video heads will eventually require cleaning or replacement. Cleaning or replacement of the video heads should be performed by an authorized service center.

#### Helpful Hints

- The remote control and its batteries are supplied.
- Do not mix alkaline and manganese batteries.
- Do not mix old and new batteries.

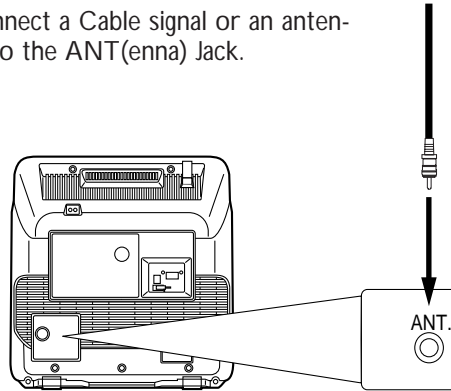

Hook up your TV/VCR using one of the connections shown.

#### A.

##### Hooking Up Your TV/VCR With a Cable Signal or Outdoor Antenna

Connect a Cable signal or an antenna to the ANT(enna) Jack.



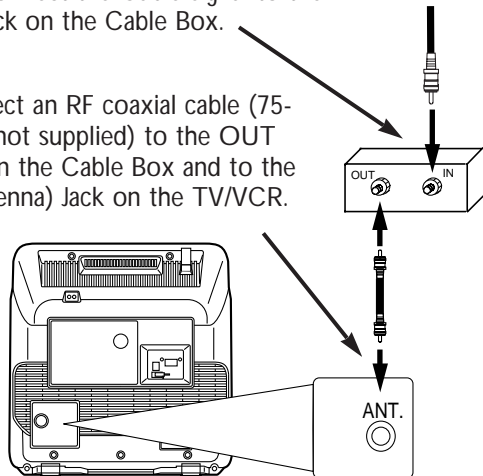
#### B.

##### Hooking Up Your TV/VCR With a Cable Box

To view any channel, set the TV/VCR to the Cable Box output channel (channel 03 or 04). Then, select channels at the Cable Box.

Connect the Cable signal to the IN Jack on the Cable Box.

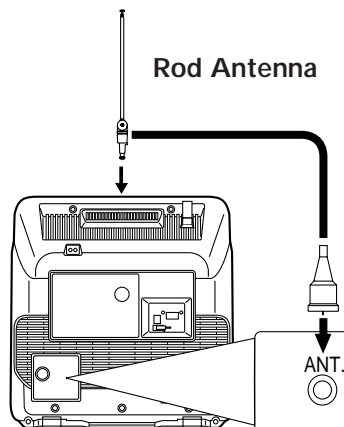
Connect an RF coaxial cable (75-ohm, not supplied) to the OUT Jack on the Cable Box and to the ANT(enna) Jack on the TV/VCR.

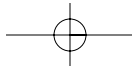


#### C.

##### Hooking Up Your TV/VCR With an Indoor Antenna

To install a rod antenna (supplied), push the stem of the antenna into the antenna hole on the top of the TV/VCR. Connect the antenna wire to the ANT(enna) Jack on the back of the TV/VCR as shown. Extend the antenna and adjust its length, direction, and angle for the clearest picture.

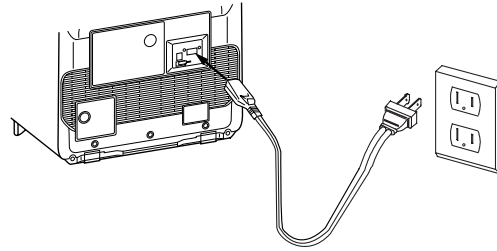




## Hooking Up the TV/VCR (cont'd) 7

Connect the AC cord to the AC 120V jack on the back of the TV/VCR. Plug the AC cord into an AC power outlet.

Before you turn on the TV/VCR, go to page eight.

### Mobile Connections

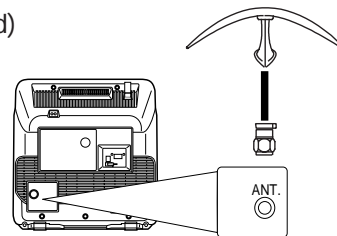
Usually, the supplied indoor rod antenna provides adequate reception. But when you want to watch TV outdoors or in a vehicle, use a mobile antenna (not supplied) or an indoor dipole antenna (not supplied) and a car battery cord (supplied) to get good reception.

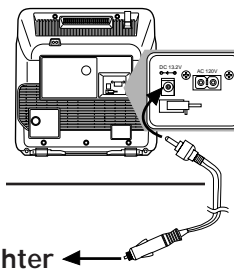

#### Car Battery Cord Hookup

Make sure your vehicle has a 13.2-volt, negative ground electrical system. Connect one end of the car battery cord to the DC 13.2V jack on the back of the TV/VCR. Then connect the other end of the car battery cord to the cigarette lighter in your vehicle.

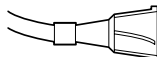

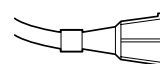
### Helpful Hints

- Do not watch TV while driving.
- Use only the supplied car battery cord. Using another cord could damage the TV/VCR.
- Make sure the cigarette lighter jack is free of ashes and other debris.
- Make sure you push the car battery cord's plug completely into the cigarette lighter.
- Always unplug the car battery cord from the cigarette lighter before you unplug it from the TV/VCR.
- You must disconnect the car battery cord from the TV/VCR before you can use standard electrical (AC) power.
- If you use the TV/VCR with the vehicle's engine off, recharge the vehicle's battery every four hours. Unplug the car battery cord from the cigarette lighter when you finish using the TV/VCR.
- When you use the TV/VCR with a car battery cord, noise may appear on the TV/VCR screen.
- Please do not use this TV/VCR in high temperature conditions.
- Before connecting an antenna or coaxial cable to the ANT(enna) Jack, make sure the pin is not bent. If the pin is bent, straighten it as illustrated, then connect it to the ANT(enna) Jack.

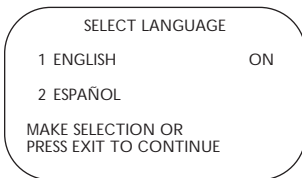


## 8 Turning On the TV/VCR

Before you turn on the TV/VCR, make sure there are batteries in the remote control and the TV/VCR is hooked up correctly. The instructions on this page work only when you turn on the TV/VCR for the first time.

# 1

Press the **POWER** button. The TV/VCR will come on and the screen shown below will appear.

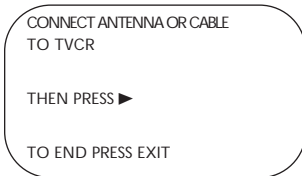


# 2

Press the **Number 1** button to select English on-screen displays or press the **Number 2** button to select Spanish on-screen displays.

# 3

Press the **STATUS/EXIT** button. The screen shown below will appear.

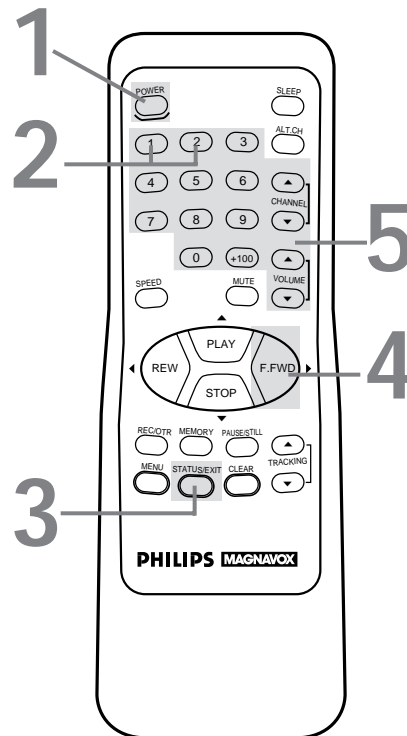


# 4

Press the **F.FWD/►** button to begin automatic channel setup. The TV/VCR will memorize all available channels. When channels are set, CHANNELS ARE SET will appear on-screen briefly. Then the TV/VCR will go to the lowest channel programmed.

# 5

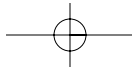
Use the **CHANNEL ▲/▼** buttons or the **Number** buttons on the remote control to select a TV/VCR channel. Use the **VOLUME ▲/▼** buttons to adjust the sound.



### Helpful Hints

- If you do not see any on-screen displays when you turn on the TV/VCR, check your hookups, then try again. If you still do not see any on-screen displays, follow the steps on pages nine - 10 to select a language and set up channels.
- To skip step 2, press the STATUS/EXIT button. All on-screen displays will be in English. To skip step 4, press the STATUS/EXIT button. Channels will not be set up, and CHANNELS NOT SET will appear on-screen briefly.
- You cannot set up channels if you are using a Cable Box.
- Line Input mode will always be stored in the TV/VCR's memory as channel 00. When you select channel 00, A/V IN will appear on-screen briefly. Press the CHANNEL ▲/▼ buttons or Number buttons to select another channel.



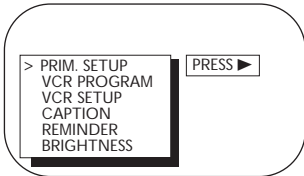


## Language Selection 9

Follow the steps below to change the language of the on-screen displays.

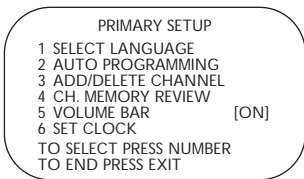

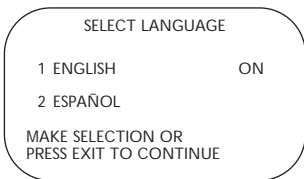

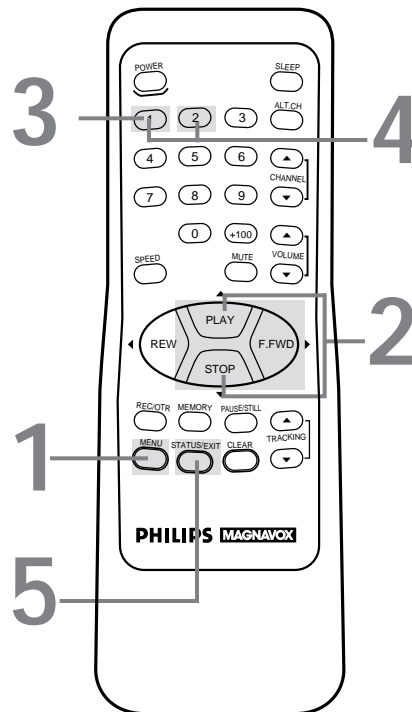

Press the Number 1 button if you want the on-screen displays in English. ON will appear to the right of ENGLISH on-screen. Or, press the Number 2 button if you want the on-screen displays in Spanish. SI will appear to the right of ESPAÑOL on-screen.

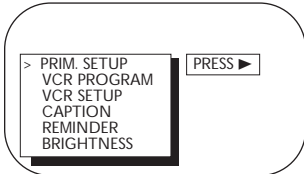
- If you accidentally select Spanish on-screen displays and need English on-screen displays:
  - 1) Press the MENU button.
  - 2) Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select PREPARACION, then press the F.FWD/▶ button.
  - 3) Press the Number1 button to select SELECCION IDIOMA.
  - 4) Press the Number1 button to select ENGLISH.
  - 5) Press the STATUS/EXIT button.

# 10 Automatic Channel Setup

Although the TV/VCR may automatically memorize the channels you receive when you turn it on for the first time, you may set up channels again by following the steps below.

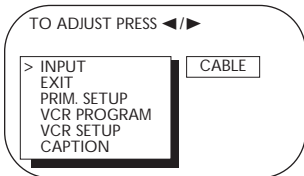

Press the MENU button.



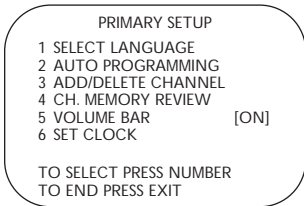

Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select INPUT. Press the REW(ind)/◀ button or the F.FWD/▶ button until ANTENNA or CABLE (whichever you have) appears beside INPUT.



**3**

Press the STOP/▼ button repeatedly to select PRIM. SETUP, then press the F.FWD/▶ button.



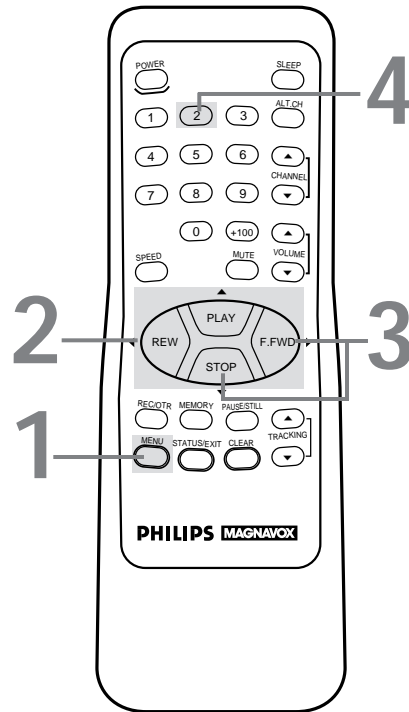
**4**

Press the Number 2 button to select AUTO PROGRAMMING. AUTO PROGRAMMING MEMORIZED CH... will appear on-screen. The TV/VCR will memorize all available channels.

**5**

Wait for a few minutes. When setup is complete, CHANNELS ARE SET will appear on-screen. Then the programming of the lowest channel number placed in the TV/VCR's memory will appear on-screen. Now, when you press the CHANNEL ▲/▼ buttons, you will scan only through channels you receive.

**5** Wait for the TV/VCR to set up channels.



### Helpful Hints

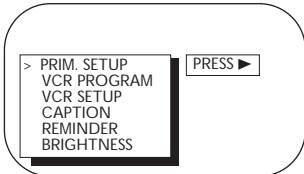
- Line Input mode will always be stored in the TV/VCR's memory as channel 00. You cannot delete it. To exit line input mode, press the CHANNEL ▲/▼ buttons or the Number buttons to select another channel.
- You cannot program channels when the TV/VCR is on channel 00 (A/V INPUT will appear beside INPUT at step 2). Select ANTENNA or CABLE at step 2.

## Automatic Channel Setup (cont'd) 11

### Adding/Deleting Channels

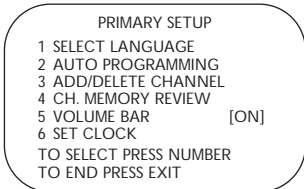

Press the MENU button.



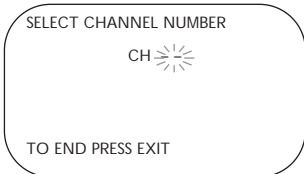

Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select PRIM. SETUP, then press the F.FWD/▶ button.



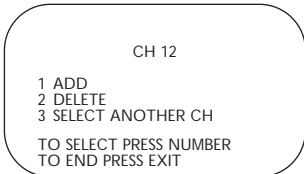

Press the Number 3 button to select ADD/DELETE CHANNEL.

Press the Number buttons to enter the channel number you want to add or delete. You must enter a zero before single-digit channels.



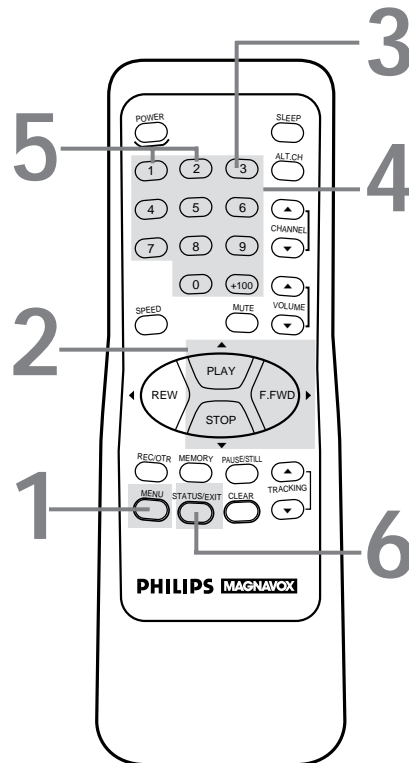

Within five seconds, press the Number 1 button to add that channel or the Number 2 button to delete that channel. If you do not make a choice within five seconds, you will return to the previous screen. (If you make a mistake, press the Number 3 button to select another channel.)

# 6

Press the STATUS/EXIT button.

Programming of the channel you added or deleted will appear.



### Helpful Hint

- To review the channels memorized by the TV/VCR, follow these steps.
  - 1) Press the MENU button.
  - 2) Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select PRIM. SETUP. Press the F.FWD/▶ button.
  - 3) Press the Number 4 button to select CH. MEMORY REVIEW. A list of programmed channels will appear on-screen.
  - 4) If all the programmed channels don't fit on-screen, press the Number 1 button. If you do not press the Number 1 button within 10 seconds, the remaining channels will appear on-screen. (If there are no remaining channels, the previous menu will appear.) Or press the Number 2 button to see the previous screen of channels.
  - 5) Press the STATUS/EXIT button.

## 12 Setting the Clock

There are three ways to set the clock: Manually, with Automatic PBS Channel Selection, or with Manual PBS Channel Selection. With manual clock setting, you tell the TV/VCR the current time. With Automatic or Manual PBS Channel Selection, the TV/VCR gets the time from your local PBS station. If you use either Manual PBS Channel Selection or Automatic PBS Channel Selection, follow the steps on page 19 to have the TV/VCR maintain the clock according to your Time Zone.

To set the clock manually, follow the steps on pages 12 -13. To set the clock using Automatic PBS Channel Selection, follow the steps on pages 14 - 15. To set the clock using Manual PBS Channel Selection, follow the steps on pages 16 - 17.

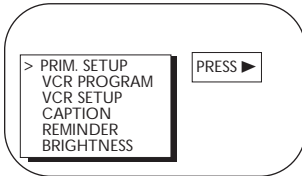
Before you begin, make sure:

- The TV/VCR is hooked up and turned on.
- Channels are set up.
- You make each entry within 60 seconds of the previous entry. (If you do not, you may start again at step 1.)

- To make corrections while you are setting the clock, press the CLEAR button until the space for the number you want to correct is flashing. Then enter the correct number.

If this message appears, turn off the TV/VCR for a few minutes. When you turn on the TV/VCR, the time will be set. If the time is not set, repeat steps 1 - 5. Or, follow the steps on pages 12 - 13 to set the clock manually or pages 16 - 17 to set the clock with Manual PBS Channel Selection.

When the TV/VCR finds the PBS channel, the time will appear on-screen. Press the STATUS/EXIT button.



- If **CANNOT FIND CLOCK DATA** flashes on the TV/VCR screen, you will be prompted to turn off the TV/VCR. Turn off the TV/VCR. Leave it off for several minutes. When you turn on the TV/VCR again, the clock will be set.

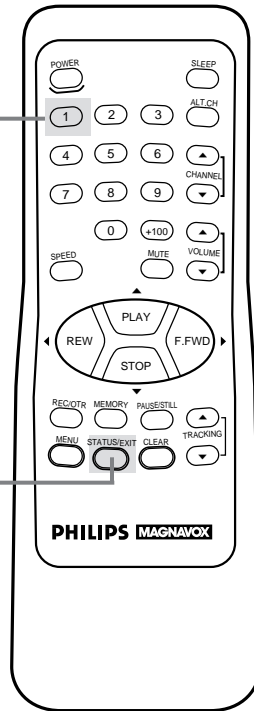

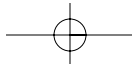

### Helpful Hints

- To display the time, press the STATUS/EXIT button. A status display, which includes the time, will appear on the TV/VCR screen. Details are on page 26.
- You must turn off the TV/VCR for several minutes during automatic clock setting. If the clock is not set when you turn on the TV/VCR, repeat the steps for Automatic PBS Channel Selection. If the clock still is not set, set the clock manually.
- You cannot use the AUTO CLOCK feature if you don't receive a PBS channel that carries a time signal in your area. Set the clock manually.
- Automatic clock setting is not possible with a mobile connection.
- Cable Box users must set the clock manually.

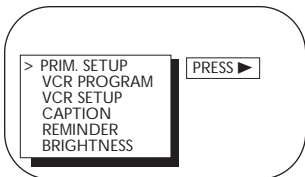

- If **CANNOT FIND CLOCK DATA** flashes on the TV/VCR screen and you do not know another channel, press the Number 2 button to select **SET PBS CH. AUTO.** The TV/VCR will search for the PBS channel automatically.
  - If the PBS channel is found, the time will appear on-screen. Press the STATUS/EXIT button.
  - If the PBS channel is not found, you will be prompted to turn off the TV/VCR. Leave it off for several minutes. When you turn on the TV/VCR again, the time will be set.

Wait for the TV/VCR to find the time.

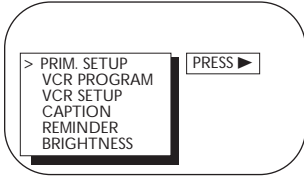
- If you have an Antenna hookup, you may select channels 2 - 69 at step 6. If you have a cable connection, you may select channels 1 - 125 at step 6. Details about available memorized channels are on page 11.
- To display the time, press the STATUS/EXIT button. A status display, which includes the time, will appear on the TV/VCR screen. Details are on page 26.

# 18 Daylight-Saving Time

When the Daylight-Saving Time feature is ON, the TV/VCR clock will automatically move forward one hour on the first Sunday in April and move back one hour on the last Sunday in October. To turn Daylight-Saving Time ON or OFF, follow the steps below.

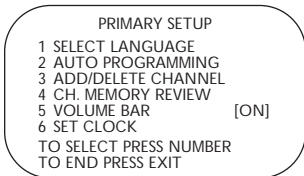

## 20 Front Panel

### Cassette Compartment

Insert a video cassette tape here.

### Remote Sensor

Receives signal from your remote control so you can operate the TV/VCR from a distance.

### REC(ord) Light

Appears during a recording. It flashes when the TV/VCR power is turned off to set a timer recording or when a recording is paused.

### VIDEO Jack

Connect this jack to the video out jack of a camcorder or a VCR. *Details are on page 31.*

### AUDIO Jack

Connect this jack to the audio out jack of a camcorder or a VCR. *Details are on page 31.*

### POWER Button

Press to turn the power on or off.

### STOP/EJECT Button

Press once to stop the tape. When playback is stopped, press to eject the tape. Press to select an item in the pop up menu.

### REW(ind) Button

When tape playback is stopped, press to rewind the tape at high speed. During playback, press to rewind the tape while the picture stays on-screen. Press to change a setting of a pop up menu item (for example, to adjust the BRIGHTNESS setting).

### PLAY Button

Press to play a tape. Also, press to release Search or Still mode and return to normal playback. *Details are on page 46.*

Press to select an item in the pop up menu.

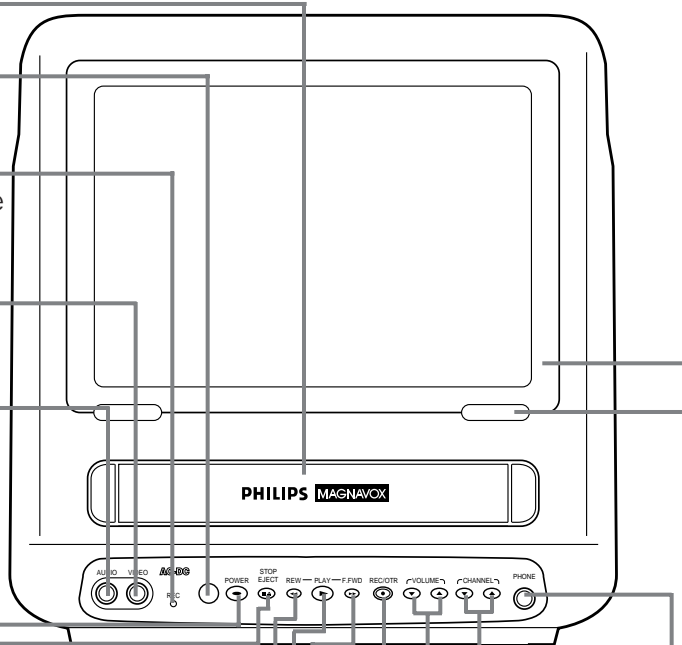
### F.FWD Button

When tape playback is stopped, press to fast forward the tape at high speed. During playback, press to fast forward the tape while the picture stays on-screen. Press to change a setting of a pop up menu item (for example, to adjust the BRIGHTNESS setting).

### REC(ord)/OTR Button

Press once to start a recording.

*Details are on page 29.* Press repeatedly to start a One-Touch Recording (an immediate timed recording, 30 minutes to eight hours long) of the channel you are watching. *Details are on page 30.*



### CHANNEL ▲/▼ Buttons

Press to scan through the TV/VCR channels. During tape playback, press to adjust the tracking. *Details are on page 45.*

Press the CHANNEL ▲ button and the VOLUME ▼ button on the TV/VCR **at the same time** to display the pop up menu. Press again to remove the menu.

### VOLUME ▲/▼ Buttons

Press to adjust the sound level.

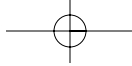
Press the CHANNEL ▲ button and the VOLUME ▼ button on the TV/VCR **at the same time** to display the pop up menu. Press again to remove the menu.

### PHONE Jack

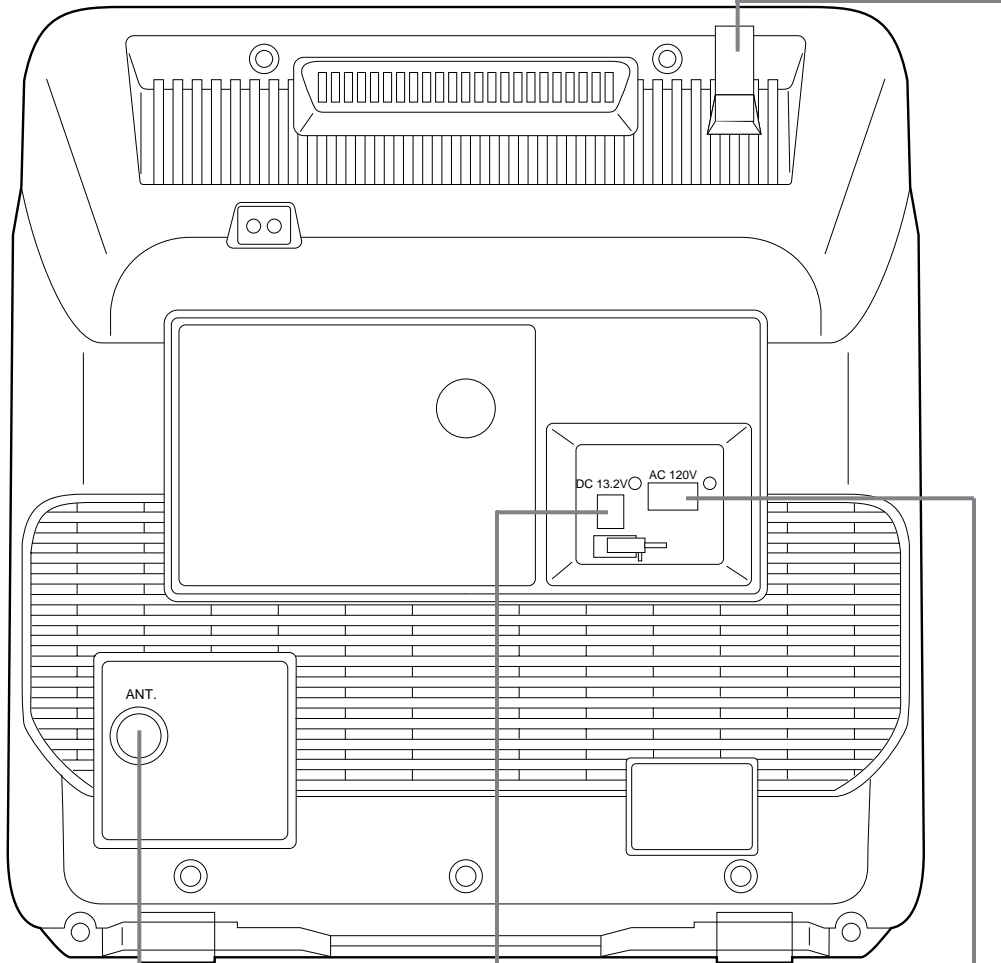
Connect headphones (not supplied) here for personal listening.

### Screen Cover

The TV/VCR screen is protected by a removable screen cover. If you want to remove the screen cover, slide the two tabs that hold the cover in place, then pull off the cover.

## 22 Remote Control Buttons

### SLEEP Button

Press to set the sleep timer. *Details are on page 37.*

### POWER Button

Press to turn on or off the TV/VCR.

### Number Buttons

Use to select channels and to program TV/VCR functions (such as setting the clock).

#### ● Channels 1 - 9

To select, press 0, then press the channel you want to select. For example, to select channel 7, press 0, 7.

#### ● Channels 100 and above

To select, press the +100 button, then press the last two digits of the channel you want. For example, to select channel 117, press the +100 button, 1, 7.

### SPEED Button

Press to select the recording speed (SP, LP, or SLP).

### PLAY/▲ Button

Press to play a tape. *Details are on page 28.* Also, press to release Search or Still mode and return to normal playback. *Details are on page 46.* Press to select an item in the pop up menu.

### REW(ind)/◀ Button

When tape playback is stopped, press to rewind the tape at high speed. During tape playback, press to rewind the tape while the picture stays on-screen. *Details are on page 46.*

Press to change a setting of a pop up menu item or to adjust the picture controls. *Details are on pages 24 - 25.*

### REC(ord)/OTR Button

Press once to start a recording. *Details are on page 29.* Or, press repeatedly to start a One-Touch Recording (an immediate timed recording, 30 minutes to eight hours long) of the channel you are watching. *Details are on page 30.*

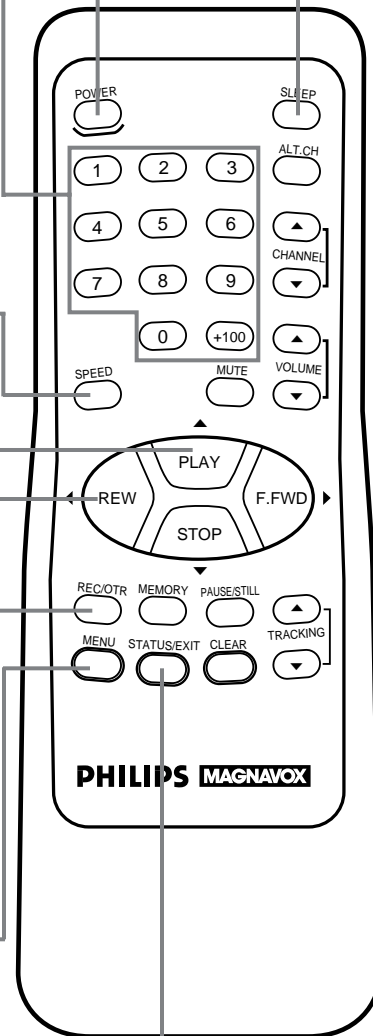
### MENU Button

Press to display the pop up menu. You may also use the buttons on the front panel of the TV/VCR to access the pop up menu. *Details are on page 20.*

### STATUS/EXIT Button

Press to see the status display. Press again to remove the status display. *Details are on page 26.*

Press to exit the on-screen menu.



## Remote Control Buttons (cont'd) 23

### ALT. CH (Alternate Channel) Button

Press to return to the TV channel you were viewing immediately before switching to your current channel.

### CHANNEL ▲/▼ Buttons

Press to scan through the TV/VCR's channels.

### VOLUME ▲/▼ Buttons

Press to adjust the sound level. If you press the VOLUME ▲/▼ buttons when the sound is muted, the sound will be restored.

### MUTE Button

Press to eliminate the TV/VCR's sound. Press again to return to the previous volume level.

### F.FWD▶ Button

When tape playback is stopped, press to fast forward the tape at high speed. During tape playback, press to fast forward the tape while the picture stays on-screen. *Details are on page 46.*

Press to change the setting of an item in the on-screen menu or press to proceed to the next menu. Press to adjust the picture controls. *Details are on pages 24 - 25.*

### STOP/▼ Button

Press to stop the tape. Press to select an item in the on-screen menu.

### PAUSE/STILL Button

During recording, press to temporarily stop the recording. Press again to resume recording. *Details are on page 29.* You cannot pause a One-Touch Recording.

During tape playback, press to freeze the picture (still). Each time you press the PAUSE/STILL button, the noise lines will change position on-screen. *Details are on page 46.*

### MEMORY Button

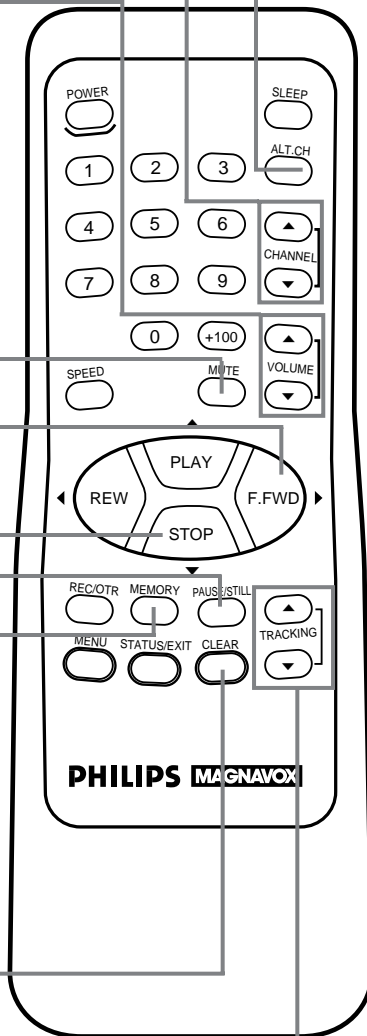
Press to memorize a tape position at which the real-time counter was set to 0:00:00. *Details are on page 44.* Or, press to memorize the start and end position on a tape when setting up A-B Repeat Play. *Details are on pages 42 - 43.*

### CLEAR Button

Press to erase incorrect data when programming TV/VCR functions. Also, press to reset the real-time counter to 0:00:00. *Details are on page 44.*

### TRACKING ▲/▼ Buttons

Press during tape playback to adjust the tracking. *Details are on page 45.*

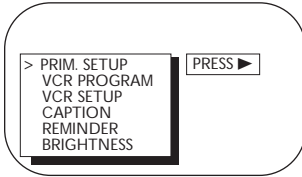

## 26 On-Screen Status Displays

A status display, which includes the current time, channel, and other information (see illustration of the status display at right), will appear when you press the STATUS/EXIT button or certain function buttons. You can bring up the status display at any time by pressing the STATUS/EXIT button. Remove the status display by pressing this button again. The contents of the status display may vary.

### ON MODE:

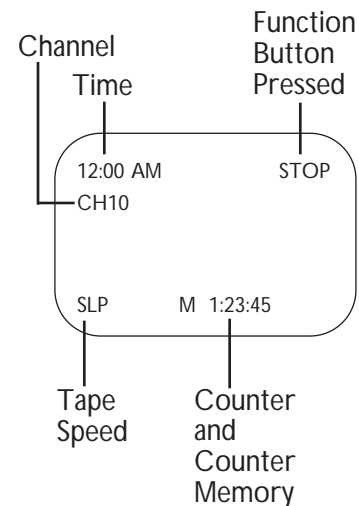
- Whenever a function button (REW(ind)/◀, PLAY/▲, etc.) is pressed, the status display will appear for five seconds.

### COUNTER ONLY MODE:

- When a function button (REW(ind)/◀, PLAY/▲, etc.) is pressed, the status display will appear for five seconds. After five seconds, only the counter will remain on-screen. To remove it, choose ON or OFF in the ON-SCREEN MODE menu. (There is an exception. When you press the STOP/▼ button, the status display will appear for five seconds, then disappear.)

### OFF MODE:

- The status display will not appear when you press a function button. The channel number will appear briefly when you select a channel if channels are programmed.



To choose an ON-SCREEN MODE, follow the steps below.

Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select VCR SETUP. Then, press the F.FWD/▶ button.

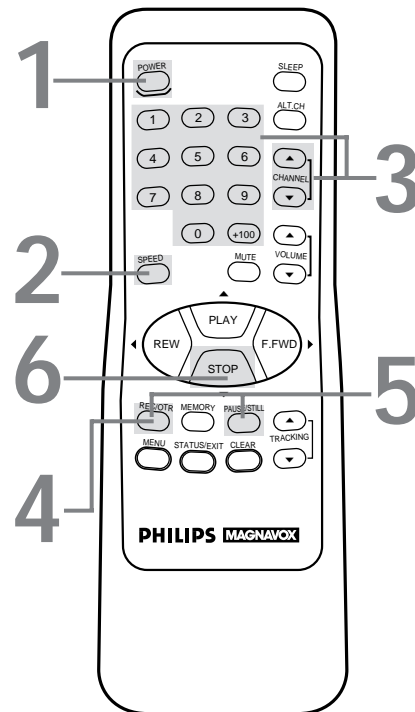

- If the tape does not have a record tab, PROTECTED CASSETTE CANNOT RECORD flashes on-screen briefly. The TV/VCR will eject the tape. Insert another tape.

To pause the recording (for example, during commercials), press the **PAUSE/STILL** button. The REC(ord) light will flash. To resume recording, press the **PAUSE/STILL** button again or the **REC(ord)/OTR** button. The REC(ord) light will glow.

## 6

To stop recording, press the **STOP/▼** button.



### Tape Speeds

This chart shows the recording/playback time for three types of video cassettes (T160, T120, and T60). There are three playback speeds: SP, LP, and SLP. During playback, the TV/VCR selects the tape speed automatically. When recording, you can change the tape speed using the **SPEED** button (see page 22).

- Recording options are on pages 30 - 36.
- You cannot record if RECORD DEFEAT is set to ON. (REC DEFEATED will flash on-screen.) Details are on page 36.
- If you pause a recording for more than five minutes, the TV/VCR will switch to Stop mode automatically to protect the video cassette tape from damage.
- You can change the tape speed with the **SPEED** button while a recording is in progress, but some distortion may appear on the tape.

## 30 One-Touch Recording

The One-Touch Recording (OTR) function allows you to program an immediate timed recording from 30 minutes to eight hours long without setting the timer.

Before you begin, make sure:

- Channels are set up.
- There is a tape in the TV/VCR. The record tab must be intact.

- Unauthorized recording of copyrighted television programs, video tapes, or other materials may infringe on the rights of copyright owners and violate copyright laws.
- Different brands of equipment may operate differently.
- Make sure all connections are secure. Otherwise, you may not record both picture and sound.
- Audio and video cables are not included.



## 32 Timer Recording

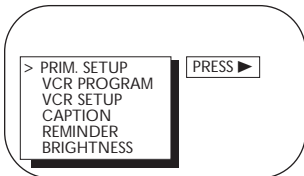
Follow the steps below to program the TV/VCR to record TV programs while you're away from home. The TV/VCR will turn itself on, record, and turn itself off automatically. Before you begin, make sure:

- The clock is set. If not, CLOCK MUST BE SET appears.

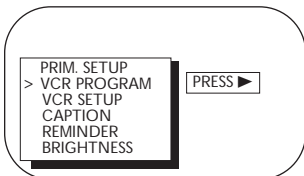

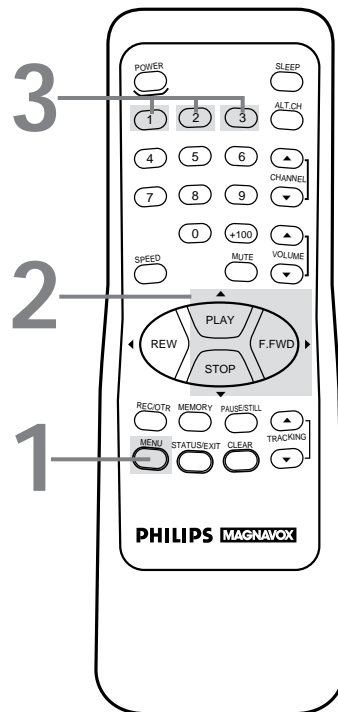
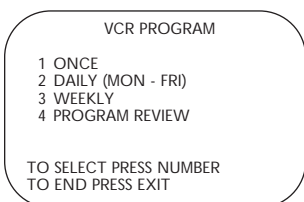

The timer recording will not occur only if the timer recording was scheduled to take place during the power failure.
- You cannot set a timer recording if RECORD DEFEAT is set to ON. Details are on page 36.

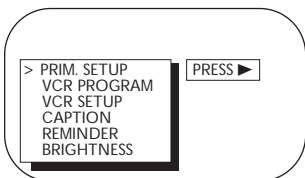
## 38 Closed Caption

When you watch a program that is being broadcast with closed captions, you can access on-screen boxes containing the program's dialogue (for example, what a character is saying), dialogue in a foreign language, or information (such as a channel guide, schedule, or announcements). Follow the steps below to select closed captions.

Not all TV programs and commercials are broadcast with closed captions. Similarly, all types of closed captions (second language, half-screen text, etc.) are not always broadcast. If closed captioning is not broadcast, you cannot receive it. This does not indicate a problem with the TV/VCR. Refer to your area's TV program listings for the shows offered with closed captions.

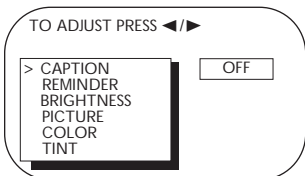

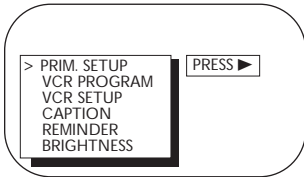
- You cannot view closed captions during recording or tape playback if COUNTER ONLY is set.
- Abbreviations, symbols, and other grammatical shortcuts are often used in order to keep pace with the on-screen action. This does not indicate a problem with the TV/VCR.

## 40 Volume Bar

Usually, the volume bar appears when you press the VOLUME ▲/▼ buttons. If you do not need it, set the VOLUME BAR to OFF position. ## Automatic Operation Features 45

The following playback features will always operate.

### Automatic Playback

When you put a tape in the TV/VCR, the power will come on automatically. If the tape's record tab is missing, playback will begin. If a timer recording is set, the power will not come on automatically when you insert a tape with the record tab intact. If a timer recording is set and the TV/VCR power is off, the TV/VCR will eject the tape if the record tab is missing.

### Automatic Rewind, Eject, Off

When a tape is played, fast forwarded, or recorded to its end, the TV/VCR will rewind the tape, stop, turn itself off, and eject the tape. If a real-time counter memory is set, the TV/VCR will only rewind the tape to the point at which the counter was set to zero, then stop. The TV/VCR will not turn itself off or eject the tape.

### Memory Rewind, Power Off

When the POWER button is pressed while the TV/VCR is rewinding a tape, REW → POWER OFF will appear on-screen. The TV/VCR will turn itself off when the tape has finished rewinding. If a real-time counter memory is set, the TV/VCR may only rewind the tape to the point at which the counter was set to zero, then turn itself off.

### Tape Eject

A tape can be ejected with the TV/VCR power on or off (but the TV/VCR must be plugged in). If a timer recording is programmed, a tape can not be ejected when the power is off. Turn on the TV/VCR power, then eject the tape. Be sure to insert a tape and turn off the TV/VCR power for the timer recording.

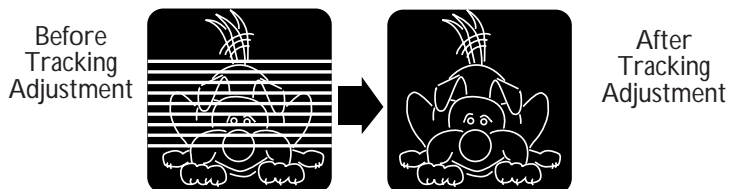
### Automatic Tracking Adjustment

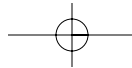
The TV/VCR automatically adjusts the tracking to give you the best possible picture quality. With some recordings, however, you may get a better picture using the manual tracking controls (see below).

### Manual Tracking

To adjust the tracking manually, press the CHANNEL ▲/▼ buttons on the TV/VCR or the TRACKING ▲/▼ buttons on the remote control.

Tracking returns to Automatic Tracking Adjustment when a tape is inserted or when the STOP/▼ button is pressed.

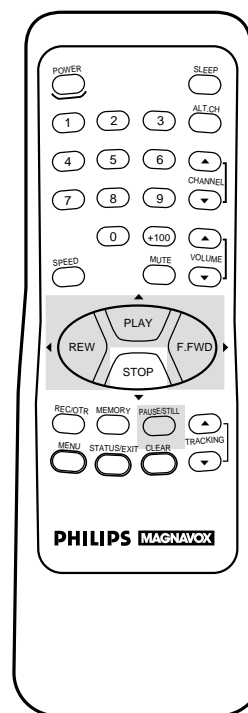

### Glossary

**AUDIO Jack:** jack located on the front of the TV/VCR which is used to record audio from another source.

**Automatic Channel Setup:** process in which the TV/VCR scans all available channels and places the ones you receive in its memory. Then, when you push the CHANNEL ▲/▼ buttons, you only scan through channels you receive.

**Bands:** settings that allow you to tune channels.

- **Antenna** – VHF (very high frequency; channels 2 - 13) and UHF (ultra high frequency; channels 14 - 69).
- **Cable** – all standard channels can be received without a Cable Box.

**Brightness:** adjusting increases or decreases the brightness of the color on-screen.

**Color:** adjusting pales or brightens the TV/VCR color.

**Dubbing:** copying a tape using a VCR.

**HQ:** high quality; a feature in the TV/VCR circuitry which provides enhanced picture detail.

**Line Input:** The channel to which you set your TV/VCR during dubbing. The line input channel is always channel 00 (A/V IN). To exit line input mode, press the CHANNEL ▲/▼ buttons or the Number buttons to select another channel.

**Mode:** a TV/VCR operation.

**OTR:** One-Touch Recording; programming a timed recording that starts immediately and records for 30 minutes to eight hours, whichever you specify.

**Picture:** adjust to increase or decrease the contrast of the picture on-screen.

**Sharpness:** adjusting softens or clarifies the picture on the TV screen.

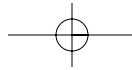
**Tape Speeds:** how fast the tape travels during playback or recording.

- **SP** (standard play) – fastest tape speed (recording time for a T120 tape is approximately two hours); best picture quality.
- **LP** (long play) – average tape speed (recording time for a T120 tape is approximately four hours).
- **SLP** (super long play) – slowest tape speed (recording time for a T120 tape is approximately six hours).

**Tint:** adjusting changes the tints of the picture on the TV/VCR from purple to green.

**VCR:** video cassette recorder.

**VIDEO Jack:** jack located on the front of the TV/VCR which is used to record video from another source.



## 48 Helpful Hints

If you are having problems with your product, check this list of problems and possible solutions before requesting service. You may be able to solve the problem yourself.

If you need to call a customer service representative, please know the model number and serial number of your product before you call. This information is displayed on the back of the product. Also, please take a moment to identify the problem you are having, and be prepared to explain this to the representative. If you believe the representative will need to help you with operations, please stay near the product. Our representatives will be happy to assist you.

### Location

For safe operation and satisfactory performance of your TV/VCR, remember the following:

- Shield it from direct sunlight and keep it away from sources of intense heat.
- Avoid dusty or humid places.
- Avoid places with insufficient ventilation. Do not block the ventilation openings at the top and bottom of the TV/VCR. Do not place the TV/VCR on a carpet, as this will block the ventilation openings.
- Avoid locations subject to strong vibrations.
- Do not place the TV/VCR near strong magnetic fields.
- Do not move the TV/VCR from a cold place to a hot place, or vice versa.
- Please do not use this TV/VCR under high temperature conditions.

### Electrical Shock and Fire Hazards

- Do not handle the power cord with wet hands.
- Do not pull the power cord when disconnecting the TV/VCR from the AC (alternating current) wall outlet. Grasp it by the plug.
- If water is spilled on the TV/VCR, unplug the power cord immediately and take the TV/VCR to an authorized service center.
- Do not put your fingers or objects into the TV/VCR cassette compartment.
- Do not place anything on top of the TV/VCR.

### Dew Warning/Display (Moisture Condensation)

- The TV/VCR is equipped with a sensor which helps detect moisture condensation. If excessive moisture is present inside the TV/VCR, "DEW PROTECTION PLEASE WAIT" appears on the screen. While "DEW PROTECTION PLEASE WAIT" appears, a safety device prevents the TV/VCR from operating until moisture is gone. Moisture condensation may occur inside the TV/VCR when it is moved from a cold place to a warm place, or after heating a cold room, or under conditions of high humidity. Therefore, when "DEW PROTECTION PLEASE WAIT" appears on the screen, press the POWER button to turn the TV/VCR on. Allow at least two hours for the TV/VCR to dry out. "DEW PROTECTION PLEASE WAIT" may appear for up to one hour after moisture is gone. During this time, you can not insert the cassette.

### TV/VCR will not perform a timer recording.

- Make sure the recording start and stop times are set correctly (pages 32 - 35). Midnight is 12 a.m. Noon is 12 p.m.
- Make sure the TV/VCR power is off.
- Make sure the clock is set (pages 12 - 17).
- Make sure there is a tape in the TV/VCR. The tape must have a record tab.
- If the power fails, programmed timer recordings will be restored when the clock is reset. (The clock will reset itself automatically if you are using the AUTO CLOCK feature. Details are on pages 14 - 17. If you are not using the AUTO CLOCK feature, reset the clock manually. Details are on pages 12 - 13.) The timer recording will not occur only if the timer recording was scheduled to take place during the power failure.
- Make sure RECORD DEFEAT is set to OFF (page 36).

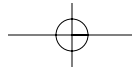
### TV/VCR will not record.

- Make sure the tape has a record tab (page five).
- Make sure RECORD DEFEAT is set to OFF (page 36).
- Plug the power cord into an active AC outlet (page seven).
- Check your hookups (pages six - seven).
- Set up the channels (page 10).

### TV/VCR has no power.

- Make sure the power plug is completely connected to an AC (alternating current) outlet.

### **The remote control is not available, or the remote control will not access the pop up menu.**

- Use the buttons on the front panel of the TV/VCR to access the pop up menu (page 20). You can not enter numbers (for example, to program a timer recording) using the front panel buttons.

### **TV/VCR power shuts off after 15 minutes.**

- To save energy, the TV/VCR will shut itself off after 15 minutes when it is on a channel that is not receiving a broadcast signal (for example, a station that has gone off the air for the night). This is normal.

### **Channel reception is poor.**

- Check connections, then set up the channels again (page 10).

### **TV/VCR does not have a picture.**

- Adjust the antenna (pages six - seven).
- Adjust the TV/VCR picture controls (pages 24 - 25).

### **TV/VCR has poor sound or no sound.**

- Adjust the volume.
- Press the MUTE button to restore the volume.

### **Tape playback is poor or tape is destroyed.**

- Adjust the tracking. *Details are on page 45.*
- If moisture has accumulated in your TV/VCR, keep the power on for at least two hours, but do not try to play a tape. *Details are on page 48.*

### **TV/VCR does not display closed captions.**

- Cancel Counter Only mode. *Details are on page 26.*
- Make sure closed captioning is available for the program. Refer to the TV listings in your local newspaper.

### **Remote control does not operate TV/VCR.**

- Aim the remote control directly at the TV/VCR's remote sensor. *Details are on pages five and 20.*
- Remove all obstacles between the remote control and the TV/VCR.
- Inspect and replace the batteries in the remote control. *Details are on page five.*

### **Number buttons won't work for channels above 69.**

- Select CABLE from the INPUT section of the pop up menu, then let the TV/VCR set up the channels. *Details are on page 10.*

### **TV/VCR can't receive channels above 13.**

- Select CABLE from the INPUT section of the pop up menu, then let the TV/VCR set up the channels. *Details are on page 10.*

### **A tape can't be inserted into the TV/VCR.**

- Insert the tape window side up, with the record tab facing you.
- Make sure a tape isn't already in the TV/VCR by pressing the STOP/EJECT button on the TV/VCR.
- Gently push on the center of the tape. Never force a tape into the TV/VCR.
- Moisture may be present in the TV/VCR. If "DEW PROTECTION PLEASE WAIT" appears on-screen, you may not be able to insert a tape for several hours. *Details are on page 48.*
- If a timer recording is set and the TV/VCR power is off, the TV/VCR will eject the tape if the record tab is missing.

### **A tape can't be removed from the TV/VCR.**

- Make sure the power plug is completely connected to an AC (alternating current) outlet.
- If a timer recording is programmed, turn on the TV/VCR power, then eject the tape. Be sure to insert a tape and turn off the TV/VCR power for the timer recording.

### **TV/VCR ejects the tape when you try to start a recording.**

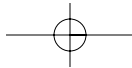
- Make sure the tape has a record tab. *Details are on page five.*

### **The cylinder rotates when tape playback is stopped.**

- To enable the quick play mechanism, the cylinder will rotate for about five minutes. This is normal. The quick play mechanism switches the tape mechanism from Stop to Play in just one second.

### **Automatic clock setting won't work.**

- Disconnect the car battery cord from the DC 13.2V jack. Instead, use the AC 120V jack to supply standard electrical power (page 7).

### WHO IS COVERED?

You must have proof of purchase to receive warranty service. A sales receipt or other document showing that you purchased the product is considered proof of purchase.

### WHAT IS COVERED?

Warranty coverage begins the day you buy your product. For 90 days thereafter, all parts will be repaired or replaced, and labor is free. From 90 days to one year from the day of purchase, all parts will be repaired or replaced, but you pay for all labor charges. From one to two years from the day of purchase, you pay for the replacement or repair of all parts except the picture tube, and for all labor charges. After two years from the day of purchase, you pay for the replacement or repair of all parts, and for all labor charges.
