
- **6B. Tilt/Stability** All televisions must comply with recommended international global safety standards for tilt and stability properties of its cabinet design.
 - Do not compromise these design standards by applying excessive pull force to the front, or top, of the cabinet which could ultimately overturn the product.
 - Also, do not endanger yourself, or children, by placing electronic equipment/toys on the top of the cabinet. Such items could unsuspectingly fall from the top of the set and cause product damage and/or personal injury.
- 7. Wall or Ceiling Mounting The appliance should be mounted to a wall or ceiling only as recommended by the manufacturer.
- 8. Ventilation The appliance should be situated so that its location or position does not interfere with its proper ventilation. For example, the appliance should not be situated on a bed, sofa, rug, or similar surface that may block the ventilation openings; or, placed in a built-in installation, such as a bookcase or cabinet that may impede the flow of air through the ventilation openings.
- 9. Heat The appliance should be situated away from heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other appliances (including amplifiers) that produce heat.
- **10.** Power Sources The appliance should be connected to a power supply only of the type described in the operating instructions or as marked on the appliance.

- **14. Outdoor Antenna Grounding** If an outside antenna is connected to the receiver, be sure the antenna system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built up static charges.

Section 810 of the National Electric Code, ANSI/NFPA No. 70-1984, provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mats and supporting structure grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding connectors, location of antennadischarge unit, connection to grounding electrodes and requirements for the grounding electrode. - 15. Non-use Periods The power cord of the appliance should be unplugged from the outlet when left unused for a long period of time.
- **16. Object and Liquid Entry** Care should be taken so that objects do not fall and liquids are not spilled into the enclosure through openings.
- 17. Damage Requiring Service The appliance should be serviced by qualified service personnel when:
 - A. The power supply cord or the plug has been damaged; or
 - B. Objects have fallen, or liquid has been spilled into the appliance; or
 - C. The appliance has been exposed to rain; or
 - **D.** The appliance does not appear to operate normally or exhibits a marked change in performance; or
 - E. The appliance has been dropped, or the enclosure damaged.
- **18. Servicing** The user should not attempt to service the appliance beyond that described in the operating instructions. All other servicing should be referred to qualified service personnel.

Note to the CATV system installer: This reminder is provided to call the CATV system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the NEC that provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as practical.



ADJUSTING THE TV PICTURE

 T^{o} adjust your TV picture controls, select a channel and follow the steps shown below:

(BEGIN)

Press the MENU button on the remote to show the on-screen menu. Press the CURSOR DOWN ■ button on the remote to highlight the word PICTURE.

 Press the CURSOR RIGHT
 button and the menu will shift to the right to display an adjustment bar in front of the BRIGHTNESS control.

Use the CURSOR LEFT or RIGHT b buttons to adjust the BRIGHTNESS level of the picture.

 After adjusting the BRIGHT-NESS control, press the CURSOR DOWN ■ button to select another Picture adjustment: COLOR, PIC-TURE, SHARPNESS, TINT, or COLOR TEMP. Use the CURSOR LEFT ◄< or CURSOR RIGHT
 buttons to adjust the selected control.

5 Press the STATUS/EXIT button to remove the menu from the screen.



SMART HELP

Remember, when the bar scale is centered, the control settings are at normal mid-range levels.

BRIGHTNESS Press the >> or <</td>buttons until darkest parts of the pictureare as bright as you prefer.










SETTING THE TV'S ON TIMER START TIME





UNDERSTANDING SMARTLOCK

The SmartLock feature receives and processes data sent by broadcasters, or other program providers, that contain program content advisories. When programmed by the viewer, a TV with SmartLock can respond to the content advisories and block program content that may be found objectionable (such as offensive language, violence, sexual situations, etc.). This is a great feature to censor the type of programming children may watch.

Over the next few pages, you'll learn how to block channels and certain rated programming, as well as learn to turn these blocking features on or off. Below is a brief explanation of some terms and ratings you will find in the SmartLock feature.

SmartLock offers various Blocking Options from which to choose:

BLOCKING: This is what might be called the "master switch" for SmartLock. When BLOCKING is OFF, ALL blocking/censoring is disabled. When BLOCKING is ON, ALL blocking based on specific settings will take place.


BLOCK UNRATED: ALL unrated programs will be blocked if this feature is set to ON.

UNRATED programming is encoded with information from the MPAA or TV broadcasters, but it does not have a specific rating. In other words, the MPAA or the TV broadcasters have chosen not to assign a rating to the programming.

NO RATING: ALL programming with no content advisory data can be blocked if NO RATING is set to ON.

Programming that has No Rating is not encoded with any rating information from the MPAA or the Parental Guidelines. Any programming could fall into this category.

You also can block individual channels or block programming based on ratings of the MPAA and TV broadcasters. (See description of ratings on this page.)

MOVIE RATINGS

(MOTION PICTURE ASSOCIATION OF AMERICA)

G: General Audience - All ages admitted. Most parents would find this program suitable for all ages. This type of programming contains little or no violence, no strong language, and little or no sexual dialogue or situations.

PG: Parental Guidance Suggested - This programming contains material that parents may find unsuitable for younger children. It may contain one or more of the following: Moderate violence, some sexual situations, infrequent coarse language, or some suggestive dialogue.

PG-13: Parents Strongly Cautioned - This programming contains material that parents may find unsuitable for children under the age of 13. It contains one or more of the following: violence, sexual situations, coarse language, or suggestive dialogue.

R: Restricted -This programming is specifically designed for adults. Anyone under the age of 17 should only view this programming with an accompanying parent or adult guardian. It contains one or more of the following: intense violence, intense sexual situations, strong coarse language, or intensely suggestive dialogue.

NC-17: No one under the age of 17 will be admitted. - This type of programming should be viewed by adults only. It contains graphic violence, explicit sex, or crude indecent language.

X: Adults Only - This type of programming contains one or more of the following: very graphic violence, very graphic and explicit or indecent sexual acts, very coarse and intensely suggestive language.

TV PARENTAL GUIDELINES (TV BROADCASTERS)

TV-Y - (**All children** -- *This program is designed to be appropriate for all children*.) Designed for a very young audience, including children ages 2-6. This type of programming is not expected to frighten younger children.


TV-Y7 - (Directed to Older Children -- This program is designed for children age 7 and above.) It may be more appropriate for children who have acquired the development skills needed to distinguish between make-believe and reality. This programming may include mild fantasy and comic violence (FV).

TV-G - (General Audience -- Most parents would find this program suitable for all ages.) This type of programming contains little or no violence, no strong language, and little or no sexual dialogue or situations.


TV-PG - (Parental Guidance Suggested -- This program contains material that parents may find unsuitable for younger children.) This type of programming contains one or more of the following: Moderate violence (V), some sexual situations (S), infrequent coarse language (L), or some suggestive dialogue (D).

TV-14 - (Parents Strongly Cautioned -- This program contains some material that many parents would find unsuitable for children under 14 years of age.) This type of programming contains one or more of the following: intense violence (V), intense sexual situations (S), strong coarse language (L), or intensely suggestive dialogue (D).


TV-MA - (Mature Audience Only --This program is specifically designed to be viewed by adults and therefore may be unsuitable for children under 17.) 


USING SMARTLOCK - MOVIE RATING









AUDIO/VIDEO INPUTS

The TV's Audio/Video Input jacks are for direct picture and sound connections between the TV and a VCR (or similar device) that has Audio/Video Output jacks.

(BEGIN)

Connect the VIDEO (yellow) CABLE to the VIDEO IN-1 jack on the back of the TV. Then connect the AUDIO (red and white) CABLES to the AUDIO (left and right) IN-1 jacks on the rear of the TV.

Connect the VIDEO (yellow) CABLE to the VIDEO OUT jack on the back of the VCR. Then connect the AUDIO (red and white) CABLES to the AUDIO (left and right) OUT jacks on the rear of the VCR.

3 Turn the VCR and the TV ON.

4 Use the AV button on the remote to select the AV 1 channel.

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USING THE AUDIO/VIDEO INPUT JACKS (CONT'D)

S-VIDEO INPUT

The S(uper)-Video connection on the rear of the television can give you better picture detail and clarity for the playback of S-VHS VCR tapes or Digital Video Discs than the normal antenna picture connections.

Note: The VCR (or Digital Video Disc player) must have a S-VIDEO OUT(put) jack in order for you to complete the connections shown on this page.

(BEGIN)

Connect the S-VIDEO CABLE to the S-VIDEO input jack on the rear of the television, then connect the AUDIO (red and white) cables to the AUDIO IN (IN 1) jacks on the rear of the TV.

2 Connect the S-VIDEO

CABLE to the S-VIDEO output jack on the accessory device. Then, connect the red and white AUDIO CABLES to the AUDIO (left and right) output jacks on the rear of the accessory device.

3 Turn the VCR (or Digital Video Disc Player) ON.


Press the AV button on the remote until you tune to the AV 1 channel. You are now ready to view the tape or disc on the TV.

The S-VIDEO and IN-1 inputs are in parallel. The S-VIDEO input will take precedence when in use. If separate video signals are connected to the S-Video and VIDEO IN-1 inputs, the signal from the VIDEO IN-1 input will not be useable.

If you have added AV 1 to the TV's channel memory, just press the CHANNEL + or – buttons until the AV 1 mode (channel) is selected.



Whether you're watching a movie or a video game, your TV has automatic video control settings matched for your current program source or content. The SmartPicture feature quickly resets your TV's video controls for a number of different types of programs and viewing conditions you may have in your home. Each SmartPicture setting is preset at the factory to automatically adjust the TV's Brightness, Color, Picture, Sharpness, Tint, and Color Temperature levels.



Press the SMART PICTURE button on the remote control. The current SmartPicture setting will appear in the middle of the screen.

Press the SMART PICTURE button repeatedly to select either PERSONAL, MOVIES, SPORTS, WEAK SIGNAL, or MULTI MEDIA picture settings.


Note: The PERSONAL setting and the PICTURE options within the on-screen menu are the same. This is the only option in Smart Picture that can be changed. To adjust these settings, use the PICTURE options within the on-screen menu. All other settings are set up at the factory during production and cannot be adjusted.










Direct Access Method

Now that you have looked up the three-digit Remote Code Number for your brand of device, you are ready to follow the five simple steps below.

Please read through steps 1-5 before beginning.

(BEGIN)

Place the TV/VCR/ACC
 Mode Switch in the proper position.

Press the VCR RECORD
 button on the remote control and release.

Press the SMART SOUND button on the remote within 30 seconds, then release.

4 Enter the THREE-DIGIT REMOTE CODE NUMBER for your desired device. The remote is now ready to send commands to the unit.

5 Point the remote at the Device. Press the POWER button on the remote to turn the unit ON.



Remember, if this doesn't work the first time, repeat steps 1-5 using the same remote code number.

After a second try and the remote does not operate your device, see if there is another three-digit code number (pages 39-40) listed for your device. Repeat the steps above using the new number.

If, after repeated attempts, the remote does not work your device, try the **SEARCH METHOD** on page 38.

Some Cable Converters can not be turned ON by a remote control.



SETTING THE REMOTE CONTROL TO OPERATE ACCESSORY DEVICES

Search Method

Your TV remote can be set to work various accessory devices such as VCRs, Cable Boxes, Satellite Receivers, DBS, DVD, etc. by using the search method.

If the Direct Access method shown on page 37 did not set your remote to work your accessory device, follow the easy steps listed below.

Please read steps 1-4 before beginning.

BEGIN

Turn ON the device by pressing the POWER button on the device you are attempting to program.

Place the TV/VCR/ACC Mode Switch in the proper position.

Press and hold the VCR RECORD and the SMART SOUND buttons simultaneously.

• The device will begin to change channels after the remote identifies the correct code. When the channels start to change, release the VCR RECORD and SMART SOUND buttons. The remote should be ready to operate the device.



SMART HELP

This method can take up to two minutes to perform.

Don't let the device change more than five channels after the remote identifies the code. If you do, the remote may pass up the right code; another two minute search cycle will have to be repeated.

If no channel change happens within two minutes, repeat steps 1-4. Should a channel change still not occur, the remote will not work the desired device.



USING THE REMOTE'S VCR BUTTONS





POWER BUTTON

Press to turn the VCR ON and OFF.

(CLOCK)TV/VCR BUTTON

Press to select VCR position (VCR indicator on the front of the unit will light), to view the playback of a tape, to watch a program while recording it, or to watch a TV broadcast using the VCR CH +, – or Numbered buttons. Press again to place in the TV position (VCR indicator light will go off) or to view one program while recording another program.

NUMBER BUTTONS

Press buttons for direct VCR channel selections.

PAUSE BUTTON

Press to temporarily stop the tape during playback or recording. Press again to release Pause.

FAST FORWARD BUTTON

Press to rapidly advance the tape. For some VCRs, you may need to press the STOP button first, then the FAST FORWARD button. During playback, press or press and hold the button to view the picture moving rapidly in the forward direction.

CHANNEL + & – BUTTONS

Press to scan up or down through the VCR channel numbers.

TIPS IF SOMETHING ISN'T WORKING

Please make these simple checks before calling for ser- vice. These tips can save you time and money since charges for TV installation and adjustment of customer controls are not cov- ered under your warranty.	CAUTION: A video source (such as a video game, Compact Disc Interactive - CDI, or TV information channel) which shows a constant non-moving pattern on the TV screen can cause picture tube damage. When your TV is continuously used with such a source, the pattern of the non-moving portion of the game (CDI, etc.) could leave an image permanently on the picture tube. When not in use, turn the video source OFF. Regularly alternate the use of such video sources with normal TV viewing.
<u>No Power</u>	 Check the TV power cord. Unplug the TV, wait 10 seconds, then reinsert plug into outlet and push POWER button again. Check that outlet is not on a wall switch. Be sure fuse is not blown on AC power strip. Check to be sure the system mode switch (TV/VCR/ACC) is in the correct position when using the remote control to power the set ON.
<u>No Picture</u>	 Check antenna connections. Are they properly secured to the TV's ANT/CABLE plug? Check the TUNER control for CABLE or ANTENNA setting. Press the AV button on the remote to make sure the correct signal source is selected (AV 1, AV 2, SVID-R or MM 1, MM 2, MM 3).
<u>No Sound</u>	 Check the VOLUME buttons. Check the MUTE button on the remote control. Check the SPEAKER on-screen control. OFF position will eliminate sound at the set. If attempting auxiliary equipment hookups, check audio jack connections. (If Applicable) Check Audio Receiver for correct operating mode.
<u>Remote Does Not</u> <u>Work</u>	 Check TV/VCR/ACC "System" switch on the remote. Move the switch to the TV position to operate the television. Check batteries. Replace with AA Heavy Duty (Zinc Chloride) or Alkaline batteries if necessary. Clean the remote and the remote sensor window on the TV. Check the TV power cord. Unplug the TV, wait 10 seconds, then reinsert plug into outlet and push POWER button again. Be sure fuse is not blown on AC power strip. Check to be sure TV outlet is not on a wall switch.
<u>TV Displays Wrong</u> <u>Channel or No</u> <u>Channels Above 13</u>	 Repeat channel selection. Add desired channel numbers (CHANNEL EDIT control) into TV memory. Check to be sure the TUNER control is set to the CABLE option.

Cleaning and Care

- To avoid possible shock hazard be sure the TV is unplugged from the electrical outlet before cleaning.
- When cleaning the TV screen take care not to scratch or damage the screen surface (avoid wearing jewelry or using anything abrasive). Wipe the front screen with a clean cloth dampened with water. Use even, easy, vertical strokes when cleaning.
- Gently wipe the cabinet surfaces with a clean cloth or sponge dampened in a solution of cool clear water. Use a clean dry cloth to dry the wiped surfaces.
- Never use thinners, insecticide sprays, or other chemicals on or near the cabinet, as they might cause permanent marring of the cabinet finish.

Alternate Channel • Use the A/CH button on the remote control to toggle between the last two channels viewed.

Auto Programming • When activated, this feature automatically scans for all available channels from regular antenna or cable signals and stores only active broadcast stations into the TV's memory.

Channel Edit • Add or delete channels from the sequential tuning cycle to develop a customized list of channels you want to watch. Editing makes it easy to limit the number of channels when using the Channel +/- buttons or to expand the number of channels available to suit your preference.

Closed Caption • Broadcast standard which allows you to read the voice content of television programs on the TV screen. Designed to help the hearing impaired, this feature uses onscreen "text boxes" to show dialogue and conversations while the TV program is in progress.

Coaxial Cable • A single solid antenna wire normally matched with a metal plug (F-type) end connector that screws (or pushes) directly onto a 75 Ohm input found on the Television or VCR.

Direct Audio/Video Inputs • Located on the rear of the TV, these connectors (RCA phono type plug) are used for the input of audio and video signals. Designed for use with VCRs (or other accessories) in order to receive higher picture resolution and offer sound connection options.

Identify • Method by which a remote control searches and finds an operating code for another product (such as a VCR or Cable Converter). Once the code has been "identified," the TV remote can operate and send commands to the other product.

Incredible Stereo (or Surround) • Pseudo-acoustic management of the audio signal produces a dramatic expansion of the wall of sound engulfing the listener and heightens overall viewing pleasure.

Menu • An on-screen listing of feature controls that are available for user adjustments.

Multichannel Television Sound (MTS) • The broadcast standard that allows for stereo sound to be transmitted with the TV picture. **On Screen Displays (OSD)** • Refers to the wording or messages generated by the television (or VCR) to help the user with specific feature controls (color adjustment, programming, etc.).

Programming • The procedure of adding or deleting channel numbers into the Television's memory circuits. In this way, the Television "remembers" only the locally available or desired channel numbers and skips over any unwanted channel numbers.

Remote Sensor Window • A window or opening found on the Television control panel through which infrared remote control command signals are received.

Second Audio Program (SAP) • Another or additional audio channel provided for in the Multichannel Television Sound (MTS) broadcast standard. The most frequently proposed use for SAP is the simultaneous bilingual broadcast of TV program material.

Status/Exit • Allows the user to quickly confirm what channel number is currently being viewed. Status can also be used to clear the Television of on screen displays or information (rather than waiting for the displays to "time out" or automatically disappear from the screen).

Twin Lead Wire • The more commonly used name for the two strand 300 Ohm antenna wire used with many indoor and outdoor antenna systems. In many cases this type of antenna wire requires an additional adapter (or balun) in order to connect to the 75 Ohm Input terminals designed into the more recent Televisions and VCRs.

SmartLock • Allows you to block or censor channels or programming that you may find objectionable. Program advisory content data (i.e., movie ratings, TV ratings) is supplied by broadcasters during the broadcasting of programs. The TV can detect the data and block the programs if desired.

SmartClock • An accurate digital clock. By monitoring the vertical blanking interval of PBS broadcasts, TVs equipped with SmartClock can automatically set the right time of day and maintain it through brown-outs, power failures, and even Daylight Savings Time adjustments.


