

Power Supply:

Connect the supplied power adapter to the side of the DVD player in the slot marked "Power In". Plug the two-prong end of the power cord to an AC100-240V outlet. If you have difficulty inserting the plug, turn it over and reinsert it; if the unit will not be used for a long time, disconnect the power from the outlet.

Note: before plugging in the power cord to an AC outlet, make sure that all the connections have been made.

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View of Front Panel




- 1. LCD screen
- 2. \(\begin{align*} \lambda \rightarrow \lambda \text{ select different items; press } \rightarrow \text{ to pause the playback; press the mode button and then the + button to increase the level of brightness, contrast, and color.
- 3. ▼/■/- button: press ▼ to select different items; press to stop playback or press it twice to stop completely, then press the ▶ (PLAY) button to resume playback from the stopped spot; press the MODE button and then press the button to decrease the level of brightness, color, and contrast.
- **4. ♦ /♦♦/♦♦ button:** press **♦** to select different items; press and hold **♦** to search backward fast; press **♦** to return to previous list/track/chapter.
- 5. ▶ /▶ button: press ▶ to select different items; press and hold ▶ to search forward fast; press ▶ to go to next list/track/chapter.
- 6. ENT/ ▶ (PLAY) button: press ENT to confirm selection; press ▶ (PLAY) to start playback
- 7. Speaker
- **8. Disc tray:** when the disc tray is loaded, gently press the cover to close it
- 9. **MENU button:** press to access the DVD disc menu during playback
- 10. SETUP button: press to access or exit the system setup menu
- 11. MODE button: press to enter the brightness, contrast, or color adjusting mode. Press and hold for several seconds to change the aspect ratio among 16:9, 4:3, 16:9 overturn, and 4:3 overturn. (This button is invalid when the unit is connecting to the docking station.)
- **12. ZOOM button:** press to realize various zoom functions
- 13. OPEN switch: push to open the disc tray cover
- **14. SLOW button:** press to activate slow playback function
- 15. A-B REPEAT button: press to play a section of the disc from point A to point B
- 16. Remote sensor
- 17. Charge indicator: light is red when the battery is being charged; green when battery is fully charged.

View of Side Panels


Ride Side View

- 1. Volume Control Knob: Used to adjust the volume of headphones and speaker
- **2. Headphone Jack:** Used to connect to headphones for private listening. When headphone is plugged in, the speakers will automatically turnoff.
- 3. Audio Input/Output Jack: For connecting to an external amplifier or audio source
- 4. Video Input/Output Jack: For connecting to an external monitor or video source
- **5. AV IN/OUT Switch:** Switch to "IN" to input external Audio/Video signal. Switch to "OUT" to play disc or output AV signal
- **6.** DC 9.5/12V Input Jack: Used to connect the DC 9.5/12V adaptor



Left Side View

- **1. HOLD button:** Push the HOLD switch to lock the function of all the buttons on the front panel (except the POWER and ON switches)
- 2. Power ON/OFF Switch: Switch the power on or off



View of Bottom Panel



- 1. Rechargeable Battery Contacts: For connecting the rechargeable battery pack
- 2. Docking Jack: This portable DVD player is designed with a docking jack on the bottom. The docking jack is designed for connecting to external docking station to get more expanded functions. Docking station is a set of electrical connection interfaces that enables the portable DVD player to effectively serve as a desktop DVD player. It is typically integrated with connectors for peripheral devices to eliminate the complicated connections and save valuable space around. With docking station, you can simultaneously enjoy the expansion possibilities of desktop model DVD players with the possibility of the portable feature.


Revolving LCD Screen

Revolving Steps

The revolving LCD screen is one of the outstanding features about this product. Here are some suggested steps for proper operation:

A	Open the screen cover to position (A) as shown at left, where the screen is vertical to the operation panel.
B	Revolving the screen horizontally about its axis in the clockwise only. The maximum revolving degree is 180 (position C). If you want to return to initial position (A), please revolve the screen counterclockwise until it clicks.
C	You can rotate the screen vertically from position (C) to the operation panel as shown at left.
	The final position (position D) is when the screen faces upwards and back to operation panel.

Remote Control



- 1. **POWER button:** press to turn unit on or off
- 2. INFO button: press repeatedly to display or cancel the detailed information of the disc during playback
- 3. TITLE button: press to display the title menu if it exists on the disc
- **4. Direction button:** press to select different options
- **5. ENTER button:** press to access playback or confirm your selection
- **6. SETUP button:** press to enter the unit's setup menu
- 7. **0-9 number buttons:** press to select numbers
- **8. MEXT button:** press to skip to the next list, track, or chapter
- 9. Rev button: press to return to the previous list, track, or chapter
- **10. SUBT button:** press to select a subtitle language or to turn the subtitles on or off (when playing a disc coded with subtitles)
- 11. ANGLE button: press to access various camera angles if the DVD disc contains multiple camera angles
- **12. A-B button:** press to play a section of the disc from point A to point B. Press once to select the starting point A, press again to select the end point B. During A-B repeat playback, press this button to stop the repeat
- **13. ZOOM button:** press to realize different zoom functions
- **14. REP button:** press to repeat a chapter, title, or entire disc
- 15. MENU button: press to access the DVD disc menu during playback
- **16. PAUSE button:** press to pause playback, press the PLAY button to resume normal playback
- **17. STOP button:** press stop to stop playback, press twice to stop completely. Press the PLAY button to resume playback.
- **18. PLAY button:** press to start playback
- **19.** +10 button: press the 10+ button followed by another number to select a number greater than 9
- **20. GOTO button:** press to select the desired disc starting time, title, or chapter
- 21. « REV SCAN button: press to search backward during playback
- 22. **>> FWD SCAN button:** press to search forward during playback
- 23. SLOW button: press to activate slow playback function
- **24. AUDIO button:** press to select different languages when a DVD disc with multiple audio languages is being played; press to select different audio tracks when a CD disc is being played

Remote Control

Installing the Remote Control Battery

- 1. Pull the battery holder out from the remote control as shown below.
- 2. Load a new battery properly with the (+) side up.
- 3. Insert the battery holder back into the remote control.



Battery Type: CR2025 3V

Battery service life: approximately 1 year under normal use (at room temperature)

Using the Remote Control

Point the remote control to the remote sensor on the unit within a 5-meter range and 60-degree angles, without obstacles between the remote control and remote sensor.



Notes:


- Improper use of the battery may cause overheating, explosion or ignition, which can result in an injury or fire. Battery leakage may damage the remote control.
- Do not expose the remote control to direct sunlight.
- Do not recharge, disassemble, deform, or heat the battery.
- Immediately replace the exhausted battery.
- Take out battery when the remote is not being used for a long period of time.

System Connections

- Always endure that the DVD player, TV, and any other electrical equipment to be connected are switched off and unplugged from the power supply.
- Ensure that you observe the color coding when connecting audio and video cables.

Connecting to a TV

Follow the drawing below to connect the DVD player to the TV's audio/video input with the audio/video cables.




Connecting to an Amplifier

Refer to your audio equipment's manual before connecting. Follow the drawing below to connect the DVD player to an AV amplifier.



Connecting to an External AV Source

The player supports an AV signal input function. Use the AV cables to connect the unit to an external AV signal source such as a DVD, VCR, etc. After connecting, switch the DVD/AV IN to AV IN.



Note: Noise may occur in speakers when there is an external audio signal input while playing a DVD disc. Unplug the audio cord to clear the noise.

Connecting to the Headphones

Connect the headphones to the headphone jack on either side of the player. When headphones are connected, the speakers will automatically turn off.



Power Supply

Using the AC Adapter

The player is supplied with an AC adapter for powering the unit and charging the batter.

- 1. Connect the AC adapter to the left side of the DVD player in the pack marked DC 9.5/12V IN.
- 2. Plug the two-prong end of the power cord into a grounded electrical outlet. The power indicator lights red when charging the battery and green when complete.




Notes:

- Turn the player's power off before unplugging.
- When using the adapter, the LCD screen will be brighter than using the rechargeable battery.

Using the Car Adapter

The player is supplied withe a car adapter for powering the unit and charging the battery in a vehicle.

Connect the car adapter power plug to the unit's power jack and the other end to the vehicle's 12V accessory/cigarette lighter socket.



Attention:

- Do not operate the unit or view video software while driving a vehicle.
- Place the unit in a proper viewing position.
- Detach the battery pack when using the AC or car adapter as a power source.
- Disconnect the player from the car adapter when starting the vehicle.

Rechargeable Battery

About Your Rechargeable Battery Pack

Your portable DVD player comes with a lithium ion polymer rechargeable battery that attaches to the bottom of the DVD player. Charge the battery fully before initial use. Charging time is normally about 5 hours. A fully-charged battery delivers about 3 hours of use, but playing time varies disc to disc. If the battery will not be used for a long period of time, charge the battery fully before storing.

Working conditions and precautions for the rechargeable battery

- 1. New battery should be fully charged before initial use
- 2. Battery should only be used and charged when temperature is between 32-100F
- 3. Never but the battery in fire or water
- 4. Do not expose the battery to high temperatures or store in a hot, sunny place
- 5. Maintain well-ventilated conditions around the product to avoid overheating. Do not put the product on a bed, sofa, or anything that may block ventilation to the product
- 6. Do not short the battery terminals
- 7. Do not open the battery
- 8. Detach the battery after charging is complete. When charging the battery pack, the charge light will turn red; when the charging is complete, the light will turn green
- 9. Detach the battery when it is not in use
- 10. When the charge of the battery is wear, low power indicator will appear on the LCD screen. The player will turn off automatically about five minutes later.

Warning: Do not touch any metal object to the battery connectors as it will put the battery in standby mode. To exit standby mode, connect the battery and DVD player to AC or DC power.

Rechargeable Battery

Attaching the Battery Pack

- 1. With one hand on the DVD player to prevent it from moving, take the battery and align the plastic tabs on the battery pack with the holds on the player, and push the battery pack into the DVD player.
- 2. Slide the battery pack until you hear it click and lock in place.



Charging the Battery Pack

The battery pack must be attached to the DVD player to charge it by using the supplied AC power adapter.

- 1. Attach the battery pack to the DVD player.
- 2. Plug the supplied AC power adapter into the player's jack marked "DC 9.5/12V IN", which is located on the right side of the DVD player.
- 3. Plug the other end of the AC power adapter cord into a household AC outlet as shown below:




Detaching the Battery Pack

When being turned off, the DVD player still consumes some power in standby mode. This will eventually discharge the battery. If the DVD player is not going to be used for long periods of time, the battery pack should be detached.

Make sure the power is turned off before detaching the battery pack.

- 1. Press and hold the battery release tab in the direction of arrow 1 as shown in figure 1 below.
- 2. Slide the battery pack gently towards the direction of arrow 2 as shown in figure 1 below.
- 3. Carefully remove the battery pack from your player.

Care of Discs

Holding Discs

• When loading or removing discs, try not to touch their play surfaces.







Cleaning Discs

- Fingerprints or stain on the disc may affect the quality of sound and picture. To clean your discs, use a soft clean cloth to wipe them. If necessary, moisten a soft cloth with neutral detergent to remove heavy dirty or fingerprints.
- Do not wipe in a circular direction (concentric scratches on the disc groove tend to cause noise). Gently wipe from center of the disc to the outer edge.

Please read the following instructions carefully before using your <u>DVD player for the first time.</u>

Warning: To avoid damaging the lens, do not play poor quality discs.

Pre-Operation

- 1. Connect the unit to power supply through the provided AC adaptor.
- 2. Switch POWER ON/OFF to ON to turn the DVD player on.
- 3. Push the OPEN switch on the unit to open the disc tray cover. Put a disc in the disc tray with printed side up. Close the disc cover.
- 4. The player will search the disc and play it automatically.
- 5. Adjust the volume with the VOLUME control on the right panel to the desired level.
- 6. To turn the player off, switch the POWER ON/OFF to off.



Basic Operation

MODE button: press the MODE button and then press the || /+ or || /- button to adjust brightness, contrast, and color of the screen. Press and hold several seconds to change the aspect ratio among 16:9, 4:3, 16:9 overturn, and 4:3 overturn.



Features are available on both the DVD player and remote control unless otherwise noted.

During playback, press the GOTO button repeatedly to enter the mer desired TITLE, CHAPTER, or TIME. Use the ◀▶ direction button the item you want to set. Use the 0-9 and +10 buttons to select direction press the ENTER/ENT button to confirm. Press the GOTO button as (remote only)			
A-B button	In normal playback, press the A-B button to select the segment you want to play repeatedly. Press once to select the starting point A, press again to select the end point B; the player will play the segment between A and B continuously. Press the A-B button a third time to cancel the preeat segment.		
RED button Press the REP button to repeat a Chapter, All, or cancel repeat in sequer (remote only)			
SLOW button	Press the SLOW button repeatedly and slow playback will at the speed of 1/2, 1/4, 1/8, 1/16, and normal playback. During slow playback, press the PLAY button to resume normal playback.		
« & » buttons	Press the () button (and hold it for several seconds) to start fast forward/rewind playback. Press it (and hold it for several seconds) repeatedly to fast forward/rewind at the speed of 2x, 4x, 8x, 16x, and normal playback. Press PLAY to return to normal playback.

TITLE button	In general, the content of a DVD disc can be divided into several titles. There are also several menus in a title. Press the TITLE button during playback. The title menu will appear on the screen. Press the direction buttons (▲▼◀▶) to select the title or disc menu item you want to watch and then press the ENTER/ENT button to confirm. You can also press the 0-9 and +10 buttons to select the item you prefer. (remote only)		
MENU button	Press the MENU button during playback. The root menu will appear on the screen. Press the direction buttons ($\blacktriangle \blacktriangledown \blacktriangleleft \blacktriangleright$) to select the item you want to play and press the ENTER/ENT button to confirm. You can also press the 0-9 and +10 buttons to select the item you prefer.		
STOP/ ■ button	Press the STOP/ ■ button once to stop playback. Then press the PLAY ▶ button to resume normal playback from the place where the STOP buton was pressed. Press the STOP/ ■ button twice to stop playback completely.		
PAUSE/ button	Press the PAUSE/ II button to pause during playback and the PLAY ▶ button to resume normal playback.		
ENTER/ENT button	When you load a disc in, the player will search the disc and play it automatically. Press the direction buttons (▲▼◀▶) to highlight the item you want to play and press the ENTER/ENT button to confirm.

INFO button	Press to display or cancel the detailed information of the disc during playback. (remote only)	
AUDIO button	DVD discs can contain up to 8 audio bit streams. For example: English, French, etc. To select the audio bit stream you prefer, press the AUDIO button during playback. The DVD player will play the next audio bit stream every time you press the AUDIO button in succession. (remote only)	
SUBT button	When a DVD is playing, press the SUBT button to select a subtitle language or to turn subtitles off. A DVD disc can be recorded with at most 32 subtitles. Note: this function is only available for discs recorded with multi-subtitles. (remote only)	
ANGLE button	Press the ANGLE button to play the disc in multi-angle. Multi-angle means that a scene is shot from different angles so the audience can watch from any angle. If there are multiple angles in a scene, you can use the ANGLE button to select the angle you enjoy. Press the ANGLE button repeatedly to view different angle options. JPEG Playback

- 1. Load a JPEG in the disc tray and the player will search and play the disc automatically.
- 2. The screen displays the root folder with several subdirectories/subfolders. Use the ▲▼ buttons to select desired folder. Then press the ENTER/ENT button or PLAY/▶ button to confirm your selection.
- 3. The screen enters the subfolder with several files. Use the ▲▼ buttons tp se;ect desired file. Then press the ENTER/ENT button or PLAY/▶ button to confirm your selection.
- 4. Press the ◀ button to return to the previous folder or directory.

Note: many discs have other items besides pictures.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR ATTACHING YOUR PORTABLE DVD PLAYER CASE IN A VEHICLE

Please read and follow these instructions carefully when attaching this case inside your vehicle. For easy installation, do not place the DVD player in the case until the case is attached inside the vehicle.

Caution

- 1. Do not use this DVD player case as a swing, car seat, or for any other purpose than to hold a DVD player and accessories.
- 2. The DVD player case is intended for viewing only from the rear seats. No not install or use this product in the front seat of a vehicle.
- 3. In case of collision or a sudden stop, to reduce the chance of injury, always keep the DVD player strapped securely while the vehicle is moving.

Your DVD player can be securely attached in one of the following ways to view movies from the rear seats:

- Directly behind either the driver or passenger seat
- Between two front bucket seats

Caution

Always position the plastic hooks and strap adjustment slider so they do not contact the back of the head of the person in the front seat.

Carrying Case

To attach the DVD player case to a seat back (figures 1 and 2)

- 1. Unzip the main compartment that holds the player; locate the set of rings tucked inside the top edge of the case (A).
- 2. Locate the two straps with hooks on each end.
- 3. Hook one end of each strap to the rings at the top of the case (A).
- 4. Criss-cross the straps around the front of the headrest (B) and hook the straps to a second set of rings on the lower part of the case (C).
- 5. Tighten up the straps until secure.





To suspend the DVD player case between two bucket seats (figure 3):

- 1. Unzip the main compartment that holds the player; locate the set of rings tucked inside the top edge of the case (A).
- 2. Locate the two straps with hooks on each end.
- 3. Hook one end of each strap to the rings at the top of the case (A).
- 4. Wrap each strap around the headrest of seat; hook the straps to a second set of rings on the lower part of the case (C); in some vehicles, the middle rings in the gusset might work best (D).
- 5. Tighten up the straps until secure.



Definitions

Letterbox screen

This refers to a screen on which the playback picture of wide-screen DVDs appears with black bands running along the top and bottom.

Pan & Scan screen

This refers to a screen on which the playback picture of wide-screen DVDs is cut off at the left and right sides.



JPEG

Troubleshooting

If you suspect there is something wrong with the DVD player, immediately turn off the power. Disconnect the power connector and check that there is no smoke or excessive heat coming from the unit.

Never open or try to repair the unit yourself. There are no user serviceable parts inside.
