Introducing the VCR Commander Service

The VCR CommanderTM service allows you to easily record programs whether your television is on or off. You simply select programs to record from the Explorer[®] Digital Home Communications Terminal (DHCT) Interactive Program Guide (IPG) or use the VCR Timer feature. The VCR Commander service works with models of the Explorer DHCT that have the infrared (IR) port on the back of the unit to control VCR recording.

Before you can use the VCR Commander service, you must connect the IR Blaster and then set up the DHCT to recognize your brand of VCR.

Use this guide for the following tasks:

- Connecting the IR Blaster to the Explorer DHCT and to your VCR
- Setting up the VCR Commander service to work with your brand of VCR
- Scheduling a program to record on your VCR

Notes:

- The IR Blaster is compatible with all Explorer DHCTs except the Explorer 2000; for the Explorer 2000 refer to the VCR Commander™ Module User's Guide.
- Refer to your DHCT user's installation guide for information about setting up your Explorer DHCT, and to your remote control user's guide for information about setting up and using your remote control.

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Installing the IR Blaster

This section explains how to

- Attach the IR Blaster cable to the Explorer DHCT
- Attach the IR Blaster to your VCR

Attaching the IR Blaster Cable Connector




WARNING:

Avoid electric shock. Disconnect the DHCT from the AC power outlet before attaching the connector.

To attach the IR Blaster cable to the Explorer DHCT, complete these steps.

- 1. Disconnect the Explorer DHCT from the AC power outlet.
- 2. Locate the port labeled IR on the back of the Explorer DHCT.
- 3. Plug the cable connector into the IR port.
- 4. Reconnect the Explorer DHCT to the AC power outlet.



Installing the IR Blaster, Continued

Attaching the IR Blaster to Your VCR

- Refer to your VCR user's guide to locate the IR sensor window. (The IR sensor is where the VCR receives the remote control signal.)
- Remove the covering on the adhesive strip from the loop tape, which is attached to the hook fastener on the IR Blaster.




- Attaching the IR Blaster to the VCR may be easier if the loop tape remains attached to the hook fasteners.
- IR Blaster

 Hook Fastener
 Loop Tape
 Remove Adhesive Strip Covering
- After attaching the IR Blaster to the VCR, the hook and loop fastener allows you to easily remove the IR Blaster for cleaning or to move the VCR.
- 3. Mount the IR Blaster within 3 inches of the IR sensor on your VCR by pressing the IR Blaster against your VCR to secure it.

Notes:

- A, B, C, and D are typical places where the IR Blaster can be attached (within 3 inches of the IR sensor on your VCR).
- Do not block the tape insert door on your VCR.



Setting Up VCR Commander Service

Use your Explorer Remote Control to set up the VCR Commander service.

After you connect the IR Blaster, you must program the code for your brand of VCR into the memory of the VCR Commander.

Before you begin

- Be sure the VCR is off
- Be sure the TV is on and tuned to your cable channel (3 or 4)

Note: At any time during this procedure, you can press or to manually record a program on your VCR.

- 1. Turn on the power to your Explorer DHCT.
- 2. Press **SETTINGS** twice to display the General Settings menu.




Press ▲ or ▼ to scroll to the Set: VCR Commander preference; then, press SELECT.
 Note: If the menu does not display the VCR Commander option, contact your cable service provider.




4. Press ▲ or ▼ to scroll to **Setup**; then, press **SELECT**.




- 5. Scroll to **VCR Input**; then, press **SELECT**.
- 6. Your VCR is connected to your DHCT by one of the following cable types. Locate your cable type in this step and follow the instructions:
 - For RF/coaxial cable, choose **Channel 3/4**; then, press **SELECT**.






• The For RCA jacks, choose **Audio-Video**; then, press **SELECT**.




• For S-Video (SVHS), choose **S-Video**; then, press **SELECT**.



7. Press SELECT again; press ▲ or ▼ to scroll to Setup and press **SELECT** again.



8. Press ▲ or ▼ to scroll to VCR Code; then, press SELECT to display the VCR Commander Instructions screen.



VCR Commander Instructions

- Refer to the Manufacturer's VCR Codes section in this guide to find the code choice(s)
- Please power OFF your VCR. for your brand of VCR. Enter the Model Code for your VCR or 000, then press SELECT. A Clear VCR Model Code Cancel Setup 10. Enter the code for your brand

of VCR; then, press **SELECT**.

Notes:

- If more than one code is available for your brand of VCR, use the first code listed.
- If the code choice has only 3 digits, add a leading 0 (zero).
- If you enter an incorrect number, press A; then, reenter the code.



- 11. Wait for the test process to complete and the power to your VCR to turn on.
- 12. Did the power to your VCR turn on?
 - If **yes**, press A.
 - If **no**, choose one of the following:
 - There are additional code choices for your brand of VCR; press and repeat steps 8 through 10 using the next code in your list of choices.
 - There are no additional code choices for your brand of VCR, go to step 16.
- 13. Insert a blank tape into your VCR and turn the VCR off; then, press **SELECT** to begin a recording test.






14. Wait for the recording process to begin.



- 15. Did the VCR begin recording?
 - If yes, the VCR Commander service setup is complete.
 Press SELECT to return to the General Settings menu.



- If **no**, press A and choose one of the following:
 - There are additional code choices for your brand of VCR; enter the next code in your list of choices and press SELECT. Then, repeat steps 11 through 15.
 - There are no additional code choices for your brand of VCR, go to step 16.



16. If none of the codes turn on the VCR power and start the recording, enter code **0000**; then, press **SELECT**.

Note: The entire VCR code library will be scanned. This process can take several minutes.



17. Wait for the test process to complete.



18. Press SELECT slowly and repeatedly, and wait for the VCR power to turn on; then, press A to begin the recording test process.

Note: If the power to the VCR does not turn on, call your cable service provider for help.



Scheduling VCR Recording

One-Touch Recording

You can instantly record the current program using your remote control.

- Turn on the power to your Explorer DHCT.
- 2. Press **SETTINGS** once while viewing a full-screen TV program.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to scroll to the Start Recording...Now option.



4. Press **SELECT** to setup the recording process.

Note: If the VCR Input option was set correctly in the General Settings VCR Commander Service Setup, you will see instructions for selecting the Input option of your VCR.

- 5. Put a blank tape in your VCR.
- 6. Turn off the power to your VCR.
- 7. Press SELECT to start recording the program. The DHCT displays rEc, which indicates that the recording process is preventing you from using most of the keys on the remote control. This ensures that your recording will not be interrupted accidentally.





- 8. Verify that the DHCT power is on by checking the LED under the Power button on the front panel. If the LED is not illuminated, press POWER or CBL on your remote control.
- 9. Press **EXIT** to stop recording.

Using the IPG

You can program your VCR to record future TV programs, directly from the IPG, using your remote control. You can select up to eight programs to record.

- Turn on the power to your Explorer DHCT.
- 2. Press GUIDE . The IPG appears.
- 3. Press the arrow keys to locate and highlight the future program you want to record; then, press **SELECT**.
- 4. Press ▲ or ▼ to scroll to Set a VCR Timer for...; then, press SELECT to set the timer. The programs for which you set timers are highlighted in red, and the red REC icon indicates that a VCR timer is set.







- 5. Press **EXIT** to return to the TV program.
- 6. Put a blank tape in your VCR.
- 7. Turn off the power to the VCR.

 Note: When you set a timer from the IPG, you are setting a one-time only timer for that program. See Using the VCR Timer for information about setting 7-day, weekday only, weekend only, or single-day timers.



Using the VCR Timer


The VCR timer sets your VCR Commander service to record programs at specific days and times. Use your remote control to set the channel, day, start time, and stop time of the program or programs you want to record. You can select/choose up to eight timers including the timers set from the IPG.

Important: Do not overlap program times when setting up the VCR timer. A program that you set to record will not begin recording until the previous VCR timer event has stopped.


- 1. Turn on the power to your Explorer DHCT.
- Press SETTINGS twice while viewing a full-screen TV program.



 Press ▲ or ▼ to scroll to the Timer: VCR New option; then, press SELECT.



- 4. Follow the on-screen instructions to set the recording time. Refer to your *Interactive Program Guide for Explorer®*Digital Home Communications
 Terminal User's Guide for detailed instructions to set the VCR Timer.
- 5. Press A to accept the timer settings.
- 6. Put a blank tape in your VCR; then, set the Input option you selected on your VCR.
- 7. Turn off the VCR.
- 8. Press SELECT to set the timer; then, press EXIT to return to the TV program.






Clearing a VCR Timer

You can delete a scheduled VCR Timer program from the VCR Timer.

- Turn on the power to your Explorer DHCT.
- Press SETTINGS twice while viewing a full-screen TV program.



 Press ▲ or ▼ to scroll to the Timer: VCR preference number for the VCR Timer you want to delete.



4. Press to clear the timer; then, press XIII to return to the TV program.

Note: The program name appears in the current CHAN column.

5. Press C twice to clear the timer.

Troubleshooting

Check the following list for possible problems. If a problem occurs, you may be able to easily resolve it before calling your cable service provider.

Message or Problem	Possible Cause	Check and Correct
VCR Commander service did not turn on the power to the VCR for the scheduled recording and/or did not begin recording.	A blank tape is not in the VCR.	Insert a blank tape.
	The VCR is not off.	Power off the VCR.
	The IR Blaster is improperly positioned.	Move the IR Blaster around until you are in front of or within 3 inches of the sensor window on the VCR.
	VCR Timer is improperly set.	See Using the VCR Timer in the Scheduling VCR Recording section.
The VCR Commander Menu option does not appear on the screen.	Your DHCT is not authorized for VCR Commander service.	Call your cable service provider.
After entering your VCR code, the VCR will not turn on.	The VCR code is incorrect.	Try another VCR code for your VCR brand or enter 0000. See the instructions in the section on Setting Up the VCR Commander Service.
Your VCR powered on	A blank tape is not in the VCR.	Insert a blank tape.
but did not begin recording.	The incorrect VCR code was entered.	Try another VCR code for your VCR brand or enter 0000 . See the instructions in the section on Setting Up the VCR Commander Service .
You recorded an on-screen message (blocked barker), which states the channel was not authorized.	The channel, time, or rating was blocked after the program timer was set.	Blocking should be done before setting the program timer.
	Program became blocked after One- Touch recording started.	Make sure Parental Control is off before starting a One-Touch recording.
