



BEFORE YOU BEGIN



Your portable stereo operates on battery or AC Power.

AC/DC POWER CONVERTER

Plug the male end of the AC/DC power converter into the back of the unit. Plug the other end of the converter into an AC power outlet.

BATTERY POWER

Insert 6 D-sized alkaline batteries (not supplied) and you can take your stereo just about anywhere. Open the battery compartment door on the back of the unit by pressing down on the two tabs and pulling out the cover. Insert batteries as shown on the back of the unit. To operate the unit on battery power, the AC/DC power convertor must be disconnected from the DC jack on the back of the unit.

Batteries Don't Last Forever

If you're not going to use your portable stereo for more than a month, be sure to take the batteries out, or they might leak and cause you all kinds of problems.

MOISTURE CONDENSATION

Just as moisture can form on the inside of windows on cold day, it can also form on the inside of your portable stereo, causing it to malfunction.

If moisture forms inside this player, it may not operate properly. To correct the problem, turn off the power and wait about 30 minutes for moisture to evaporate.


ANTENNAS

- The AM antenna is built in.
- The FM whip antenna is attached. Stretch it to its full length and adjust its position to improve FM reception.

HEADPHONES

To listen to your stereo with headphones (not included), use the 3.5 mm PHONES jack on the back of the unit.

GENERAL CONTROLS



POWER ON/OFF

Press and release the POWER button to turn power on and off.

FUNCTION CONTROL

Press the FUNCTION control to choose among the available sources of sound: RADIO, CD, or TAPE.


VOLUME

Press the VOLUME + and - controls to increase or decrease the volume.

EQUALIZER

Repeatedly press and release the EQUALIZER button to advance through the four preset electronic equalizer settings (FLAT, ROCK, VOCAL, or JAZZ).

USING THE RADIO



TUNING IN RADIO STATIONS

Repeatedly press the FUNCTION Control until RADIO is selected (the radio frequency appears in the display). Use the following buttons to make desired adjustments.

- Press the BAND button repeatedly to choose AM or FM (your selection appears in the display).
- Press ST/MONO to choose between FM mono or FM stereo. Note that AM stations are broadcast in mono only, and that the FM radio station must be transmitting in stereo for you to receive it in stereo.
- Use the TUNING up and down buttons to select the radio station.
- Adjust the VOLUME to desired level.
- To turn on the Seek feature, which locates the next station, press and quickly release the SEEK/SCAN button
- To turn on the Scan feature, which searches for stations, press and momentarily hold the SEEK/SCAN button before releasing it. When a station is found, the Scan feature allows you to listen for a few seconds and then moves to the next station. When you find a station you like, press the SEEK/SCAN button again to choose that station.

STORING RADIO STATIONS IN MEMORY


Preset up to five AM and five FM stations for easy access.

- 1. Choose the radio band and station.
- 2. Press the MEMORY button. The preset indicator and the station frequency blink in the display.
- 3. Press one of the five MEMORY PRESETS buttons (1, 2, 3, 4, or 5) to store the radio station frequency in that preset location.

RECALLING PRESET STATIONS

- 1. Choose the radio band (AM or FM).
- 2. Press the appropriate MEMORY PRESETS number button (the preset number appears in the display).

USING THE CASSETTE DECK



UNDERSTANDING THE BUTTONS

If you know what each button does, it's easy to figure out how to operate the tape deck. REC ● — Press to record from the CD player or to record from the radio.

PLAY ► — Press to play cassettes.

REWIND ◀◀ — From stop mode, press to rewind the tape toward the beginning.

F.FWD ►► — From stop mode, press to advance the tape toward the end. STOP/EJECT■ — Press to stop current tape activity, or to open the cassette compartment door when no buttons are active.

PAUSE \(\big| - \text{Press to interrupt tape play or record mode. Press a second time to resume tape play or tape record mode

PLAYING CASSETTE TAPES

- 1. Repeatedly press the FUNCTION Control until TAPE is selected (TAPE and CASS appear in the
- 2. Press STOP/EJECT■ to open the cassette compartment door. Note that an internal interlock prevents the cassette door from opening unless all controls are in their off (up) position.
- 3. Insert a cassette by gently sliding it into the cassette carry compartment in the door with the exposed tape upward.
- 4. Close the door securely.
- 5. Press REWIND ◀◀ or F.FWD ▶▶ to move tape to the desired starting point
- 6. Press PLAY ► to begin playing the tape.

RECORDING FROM THE RADIO

- 1. Insert a blank cassette tape into the tape deck 2. Repeatedly press FUNCTION Control until RADIO is selected.
- 3. Select a radio station.
- Press the REC button to begin recording.
- Press STOP/EJECT to end recording.

RECORDING CDs


- 1. Insert a blank cassette tape into the tape deck.
- 2. Repeatedly press the FUNCTION Control until the CD player is selected.
- 3. Insert a CD and select the first track you want to record. 4. Press PLAY/PAUSE ► twice to begin and pause CD play.
- 5. Press PAUSE **■** and then REC on the tape deck.
- 6. Press PAUSE **II** on the tape deck and PLAY/PAUSE **▶II** on the CD player at the same time to begin recording.

AUTOMATIC STOP FEATURE

When the tape deck is operating in any mode and the end of the tape is reached, the tape deck automatically shuts itself off and returns all buttons to the off position.

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USING THE CD PLAYER



LOADING AND PLAYING CDs

- 1. Repeatedly press the FUNCTION Control until the CD player is selected (cd and rEAD appear in the display).
- 2. Press the OPEN/CLOSE button to open the CD drawer (dr out appears in the display).
- 3. Place a CD into the compartment with label side facing up.
- 4. Press the OPEN/CLOSE button again to close the CD drawer (the unit reads the CD's table of contents and then the total number of tracks on the CD and the CD's total playing time appear in the display).
- 5. Press REV TRACK ◀◀ or FWD TRACK ▶▶ to choose a track.
- 6. Press PLAY/PAUSE ►/II to begin play.
- 7. Press STOP to stop play.

You can play 3" and 5" CDs in this CD player.

PAUSING CD PLAY

To temporarily stop play during operation, press PLAY/PAUSE ▶/▮▮ To resume play, press PLAY/PAUSE ▶/**II** again.

SWITCHING TRACKS

During play, pause, or stop mode, you can skip forward or backward to the beginning of any selection on the CD by using the REV TRACK ◀◀ and FWD TRACK ▶▶ buttons.

Momentarily press the REV TRACK ◀◀ or FWD TRACK ▶▶ button to move to the beginning of a selection on the CD. To "skip" to another selection on the CD, repeatedly press and release the buttons.

SEARCHING A CD

During play or pause mode, pressing and holding the REV TRACK ◀◀ or FWD TRACK ▶▶ button enables you to speed forward or move quickly backward to any point on the CD. The CD material will be audible, allowing you to scan for a favorite segment or skip a segment. Normal play resumes when you release the button.

PROGRAMMING PLAY ORDER

You can program up to 20 tracks on a CD to play in the order you choose. The CD player must be stopped before you program tracks.

- 1. Press PROGRAM to enter Program mode (PROGRAM appears in the display).
- the first memory location. 3. Press PROGRAM to enter the track into memory. 4. Repeat Steps 2 and 3 to store additional tracks in memory.

Note: When all 20 memory locations have been used, Pr Full appears in the display for 3 to 5

2. Press the REV TRACK ◀◀ or FWD TRACK ▶▶ button to choose the track you want to store in

seconds. Then the first programmed track appears in the display. When this happens, any track you enter replaces the displayed track. 5. Press PLAY/PAUSE \[\rightarrow \]. The tracks play in the programmed order. PROGRAM, the current

track number, and the track's elapsed time appear in the display Note: During play, you can press the REV TRACK ◄ or FWD TRACK ► button to move through the programmed sequence.

CHECKING THE PROGRAM

While the CD is stopped, repeatedly press PROGRAM to step through the program in memory.

EDITING THE PROGRAM

To replace one of the tracks in your program:

- · Repeatedly press PROGRAM while the CD is stopped until the track you want to replace appears in the display.
- To add a track to the end of your program:

• Repeatedly press PROGRAM until you reach the end of the program. Then follow steps 2 and

CLEARING THE PROGRAM FROM MEMORY

While in program mode, press and hold the PROGRAM button (Pr CLr appears in the display). Note: The program will also be erased if you turn off the unit or load a different CD.

SHUFFLING PLAY

- 1. Load a CD and close the door.
- 2. Press the SHUFFLE button to play tracks in random order (shuffle and play appear in the display). The unit automatically starts playing the tracks in shuffled sequence
- Note: Pressing the SHUFFLE button while a CD is playing causes the CD player to immediately start playing the tracks in random order.
- 3. Press SHUFFLE again to cancel shuffle play and return to normal play beginning with the track currently playing.

REPEATING PLAY

The REPEAT ONE/ALL button allows you to repeat one track or all tracks. To scroll through the choices (REPEAT ONE, REPEAT ALL, and OFF), continually press and release the REPEAT ONE/ALL button and check the display to see which choice you've selected. The following chart illustrates how REPEAT ONE/ALL works in various modes.

Play Mode:	Repeat One replays current track	Repeat All replays entire CD
Shuffle Mode:	Repeat One replays current track	Repeat All replays entire CD in a different shuffle sequence
Program Mode:	Repeat One replays current track	Repeat All replays the program

USING THE STOP BUTTON

Press the STOP ■ button once to terminate CD play. Press STOP ■ again to exit Program mode

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

CLEANING THE EXTERIOR

• Disconnect the system from AC power before cleaning the exterior of the unit with a soft dust

HANDLING CDs

- Do not touch the signal surfaces. Hold CDs by the edges, or by one edge and the hole.
- Do not affix labels or adhesive tape to the label surfaces. Do not scratch or damage the label. • CDs rotate at high speeds inside the player. Do not use damaged (cracked or warped) CDs.

- Dirty CDs can cause poor sound quality. Always keep CDs clean by wiping them gently with a soft cloth from the inner edge toward the outer perimeter.
- If a CD becomes dirty, wet a soft cloth in water, wring it out well, wipe the dirt away gently and then remove any water drops with a dry cloth.
- Do not use record cleaning sprays or antistatic agents on CDs. Also, never clean CDs with benzene, thinner, or other volatile solvents which may cause damage to the disc surface.


TAPE CARE

CLEANING CDs

- Don't expose tapes to sunlight or store in hot places. High temperatures may warp the shell or
- damage the tape itself. Keep tapes in their cases when not in use.
- Cassette tapes can be erased by magnetic fields produced by magnets, electric motors, electrical transformers, and other devices. Keep tapes away from magnets and magnetic fields.

CLEANING THE TAPE HEADS

Iron oxide particles from the magnetic tape can build up on the parts that come in contact with the tape. These deposits can cause incomplete erasure, muffled playback sound, and might prevent automatic stop.



Clean these parts

Clean heads after every 25 hours of use.

Demagnetize the head occasionally with a head

capstan, and pinch wheel with a head cleaner.

demagnetizing cassette (available from many audio equipment stores). Never use any metal objects on or near the tape heads.

Do not allow any cleaning material to fall into the tape assembly.

TROUBLESHOOTING TIPS

Problem	Solution
System doesn't turn on	 Make sure AC/DC power convertor is securely plugged into the AC power outlet and the male end is plugged into the DC jack on the back of the unit (or make sure batteries are fresh). To operate on batteries, unplug the DC male end of the plug from the cabinet back. Unplug the unit for a moment, and then plug it back in. Check the outlet by plugging in another device.
No sound	 Adjust volume setting. Make sure you've selected the correct function: RADIO, TAPE, or CD.
Poor radio reception	 Adjust the FM whip antenna for better FM reception. Rotate the unit to achieve better AM reception. Try turning off electrical appliances near the unit, such as hair dryers, vacuum cleaners, or fluorescent lights.
CD doesn't play	Make sure you've put a CD in the tray.
