You do not have to set the clock time as a built-in automatic time set system is equipped in this clock powered by 3V (2 AA batteries, included and installed). All you have to do is to plug this clock for power and current time will be shown automatically after setting the time zone and daylight saving time (read below). However, the batteries can also be exhausted and we recommend that you replace the batteries every 2-3 years.

This clock radio is equipped with a memory holding system that can be powered with a "AA" batteries (included). The power "AA" batteries (included). The power failure protection circuit will not operate unless battery is installed. When normal household power is interrupted, or AC line cord is unplugged, the batteries will power the clock radio to keep track of time and alarm settings programmed into memory. When the battery backup functions, the digital display will not light, however, the function of alarm still occurs during the power interruption if remaining battery power is adequate.
