Tone Control — lets you adjust the tone for superior sound.

Telescoping Antenna — gives you high sensitivity FM reception.

Earphone — lets you listen in privacy.

Automatic Frequency Control (AFC) — gives you drift-free FM reception.

INSTALLING BATTERIES

Your radio is powered by four C batteries. For the longest operation, we recommend alkaline batteries (not supplied), such as Radio Shack Cat. No. 23-551.

Follow these steps to install batteries.

 Press the two latches on the battery compartment cover and pull it off in the direction of the arrows.

2. Place four C batteries in the compartment as indicated by the polarity symbols (+ and –) marked in the compartment.

Cautions:

- Use only fresh batteries of the required size and recommended type.
- Never mix fresh and old batteries, batteries of different types (standard, alkaline, or rechargeable), or rechargeable batteries of different capacities.
- Never leave dead or weak batteries in the radio. They can leak chemicals that can damage the radio.
- If you do not plan to use the radio, or if you are using the power cord, for a month or more, remove the batteries.
- 3. Replace the cover.
- 4. Set AC/DC to DC.

When the sound weakens, replace the batteries.

USING AC POWER

- Press the two latches on the battery compartment cover and pull it off in the direction of the arrows.
- Pull out the AC power cord from the upper level of the compartment and plug it into any standard AC power outlet.

- 3. Route the power cord through the hole on the battery compartment cover and replace the cover.
- 4. Set AC/DC to AC.

OPERATING YOUR RADIO

- To turn on the radio, turn VOLUME clockwise until it clicks.
- 2. Set AM/FM to the desired band.

Note: For better FM reception, extend the telescoping antenna to its full length. For better AM reception, turn or move the radio.

- Rotate the tuning control to select the desired station.
- Set AFC to OUT when tuning an FM station. Set AFC to IN to lock in the tuned FM station for drift-free reception.
- Adjust VOLUME to a comfortable listening level.
- 6. Adjust **TONE LOW/HIGH** to the desired tone.
- 7. Turn **VOLUME** to **OFF** until it clicks to turn off the radio.

USING AN EARPHONE

To enjoy your radio in privacy, plug the supplied earphone into the **EAR** jack. The built-in speaker is automatically disconnected.

Listening Safely

To protect your hearing, follow these guidelines when you use an earphone.

- Set the volume to the lowest setting before you begin listening. After you begin listening, adjust the volume to a comfortable level.
- Do not listen at extremely high volume levels. Extended high-volume listening can lead to permanent hearing loss.
- Once you set the volume, do not increase it. Over time, your ears adapt to the volume level, so a volume level that does not cause discomfort might still damage your hearing.

MAINTENANCE

Your Radio Shack AM/FM Portable Radio is an example of superior design and craftsmanship. The following suggestions will help you care for the radio so you can use it for years.

- Keep the radio dry. If it gets wet, immediately wipe it dry. Liquids might contain minerals that can corrode the electronic circuits.
- Use and store the radio only in normal temperature environments. Temperature extremes can shorten the life of electronic devices, damage batteries and distort or melt plastic parts.
- Handle the radio gently and carefully.
 Dropping it can damage its circuit board and can cause the radio to work improperly.
- Keep the radio away from dust and dirt, which can cause premature wear of parts.
- Wipe the radio with a damp cloth occasionally to keep it looking new. Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents, or strong detergents to clean the radio.

Modifying or tampering with the radio's internal components can cause a malfunction and might invalidate the radio's warranty and void your FCC authorization to operate it. If your radio is not performing as it should, take it to your local Radio Shack store for assistance.
