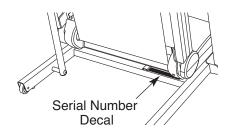

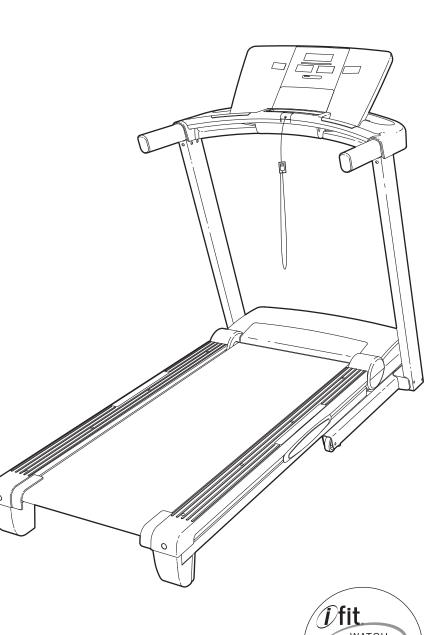

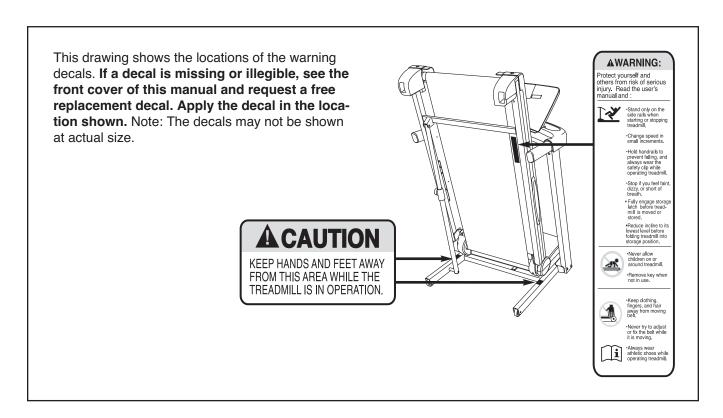

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IMPORTANT PRECAUTIONS

WARNING: To reduce the risk of serious injury, read all important precautions and instructions in this manual and all warnings on your treadmill before using your treadmill. ICON assumes no responsibility for personal injury or property damage sustained by or through the use of this product.

- Before beginning any exercise program, consult your physician. This is especially important for persons over age 35 or persons with pre-existing health problems.
- 2. It is the responsibility of the owner to ensure that all users of this treadmill are adequately informed of all warnings and precautions.
- 3. Use the treadmill only as described.
- 4. Place the treadmill on a level surface, with at least 8 ft. (2.4 m) of clearance behind it and 2 ft. (0.6 m) on each side. Do not place the treadmill on any surface that blocks air openings. To protect the floor or carpet from damage, place a mat under the treadmill.
- Keep the treadmill indoors, away from moisture and dust. Do not put the treadmill in a garage or covered patio, or near water.
- Do not operate the treadmill where aerosol products are used or where oxygen is being administered.
- 7. Keep children under age 12 and pets away from the treadmill at all times.
- 8. The treadmill should be used only by persons weighing 300 lbs. (136 kg) or less.
- Never allow more than one person on the treadmill at a time.
- 10. Wear appropriate exercise clothes when using the treadmill. Do not wear loose clothes that could become caught in the treadmill. Athletic support clothes are recommended for both men and women. Always wear athletic shoes. Never use the treadmill with bare feet, wearing only stockings, or in sandals.
- 11. When connecting the power cord (see page 12), plug the power cord into a surge suppressor (not included) and plug the surge suppressor into a grounded circuit capable

- of carrying 15 or more amps. No other appliance should be on the same circuit. Do not use an extension cord.
- 12. Use only a single-outlet surge suppressor that meets all of the specifications described on page 12. To purchase a surge suppressor, see your local REEBOK dealer or call the telephone number on the front cover of this manual and order part number 146148, or see your local electronics store.
- 13. Failure to use a properly functioning surge suppressor could result in damage to the control system of the treadmill. If the control system is damaged, the walking belt may slow, accelerate, or stop unexpectedly, which may result in a fall and serious injury.
- 14. Keep the power cord and the surge suppressor away from heated surfaces.
- 15. Never move the walking belt while the power is turned off. Do not operate the treadmill if the power cord or plug is damaged, or if the treadmill is not working properly. (See TROUBLESHOOTING on page 22 if the treadmill is not working properly.)
- 16. Read, understand, and test the emergency stop procedure before using the treadmill (see HOW TO TURN ON THE POWER on page 14).
- 17. Never start the treadmill while you are standing on the walking belt. Always hold the handrails while using the treadmill.
- The treadmill is capable of high speeds.
 Adjust the speed in small increments to avoid sudden jumps in speed.
- 19. The pulse sensor is not a medical device. Various factors, including the user's movement, may affect the accuracy of heart rate readings. The pulse sensor is intended only as an exercise aid in determining heart rate trends in general.

- 20. Never leave the treadmill unattended while it is running. Always remove the key, unplug the power cord, and switch the reset/off circuit breaker to the off position when the treadmill is not in use. (See the drawing on page 5 for the location of the circuit breaker.)
- 21. Do not attempt to raise, lower, or move the treadmill until it is properly assembled. (See ASSEMBLY on page 6, and HOW TO FOLD AND MOVE THE TREADMILL on page 21.) You must be able to safely lift 45 lbs. (20 kg) to raise, lower, or move the treadmill.
- 22. When folding or moving the treadmill, make sure that the frame is held securely in the storage position.
- 23. Never insert any object into any opening on the treadmill.

- 24. Inspect and properly tighten all parts of the treadmill regularly.
- 25. DANGER: Always unplug the power cord immediately after use, before cleaning the treadmill, and before performing the maintenance and adjustment procedures described in this manual. Never remove the motor hood unless instructed to do so by an authorized service representative. Servicing other than the procedures in this manual should be performed by an authorized service representative only.
- 26. This treadmill is intended for in-home use only. Do not use this treadmill in a commercial, rental, or institutional setting.
- 27. Over exercising may result in serious injury or death. If you feel faint or if you experience pain while exercising, stop immediately and cool down.

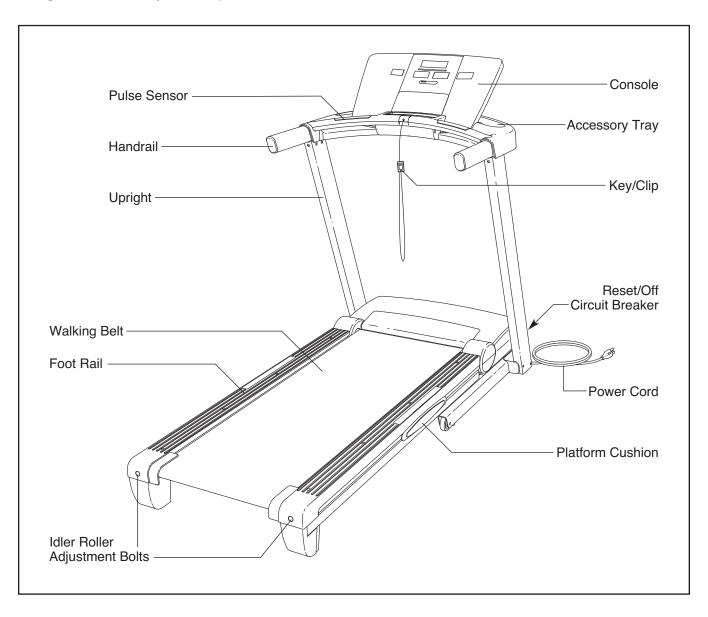
BEFORE YOU BEGIN

Thank you for selecting the new REEBOK® R 6.90 treadmill. The R 6.90 treadmill offers a selection of features designed to make your workouts at home more enjoyable and effective. And when you're not exercising, the unique treadmill can be folded up, requiring less than half the floor space of other treadmills.

For your benefit, read this manual carefully before using the treadmill. If you have questions after read-

ing this manual, please see the front cover of this manual. To help us assist you, note the product model number and serial number before contacting us. The model number and the location of the serial number decal are shown on the front cover of this manual.

Before reading further, please familiarize yourself with the parts that are labeled in the drawing below.



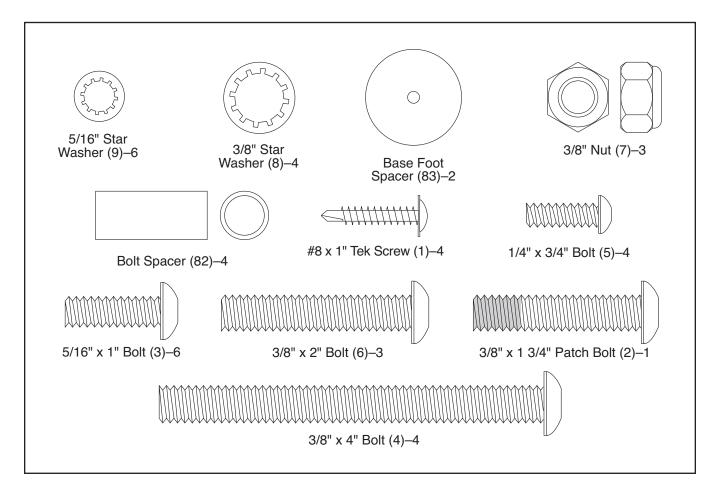
ASSEMBLY

To hire an authorized service technician to assemble the treadmill, call 1-800-445-2480.

Assembly requires two persons. Set the treadmill in a cleared area and remove all packing materials. Do not dispose of the packing materials until assembly is completed. Note: The underside of the treadmill walking belt is coated with high-performance lubricant. During shipping, some lubricant may be transferred to the top of the walking belt or the shipping carton. This is normal and does not affect treadmill performance. If there is lubricant on top of the walking belt, simply wipe off the lubricant with a soft cloth and a mild, non-abrasive cleaner.

Assembly requires the included hex keys and your own Phillips screwdriver adjustable wrench , rubber mallet , and scissors .

Use the drawings below to identify the assembly hardware. The number in parentheses below each drawing is the key number of the part, from the PART LIST near the end of this manual. The number after the parentheses is the quantity needed for assembly. Note: If a part is not in the hardware kit, check to see if it is preattached to one of the parts to be assembled. To avoid damaging plastic parts, do not use power tools for assembly. Extra hardware may be included.



1. Make sure that the power cord is unplugged.

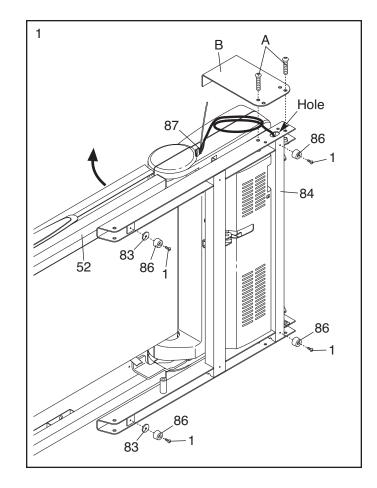
With the help of a second person, carefully tip the treadmill onto its left side. Partially fold the Frame (52) so that the treadmill is more stable; do not fully fold the Frame yet.

Remove and discard the two indicated bolts (A) and the shipping bracket (B).

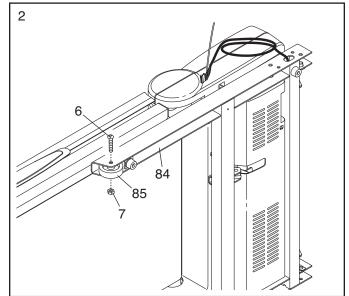
Cut the shipping tie securing the Wire Harness (87) to the Base (84). Locate the plastic tie in the indicated hole in the Base, and use the tie to pull the Wire Harness out of the hole.

Attach two Base Feet (86) to the Base (84) in the locations shown with two #8 x 1" Tek Screws (1) and two Base Foot Spacers (83).

Then, attach the other two Base Feet (86) with two #8 x 1" Tek Screws (1).



 Attach a Wheel (85) to the Base (84) with a 3/8" x 2" Bolt (6) and a 3/8" Nut (7). Do not overtighten the Nut; the Wheel must turn freely.



 Identify the Right Upright (77) and the Right Upright Spacer (88), which are marked with "Right" stickers. Insert the Wire Harness (87) through the Right Upright Spacer as shown. Then, set the Right Upright Spacer on the Base (84).

Have a second person hold the Right Upright (77) near the Base (84). **See the inset drawing.** Tie the wire tie in the Right Upright securely around the end of the Wire Harness (87). Then, pull the other end of the wire tie until the Wire Harness is routed completely through the Right Upright.

4. Hold a Bolt Spacer (82) inside the lower end of the Right Upright (77). Insert a 3/8" x 4" Bolt (4) with a 3/8" Star Washer (8) into the Right Upright and the Bolt Spacer. Repeat this step with a second Bolt Spacer (82), 3/8" x 4" Bolt (4), and 3/8" Star Washer (8).

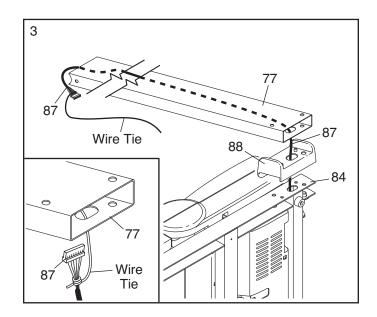
Hold the Right Upright (77) against the Right Upright Spacer (88). **Be careful not to pinch the Wire Harness (87).** Tighten the 3/8" x 4" Bolts (4) until the heads of the Bolts touch the Right Upright; **do not fully tighten the Bolts yet.**

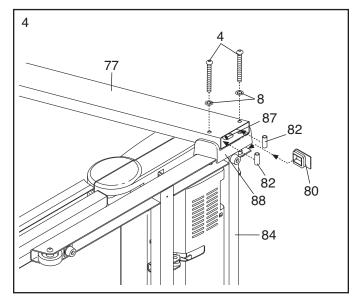
Press a Base Cap (80) into the Base (84).

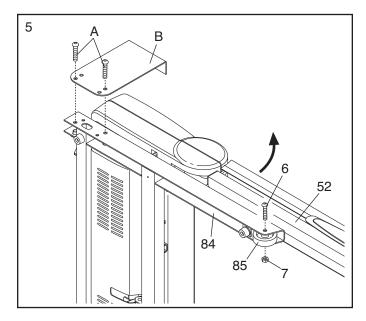
 With the help of a second person, carefully tip the treadmill onto its right side. Partially fold the Frame (52) so the treadmill is more stable; do not fully fold the Frame yet.

Remove and discard the two indicated bolts (A) and the shipping bracket (B).

Attach a Wheel (85) to the Base (84) with a 3/8" x 2" Bolt (6) and a 3/8" Nut (7). **Do not overtighten the Nut; the Wheel must turn freely.**





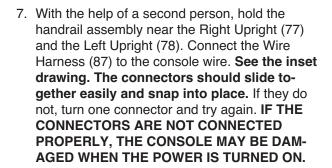


 Hold a Bolt Spacer (82) inside the lower end of the Left Upright (78). Insert a 3/8" x 4" Bolt (4) with a 3/8" Star Washer (8) into the Left Upright and the Bolt Spacer. Repeat this step with a second Bolt Spacer (82), 3/8" x 4" Bolt (4), and 3/8" Star Washer (8).

Hold the Left Upright Spacer (81) and the Left Upright (78) against the Base (84). Tighten the 3/8" x 4" Bolts (4) until the heads of the Bolts touch the Left Upright; **do not fully tighten the Bolts yet.**

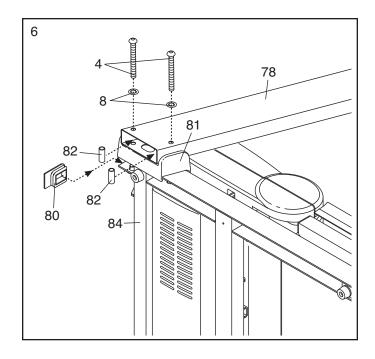
Press a Base Cap (80) into the Base (84).

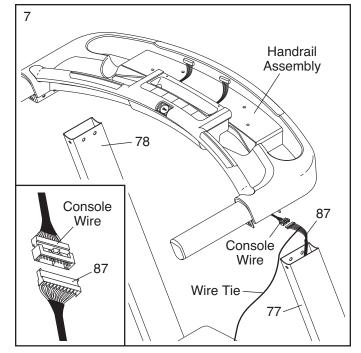
With the help of a second person, tip the treadmill so that the Base (84) is flat on the floor.



Remove the wire tie from the Wire Harness (87).

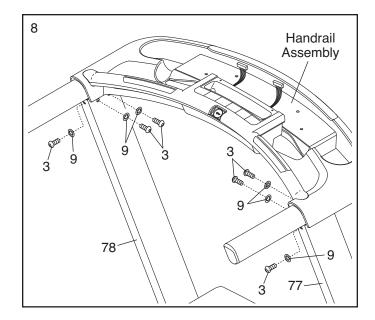
Set the handrail assembly on the Uprights (77, 78). **Be careful not to pinch the wires.**



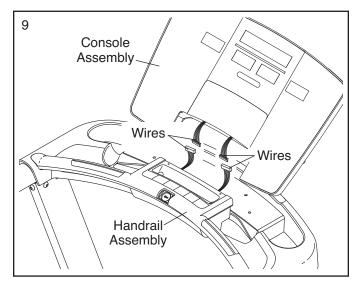


8. Attach the handrail assembly to the Uprights (77, 78) with six 5/16" x 1" Bolts (3) and six 5/16" Star Washers (9) as shown.

See assembly steps 4 and 6. Firmly tighten the 3/8" x 4" Bolts (4).

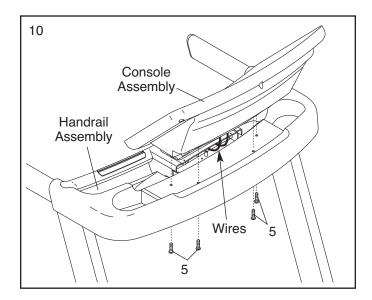


With the help of a second person, hold the console assembly near the handrail assembly.
 Connect the two wires from the console assembly to the two wires from the handrail assembly.
 See the inset drawing in step 7. The connectors should slide together easily and snap into place. If they do not, turn one connector and try again. IF THE CONNECTORS ARE NOT CONNECTED PROPERLY, THE CONSOLE MAY BE DAMAGED WHEN THE POWER IS TURNED ON.



10. Insert the wires from the console assembly into the handrail assembly.

Attach the console assembly to the handrail assembly with four 1/4" x 3/4" Bolts (5). **Be careful not to pinch the wires.**



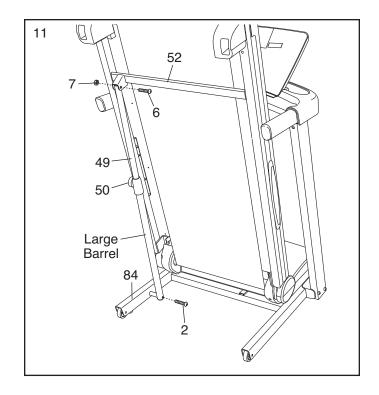
 Raise the Frame (52) to the position shown.
 Have a second person hold the Frame until this step is completed.

Orient the Storage Latch (49) so that the large barrel and the Latch Knob (50) are in the positions shown.

Attach the upper end of the Storage Latch (49) to the bracket on the Frame (52) with a 3/8" x 2" Bolt (6) and a 3/8" Nut (7).

Attach the lower end of the Storage Latch (49) to the Base (84) with a 3/8" x 1 3/4" Patch Bolt (2). Note: It may be necessary to move the Frame (52) back and forth to align the Storage Latch with the Base.

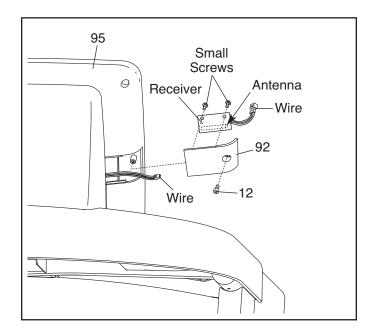
Lower the Frame (52) (see HOW TO LOWER THE TREADMILL FOR USE on page 21).



12. Make sure that all parts are properly tightened before you use the treadmill. If there are sheets of clear plastic on the treadmill decals, remove the plastic. To protect the floor or carpet, place a mat under the treadmill. Note: Extra hardware may be included. Keep the included hex keys in a secure place; one of the hex keys is used to adjust the walking belt (see pages 23 and 24).

If you purchase the optional chest pulse sensor (see page 20), follow the steps below to install the receiver included with the chest pulse sensor.

- Make sure that the power cord is unplugged. Remove the indicated #8 x 1/2" Screw (12) and the Access Door (92) from the Console Back (95).
- Connect the wire on the receiver to the indicated wire extending from the Console Back (95).
 Hold the receiver so the antenna is oriented as shown and is facing the Console Back.
 Attach the receiver to the plastic posts on the Access Door (92) with the two included small screws.
- 3. **Be careful not to pinch the wires.** Reattach the Access Door (92) with the #8 x 1/2" Screw (12). Discard the other wires included with the receiver.



OPERATION AND ADJUSTMENT

THE PRE-LUBRICATED WALKING BELT

Your treadmill features a walking belt coated with highperformance lubricant. IMPORTANT: Never apply silicone spray or other substances to the walking belt or the walking platform. Such substances will deteriorate the walking belt and cause excessive wear.

HOW TO PLUG IN THE POWER CORD

DANGER: Improper connection of the equipment-grounding conductor can result in an increased risk of electric shock. Check with a qualified electrician or serviceman if you are in doubt as to whether the product is properly grounded. Do not modify the plug provided with the product—if it will not fit the outlet, have a proper outlet installed by a qualified electrician.

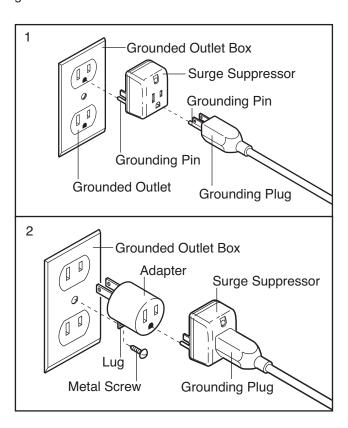
Your treadmill, like any other type of sophisticated electronic equipment, can be seriously damaged by sudden voltage changes in your home's power. Voltage surges, spikes, and noise interference can result from weather conditions or from other appliances being turned on or off. To decrease the possibility of your treadmill being damaged, always use a surge suppressor with your treadmill (see drawing 1 at the right). To purchase a surge suppressor, see your local REEBOK dealer or call the telephone number on the front cover of this manual and order part number 146148, or see your local electronics store.

Use only a single-outlet surge suppressor that is UL 1449 listed as a transient voltage surge suppressor (TVSS). The surge suppressor must have a UL suppressed voltage rating of 400 volts or less and a minimum surge dissipation of 450 joules. The surge suppressor must be electrically rated for 120 volts AC and 15 amps. There must be a monitoring light on the surge suppressor to indicate whether it is functioning properly. Failure to use a properly functioning surge suppressor could result in damage to the control system of the treadmill. If the control system is damaged, the walking belt may slow, accelerate, or stop unexpectedly, which may result in a fall and serious injury.

This product must be grounded. If it should malfunction or break down, grounding provides a path of least resistance for electric current to reduce the risk of elec-

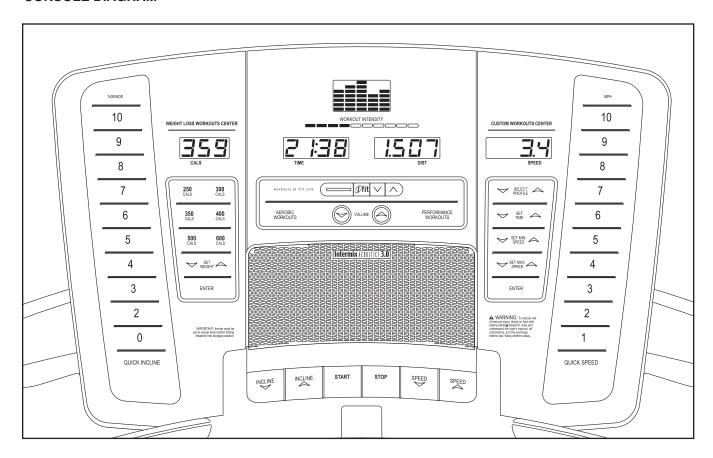
tric shock. This product is equipped with a cord having an equipment-grounding conductor and a grounding plug. Plug the power cord into a surge suppressor, and plug the surge suppressor into an appropriate outlet that is properly installed and grounded in accordance with all local codes and ordinances. IMPORTANT: The treadmill is not compatible with GFCI-equipped outlets.

This product is for use on a nominal 120-volt circuit, and has a grounding plug that looks like the plug illustrated in drawing 1 below. A temporary adapter that looks like the adapter illustrated in drawing 2 may be used to connect the surge suppressor to a 2-pole receptacle as shown in drawing 2 if a properly grounded outlet is not available.



The temporary adapter should be used only until a properly grounded outlet (drawing 1) can be installed by a qualified electrician.

The green-colored rigid ear, lug, or the like extending from the adapter must be connected to a permanent ground such as a properly grounded outlet box cover. Whenever the adapter is used it must be held in place by a metal screw. Some 2-pole receptacle outlet box covers are not grounded. Contact a qualified electrician to determine if the outlet box cover is grounded before using an adapter.



FEATURES OF THE CONSOLE

The treadmill console offers an impressive array of features designed to make your workouts more effective and enjoyable. When the manual mode of the console is selected, the speed and incline of the treadmill can be changed with the touch of a button. As you exercise, the console will display continuous exercise feedback. You can even measure your heart rate using the handgrip pulse sensor or the optional chest pulse sensor (see page 20 for information on the optional chest pulse sensor).

In addition, the console features twelve preset workouts—three aerobic workouts, three performance workouts, and six weight loss workouts. Each workout automatically controls the speed and incline of the treadmill as it guides you through an effective exercise session. You can also create your own custom workouts.

The console also features the new iFit interactive workout system. The iFit system enables the console to accept iFit interactive workout cards containing workouts designed to help you achieve specific fitness goals. For example, lose unwanted pounds with the 8-week Weight Loss workout, or train for a long-distance run with the Marathon workout. iFit workouts automatically control the treadmill while the voice of a personal

trainer coaches you and motivates you through every step of your workout. iFit cards are available separately. To purchase iFit cards at any time, call the telephone number on the front cover of this manual or go to www.iFit.com. iFit cards are also available at select stores.

You can even listen to your favorite workout music or audio books with the console's sound system while you exercise. This product has been designed specifically to work with iPod and has been certified by the developer to meet Apple performance standards.

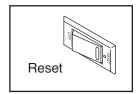

IMPORTANT: If there is a sheet of plastic on the console, remove the plastic. To prevent damage to the walking platform, wear clean athletic shoes while using the treadmill. The first time the treadmill is used, observe the alignment of the walking belt, and center the walking belt if necessary (see page 24).

HOW TO TURN ON THE POWER

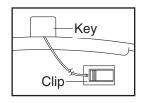
IMPORTANT: If the treadmill has been exposed to cold temperatures, allow it to warm to room temperature before turning on the power. If you do not do this, you may damage the console displays or other electrical components.

Plug in the power cord (see page 12). Next, locate the reset/off circuit breaker on the treadmill frame near the power cord. Make sure that the circuit breaker is in the reset position.



IMPORTANT: The console features a display demo mode, designed to be used if the treadmill is displayed in a store. If the displays light as soon as you plug in the power cord and switch the reset/off circuit breaker to the reset position, the demo mode is turned on. To turn off the demo mode, hold down the Stop button for a few seconds. If the displays remain lit, see THE INFORMATION MODE on page 20 to turn off the demo mode.

Next, stand on the foot rails of the treadmill. Locate the clip attached to the key (see the drawing at the right), and slide the clip securely onto the waistband of your clothes. Then, insert



the key into the console. After a moment, the displays will light. IMPORTANT: In an emergency situation, the key can be pulled from the console, causing the walking belt to slow to a stop. Test the clip by carefully taking a few steps backward; if the key is not pulled from the console, adjust the position of the clip.

Note: The console can display speed and distance in either miles or kilometers. To find which unit of measurement is selected or to change the unit of measurement, see THE INFORMATION MODE on page 20. For simplicity, all instructions in this manual refer to miles.

HOW TO USE THE MANUAL MODE

1. Insert the key into the console.

See HOW TO TURN ON THE POWER at the left.

2. Select the manual mode.

Each time the key is inserted, the manual mode will be selected. If you have selected a workout, press the Aerobic Workouts or Performance Workouts button repeatedly until only zeros appear in the display. Note: Make sure that an iFit card is not inserted into the iFit slot.

3. Start the walking belt and adjust the speed.

To start the walking belt, press the Start button, the Speed increase button, or one of the numbered Quick Speed buttons.

If you press the Start button or the Speed increase button, the walking belt will begin to move at 1 mph. As you exercise, change the speed of the walking belt as desired by pressing the Speed increase and decrease buttons next to the Start button. Each time you press one of the buttons, the speed setting will change by 0.1 mph; if you hold down the button, the speed setting will change in increments of 0.5 mph. If you press one of the numbered Quick Speed buttons, the walking belt will gradually increase in speed until it reaches the selected speed setting.

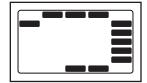
To stop the walking belt, press the Stop button. To restart the walking belt, press the Start button, the Speed increase button, or one of the numbered Quick Speed buttons.

4. Change the incline of the treadmill as desired.

To change the incline of the treadmill, press the Incline increase and decrease buttons or one of the numbered Quick Incline buttons. Each time you press one of the buttons, the incline will gradually change until it reaches the selected incline setting.

5. Monitor your progress with the displays.

The matrix—When you select the manual mode, the matrix will display a 1/4-mile (400 meter) track. As you exercise, the indicators around the track will light in succes-



sion until the entire track is lit. The track will then darken and the indicators will again begin to light in succession.

The Time display—This display will show the elapsed time. Note: When a workout is selected, the display will show the time remaining



in the workout instead of the elapsed time.

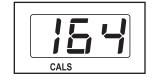
The Distance display— This display can show

This display can show the distance that you have walked or run.



The Weight Loss Workouts Center display—This display can show the approximate

play—This display can show the approximate number of calories you have burned, the incline



of the treadmill, your heart rate, and your weight.

The Custom Workouts Center display—This display will show the speed of the walking belt. When you use the Custom Workout



Center, the display will also show the number, duration, minimum speed, and maximum speed of the workout.

As you exercise, the workout intensity level bar will indicate the approximate intensity level of your exercise.

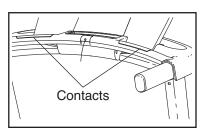


To reset the displays, press the Stop button, remove the key, and then reinsert the key.

6. Measure your heart rate if desired.

Note: If you use the handgrip pulse sensor and the chest pulse sensor at the same time, the console will not display your heart rate accurately. See page 20 for information on the chest pulse sensor.

Before using the handgrip pulse sensor, remove the sheets of plastic from the metal contacts. In addition, make sure that your hands are clean.



To measure your heart rate, stand on the foot rails and hold the metal contacts on the handrail—avoid moving your hands. When your pulse is detected, your heart rate will be shown. For the most accurate heart rate reading, continue to hold the contacts for about 15 seconds.

7. When you are finished exercising, remove the key from the console.

Step onto the foot rails, press the Stop button, and adjust the incline of the treadmill to the lowest setting. The incline must be at the lowest setting when you fold the treadmill to the storage position, or you may damage the treadmill. Next, remove the key from the console and put it in a secure place.

When you are finished using the treadmill, switch the reset/off circuit breaker to the off position and unplug the power cord. IMPORTANT: If you do not do this, the treadmill's electrical components may wear prematurely.

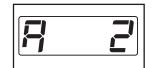
HOW TO USE A PRESET WORKOUT

1. Insert the key into the console.

See HOW TO TURN ON THE POWER on page 14.

2. Select a preset workout.

To select a preset workout, press the Aerobic Workouts button or the Performance Workouts button repeatedly until the number of the de-



sired workout appears in the display.

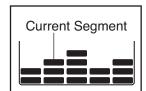
When you select a preset workout, the display will show the name, duration, maximum speed setting, and maximum incline setting of the workout. In addition, a profile of the speed settings of the workout will scroll across the matrix.

Each preset workout is divided into one-minute segments. One speed setting and one incline setting are programmed for each segment. Note: The same speed and/or incline setting may be programmed for consecutive segments.

3. Start the walking belt.

Press the Start button or the Speed increase button to start the workout. A moment after you press the button, the treadmill will automatically adjust to the first speed and incline settings of the workout. Hold the handrails and begin walking.

During the workout, the profile will show your progress. The flashing segment of the profile represents the current segment of the workout.



The height of the flashing segment indicates the speed setting for the current segment. At the end of each segment, a series of tones will sound and the next segment of the profile will begin to flash. The new speed and incline settings will appear in the display for a few seconds and the treadmill will automatically adjust to the new speed and incline settings.

The workout will continue in this way until the last segment of the profile flashes in the display and the last segment ends. The walking belt will then slow to a stop.

If the speed or incline setting is too high or too low at any time during the workout, you can manually override the setting by pressing the Speed or Incline buttons. Note: When the next segment of the workout begins, the treadmill will automatically adjust to the speed and incline settings for the next segment.

To stop the workout at any time, press the Stop button. To restart the workout, press the Start button or the Speed increase button. The walking belt will begin to move at 1 mph. When the next segment of the workout begins, the treadmill will automatically adjust to the speed and incline settings for the next segment.

4. Monitor your progress with the displays.

See step 5 on page 15.

5. Measure your heart rate if desired.

See step 6 on page 15.

6. When you are finished exercising, remove the key from the console.

See step 7 on page 15.

HOW TO USE THE CUSTOM WORKOUTS CENTER

1. Insert the key into the console.

See HOW TO TURN ON THE POWER on page 14.

2. Select the Custom Workouts Center.

To use a Custom Workouts Center workout, press the Select Profile increase button.

Select the desired profile by pressing the Select Profile increase and decrease buttons repeatedly. Then press the Enter button below the Set Max. Speed buttons. Note: If you do not press the Enter button, the display will advance to the next selection in a few seconds.

Next, select your desired workout duration by pressing the Set Time increase and decrease buttons repeatedly. Then press the Enter button.

Select your minimum workout speed by pressing the Set Min. Speed increase and decrease buttons repeatedly. Then press the Enter button.

Next, select your maximum workout speed by pressing the Set Max. Speed increase and decrease buttons repeatedly. Then press the Enter button.

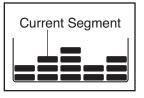
Each custom workout is divided into segments. One speed setting and one incline setting are programmed for each segment.

3. Start the walking belt.

Press the Start button to start the workout. A moment after you press the button, the walking belt will begin to move. Hold the handrails and begin walking.

During the workout, the profile will show your progress. The flashing segment of the profile represents the current segment of the workout. The

height of the flashing segment indicates the speed setting for the current segment. At the end of each segment, a series of tones will sound and the next segment of



the profile will begin to flash. The new speed and incline settings will appear in the display for a few seconds and the treadmill will automatically adjust to the new speed and incline settings.

The workout will continue in this way until the last segment of the profile flashes in the display and the last segment ends. The walking belt will then slow to a stop.

If the speed or incline setting is too high or too low at any time during the workout, you can manually override the setting by pressing the Speed or Incline buttons. Note: When the next segment of the workout begins, the treadmill will automatically adjust to the speed and incline settings for the next segment.

To stop the workout at any time, press the Stop button. To restart the workout, press the Start button or the Speed increase button. The walking belt will begin to move at 1 mph. When the next segment of the workout begins, the treadmill will automatically adjust to the speed and incline settings for the next segment.

4. Monitor your progress with the displays.

5. Measure your heart rate if desired.

6. When you are finished exercising, remove the key from the console.

HOW TO USE THE WEIGHT LOSS WORKOUTS CENTER

1. Insert the key into the console.

See HOW TO TURN ON THE POWER on page 14.

2. Select a weight loss workout.

To select a weight loss workout, press the 250 Cals, 300 Cals, 350 Cals, 400 Cals, 500 Cals or 600 Cals button. When you select a weight loss workout, the display will show the approximate number of calories you will burn, and the duration and maximum speed setting of the workout. In addition, a profile of the speed settings of the workout will scroll across the matrix.

Next, the current weight setting will appear in the display. If you have not entered your weight, press the Set Weight increase and decrease buttons repeatedly to enter your weight. Press the Enter button below the Set Weight buttons.

Each weight loss workout is divided into segments. One speed setting and one incline setting are programmed for each segment. Note: The same speed and/or incline setting may be programmed for consecutive segments.

3. Start the walking belt.

The weight loss workout will function in the same way as a preset workout (see step 3 on page 16).

4. Monitor your progress with the displays.

See step 5 on page 15. The Weight Loss Workouts Center display will show the number of calories remaining in the workout.



5. Measure your heart rate if desired.

HOW TO USE THE SOUND SYSTEM

This product has been designed specifically to work with iPod and has been certified by the developer to meet Apple performance standards. To play music or audio books through the console's speaker, you must connect your iPod, CD player, or personal audio player to the console through the audio jack or through the compatible music port for iPod. The music port will charge your iPod while you use it.

To use the audio wire, locate the audio wire and plug it into the audio jack near the speaker. Then, plug the audio wire into a jack on your iPod, CD player, or personal audio player. **Make sure that the audio wire is fully inserted.**

To use the compatible music port for iPod, you need an iFit universal iPod connector (not included). To purchase an iFit universal iPod connector, please see the front cover of this manual. Plug one end into the music port near the speaker and the other end into your iPod. Make sure that the iFit universal iPod connector is fully plugged in.

Next, press the Play button on your iPod, CD player, or personal audio player. Adjust the volume on your iPod, CD player, or personal audio player or press the Volume increase and decrease buttons on the console.

If you are using a personal CD player and the CD skips, set the CD player on the floor or another flat surface instead of on the console.

HOW TO USE AN IFIT CARD

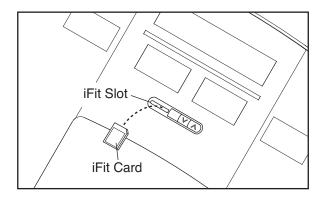
To purchase iFit cards at any time, call the telephone number on the front cover of this manual or go to www.iFit.com. iFit cards are also available at select stores.

1. Insert the key into the console.

2. Insert an iFit card and select a workout.

To use an iFit workout, insert an iFit card into the iFit slot; make sure that the iFit card is oriented so that the metal contacts are face-down and are inserted into the iFit slot.



Next, select an iFit workout by pressing the iFit increase or decrease button. When an iFit workout is selected, the display will show the number, duration, and maximum speed setting of the workout. In addition, a profile of the speed settings of the workout will appear in the display.

Each iFit workout is divided into several oneminute segments. One speed setting and one incline setting are programmed for each segment. Note: The same speed setting and/or incline setting may be programmed for consecutive segments.

3. Start the walking belt.

Press the Start button to start the workout. A moment after you press the button, the treadmill will automatically adjust to the first speed and incline settings of the workout. Hold the handrails and begin walking.

The voice of a personal trainer will guide you through the workout.

If the speed or incline setting for the current segment is too high or too low, you can override the setting by pressing the Speed or Incline buttons; however, when the next segment begins, the treadmill will automatically adjust to the speed and incline settings for the next segment.

To stop the workout at any time, press the Stop button. To restart the workout, press the Start button. The walking belt will begin to move at 1 mph. When the next segment of the workout begins, the treadmill will automatically adjust to the speed and incline settings for the next segment.

4. Monitor your progress with the displays.

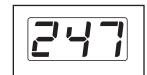
CAUTION: Always remove iFit cards from the iFit slot when you are not using them.

THE INFORMATION MODE

The console features an information mode that keeps track of the total distance that the walking belt has moved and the total number of hours that the treadmill has been used. The information mode also allows you to select a measurement system of miles or kilometers, and to turn on and turn off the display demo mode.

To select the information mode, hold down the Stop button while inserting the key into the console and then release the Stop button. When the information mode is selected, the following information will be shown:

The display will show the total number of hours the treadmill has been used.



The display will also show the total number of miles (or kilometers) that the walking belt has moved.



An "E" for English miles or an "M" for metric kilometers will appear in the display. Press the Speed increase button to change the unit of measurement if desired.



The console features a display demo mode, designed to be used if the treadmill is displayed in a store. While the demo mode is turned on, the console will function normally

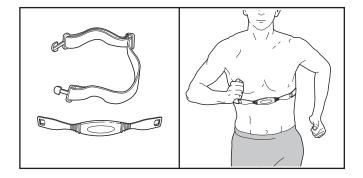


when you plug in the power cord, switch the reset/off circuit breaker to the reset position, and insert the key into the console. However, when you remove the key, the displays will remain lit, although the buttons will not function. If the demo mode is turned on, a "d" will appear in the display while the information mode is selected. To turn on or turn off the demo mode, press the Speed decrease button.

To exit the information mode, remove the key from the console.

THE OPTIONAL CHEST PULSE SENSOR

An optional chest pulse sensor offers hands-free operation as it tracks your heart rate during your workouts. To purchase the optional chest pulse sensor, call the telephone number on the front cover of this manual.



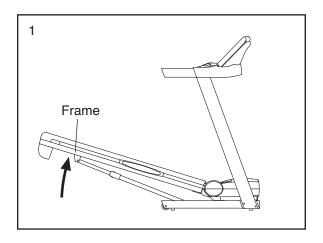
HOW TO FOLD AND MOVE THE TREADMILL

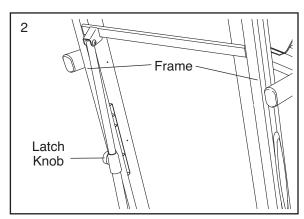
HOW TO FOLD THE TREADMILL FOR STORAGE

Before folding the treadmill, adjust the incline to the lowest position. If you do not do this, you may damage the treadmill when you fold it. Remove the key and unplug the power cord. CAUTION: You must be able to safely lift 45 lbs. (20 kg) to raise, lower, or move the treadmill.

- Hold the metal frame firmly in the location shown by the arrow at the right. CAUTION: To decrease the possibility of injury, do not lift the frame by the plastic foot rails. Make sure to bend your legs and keep your back straight as you raise the frame. Raise the frame about halfway to the vertical position.
- 2. Raise the frame until the latch knob locks into the storage position. Make sure that the latch knob is locked in the storage position.

To protect the floor or carpet from damage, place a mat under the treadmill. Keep the treadmill out of direct sunlight. Do not leave the treadmill in the storage position in temperatures above 85° F (30° C).

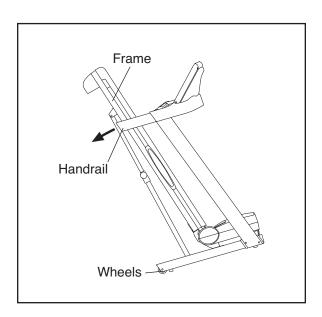




HOW TO MOVE THE TREADMILL

Before moving the treadmill, convert the treadmill to the storage position as described above. Make sure that the latch knob is locked in the storage position.

- Hold a handrail and the frame and place one foot against one of the wheels.
- 2. Tip the treadmill back until it rolls freely on the wheels. Carefully move the treadmill to the desired location. Never move the treadmill without tipping it back. To reduce the risk of injury, use extreme caution while moving the treadmill. Do not attempt to move the treadmill over an uneven surface. Do not pull on the frame.
- 3. Place one foot against a wheel, and carefully lower the treadmill until it is resting in the storage position.



HOW TO LOWER THE TREADMILL FOR USE

- 1. **See drawing 2.** Hold the upper end of the treadmill with your right hand. Pull the latch knob to the left and hold it. It may be necessary to push the frame forward as you pull the knob to the left. Pivot the frame downward and release the latch knob.
- 2. See drawing 1. Hold the metal frame firmly with both hands and lower it to the floor. CAUTION: Do not grip only the plastic foot rails or drop the frame to the floor. Bend your legs and keep your back straight.

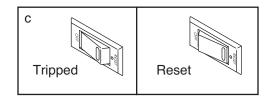
TROUBLESHOOTING

Most treadmill problems can be solved by following the steps below. Find the symptom that applies, and follow the steps listed. If further assistance is needed, please see the front cover of this manual.

PROBLEM: The power does not turn on

SOLUTION: a. Make sure that the power cord is plugged into a surge suppressor, and that the surge suppressor is plugged into a properly grounded outlet (see page 12). Use only a single-outlet surge suppressor that meets all of the specifications described on page 12. **IMPORTANT: The treadmill is not compatible with GFCI-equipped outlets.**

- b. After the power cord has been plugged in, make sure that the key is inserted into the console.
- c. Check the reset/off circuit breaker located on the treadmill frame near the power cord. If the switch protrudes as shown, the circuit breaker has tripped. To reset the circuit breaker, wait for five minutes and then press the switch back in.



PROBLEM: The power turns off during use

SOLUTION: a. Check the reset/off circuit breaker (see the drawing above). If the circuit breaker has tripped, wait for five minutes and then press the switch back in.

- b. Make sure that the power cord is plugged in. If the power cord is plugged in, unplug it, wait for five minutes, and then plug it back in.
- c. Remove the key from the console. Reinsert the key into the console.
- d. If the treadmill still will not run, please see the front cover of this manual.

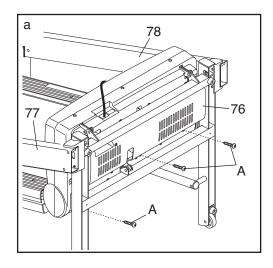
PROBLEM: The console displays remain lit when you remove the key from the console

SOLUTION: a. The console features a display demo mode, designed to be used if the treadmill is displayed in a store. If the displays remain lit when you remove the key, the demo mode is turned on. To turn off the demo mode, hold down the Stop button for a few seconds. If the displays are still lit, see THE INFORMATION MODE on page 20 to turn off the demo mode.

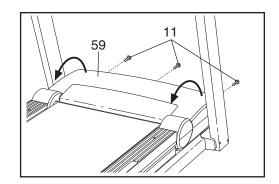
PROBLEM: The displays of the console do not function properly

SOLUTION: a. Remove the key from the console and UNPLUG
THE POWER CORD. With the help of a second
person, carefully tip the Uprights (77, 78) down.
There may be three Hood Screws (A) in the bottom
of the Belly Pan (76). If there are, remove them.
Note: A Phillips screwdriver with a shaft at least 5
in. (13 cm) long is required.

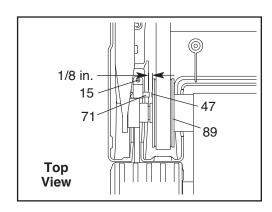
Raise the Uprights (77, 78).



Remove the three #8 x 3/4" Screws (11) and carefully pivot the Motor Hood (59) off.



Locate the Reed Switch (71) and the Magnet (47) on the left side of the Pulley (89). Turn the Pulley until the Magnet is aligned with the Reed Switch. **Make sure that the gap between the Magnet and the Reed Switch is about 1/8 in. (3 mm).** If necessary, loosen the #8 x 3/4" Truss Head Screw (15), move the Reed Switch slightly, and then retighten the Screw. Reattach the Hood (not shown). Reattach the Hood Screws (not shown), if necessary. Run the treadmill for a few minutes to check for a correct speed reading.



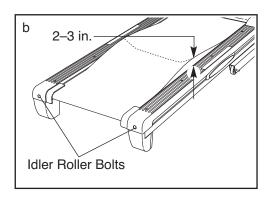
PROBLEM: The incline of the treadmill does not change correctly

SOLUTION: a. With the key in the console, press one of the Incline buttons. **While the incline is changing, remove the key.** After a few seconds, re-insert the key. The treadmill will automatically rise to the maximum incline level and then return to the minimum level. This will recalibrate the incline system.

PROBLEM: The walking belt slows when walked on

SOLUTION: a. Use only a single-outlet surge suppressor that meets all of the specifications described on page 12.

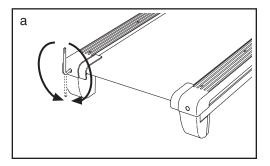
b. If the walking belt is overtightened, treadmill performance may decrease and the walking belt may become damaged. Remove the key and UNPLUG THE POWER CORD. Using the hex key, turn both idler roller bolts counterclockwise, 1/4 of a turn. When the walking belt is properly tightened, you should be able to lift each edge of the walking belt 2 to 3 in. (5 to 7 cm) off the walking platform. Be careful to keep the walking belt centered. Then, plug in the power cord, insert the key, and run the treadmill for a few minutes. Repeat until the walking belt is properly tightened.

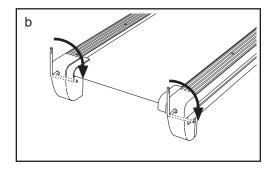


c. If the walking belt still slows when walked on, see the front cover of this manual.

PROBLEM: The walking belt is off-center or slips when walked on

- SOLUTION: a. If the walking belt is off-center, first remove the key and UNPLUG THE POWER CORD. If the walking belt has shifted to the left, use the hex key to turn the left idler roller bolt clockwise 1/2 of a turn; if the walking belt has shifted to the right, turn the bolt counterclockwise 1/2 of a turn. Be careful not to overtighten the walking belt. Then, plug in the power cord, insert the key, and run the treadmill for a few minutes. Repeat until the walking belt is centered.
 - b. If the walking belt slips when walked on, first remove the key and UNPLUG THE POWER CORD. Using the hex key, turn both idler roller bolts clockwise, 1/4 of a turn. When the walking belt is correctly tightened, you should be able to lift each edge of the walking belt 2 to 3 in. (5 to 7 cm) off the walking platform. Be careful to keep the walking belt centered. Then, plug in the power cord, insert the key, and carefully walk on the treadmill for a few minutes. Repeat until the walking belt is properly tightened.





EXERCISE GUIDELINES

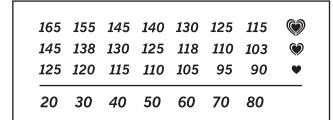
WARNING: Before beginning this or any exercise program, consult your physician. This is especially important for persons over age 35 or persons with pre-existing health problems.

The pulse sensor is not a medical device. Various factors may affect the accuracy of heart rate readings. The pulse sensor is intended only as an exercise aid in determining heart rate trends in general.

These guidelines will help you to plan your exercise program. For detailed exercise information, obtain a reputable book or consult your physician. Remember, proper nutrition and adequate rest are essential for successful results.

EXERCISE INTENSITY

Whether your goal is to burn fat or to strengthen your cardiovascular system, exercising at the proper intensity is the key to achieving results. You can use your heart rate as a guide to find the proper intensity level. The chart below shows recommended heart rates for fat burning and aerobic exercise.



To find the proper intensity level, find your age at the bottom of the chart (ages are rounded off to the nearest ten years). The three numbers listed above your age define your "training zone." The lowest number is the heart rate for fat burning, the middle number is the heart rate for maximum fat burning, and the highest number is the heart rate for aerobic exercise.

Burning Fat—To burn fat effectively, you must exercise at a low intensity level for a sustained period of time. During the first few minutes of exercise, your body uses *carbohydrate calories* for energy. Only after the first few minutes of exercise does your body begin to use stored *fat calories* for energy. If your goal is to burn fat, adjust the intensity of your exercise until your heart rate is near the lowest number in your training zone. For maximum fat burning, exercise with your heart rate near the middle number in your training zone.

Aerobic Exercise—If your goal is to strengthen your cardiovascular system, you must perform aerobic exercise, which is activity that requires large amounts of oxygen for prolonged periods of time. For aerobic exercise, adjust the intensity of your exercise until your heart rate is near the highest number in your training zone.

WORKOUT GUIDELINES

Warming Up—Start with 5 to 10 minutes of stretching and light exercise. A warm-up increases your body temperature, heart rate, and circulation in preparation for exercise.

Training Zone Exercise—Exercise for 20 to 30 minutes with your heart rate in your training zone. (During the first few weeks of your exercise program, do not keep your heart rate in your training zone for longer than 20 minutes.) Breathe regularly and deeply as you exercise—never hold your breath.

Cooling Down—Finish with 5 to 10 minutes of stretching. Stretching increases the flexibility of your muscles and helps to prevent post-exercise problems.

EXERCISE FREQUENCY

To maintain or improve your condition, complete three workouts each week, with at least one day of rest between workouts. After a few months of regular exercise, you may complete up to five workouts each week, if desired. Remember, the key to success is to make exercise a regular and enjoyable part of your everyday life.

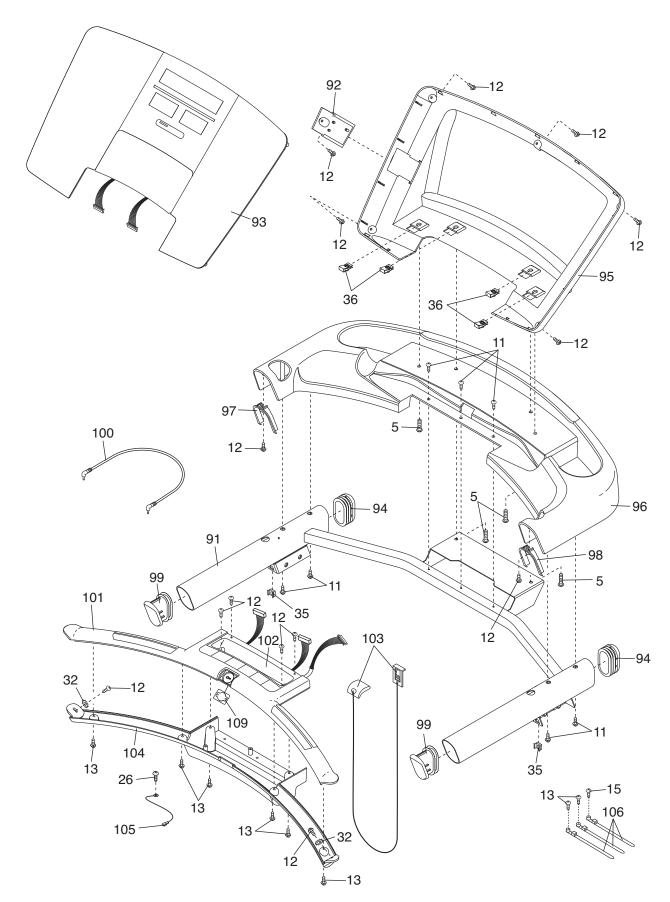


EXPLODED DRAWING B-Model No. RBTL67708.1
