





The buttons on the front panel control your TV's basic features, including the on-screen menu. To use the more advanced features, you must use the remote control.





Rear Panel Jacks

Use the rear panel jacks to connect an A/V component that will be connected continuously, such as a VCR or a laserdisc player. Because there are two sets of input jacks, you can connect two different A/V components (i.e., a VCR and a laserdisc, 2 VCRs, etc.)

For more information on connecting equipment, see pages 2.1 - 2.8.



VIDEO INPUT jack Video signals from VCRs, laserdisc players and similar devices.

AUDIO INPUTS(INPUT1 and 2)/ DVD AUDIO INPUTS(INPUT 2) Audio signals from VCRs, laserdisc

players and similar devices.

Use these jacks to connect the audio signals from a DVD player when using the DVD video input jacks. When not using the DVD jacks, these audio jacks function as audio for Video 2 or S-VIDEO).

AUDIO-VIDEO MONITOR OUTPUT jacks

These audio-video signals are identical to A/V signals being displayed on the big screen. (Typically used as the input signals for a recoding VCR.)

- SUPER VIDEO INPUT jack S-Video signal from an S-VHS VCR or laserdisc player.
- DVD VIDEO INPUT jacks Connect video from a DVD player. Note: Only black and white signals are output from a monitor in DVD mode.

Remote Control

You can use the remote control up to about 23 feet from the TV. When using the remote, always point it directly at the TV.

You can also use your remote control to operate your VCR and cable box. See page4.1 for details.

POWER Turns the TV on and off.

O Number buttons

Press to select channels directly on the TV.

+100

Press to select channels over 100. For example, to select channel 121, press "+100," then press "2" and "1."

9 P.SIZE

Press to change to screen size. Your choises are Normal screen, Zoom screen or Wide screen.

R.SURF

Press the R.SURF button to automatically return to a preferred channel after a user-preset time delay.

SLEEP

Press to select a preset time interval for automatic shutoff.

6 TURBO

Press to select the TURBO sound On or Off.

MUTE Press to temporarily cut off


the sound.

8 CH▲ and CH▼ (Channel Up/Down)

Press CH▲ or CH▼ to change channels. (Also used to highlight selections on the on-screen menus.)

9 P.STD

Adjust the TV picture by selecting one of the preset factory settings (or select your personal, customized picture settings).



TV Press to use your remote control to operate your TV.

VCR

Press to use your remote control to operate your VCR.

CABLE

Press to use your remote control to operate a CABLE BOX.

SET

Use this button when you are setting up your remote control to operate your VCR or Cable box.

PRE-CH

Tunes to the previous channel.

MTS (Multichannel Television Stereo) Press to choose stereo, mono or Separate Audio Program (SAP broadcast).

B DISPLAY

Press to see the time, channel, etc., on-screen. Also press to exit (quit) the menu system.

VOL -, VOL + Press increase or decrease the volume. (Also used to make selections on the on-screen menus.)

MENU

Displays the main on-screen menu.

© TV/VIDEO

Press to display all of the available video sources (i.e., Antenna/cable, VCR, DVD).



PIP Controls

<u>SWAP</u>

Exchanges the video signal that is currently displayed on the main screen with the signal in the PIP window.

TV/VIDEO

Press this button to control the PIP window. Press repeatedly to cycle through this sequence: PIP ON with large window, PIP ON with small window, and PIP OFF.



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

Antennas with 300-ohm Flat Twin Leads

If you are using an off-air antenna (such as a roof antenna or "rabbit ears") that has 300-ohm twin flat leads, follow the directions below.

Place the wires from the twin leads under the screws on the 300-75 ohm adaptor (not supplied). Use a screwdriver to tighten the screws.


Plug the adaptor into the VHF/UHF terminal on the bottom of the back panel.








Connecting an S-VHS VCR

Your Samsung TV can be connected to an S-Video signal from an S-VHS VCR. (This connection delivers a better picture as compared to a standard VHS VCR.)





Make sure the jacks you are using are underneath the number "2."



An S-video cable is usually included with an S-VHS VCR. (If not, check your local electronics store.)



Connecting a Second VCR to Record from the TV

Your TV can send out signals of its picture and sound to be recorded by a second VCR. To do this, connect your second VCR as follows:




(The VCR input jacks might be either on the front or on back of the VCR.)

Connecting a DVD Player

The rear panel jacks on your TV make it easy to connect a DVD player to your TV.




To enable DVD viewing, connect video cables between the Y, Pb and Pr inputs on the TV and Y,Pb and Pr outputs on the DVD player.

Note: For an explanation of Component video, see your DVD player's owner's manual.

Connecting a Camcorder

The side panel jacks on your TV make it easy to connect a camcorder to your TV. They allow you to view the camcorder tapes without using a VCR. (Also see "Viewing a VCR or Camcorder Tape" on page 3.16)



The audio-video cables shown here are usually included with a Camcorder. (If not, check your local electronics store.) If your camcorder is stereo, you need to connect a set of two cables.



Memorizing the Channels

Your TV can memorize and store all of the available channels for both "off-air" (antenna) and cable channels. After the available channels are memorized, use the CH \blacktriangle and CH \checkmark buttons to scan through the channels. This eliminates the need to change channels by entering the channel digits. There are three steps for memorizing channels: selecting a broadcast source, memorizing the channels (automatic) and adding and deleting channels (manual).

Selecting the Video Signal-source

Before your television can begin memorizing the available channels, you must specify the type of signal source that is connected to the TV (i.e., an antenna or a cable system).





Changing Channels

Your TV comes equipped with a "universal" remote control. In addition to controlling the TV, the universal remote can also operate a VCR and a cable box (even if your VCR and cable box are made by manufacturers other than Samsung).

Choosing a Multi-Channel Sound (MTS) Soundtrack

Depending on the particular program being broadcast, you can listen to stereo, mono, or a Separate Audio Program. (SAP audio is usually a foreign-language translation. Sometimes SAP has unrelated information like news or weather.)



◄ The text at the bottom of the menu tells you if the incoming audio is stereo, SAP, or mono.

- Choose Stereo for channels that are broadcasting in stereo.
- Choose *Mono* for channels that are broadcasting in mono, or if you are having difficulty receiving a stereo signal.
- Choose SAP to listen to the Separate Audio Program, which is usually a foreign-language translation.

Extra sound settings (Turbo Sound, Surround, Auto Volume or Virtual surround)

Turbo Sound

Turbo sound emphasizes the bass and treble frequencies to add fullness to the sound.

Surround


Your TV can create a "Surround" effect such that the sound seems to come from all directions. Once the "Surround" is set to "On" or "Off", the setting applies to the sound effects such as Standard, Music, Movie and Speech.

Auto Volume

Each broadcasting station has its own signal conditions, which can make it necessary to adjust the volume every time the channel is changed. "Auto volume" lets you automatically adjust the volume of the desired channel by lowering the sound output when the modulation signal is high or by raising the sound output when the modulation signal is low.

• Virtual surround

This function allows the TV L/R speakers to provide a home-like Dolby effect. The center and surround sounds are mixed up into the L/R speakers.



Viewing Closed Captions

Your TV decodes and displays the closed captions that are broadcast with certain TV shows. These captions are usually subtitles for the hearing impaired or foreign-language translations. All VCRs record the closed caption signal from television programs, so home-recorded video tapes also provide closed captions. Most pre-recorded commercial video tapes provide closed captions as well. Check for the closed caption symbol in your television schedule and on the tape's packaging: [cc].



◄ Misspellings and unusual characters sometimes occur during closed caption transmissions, especially those of live events. There may be a small delay before captions appear when you change channels. These are not malfunctions of the TV.

◄ In caption mode, captions appear at the bottom of the screen, and they usually cover only a small portion of the picture.

In **text mode**, information unrelated to the program, such as news or weather, is displayed. Text often covers a large portion of the screen.

◄ Different channels and fields display different information: Field 2 carries additional information that supplements the information in Field 1. (For example, Channel 1 may have subtitles in English, while Channel 2 has subtitles in Spanish.)

If the TV seems to have a problem, first try this list of possible problems and solutions. If none of these troubleshooting tips apply, then call your nearest service center.

Identifying Problems

| Problem | Possible Solution |

| Poor sound quality. | Try another channel. Adjust the antenna. |

| No color, wrong colors or tints. | Make sure the program is broadcast in color. Adjust the picture settings. If the set is moved or turned in a different direction, the power should be OFF for at least 30 minutes. |
| Picture rolls vertically. | Adjust the antenna. Check all wire connections. |
| The TV operates eratically | Unplug the TV for 30 seconds, then try operating it again. |
| The TV won't turn on. | Make sure the wall outlet is working. |

5.1 Chapter Five: Troubleshooting

Cleaning and Maintaining Your TV

With proper care, your TV unit will give you many years of service. Please follow these guidelines to get the maximum performance from your TV.

Placement

- Do not place the TV near extremely hot, cold, humid or dusty places.
- Do not place the TV near appliances with electric motors that create magnetic fields, such as vacuum cleaners.
- Keep the ventilation openings clear; do not place the TV on a soft surface, such as cloth or paper.
- Place the TV in a vertical position only.

Liquids

• Do not handle liquids near or on the TV. Liquids that spill into it can cause serious damage.

Cabinet

- Never open the cabinet or touch the parts inside.
- Wipe your TV with a clean, dry cloth. Never use water, cleaning fluids, wax, or chemicals.
- Do not put heavy objects on top of the cabinet.

Temperature

• If your TV is suddenly moved from a cold to a warm place, unplug the power cord, and allow at least two hours for moisture that may have formed inside the unit to dry completely.

Using Your TV in Another Country
