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Important Warranty Information Regarding Television Format Viewing

Standard screen format televisions (4:3, the aspect ratio of the screen width to height) are primarily designed to view standard format full-motion video. The images displayed on them should primarily be in the standard 4:3 ratio format and constantly moving. Displaying stationary graphics and images on screen, such as the dark top and bottom letterbox bars (wide screen pictures), should be limited to no more than 15% of the total television viewing per week.

Wide screen format televisions (16:9, the aspect ratio of the screen width to height) are primarily designed to view wide screen format full-motion video. The images displayed on them should primarily be in the wide screen 16:9 ratio format, or expanded to fill the screen if your model offers this feature, and constantly moving. Displaying stationary graphics and images on screen, such as the dark side-bars on non-expanded standard format television video and programming, should be limited to no more than 15% of the total television viewing per week.

Additionally, viewing other stationary images and text such as stock market reports, video game displays, station logos, web sites or computer graphics and patterns, should be limited as described above for all televisions. *Displaying any stationary images that exceed the above guide-lines can cause uneven aging of picture tubes (CRTs) that leave subtle, but permanent burned-in ghost images in the television picture. To avoid this, vary the programming and images, and primarily dis-play full screen moving images, not stationary patterns or dark bars.* On television models that offer picture sizing features, use these controls to view the different formats as a full screen picture.

Be careful in the selection and duration of television formats used for viewing. Uneven CRT aging as a result of format selection and use, as well as other burned-in images, is not covered by your Samsung limited warranty.



Your TV was designed with the latest technology. This TV is a high-performance unit that includes the following special features:

Familiarizing Yourself with The TV


Front Panel Buttons

(Wise Link mode)

Used to move to the previous menu.

Used to execute the selected item.

The buttons on the front panel control your TV's basic features, including the on-screen menu. To use the more advanced features, you must use the remote control.




When the TV is turned on, the TIMER indicator blinks five times. This indicator illuminates when the TIMER mode is set to the "On" position after setting the clock and either the On timer or Off timer, with the remote control. Even if the power is turned off, this indicator stays lit. (Clock must be set before using this function.)

Note: You can use the Volume button on the remote control to control the volume while in WISE LINK mode. (You cannot control the volume on the front control panel of TV.)

Side Panel Jacks

You can use the side panel jacks to connect an A/V component that is used only occasionally, such as a camcorder or video game. (For information on connecting equipment, see page 19.)



AUDIO INPUT jacks

Used to connect the audio signals from a camcorder or video game.

Ø VIDEO INPUT jack

Used to connect a video signal from a camcorder or video game.

SUPER VIDEO INPUT jack


S-Video signal from an S-VHS VCR or DVD player.

Note: In S-Video mode, Audio Output depends what kind of audio input source is connected to the side audio input jacks (AV1).

Rear Panel Jacks

Use the rear panel jacks to connect an A/V component that will be connected continuously, such as a VCR or a DVD player. Because there are three sets of input jacks, you can connect three different A/V components (i.e., a VCR and a DVD, 2 VCRs, etc.)

Remote Control

You can use the remote control up to about 23 feet from the TV. When using the remote, always point it directly at the TV.

You can also use your remote control to operate your Set-Top Box, VCR, DVD and cable box. See page 73 for details.

POWER

Turns the TV on and off.

Adjust the TV sound by selecting one of the preset factory settings (or select your personal, customized sound settings).

Adjust the TV picture by selecting one of the preset factory settings (or select your personal, customized picture settings).

O Number buttons

Press to select channels directly on the TV.

+100

Press to select channels over 100. For example, to select channel 121, press "+100," then press "2" and "1."

VOL -, VOL +

Press to increase or decrease the volume.

6 MUTE

Press to temporarily cut off the sound.

O SLEEP

Press to select a preset time interval for automatic shutoff.

8 MENU

Displays the main on-screen menu.

9 R.SURF


Press the R.SURF button to automatically return to a preferred channel after a user-preset time delay.

ROTATE

Press to rotate a JPEG image by 90 degrees.

W.LINK

Press to switch to or initialize the WISE LINK mode.



MODE

Selects a target device to be controlled by the Samsung remote control (i.e., TV, Set Top Box, VCR, Cable box, or DVD).

PRE-CH

Tunes to the previous channel.

TV/VIDEO

Press to display all of the available video sources (i.e., Antenna/Cable, VCR).

CH ∧ and CH ∨ (Channel Up/Down) Press CH ∧ or CH ∨ to change

channels.

INFO

Press to see the time, channel, etc., on-screen.

Press to exit the menu.

Press to select highlight up, down, left, or right. While using the onscreen menus, press ENTER to activate (or change) a particular item.

VCR(DVD, DVR STB or Wise Link) Controls

REW (Rewind)

Press to rewind a tape in your VCR(DVD, DVR or STB).

<u>STOP</u>

Press this button to stop a tape during play, record, rewind or fast forward. If the button is pressed during Full-Automatic play, the function will be cancelled.

PLAY/PAUSE


Press the PLAY/PAUSE button to play back prerecorded tapes or pause the tape.

FF

Press to fast forward the tape in your VCR(DVD, DVR or STB).

SET

Use this button when you are setting up your remote control to operate your Set Top Box, VCR, Cable box or DVD.



STILL (Main picture)

Press to stop the action during a particular scene. Press again to resume normal video. Note: The still function doesn't operate in Component 1 or 2 mode.

PIP Controls

PIP

Press this button to control the PIP window.

<u>SIZE</u>

Press to make the PIP window small, large, double window or stock ticker window.

<u>SWAP</u>

Exchanges the video signal that is currently displayed on the main screen with the signal in the PIP window.

<u>CH</u>


Displays the available channels in sequence (These buttons change channels in the PIP window only).

RESET

If your remote control is not functioning properly, take out the batteries and press the reset button for about 2~3 seconds. Re-insert the batteries and try using the remote control again. INSTALLATION

Connecting VHF and UHF Antennas

If your antenna has a set of leads that look like this, see "Antennas with 300-ohm Flat Twin Leads" below.





If you are using an off-air antenna (such as a roof antenna or "rabbit ears") that has 300-ohm twin flat leads, follow the directions below.




Antennas with 75-ohm Round Leads

If you have two separate antennas for your TV (one VHF and one UHF), you must combine the two antenna signals before connecting the antennas to the TV. This procedure requires an optional combiner-adaptor (available at most electronics shops).


To connect to a cable TV system, follow the instructions below.

 Because this TV is cable-ready, you do not need a cable box to view unscrambled cable channels.


Connecting to a Cable Box that Descrambles All Channels




→ This terminal might be labeled "ANT OUT", "VHF OUT" or simply, "OUT".

Connecting to a Cable Box that Descrambles Some Channels

If your cable box descrambles only some channels (such as premium channels), follow the instructions below. You will need a two-way splitter, an RF (A/B) switch, and four lengths of coaxial cable. (These items are available at most electronics stores.)









After you've made this connection, set the A/B switch to the "A" position for normal viewing. Set the A/B switch to the "B" position to view scrambled channels. (When you set the A/B switch to "B", you will need to tune your TV to the cable box's output channel, which is usually channel 3 or 4.)

Connecting a VCR

These instructions assume that you have already connected your TV to an antenna or a cable TV system (according to the instructions on pages 11-14). Skip step **1** if you have not yet connected to an antenna or a cable system.




A coaxial cable is usually included with a VCR. (If not, check your local electronics store).




Follow the instructions in "Viewing an External Signal Source" to view your VCR tape.

Connecting an S-VHS VCR

Your Samsung TV can be connected to an S-Video signal from an S-VHS VCR. (This connection delivers a better picture as compared to a standard VHS VCR.)




Make sure the jacks you are using are underneath the number "1."




An S-video cable is usually included with an S-VHS VCR (If not, check your local electronics store.)

Connecting a Second VCR to Record from the TV

Your TV can send out signals of its picture and sound to be recorded by a second VCR. To do this, connect your second VCR as follows:




(The VCR input jacks might be either on the front or on back of the VCR.)

The rear panel jacks on your TV make it easy to connect a DVD player to your TV.




Connect the Y, P_B , and P_R video outputs of the set-top box to their corresponding inputs on the TV. Next, connect the Left and Right audio from the set-top box to the corresponding L and R terminals on the TV. (The connections for a typical set-top box are shown below.)

Connecting a Camcorder

The side panel jacks on your TV make it easy to connect a camcorder to your TV. They allow you to view the camcorder tapes without using a VCR. (Also see "Viewing an External Signal Source" on page 36).



Installing Batteries in the Remote Control


1 Slide the cover out completely.



2 Install two AAA size batteries.



 ✓ Make sure to match the "+" and "-" ends of the batteries with the diagram inside the compartment.



 Remove the batteries and store them in a cool, dry place if you won't be using the remote control for a long time.

The remote control can be used up to about 23 feet from the TV. (Assuming typical TV usage, the batteries last for about one year.)

OPERATION

Turning the TV On and Off

Press the **POWER** button on the remote control.

You can also use the POWER button on the front panel.

Plug & Play Feature

When the TV is initially powered On, five basic customer settings proceed automatically and subsequently: Setting the language, Video signal source, Ant. input check, Auto program and Clock.

The message "Plug & Play" is displayed. It flickers for a little while and then the "Language" menu is automatically displayed.




Memorizing the Channels

Your TV can memorize and store all of the available channels for both "off-air" (antenna) and cable channels. After the available channels are memorized, use the CH \land and CH \checkmark buttons to scan through the channels. This eliminates the need to change channels by entering the channel digits. There are three steps for memorizing channels: selecting a broadcast source, memorizing the channels (automatic) and adding and deleting channels (manual).

Selecting the Video Signal-source


Before your television can begin memorizing the available channels, you must specify the type of signal source that is connected to the TV (i.e., an antenna or a cable system).



Note: STD, HRC and IRC identify various types of cable TV systems. Contact your local cable company to identify the type of cable system that exists in your particular area.

At this point the signal source has been selected. Proceed to "Storing Channels in Memory" (next page).

Storing Channels in Memory (Automatic Method)

Press the **ENTER** button. The TV will begin memorizing all of the available channels.

After all the available channels are stored, the channel menu reappears.

Changing Channels

Using the Channel Buttons

Press the ${
m CH}$ ightarrow or ${
m CH}$ ightarrow button to change channels.

When you press $CH \land or CH \lor$, the TV changes channels in sequence. You will see all the channels that the TV has memorized. (The TV must have memorized at least three channels.) You will not see channels that were either erased or not memorized.

Directly Accessing Channels

Use the number buttons to quickly tune to any channel.

Press the number buttons to go directly to a channel. For example, to select channel 27, press "2" then "7". The TV will change channels when you press the second number.


When you use the number buttons, you can directly select channels that were either erased or not memorized.

To select a channel over 100, press the +100 button. (For channel 122, press "+100" then "2" then "2".)

To change to single-digit channels (0-9) faster, press "0" before the single digit. (For channel "4" press "0" then "4".)

Using the PRE-CH Button to select the Previous Channel

Press the **PRE-CH** button. The TV will switch to the last channel viewed.



✓ To quickly switch between two channels that are far apart, tune to one channel, then use the number button to select the second channel. Then, use the PRE-CH button to quickly alternate between them.

Labeling the Channels

Use this feature to assign an easy-to-remember label to any channel (i.e., "CBS", "ESPN", "PBS2", CNN1", etc.) A label consists of four fields, where each field is a letter, a number, "*", or a blank. When the INFO button is pressed, the channel label will appear next to the channel number.

Viewing Closed Captions

Your TV decodes and displays the closed captions that are broadcast with certain TV shows. These captions are usually subtitles for the hearing impaired or foreign-language translations. All VCRs record the closed caption signal from television programs, so home-recorded video tapes also provide closed captions. Most pre-recorded commercial video tapes provide closed captions as well. Check for the closed caption symbol in your television schedule and on the tape's packaging: \boxed{cc} .



◄ Misspellings and unusual characters sometimes occur during closed caption transmissions, especially those of live events. There may be a small delay before captions appear when you change channels. These are not malfunctions of the TV.

In "Caption" mode, captions appear at the bottom of the screen, and they usually cover only a small portion of the picture.

In **"Text" mode**, information unrelated to the program, such as news or weather, is displayed. Text often covers a large portion of the screen.

◄ Different channels and fields display different information: Field 2 carries additional information that supplements the information in Field 1. (For example, Channel 1 may have subtitles in English, while Channel 2 has subtitles in Spanish.)





Using WISE LINK

WISE LINK is used to play JPEG files (*.jpg) and MP3 files (*.MP3) stored in the memory card on the TV.

What is a Memory Card?

A memory card is an auxiliary storage device used in AV equipment to exchange data between devices. It is mainly used in digital cameras, digital camcorders, MP3 players, notebooks and PDAs.

Memory Cards Available in WISE LINK

You can use CF (Compact Flash), SMC (Smart Media Card), SD (Secure Digital), MMC (Multi Media Card), and MS (Memory Stick) in the four WISE LINK slots. Confirm the card type and proper insertion direction before you insert a memory card. The correct card type is listed for each slot.

· How to Insert a Memory Card

Gently push the memory card into the slot. If the card is not inserted completely, it will not work. Insert the card in the direction indicated on the memory card. Note: Do not apply excessive force while inserting the card.

 How to Eject a Memory Card Holding the tip of the card, gently pull it out.

Cautions on Memory Card Use

- Data can be damaged when a memory card is used in the presence of static electricity and/or electronic noise.

- Data can be damaged when a memory card is repeatedly inserted and ejected.
- Play speed may differ depending on the card type.
- Do not attach anything but a label in the proper place.
- Be careful to attach the label only within the proper space.
- Be careful not to make contact between the memory card terminal and metal objects.
- Do not strike, bend or drop the memory card.
- Do not dismantle or tinker with the memory card.
- Be careful to keep the memory card dry.

Cautions on using WISE LINK Mode

- Do not insert foreign objects into the slot.
- Insert the memory card in the proper direction
- Do not remove the memory card when it is in use.
- The manufacturer's responsibility does not include damaged data. (Be careful not to corrupt data and be sure to back up files.)
- Use the slot cover so that dust and foreign objects cannot enter the slot when WISE LINK is not in use.

Errors can occur in WISE LINK mode because of the various memory card types, the various manufacturers and the type of data stored. When an error occurs, please initialize WISE LINK as follows:




- When Music Repeat is set to OFF, the Music Slide Show repeats all the music.

Customizing Your Remote Control

Your TV comes equipped with a universal remote control. In addition to controlling the TV, the universal remote control can also operate a Set-Top Box, VCR, Cable box and DVD (even if your VCR, Cable box and DVD are made by manufacturers other than Samsung).

• The remote control might not be compatible with all VCRs, DVD players and Cable boxes.

Setting Up Your Remote Control to Operate Your VCR (Cable box or DVD player)



- When your remote is in the **TV** mode, the VCR (or DVD player) control buttons (**REW**, **STOP**, **PLAY/PAUSE** and **FF**) will still operate your VCR (or DVD player).
- When your remote control is in the VCR (CABLE or DVD) mode, the volume buttons still control your TVs volume.

If the TV seems to have a problem, first try this list of possible problems and solutions. If none of these troubleshooting tips apply, then call your nearest service center.

Identifying Problems

Problem	Possible Solution
Poor picture	Try another channel. Adjust the antenna. Check all wire connections.
Poor sound quality.	Try another channel. Adjust the antenna.
No picture or sound.	Try another channel. Press the TV/VIDEO button. Make sure the TV is plugged in. Check the antenna connections.
No color, wrong colors or tints.	Make sure the program is broadcast in color. Adjust the picture settings. If the set is moved or turned in a different direction, the power should be OFF for at least 30 minutes.
Picture rolls vertically.	Adjust the antenna. Check all wire connections.
The TV operates erratically	Unplug the TV for 30 seconds, then try operating it again.
Your remote control does not operate your TV.	Press the "MODE" button to put your remote control in the "TV" mode.
The TV won't turn on.	Make sure the wall outlet is working.
Image or Music Files do not play back.	Please check the original files. There may be errors in the original files.
The image appears in mosaic at first.	It is typical for a Progressive JPEG. It will automatically become normal after a short period of time.
Each picture or slide has a different running time.	The processing time may be different depending on the memory card type or the picture size.
The memory card is not recognized.	Check if it is supported in WISE LINK mode. Check if the card is inserted all the way. The reading time may differ depending on the card capacity and type. Please give it a moment. Check if the memory card is normal. A memory card which has been formatted on a computer may not work in AV devices.
The volume changes while music is played.	Check the original file. The manufacturers may randomly set the volume when they create MP3 files.
There is a blank screen when switching to WISE LINK.	Check if the inserted memory card is normal.

Cleaning and Maintaining Your TV

With proper care, your TV unit will give you many years of service. Please follow these guidelines to get the maximum performance from your TV.

Placement

- Do not place the TV near extremely hot, cold, humid or dusty places.
- Do not place the TV near appliances with electric motors that create magnetic fields, such as vacuum cleaners.
- Keep the ventilation openings clear; do not place the TV on a soft surface, such as cloth or paper.
- Place the TV in a vertical position only.

Liquids

• Do not handle liquids near or on the TV. Liquids that spill into it can cause serious damage.

Cabinet

- Never open the cabinet or touch the parts inside.
- Wipe your TV with a clean, dry cloth. Never use water, cleaning fluids, wax, or chemicals.
- Do not put heavy objects on top of the cabinet.

Temperature

• If your TV is suddenly moved from a cold to a warm place, unplug the power cord, and allow at least two hours for moisture that may have formed inside the unit to dry completely.

Using Your TV in Another Country

If you plan to take your TV with you to a foreign country, please be aware of the different television systems that are in use around the world. A TV designed for one system may not work properly with another system due to differences in the TV channel frequencies.
