Some of the contents in this manual may differ from your phone, depending on the software installed, your SIM card or your service provider.

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## Safety Precautions

Read these simple guidelines. Failure to comply with them may be dangerous or illegal. For more detailed safety information, see "Safety Information" on page 129.

## Road safety comes first

Do not use a hand-held phone while driving; park the vehicle first. Remember that in some countries, it is illegal to use a hand-held phone while driving.

## Sw itch off when refuelling

Do not use the phone at a refuelling point (service station) or near fuels or chemicals.

## Switch off in aircraft

W ireless phones can cause interference. Using them on aircraft is both illegal and dangerous.

## Switch off in hospital

Follow any regulations or rules. Switch phone off near medical equipment.

## Respect special regulations

Follow any special regulations in force in any area and always switch off your phone whenever it is forbidden to use it, or when it may cause interference or danger (in a hospital for example).

## Interference

All wireless phones may be subject to radio interference, which may affect their performance.

## Use qualified servicing

Only qualified service personnel must repair equipment.

## Use sensibly

Do not touch the antenna unnecessarily when the phone is switched on.

## Emergency calls

Ensure the phone is switched on and in service. Enter the emergency number (112 or another official emergency number) and press $\approx$. Give your location. Do not end the call until told to do so.

## Non-Ionising Radiation

No part of the human body should come into contact with the antenna during normal operation.

## Your Phone

## Phone Layout

The following illustrations show the main elements of your phone.

## Volume

During a call, adjusts the earpiece volume. In idle mode with the phone open, the keys adjust the key tone volume.
To reject an incoming call, press and hold the volume key when the phone is closed.


## Key Functions



Soft keys perform the functions indicated by the text above them (in the bottom line of the display).

In the menu facility, scroll through the menu options and phonebook memory. In idle mode, performs as a hot key to the several menus respectively.


## Display

## Display Layout

The display comprises of three areas.


| Area | Description <br> First line <br> Displays various icons (see below). |

| M iddle lines | Display messages, instructions and <br> any information that you enter <br> (number to be dialled, for example). |
| Last line | Shows the functions currently <br> assigned to the two soft keys and <br> the divert icon. |

## Icons

## Tullll

Signal strength : Shows the received signal strength. The greater the number of bars, the better the signal strength.


Service: Appears when a call is in progress.

New Message: Appears when a new text message has been received.

New Voice Mail: Appears when a new voice mail message has been received.

Vibrator on: Appears when the vibrate mode is on. An incoming call will vibrate the phone rather than ring it.

Alarm on: Appears when you set an alarm.

Battery strength: Shows the level of your battery. The more bars you see, the more power you have left.

## Backlight

The display and keypad are illuminated by a backlight. W hen you press any key, the backlight illuminates. It turns off if no key is pressed within a given period of time, depending on the Backlight option set in the Phone Settings menu. The backlight remains on at all times when the phone is connected to a car kit (optional).

To specify the length of time for which the backlight is active, set the Backlight menu option (5-1-5); see page 80 for further details.

## External Display

Your phone has an external display on the cover. It also shows Signal strength, Vibrator, and Battery Strength icon. It indicates that you have an incoming call or message, missed calls and alerts you at the specified time if set an alarm.

W hen you press and hold the volume key with the phone closed, the backlight of the external display illuminates.

## Getting Started

## Service Light

The service light is on the top right-hand corner of the phone. It flashes when services are available on the phone.

To activate or deactivate use of the service light, set the Service Light menu option (5-1-6); see page 81 for further details.


## Installing the SIM Card and the Battery

- Keep all miniature SIM cards out of the reach of small children.
- The SIM card and its contacts can easily be damaged by scratches or bending, so be careful when handling, inserting or removing the card.
- Before installing the SIM card, always make sure that the phone is switched off and then remove the battery.

1. If necessary, switch off the phone by holding down until the closing animation is displayed.
2. Pull/push and hold the catch above the battery on the back of the phone. Lift the battery away.

3. Insert and slide the SIM card under the two tabs, ensuring that the cut corner is top left and the gold contacts of the card face into the phone.

4. Place the battery back on the phone. First insert the teeth on the bottom of the battery into the corresponding slots, then push the battery against the back of the phone until it clicks into place. $M$ ake sure the battery is properly installed before switching on the power.


## Charging a Battery

Your phone is powered by a rechargeable Li-ion battery. Use only approved batteries and chargers. Ask your local SAM SUNG dealer for further details.

Note: You must fully charge the battery before using your phone for the first time. A discharged battery is fully recharged in approximately 120 minutes for a Standard battery, 150 minutes for a Extended battery.

## Using a Travel Adapter

The phone can be used while the battery is charging.

1. Connect the lead from the travel adapter to the bottom of the phone. Check that the arrow on the lead connector is facing tow ards the front of the phone.

2. Connect the adapter to a standard $A C$ wall outlet.

W hen the battery is charging, the battery icon in the top right-hand corner of the display fills repeatedly.
3. W hen finished charging, disconnect the adapter from the power outlet.

Disconnect the adapter from the phone by pressing the grey tabs on either side of the connector and pulling the connector out.

## Low Battery Indicator

W hen the battery is weak and only a few minutes of talk time remain, the battery sensor will let you know by blinking an empty battery icon( $\square$ ), you will hear a warning tone and a message will be repeated at regular intervals on the display. W hen the battery becomes too weak for the phone to operate, it switches off automatically.

## Sw itching the Phone On/ Off

1. Open the phone.
2. Hold down for more than one second to switch the phone on.
3. If the phone asks for a passw ord, key in the passw ord and press the OK soft key. The passw ord is factory set to 0000. For further details, see page 124.
4. If the phone asks for a PIN, key in the PIN and press the OK soft key. For further details, see page 125.
When the phone has registered with an approved netw ork provider, the idle screen, illustrated below, is displayed on the main display and the external display respectively.


Note: The display language is determined by the SIM card inserted. To change the language, use the Language menu option (5-1-3); for further details, refer to page 79.
5. When you wish to switch the phone off, hold down - for more than two seconds.

## Using the Earmicrophone

When you connect the earmicrophone to the jack on the top of the phone, the button on the earmicrophone will operate as below without opening the phone or pressing a key on the phone.

Redialling a last call: Press the button twice in idle mode.
Answering a call: press the button when a call comes in.
Ending a call: press the button during a call.
Note: You can use the voice dialling or voice command by pressing the button, when the Active Folder menu option (5-1-10) is set Voice Dial or Voice Command. For further details, refer to page 82.

## Call Functions

## Making a Call

W hen the idle screen is displayed, key in the area code and phone number and press

Note: If you have set the Auto Redial option (5-1-7) to ON (see page 81) and the person called does not answer or the line is busy, the number is redialled automatic ally up to ten times.

## International Calls

1. Press and hold down $0+$ for the international prefix. The + character appears.
2. Key in the country code, area code and phone number and press

## Making a Call using the Phonebook

You can store the names and phone numbers called regularly in the SIM card and phone memory, called the phonebook. You then simply select the required name to recall the associated number. For further details on the Phonebook feature, refer to page 35.

## Voice Dialling

If you have set the Active Folder option (5-1-10) to Voice Dial (see page 82), your phone also allows you to say a name when you open the phone. It then automatically dials the number stored with that name. For further details on the Voice Dialling feature, refer to page 67.

## Last Number Redial

The phone stores the last 10 numbers dialled. To recall any of these numbers, proceed as follows.

1. If there are any characters on the display, press to return to idle mode.
2. Press $\Theta$ to access the list of last-dialled numbers.
3. Use 三 or = to scroll through the Redial list until the required number is displayed.
4. Press $\approx$ to dial the number displayed.

## Adjusting the Volume

During a call, if you want to adjust the earpiece volume, use the volume keys on the left side of the phone.


## Answ ering a Call

When somebody calls you, the phone rings and the phone icon in the middle of the screen flashes. If the caller can be identified, the caller's phone number (or name if stored in your phonebook) is displayed.

1. To answer a call, open the phone. If the phone is already open, press $\circlearrowleft$ or the Accept soft key.
If the Any-key Answ er menu option (5-1-4) is set to $\mathbf{O N}$, you can press any key to answer a call except for ${ }^{\circ}$ and the Reject soft key (see page 80).

Note: To reject an incoming call, press the Reject soft key or $\omega$. When the phone is closed, press and hold the volume key on the left side of the phone.
2. End the call by closing the phone or pressing

Note: You can answer a call while using the phonebook or menu features.

In idle mode with the phone open, you can adjust the key tone volume using the same keys.

## View ing Missed Calls

If you are unable to answer a call for any reason，you can find out who was calling you，if this service is available．In this way，you can call the person back， if necessary．

The number of missed calls is displayed on the idle screen immediately after a call was missed．

To view the missed call immediately，proceed as follows．

1．If the phone is closed，open the phone．
2．Press the View soft key．
The number corresponding to the most recent missed call is displayed，if available．

## Deleting a Missed Call

1．Press the Options soft key．
2．Press 二 or 二 to highlight the Delete option．
3．Press the Select soft key．
You can press at any time to exit the $M$ issed Call feature．

Note：You can access the Missed Call feature at any time by selecting the Missed Calls menu option （1－1）；for further details，see page 55.

## In-Call Options

Your phone provides a number of control functions that you can use during a call. To access these functions during a call, press the Options soft key.

## Switching the Microphone Off (Mute)

You can temporarily switch your phone's microphone off, so that the other party cannot hear you.

Example: You wish to say something to another person in the room but do not want the other party to hear you.

To sw itch the microphone off temporarily, proceed as follows.

1. Press the Options soft key.
2. Press $\bar{\approx}$ or to highlight the Mute option.
3. Press the OK soft key.

Your correspondent can no longer hear you.

## To sw itch the microphone back on, proceed as follows.

1. Press the $\mathbf{O}$ ptions soft key.
2. Press Б or 二 to highlight the Unmute option.
3. Press the $\mathbf{O K}$ soft key.

Your correspondent can hear you again.

## Searching for a Number in the Phonebook

You can search for a number in the phonebook during a call.

1. Press the Options soft key.
2. Press $\overline{\text { 玉 }}$ or to highlight the Phonebook option.
3. Press the OK soft key.
4. Enter the start of the name that you want to find and press the Find soft key.

Note: You can also scroll through the phonebook from the beginning, by pressing the Find soft key directly.

The phonebook entries are listed, starting with the first entry matching your input. This entry is also highlighted.
5. To review the highlighted entry, press the View soft key.

For a more detailed description of the Phonebook feature, refer to page 35 .

## Putting a Call on Hold

You can place the current call on hold whenever you want. You can make another call while you have a call in progress if this service is supported by the netw ork. Of these two calls, one is active and the other is on hold and you can swap between the calls.

To place a call on hold, press the Options soft key, and select the Hold option. You can reactivate the call whenever you want, by pressing the Retrieve soft key.

## To make a call while you have a call in progress, proceed as follows.

1. Key in the phone number that you wish to dial or look it up in the phonebook.
2. Press $\circlearrowleft$ to dial the second call. The first call is automatically put on hold.

## Or alternatively, proceed as follow s.

1. Put the current call on hold by pressing the Options soft key, followed by the Hold option.
2. M ake the second call in the normal way.

To swap between the two calls, simply press the

## Swap soft key.

The current call is placed on hold and the call on hold is reactivated so that you can continue conversing with the other party.

When you have finished, end each call normally by pressing

## Answ ering a Second Call

You can answer an incoming call while you have a call in progress, if this service is supported by the netw ork and if you have set the Call W aiting menu option (5-2-3) to Active (see page 89). You will be notified of an incoming call by a call waiting tone.

To answer a call while you have a call in progress, proceed as follows.

1. Press $\curvearrowright$ to answer the incoming call. The first call is automatically put on hold.
2. If you want to switch betw een the two calls, press the Swap soft key.

If you want to end a held call, press the Options soft key and select the End held option.
3. To end the current call, press

Any held calls will automatically be reconnected to you.

## Making a Multiparty Call

A multiparty call is a netw ork service that allows up to six people to take part simultaneously in a multiparty or conference call. For more information, contact your service provider.

## Setting up the Multiparty Call

1. Call the first participant in the normal way.
2. Call the second participant in the normal way. The first call is automatically put on hold.
3. To join the first participant to the multiparty call, press the Options soft key and select the J oin option.
4. To add a new person to the multiparty call, call the person in the normal way, then press the Options soft key and select the J oin option.

You can add incoming callers by answering the call and pressing Options, followed by Join. Repeat as required.

## Having a Private Conversation W ith One Participant

1. Press the $\mathbf{O p t i o n s}$ soft key and choose the Select one option. The list of call participants appears.
2. Highlight the required person, by pressing 三 or $\approx$, followed by $\vDash$.
3. Select Private.

Now you can talk privately with that person. The other participants can continue to converse with each other.
4. To return to the multiparty call, press the Options soft key and select J oin.

All the multiparty call participants can now hear each other.

## Dropping One Participant

1. Press the Options soft key and choose the Select one option. The list of call participants appears.
2. Highlight the required person, by pressing 三 or $\equiv$, followed by $\checkmark$.

## 3. Select Remove.

The call is ended with that participant, but you can continue to talk with the other participants.
4. End the multiparty call by closing the phone or pressing

## Phonebook

## Muting/ Sending Key Tones

These options allow you to turn the key tones off or on. If the Mute keys option is selected, your phone does not transmit the key tones.

Note: To communicate with answering machines or computerised telephony systems, the Send keys option must be selected.

## Using the SMS Service

If you receive an SMS (Short M essage Service) message during a call, the message icon ( $\Delta$ ) flashes in the display.

After you have finished your call, you can read the message; refer to page 59 for further details.

You can store phone numbers and their associated names in the memory of your SIM card. In addition, you can store up to 500 numbers and names in the phone memory. The SIM card and phone memories, although physically separate, are used as if they were a single entity, called the Phonebook.

## Storing a Phone Number with a Name

As soon as you start to enter a number, Save appears above the left soft key to allow you to store the number in the phonebook.

1. Key in the number to be stored.
2. When you are sure that it is correct, press the Save soft key.

## Notes:

- If you make a mistake while entering a number, correct it using the $\leftarrow$ soft key. For further details, refer to page 22.
- To insert a dialling pause for special phone services, such as banking by phone, hold down $*_{+}$. ' P ' is displayed to indicate the pause.

3. Enter the associated name (the maximum length depends on your SIM card). For information on how to enter a name, see page 42.
4. When you are satisfied, press the Save soft key. The phone now displays the first free location in the SIM card for you to save the number and name. If the card memory is full, the first free location in the phone memory is displayed.

5．Press the right soft key to toggle betw een the phone （To Phone）and card（To Card）memories．

6．If you do not want to save the number and name in the suggested location，press $\square$ to clear the location number and enter your preferred location by pressing the number keys．

7．Press $\mathbf{O K}$ to store the name and number．
8．You can access the phonebook options by pressing the Options soft key，or scroll through the memory with 三or 二．
To exit，press

## Phonebook Options

W hen storing or viewing a number in the phonebook， Options appears above the left soft key to allow you to access the phonebook options，described in the following paragraphs．

## Accessing the Options

To access the various phonebook options，proceed as follows．

1．Press the $O$ ptions soft key．
The first available option is highlighted．
2．Press the Select soft key to select the highlighted option．Or，press 三 or 三 key one or more times until the required option is highlighted to highlight a differnt option．

## Voice Record

Note：This option appears only when no name has been recorded．

Allows you to add a voice tag to the number．
Follow the instructions given by your phone to record the required name．

## Play Voice

Note：This option appears only when you have already recorded some names．

Plays back the names that you have recorded．

## Voice Delete

Note：This option appears only when you have already recorded some names．

Allows you to delete a specific voice entry．
You are asked to confirm the deletion by pressing the OK soft key．

## Paste

Allows you to paste the phonebook number into the normal dialling mode．Use this option to dial a number similar to one in the phonebook（a different extension in the same office for example）．
Use the $\leftarrow$ soft key to change the number as required（refer to page 22 for further details）．When you are ready to dial，press $\circledast$ ．

## Edit

Allows you to edit a number and name stored in the phonebook.

## Erase

Allows you to erase a number and name stored in the phonebook. You are asked to confirm that you wish to erase the name and number from the phonebook by pressing the Yes soft key.

## Copy

Allows you to copy a phonebook number to another location. Use this option to store a number similar to one already in memory; once copied, edit the number and store it into another location on the SIM card or in the phone memory.

## Memory Status

You can check how many names and phone numbers are stored and how many locations are still free in the card memory and phone memory.

## Alert

Allows you to set a ringing tone on a number stored by the phone. You can select the required ringing tone from several tones. When this number calls you, the phone rings with this ringing tone.

## Speed-Dialling by SIM Memory Location

Once you have stored phone numbers in the SIM card, you can dial them easily whenever required.

To speed-dial a number, proceed as follows.

Note: Memory location 1 is reserved for your Voice $M$ ail server number.

## Searching for and Dialling a Number in the Phonebook

1. When the idle screen is displayed, press the PhoneBook soft key.
2. If your SIM card provides with Service Dialling Number (SDN) and Information Numbers services, you should select the Find option.
3. Enter the start of the name that you want to find and press the Find soft key.
Note: You can also scroll through the phonebook from the beginning, by pressing the Find soft key directly.

The phonebook entries are listed, starting with the first entry matching your input. This entry is also highlighted.

## Entering Text

W hen storing a name in the phonebook, creating your personal greeting or scheduling events in your calendar, you will need to enter text.

You are provided with the following text input modes.

## English mode (T9)

This mode allows you to enter words with only one keystroke per letter. Each key on the keypad has more than one letter - when you press the $\left[5_{m}\right.$ key once, J, K or L may be displayed. The English mode automatically compares your keystrokes with an internal linguistic dictionary to determine the correct word, thus requiring far fewer keystrokes than the traditional $\mathbf{A B C}$ mode.

## ABC mode

This mode allows you to enter letters by pressing the key labelled with the required letter once, twice, three or four times until the letter is displayed.

## Number mode

This mode allows you to enter numbers.

## Symbolic mode

This mode allows you to enter special characters.

## Changing Text Input Mode

When you are in a field that allows character entry, you should notice the text input mode indicator in the bottom of the display.

To change to another text input mode:

1. Press the right soft key, indicating the text input mode.
2. Scroll to the desired mode with $\equiv$ or $=$.

Note: If you want to exit the menu without changing to a new mode, press the right $\curvearrowleft$ soft key.
3. Press the Select soft key to select the displayed mode.
4. You will find the selected text input mode indicated in the bottom of the display.

## English Mode (T9)

To type a word, press keys corresponding to the letters you need. Remember the following as you are typing:

1. Press keys on the phone just once per desired letter. For example, to enter 'hello', press 4 an [300, $5 m, 5 m, 560$.
2. The word you are typing appears in the display. It may change with each key press.
3. Type to the end of the word before editing or deleting any keystrokes.
4. Complete each word with a space by pressing (0).

If the word that appears in the display is not the word that you desire, press [0+] one or more times to display alternate word choices for the keys you have typed. (For example, 'of' and 'me' both shares the sequence 6m, 3**. The phone displays the most commonly used choice first.)

To type words not found in the English mode, change the text input mode to ABC mode.

## Smart Punctuations

Period, hyphen, and apostrophe are available on 1 Ifol. English mode applies rules of grammar to insert the correct punctuation. Notice that 1 . ${ }^{\circ}$ is used twice in this
example to display two punctuation marks:


## Changing Case

To shift the case of the next letter(s) that you type, press ${ }^{*+}+$. There are three shift states: Lower Case, Initial Capital and Capitals Lock.

## Scrolling

- To move the cursor left or right through your text message, press ( or $)$ ).
- To scroll through alternate word choices for the keys you have entered, press $[0+]$.


## Clearing Letters and W ords

Press 0 one or more times to clear letters to the left. Press and hold down the key to erase a word.

## ABC Mode

When typing in ABC mode, you should press the key labelled with the required letter:
-Once for the first letter
-Twice for the second letter -And so on.

For example, you press 2we three times quickly to display the letter "C", 5m two times quickly to display the letter "K". So, this method is called M ulti-tap typing.

Refer to the table below for the list of characters assigned on each key.

The cursor moves to the right when you press a different key. When entering the same letter twice (or a different letter on the same key), just wait for a few seconds for the cursor to move right automatically, and enter the next letter.

## Changing Case

To shift the case of the next letter(s) that you type, press * $^{+}+$. There are three shift states: Lower Case, Initial Capital and Capitals Lock.

## Inserting a Space

Press (.0) to insert a space between the words.

## Scrolling

To move the cursor left or right through your text message, press ( or $)$.

## Clearing Letters and W ords

Press 0 one or more times to clear letters to the left. Press and hold down the key to erase a words.

## Number M ode

Number mode enables you to enter numbers into a text message. Press keys corresponding to the desired digits, and manually switch back to the text entry mode of choice.

## Symbolic Mode

Symbolic mode enables you enter symbols into a text message.
Press ( - or $)$ to display more symbol sets.
Press keys corresponding to the desired mark, then the phone automatically switches back to the text entry mode used just prior to selecting Symbol mode.

## Selecting Functions and Options

Your phone offers a set of functions that allow you to customise your phone. These functions are arranged in menus and sub-menus, accessed via the two soft keys ( © and ). Each menu and submenu allows you to view and alter the settings of a particular function.

The roles of the soft keys vary according to the current context; the label on the bottom line of the display just above each key indicates its current role.


Press the left soft key to access the M enu functions.

Press the right soft key to access the Phonebook feature.

## Using the Menu

The phone offers a range of functions that allows you to tailor the phone to your needs．These functions are arranged in menus and submenus．

The menus and submenus can be accessed by scrolling．

1．In idle mode，press the Menu soft key to access the menu facility．Scroll with（ 6 or $)^{\prime}$ ）．

2．If the menu contains any submenus：for example， Ring Tone，find the one you want by scrolling with $二$ or $二$ ．Press the Select soft key to enter the submenu．
If the menu you have selected contains submenus， repeat this step．
3．Scroll with 三 or $二$ to find the setting of your choice．Press the Select soft key to confirm the chosen setting．

## Notes：

－You can return to the previous menu level by pressing the Э soft key．
－You can exit the menu without changing the menu settings by pressing

## Menu Structure

M enus let you check or change your phone settings. The following shows the menu structure.

The number and name (if available) are displayed together with the date and time at which the call was made. You can also view call times and costs.

Lets you view the timers for calls made and received.
The following timers are available.
Last Call Time: length of the last call.

Note: The actual time invoiced for calls by your service provider may vary, depending on netw ork features, rounding-off for billing purposes, and so forth.

This netw ork feature lets you view the cost of calls.
The following options are available.
Last Call Cost: cost of the last call made.
Total Cost: total cost of all calls made since the cost counter was last reset. If the total cost exceeds the maximum cost set via the Set Max Cost option, you will no longer be able to make any calls until you reset the counter(does not affect calls to the emergency services).

Max Cost: maximum cost set via the Set Max Cost option (see below).

Reset Counters: option used to reset the cost counter; you must first enter your PIN2 (see page 125) and then press the OK soft key.

Set Max Cost: option used to enter the maximum cost that you authorise for your calls.

Price/Unit: option used to set the cost of one unit; this price per unit is applied when calculating the cost of your calls.

## Messages

Your phone receives voice mail notification messages, and text messages. Voice mail and short message service (SMS) are netw ork service. Please contact your service provider for more information.

When the icon appears, you have received voice mail.W hen the icon appears, you have received new messages. If the message memory is full, an error message is displayed and you cannot receive any new messages. Use the Delete option in the Read Messages menu (2-2) to delete obsolete messages. Once there is space in the memory any undelivered SM S messages will be received (provided sufficient space is available).

Picture and ringing tone messages can also be received.

## Voice Mail

## Connect to Voice Mail

Before using this feature, you must enter the voice server number obtained from your service provider (see the following page). You can then select this option and simply press the OK soft key to listen to your messages.

Note: If you press and hold ${ }^{10}$ when the phone is in idle mode, you can access your voice mail server directly.

- Date and time at which the message was received
- M essage text

To scroll through the messages, press 三 or 三. You can choose the following options, by pressing the Options soft key.

Text Reply: allows you to reply by sending a text message. You can also:

- Change the SM S centre number (if required)
- Send the message
- Save and send the message
- Save but not send the message

Call back: allows you to call the sender back.
Edit: allows you to edit a message.
Delete: allows you to delete obsolete messages.
Cut Number: allows you to extract a number from the message text, so that you can call the number or save it in the phonebook.

Send: allows you to send a message that you have not already sent.

Send again: allows you to resend a message that you have already sent.
Note: The options available vary, depending on the message status (New/Old, N ot sent, Sent).

Write Messages
Мепи 2-3

Via this menu, you can write and edit text messages of up to 160 characters.

1. Key in a message. For details on how to enter text, refer to page 42.
2. After you complete the message, you can select the following options.

Send Only: allows you to send the message immediately. You can enter the required destination.

Save and Send: allows you to save a copy of the message and then send the message to the required destination. You can read the message using the Read Messages option. When you read the message, 'Sent' is displayed to indicate the message state.

Save Only: allows you to save the message so that it can be sent later. W hen you read the message, 'Not sent' is displayed.
3. After selecting the required option, press the Select soft key.
The display prompts you to enter the destination number.
4. Enter the phone number and press the $\mathbf{O K}$ soft key. Or,
Press the PhoneBook soft key to select the number from the phone book.

## Preset Message List

 Мепи 2-4Using this menu, you can preset up to five messages that you use most frequently. This menu shows the preset message list. Scroll through the list using三 or $二$. W hen the required message number appears, press the Options soft key.

The following options are available.
Edit: allows you to write a new message or edit the selected preset message.

Note: For further information on how to enter text in your message, refer to page 42.

Send Message: allows you to recall the selected preset message. Once you have completed the message, you can send, save and send, or simply save it.

Delete: allows you to delete the selected preset message.

## Setup

Via this menu, you can set up default information on the SM S feature.

Service Centre: allows you to store or change the number of your SMS centre required when sending text messages. You must obtain this number from your service provider.

Default Type: allows you to set the default message type (Text, Voice, Fax, X.400, Email, and ERM ES). The netw ork can convert the message into the selected format.

Default Validity: allows you to set the length of time for which your text messages will be stored at the SM S centre while attempts are made to deliver them to the recipient.
Possible values are one hour, 6 hours, 24 hours, one week and the maximum authorised by your service provider.

Reply Path: allows the recipient of your SM S message to send you a reply via your message centre, if the service is provided by the netw ork.

Delivery Report: allows you to activate or deactivate the report function. When this function is activated, the network informs you whether or not your message has been delivered.

## Broadcast

Мепи 2-6

This network service allows you to receive text messages on various topics, such as the weather or traffic. M essages are displayed immediately they are received, provided that:

- The phone is in the idle mode
- The Receive option is set to Enable
- The message channel is currently active in the channel list

If the message is long, press the down volume key on the left side of the phone one or more times.

The last five messages are also stored for later retrieval. Please contact your service provider for more information.

The following options are available.
Read: lets you view the first message. Scroll through the message using $三$ or $三$. At the end of the message, press the Next soft key to move to the next message.

Receive: allows you to Enable or Disable the reception of broadcast messages.

Channel List: lists all available channels. The channels currently selected are indicated by an asterisk (*) beside the name. W hen you select one of them, you can edit, enable, disable or delete the channel.
The Enter Channel option allows you to add a new channel to the channel list. Enter the appropriate channel ID obtained from your service provider, and a title for the channel.

Language: allows you to select your preferred language for the cell broadcast message display.

## Picture Messages

Мепи 2-7

The phone allows you to send and receive text messages that contain pictures. These messages are called 'Picture M essages', several of which are preset in the phone and can be replaced with new ones received from other sources.

The following options are available.
Write Message: allows you to write text to send with the picture message.

Delete: deletes the picture message; Empty is displayed instead of the title.

Send Message: allows you to enter the destination phone number; you must then press the OK soft key to send the picture message.

Cut Number: allows you to extract a number from the picture message, so that you can call the number or save it in the phonebook.

## Receiving a Picture Message

To view a message immediately you receive it, press the View soft key. Press the right soft key to toggle between viewing the message and the image.

The following options are available.
Save: allows you to save the picture message to your picture message list.

Discard: allows you to discard the picture message without saving it.

Cut Number: allows you to extract a number from the picture message, so that you can call the number or save it in the phonebook.

Note: This function is available between phones supporting Nokia's*Smart M essaging services.

Each picture message is made up of several text messages;therefore, sending one picture message may cost more than one text message.

Picture messages are stored in the phone, you cannot view them if you use your SIM in another phone.

## Voice Functions

You can use the Voice feature to customize various settings, such as the:

- Voice Dial
- Voice Command
- Voice Memo


## Voice Dial

Мепи 3-1

The voice dialling feature allows you to make phone calls by saying a voice tag that has been added to a desired name and phone number. Any spoken word, for example a name, can be a voice tag.

Before using voice dialling, note that:

- Voice tags are not language dependent. They are dependent on the speaker's voice.
- The voice tags are sensitive to background noise. Where possible, record voice tags or make calls in a quiet environment.
- When recording a voice tag or making a call, hold the phone in the normal position close to your ear.
- The maximum length for a voice tag recording is about 1.5 seconds, but very short names are not recorded
- You can store up to twenty voice tags in the phone's memory.


## Voice Dial Record

Allows you to record name tags and allocate them to numbers for voice dialling.

Say the name you want to use for voice dialling after you hear a voice prompt. For best results, use names with at least two syllables, or use both a first and last name. The phone stores the name as a "first" sample, and then prompts you to say the name again.

Respond to the prompt by repeating the name. The phone stores the name as a second sample and then requests the phone number.

To store the number, press the OK soft key. Follow the instructions described on page 35 to complete storing the number into your internal phonebook.

## Voice Dial Act

This option activates voice dialling.
You hear a voice prompt and Say Name is displayed. Say the voice tag clearly. If no match for the voice tag is found or recognized, the phone may ask you to try again. The phone automatically dials the number of a recognized voice tag.
Note: This option is only available once you have recorded and stored voice tags.

## Voice Dial Delete One

Allows you to delete an individual voice tag. The corresponding phone number remains in the phonebook but the voice tag is deleted.

If the name displayed is... Then press the...
To be deleted
OK soft key.
Not to be deleted三 or = key. The next name is displayed.

To exit the Voice Dial Delete One option, press the つ soft key.

## Voice Dial Play All

Allows you to play back all recorded voice tags.

## Voice Dial Delete All

Allows you to delete all voice tags. The corresponding phone numbers remain in the phonebook but the voice tags are all deleted. Press the OK soft key when the message 'Delete All confirm?' is displayed.
Otherwise, press the Cancel soft key to exit the function without deleting the voice tags.

## Voice Command <br> Мепи 3-2

This menu allows you quick access to menus you use frequently, using your own voice commands.

You can select the following functions:
Voice Command Record: The most frequently used menu functions are programmable with your own voice commands. The menus are preset to OFF at the factory, indicating that they are not recorded. W hen voice commands are recorded successfully, the menus are changed to 0 N in the display.

Voice Command Act: Use this menu to access the menu of the recorded voice commands.

Voice Command Play All: Plays all voice commands you have recorded.

Voice Command Delete All : Deletes all commands you have recorded.

## Voice Memo

Мепи 3-3

You can use the Voice Memo feature to :

- Record up to 3 voice memos
- Play the recorded voice memos
- Delete one or all voice memos

Voice Memo Record: Allows you to record a memo. The screen displays the:

- Memo location
- Date and time when the memo was recorded
- Recording time counter

The maximum recording time is about 35 seconds. If you want to record for longer, press the Continue soft key. Split appears instead of Continue. You can continue recording and the rest of the memo is stored in the next memo location.

To stop recording, press the Stop soft key.
Note: If all memo locations are full, you must delete an old memo before recording a new one.

Voice Memo Replay: Allows you to play back all memos recorded, starting with the most recent memo. The screen displays the:

- M emo location
- Date and time when the memo was recorded.

To skip to the next memo, press the Skip soft key, to stop the playback, press the Stop soft key.

Voice Memo Delete One: Allows you to delete a specific memo. All memos recorded are played back, starting with the most recent one.

Voice Memo Delete All: Allows you to delete all memos. Press the OK soft key to confirm.

## Tones

You can use the Tones menu to customise various sound settings.

## Ring Tone

Мепи 4-1

Your phone supports 16 poly. 16 poly means the sound of pressing 16 keyboards of instrument simultaneously. There are 47 ringing tones in total. 42 predefined 16 poly ( 30 fixed and 12 changeable), 3 dow nloadable monopoly and 2 composite.

## To Select a Ringing Tone

When a list of ringing tones is displayed, scroll through them each will play. Highlight the ringing tone you want to use and press the Select soft key.

Note: If your SIM card supports ALS, this option also allows you to select a different ring tone for each line.

## To Change the Changeable Ringing Tones

- Downloading ringing tone messages

This method can change the Dow nload 1~3 entries in the list of ringing tones. This is Nokia compatible. For details about this network service, contact your service provider.
W hen you receive a ringing tone message, proceed as follows;

1. To listen to the tone, press the Play soft key.
2. To save the ring tone, press the Save soft key.
3. Select the ringing tone location you wish to save it and press the OK soft key.
4. To use this tone as the current ringing tone, press the

- Composing ringing tones

This method can change the User 1~2 entries in the list of ringing tones. Refer to melody composer (M enu 4-2) for details.

- Downloading ringing tones via PC Link and cable

This method can change 12 changeable 16 poly entries in the predefined ringingtones. For further details, refer to the PC Link guide in this package.

- Downloading ringing tones from WAP

This method can change only the first 8 entries of the 12 changeable 16 poly. For details about this netw ork service, contact your service provider.

Note: While dow nloading ring tones, if the battery is detached from the phone, you can lose the downloaded ringtones.

## Melody Composer

Мепи 4-2

This menu allows you to compose your own, customised ringing tone.

- Three octaves are available.
- A maximum of 100 notes can be entered.
- Adjustable length of note and note rest.


## To Compose M elody

You can compose two melodies. When you access the menu, the melody name appears, if already created.
Otherw ise, Empty appears. Select Empty to create a new melody or select the melody's name that you want to edit.

You can listen to your melody by pressing the Listen soft key. If you are satisfied, press the Yes soft key, and enter the melody name. For information on how to enter a name, refer to page 42.

Note: If you want to cancel your composing, press
. The display goes back to the previous menu level, the screen displays Empty.

After you save the melody, the display asks you if you want to set the melody as the ring tone. If you select Yes, your phone plays the melody each time your phone rings. If you select No o, the melody is just saved and the phone returns to the idle mode.

## To Delete a Selected Melody

1. Select the melody you want to delete.
2. Press and hold 0 for a few seconds. All notes will be erased.
3. Press the Listen soft key. The display asks you if you are sure you want to erase the melody. Select the Yes soft key.

## Ring Volume

Allows you to adjust the ringing volume to one of five levels. Use the volume keys on the left side of the phone or the 二 or 二 keys. The greater the number of bars, the greater the volume level.

Alert Type

Allows you to indicate how you are to be informed of any incoming calls. The following options are available.

Light Only: only the backlight is switched on; the phone neither rings nor vibrates.

Melody: the phone rings using the ringing tone selected via menu option 4-1.

Vibration: the phone vibrates but does not ring.
Vibra+M melody: the phone first vibrates three times and then starts ringing.

Note: Pressing and holding down +i. toggles between the current alert type and Vibration.

## Keypad Tone

Allows you to select the tone that the keypad generates when you press a key. The following options are available.

OFF: the keys do not make any sound.
Tone: each key, when pressed, makes a different sound.

Beep: each key, when pressed, makes the same sound.

## Message Tone

Allows you to select how the phone informs you that a new message has been received. The following options are available.

Single Beep: the phone beeps once.
SM S Tone 1 ~ SMS Tone 5: the phone sounds the selected SM S tone.

Light Only: the service light on the top of the phone flashes.

Vibration: the phone vibrates but does not ring.

Error Tone

Allows you to select how the phone informs you that you have made a mistake. The following options are available.

OFF: the phone does not beep.
ON: the phone beeps to indicate an invalid entry.

Minute Minder
Мепи 4-8

Allows you to specify whether the phone must beep every minute during an outgoing call to keep you informed of the length of your call. The following options are available.

OFF: the phone does not beep.
ON: the phone beeps every minute.

## Connect Tone <br> Мепи 4-9

Allows you to specify whether the phone should beep when the phone connects to the network. The following options are available.

OFF: the phone does not beep.
ON: the phone beeps when your call is accepted.

M any different features of your phone can be customised to suit your preferences. All of these features are accessed via the Settings menu.

## Greeting Message

Allows you to set a greeting message to be displayed briefly when the phone is switched on. The current message is displayed.

To go back to the previous menu level without saving your input, press

## Own Number

Note: The contents of this menu may be different depending on the SIM card.

You can enter your own name and number using this menu. If you have subscribed to the Alternative Line Service, you can select a line with 三 or $三$.

The following options are available:
Erase: allows you to erase name and number.
Edit: allows you to edit name and number. If your SIM card supports ALS only the Edit soft key displays. Press the Edit soft key and you can setup or edit your own name for the ALS line.

## Language

You can set a different setting for the text language and voice language.

You can also set the default text input mode. For details on the text input mode, refer to page 42.

## Any-key Answ er

Depending on the setting of the Any-key Answ er option, you can answer an incoming call by pressing any key except $\Leftrightarrow$ and the Reject soft key. To reject the call, press $\omega$ or the Reject soft key.W hen the phone is closed, press the volume key on the left side of the phone to reject an incoming call. ( If the Any-key Answ er menu option (5-1-4) is set to ON, just press, if it's set to OFF press and hold down the button.)

ON: you can press any key except and Reject.
OFF: you can only press $\circledast$ or Accept keys.

## Backlight

You can select whether or not the phone uses the backlight. A marginal increase in standby/talk time can be achieved by turning the backlight off. The following options are available.

Short: the backlight comes on when you press a key or receive a call and switches off 10 seconds after the last key is pressed.

Long: the backlight comes on when you press a key or receive a call and switches off 20 seconds after the last key is pressed.

OFF: the backlight is not used.

## Service Light

Allows you to select whether or not the service light on the top of the phone is used. The following options are available.

ON: the service light flashes when the phone is ready for use.

OFF: the service light is not used.

## Auto Redial

With the Auto Redial function, the phone makes up to ten attempts to redial a phone number after an unsuccessful call.

Note: The interval betw een two call attempts varies.
The following options are available.
ON: the number is redialled automatically.
OFF: the number is not redialled.

## Auto Answ er

With the Auto Answer function, the phone automatically answers calls after 3,5 or 10 seconds. You can also turn this feature off.

Note: This feature is only available when the phone is connected to a car kit (optional).

## Caller ID

You can prevent your phone number from being displayed on the phone of the person being called.
Note: Some netw orks do not allow the user to change this setting.

The following options are available.
Default: the default setting provided by the netw ork is used.

Hide Number: your number is not displayed on the other person's phone.

Send Number: your number is sent each time you make a call.

## Active Folder

The voice dial and voice command mode can be activated automatically whenever the phone is opened.

The following options are available.
OFF: the voice dial mode must be activated manually via the Voice Dial menu; for further information, refer to page 67.

Voice Dial: the voice dial mode is activated when you open the phone.

Voice Command: the voice command mode is activated when you open the phone.

Note: When you use the earmicrophone and the Voice Dial or Voice Comand is set, you can use this function by pressing the button on the earmicrophone.

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## Netw ork Services

Мепи 5-2

These menu functions are netw ork services.
Please contact your service provider to check their availability and subscribe to them, if you so wish.

## Call Diverting

Note: The call divert options that are not supported by your netw ork operator may not be shown.

This netw ork service enables incoming calls to be rerouted to the number that you specify.
Example: You may wish to divert your business calls to a colleague while you are on holiday.

Call diverting can be set up in the following ways.
Divert Alw ays: all calls are diverted.
Busy: calls are diverted if your phone is engaged on another call.

No Reply: calls are diverted if you do not answer the phone.

Unreachable: calls are diverted if you are not in an area covered by your service provider.
Cancel All: all call diverting options are cancelled.
Note: These options may be different depending on the SIM card.

You can specify individual diverting options for each of the following call types:

- Voice calls only
- Fax calls only ; not available when a Line 2 is in use
- Data calls only ; not available when a Line 2 is in use.

Example: You can:

- Systematically divert fax calls to your office fax machine
- Divert voice calls to your colleague if you are already using the phone

To set your call diverting options, proceed as follows.

1. Select the type of calls diverting required by pressing 三 or 三until the appropriate option is highlighted, and then press the Select soft key.
2. Select the type of calls to be diverted by pressing = or = until the appropriate option is highlighted and then press the Select soft key.
3. Press the Activate soft key to confirm your settings.
4. You can enter the number of your choice. To enter the international code, press and hold $0+$ until the + sign is displayed. You can also select a number in the phonebook or the voice server number, by pressing the Options soft key, followed by PhoneB ook or Voice Server Number.
When you are satisfied, press the Send or OK soft key; the phone sends your setting to the netw ork and the netw ork's acknow ledgement is displayed.

To deactivate specific call diverting settings，proceed as follows．

1．Select the call diverting option to be deactivated．
2．Select the type of call to which this option applies．
3．Press the Remove soft key．
The phone sends your settings to the network and the netw ork＇s acknowledgement is displayed．

You can also deactivate all call diverting settings by selecting the Cancel All option．

## Call Barring

The call barring netw ork service allows you to restrict your calls．

Call barring can be set up in the following ways．
All outgoing：calls cannot be made．
International：international calls cannot be made．
International except to home：when abroad，calls can be made only to numbers within the current country and to your home country，that is the country where your home netw ork provider is located．

All Inc oming：calls cannot be received．
Incoming while abroad：calls cannot be received when you are using your phone outside your home service area．

Cancel All：all call barring settings are deactivated； calls can be made and received normally．

To set your call barring options，proceed as follows．
1．Select the type of calls barring required by pressing $三$ or $二$ until the appropriate option is highlighted and then press the Select soft key．

2．Select the type of calls to be barred by pressing三 or＝until the appropriate option is highlighted and then press the Select soft key．

3．Press the Activate soft key to confirm your settings．
4. Enter your call barring passw ord supplied by your service provider.
The phone sends your settings to the network and the netw ork's acknow ledgement is displayed.

To deactivate specific call barring settings, proceed as follows.

1. Select the call barring option to be deactivated.
2. Select the type of call to which this option applies.
3. Press the Remove soft key.
4. Enter your call barring passw ord supplied by your service provider.
The phone sends your settings to the network and the netw ork's acknow ledgement is displayed.

You can also deactivate all call barring settings by selecting the Cancel All option.

Change Barring Passw ord: you can set and change the call barring passw ord obtained from your service provider using this option. You must enter the current passw ord before you can specify a new one.

Once you have entered a new password, you are asked to confirm it by entering it again.

## Call Waiting

This netw ork service enables you to be informed when someone is trying to reach you during another call.

To set your call waiting options, proceed as follows.

1. Select the type of calls to which the call waiting option is to be applied by pressing 三 or until the appropriate option is highlighted and then press the Select soft key.
2. Press the Activate soft key to confirm your settings.
The phone sends your settings to the network and the netw ork's acknow ledgement is displayed.

To deactivate specific call waiting settings, proceed as follows.

1. Select the type of call to which the option applies.
2. Press the Deactivate soft key.

The phone sends your settings to the network and the netw ork's acknow ledgement is displayed.

You can also deactivate all call waiting settings by selecting the Cancel All option.

## Netw ork Selection

The Netw ork Selection feature enables you to:

- Indicate whether the netw ork used when roaming (outside your home area) is selected automatically or manually

Note: You can select a netw ork other than your home network only if it has a valid roaming agreement with your home netw ork.

To indicate whether the netw ork is to be selected automatically or manually when roaming, proceed as follows.

CLIR (Calling Line Identification Restriction) / COLR (Connected Line Identification Restriction) If these netw ork functions are active, your phone number is not displayed on the called person's phone.

## Closed User Group (CUG)

This network service allows incoming and outgoing calls to be restricted to a selected user group. You may be a member of up to 10 user groups. For details on how to create, activate and use a closed user group, contact your service provider.

Example: A company lends SIM cards to its employees and wants to restrict outgoing calls to members of the same team.

## Activating a Closed User Group

If you select the Closed User Group menu, you are asked if you want to activate the CUG function. Press the Yes soft key. You can now access the following options.

Deactivate: deactivates the CUG function.
Index List: lets you list, add or delete CUG index numbers. The list of current CUG indexes appears. Add a new CUG index (as advised by your service provider) or delete a selected group.

Default Group: you may communicate a default CUG to your service provider. If you have done so, you can enable the Default Group option on your phone. When making a call, you will be given the option of using your default CUG, instead of selecting one from the list.

## Security Settings

The Security feature enables you to restrict the use of your phone to:

- The people of your choice
- The types of calls of your choice

Various codes and passwords are used to protect the features of your phone. They are described in the following sections (also see page 125).

## PIN Check

W hen the PIN Check feature is enabled, you must enter your PIN each time you switch the phone on. Any person who does not have your PIN cannot, therefore, use your phone without your approval.
Note: Before disabling the PIN Check feature, you must enter your PIN.

To change your PIN, refer to menu option 5-3-2 opposite.

The following options are available.
Enable: you must enter the PIN each time the phone is switched on.

Disable: the phone connects directly to the netw ork when you switch it on.

## Change PIN

This feature allows you to change your current PIN to a new one, provided that the PIN Check feature is enabled. You must enter the current PIN before you can specify a new one.

Once you have entered a new PIN, you are asked to confirm it by entering it again.

## Phone Lock

When the Phone Lock feature is enabled, the phone is locked and you must enter the 4 -digit phone password each time the phone is switched on.
The password is factory set to 0000. To change the phone passw ord, refer to menu option 5-3-4. Once the correct passw ord has been entered, you can use the phone until you switch it off.

The following options are available.
Enable: you are required to enter the phone passw ord when you switch the phone on.
Disable: you are not asked to enter the phone passw ord when you switch the phone on.

## Change Passw ord

## Your correspondent cannot reach you

- Check the signal strength indicator in the display ( $\mathbb{Y}$ ); the number of bars after it indicates the signal strength from strong (iulll ) to weak (ıI).
- Try moving the phone slightly or moving closer to a window if you are in a building.


## No number is dialled when you recall a phonebook entry

- Check that the numbers have been stored correctly, by using the Phonebook Search feature.
- Re-store them, if necessary.

If the above guidelines do not enable you to solve the problem, take a note of:

- The model and serial numbers of your phone
- Your warranty details
- A clear description of the problem

Then contact your local dealer or SAM SUNG after-sales service.

## Reference Information

## Access Codes

There are several access codes that are used by your phone and its SIM card. These codes help you protect the phone against unauthorised use.

The access codes (except for the PUK and PUK2 codes) can be changed using the Security Settings menu (5-3) options. See page 94 for further details.

## Phone Passw ord

This security code can be used to avoid unauthorised use of the phone. The security code 0000 is the factory default setting but you are advised to change the security code before you start using your phone. Keep the new code secret and in a safe place, which is separate from the phone.

If you key in an incorrect security code five times in succession, the phone will not accept the correct code for the next five minutes.

## PIN code

The PIN (Personal Identification Number) code protects your SIM card against unauthorised use. The PIN code is usually supplied with the SIM card. W hen the PIN code request is enabled (Menu 5-3-1), the code is asked each time the phone is switched on.

If you key in an incorrect PIN code three times in succession, key in the PUK code and press the OK soft key. Key in a new PIN code and press the OK soft key. Key in the new PIN code again and press the OK soft key.

## PIN2 code

The PIN2 code, supplied with some SIM cards, is required to access some functions, such as charging unit counters. These functions are only available if supported by your SIM card.
If you key in an incorrect PIN2 code three times in succession, key in the PUK2 code and press the OK soft key. Key in a new PIN2 code and press the OK soft key. Key in the new PIN2 code again and press the OK soft key.

## PUK code

The PUK (Personal Unblocking Key) code is required to change a blocked PIN code. The PUK code may be supplied with the SIM card. If not, contact your local service provider.

If you key in an incorrect PUK code ten times in succession, the SIM card cannot be used anymore. Contact your service provider for a new card.

You cannot change the PUK code. If you lose the code, contact your service provider.

## PUK2 code

The PUK2 code, supplied with some SIM cards, is required to change a blocked PIN2 code.

If you key in an incorrect PUK2 code ten times in succession, you cannot use the functions requiring the PIN2 code. Contact your service provider for a new card.

You cannot change the PUK2 code. If you lose the code, contact your service provider.

## Barring Passw ord

The 4-digit barring password is required when you use the Call Barring function. You obtain the passw ord from your service provider when you subscribe to this function.

## Using the Batteries

Your phone is powered by a rechargeable Li-ion standard battery.
The following batteries are also available (ask your SAM SUNG dealer for further details):

- Slim battery
- Standard battery


## Precautions When Using Batteries

- Never use any charger or battery that is damaged in any way.
- Use the battery only for its intended purpose.
- If you use the phone near the netw ork's base station, it uses less power; talk and standby times are greatly affected by the signal strength on the cellular netw ork and the parameters set by the netw ork operator.
- Battery charging times depend on the remaining battery charge and the type of battery and charger used. The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but it will gradually wear out. When the operation time (talk time and standby time) is noticeably shorter than normal, it is time to buy a new battery.
- If left unused, a fully charged battery will discharge itself over time.
- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and recharge your battery only with Samsung-approved chargers. When a charger is not in use, disconnect it from the power source. Do not leave the battery connected to a charger for more than a week, since overcharging may shorten its life.
- Extreme temperatures will affect the charging capacity of your battery: it may require cooling or warming first.
- Do not leave the battery in hot or cold places, such as in a car in summer or winter conditions, as you will reduce the capacity and life-time of the battery. Alw ays try to keep the battery at room temperature. A phone with a hot or cold battery may temporarily not work, even when the battery is fully charged. Li-ion batteries are particularly affected by temperatures below $0^{\circ} \mathrm{C}\left(32^{\circ} \mathrm{F}\right)$.
- Do not short-circuit the battery. Accidental short circuiting can occur when a metallic object (coin, clip or pen) causes a direct connection betw een the +and - terminals of the battery (metal strips on the back of the battery), for example when you carry a spare battery in a pocket or bag. Short-circuiting the terminals may damage the battery or the object causing the short-circuit.
- Dispose of used batteries in accordance with local regulations. Always recycle. Do not dispose of batteries in a fire.


## Safety Information

## Road Safety

- Remember, road safety always comes first!
- Do not use a hand-held phone while driving a vehicle. Always park the vehicle before having a conversation.
- M ake sure that the phone is stored safely and will not fall or be broken in the event of a collision or emergency stop.
- The use of an alert device to operate a vehicle's lights or horn on public roads is not permitted.
- Only qualified personnel should install or service the phone in a vehicle. Faulty installation or service may be dangerous and may invalidate any warranty applicable to the unit.
- Electronic fuel injection, anti-skid braking, electronic cruise control or any other electronic systems may malfunction due to the lack of protection from radio signals. Check regularly that all cellular phone equipment in your vehicle is mounted and operating correctly.


## Operating Environment

- Remember to follow any special regulations in force in any area and always switch off your phone whenever it is forbidden to use it, or when it may cause interference or danger (in a hospital for example).
- Operation of any radio transmitting equipment, including cellular phones, may interfere with inadequately protected medical devices. Consult a physician or the manufacturer of the medical device if you have any questions. Other electronic equipment may also be subject to interference.
- As with other mobile radio transmitting equipment, you are advised that for satisfactory operations and personal safety, the equipment should only be used in the normal operating position.
- The effect of the GSM transmit/duty cycle on hearing aids and pacemakers is being investigated, and there is potential hazards associated with use close to such personal medical electronic devices.
- Always switch off the phone when at a refuelling point (service station). You are reminded of the need to observe restrictions on the use of radio equipment in fuel depots (fuel storage and distribution areas), chemical plants or where blasting operations are in progress.
- Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases or explosive materials in the same compartment as the phone, its parts or accessories.
- Switch off your cellular phone when in an aircraft. The use of cellular phones in an aircraft is illegal and may be dangerous to the operation of the aircraft or disrupt the cellular netw ork. Failure to observe these instructions may lead to the suspension or denial of cellular telephone services to the offender, legal action or both.


## Care and Maintenance

Your phone is a product of superior design and craftsmanship and should be treated with care. The suggestions below will help you fulfill the warranty obligations and enjoy this product for many years.

- Keep the phone and all its parts and accessories out of the reach of small children.
- Keep the phone dry. Precipitation, humidity and liquids containing minerals will corrode the electronic circuits.
- Do not use or store the phone in dusty, dirty areas as its components may be damaged.
- Do not store the phone in hot areas. High temperatures can shorten the life of electronic devices, damage batteries and warp or melt certain plastics.
- Do not store the phone in cold areas. When the phone warms up (to its normal temperature), moisture can form inside the phone, which may damage the electronic circuits.
- Do not attempt to open the phone. Non-expert handling of the phone may damage it.
- Do not drop or knock the phone. Rough handling may damage the internal circuits.
- Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents or strong detergents to clean the phone. Wipe it with a soft cloth slightly dampened in mild, soapy water.
- If the phone or any of its accessories are not working properly, take them to your nearest qualified service centre. The personnel there will assist you, and if necessary, arrange for the phone to be repaired.


## Emergency Calls

Important! This phone, like any cellular phone, uses radio signals, cellular and landline netw orks, as well as user-programmed functions that cannot guarantee connection in all conditions. Therefore, you should never rely solely on any cellular phone for essential communications (medical emergencies for example).

Remember, to make or receive any calls, the phone must be switched on and in a service area with adequate cellular signal strength.

Emergency calls may not be possible on all cellular phone netw orks or when certain netw ork services and/or phone features are in use. Check with local cellular service providers.

## Glossary

To help you understand the main technical terms and abbreviations used in this booklet and take full advantage of the features on your mobile phone, here are a few definitions.

## Active Folder

Ability to voice dial or voice command immediately on opening the phone.

## ALS(Alternate Line Service)

ALS provides the capability of associating two alternate lines with one SIM card. You can make and receive calls on either line as desired with this service.

## Call Barring

Ability to restrict outgoing and incoming calls.

## Call Diverting

Ability to reroute calls to another mobile or fixed line.

## Call Holding

Ability to put one call on standby while answering or making another call; you can then switch between the two calls, as required.

## Call Waiting

Ability to inform users that they have an incoming call when engaged on another call.

## GSM (Global System for Mobile Communication)

International standard for cellular communication, guaranteeing compatibility betw een the various netw ork operators. GSM covers most European countries and many other parts of the world.

## Line Identification Services

Service allowing subscribers to view or block the telephone numbers of callers.

## Multi-party Calling

Ability to establish a conference call involving up to five additional parties.

## Phone's Passw ord

Security code used to unlock the phone when you have selected the option to lock it automatically each time it switches on.

## PIN (Personal Identification Number)

Security code that protects the phone/SIM against unauthorised use. The PIN is supplied by the service provider with the SIM card. It may be a four to eightdigit number and can be changed, as required.

## PUK (PIN Unblocking Key)

Security code used to unlock the phone when an incorrect PIN has been entered three times in succession. The eight-digit number is supplied by the service provider with the SIM card.

## Roaming

Use of your phone when you are outside your home area (when travelling for example).

## SIM (Subscriber Identification Module)

Card containing a chip with all the information required to operate the phone (netw ork and memory information, as well as the subscriber's personal data). The SIM card fits into a small slot on the back of the phone and is protected by the battery.

## SMS (Short Message Service)

Netw ork service sending and receiving messages to and from another subscriber without having to speak to the correspondent. The message created or received (up to 160 characters long) can be displayed, received, edited or sent.

## Soft Keys

## Voice Mail

Computerised answering service that automatically answers your calls when you are not available, plays a greeting (optionally in your own voice) and records a message.

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
