## Inserting the Battery

The AA battery is not supplied.

- *1* Slide the cover in the direction of the arrow to open.
- 2 Insert the AA battery to the right poles (+, -) and push-close the cover in the direction of the arrow as indicated.

- Do not place heavy objects on the cover.

- Windows ME, 2000 and XP can recognize the driver without installing the provided program. However, you must install the program in order to format the player and upgrade firmware.
- If you are using Windows 98, install the USB driver first before connecting the player to your PC.

Before connecting the player to PC, make sure to install USB driver. If "Add New Hardware Wizard" appears, press the [Cancel] button and install the USB driver.



### Connecting the player to PC with the USB cable

- 1 Connect the USB cable to the USB port on your PC.
- 2 Connect the other end of the USB cable to the USB cable connection port on the bottom of the player.
  - If you disconnect the USB cable from your PC while implementing a command or initializing during USB driver installation, your PC may not function correctly.
- 3 The USB driver is installed with a message saying that it is searching for a new device. You may not see the display screen during installation. Go to the device manager (see next page) to check that installation has been successfully completed.
- 4 Upon installation of the USB driver "Samsung YP-C1 USB Device" will appear in your PC's control panel under [System Properties] → [Device Manager].



## Disconnecting the USB cable

### Downloading/Uploading files

- 1 Connect the player to your PC with the supplied USB cable.
- $2 \ {\rm Open} \ {\rm Windows} \ {\rm Explorer} \ {\rm on} \ {\rm PC}.$ 
  - Removable Disc is displayed in Windows Explorer.
- 3 Select the file to save and drag-and-drop it into the removable disk icon. (Files appear on the player in numerical, alphabetical order)
  - For example, if you change the name of music files in Windows Explorer to 001\* \* \*, 002\* \* \*..., the files will be played in the numerical order you set.



- The "WRITING/READING" message will appear on the player's display during file download or upload. Disconnecting the USB cable while "WRITING/READING" is displayed may cause malfunction of the player.
- To use the player as removable (backup) storage for your PC, simply drag and drop files to the Removable Disc icon in Windows Explorer in the same way as saving music files above.





## **Ripping Tracks from an Audio CD**





## Playing Music and Turning Off the Device

## **HOLD Function**

Make sure the earphones are connected.

### **Turning Power On and Off**

Power On : Press the ►II button to turn on the power. Power Off : Press and hold the ►II button to turn off the power.

### **Playing Music**

Press the ►II button.

Playback starts.

### **Pausing Music**

Press the ▶∎ button to pause playback.

- If no buttons are pressed within 10 seconds (changes depending on settings shown on page 57), the player automatically powers off.
- While in Pause mode, press the ►II button again to resume playback.

## Adjusting the Volume

Press -, + to adjust the volume from 00 to 30.

### a Note

- If the file name is not displayed correctly, move to [Settings] → [Language] → [Menu] and then change the language setting. When the language setting changes, the language in the menu screen changes accordingly.
- WMA files can only be played as music files with a compression rate of 48Kbps-192Kbps.
- The power off time can be set in the menu. See page 57.

In Hold mode, all buttons are disabled. This function is useful when you are walking or jogging.

Slide the ..... switch in the direction of the arrow. When the button is pressed, the " HOLD!" message will appear on the display.

## Recording Voice

- \* To move to other modes from the Voice mode, refer to page 41 "Changing Modes".
- I Press and hold the **REC** button for two seconds and then release to start voice recording.
- $2\ {\rm Press}$  the  ${\rm REC}$  button again to stop the recording and save the voice file.



### 🖄 Note

- The files are recorded in the order of V001,V002....., and saved as WAV files in the VOICE folder after recording (Menu → Navigation → Voice).
- If the Memory is full, Voice Recording is stopped automatically.
- Voice Recording does not work in FM Mode or when the Line In cable is connected.

## Recording MP3s

You can record music as MP3s directly from an external audio source without having to use your computer.

## \* To move to other modes from LINE\_ENC mode, refer to page 41 "Changing Modes".

*I* Connect the Audio Output port on the external audio source (or the Line Out port) to the ENC port on the device with the Line cable.

• Press the play button on the external device to play the music to record.



2 Press and hold the REC button to start MP3 recording.

● If the ▶II button is pressed, recording is paused and if the ▶II button is pressed again, the recording resumes.

- ${\bf 3}$  If the REC button is pressed during recording, the recording stops and an MP3 file is created.
  - The files are recorded in the order of L001, L002.... and saved as MP3 files in LINE\_ENC folder after recording.

#### À Note

- Bit Rates can be set within the range of 32Kbps~128Kbps.
- Volume can be adjusted while monitoring the recording.

#### À Notice

- Do not disconnect the Line cable during recording.
- If the battery is not sufficiently charged, the player will not completely record the file.
- Adjust the volume of the external audio source to a suitable level and record it. If the volume level is too high, the sound quality may be poor.

## **Searching for Music/Voice Files**

#### To search for specific parts during play

- Release I◀, ➡I to resume play normally.

#### To change tracks during play

- Press ▶ briefly during playback to play the next track.
- Press I◀ briefly within 5 seconds after playback starts, to move to and play the previous track. Press I◀ briefly after five seconds to play the current track from the beginning.

#### To change tracks when stopped

● Press I, ▶ I in stop mode to move to the previous/next track.

#### À Note

- VBR(Variable Bit Rate) file: A file that constantly changes the compression rate according to the type of sounds, such as their pitch, in the file.
- When playing a VBR file, you cannot move to and play the previous track even if you press I≪ within 5 seconds after playback starts.
- Files that were downloaded in MP2 or MP1 and had their file extension changed to MP3 may not play.

You can bookmark a point in a track to return to later.

- 1 Press the REC button briefly during playback.
  - "IB" mark will be displayed and a bookmark is set.
  - Press [4], >> within the bookmarked file to move to the bookmarked locations.



- A bookmark can only be set in one track at a time, so if the bookmark function is set to on and playback advances to the next track, "B" will be displayed.
- To remove the bookmark, press the REC button once again at the bookmark.
   "B" mark will disappear.

## Listening to FM Radio

## Listening to FM Radio

First, press the "M" button to display the menu screen and select FM Radio.

## Manual Search for a Frequency

● Press I◀, ► briefly to search manually for the frequency you want.

## Automatic Search for a Frequency

● Press and hold I◀, ► I to search for and stop at frequencies with reception.

## Manual Storage of a Frequency

- After searching manually for the frequency you want, press the A↔B button to display the save screen.
- Press I◀, ►►I to select the number you want to assign to save the frequency and then press the A↔B button.


## Automatic Storage of a Frequency

- $\bullet$  Press and hold the  $\textbf{A}{\leftrightarrow}\textbf{B}$  button while in FM Mode.
- Frequencies within the range of 87.5MHz to 108.0MHz are automatically selected and stored.
- Frequencies are automatically stored, starting from 1.

### a Note

- To exit from FM Mode, press the "M" button.
- Mono (MO) or Stereo (ST) is automatically selected.

## Searching Stored Frequencies

- Press the "M" button in FM Mode.
   PRESET screen will appear.
- 2 Use I, H, H to move to the frequency you want.

## Deleting Stored Frequencies

- 1 After moving to the PRESET number you want to delete, press the  $\mathbf{A} \leftrightarrow \mathbf{B}$  button.
- 2 After selecting the "Y" (Yes), press the "M" button. ● The saved PRESET number will be deleted.

## Mute Function

- 1 Press the ►II button in FM mode.
  - ${\ensuremath{\bullet}}$  "MUTE" is displayed and no sound is heard.
- 2 Press the ►II button again.
  - Mute function is released.

#### À Note

- You can store up to 20 frequencies.
- Press the "M" button in the PRESET screen to exit the PRESET mode.

## FM Recording

## **MENU Options**

- *I* Press and hold the **REC** button during FM reception.
  - Recording of the currently transmitted FM broadcast begins.



- 2 Press the **REC** button again.
  - A file is created and the recording stops.
  - Files are recording in the order F001, F002, F003...and saved as MP3 files in FM\_ENC folder.

### À Notice

- If the battery is not sufficiently charged, the player will not completely record the file.

## Loop Repeating

#### Starting Point

While playing music files, press the  $A \leftrightarrow B$  button briefly at the beginning of the loop you want to set.  $A \leftrightarrow$  appears in the display.

### Ending Point

Press the  $\mathbf{A} \leftrightarrow \mathbf{B}$  button briefly again to set the end of the loop.


A↔B appears in the display. The loop is played repeatedly.

### À Note

- Press the A $\leftrightarrow$ B button briefly to cancel the loop.

#### Press and hold the "M" button to switch to MENU mode.

Use -, to move and press the "M" button briefly to select the menu you want. Press and hold the "M" button to exit the MENU mode.



- Music : To view the file currently playing.

- I Press the "M" button to enter Navigation mode, or press and hold the "M" button to move to Menu and then select Navigation in Menu.
- 2 Select the file or folder that you want to play.
  - It: To exit a folder and go back one level.
  - It is view the contents of a folder.
  - ,+ : When moving to a file or folder in the same directory.
  - "M" : Move to the next folder down. When there is no lower folder, the selected file will be designated as part of the playlist.

#### 3 Press the ►∎ button.

• The selected file will be played.



### A Note
