





## Charging the battery |

- 1 Slide the USB door on the rear side of the player in the direction of the arrow.
- 2 Turn the USB plug so that it faces outward.
- 3 Connect the USB plug on the player to the USB port on your computer.
  - \* When recharging is complete, "Fully Charged" is shown in the display window.
  - \* Battery recharge time in normal operation is approximately 2 hours and 30 minutes.



#### **Caution**

- Fully charge the rechargeable battery if using for the first time or after several months of non-use.
- To avoid the risk of fire, do not charge longer than 12 hours.
- Overcharging will reduce the battery life.
- The rechargeable battery is a consumable item and its capacity will decrease gradually.
- If you connect the player through a USB hub, the connection may be unstable. Please connect
  the player to the computer directly.

### Connecting the Player to Your PC

#### System Requirements.

The PC system must meet the following minimum specifications:

- Pentium 200MHz or greater
- Windows 98 SE/ME/2000/XP
- 40MB of available hard disk space
- CD-ROM drive (double speed or greater)
- USB port (2.0) supported
- VGA graphic

#### note 🏚

- Install the operating system in Administrator Account (main user) for Windows 2000 or XP.
  - Otherwise, installation will not be completed.
- Windows ME, 2000 and XP can recognize the driver without installing the provided program. However, you must install the program in order to format the player and upgrade firmware.
- If you are using Windows 98, install the USB driver first before connecting the player to your PC.

Before connecting the player to PC, make sure to install USB driver.

If "Add New Hardware Wizard" appears, press the [Cancel] button and install the USB driver.

1 Insert the Installation CD into the CD-ROM drive. Select [Install Player USB Driver].



#### Connecting the player to your PC

- ${f 1}$  Connect the USB plug of the player to the USB port on your PC.
  - If you disconnect the USB plug from your PC while implementing a command or initializing during USB driver installation, your PC may not function correctly.
- 2 The USB driver is installed with a message saying that it is searching for a new device. You may not see the display screen during installation. Go to the device manager (see next page) to check that installation has been successfully completed.
- 3 When the USB driver is successfully installed, "Samsung YP-U1 USB Device" will appear in your PC's control panel under [System Properties] → [Device Manager].

#### Manual Installation of USB Driver

Go to "Downloading/Uploading files" on page 20 if the USB driver is installed automatically. If an error occurs during installation of the USB driver, you must install the USB driver manually. Follow these steps if the USB driver is not installed:

Be sure the Installation CD is inserted in your PC's CD-Rom drive.

1 Check the device manager.

Windows 98SE/ME:

Control Panel → System → Device Manager

Windows 2000 / XP:

Control Panel → System → Hardware → Device Manager

- 2 Check if there is a device listed with an exclamation point or a question mark (displayed as unknown device or USB device).
- 3 Double click on the device listed with an exclamation point or a question mark.

- If you are using Windows 2000 and your version of Windows does not recognize the USB driver, please download and install the latest service pack from windowsupdate.microsoft.com
- The installation method may vary depending on the type of PC or operating system.
   Contact your PC dealer or service center for installation information.
- If errors occur continuously when you install the USB driver, reconnect the USB plug after rebooting your system.




 You cannot use the player as a removable disc in Windows 98SE if the YP-U1 program is not installed.

Make sure to install the USB driver file first.

### **Downloading/Uploading Files**

When the MP3 player is connected to your PC, the PC will see it as a removable disc. Music and other files can then be dragged and dropped into the removable disc for playback on the MP3 player.

- $m{1}$  Connect the player to your PC.
- 2 Open Windows Explorer on PC.
  - Removable Disc is displayed in Windows Explorer.
- 3 Select the file to save and drag-and-drop it into the removable disk icon.
  - (Files appear on the player in numerical, alphabetical order)
  - For example, if you change the name of music files in Windows Explorer to 001\*\*\*, 002\*\*\*..., the files will be played in the numerical order you set.



#### 🙆 Notice

- The "USB Transferring" message will appear on the player's display during file download or upload. Disconnecting the USB plug while "USB Transferring" is displayed may cause malfunction of the player.
- The music file order displayed in Windows Explorer may differ from the play order on your device.
- To use the player as removable (backup) storage for your PC, simply drag and drop files to the Removable Disc icon in Windows Explorer in the same way as saving music files above.
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
### Disconnecting the player

After completing the file transfer, you must disconnect the player in the following way:

1 Double-click on the green arrow in the taskbar on the bottom right of the window. The Safely Remove Hardware message appears. Press Stop.



2 When the [Stop a Hardware device] message appears, press the [OK] button and disconnect the player.





- If you disconnect the player improperly, the files on the device may be damaged and will not play.

### Formatting the Player on your PC

Formatting deletes all files on the MP3 player so maximum memory is available for new file storage. It saves you the trouble of deleting unwanted files one at a time.

1 Select the removable disc icon in Windows Explorer and click the right mouse button to select [Format].



#### 2 Press the [Start] button.

- All saved files will be deleted.
- You can change the name of removable disc by selecting [Volume label].





- By formatting, all previously preset menus will be reset, and any pre-existing song or data files will be erased.
- Care must be taken as formatted files can not be recovered.

## **Installing Media Studio**

Media Studio is the program that enables you to download music files to the player, and play back music files on your PC.

Insert the Installation CD into CD-ROM drive. Select [Install Samsung Media Studio].



#### | Downloading Music Files

- $\boldsymbol{I}$  Connect the player to your PC.
  - A device connection window will appear on the right side of the screen.
     Select [Device] → [Show device Window] at the top of the screen if device connection window does not automatically appear.
- 2 Select the folder with the file(s) you want to transfer from the [Library] window.
  - The music files within the folder appear in the center of the screen.



- 3 When music files appear, select the file(s) you want to transfer, and then press the [Transfer] 📥 button.
  - The selected file(s) are transferred to the player.





#### | Formatting the Player in Media Studio

- 1 Connect the player to PC.

  - The memory of the player is formatted (erased) and all the saved files will be deleted.









#### Ripping Tracks from an Audio CD

- $m{1}$  Insert the Audio CD into the CD-ROM drive of your PC.
- 2 Press the [Search Audio CD] button on the lower part of the Media Studio software screen
  - The tracks on the CD are displayed.



- 3 Select tracks to be ripped and press the [Rip a CD] → button.
  - The selected file is converted into an MP3 file.
  - Select [Tools]→[Audio Source Format Conversion Settings] on the top of the screen to change rip settings. You can change a file format, bitrate and save path on rip settings.



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#### | Creating a Folder on your Player


You can create folders on the player to better organize your music.

- ${\it 1}$  Connect the player to your computer.
- 2 Press the [Create Folder] 📵 button at the bottom of device connection window.
- 3 Enter the name of the new folder when an input screen appears.
  - A new folder is created on the player.
  - If you open a new folder and transfer a file, the file is transferred to the newly created folder on the player.



#### | Deleting Files

- I Connect the player to your computer.
- 2 Press the [Delete] button at the bottom of the connection window after selecting required files or folders you want to delete.
- 3 Press the [Confirm] button when the Confirm Deletion screen appears.
  - The selected folder or file is deleted.

## **Playing Music and Turning Off the Device**

Make sure the player is fully charged and the earphones are connected.

#### | Turning Power On and Off

Power On: Press the ►II button to turn on the power.

Power Off: Press and hold the ▶II button to turn off the power.

#### | Playing Music

Press the ►II button.

Playback starts.

#### | Pausing Music

Press the ▶II button to pause playback.

- If no buttons are pressed within 10 seconds (changes depending on settings shown on page 49), the player automatically powers off.
- While in Pause mode, press the ►II button again to resume playback.

#### Adjusting the Volume

Press -, + to adjust the volume from 00 to 30.

#### Mote

- If the file name is not displayed correctly, move to [Settings] → [Language] → [ID3-Tag] and then change the language setting.
- WMA files can only be played as music files with a compression rate of 48Kbps-192Kbps.
- The power off time can be set in the menu. See page 49.

#### **HOLD Function**

In Hold mode, all buttons are disabled. This function is useful when you are walking or jogging.

Slide the switch in the direction of the arrow.

₩ When the button is pressed, the " A HOLD!" message will appear on the display.

## Recording Voice |

- \* To move to other modes from the Voice mode, refer to page 38 "Changing Modes".
- ${m 1}$  Press and hold the **REC** button for two seconds and then release to start voice recording.
- 2 Press the **REC** button again to stop the recording and save the voice file.





- The files are recorded in the order of V001, V002....., and saved as WAV files in the VOICE folder after recording.([Menu] → [Navigation] → [Voice]).
- If the Memory is full, Voice Recording will be disabled automatically.

### | Searching for Music/Voice Files

#### To search for specific parts during play

- Press and hold I
  I during playback to search for the part you want to listen to.
- Release 

  →, 

  i to resume play normally.

#### To change tracks during play

- Press ▶ briefly during playback to play the next track.
- Press I briefly within 5 seconds after playback starts, to move to and play the
  previous track. Press I briefly after five seconds to play the current track from
  the beginning.

#### To change tracks when stopped

● Press ► in stop mode to move to the previous/next track.

#### **८** Mote

- VBR(Variable Bit Rate) file: A file that constantly changes the compression rate according to the type of sounds, such as their pitch, in the file.
- When playing a VBR file, you cannot move to and play the previous track even if you press I

  within 5 seconds after playback starts.
- Files that were downloaded in MP2 or MP1 and had their file extension changed to MP3 may not play.

### **Loop Repeating**

#### | Starting Point

While playing music files, press the  $\mathbf{A} \leftrightarrow \mathbf{B}$  button briefly at the beginning of the loop you want to set.

A↔ appears in the display.



#### | Ending Point

Press the  $\mathbf{A} \leftrightarrow \mathbf{B}$  button briefly again to set the end of the loop.

- A↔B appears in the display.
- The loop is played repeatedly.

Press the  $A \leftrightarrow B$  button briefly to cancel the loop.





- Loop Repeat is automatically released if you Speed Search with [◄◄,▶►].

### **MENU Options**

#### Press and hold the MENU button to switch to MENU mode.

Use ■, ♣ to move and press the **MENU** button briefly to select the menu you want. Press and hold the **MENU** button to exit the MENU mode.



Music : To view the file currently playing.

Navigation: To move to Navigation Mode and browse files and folders on the player.

Playlist : To play back only the files you want

• Settings : To adjust the settings on the player. (refer to page 41)

● Exit : To exit MENU



- Menu mode will be cancelled if no buttons are pressed within 25 seconds
- Language in the menu screen can be changed in [Settings] → [Language] → [Menu].

# **Using Navigation**

You can easily search for files or switch modes using the Navigation function.

- 1 Press the MENU button to enter Navigation mode, or press and hold the MENU button to move to Menu and then select Navigation in Menu.
- 2 Select the file or folder that you want to play.
  - I<: To exit a folder and go back one level.
  - **>**: To view the contents of a folder.
  - , → : When moving to a file or folder in the same directory.
  - MENU: Move to the next folder down. When there is not no lower folder, the selected file will be designated as part of the playlist.
- 3 Press the ►II button.
  - The selected file will be played.





- Press and hold the **MENU** button in Navigation mode to exit the Navigation mode.



#### Preset FQ

- Select User FQ to set the 9 band FQ as desired.



### Bass Booster

- press the MENU button.
- Bass Booster function operates only when you select Normal, Classic, Jazz or Rock in the Preset EQ menu.
- On: When the music is played back, the bass is boosted
- Off: Bass boost function is off.

### User FQ Set

- If User EQ is selected, the EQ can be set to your preference.
- Use I◀ .▶I to move to the right or left to select the desired EQ, and use -, to adjust the level.

Press the **MENU** button after completing the setting.

- This is what is attached to an MP3 to carry information relevant to the file, such as the title, artist, album, year, genre and a comment field.
- Supported languages can be changed or added.
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# System Settings

Press and hold the MENU button. Select Settings → System.

#### Resume

- Use ■. ■ to select Resume On or Off.
- On: Playback will resume from the point it was previously stopped.
- Off: Playback will resume from the beginning of the file/track that was playing when stopped.



#### Default vol

- Use → , → to set the default volume from 0 to 30(Max).
- If the power is turned on again after having adjusted the volume to a level above the default volume(for example: 20) music is played at the default volume level.
- If the power is turned on again after having adjusted the volume at or below the default volume (for example: 20 or lower), the music is replayed at the previous volume.

- Check to see if the driver is installed correctly in the computer.
- Check the connection between the player and PC.
- Operating system limits the number of files you can save.
   Please save your music files by creating a subfolder.
- Check if the memory is full.

#### Backlight does not work.

- Check the backlight setup.
- When the battery power is low, the backlight will go out.

#### The buttons do not work.
