This device is a Class B digital apparatus.

Important Warranty Information Regarding Television Format Viewing

Standard screen format televisions (4:3, the aspect ratio of the screen width to height) are primarily designed to view standard format full-motion video. The images displayed on them should primarily be in the standard 4:3 ratio format and constantly moving. Displaying stationary graphics and images on screen, such as the dark top and bottom letterbox bars (wide screen pictures), should be limited to no more than 15% of the total television viewing per week.

Wide screen format televisions (16:9, the aspect ratio of the screen width to height) are primarily designed to view wide screen format full-motion video. The images displayed on them should primarily be in the wide screen 16:9 ratio format, or expanded to fill the screen if your model offers this feature, and constantly moving. Displaying stationary graphics and images on screen, such as the dark side-bars on non-expanded standard format television video and programming, should be limited to no more than 15% of the total television viewing per week.

Additionally, viewing other stationary images and text such as stock market reports, video game displays, station logos, web sites or computer graphics and patterns, should be limited as described above for all televisions. Displaying any stationary images that exceed the above guidelines can cause uneven aging of picture tubes (CRTs) that leave subtle, but permanent burned-in ghost images in the television picture. To avoid this, vary the programming and images, and primarily display full screen moving images, not stationary patterns or dark bars. On television models that offer picture sizing features, use these controls to view the different formats as a full screen picture.

Be careful in the selection and duration of television formats used for viewing. Uneven CRT aging as a result of format selection and use, as well as other burned-in images, is not covered by your Samsung limited warranty.






Using a Display Deck



Connection Jacks (Rear)

Use the rear panel jacks to connect an A/V component that will be connected continuously, such as a VCR or a DVD player. For more information on connecting equipment, see pages 14~19.



Antenna terminals

Two independent cables or antennas can be connected to these terminals. Use "ANT 1 IN" and "ANT 2 IN" terminals to receive a signal from VHF/ UHF antennas or your cable system. Use the "ANT 1 OUT" terminal to send the signal being received by the "ANT 1 IN" terminal out to another component (such as a Cable Set-Top Box). The PIP channel can be received only when a signal source is connected to "ANT 1 IN".

Surround Speaker Output Selection

The factory default is set to INT (Internal). For sound output to external speakers, set to EXT (External), then sound to the internal speaker is off.

Surround Speaker Output

Connect to the external speakers.

To improve the sound quality, connect the red wire to the red terminal and black wire to the black terminal.

Oigital Audio Input jacks

Connect to the digital audio output jacks for device with digital audio output.

6 Audio/Video Output jacks

Connect to the audio/video input jacks of a recording VCR.

Wideo Input jacks

Connect to the video output jacks of VCRs, DVD players and similar devices.

Audio Input jacks

Connect to the audio output jacks of VCRs, DVD players and similar devices.

S-Video Input jack

Connect to S-VIDEO output jacks of an S-VHS VCR or DVD player.

© COMPONENT Input jacks (Y, PB, PR, AUDIO-L/R)

Connect to the audio and video outputs of DVD or DTV Set-Top Box. 480i/480p/1080i Y,PB and PR video signal outputs are available.





(1) RESET




Connecting VHF and UHF Antennas

Antennas with 300-ohm Flat Twin Leads


If you are using an off-air antenna (such as a roof antenna or "rabbit ears") that has 300-ohm twin flat leads, follow the directions below.



to tighten the screws.



Plug the adaptor into the "ANT 1 IN" terminal on the rear panel.



Antennas with 75-ohm Round Leads

Plug the antenna lead into the "ANT 1 IN" terminal on the rear panel.




Separate VHF and UHF Antennas

If you have two separate antennas for your TV (one VHF and one UHF), you must combine the two antenna signals before connecting the antennas to the TV. This procedure requires an optional combiner-adaptor (available at most electronics shops).

1 Connect both antenna leads to the combiner.



Plug the combiner into the "ANT 1 IN" terminal on the rear panel.



Connecting Cable TV

You can connect different cable systems to your TV, including cable without a cable box, and cable with a cable box that descrambles some or all channels.

Cable without a Cable Box


If you want to connect cable, and you do not need to use a cable box:

Plug the incoming cable into the "ANT 1 IN" terminal on the rear panel.




Cable with a Cable box that Descrambles All Channels

Find the cable that is connected to the ANTENNA OUT terminal on your cable box.




■ This terminal might be labeled "ANT OUT", "VHF OUT", or simply "OUT".

Connect the other end of this cable to the "ANT 1 IN" terminal on the rear panel.



Connecting to a Cable Box that Descrambles Some Channels

If your cable box descrambles only some channels (such as premium channels), follow the instructions below. You will need a two-way splitter, an RF (A/B) switch, and four lengths of coaxial cable. (These items are available at most electronics stores.)



After you've made this connection, set the A/B switch to the "A" position for normal viewing. Set the A/B switch to the "B" position to view scrambled channels. (When you set the A/B switch to "B," you will need to tune your TV to the cable box's output channel, which is usually channel 3 or 4.)

Connecting a VCR

These instructions assume that you have already connected your TV to an antenna or a cable TV system (according to the instructions on pages 11~13). Skip step **1** if you have not yet connected to an antenna or a cable system.

1

Connect a coaxial cable between the "ANT IN" (1 or 2) terminal on the TV and the ANTENNA OUT terminal on the VCR.

A coaxial cable is usually included with a VCR. (If not, check your local electronics store).

2


Connect a set of audio cables between the "AV IN 1 (L, R)" (or "AV IN 2 (L, R)") jacks on the TV and AUDIO \overline{OUT} jacks on the VCR.

If you have a mono VCR, connect L(mono) to VCR audio out using only one audio cable.

3

Connect a video cable between the "AV IN 1 (VIDEO)" (or "AV IN 2 (VIDEO)") jack on the TV and the VIDEO OUT jack on the VCR.

Follow the instructions in "Viewing a VCR or Camcorder Tape" to view your VCR tape.



• Also, you can connect to "AV 3" on the side panel of TV.

Connecting a Second VCR to Record from the TV

Your TV can send out signals of its picture and sound to be recorded by a second VCR. To do this, connect your second VCR as follows:


Connect a set of audio cables between the "AV OUT (L,R)" jacks on the TV and the AUDIO IN jacks on the VCR.

(The VCR input jacks might be either on the front or rear of the VCR.)

2

Connect a video cable between the "AV OUT (VIDEO)" jack on the TV and the VIDEO IN jack on the VCR.

Refer to your VCR's instructions for more information about how to record using this kind of connection.



Connecting a DVD Player

The rear panel jacks on your TV make it easy to connect a DVD player to your TV.

Connecting to Y, PB, PR



Connect a set of audio cables between the "COMPONENT IN 1 (L, R)" (or "COMPONENT IN 2 (L, R)") jacks on the TV and the AUDIO OUT jacks on the DVD player.

Connect a set of video cables between the "COMPONENT IN 1 (Y, PB, PR)" (or "COMPONENT IN 2 (Y, PB, PR)") jacks on the TV and the VIDEO OUT (Y, PB, PR) jacks on the DVD player.


Connecting to Regular Audio and Video Jacks

Connect a set of audio cables between the "AV IN 1 (L, R)" (or "AV IN 2 (L, R)") jacks on the TV and the AUDIO OUT jacks on the DVD player.

Connect a video cable between the "AV IN 1 (VIDEO)" (or "AV IN 2 (VIDEO)") jack on the TV and the VIDEO OUT jack on the DVD player.



• Also, you can connect to "AV 3" on the side panel of TV.

Connecting a Digital TV Set-Top Box

The rear panel jacks on your TV make it easy to connect a Set-Top Box to your TV.

Connecting to Y, PB, PR

Connect a coaxial cable to the ANTENNA IN terminal on the Set-Top Box.



Connect a set of audio cables between the "COMPONENT IN 1 (L, R)" (or "COMPONENT IN 2 (L, R)") jacks on the TV and the AUDIO OUT jacks on the Set-Top Box.

Connect a set of video cables between the "COMPONENT IN 1 (Y, PB, PR)" (or "COMPONENT IN 2 (Y, PB, PR)") jacks on the TV and the VIDEO OUT (Y, PB, PR) jacks on the Set-Top Box.

The connections for a typical Set-Top Box are shown. For detailed information, refer to the Set-Top Box instruction manual.



Connecting to DVI (Digital Visual Interface)


By inputting a high-bandwidth digital content protection high-definition picture source to the DIGITAL INPUT jack on the TV, high-definition pictures can be displayed on the screen in their digital forms. (This DIGITAL INPUT jack is for use in the future when high-bandwidth digital content protection DTV decoders, DVD players and D-VHS are put on the market.)

Connect a set of audio cables between the "DVI IN (AUDIO-L, R)" jacks on the TV and the AUDIO OUT jacks on the Set-Top Box.

Connect a video cable between the "HDMI/DVI IN" jack on the TV and the VIDEO OUT jack on the Set-Top Box.




• The DIGITAL INPUT jack can only be used with 1080i and 480p picture signals. Set the DTV decoder DIGITAL OUTPUT jack output setting to 1080i or 480p. The DIGITAL INPUT jack is not compatible with the picture signal of a PC.

Connecting to HDMI (High Definition Multimedia Interface)

Connect a HDMI cable between the "HDMI/DVI IN" jacks on the TV and the HDMI OUT jacks on the Set-Top Box.

Please check that the HDMI source is powered on. If not, you can not select "HDMI" in the "Source List" on-screen menu.



Connecting a Camcorder

The side panel jacks on your TV make it easy to connect a camcorder to your TV. They allow you to view the camcorder tapes without using a VCR.

1

Locate the A/V output jacks on the camcorder. They are usually found on the side or rear of the camcorder.



Connect a set of audio cables between the "AV 3 (L, R)" jacks on the TV and the AUDIO OUT jacks on the camcorder. If you have mono camcorder, connect L(mono) to camcorder audio out using only one audio cable.

Connect a video cable between the "AV 3 (VIDEO)" (or "S-VIDEO2 INPUT") jack on the TV and the VIDEO OUT jacks on the camcorder.


The audio-video cables shown here are usually included with a Camcorder. (If not, check your local electronics store.) If your camcorder is stereo, you need to connect a set of two cables.



Connecting to the Digital Audio Input

The rear panel jacks on your TV make it easy to connect a device with digital audio output. After making a connection, set the audio input by reference to page 51.

Connect a audio (or optical) cable between the "COAXIAL IN" (or "OPTICAL IN") jack on the TV and the AUDIO OUT jack on a device with digital audio output.



Connecting Additional Speakers

The rear panel jacks on your TV make it easy to take advantage of the surround sound system.

Connect speaker audio cables to "SURROUND SPEAKER OUT" terminals on the TV.


To improve the sound quality, connect the Red wire to the Red terminal and Black wire to the Black terminal.

The factory default of "SURROUND SPEAKER OUT SELECTION" is set to "INT" (Internal). For sound output to external speakers, set to "EXT" (External), then sound to the internal speaker is off.


• The speakers MUST have to a power handling capability of 10 watts minimum (impedance 8 Ω).

Installing Batteries in the Remote Control





■ Make sure to match the "+" and "-" ends of the batteries with the diagram inside the compartment.



■ Remove the batteries and store them in a cool, dry place if you won't be using the remote control for a long time. (Assuming typical TV usage, the batteries last for about one year.)

• The remote control can be used up to about 23 feet from the TV.

Turning the TV On and Off

Press the **POWER** button on the remote control.
You can also use the **POWER** button on the front panel.

Plug & Play Feature

When the TV is initially powered On, basic customer settings proceed automatically and subsequently as below.

Press the **POWER** button on the remote control.
The "Start Plug & Play" is displayed.

Press the **ENTER** button to start.



■ Plug & Play feature doesn't work when the V-Chip is activated or when in the A/V mode.

The "Language" menu is displayed.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the appropriate language, then press the **ENTER** button.

The "Check antenna input" is displayed.

Make sure that the antenna is connected to the TV, then press the **ENTER** button.

The "Air/CATV" menu is displayed.

Press the \triangle or ∇ button to select the video signal source, then press the **ENTER** button.





The TV displays the current channel, the status of certain picture and sound settings and the current time.



Selecting the Antenna Input

You can connect two different signal sources by choosing the antenna input ("Ant.1" or "Ant.2").



Adjusting the Screen Automatically (Self Focus)

The "Self Focus" feature automatically finds the optimum picture quality when blurring, overlapping colors or incorrect focus occurs. These conditions may be caused by moving your TV

1

Press the **MENU** button.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select "Setup", then press the **ENTER** button.





Press the \triangle or ∇ button to select "Self Focus", then press the **ENTER** button.

The "Self Focus" is selected.

Press the ENTER button again. The self focus process begins with the message "Self Focus" and horizontal bar is displayed. When it is finished, all of things will disappear and the optimum picture quality can be enjoyed.

Press the **EXIT** button to exit.






■ During the process, minor distortions of the picture may occur. At this time, the colors may diffuse and a searching pattern will appear on the edges of the screen. This is a normal part of the adjustment.

Alternate method:

Simply press the **SELF FOCUS** button on the remote control to enjoy the optimum picture quality.




- Changing channels and any other signal changes will pause the self focus until a stable signal has returned. It resumes after the signal has been stabilised. This feature will not work without a signal
- Ambient light that is too bright may affect the self focus. If this occurs, darken the environment and try again.


Deactivating the Automatic Execution of the Self Focus

The "Self Focus" feature starts on default. It will automatically begin 10 minutes after switching on the power and the appearance of the screen image. To set the optimum picture quality, the "Self Focus" will automatically begin again after another 30 minutes, as the screen image is then fully stabilised.

Memorizing the Channels

Your TV can memorize and store all of the available channels for both "off-air" (antenna) and cable channels. After the available channels are memorized, use the $CH \land$ and $CH \lor$ buttons to scan through the channels. This eliminates the need to change channels by entering the channel digits.

Selecting the Video Signal Source

Before your TV can begin memorizing the available channels, you must specify the type of signal source that is connected to the TV (i.e., an antenna or a cable system).



Press the **MENU** button. Press the \triangle or ∇ button to select "Channel", then press the **ENTER** button.

Press the \triangle or ∇ button to select "Air/CATV", then press the **ENTER** button.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select "Air", "STD", "HRC" or "IRC", then press the **ENTER** button.

Press the EXIT button to exit.




- If you are connected to an antenna, press the
 or
 ▼ button to select "Air".
- If you connected cable, press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the type of cable system: "STD", "HRC" or "IRC".
- "STD", "HRC" and "IRC" identify various types of cable TV systems. Contact your local cable company to identify the type of cable system that exists in your particular area. At this point the signal source has been selected. Proceed to "Storing Channels in Memory Automatically".
- Subscription cable services require service-specific requirement for viewing.

Storing Channels in Memory Automatically

First, select the correct signal source ("Air", "STD", "HRC" or "IRC") as described on the previous page.





Changing Channels

Using the Channel Buttons

Press the CH o or CH o button to change channel.

When you press the CH ∧ or CH ∨ button, the TV changes channels in sequence. You will see all the channels that the TV has memorized. (The TV must have memorized at least three channels.) You will not see channels that were either erased or not memorized.

Using the Number Buttons

Use the number buttons to quickly tune to any channel.

Press the number buttons to go directly to a channel. For example, to select channel "27", press the "2", then "7". The TV will change channels when you press the second number.

When you use the number buttons, you can directly select channels that were either erased or not memorized.

To select a channel over 100, press the +100 button. (For channel "122", press the +100 button, then "2", then "2".)

To change to single-digit channels (0-9) faster, press the "0" before the single digit. (For channel "4", press the "0", then "4".)

Using the Previous Channel


Press the **PRE-CH** button. The TV changes to the last channel you were watching.



Selecting Your Favorite Channels

You can store your favorite channels for each available input source (such as TV and CATV), This allows you to quickly and easily find frequently watched channels by pressing the FAV.CH button on the remote control.

To Store Your Favorite Channels:



Press the **MENU** button. Press the \triangle or \bigvee button to select "Channel", then press the **ENTER** button.

Press the \triangle or ∇ button to select "Favorite Channels", then press the **ENTER** button.

Press the \triangle or \blacktriangledown button to select a channel, then press the **ENTER** button.

Press the **ENTER** button again to deselect the selected channel.

Press the EXIT button to exit.



■ Only memorized channels can be set as Favorite channels.

To View Your Favorite Channels:

Press the **FAV.CH** button repeatedly to jump from one favorite channel to another.



Labeling the Channels

Use this feature to assign an easy-to-remember label to any channel (i.e., "CBS", "ESPN", "PBS2", CNN1", etc.) A label consists of five fields, where each field is a letter, a number or a blank. When the **INFO** button is pressed, the channel label will appear next to the channel number.

Press the $\mathbf{CH} \wedge$ or $\mathbf{CH} \vee$ button to tune to the channel that will be labeled.

Press the **MENU** button. Press the \triangle or \blacktriangledown button to select "Channel", then press the **ENTER** button.


DVD OPERATION

Pausing Playback

Press the ►II (Play/Pause) button during playback, then screen stops and no sound. To resume, press the ►II (Play/Pause) button again. It will pick up where you left off

(unless the disc is removed, the ■ (Stop) button is pressed twice or

the set is unplugged.).



- ◀ If the player is left for 5 minutes in pause mode, it will stop.
- The "⊘" icon indicates an invalid button press.

Slow Motion Play (Except CD)

Press the ►► (Forward search) button during pause.




- By pressing the ►► (Forward search) button for a second during pause, you can select slow motion playback for 1/2, 1/4, 1/8 or 1/16 of normal speed.
- No sound is heard during slow mode.
- Press the ►II (Play/Pause) button to resume normal playback.
- When playing a VCD, the reverse slow motion play will not work.

DVD OPERATION

Using the Search and Skip Functions

Searching through a Chapter or Track

Press the ►► (Forward search) or ◄ (Rewind search) button during playback.



■ When in search mode (2X/4X/8X/16X/32X) on a DVD or high-speed playback on a VCD, no sound will be heard.

- Press the ►► (Forward search) or ◄◄ (Rewind search) button and press again to search at a faster speed (2X/4X/8X/16X/32X) on the DVD, VCD, CD.

Skipping Tracks

 press the I◄ (Back skip) button, it moves to the beginning of the chapter. One more press makes
 it move to the beginning of the previous chapter.
- When playing a CD, if you press the ►► (Next skip) button, it moves to next track. If you press the I◄ (Back skip) button, it moves to the beginning of the track. One more press makes it move to the beginning of the previous track.
- When playing a VCD 2.0 in MENU OFF mode, a VCD1.1 or a CD, if you press the ►► (Next skip) button, it moves to next track. If you press the I◄ (Back skip) button, it moves to the the beginning of the track. One more press makes it move to the beginning of the previous track.
- If a track exceeds 15 minutes when playing a VCD and you press the ►► (Next skip) button, it moves forward 5 minutes. If you press the I◄ (Back skip) button, it moves backward 5 minutes.
- When playing a VCD 2.0 in the MENU MODE or Track View function, if you press the ►► (Next skip) button, it moves to the next menu or the next Track View display. If you press the ►► (Back skip) button, it moves to the previous menu or the previous Track View display.



When playing CD-R/MP3 discs, please follow the recommendations below:

- Your MP3 files should be ISO 9660 or JOLIET format.
 ISO 9660 format and Joliet MP3 files are compatible with Microsoft's DOS and Windows, and with Apple's Mac. These two formats are the most widely used.
- When naming your MP3 files do not exceed 8 characters, and place ".mp3" as the file extension.

General name format of: Title.mp3. When composing your title, make sure that you use 8 characters or less, have no spaces in the name, and avoid the use of special characters including: (../, =,+).

- Use a decompression transfer rate of at least 128 Kbps when recording MP3 files. Sound quality with MP3 files basically depends on the rate of compression/decompression you choose. Getting audio CD quality sound requires an analog/digital sampling rate (conversion to MP3 format) of at least 128 Kbps and up to 160 Kbps. However, choosing higher rates, like 192 Kbps or more, only rarely give better sound quality. Conversely, files with sampling rates below 128 Kbps will not be played properly.
- Do not try recording copyright protected MP3 files.
 Certain "securized" files are encrypted and code protected to prevent illegal copying. These files are of the following types: Windows Media™ (registered trade mark of Microsoft Inc) and SDMITM (registered trademark of The SDMI Foundation). You cannot copy such files.
- Your DVD player only accepts one level of file directory.

Consequently you must choose:

- either to save all your MP3 recording files at the root of the disc;
- and/or create folders in the directory for each artist or music type (e.g.classical, rock, jazz, etc)


The above recommendations cannot be taken as a guarantee that the DVD player will play MP3 recordings, or as an assurance of sound quality. You should note that certain technologies and methods for MP3 file recording on CD-Rs prevent optimal playback of these files on your DVD player (degraded sound quality and in some cases, inability of the player to read the files).






Refers to the subtitle languages available in the disc. You will be able to choose the subtitles language or, if you prefer, turn them off from the screen. A DVD disc can have up to 32 different subtitles.

Changing the Camera Angle

When a DVD contains multiple angles of a particular scene, you can select the Angle function.



Using the Bookmark Function (DVD/VCD)

This feature lets you bookmark sections of a DVD or VCD so you can quickly find them at a later time.



Press the **DVD MENU** button.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select
"Function", then press the **ENTER**button.

Chapter Five

TROUBLESHOOTING

If the TV seems to have a problem, first try this list of possible problems and solutions. If none of these troubleshooting tips apply, then call your nearest service center.

Identifying Problems

Problem	Possible Solution
Poor picture	Try another channel. Adjust the antenna. Check all wire connections.
Poor sound quality	Try another channel. Adjust the antenna.
No picture or sound	Try another channel. Press the SOURCE button. Make sure the TV is plugged in. Check the antenna connections.
No color, wrong colors or tints.	Make sure the program is broadcast in color. Adjust the picture settings. If the set is moved or turned in a different direction, the power should be OFF for at least 30 minutes.
Picture rolls vertically.	Adjust the antenna. Check all wire connections.
The TV operates erratically.	Unplug the TV for 30 seconds, then try operating it again.
The TV won't turn on.	Make sure the wall outlet is working.

Troubleshooting

Problem	Possible Solution
Disc does not play.	Ensure that the disc is installed with the label side facing up. Check the region number of the DVD. This player cannot play CD-ROMs, DVD-ROMs, CD-R, etc. Insert a DVD, a VIDEO-CD or a CD.
5.1 channel sound is not being reproduced.	 5.1 channel sound is reproduced only when the following conditions are met.: 1) The DVD player is connected with the proper amplifier. 2) The disc is recorded with 5.1 channel sound. • Check whether the disc being played has the "Dolby 5.1 ch" mark on the outside. • Check if your audio system is connected and working properly.
The "⊘" icon appears on screen.	 The features or action cannot be completed at this time because: 1) The DVD's software restricts it. 2) The DVD's software doesn't support the feature (e.g., angles). 3) The feature is not available at the moment. 4) You've requested a title or chapter number or search time that is out of range.
Disc Menu doesn't appear.	Check if the disc has a Menu.
Playback mode differs from the Setup Menu selection.	Some of the functions selected in the Setup Menu may not work properly if the disc is not encoded with the corresponding function.
If you experience other problems.	Go to the contents and find the section of the instruction book that contains the explanations regarding the current problem, and follow the procedure once again. If the problem still cannot be solved, please contact your nearest authorized service center.

APPENDIX

Cleaning and Maintaining Your TV

With proper care, your TV unit will give you many years of service. Please follow these guidelines to get the maximum performance from your TV.

Placement

- Do not place the TV near extremely hot, cold, humid or dusty places.
- Do not place the TV near appliances with electric motors that create magnetic fields, such as vacuum cleaners.
- Keep the ventilation openings clear; do not place the TV on a soft surface, such as cloth or paper.
- Place the TV in a vertical position only.

Liquids

• Do not handle liquids near or on the TV. Liquids that spill into it can cause serious damage.

Cabinet

- Never open the cabinet or touch the parts inside.
- Wipe your TV with a clean, dry cloth. Never use water, cleaning fluids, wax, or chemicals.
- Do not put heavy objects on top of the cabinet.

Temperature

• If your TV is suddenly moved from a cold to a warm place, unplug the power cord, and allow at least two hours for moisture that may have formed inside the unit to dry completely.

Using Your TV in Another Country

If you plan to take your TV with you to a foreign country, please be aware of the different television systems that are in use around the world. A TV designed for one system may not work properly with another system due to differences in the TV channel frequencies.
