



Familiarizing Yourself with The TV

Front Panel Buttons

The buttons on the front panel control your TV's basic features, including the on-screen menu. To use the more advanced features, you must use the remote control.



O POWER

Press to turn the TV on and off.

2 TIMER indicator

When the TV is turned on, the TIMER indicator blinks ten times. This indicator illuminates when the TIMER mode is set to the "On" position after setting the clock and either the On timer or Off timer, with the remote control. Even if the power is turned off, this indicator stays lit. (Clock must be set before using this function.)

Remote Control Sensor

Aim the remote control towards this spot on the TV.

◊ VOLUME − , +

Press to increase or decrease the volume. Also used to select items on the on-screen menu.

CH ▼ and CH ▲

Press to change channels. Also press to highlight various items on the on-screen menu.

6 MENU


Press to see an on-screen menu of your TV's features.

6 TV/VIDEO

Press this button to display a menu of all the available signal sources. When the menu appears, use the CH buttons to highlight a particular source, and then press VOL+ to select it.

Front Panel Jacks

You can use the front panel jacks to connect an A/V component that is used only occasionally, such as a camcorder or video game. (For information on connecting equipment, see pages 2.1 - 2.7.)



- SUPER VIDEO IN jack Used to connect an S-Video signal from a camcorder or a video game.
- VIDEO IN jack Used to connect a video signal from a camcorder or a video game.
- AUDIO IN jacks


Used to connect the audio signals from a camcorder or video game.

Rear Panel Jacks

Use the rear panel jacks to connect an A/V component that will be connected continuously, such as a VCR or a laserdisc player.

Because there are two sets of input jacks, you can connect two different A/V components (i.e., a VCR and a laserdisc, 2 VCRs, etc.)

VHF/UHF

Connect to an antenna or to a cable TV system.

0 WIRELESS HEADPHONES

Connect a pair of wireless headphones here (optional)

3 SUPER VIDEO IN

S-Video signal from an S-VHS VCR or laserdisc player.

O VIDEO INPUTS

Video signals from VCRs, laserdisc players and similar devices (Two sets are available: Video1 and Video2).

6 AUDIO INPUTS

Audio signals from VCRs, laserdisc players and similar devices.

6 AUDIO-VIDEO MONITOR OUTPUTS

These audio-video signals are identical to A/V signals being displayed on the big screen. (Typically used as the input signals for a recording VCR.)

Note: The monitor out does not operate in DVD or DTV mode.

6 DVD INPUT

Connect video from a DVD player.

3 DVD & DTV AUDIO INPUT

Connect to the audio output jacks of a DVD player & SET-TOP BOX.

9 DTV INPUT

(For models PCJ532RF/PCJ534RF/ PCJ611RF/PCJ614RF/PCK5315R/PCK6115R) Connects video from a SET-TOP BOX.

10 SURROUND OUT

Connects to the (optional)
rear-surround amp: Surround Left,
Surround Right and Center.
Here are two ways to connect an audio amplifier:

2. TV - speaker(amp built-in).

Remote Control

You can use the remote control up to about 23 feet from the TV. When using the remote, always point it directly at the TV.

You can also use your remote control to operate your VCR and cable box. See page 4.1 for details.

• POWER

Turns the TV on and off.

ADD/ERASE

Press to add or erase channels in the TV's memory.

6 PIP

Activates picture in picture.

O DISPLAY

Press to display the current channel and the audio-video settings.

6 Number buttons

Press to select channels directly on the TV.

6 + 100

Press to select channels over 100. For example, to select channel 121, press "+100," then press "2" and "1."

7 P.MODE

Adjust the TV picture by selecting one of the preset factory settings (or select your personal, customized picture settings).


3 S.MODE

Adjust the TV sound by selecting one of the preset factory settings (or select your personal, customized sound settings).

9 MUTE

Press to temporarily cut off the sound.

Press CH▲ or CH▼ to change channels. (Also used to highlight selections on the on-screen menus.)

1 MODE

Selects a target device to be controlled by the Samsung remote control (i.e., TV, VCR, Cable box, or DVD).

@ 3D PHONIC

Selects one of the 3D Phonic modes (Drama, Action or Theater).

® CAPTION

Controls the caption decoder.

@ V.CHIP

Press to set up and activate the parental locks.

® PRE-CH

Tunes to the previous channel.

(6) SLEEP

Press to select a preset time interval for automatic shutoff.

MTS (Multichannel Television Stereo)

Press to choose stereo, mono or Separate Audio Program (SAP broadcast).

® TV/VIDEO

Press to display all of the available video sources (i.e., Antenna/cable, VCR, DVD, Video1~3 and S-Video 1~2).

MENU

Displays the main on-screen menu.

4 VOL -, VOL +

Press increase or decrease the volume. (Also used to make selections on the on-screen menus.)

Press to begin recording. (Note: A VCR must be connected.)

Press to pause the tape.



2 SET

PIP Controls

TV/VIDEO

Press to select one of the available signal sources for the PIP window.

ROTATE

Press to move the PIP window to any of the four corners of the TV screen.

P.SIZE

Press to make the PIP window larger or smaller.

SWAP

Exchanges the video signal that is currently displayed on the main screen with the signal in the PIP window.

PIP CH

Displays the available channels in sequence. (These buttons change channels in the PIP window only).

STILL

Press to stop the action during a particular scene. Press again to resume normal video.

CH.SCAN

Press to memorize (scan) the available channels.



O DTV

Press to activate a Digital TV Set-Top Box. (When the DTV mode is active, all channel selections must be made using a separate remote control that is supplied with the set-top box.)

When pressing the DTV button, the DTV mode is selected after approximately 5 seconds.

Connecting VHF and UHF Antennas

If your antenna has a set of leads that look like this, see "Antennas with 300-ohm Flat Twin Leads," below.



If your antenna has one lead that looks like this, see "Antennas with 75-ohm Round Leads," on page 2.2.




If you have two antennas, see "Separate VHF and UHF Antennas," on page 2.2.


Antennas with 300-ohm Flat Twin Leads

If you are using an off-air antenna (such as a roof antenna or "rabbit ears") that has 300-ohm twin flat leads, follow the directions below.

Place the wires from the twin leads under the screws on the 300-75 ohm adaptor (not supplied). Use a screwdriv-



Plug the adaptor into the VHF/UHF terminal on the bottom of the back panel.





Antennas with 75-ohm Round Leads



Separate VHF and UHF Antennas

If you have two separate antennas for your TV (one VHF and one UHF), you must combine the two antenna signals before connecting the antennas to the TV. This procedure requires a an optional combiner-adaptor (available at most electronics shops).






Connecting Cable TV


To connect to a cable TV system, follow the instructions below.

Connecting to a Cable Box that Descrambles All Channels




If your cable box descrambles only some channels (such as premium channels), follow the instructions below. You will need a two-way splitter, an RF (A/B) switch, and four lengths of coaxial cable. (These items are available at most electronics stores.)












After you've made this connection, set the A/B switch to the "A" position for normal viewing. Set the A/B switch to the "B" position to view scrambled channels. (When you set the A/B switch to "B," you will need to tune your TV to the cable box's output channel, which is usually channel 3 or 4.)


Connecting a VCR

These instructions assume that you have already connected your TV to an antenna or a cable TV system (according to the instructions on pages 2.1-2.3). Skip step 1 if you have not yet connected to an antenna or a cable system.






A coaxial cable is usually included with a VCR. (If not, check your local electronics store).




If you have a "mono" (non-stereo) VCR, use the Y-connector (supplied) to hook up to the left and right audio input jacks of the TV. If your VCR is stereo, you must connect two cables.




Follow the instructions in "Viewing a VCR or Camcorder Tape" to view your VCR tape.

Connecting an S-VHS VCR

Your Samsung TV can be connected to an S-Video signal from an S-VHS VCR. (This connection delivers a better picture as compared to a standard VHS VCR.)




Make sure the jacks you are using are underneath the number "2."




An S-video cable is usually included with an S-VHS VCR. (If not, check your local electronics store.)

Connecting a Second VCR to Record from the TV

Your TV can send out signals of its picture and sound to be recorded by a second VCR. To do this, connect your second VCR as follows:



(The VCR input jacks might be either on the front or on back of the VCR.)



Connecting a Digital TV Set-Top Box

(For models PCJ532RF/PCJ534RF/PCJ611RF/PCJ614RF/PCK5315R/PCK6115R)

Connect the Y, Pb, and Pr video outputs of the set-top box to their corresponding inputs on the TV. Next, connect the Left and Right audio from the set-top box to the corresponding L and R terminals on the TV. (The connections for a typical set-top box are shown below.)





When switching to the DTV mode, either 480p or 1080i format is automatically selected according to the input signal.


Note: Only 480p and 1080i formats are supported in their original formats.

Connecting a Camcorder

The front panel jacks on your TV make it easy to connect a camcorder to your TV. They allow you to view the camcorder tapes without using a VCR. (Also see "Viewing a VCR or Camcorder Tape" on page 3.14)








The audio-video cables shown here are usually included with a Camcorder. (If not, check your local electronics store.) If your camcorder is stereo, you need to connect a set of two cables.

Installing Batteries in the Remote Control





■ Make sure to match the "+" and "—" ends of the batteries with the diagram inside the compartment.



■ Remove the batteries and store them in a cool, dry place if you won't be using the remote control for a long time.

The remote control can be used up to about 23 feet from the TV.

(Assuming typical TV usage, the Batteries last for about one year.)






Adjusting Basic Convergence





Memorizing the Channels


Your TV can memorize and store all of the available channels for both "off-air" (antenna) and cable channels. After the available channels are memorized, use the CH ▲ and CH ▼ buttons to scan through the channels. This eliminates the need to change channels by entering the channel digits. There are three steps for memorizing channels: selecting a broadcast source, memorizing the channels (automatic) and adding and deleting channels (manual).








▼ The TV automatically cycles through all of the available channels and stores them in memory. This takes about one to two minutes. Press VOL+ at any time to interrupt the memorization process and return to the Setup menu.

Adding and Erasing Channels (Manual Method)

Customizing Your Remote Control

Your Samsung TV comes equipped with a "universal" remote control. In addition to controlling the TV, the universal remote can also operate a VCR, DVD and a cable box (even if your VCR and cable box are made by manufacturers other than Samsung).

Setting Up Your Remote Control to Operate Your VCR

Viewing Closed Captions


Your TV decodes and displays the closed captions that are broadcast with certain TV shows. These captions are usually subtitles for the hearing impaired or foreign-language translations. All VCRs record the closed caption signal from television programs, so home-recorded video tapes also provide closed captions. Most pre-recorded commercial video tapes provide closed captions as well. Check for the closed caption symbol in your television schedule and on the tape's packaging: **cc**.

Special Audio Options: **Dolby Surround, MTS, and Headphones**

Depending on the particular type of audio that is being broadcast, you can listen to any of three modes: Mono, Stereo and SAP (Secondary Audio Programming, which is typically a foreign-language translation).

The Dolby Surround options (3D-Phonic and Dolby Prologic) simulate the ambience of a stadium or a movie theater. The wireless headphone option is especially useful when simultaneously watching the main screen and the PIP window.

Press **CH** ▼ six times to highlight the "V-chip" menu.

Press VOL+ .

The "Enter pin" screen will appear. Enter your 4-digit PIN number.


The "V-chip mode" screen will appear. Press the CH ▼ button, and highlight the field for "TV Guidelines." (Note: When a particular field is highlighted, its color turns BLUE.)

Press VOL+. The "TV guidelines" screen will appear. Press the CH ▲, CH ▼ buttons to highlight one of the six age-based categories:

TV-Y	Young children
TV-Y7	Children 7 and over
TV-G	General audience
TV-PG	Parental guidance
TV-14	Viewers 14 and over
TV-MA	Mature audience



■ Note: These categories consist of two separate groups: TV-Y and TV-Y7 (young children through age 7), and TV-G through TV-MA (everybody else). The TV-Y and TV-Y7 categories are colored green.

The restrictions for these two groups work independently: If a household includes very young children as well as young adults, the TV guidelines must be set up separately for each age group. (See next step.)

At this point, one of the TV-Ratings is highlighted (blue color).

Press the **VOL+** button: Depending on your existing setup, a letter "U" or "B" will start blinking. (U= Unblocked, B= Blocked)

While the "U" or "B" is blinking, press the $\mathbf{CH} \triangle$ or $\mathbf{CH} \nabla$ button to block or unblock the category.

Press MENU once to save the TV guidelines. A TV-Rating will be highlighted (BLUE), and no letters will blink. To exit this screen, press MENU again. To select a different TV-Rating, press CH ▲ or CH ▼ and then repeat the process.

Note 1: The TV-Y7, TV-PG, TV-14 and TV-MA have additional options. See the next step to change any of the following sub-ratings:

FV: Fantasy violence

D: Dialog

i. i

S: Sexual situation

V: Violence

Note 2: The V-Chip will automatically block certain categories that are "more restrictive." For example, if you block "TV-Y" category, then TV-Y7 will automatically be blocked. Similarly, if you block the TV-G category, then all the categories in the "young adult" group will be blocked (TV-G, TV-PG, TV-14 and TV-MA). The sub-ratings (D, L, S, V) work together similarly. (See next section.)

How to set the FV, D, L, S and V sub-ratings.

First, highlight one of these TV-Ratings: TV-Y7, TV-PG, TV-14 or TV-MA (See Step 4, on previous page).

Next, while the TV-Rating is highlighted (BLUE), repeatedly press the VOL+ button. This will cycle through the available sub-ratings (FV.L. S. D or V).

A blinking letter ("U" or "B") will be displayed for each sub-rating. While the "U" or "B" is blinking, press CH ▲ or CH ▼ to change the sub-rating.

Press MENU once to save the TV guidelines. A TV-Rating will be highlighted (BLUE), and no letters will blink. To exit this screen, press MENU again. To select a different TV-Rating, press CH ▲ or CH ▼ and then repeat the process.

Note: The V-chip will automatically block certain categories that are "More restrictive". For example, if you block "L" sub-rating in TV-PG, then the "L" sub-ratings in TV-14 and TV-MA will automatically be blocked.

Press the MENU button three times to clear all the screens. (Or proceed to the next section, and set up additional restrictions based on the MPAA codes).


How to Set up Restrictions using the MPAA Ratings: G, PG, PG-13, R, NC-17, X

The MPAA rating system uses the Motion Picture Association of America (MPAA) system, and its main application is for movies. (Eventually, movie videocassettes will be encoded with MPAA ratings.) When the V-Chip lock is on, the TV will automatically block any programs that are coded with objectionable ratings (either MPAA or TV-Ratings).

Press MENU to display the menu.

Press CH ▼ two times to highlight the "SET UP" menu.

Press VOL + .



Press CH ▼ six times to highlight the "V-chip" menu.

Press VOL+.

The "Enter pin" screen will appear. Enter your 4-digit PIN number.


The "V-chip mode" screen will appear.

Press the CH ▼ button twice, and highlight "MPAA rating."





While "MPAA rating" is highlighted, press the **VOL** + button. The "MPAA rating" screen will appear.

Repeatedly press the CH ▼ button to highlight a particular MPAA category. (When a category is highlighted, its color changes to blue.) Pressing the CH ▼ button will cycle through the MPAA categories:



G	General audience (no restrictions).	
PG	Parental guidance suggested.	
PG-13	PG-13 (Parents strongly cautioned).	
R	R (Restricted. Children under 17 should be accompanied by an adult).	
NC-17	No children under age 17.	
Χ	X (Adults only).	
NR	Not rated.	

While a particular category is highlighted, press **VOL**+ to activate it.

A blinking letter ("U" or "B") will be displayed. Press **CH** ▲ or **CH** ▼ to select "U" or "B".

Press MENU three times to save the settings and to clear all screens.

Note: The V-Chip will automatically block any category that is "more restrictive." For example, if you block the "PG-13" category, then "R," "NC-17," and "X" will automatically be blocked also.

How to Reset the TV after the V-Chip Blocks a Channel ("Emergency Escape")

If the TV is tuned to a restricted channel, the V-Chip will block it. The screen will go blank and the following message will appear: "Excessive rating."

To resume normal viewing, tune to a different channel using the number buttons. Under certain conditions (depending on the rating of the local TV programs) the V-Chip might lock out all the channels. In this case, use the V-Chip button for an "emergency escape":

Press the V-chip button on the remote control. Enter your PIN number, and press **VOL+** to temporarily disable the V-Chip Lock.

Chapter Five

TROUBLESHOOTING

If the TV seems to have a problem, first try this list of possible problems and solutions. If none of these troubleshooting tips apply, then call your nearest service center.

Identifying Problems

Problem	Possible Solution
Poor picture	Try another channel. Adjust the antenna. Check all wire connections.
Poor sound quality.	Try another channel. Adjust the antenna.
No picture or sound.	Try another channel. Press the TV/VIDEO button. Make sure the TV is plugged in. Check the antenna connections.
No color, wrong colors or tints.	Make sure the program is broadcast in color. Adjust the picture settings.
Picture rolls vertically.	Adjust the antenna. Check all wire connections.
The TV operates eratically	Unplug the TV for 30 seconds, then try operating it again.
Your remote control does not operate your TV.	Press the "MODE" button to put your remote control in the "TV" mode.
The TV won't turn on.	Make sure the wall outlet is working.

Note: If you watch a still image or the screen in the 16:9 aspect ratio format for a long time, some burning images may be seen on the screen.

Cleaning and Maintaining Your TV

With proper care, your TV unit will give you many years of service. Please follow these guidelines to get the maximum performance from your TV.

Placement

- Do not place the TV near extremely hot, cold, humid or dusty places.
- Do not place the TV near appliances with electric motors that create magnetic fields, such as vacuum cleaners.
- Keep the ventilation openings clear; do not place the TV on a soft surface, such as cloth or paper.
- Place the TV in a vertical position only.

Liquids

• Do not handle liquids near or on the TV. Liquids that spill into it can cause serious damage.

Cabinet

- Never open the cabinet or touch the parts inside.
- Wipe your TV with a clean, dry cloth. Never use water, cleaning fluids, wax, or chemicals.
- Do not put heavy objects on top of the cabinet.

Temperature

• If your TV is suddenly moved from a cold to a warm place, unplug the power cord, and allow at least two hours for moisture that may have formed inside the unit to dry completely.

Using Your TV in Another Country

If you plan to take your TV with you to a foreign country, please be aware of the different television systems that are in use around the world. A TV designed for one system may not work properly with another system due to differences in the TV channel frequencies
