Before operating the unit, please read this manual thoroughly, and retain it for future reference.



#### **Safety Instructions**

- Do not install the television in a confined space such as a book case or similar unit. Place on a stable stand or table.
- Do not expose the television to extreme temperature conditions or to extreme humidity conditions.
- Adequate ventilation is essential to prevent failure of electrical components.
- Do not expose the television to direct sunlight and other sources of heat.
- Do not expose the television to any liquids.
- During a storm conditions (especially when there is lightning) unplug the television from the mains socket and aerial.
- Do not step on or twist the power cord.
- Do not overload wall outlets or extension cords as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.
- Never put objects of any kind into the television, and do not place a water-containing vessel on the television.
- To prevent damage which may result in fire or shock hazard, do not expose the television to rain or excessive moisture.
- Please use a soft and dry cloth (not containing volatile matter) when you clean the TV.
- If the television is broken, do not try to repair it yourself. Contact qualified service personnel.
- If the remote control is not used for a long period of time, remove the batteries and store it in a cool, dry place.
- Do not drop the remote control.







### **Connecting the Aerial or Cable Television Network**






To view television channels correctly, a signal must be received by the set from one of the following sources:

- An outdoor aerial
- A cable television network

Connect the aerial or network input cable to the  $75\Omega$  coaxial socket on the rear of the television.

### **Connecting a Decoder**



In order to descramble a coded transmission signal, you must connect a decoder to the TV set.

- If you wish to connect both a decoder and a VCR, you should connect the:
  - Decoder to the VCR
  - VCR to the television

Otherwise, connect the decoder directly to the television.

#### Using a coaxial cable

Connect a coaxial cable to the:


- Receiver output socket.
- Television aerial input socket.

### **Connecting to the Audio/Video Input/Outputs**



The RCA connectors are used for equipment, such as VCRs, camcorders, video disc players, and video game devices.

### **Connecting Headphones**




You can connect a set of headphones to your television if you wish to watch a television programme without disturbing the other people in the room.

- 1 Plug a set of headphones into the 3.5 mm mini-jack socket on the television panel.
  - Result: The sound is heard through the headphones.
- **2** When you wish to hear the sound through the speakers again, simply disconnect the headphones.
  - Prolonged use of headphones at a high volume may damage your hearing.

### Inserting the Batteries in the Remote Control

 $\sum$ 





You must insert or replace the batteries in the remote control when you:

- Purchase the television
- Find that the remote control is no longer operating correctly
- 1 Remove the cover on the rear of the remote control by pressing the symbol downwards and then pulling firmly to remove it.
- Insert batteries taking care to respect the polarities:
   + on the battery against + on the remote control
   on the battery against on the remote control
- **3** Replace the cover by aligning it with the base of the remote control and pressing it back into place.

> Do not mix battery types, i.e. alkaline and monganese.

### Switching Your Television On and Off

#### The mains lead is attached to the rear of your television.

- Plug the mains lead into an appropriate socket.
   Press the ON/OFF button (①) on the front of the television. <u>Result</u>: The Standby indicator lights up on the front panel.
- **3** Press the **POWER** button (()) on the remote control to switch the television on.
  - <u>Result</u>: The programme that you were watching last is reselected automatically.
- 4 To switch your television off, press the ON/OFF button (()) again.





### **Placing Your Television in Standby Mode**

Your television can be placed in Standby mode, in order to reduce:

- Power consumption
- Wear of the cathode ray tube

The Standby mode can be useful when you wish to interrupt viewing temporarily (during a meal, for example).

**1** Press the **POWER** button  $(\bigcirc)$  on the remote control.


<u>Result</u>: The screen is turned off and a red Standby indicator appears on the front of the television.

2 To switch the television back on, simply press the **POWER** button  $(\bigcirc)$  again or a number button.

Do not leave your television in Standby mode for long periods of time (when you are away on holiday, for example). Turn your television off by pressing the ON/OFF button (①) on the front of the television. It is best to unplug the set from the mains and aerial.

The remote control is used mainly to:

- Change channels and adjust the volume
- Set up the television using the on-screen menu system

The following table presents the most frequently used buttons and their functions.



### **Displaying Information on the Screen**

You can display various types of information on the screen to help you use your television.

Press the **DISPLAY**  $\$  button to display the information. To remove the information from the screen, press the **DISPLAY**  $\$  button again.




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### **Choosing Your Language**

When you start using your television for the first time, you must select the language which will be used for displaying menus and indications.

You can scan for the frequency ranges available to you, (availability depends on your country). Automatically allocated programme numbers may not correspond to actual or desired programme numbers. However you can sort numbers manually and clear any channels you do not wish to watch.

### Storing the Channels Manually (depending on the model)

You can store up to 100 television channels, including those received via cable networks.

When storing channels manually, you can choose:

- Whether or not to store each of the channels found
- The programme number by which you wish to identify each stored channel
- To entry the frequency of the channel to be stored directly, if you know it

#### Playback





When playing CD-R MP3 discs, please follow the recommendations below:

- Your MP3 files should be ISO 9660 or JOLIET format.
   ISO 9660 format and Joliet MP3 files are compatible with Microsoft's DOS and Windows, and with Apple's Mac. These two formats are the most widely used.
- When naming your MP3 files do not exceed 8 characters, and place ".mp3" as the file extension. General name format of: Title.mp3. When composing your title, make sure that you use 8 characters or less, have no spaces in the name, and avoid the use of special characters including: (.,/,\,=,+).
- Use a decompression transfer rate of at least 128 Kbps when recording MP3 files. Sound quality with MP3 files basically depends on the rate of compression/decompression you choose. Getting audio CD quality sound requires an analog/digital sampling rate (conversion to MP3 format) of at least 128 Kbps and up to 160 Kbps. However, choosing higher rates, like 192 Kbps or more, only rarely give better sound quality. Conversely, files with sampling rates below 128 Kbps will not be played properly.
- ◆ Do not try recording copyright protected MP3 files. Certain "securized" files are encrypted and code protected to prevent illegal copying. These files are of the following types: Windows Media<sup>™</sup> (registered trade mark of Microsoft Inc) and SDMI<sup>™</sup> (registered trademark of The SDMI Foundation). You cannot copy such files.
- Your DVD player only accepts one level of file directory. Consequently you must choose:
   either to save all your MP3 recording files at the root of the disc:
  - and/or create folders in the directory for each artist or music type (e.g.classical, rock, jazz, etc)
- Important: The above recommendations cannot be taken as a guarantee that the DVD player will play MP3 recordings, or as an assurance of sound quality. You should note that certain technologies and methods for MP3 file recording on CD-Rs prevent optimal playback of these files on your DVD player (degraded sound quality and in some cases, inability of the player to read the files).

### **Teletext Feature**

Most television channels provide a written information service via Teletext. They provide such information as:

- Television programme times
- News bulletins
- Weather forecasts
- Sports results
- Travel information

This information, which you cannot modify, is divided into numbered pages laid out as follows:





### **Displaying the Teletext Screen**




You can display Teletext information at any time on your television screen.

- For Teletext information to be displayed correctly, channel reception must be good; otherwise:
  - Information may be missing
  - Some pages may not be displayed

# To activate the Teletext mode and display the contents page, follow the instructions below.

- 1 Select the channel providing the Teletext service, using the  $P \land$  ( $\boxdot$ ) or  $P \checkmark (\boxdot)$  button.
- **3** When you have finished, press the **TV/TEXT** (**(**) button to return to normal viewing.

### **Selecting a Teletext Page**

### You can enter the page number directly by pressing the numeric buttons on the remote control.

- 1 Enter the three-digit page number given in the contents, by pressing the corresponding numeric buttons.
  - The current page number is incremented until the Result: requested page is reached. That page is then displayed.
- 2 If the selected page is linked with several secondary pages, the secondary pages are displayed in turn. To freeze the display on a given page, press the 🗉 button. Press the 🖃 button again to continue the display.
- 3 If the FASTEXT system is used by the broadcasting company, the different topics covered on a Teletext page are colour-coded and can be selected by pressing the coloured buttons on the remote control. Press the coloured button corresponding to the topic that you wish to select; the available topics are given on the status line.
  - Result: The page is displayed with other coloured information that can be selected in the same way.
- 4 When you have finished, press the TV/TEXT (
  ) button to return to your normal broadcast.


