Please read this manual before operating your device and keep it for future reference.



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Section 1: Getting Started

This section helps you to quickly start using your device.

Understanding This User Manual

The instructions in this manual are based on default settings, and may vary from your device depending on the software version on your device and any changes to the device's settings.

Unless otherwise specified, all instructions in this manual assume that you are starting from a Home screen. To get to a Home screen, you may need to unlock the device. For more information, refer to "Securing Your Device" on page 9.

Note: Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this user manual start with the device unlocked, at the Home screen.

All screen images in this manual are simulated. Actual displays may vary depending on the software version of your device and any changes to the device's settings.

Special Text

In this manual, some text is set apart from the rest. This special text is intended to point out important information, share quick methods for activating features, define terms, and more. The definitions for these methods are as follows:

- Note: Presents alternative options for the current feature, menu, or sub-menu.
- Tips: Provides quick or innovative methods or useful shortcuts.
- Important! Points out important information about the current feature that could affect performance.
- Warning! Brings important information to your attention that can help to prevent loss of data or functionality or damage to your device.

Text Conventions

This manual provides condensed information about how to use your device. To make this possible, the following text conventions are used to represent often-used steps:

Arrows are used to represent the sequence of selecting successive options in longer, or repetitive, procedures.

For example:

From a Home screen, touch Apps →

Settings → Wi-Fi.

ON/OFF This button disables or enables a feature, or turns a setting off or on.

- Indicates that the feature is OFF.
- Indicates that the feature is **ON**.

For example:

Touch the **OFF/ON** button to turn Bluetooth ON or OFF off.

SIM Card

Your device uses a 4G LTE SIM (Subscriber Identity Module). The 4G LTE SIM is a small, rectangular plastic card that stores your device number, information about your wireless service, and may contain other information.


If you purchased your device at a Verizon Wireless store, the SIM card is activated and ready to use. If you ordered a new device, the card may need to be activated before you can use it. For more information about activating the SIM card, visit: verizonwireless.com/4GSIM.

Caution! Do not bend or scratch the SIM card. Take care when handling, installing, or removing the SIM card, and avoid exposing the SIM card to static electricity, water, or dirt. Keep the SIM card out of reach of small children.

Important! Turn the device off before installing or removing the SIM card. To turn the device off, press and hold the Power/Lock Key.

Installing the 4G LTE SIM Card

- 1. Locate the SIM card slot on the right side of the tablet.
- Make sure the gold contacts of the SIM card face downward and that the notched corner of the card faces inward toward the left (as shown).
- **3.** Carefully slide the SIM card into the SIM card socket (as shown) until the card locks into place.



Battery

Your device is powered by a rechargeable, standard Li-lon battery. A Wall/USB Charger (Charging Head and USB cable) are included with the device for charging the battery.

Warning! Use only approved charging devices. Approved accessories are designed to maximize battery life. Using other accessories may invalidate your warranty and may cause damage.

Battery Indicator

The Battery icon in the Status Bar shows the battery power level. When battery power is low, your device prompts you to charge the battery. If you continue to operate the device without charging, the device powers off. For battery use information, see "Security" on page 99.

Charging the Battery

Your device comes with a Charging Head and USB cable to charge your device from any standard power outlet.

Please note that:

- The battery comes partially charged. You must fully charge the battery before using your device for the first time. After the first charge, you can use the device while charging.
- You cannot charge the battery using the USB cable and your PC.
- If the battery is completely discharged, you cannot turn on the device, even with the USB power adapter connected.
 Allow a depleted battery to charge for a few minutes before you try to turn on the device.

1. Insert the USB cable into the Charger/Accessory Port.



Insert the USB cable into the Charging Head, and then plug the Charging Head into a standard AC power outlet.



When charging is complete, unplug the Charging Head from the power outlet and remove the USB cable from the device.

Turning Your Device On and Off

Turning Your Device On

Press and hold the Power/Lock Key.

Turning Your Device Off

- Press and hold the Power/Lock Key.
- On the options menu, touch Power off → 0K.



Setup Wizard

The first time you turn your tablet on, Setup Wizard will guide you through the basics of setting up your tablet.

Follow the prompts to choose a default language, set up accounts, choose location services, and learn more about your tablet.


You can also run the Setup Wizard later. From a Home

Memory Card

Your device supports removable microSD or microSDHC memory cards (not included) with maximum capacities of 64 GB. Memory cards used to store music, photos, videos, and other files

Installing a Memory Card

- Open the memory card slot cover and turn to expose the slot.
- With the gold contacts facing down, carefully slide the memory card into the slot, pushing gently until it clicks into place.



3. Close the memory card slot cover.

Securing Your Device

By default, the device locks automatically when the screen times out or you can lock it manually.

Unlock the tablet by swiping your finger across the screen. This is the default Screen lock (Swipe), and offers no security.

Prevent others from using or accessing personal data and information stored in the device by using a secure Screen Lock.

Locking the Device Manually

Press the Power/Lock Key.

Unlocking the Device

- 1. Press the Power/Lock Key. The Lock screen displays.
- Swipe across the screen as shown. This is the default Swipe screen lock and offers no security.



Section 2: Understanding Your Device

This section outlines key features of your device and describes the screen and the icons that appear when the device is in use. It also shows how to navigate through the device.

Features

Front View

The following items can be found on the front and sides of your device.



- Front-Facing Camera Lens: Used when taking photos or recording videos.
- Power/Lock Key: Press and hold to turn the device on or off. Press to lock the device or to wake the screen for unlocking.
- Volume Key: From Home, press to adjust Master Volume. During music playback, press to adjust volume.
- 4. Back Key: Return to the previous screen, step, or option.
- **5. Home Key**: Display the Home screen. Touch and hold to launch Google Now.
- Recent Apps Key: Touch to display Recent apps, where you can switch to an app, close apps, or access the Task manager.

Back View

The following items can be found on the back, top, and side of your device.



- 3.5mm Headset Jack: Attach optional headphones (not included) or other accessories.
- Camera Lens: Used when taking photos or recording videos.
- External Speaker: Used in music or video playback, notification tones, and for other sounds.
- Charger/Accessory Port: Connect a USB cable when charging or to sync music and files.
- microSD Card Slot: Holds a memory card (not included).
- 6. SIM Card Slot: Holds the SIM card.
- Infrared Blaster: Emits infrared signals used for controlling external devices.
- 8. Microphone: Used for video chat and recording.

Using the Touch Screen

Finger Gestures

Touching

To open an application, to select a menu item, to press an onscreen button, or to enter a character using the onscreen keyboard, touch it with a finger.

Touching and Holding

Touch and hold an item for more than 2 seconds to access available options.

Dragging

To move an icon, thumbnail, or preview to a new location, touch and hold it and drag it to the target position.

Double-Tapping

Double-tap on a web page, map, or image to zoom in a part. Double-tap again to zoom out again.

Swipe

Swipe left or right on the Home screen or the Applications screen to see another panel. Swipe up or down to scroll through a web page or a list, such as contacts.

Pinching and Spreading

Spread two fingers apart on a web page, map, or image to zoom in. Pinch to zoom out.

Important! To avoid damaging the touch screen, do not touch it with anything sharp or apply excessive pressure to it with your fingertips.

Motions

Simple motions allow easy control of the device.

Rotating the Screen

Many applications allow display in either portrait or landscape orientation. Rotating the device causes the display to automatically adjust to fit the new screen orientation.

To prevent the display from rotating automatically, open the Notification panel and deselect **Screen rotation**.

Note: Some applications do not allow screen rotation, or display a different screen depending on the orientation. For example, the calculator turns into a scientific calculator when rotated to landscape.

Screen Capture

Touch and hold the Power/Lock Key and Home to capture and save an image of the current screen.

Note: A copy of the screenshot is automatically saved to the clipboard.

To view the screen shots:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch Apps → Gallery.
- Touch to open the Screenshots album.
- 3. Touch a screen capture to view it.

Home Screen

The Home screen is the starting point for using your device. It consists of:

- Notifications: Notification icons appear on the Status Bar at the top of the screen to report calendar events, device status, and more. Drag down from the Status Bar to open the Notification panel.
- **2. Status Indicators**: Display your current network status, signal strength, battery charge, and time.
- Status Bar: The Status Bar displays notifications on the left side and status indicators on the right side.
- Widgets: Applications that run on the Home screen.
 Some widgets are found on the Home screen by default.
- **5. App Shortcuts**: Touch to launch your favorite apps.
- Apps: Access to all your apps and widgets.
- Current Screen: Shows which Home screen is presently displayed.




Extended Home Screen

The Home screen consists of the main Home panel, plus panels that extend beyond the display width to provide more space for adding shortcuts, widgets and folders.

Slide your finger horizontally across the screen to scroll to the left or right side panels. As you scroll, the indicator at the bottom of the display shows your current position.

Adding and Removing Home Screen Panels

Pinch the Home screen to display Edit page options. See "Pinching and Spreading" on page 13.

Shortcuts and Widgets

You can add, reposition, or remove shortcuts and widgets from the Home screen.

Adding a Shortcut or Widget

You can customize the Home screen by adding shortcuts and widgets.

- Touch and hold an empty area of the Home screen.
 On the popup menu, touch Apps and widgets.
 - or -Tap Apps to display the Apps screen.
- For shortcuts, touch the Apps tab. For widgets, touch the Widgets tab.
- Touch and hold the shortcut or widget, and then drag it to a position on the Home screen and release.

Removing a Shortcut or Widget

Shortcuts and widgets can be removed from the Home screen.

Touch and hold the shortcut or widget until it detaches, and then drag it to Remove and release.

Note: Removing a shortcut does not delete the application; it simply removes the shortcut from the Home screen.

Folders

Place folders on the Home screen to organize items.

Adding Folders

- From a Home screen, touch and hold on an empty area of the screen until the Home screen popup appears.
- 2. Touch Folder.
- 3. Enter a name for the folder and touch **OK**.

Using Folders

- Touch the folder to open it and access the shortcuts inside.
- To add shortcuts to the folder, touch and hold the shortcut, and then drag it to the folder and release.

Delete a Folder

 Touch and hold the folder until it detaches, and then drag it to mRemove and release.

Wallpapers

You can choose a picture to display on the Home Screen, Lock screen, or on both the Home and Lock screens. Choose from preloaded wallpapers, or select a photo you have downloaded or taken with the Camera.

- From a Home screen, touch and hold on an empty area of the screen until the Home screen popup displays.
- 2. Touch Set wallpaper.
- 3. Touch Home Screen, Lock screen, or Home and lock screens for options:
 - Gallery: Access the Gallery to select a photo.
 - **Live wallpapers**: Choose from pre-loaded interactive animated wallpapers (Home screen only).
 - Photos: Access Google Photos to select a photo (Home screen only).
 - Travel wallpaper: View recommended travel destinations (Lock screen only).
 - Wallpapers: Choose from pre-loaded wallpaper images.

Multi Window

Multi task by using up to two applications at the same time.

Note: Only applications displayed on the Multi window panel can be used with the Multi window feature.

Activate Multi Window

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings
 → Display.
- Touch the ON/OFF switch next to Multi window to turn Multi window ON.

Note: You can also activate Multi window from the Notification panel. For more information, refer to "Notification Panel" on page 21.



Multi Window Tray

Multi window apps are displayed on the Multi window tray.

Display the Multi window tray:

- Activate Multi window (see "Activate Multi Window" on page 19).
- Swipe the right edge of the screen toward the center to display the Multi window tray. After a few seconds, the tray will be hidden again.

Using Multi Window Applications

You can use Multi window to run multiple applications at the same time.

- With Multi window activated, swipe the right edge of the screen toward the center to display the Multi window tray.
- Drag an app off the tray and release. Drag another app off of the panel and release it into one of the highlighted windows.

Window Controls

Select an application window and touch in the middle of the windows. Window controls appear:



Switch locations between Multi Window applications.



Share items between the application windows. Drag an item to share from one window to another. Some applications may not support this feature.



Maximize the application.



Close the application.

Tray Configuration

You can rearrange the apps on the Multi window tray, add new apps, or remove apps.

On the Multi window tray:

- Touch = to access the tray controls.
- 2. Touch Fdit:
 - To remove an app from the tray, touch and drag it off of the tray and place it in the storage area.
 - To add an app to the tray, touch and drag it from the storage area to the tray.
 - To relocate an app, touch and drag it to a new location.
 - To save your changes, touch **Done**.
- 3. Touch ? Help for additional information.

Notification Panel

Notification icons appear on the Status Bar at the top of the screen to report new calendar events, device status, and more. For details about these notifications, open the Notification panel.

 Swipe your finger down from the top of the screen to display the Notification panel.

- 2. Scroll down the list to see additional notification details.
- 3. Touch an item to open it.
- To clear a single notification, drag the notification left or right. Touch X to clear all notifications.
- To close the Notification panel, swipe upward from the bottom of the screen or touch Back.

Additional Panel Functions

In addition to notifications, the Notification panel also provides quick and ready access to settings. These can be quickly activated or deactivated by toggling them on or off. You can choose the functions that display.

- Swipe your finger down from the top of the screen to display the Notification panel.
 - To go to Settings, touch **Settings**. For more information, refer to "Settings" on page 80.
 - Touch to display additional functions. Touch to display only your primary functions.

- To set the display brightness, touch the Brightness slider and drag it to set the display brightness.
- To adjust the system volume, touch the ☐ Sound slider and drag it to set the Notification sound level or touch ♣ to set the level for Notifications, Media, and System sounds. For more information, refer to "Sound" on page 86.

Notification panel Options

- Swipe your finger down from the top of the screen to display the Notification panel.
 - Touch to display additional options.
 - Touch and locate the Notification panel area at the bottom of the Notification panel screen.
 - Touch and hold a desired function, such as Airplane mode, and then drag it to the top two rows.
 - Touch Brightness and volume to add these controls to the Notification panel.

- Touch the ON/OFF switch to show Recommended apps on the Notification panel after certain actions, such as connecting earphones. Touch Recommended apps for options:
 - Earphones: Touch to select which apps to display on the Notification panel when you insert earphones.
 - Docking: Touch to select which apps to display on the Notification panel when you dock your tablet.

Status Bar

The Status Bar at the top of the home screen provides device information (such as network status, signal strength, battery charge, and time) on the right side and notification alerts on the left


To display the Status Bar:

 From a Home screen, swipe downward from the top of the screen. The Status Bar will appear. It will disappear after a few seconds.

Status Bar Icons

Entering Text

Use the Samsung keyboard or the voice input feature to enter text.

Note: Text entry is not supported in some languages. To enter text, you must change the input language to one of the supported languages.

Entering Uppercase

Touch ${}_{\widehat{\Omega}}$ before entering a character. For all caps, touch it twice.

Changing the Keyboard Type

Touch and hold Options, and then touch to change the keyboard type. Options are: Normal, Floating, and Split.


Changing Language Keyboards

You can add additional input languages to the keyboard. Slide the space key left or right to change language keyboards.

Touch and hold ⊕ Options, and then touch
 ★ Settings → Select input languages.

Handwriting

Touch and hold $\bullet \circ$ **Options** $\rightarrow T_{\sim}$ **Handwriting**, and then write a word with a finger. As you write, suggestions are offered in the word options area in case the correct letters were not recognized. Select a suggested word.



Use handwriting gestures to perform actions, such as editing or deleting characters and inserting spaces. To view the gesture guides, touch and hold $\[\]$ Options, and then touch $\[\]$ Settings \rightarrow Help \rightarrow Keyboard \rightarrow Use handwriting gestures.

Entering Text By Voice

Touch $\underline{\bullet}^{\circ\circ}$ to activate the voice input feature, and then speak into the microphone. The device displays what you speak.

If the device does not recognize your words, touch the underlined text and select an alternative word or phrase from the drop-down list.

To change the language or add languages for voice recognition, touch the current language.

Entering Text Using Swype

Swype is a new way to enter text on touch screens. Instead of touching each key individually, use your finger to trace over the letters of a word. For each word, place your finger on the first letter and glide to the subsequent letters, lifting on the last letter.

Swype Help

While entering text, you can get information about Swype.

 Touch and hold Swype to access Settings, for the How to Swype tutorial.

Configuring Swype

Configure Swype options in the Language and input settings.

- While entering text, touch and hold Swype.
- For more information about Swype settings, see "Swype" on page 104.

Using the Numeric Keyboard

Switch to a Numeric Keyboard, to quickly enter numbers and mathematical operators.

■ Touch 123 +!= .

Entering Symbols and Numbers

Using the Swype Keyboard:

- Touch and hold on a key to enter the character at the top of the key.
- Touch and hold on a key until a menu of all characters available on that key appears, then touch a character to enter it.
- Touch 123 to switch to Symbol mode, then touch a key.

Editing Keyboard

The Editing Keyboard provides a quick way to move the cursor and highlight text. If the application in which you are working supports editing, you can cut, copy or paste highlighted text.

■ Swype from Swype to 123 +1=.

Using Swype Voice Input

Enter text by speaking. Swype recognizes your speech and enters text for you.

■ Touch **Voice Input**. At the prompt, speak the text you want to enter.

Copying and Pasting

Touch and hold over text, drag or to select more or less text, and then touch **Copy** to copy or **Cut** to cut. The selected text is copied to the clipboard.

To paste it into a text entry field, touch and hold at the point where it should be inserted, and then touch **Paste**.

Section 3: Accounts and Contacts

This section explains how to manage accounts and contacts.

Accounts

Your device can synchronize with a variety of accounts. With synchronization, information on your device is updated with any information that changes in your accounts.

Setting Up Accounts

Set up and manage your synchronized accounts with the **Accounts** setting.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings → Accounts → Add account.
- 2. Touch the account type.
- Follow the prompts to enter your account credentials to complete the set up process.

Your tablet communicates with the appropriate account servers to set up your account. When complete, your account displays in the **Accounts** area of the Settings screen.

Your Google Account

When you set up your Google account on your device, Google applications will always be in sync between your tablet and computer.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings
 Accounts → Add account → Google.
- Follow the prompts to sign into your existing account or create a new account.

Your Samsung Account

Create a Samsung Account for access to Samsung apps and services, such as Samsung Link, and much more.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings
 Accounts → Add account → Samsung account.
- Follow the prompts to sign into your existing account or create a new account.

Contacts

Store contact information for your friends, family, and colleagues to quickly access information or to send a message.

To access Contacts:

■ From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.

Add a Contact

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts
 → Create.
- To choose where the contact is stored, touch Device or an account.

- or -

Touch **Add new account** to add a different account. For more information, refer to "Setting Up Accounts" on page 28.

- Touch each field to enter information. Touch to add another entry, or to remove an entry. Touch to choose a label.
 - Picture: Touch the picture icon to assign a picture to the new contact.
 - Name: Enter the name. Touch
 to display additional name fields.
 - Phone: Enter a phone number.
 - Email: Enter an email address.
 - **Groups**: Assign the contact to a group.
 - Add another field: Add additional fields for the contact.
- 4. Touch Save.

Note: Your personal Contact entry is always listed at the top of the Contacts list under ME. Touch **Set up profile** to add your contact information.

Updating Contacts

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- Touch a contact in the Contacts list to view its information.
- 3. Touch Fedit.
- 4. Touch any field to update.

Deleting Contacts

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- 2. Touch a contact in the Contacts list to display it.
- 3. Touch Touch Delete.

Contacts Display Options

There are various ways to display your contacts.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch **Apps** →
 - Contacts.
- 2. Touch the **Groups** tab, **Favorites** tab, or **Contacts** tab to view contacts in various ways:
 - Groups: Display contacts sorted into groups—such as Not assigned, Co-workers, Family, Friends, etc. The number of contacts in each group is displayed next to the group name. Touch a group name to show only contacts in that group. For more information, refer to "Create a New Group" on page 32.
 - Favorites: Show only your favorite (or starred), contacts. For more information, refer to "Favorites" on page 34.
 - Contacts: Show all your contacts. Touch the Search field and enter a keyword to list contacts that contain that keyword.
 - While viewing Groups, Favorites, or Contacts, touch
 Menu for options.
 - While viewing the Contacts tab, touch ☐ Menu → Settings for Contact settings.

Linked Contacts

Your device can synchronize with multiple accounts, including Google, Corporate Exchange, and other service providers. When you synchronize contacts from these accounts with your device, you may have multiple contacts for the same person.

Linking, or joining, imported contact records allows you to see all of a contact's numbers and addresses together in a single contact entry. Linking also helps you keep your contacts updated, because any changes in the respective accounts are automatically updated the next time you synchronize with that account.

Linking Contacts

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- 2. Touch a contact in the Contacts list to display it.
- Touch Menu → Link contact.
- Touch the contact you want to link. The linked contact's information is displayed with the original contact's information.

Separating Contacts

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- 2. Touch a contact in the Contacts list to display it.
- Touch to separate a linked contact.

Sharing Contact Information

You can send a contact's information using Bluetooth to other Bluetooth devices, or in an Email or Gmail as an attachment.

Note: Not all Bluetooth devices accept contacts and not all devices support transfers of multiple contacts. Check the target device's documentation.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- 2. Touch Menu → Share namecard via.
- Touch Selected contact to share only the displayed contact, or touch Multiple contacts.
- 4. Touch a sending method, such as Bluetooth or email.
- Follow the prompts to send the contact information.

Groups

Assign contacts to Groups to make searching for contacts faster or to quickly send messages to group members.

Create a New Group

Create a new group when you add or edit a contact.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts
 → Groups tab.
- 2. Touch Teate.
- 3. Touch the **Group name** field and enter a name.
- Touch Add member, touch individual contacts or touch Select all, and then touch Done to add the selected contacts to the group.
- 5. Touch Save.

Tip: Contacts can belong to more than one group. While editing a contact, touch the **Groups** field to add additional groups.

Adding Group Members

To add a contact to a group, just edit a contact's Group field. For more information, refer to "Updating Contacts" on page 30.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts
 Groups tab.
- 2. Touch the group to which you want to add members.
- 3. Touch + Add member. The contacts list displays.
- Touch Select all or the name of each contact to add.
- 5. Touch **Done** to add the contacts to the group.

Removing Group Members

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts
 → Groups tab.
- Touch the group from which you want to remove members.
- 3. Touch Menu → Remove member.
- Touch Select all or the name of each contact to remove.
- 5. Touch **Done** to remove the contacts.

Renaming a Group

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts
 → Groups tab.
- 2. Touch the group you want to rename.
- 3. Touch \blacksquare Menu \rightarrow Edit group.
- 4. Touch the **Group name** field and enter a new name.
- 5. Touch Save.

Deleting Groups

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts
 → Groups tab → Menu → Delete groups.
- **2.** Touch individual groups or touch **Select all**, then touch **Done**.
- Touch Group only to delete only the group or Group and group members to delete both the group and the group's members.

Favorites

Mark contact records with a \bigstar gold star to identify them as favorites.

Mark a Contact as a Favorite

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- 2. Touch a contact in the Contacts list to display it.
- 3. Touch the \bigstar Star so that it turns gold \bigstar .

Tip: You do not have to edit the contact to mark it as a favorite.

View Favorites

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- Touch the Favorites tab. Only your starred contacts are displayed.

- or -

Touch the **Groups** tab, then touch **Starred in Android** to list only your starred contacts that are being saved to your Google Account.

Remove Favorites

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts
 Favorites tab.
- 2. Touch Menu → Remove from Favorites.
- Touch individual contacts or touch Select all, then touch Done to remove.

Note: To remove a from your favorites list, touch the **to** Star next to the contact's name so that it is no longer gold ...

Section 4: Connections

Your device includes features to connect to the Internet and to other devices.

Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi is a wireless networking technology that provides access to local area networks. Use your device's Wi-Fi feature to:

- Access the internet for browsing or to send and receive email.
- Access your corporate network.
- Use hotspots provided by hotels or airports while traveling.

Wi-Fi communication requires access to an existing Wireless Access Point (WAP). WAPs can be Open (unsecured, as with most hotspots) or Secured (requiring you to provide login credentials).

Turn Wi-Fi On or Off

Turn your device's Wi-Fi feature on or off. When you turn Wi-Fi on, your device automatically searches for available, in-range WAPs (Wireless Access Points).

When Wi-Fi is on, 🛜 displays in the Status Bar.

From the Notification panel

- From any screen, touch the top of the screen and swipe downward. The Notification panel displays.
- 2. Touch Wi-Fi to turn it ON (green) or OFF (grey).

From Settings

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Wireless and Networks, touch Wi-Fi.
- 2. Touch ON/OFF to turn Wi-Fi on or off.

Scan and Connect to a Wi-Fi Network

When you turn on Wi-Fi, your device searches for and displays available Wi-Fi connections.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Wireless and Networks, touch Wi-Fi.
- Touch ON/OFF to turn Wi-Fi on. Your device begins scanning for available Wireless Access Points, or you can tap Scan to start searching.
- When the scan is complete, touch a Wi-Fi network to connect. If the Wi-Fi network is open (unsecured), your device automatically connects. If the Wi-Fi network is secured, enter the password at the prompt to connect.

Tip: You can have your device automatically notify you of available networks. See "Wi-Fi notifications" under "Wi-Fi Settings" on page 37.

Add a Wi-Fi Network Manually

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Wireless and Networks, touch Wi-Fi.
- Touch ON/OFF to Wi-Fi on.
- 3. Touch Add Wi-Fi network and enter the following:
 - **Network SSID**: Enter the name of the Wi-Fi Wireless Access Point (WAP).
 - Security: Select the type of security used by the WAP.

Note: Depending on the security protocol used by the WAP, additional network information may be required, such as a password.

- Password: If the WAP is secured, enter the password or hex key.
- 4. Touch Connect.

Wi-Fi Settings

Set up and manage wireless access points.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Wireless and Networks, touch Wi-Fi.
- 2. Touch ON/OFF to turn Wi-Fi on.
- 3. Touch Menu for options:
 - Advanced.
 - Wi-Fi notifications: Receive a notification when new Wireless Access Points (WAPs) are available.
 - Sort by: Sort Wi-Fi networks by alphabet or signal strength.
 - Keep Wi-Fi on during sleep: Specify when to disconnect from Wi-Fi
 - Always allow scanning: Allow Google location service and other apps to scan for networks, even when Wi-Fi is turned off.
 - Smart network switch: Auto connect to/ disconnect from Wi-Fi networks.
 - Install certificates: Install authentication certificates.

- MAC address: View your device's MAC address, which is required when connecting to some secured networks (not configurable).
- IP address: View your device's IP address (not configurable).
- Manage networks: Configure previously connected Access Points.
- WPS push button: Set up a connection to a WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup) router or other equipment.
- WPN PIN entry: View the PIN used by your device to set up a PIN-secured connection to a Wi-Fi router or other equipment (not configurable).
- **Help**: Learn about setting up and using Wi-Fi networks.

Wi-Fi Direct

Wi-Fi Direct allows device-to-device connections so you can transfer large amounts of data over a Wi-Fi connection.

Both your device and the target device must be enabled for Wi-Fi Direct communication. This connection is direct and not via a hot spot or Wireless Access Point (WAP).

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Wireless and Networks, touch Wi-Fi.
- 2. Touch ON/OFF to turn Wi-Fi on.
- Touch Wi-Fi Direct. Your device begins scanning for other devices enabled with Wi-Fi Direct.
- 4. Enable Wi-Fi Direct on the target device.
- **5.** In the list of available devices, touch the target device.
 - or -

If you want to connect to more than one device, touch **Multi connect** and touch each device (that support Multi connect) you want to connect to. Touch **Done**.

6. On the target device, touch Connect. Once connected, the target device will show as Connected in your list of Wi-Fi Direct devices and the picon will display on the Status Bar.

Share Information Using Wi-Fi Direct

To share videos, photos, or other information with the connected device, follow these steps:

- View the information that you want to share. For example, if you want to share a photo, find the photo in your camera viewer or from a Home screen, touch Apps Tiles, touch and hold to select the photo, and then use the Share via option.
- 2. Touch the Wi-Fi Direct option.

The Wi-Fi Direct settings screen displays, Wi-Fi Direct is turned on, and your device scans for other devices.

- 3. Touch a connected device name.
- The other device displays a popup that indicates it is receiving the file.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology for exchanging information over a distance of about 30 feet. You do not need to line up the devices to send information with Bluetooth. If the devices are in range, you can exchange information between them—even if they are in different rooms.

Your device can use Bluetooth to share photos, contacts and other content with other Bluetooth-enabled devices. Many of the apps on your tablet provide options for sharing via Bluetooth under **Menu**.

Turning Bluetooth On or Off

Turn your device's Bluetooth feature on or off. When you turn Bluetooth on, your device can search, pair, and connect to other Bluetooth devices.

When Bluetooth is on, \gg is displayed on the Status Bar.

From the Notification panel

- 1. From any screen, touch the top of the screen and swipe downward. The Notification panel displays.
- Touch Bluetooth to turn Bluetooth on (green) or off (grey).

From Settings

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Wireless and Networks, touch Bluetooth.
- 2. Touch **ON/OFF** to turn Bluetooth on or off.

Pairing with a Bluetooth Device

Search for a Bluetooth device and pair with it, to exchange information between your device and the target device.

After pairing, your device and the target device will recognize each other and exchange information without a passcode or PIN.

Note: When connected to a paired device, the Reluetooth connected icon displays in the Status Bar.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Wireless and Networks. touch Bluetooth.
- 2. Touch ON/OFF to turn Bluetooth on.
- Activate the target device's discoverable mode.
- Touch Scan.

- 5. From the list of scanned devices, touch the target device, then follow the prompts to complete the pairing:
 - If the target device requires a PIN, enter a PIN for the target device and touch OK. When prompted, enter the PIN on the target device.
 - If the device allows automatic or smart pairing, your device will attempt to pair with the device automatically.
 Follow the prompts on your device and the target device to complete the pairing.

Note: Due to different specifications and features of other Bluetooth-compatible devices, display and operations may be different, and functions such as transfer or exchange may not be possible with all Bluetooth-compatible devices.

Disconnect or Unpair from a Bluetooth Device

Follow these instructions to disconnect or unpair your tablet from a Bluetooth device.

Disconnect from a Bluetooth Device

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Wireless and Networks. touch Bluetooth.
- Touch the connected device, and then touch **OK** to disconnect.

Unpair from a Bluetooth Device

You can make your tablet forget its pairing connection with another Bluetooth device. To connect to the other device again, you will need to pair them again.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Wireless and Networks, touch Bluetooth.
- Touch ON/OFF to turn Bluetooth on.
- Touch the connected device, and then touch ♣ → Unpair.

Send Information Using Bluetooth

You can use Bluetooth to transfer information between your tablet and another Bluetooth-enabled device such as a tablet or notebook computer. The first time you transfer information between your table and another device, you need to enter or confirm a security passcode. After that, your tablet and the other device are paired, and you will not need to exchange pass codes to transfer information in the future.

You can send the following types of information, depending on the device you are sending to:

- Images and videos
- · Calendar events
- Contacts
- Audio files

Note: Your tablet must already be paired to the target device in order to share files. For more information, refer to "Pairing with a Bluetooth Device" on page 39.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Wireless and Networks, touch Bluetooth.
- 2. Touch ON/OFF to turn Bluetooth on.
- 3. On your tablet, open the application that contains the information or file you want to send. Some common ways of sharing files via Bluetooth include:
 - While viewing photos or videos in the Gallery, touch
 → Bluetooth.
 - While playing music using the Music app, touch
 Menu → Via Bluetooth.
 - While viewing a Contact, touch ☐ Menu →
 Share namecard via → Bluetooth.
- Touch the name of the target device and follow the prompts to accept the file.

Receive Data Using Bluetooth

Your tablet is capable of receiving a wide variety of file types with Bluetooth, including photos, audio files, and documents such as PDFs.

Note: Your tablet must already be paired to the target device in order to share files. For more information, refer to "Pairing with a Bluetooth Device" on page 39.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Wireless and Networks. touch Bluetooth.
- 2. Touch ON/OFF to turn Bluetooth on.
- When your tablet receives a file transfer request notification, touch **Accept**.
- When the file is transferred, a notification displays. To open the file immediately, slide down the Notification panel, and then touch the relevant notification.

Accessing Files Received Using Bluetooth

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Wireless and Networks, touch Bluetooth.
- 2. Touch Menu → Received files.
- 3. Touch a file to open it. When you open a received file, what happens next depends on the file type:
 - Media files and documents are usually opened directly in a compatible application. For example, if you open a music track, it starts playing in the Music Player application.
 - For a vCalendar file, select the calendar where you
 want to save the event, and then touch Import event.
 The vCalendar is added to your Calendar events.
 - For a vCard contact file, if there are multiple vCard files on your storage card, you can choose to import one, several, or all of those contacts to your Contacts list.

Note: Received data is normally saved to the Bluetooth folder on your tablet. If you receive a contact, it is saved to your contacts automatically.

Bluetooth Settings

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Wireless and Networks, touch Bluetooth.
- 2. Touch ON/OFF to turn Bluetooth on.
- 3. Touch Menu for options:
 - Visibility timeout: Set the length of time your tablet is visible to other devices when you turn on visibility.
 - Received files: Show the list of files received using Bluetooth.
 - Rename device: Change the name of your device (used to identify your tablet when using Bluetooth).
 Touch Device name to change it.
 - **Help**: Display additional Bluetooth information.

Mobile Hotspot

Use Mobile Hotspot to share your tablet's Internet connection with up to 10 Wi-Fi-enabled devices using 4G.

You can control whether devices connect to your Mobile Hotspot with the Allowed device list.

Note: Mobile Hotspot requires a subscription to Mobile Hotspot/Mobile Broadband Connect service. Contact Verizon Wireless for more information.

Mobile Hotspot consumes battery power and uses data service. While the Mobile Hotspot is active, your tablet's applications will use the Mobile Hotspot data allowance.

Turning Mobile Hotspot On or Off

Activate Mobile Hotspot to allow other devices to use your tablet's internet connection.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Wireless and Networks, touch More settings.
- 2. Touch Mobile Hotspot.
- 3. Touch **ON/OFF** to enable the feature.

Note: You can also access Mobile Hotspot with the Mobile Hotspot app.

Caution! By default, your device's mobile hotspot has no security applied, and any device can connect.

Connecting a Device with Mobile Hotspot

Use the other device's Wi-Fi control to connect to your device's Mobile Hotspot.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Wireless and Networks, touch More settings.
- Touch Mobile Hotspot. Touch ON/OFF to enable the feature.
- Activate Wi-Fi on the target device, using the device's Wi-Fi control.
- Scan for Wi-Fi hotspots, and select your device from the list.
- At the prompt, enter your device's Mobile Hotspot password.

Allowed Device List

Control whether devices connect to your Mobile Hotspot with the Allowed device list. After you add devices to the list, they can scan for your device and connect using your device's mobile hotspot name and password without making your hotspot visible.

Note: Mobile Hotspot requires a subscription to Mobile Hotspot/Mobile Broadband Connect service. Contact Verizon Wireless for more information.

Mobile Hotspot consumes battery power and uses data service. While the Mobile Hotspot is active, your tablet's applications will use the Mobile Hotspot data allowance.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Wireless and Networks, touch More settings.
- Touch Mobile Hotspot. Touch ON/OFF to enable the feature.
- Touch Allowed devices, then touch Add to enter the other device's Device name and MAC address.
- 4. Touch **OK** to add the device to the Allowed devices list.

Configuring Mobile Hotspot Settings

Configure your device's Mobile Hotspot settings, including your device's name and password, and set the visibility of your device's Wi-Fi hotspot.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Wireless and Networks, touch More settings.
- Touch Mobile Hotspot. Touch ON/OFF to enable the feature.
- Touch Configure Mobile Hotspot for these options:
 - Network SSID: View and change the name of your mobile hotspot.
 - Hide my device: When enabled, your mobile hotspot is not visible to other Wi-Fi devices during a scan. Other devices can still connect to your mobile hotspot, but will have to set up the connection manually with your Network SSID and Password.
 - **Security**: Choose the security level for your Mobile Hotspot.
 - Password: If you choose a security level that uses a password, enter the password.

- **Show password**: Enable to make the Password field visible.
- Show advanced options: Enable to access advanced options, including Broadcast channel, to specify the channel your device uses for Mobile Hotspot.

Tethering

Use Tethering to share your device's internet connection with a computer that connects to your device, with a USB cable, or by Bluetooth.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Wireless and Networks, touch More settings.
- 2. Touch Tethering.

Important! Tethering consumes battery power and increases your data usage. Roaming while using tethering will incur extra data charges.

Mobile Broadband Connect

Use Mobile Broadband Connect to share your device's network connection with a computer that connects to your device via USB cable.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Wireless and Networks, touch More settings.
- 2. Touch Tethering.
- Connect the other device to your device with a USB cable.
- Touch Mobile Broadband Connect to turn tethering On or Off.

Note: Mobile Broadband Connect may require a subscription to Mobile Hotspot/Mobile Broadband Connect service. Contact Verizon Wireless for more information. Mobile Hotspot consumes battery power and uses data service. While the Mobile Hotspot is active, your device's applications will use the Mobile Hotspot data allowance.

Bluetooth Tethering

Before starting, pair the target device with your tablet, and then configure it to obtain its network connection by using Bluetooth.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Wireless and Networks, touch More settings.
- 2. Touch Tethering.
- 3. Touch Bluetooth tethering to turn tethering On or Off.

VPN

Set up and manage Virtual Private Networks (VPNs).

Note: You must enable screen security before setting up a VPN. For more information, refer to "Lock Screen" on page 97.

Adding a VPN

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Wireless and Networks, touch More settings → VPN.
 - To configure a Basic VPN: Touch Basic VPN and then touch Add. Enter the configuration information and then touch Save.
 - To configure an Advanced IPsec VPN: Touch
 Advanced IPsec VPN, and then touch Add VPN
 Connection.
- Set a password to protect the private keys and shared secrets.
- 3. Re-enter the password and then touch **OK**.
- Enter the IPsec configuration information, then touch Show advanced options to configure additional options.
- Touch Save.

Connecting to a VPN

- 2. Touch the VPN to which you want to connect.
- 3. In the pop-up window, enter any requested credentials.
- 4. Touch Connect.

Edit or Delete a VPN

- 2. Touch and hold the VPN that you want to edit or delete.
- 3. In the pop-up window, touch:
 - Edit network, make the desired VPN setting changes, and touch Save.
 - or -
 - Delete network to delete the VPN.

Keep VPN Always Connected

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Wireless and Networks, touch More settings → VPN.
- 2. Touch Menu → Always-on VPN to select a VPN profile to always stay connected.

Connecting as a Mass Storage Device

You can connect your device to a PC as a removable disk and access files on both the device and an installed memory card (not included).

Note: The file directory of the memory card displays as Card, separate from the internal memory, which is Tablet.

- Insert a memory card into the device to transfer files from or to the memory card.
- 2. Attach your device to the computer with the USB cable.

Your computer recognizes the connection and displays the AutoPlay screen.

- Click the option to Open device to view files.
- Copy files from the PC to the memory card (Card folder).
- When finished, close the PC folder and disconnect the USB cable.

Section 5: Applications

This section describes apps on your device.

Apps Screen

The Apps screen displays all applications installed on your tablet. Applications that you download and install from Google Play or from the web are also added to a Home screen.

To arrange the Apps icons in alphabetical order:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch Apps.
- 2. Touch Menu → View type.
- 3. Touch Alphabetical grid.

To manually change the order of the icons on the Apps screen:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch Apps.
- Touch Menu → View type → Customizable grid.
- 3. Touch Menu → Edit.
- 4. Touch and hold an icon and drag it to a new position.
- 5. Touch Save to save the changes.

You can place shortcuts to applications on the Home screen for quick access to the application. For more information, refer to "Adding a Shortcut or Widget" on page 17.

To view your downloaded applications:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch Apps.
- Touch the <u>Downloaded applications</u> tab to view downloaded apps.
- **3.** Touch an icon to launch the application.
 - or -

Add an App Shortcut to a Home screen by dragging the App icon onto the Home screen. For more information, refer to "Adding a Shortcut or Widget" on page 17.

Application Information

To view information about an App, such as the amount of storage it uses, force the App to stop, uninstall updates, and clear data:

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings
 → Application manager.
- Swipe right to view the All tab, scroll through the apps list, and touch the app to open a screen with details about the App.

Updating Applications

When you sign in to your Google Account (see "Your Google Account" on page 28), you may see the Dpdates

Available notification in the Status Bar if there is a new version of one or more apps available or, when you open an application that is preloaded on your device, an Update

Available message may be displayed.

- Touch the top of the screen and swipe downward. The Notification panel displays.
- Touch Updates available.

Uninstalling/Disabling Apps

You can uninstall or disable apps you have downloaded. Preloaded apps cannot be uninstalled, but certain pre-loaded apps can be disabled.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch Apps.
- 2. Touch Menu → Uninstall/disable apps.
- Apps that can be uninstalled or disabled show on their icon. Touch and then follow the prompts to uninstall or disable the app.

Note: To view disabled apps, touch **### Apps**, and then touch **### Menu** → **Show disabled apps**.

Alarm

Set alarms for reminders or for wake-up times.

Note: When an alarm is set, displays in the Status Bar.

Setting Alarms

- 1. Touch Rarm.
- Touch Create, set a time for the alarm to go off, select days for the alarm to repeat, and then touch Save.
 - Location alarm: Set a location. The alarm goes ON/ OFF when you are in the location.
 - Snooze: Set an interval and the number of times for the alarm to repeat after the preset time.
 - **Smart alarm**: Set a time for the alarm to go off before the preset time.

Stopping Alarms

- Drag X outside of the circle to stop an alarm.
- Drag ZZ outside of the circle to snooze.

Deleting Alarms

- 1. Touch Ralarm.
- 2. Touch and hold the alarm, and then touch Touch and Delete.

Calculator

The Calculator provides basic and advanced arithmetic functions.

■ Touch | Calculator.

To clear the result:

■ Touch C .

To clear the calculator history:

■ Touch → Clear history.

To copy or cut the contents of the display:

 Touch and hold entries in the Calculator's display field until the popup menu displays, and then touch Select all, Cut, or Copy. You can then paste the copied value in another app.

Calendar

Use this application to manage events and tasks.

■ Touch 31 Calendar.

Creating Events or Tasks

- **1.** Touch and use one of the following methods:
 - Event: Enter an event with an optional repeat setting.
 - Task: Enter a task with an optional priority setting.
 - or -

Touch a date on the calendar to select it and touch it again.

Enter a title and specify which calendar to use or sync with. Then touch **Edit event details** or **Edit task details** to add more details, such as how often the event repeats, when it has an advance alert, or where it takes place.

Attach a map showing the location of the event. Enter
the location in the Location field, touch a next to the
field, and then pinpoint the precise location by touching
and holding on the map that appears.

Syncing with Google Calendar

- On a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings → Accounts → Google.
- Touch a Google Account → Sync Calendar → Sync now.

To manually sync for updating:

■ Touch 31 Calendar → Menu → Sync.

To display synced events or tasks:

■ Touch 31 Calendar → Menu → Calendars, and then check mark the Google Account.

Changing Calendar Type

At the top of the screen:

- Touch a calendar type: Year, Month, Week, Day, or Agenda.
- Touch Agenda to list events, tasks, and Special occasions.

Searching for Events

- Touch Search, and then enter a keyword to use for the search.
- To view today's events, touch Today at the top of the screen.

Deleting Events

■ Touch an event or task. On the popup, touch **Menu**→ Delete

- or -

Touch **Menu** → **Delete**, select events, and then touch **Delete**.

Sharing Events

■ Touch an event. On the popup, touch Menu → Share via, and then select a sharing method.

Camera

Use this application to take photos or videos.


Use **Gallery** to view photos and videos taken with the device's camera.

■ From a Home screen, touch Apps → Camera.

Taking Photos

- Touch the image on the preview screen where the camera should focus.
- 2. Touch one to take the photo.

Note: If the camera lens is not clean, the device may not work properly in some modes that require high resolution.



- 1. Change camera settings.
- 2. Switch between the front and rear camera.
- 3. View more options.
- Current shooting mode.
- 5. Record video button.
- Camera button.
- 7. Change shooting mode.
- Select an available effect.
- Open Gallery to view photos and videos.

Shooting Mode

Several photo modes are available. Some modes are not available when taking self-portraits.

- Touch MODE, and then scroll up or down the screen at the right side of the screen.
 - Auto: Use this to allow the camera to evaluate the surroundings and determine the ideal mode for the photo.

- Beauty face: Take a photo with lightened faces for gentler images.
- **Sound & shot**: Use this to take a photo with sound.
 - Touch to take a photo. The device records a few seconds of audio after taking a photo.

Note: While taking photos in this mode, sound is recorded by the internal microphone.

- Panorama: Take a photo composed of many photos strung together. To get the best shot, follow these tips:
 - Move the camera slowly in one direction.
 - Keep the camera's viewfinder within the guide frame.
- Avoid taking photos of a subject in front of unrecognizable backgrounds, such as empty skies or plain walls.
- **Sports**: Use this setting for fast-moving subjects.
- Night: Use this setting when taking photos in low light conditions.

Applying Filter Effects

Use the filter effects to take unique photos or videos.

Touch and select a filter effect. The available options vary by mode.

Recording Videos

- To record a video, touch (to record a video.
- To pause recording, touch (II).
- To continue recording, touch ●
- To stop recording, touch ...

Recording Mode

- Touch > Options → Recording mode to change the recording mode.
 - Normal: Use this mode for normal quality.
 - Limit for email: Use this mode to lower quality for sending via email.

Zooming In and Out

Use one of the following methods:

- Reset: Reset the camera settings.
- **Help**: Access help information for using the camera.

Shortcuts

Reorganize shortcuts for easy access to the camera's various options.

- 2. Touch and hold a shortcut icon to display all shortcuts.
- Touch and hold an option and drag it to a slot at the top of the screen. The other icons can be moved within the list by touching and dragging them.
- Touch Reset to reset the quick settings layout to the default settings.

List View or Tab View

Settings can be display in a list view (default) or as four tabs (Connections, Device, Controls, and General). In the list view, there are five major groups of settings: Wireless and networks, Device, Personal, Accounts, and System.

To change between views:

The Settings Screen

Warning! When disabled, you will not be able to use the Internet, sync email, or use any app that requres a data connection unless you are connected to a Wi-Fi network.

 - Global Data Roaming Access: Enable or disable connection to data services when your device is roaming on another network.
 - Roaming: (Not configurable) Current roaming status.

- **Signal strength**: (Not configurable) Current signal strength.
- **Network mode**: Choose a preferred network mode.
- Access Point Names: Configure wireless network access.
- Network operators: Configure network operators.

- Multi window: Enable or disable the Multi window feature. Touch ON/OFF to enable the feature. Touch Open in multi window view to automatically view content in a multi window when you open files from My Files or Video, or attachments from email and messages. For more information, refer to "Multi Window" on page 19.
- Brightness: Touch and drag the slider to set the brightness or touch Automatic brightness.
- Screen timeout: Set the length of delay between the last key press or screen touch and the automatic screen timeout (dim and lock).

You can download and install applications from Google Play or create applications using the Android SDK and install them on your device. Use Application manager settings to manage applications.

See how memory is being used by Downloaded or Running applications.

The graph at the bottom of the DOWNLOADED tab shows used and free device memory. The graph at the bottom of the RUNNING tab shows used and free RAM.

Downloaded

Display apps you have downloaded onto your device.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Device, touch Application manager.
- Touch DOWNLOADED to view a list of all the downloaded applications on your device.
 - To switch the order of the lists displayed in the DOWNLOADED tabs, touch ☐ Menu → Sort by size, Sort by name, or Sort by date.

 - To uninstall more than one application, touch Menu
 → Uninstall multiple.
 - Touch an application to view and update information about the application, including memory usage, default settings, and permissions.

Running Services

View and control services running on your device.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Device, touch Application manager.
- 2. Touch the RUNNING tab.

All the applications that are currently running on the device display.

- Touch Show cached processes to display all the cached processes that are running. Touch Show services in use to switch back.
- Touch one of the applications to view application information.

The following options display:

• **Stop**: Stops the application from running on the device. This is usually done prior to uninstalling the application.

Warning! Not all services can be stopped. Stopping services may have undesirable consequences on the application or Android System.

Report: Report failure and other application information.

Users

Location

- Touch Encrypt device. For more information, read the displayed help screen.
- Touch Encrypt external SD card to enable the encryption on SD card data that requires a password be entered each time the microSD card is connected.

Tip: Make sure your battery is charged more than 80 percent. Encryption may take an hour or more.

Set Up SIM Card Lock

As a security measure, you can choose to lock the SIM card, and require a PIN to use the device.

An informational popup displays.

Read the message and touch **OK** to allow installation of non-Google Play applications.

Warning! Enabling this option causes your tablet and personal data to be more vulnerable to attack by applications from unknown sources.

- Touch Verify apps to block or warn before installing apps that may cause harm.
- Touch Change security level to modify the security level for credential files

Security Update Service

To set security update service settings:

- 2. Touch Security policy updates for these options:
 - Automatic updates: Automatically check for changes to the security policy and download any updates to improve security.

To send security reports to Samsung via Wi-Fi for threat analysis:

Credential Storage

If a certificate authority (CA) certificate gets compromised or for some other reason you do not trust it, you can disable or remove it.

 - Touch Storage type to set a storage type for credential contents
 - Touch Trusted credentials. The trusted credentials screen has two tabs:
 - System: Displays CA certificates that are permanently installed in the ROM of your device.
 - User: Displays any CA certificates that you installed, for example, in the process of installing a client certificate.
 - Touch a CA certificate to examine its details.
 - A scrolling screen displays the details.
 - Scroll to the bottom of the details screen and touch
 Turn off to disable a System certificate.
- 2. Touch **OK** to return to the certificate list.

Touch Install from device storage, then choose a certificate and follow the prompts to install encrypted certificates stored on the USB storage.

You must have installed a memory card (not included) containing encrypted certificates to use this feature.

Note: If you have installed encrypted certificates, touch Clear credentials to erase the credential contents from the device and reset the password.

- Touch Google voice typing to automatically use Google voice typing.
- 3. Touch the next to Google voice typing.

The following options are available:

- Choose input languages: Touch Automatic to use the local language or select a language from the list.
- Block offensive words: Enable or disable blocking of recognized offensive words from the results of your voice-input Google searches.
- Offline speech recognition: Enable voice input while offline. Touch the All tab to download speech recognition for other languages.

Speech

Set voice search and text-to-speech options.

Voice Search

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Personal, touch Language and input.
- 2. Touch Voice search to configure:
 - Language: Choose a language for your voice input.
 - "Ok Google" hotword detection: Say "Ok Google" to launch a voice search.
 - Speech output: Always provides audible readout of text, or only when using Hands-free functions.
 - Block offensive words: Block recognized offensive words from the results of your voice-input Google searches.
 - Offline speech recognition: Enable voice input while offline. Touch the All tab to download speech recognition for other languages.
 - Bluetooth headset: Record audio through a Bluetooth headset, if available.

Text-To-Speech Options

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Personal, touch Language and input.
- **2.** Touch **Text-to-speech options** and select the preferred TTS engine.
- Touch next to the preferred TTS engine and configure.
- **4.** Under General, configure the following:
 - Speech rate: Set the speed at which the text is spoken.
 - **Listen to an example**: Play a sample of speech synthesis (available if voice data is installed).
 - **Default language status**: Display the default language in use.

Mouse/Trackpad

This option sets your Pointer speed.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Personal, touch Language and input.
- Touch Pointer speed then drag the slider to the right to go faster or to the left to go slower.

Backup and Reset

You can back up your data to the Google server and reset your device to its factory defaults.

Backup and Restore

To enable or disable backup of your information to the Google server.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Personal, touch Backup and reset.
- Touch Back up my data to enable or disable back up of application data, Wi-Fi passwords, and other settings to the Google server.

Once the **Back up my data** option is enabled, then the **Backup account** and the **Automatic restore** options are available.

- Touch Backup account and touch your Google Gmail account or touch Add account to set your Google Gmail account to be backed up to the Google server.
- Touch Automatic restore to enable automatic restoration of settings from the Google server. When enabled, backed-up settings are restored when you reinstall an application.

Factory Data Reset

Use Factory data reset to return your device to its factory defaults. This setting erases all data from the device, including Google or other email account settings, system and application data and settings, and downloaded applications, as well as your music, photos, videos, and other files.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Personal, touch Backup and reset.
- 2. Touch Factory data reset.

The Factory data reset screen displays reset information.

Touch Reset device, then follow the prompts to perform the reset.

Reset Settings

To reset system settings back to their default values:

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings. Under Personal, touch Backup and reset.
- 2. Touch Reset settings.

Accounts

Set up and manage accounts, including Samsung, Amazon, Cloud, Email, Google, and your social networking accounts.

Your device can synchronize information from a variety of accounts, including Email, Facebook, Google, and your Samsung account. Depending on the account, you can choose to synchronize your calendar, contacts, and other types of content.

With synchronization, you can ensure that the information on your device is updated with any information that changes in your accounts.

Adding an Account

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Accounts, touch Add account.
- 2. Touch one of the account types.
- Follow the prompts to enter your credentials and set up the account.

Tip: For more information about the types of accounts that you can add, see "Accounts" on page 28.

Managing Accounts

To view the accounts you have added:

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under Accounts, touch <account>.
 - The <account> is either Google, Samsung account, or some other account you have added, such as Email.
- Touch Sync all to synchronize all accounts listed. Touch Cancel sync to stop the synchronization.

- **3.** Touch an account to view the sync settings for that account.
 - Touch Sync now to synchronize all data for the selected account.

- or -

Touch the account data to synchronize, such as, Calendar. Contacts. and so on.

- To remove the account, touch Remove account and then touch Remove account at the prompt to remove the account and delete all its messages, contacts, and other data
- For Google Accounts, touch one of the items listed under Privacy to view various settings for that item.

- or -

For Samsung accounts, touch **Account settings** to manage Samsung account settings or **Backup** to set Samsung account back up and restore options.

- or -

For Email accounts, touch **Settings** to manage various settings for that account.

Motions and Gestures

Activate the palm motion feature to control the device by touching the screen with your palm.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings. Under System, touch Motions and gestures → Palm motion.
- Touch ON/OFF to enable the feature.
- Configure the following options (touch each option for details):
 - Capture screen: Capture an image of the screen when you sweep your hand left or right across the screen.
 - Mute/pause: Set the device to pause media playback when you touch the screen with your palm.

Accessories

To change optional accessory settings:

■ From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings. Under System, touch Accessory.
The following options display:

Dock

- Dock sound: Play a sound when inserting and removing the device from a dock (not included).
- Audio output mode: Use external speakers (not included) when docked.

Book Cover

 Automatic unlock: Set this option If you are using a device cover (not included) and you want your device to unlock when you open the cover.

Date and Time

By default, your device receives date and time information from the wireless network. When you are outside network coverage, you may want to set date and time information manually using the Date and time settings.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings. Under System, touch Date and time.
 - Automatic date and time: Allow the network to set the date and time. Disable this option to set date and time manually.
 - Set date: Enter the current date.
 - **Set time**: Enter the current time.
 - Automatic time zone: When enabled, the tablet takes the time zone from the wireless network. Disable this option to set time zone manually
 - Select time zone: Choose your local time zone (only available when the Automatic setting is disabled).
 - Use 24-hour format: Set the format for time displays.
 If this option is not selected, the tablet automatically uses a 12-hour format.
 - Select date format: Set the format for date displays.

Accessibility

Accessibility services are special features to make using the device easier for those with certain physical disabilities. Use the Accessibility settings to activate these services.

Note: You can download accessibility applications from the Google Play Store and manage their use here.

- From a Home screen, touch ### Apps → Settings.
 Under System, touch Accessibility.
- 2. Configure the following settings:

Accessibility

 Auto rotate screen: Set the screen orientation to automatically change when you rotate the device. When this option is not checked, the screen orientation locks in the current orientation (landscape or portrait) and the orientation does not change when you rotate the device.

Tip: From any screen, touch the top of the screen and swipe downward to display the Quick Settings screen. Touch Screen rotation to enable or disable the Auto rotate feature.

- Lock automatically: Select the screen delay time the screen delays shutting off after inactivity for the selected period of time.
- **Speak passwords**: Speaks passwords to enter them.
- Single tap mode: Tap to stop/snooze alarms, calendar events, and timer alerts, and to accept/reject incoming calls.
- Show shortcut: Set this option to display an Accessibility shortcut on the Device options popup when you press and hold the power key.
- Manage accessibility: Save and update your accessibility settings or share them with another device. You can export your settings, import a previously saved file, or share your file with another device.

Services

 TalkBack: Activate the TalkBack feature, which speaks feedback aloud to help blind and low-vision users.

Important! TalkBack can collect all of the text you enter, except passwords, including personal data and credit card numbers. It may also log your user interface interactions with the device.

Vision

- Font size: Set the font size.
- Magnification gestures: Use gestures such as tripletapping, double pinching, and dragging two fingers across the screen. Touch ON/OFF to enable the feature.
- Negative colors: Reverse the display of onscreen colors from White text on a Black background to Black text on a White background.
- Color adjustment: Adjust the display colors, if you are color blind and have difficulty reading the display because of the colors. Touch ON/OFF to enable the feature. Touch Color adjustment and follow the onscreen instructions to begin the color adjustment process.
- Notification reminders: Beep at set intervals to remind you of any unread notifications. Touch ON/OFF to enable the feature. Touch Notification reminders for options.
- Accessibility shortcut: Quickly enable accessibility features in two quick steps. Touch ON/OFF to enable the feature.

• Text-to-speech options: Set your preferred TTS engine. Touch **Speech rate** to set the speed at which the text is spoken. Touch **Listen to an example** to play a short speech demonstration. For more information, refer to "Speech" on page 105.

Hearing

- **Sound balance**: Use the slider to set the Left and Right balance when using a stereo device.
- **Mono audio**: When Mono audio is enabled, you can listen through one earphone to mono audio sound.
- Turn off all sounds: Turn off all sounds including receiver voice.
- Hearing aids: Improve the sound quality of your device for use with hearing aids.
- Google subtitles (CC): Use Google subtitles with multimedia files when available. Touch the ON/OFF switch to turn the feature ON Nouch Google subtitles (CC) for options.
- Samsung subtitles (CC): Use Samsung subtitles with multimedia files when available. Touch the ON/OFF switch to turn the feature ON ON. Touch Samsung subtitles (CC) for options

Dexterity

- Assistant menu: Improve the device accessibility for users with reduced dexterity. Touch the ON/OFF switch to turn it ON N. Follow the onscreen instructions.
- **Touch and hold delay**: Select a time interval for this gesture.

Recognition

 Interaction control: Enable or disable motions and screen timeout. You can also block areas of the screen from touch interaction. Touch the ON/OFF switch to turn the feature ON Normal. Follow the onscreen instructions

About Device

View information about your device, including status, legal information, hardware and software versions, and battery use.

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under System, touch About device.
- 2. Touch items to view details:
 - Icon glossary: Displays a categorized list of icons that display on the device.
 - Status: View Battery status, Battery level, IP address, Wi-Fi MAC address, Bluetooth address, Up time, and Device status.
 - Legal information: Touch an option to display Open source licenses, Google and Samsung legal information, and Privacy Alert.
 - Device name: Enter the name for your device. The default is the device's model number.
 - Model number: Display your device's model number.
 - Android version: Display the firmware version of your device.

- Baseband version: Baseband version loaded on this device.
- Kernel version: Display the kernel version of your device.
- Build number: Display your device's build number.
- SE for Android status: Display Security
 Enhancements for Android status information.
- Hardware version: Hardware version of your tablet.

Software Update

The Software Update feature enables you to use your device to connect to the network and download any new software directly to your device. The device automatically updates with the latest available software when you access this option.

To register your device and check for a software update:

- From a Home screen, touch Apps → Settings.
 Under System, touch Software update.
- 2. Touch Check for new software update.

The device automatically updates the software, if newer software is available.

When updating software, once the update file is downloaded, you can delay the update on the start screen by postponing it for a certain period of time. If you want to resume the update before the selected time, touch **Continue update**.

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
