This section helps you to quickly start using your device. Understanding This User Manual

The sections of this manual generally follow the features of your device. A robust index for features begins on page 200.

Also included is important safety information, beginning on page 167, that you should know before using your device.

This manual gives navigation instructions according to the default display settings. If you select other settings, navigation steps may be different.

Unless otherwise specified, all instructions in this manual assume that you are starting from a Home screen. To get to a Home screen, you may need to unlock the device. For more information, refer to *"Securing Your Device"* on page 13.

Note: Instructions in this manual are based on default settings and may vary from your device depending on the software version on your device and any changes to the device's settings.

Note: Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this user manual start with the device unlocked, at the Home screen.

All screen images in this manual are simulated. Actual displays may vary depending on the software version of your device and any changes to the device's settings.

Special Text

In this manual, some text is set apart from the rest. This special text is intended to point out important information, share quick methods for activating features, define terms, and more. The definitions for these methods are as follows:

- Notes: Presents alternative options for the current feature, menu, or sub-menu.
- Tips: Provides quick or innovative methods or useful shortcuts.
- **Important**: Points out important information about the current feature that could affect performance.
- Warning: Brings important information to your attention that can help to prevent loss of data or functionality or damage to your device.

Text Conventions

This manual provides condensed information about how to use your device. To make this possible, the following text conventions are used to represent often-used steps:

→ Arrows are used to represent the sequence of selecting successive options in longer, or repetitive, procedures.

For example:

From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow (Settings) \rightarrow Display \rightarrow Screen timeout.



Certain features and options use an OFF/ON button.

For example:

Tap OFF to turn Bluetooth ON.

Tap **IDEN** to turn Bluetooth **OFF**.

Installing the SIM Card

When you subscribe to a cellular network, you are provided with a plug-in SIM card loaded with your subscription details, such as your PIN, available optional services, and many others features.

Important! The plug-in SIM card information and its contacts can be easily damaged by scratching or bending, so be careful when handling, inserting, or removing the card. Keep all SIM cards out of reach of small children.

- 1. Remove the slot cover (1) and slide the SIM card into the SIM card slot until it is secured into place (2).
- 2. Replace the slot cover once the card is securely inserted.

Caution! Make sure that the SIM card's gold contacts face downward and that the notched corner of the card goes in first.



Note: If the card is not inserted correctly, the device will not detect the SIM card. Re-orient the card back into the slot if the SIM is not detected.

Memory Card

Your device supports removable microSD or microSDHC memory cards with maximum capacities of 32 GB (not included). Memory cards are used to store music, photos, videos, and other files.

For more information, refer to "Memory Card" on page 87.

Installing a Memory Card

- 1. Open the memory card slot cover and turn to expose the slot.
- With the gold contacts facing down, carefully slide the memory card into the slot (1), pushing gently until it clicks into place (2).
- 3. Replace the memory card slot cover.



Warning! You can damage the memory card by improper installation. Please be careful when inserting, removing, or handling it.

Battery

Your device is powered by a rechargeable, standard Li-Ion battery. A Wall/USB Charger (Charging Head and USB cable) are included with the device for charging the battery.

Warning! Use only approved charging devices. Approved accessories are designed to maximize battery life. Using other accessories may invalidate your warranty and may cause damage.

Battery Indicator

The Battery icon in the Status Bar shows the battery power level. When battery power is 15% or less, your device prompts you to charge the battery. If you continue to operate the device without charging, the device powers off. For battery use information, see *"About Device"* on page 165.

Tip: Tap the Time field to display battery charge status.

Charging the Battery

Your device comes with a Wall/USB Charger (Outlet Connector, Charging Head, and USB cable) to charge your device from any standard AC power outlet.

Note: The battery comes partially charged. You must fully charge the battery before using your device for the first time.

After the first charge, you can use the device while charging.

1. Insert the USB cable into the Charging Head (1).

 Insert the USB cable into the device's Charger/ Accessory Port (2).



- 3. Plug the Charging Head into a standard AC power outlet.
- 4. When charging is complete, unplug the Charging Head from the power outlet and remove the USB cable from the device.

Note: You cannot charge the battery using the USB cable and your PC.

Note: If the battery is completely discharged, you cannot turn on the device, even with the USB power adapter connected. Allow a depleted battery to charge for a few minutes before you try to turn on the device.

Task Manager

Your device can run applications simultaneously and some applications run in the background.

Use Task Manager to see which applications are running on your device and to end running applications to extend battery life. You can also uninstall applications from your device and see how much memory is used by applications.

Task Manager Application

The Task Manager application provides information about applications, including **Active applications**, **Downloaded**, **RAM manager**, and **Storage**.

To access the Task Manager:

 Add the Active (Apps) Manager widget to a Home screen and then tap Active applications on the Active (Apps) Manager widget. For more information, refer to "Widgets" on page 28.

– or –

Press and hold (Home) and then tap (Task manager).

- Tap Active applications to view applications running on your device. Tap End to end an application or End all to end all running applications.
- 3. Tap **Downloaded** to view applications installed from Google Play. Tap **Uninstall** to remove an application from your device.
- Tap RAM manager to display the amount of Random Access Memory (RAM) currently in use. Tap Clear memory to clear inactive and background processes.
- 5. Tap **Storage** to view internal (Device memory) and external (SD card) storage memory statistics.

Turning Your Device On and Off *Turning Your Device On*

■ Press and hold the C (Power/Lock Key).

Note: Your device's internal antenna is located along the top back of the device. Do not block the antenna; doing so may affect signal quality and may cause the device to operate at a higher power level than is necessary. For more information, refer to *"GPS Applications"* on page 96.

Turning Your Device Off

- 1. Press and hold the COMPONENT (Power/Lock Key).
- 2. At the Device options prompt, tap Power off.

Setting Up Your Device

When you first turn on your device, you are asked to set up a few things. To do that, the following screens display. Some screens can be skipped (tap **Skip**) or re-displayed (tap **Back**). Some screens display depending on the options you choose.

Welcome!

- At the Welcome screen, follow the on-screen instructions to configure your tablet's basic options, such as language, date and time, Wi-Fi connections, location settings, etc.
 - Google Account: Many of your tablet's applications, such as Gmail, Hangouts, and the Google Play Store, require a Google Account. To use these applications, you must set up your Google Account on your phone. Complete the steps to sign in to your current Google Account, or sign up for a new Google Account.
 - Samsung Account: Your Samsung Account is used for access to Samsung apps and services, such as Samsung Apps, WatchON, and much more. Complete the steps to sign in to your current Samsung Account, or sign up for a new Samsung Account.

Securing Your Device

By default, the device locks automatically when the screen times out or you can lock it manually. You can use the default screen lock or set up a more secure screen unlock.

Locking the Device Manually

Press the (Power/Lock Key).

Unlocking the Device

- 1. Press the COMPONENT (Power/Lock Key).
- 2. Swipe across the screen as shown.



The last screen you accessed displays.

Note: You can customize the Lock screen and set the type of Screen Unlock you want to use (Swipe, Face unlock, Face and voice, Pattern, PIN, Password, or None). For more information, refer to *"Lock Screen"* on page 151.



Front View

- Light Sensor: Used to control screen brightness automatically when taking photos with the front-facing camera.
- 2. Front-Facing Camera Lens: Used when taking photos or recording videos.
- 3. Display Screen: The orientation of the display screen rotates with the tablet as you turn it. For more information, refer to "System" on page 163.
- 4. Menu Key: Display a list of options for the current app or screen.
- 5. Home Key: Display the central Home screen. Touch and hold to display recent apps that have been accessed.
- 6. Back Key: Return to the previous screen or option.




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Side Views

The following items can be found on the sides of your device as illustrated.

- 1. Microphone: Used for video chat.
- 2. Power/Lock Key: Press and hold to turn the device on or off. Press to lock the device or to wake the screen for unlocking.
- 3. SIM Card Port: Insert your SIM card here.
- Volume Key: From a Home screen, press to adjust Master Volume. During music playback, press to adjust volume.
- 5. Infrared Blaster: Transmits infrared signals used for controlling external devices.
- 6. Memory Card Slot: Install a memory card for storage of files.



Back View and Bottom

The following items can be found on the back of your device as illustrated.

- 1. 3.5mm Headset Jack: Used for headphones.
- 2. Camera Lens: Used when taking photos or recording videos.
- 3. Charger/Accessory Port: Plug in a USB cable for charging or to sync music and files.
- 4. External Speakers: Used in music or video playback, notification tones, and for other sounds.



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Home Screen

The Home screen is the starting point for using your device.

Note: Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this user manual start with the device unlocked, at the Home screen.

- Status Bar: The area along the top of the Home screen which displays notifications (on the left side), battery power and connection details (on the right side). For more information, refer to "Status Bar" on page 26.
- 2. Time: Displays the current time. For more information, refer to "Date and Time" on page 163.
- 3. Widgets: Applications that run on the Home screen. For more information, refer to "Widgets" on page 28.
- App Shortcuts: Shortcuts to apps. For more information, refer to "App Shortcuts" on page 27.
- Current Page: Indicates which Home screen page is being displayed. For more information, refer to "Extended Home Screen" on page 19.
- Primary Shortcuts: Shortcuts to common features which are displayed on all Home screens. For more information, refer to "Primary Shortcuts" on page 27.
- 7. Apps: Display the Apps screen.



Extended Home Screen

The Home screen consists of the main Home screen page, indicated by \bigcap_{i} , plus additional pages that extend beyond the display width to provide additional space for adding app shortcuts and widgets. For more information, refer to *"Adding and Removing Home Screen Pages"* on page 20.

Slide your finger horizontally across the screen to scroll to the left or right pages. As you scroll, the indicator at the bottom of the display shows the current page.

Note: The main Home screen page, indicated by $\bigcap_{I \cap I}$, always displays when you press \bigcirc (Home).

Customizing the Home Screen Pages

You can customize the Home screen pages to suit your needs and preferences.

- **1.** Navigate to one of the Home pages.
- 2. Touch and hold on an empty part of the screen until the Home screen pop-up displays.
- Tap Set wallpaper to change the Home screen wallpaper. For more information, refer to "Wallpapers" on page 29.

Under Add to Home screen, tap:

- Apps and widgets to add app shortcuts or widgets to the Home screen.
- **Folder** to add a folder to a Home screen. For more information, refer to *"Folders"* on page 28.

Adding and Removing Home Screen Pages

Your device comes with seven Home screen pages. You can customize the Home screen by removing or adding pages.

Note: The main Home screen page, indicated by \bigcap_{Π} , always	
displays when you press (Home).	



- 1. From a Home screen, pinch the screen from the left and right side to the center to display the editing screen.
- 2. Use these controls to configure pages:
 - **Remove**: Tap and drag a page to the Trash Can to remove the page from the Home screen.
 - Add: Tap to add a new page, up to a total of seven. This option is available when less than seven pages have been added.
 - **Default Home Page**: Tap the Home icon at the top of a page to set it as the default Home screen.
- **3.** To rearrange the order of pages, tap and drag a page to a new location.
- 4. Tap 📥 (Back) to return to the Home screen.

Display Settings

You can customize display screen settings to your preferences. For more information, refer to *"Display"* on page 144.

Swipe, Flick, or Slide

Swipe, flick, or slide your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen. For example:

- Unlocking the screen.

Pinch and Spread

"Pinch" the screen using your thumb and forefinger to zoom out, or "spread" the screen to zoom in when viewing a picture or a Web page. For example:

- Pinch a web page to zoom out.
- Spread a photo in Gallery to zoom in.

Notifications

When you receive a Notification, a notification icon displays on the left side of the Status Bar. Notifications indicate the arrival of Gmail, Email, alarms, and more.


Notification Panel

The Notification Panel displays ongoing connections and events, as well as summaries of all current Notifications. Quick Settings are also located on the Notification Panel. For more information, refer to *"Quick Settings"* on page 23.

- 1. Tap the top of the screen and swipe downward. The Notification Panel screen displays.
 - **Ongoing**: Lists all connections and background processes currently running.
 - Notifications: Lists events and notifications from apps.
- 2. Tap a Notification to respond to it.
- To delete a Notification, tap and slide it left or right.
 or –

To delete all Notifications, tap Clear.

 Press (Home) or (Back), or swipe up to close the Notification Panel.



Quick Settings

Quick Settings allows you enable/disable common features such as Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, GPS, Screen rotation, and more.

1. Tap the top of the screen and swipe downward. The Notification Panel screen displays.

Tap a Quick Setting button to enable (green) or disable (grey) a setting or feature.

 Scroll left or right to display additional Quick Settings, or tap to list all of the Quick Settings.



To configure Quick Settings, tap \checkmark . For more information, refer to *"Notification Panel"* on page 144. Tap = to return to a single row of Quick Settings.

- 3. The Quick Settings are:
 - Wi-Fi: Tap to enable or disable Wi-Fi. For more information, refer to "Wi-Fi" on page 78.
 - GPS: Tap to enable or disable Standalone GPS services. For more information, refer to "Location Services" on page 150.
 - Sound/Mute: Tap to enable or disable sound mode.
 - Screen rotation: When on, the screen rotates automatically from landscape to portrait and vice versa. When off, the screen is fixed in the current mode—either portrait or landscape.
 - **Bluetooth**: Tap to enable or disable Bluetooth. For more information, refer to *"Bluetooth"* on page 82.
 - Blocking mode: When enabled, notifications for selected features will be disabled. For more information, refer to "Blocking Mode" on page 142.
 - Power saving mode: When enabled, your device automatically analyzes the screen and adjusts the brightness to conserve battery power. For more information, refer to "Power Saving Mode" on page 147.
 - Multi window: Display two apps on the screen at once. For more information, refer to "Using the Multi Window" on page 31.

- Hands-free mode: New notifications are read aloud.
- Smart stay: Set the screen to stay on as long as you look at it. For more information, refer to "Smart Screen" on page 146.
- Sync: Synchronizes your device with the network. Synchronizes contacts, email, time, and a variety of accounts.
- Airplane mode: Airplane mode allows you to use many of your tablet's features, such as Camera, Games, and more, when you are in an airplane or in any other area where accessing data is prohibited.
- Tap 🏠 (Settings) to access Settings. For more information, refer to "Settings" on page 136.

- Tap the Brightness slider and drag it to set the brightness, or tap Auto to allow the device to set brightness automatically based on available light and battery charge status. For more information, refer to "Brightness" on page 145.
- **6.** Tap the time and date at the top to configure:
 - Tap Automatic date and time or Automatic time zone to use network-provided date and time or time zone.
 - Tap Use 24-hour format to enable the 24-hour format.
 - Tap **Manual setup** to display the Date and time settings screen. For more information, refer to *"Date and Time"* on page 163.
- 7. Press (Home) or (Back), or swipe up to close the Notification Panel.

Notifications Icons

- **Music Player**: Music is playing. View the Notification panel to see the song title and music player controls. For more information, refer to *"Music Player"* on page 113.

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Play Music: A song is playing in the Play Music app. View the Notification panel to see the song title and music player controls. For more information, refer to "Play Music" on page 121.

- GPS Active: Displays when GPS is active.
- Software Update: There may be a software update available for this device. For more information, refer to "Software Update" on page 166.
- **Updates Available**: Updates to the applications you have downloaded are available.
- Select Input Method: When the keyboard is being displayed, open the Notification Panel screen to display a menu of quick keyboard settings. For more information, refer to *"Keyboards and Input Methods"* on page 155.



Wi-Fi Direct: Displays when Wi-Fi Direct is active and your tablet is connected to another device. For more information, refer to *"Wi-Fi Direct"* on page 80.

Status Bar

The Status Bar displays icons to show network status, battery power, and other details.

Battery Level: Shown fully charged.



Charging Indicator: Battery is charging.

- Device Power Critical: Battery has only three percent power remaining. At about 15 percent power remaining, a pop-up is displayed to remind you to charge immediately.
- USB Connection Indicator: The device is connected to a computer using a USB cable, but it is not charging. The battery is only charged while connected to a computer, if the device is turned off. When the device is off, press the Power/Lock key to see the battery charging indicator.

Battery Fully Charged: When the battery is fully charged, this indicator is displayed.



Signal Strength: The greater the number of bars, the stronger the signal.




Data Connection: Displays when your connection to a UTMS, HSDPA, HSPA, or HSPA+ network is active.

Data Connection: Displays when your connection to a 4G LTE network is active.



Airplane Mode: Indicates that the Airplane Mode is active, which allows you to use many of your device's features, but it cannot access online information or applications.



Wi-Fi Active: Wi-Fi is connected, active, and 7 communicating with a Wireless Access Point (WAP).



Alarm Set: Displays when you set an alarm to ring at a specified time. For more information, refer to "Alarm" on page 97.

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Smart Stay: Set the screen to stay on as long as you look at it. For more information, refer to "Smart Screen" on page 146.

Primary Shortcuts

Primary Shortcuts display at the bottom of all Home screens. The default Primary Shortcuts are: Email. Calendar. Browser. Camera, Settings, and Apps.

App Shortcuts

Use App Shortcuts for guick access to applications or features, such as Email or other applications.

- 1. Navigate to the Home screen on which you want to place the App Shortcut.
- 2. Tap (Apps).

- or -

Touch and hold on an empty area of the screen until the Home screen options pop-up displays and then tap Apps and widgets.

- 3. Tap the Apps tab.
- 4. Touch and hold the App Shortcut until the Home screen displays, then drag the App Shortcut to where you want to place it and release.

Removing App Shortcuts

Touch and hold the App Shortcut until (Remove) displays, then drag the App Shortcut to the Remove icon.

> 27 Understanding Your Device

Widgets

When you first turn on your tablet, there are various widgets on the center Home screen. They can also appear on the Home screens to the left and right of the center Home screen.

Widgets are self-contained applications that you can place on the Home screens to access your favorite features.

For more information, refer to "Applications" on page 93.

Adding Widgets to a Home Screen

- Navigate to the Home screen on which you want to place the Widget and tap III (Apps).
- 2. Tap the Widgets tab.

Note: Swipe across the screen horizontally to view all Widgets.

- Touch and hold the widget's icon until the Home screen displays, then slide your finger where you want to place the icon and release it.
- Note: There must be room on the screen where you want to place the widget, otherwise the widget will not add to the Home screen.

Removing Widgets

 Touch and hold the Widget until (Remove) displays, then drag the widget to the Remove icon.

Note: This action does not actually delete the Widget, it just removes it from the current Home screen.

Folders

Place Folders on a Home screen to organize items together.

Adding Folders

- 1. Navigate to the desired Home screen.
- Touch and hold on an empty area of the screen until the Home screen pop-up displays and then tap Folder. The Create folder pop-up displays.
- **3.** Tap the **Enter folder name** field, enter a name for the folder, and then tap **OK**.

A new folder displays on the Home screen.

Managing Folders

To rename a folder:

Tap the folder, tap the current name, and use the keyboard to enter a new name for the folder.

To add an App Shortcut to a folder:

- 1. Add the App Shortcut to the Home screen that the folder is on.
- 2. Touch and hold the App Shortcut, drag it to the folder, and drop it.

To remove an App Shortcut from a folder:

- 1. Tap the folder to view the contents.
- **2.** Tap the App Shortcut, drag it out of the folder, and drop it on the Home screen.

Removing a Folder

 Touch and hold the folder until in (Remove) displays, then drag the folder to the Remove icon.

Note: Any App Shortcuts in the folder are also removed.

Wallpapers

You can choose a picture to display on the Home Screen, Lock screen, or on both the Home and Lock screens. Choose from preloaded wallpaper images or select a photo you have downloaded or taken with the Camera.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch and hold on an empty area of the screen until the **Home screen** pop-up displays and tap **Set wallpaper**.
- 2. Tap Home screen, Lock screen, or Home and lock screens.

The **Select wallpaper from** pop-up displays the following options:

- **Gallery**: Access the Gallery to select a photo. Tap a photo to select it. Crop and resize the picture, if desired. Tap **Done** to save the picture as wallpaper.
- Live wallpapers: Choose from pre-loaded interactive animated wallpapers. Tap a wallpaper to see an example. If available, tap **Settings** to view options for the selection. Tap **Set wallpaper** to save your choice.
- Travel wallpaper: Display recommended travel destinations.
- Wallpapers: Choose from pre-loaded wallpaper images. Tap an image to view it. Tap Set wallpaper to save it as wallpaper.

Apps Screen

The **Apps screen** displays all applications installed on your device. The Apps icons are arranged in a customizable grid.

To arrange the Apps icons in alphabetical order:

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **HER** (Apps).
- **2.** Tap \blacksquare (Menu) and then tap View type.
- 3. Tap Alphabetical grid.

To manually change the order of the icons on the Apps screen:

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **HER** (Apps).
- 2. Tap (Menu) and then tap Edit.
- 3. Touch and hold an icon and drag it to a new position.
- 4. Tap Save to save the changes.

You can place shortcuts to applications on the Home screen for quick access to the application. For more information, refer to *"App Shortcuts"* on page 27.

To view your downloaded applications:

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap **HEE** (Apps).
- 2. Tap **Downloaded applications** to view downloaded apps.
- **3.** Tap an icon on the **Downloaded applications** screen to launch the application.

– or –

Add an App Shortcut to a Home screen by dragging the App icon onto the Home Screen. For more information, refer to *"App Shortcuts"* on page 27.

Application Information

To view information about an App, such as the amount of storage it uses, force the App to stop, uninstall updates, and clear data:

- From a Home screen, tap (Apps) → (Settings)
 → Application manager.
- 2. Tap the ALL tab, scroll through the apps list, and tap the app to open a screen with details about the App.

Using the Multi Window

This feature allows you to run multiple applications on the current screen at the same time.



Note: Only applications found within the Multi window panel can be active atop another current application on the screen.

Apps not listed in the Multi window tray may not support the Multi window feature.

When launching applications that contain multimedia files (music/video), audio from both files will be played simultaneously.

Activating and Deactivating Multi Window

To activate Multi window:

- From a Home screen, tap IIII (Apps) → (Settings)
 → Display → Multi window.
- 2. Press (Home) to return to the Home screen.
- **3.** Tap the Multi window **Tab** to open the Multi window tray showing all the available Multi window apps.

Note: Initially, the entire Multi window tray is briefly displayed, then minimized to only show the Tab.

To deactivate Multi window:

 Press and hold (Back). This action hides the Multi window Tab from view.

Note: Once you have turned the Multi window option on, you only need to press and hold **(Back)** to re-activate the Multi window feature.

Tip: You can also activate/deactivate Multi window using Quick Settings. For more information, see "Quick Settings" on page 23.

Repositioning the Tab and Multi Window Tray

The Tab can be moved up and down along the side of the Multi window tray. The Multi window tray can be relocated to either the left or right side of the screen.

To move the tab:

- 1. Activate the Multi window feature.
- Touch and hold the Tab, then slowly drag it up or down along the edge of the Multi window tray to reposition it.



Note: This is a quick way to get the Tab out of the way if you can't get to a button or option behind it.

To relocate the Multi window tray:

- 1. Activate the Multi window feature.
- 2. Tap the Tab to display the Multi window tray.
- Touch and hold the Tab, then drag it toward the center of the screen to detach it (1). Then slowly drag it to its new location on either the left or right edge of the screen (2) and release.



Customizing the Multi Window Tray

The applications found within the Multi Window Tray can be organized by either being rearranging, adding, or removing them.

To rearrange the Multi window applications:

- 1. Activate the Multi window feature.
- 2. Tap the Tab to display the Multi window tray.
- **3.** Touch and hold an app until it detaches from the panel, then carefully drag it to a new location in the list.

To add or remove a Multi window application:

- 1. Activate the Multi window feature.
- 2. Tap the Tab to display the Multi window tray.
- 3. Tap the Edit button.
- **4.** To remove an app, drag it off the the Multi window tray and into storage.
- 5. To add an app, drag it out of storage and on to the Multi window tray.

Using Multi Window to Run Multiple Apps on the Same Screen

Any of the apps found within the Multi window panel can be run at the same time as a current on-screen app.

Once multiple apps are running on the same screen, you can then choose to either swap their positions or maximize a desired app.

In this example, we will be launching both the Message and Maps applications.

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare (Apps) \rightarrow (Messages).
- 2. Activate the Multi window feature.
- 3. Tap the Tab to display the Multi window tray.
- 4. Touch and hold **(Maps)** until it detaches from the panel.
- Drag (Maps) off of the Multi window tray and drop it on to either the top or bottom area of the current on-screen app (Messages).

Note: Once two applications are running, the device displays a split screen view containing both the initial app and the new Multi window app. Each application is now running independent of the other.



To switch the arrangement of the applications:

- 1. Tap the Split Bar to show the on-screen icons.
- 2. Tap 🕞 (Switch). The two apps are switched.

To resize a window:

Touch and hold the Split Bar, and then drag it to resize the window.

To maximize the apps:

- 1. Tap the Split Bar to show the on-screen icons.
- 2. Tap 🗖 (Maximize). Both apps are now maximized.

To close an app:

- 1. Tap the Split Bar to show the on-screen icons.
- **2.** Tap \times (Close).

Multiple Users

This device can be shared with multiple people by creating User profiles. Users have their own space, which they can customize with their own apps, wallpaper, and so on. Users can also adjust device settings like Wi-Fi that affect everyone.

To set up an Owner profile and profiles for other users:

From a Home screen, tap (Apps) → (Settings)
 → Users.

For more information, refer to "Users" on page 149.

Screen Capture

- Press and hold both the (Power/Lock Key) and (Home) to capture and save an image of the current screen.
 - A white border around the screen will flash to indicate that a screen capture was created.
 - A copy of the screenshot is automatically saved to the clipboard.

To view the screen shots:

- 2. Tap the album titled Screenshots.
- 3. Tap a screen capture preview to display it.

Entering Text

Your device uses a virtual QWERTY keyboard for text entry called the *Samsung keyboard*. Use the keyboard to enter letters, punctuation, numbers, and other characters into text entry fields or applications. Access the keyboard by tapping any text entry field.

You can also use voice input to speak your inputs.

The virtual QWERTY keyboard displays at the bottom of the screen. By default, when you rotate the device, the screen orientation updates to display the keyboard at the bottom of the screen.

Text Input Methods

Your device offers two text input methods.

- Google voice typing
- Samsung keyboard

You can set a default text entry method in Settings. For more information, refer to *"Keyboards and Input Methods"* on page 155.

To change to a different text input method while entering text:

- 1. Tap the top of the screen and swipe downward to display the Notifications Panel.
- 2. Tap (Select input method).
- 3. Tap an input method to activate it.

Using the Samsung Keyboard

The Samsung keyboard is a custom virtual QWERTY keyboard, featuring optional predictive text. Input characters by tapping the on-screen keys with your finger or use speech recognition.

You can enable predictive text, to have the Samsung keyboard match your key tapes to common words and display them. Select a word from the display to insert it into your text.

Keyboard Types

In addition to the default QWERTY keyboard, there is also a *Floating* keyboard.

To change the keyboard type:

- 1. Access the QWERTY keyboard.
- 2. Touch and hold on the keyboard, select from the pop-up menu, and then tap Floating.
- **3.** Tap the tab at the top of the Floating keyboard to move it.

Configuring the Samsung Keyboard

You can configure the Samsung keyboard to your preferences. While entering text:

 Touch and hold (Options) on the keyboard and then tap (Settings).

The Samsung keyboard settings screen displays.

For more information, refer to *"Configuring the Samsung Keyboard"* on page 156.

Entering Upper and Lower Case Letters

The default case is lower case (abc). Enter upper and lower case alphabet letters by tapping the Shift key \uparrow to toggle the case, before tapping the letter key(s).

- Tap once to switch from abc to Abc mode.
- Tap twice to switch to ABC mode. When ABC mode is enabled, the Shift key turns blue.

Entering Symbols and Numbers

The number keys are displayed at the top of the keyboard and are always available.

- To enter common symbols, tap sym to switch to symbol mode.
- There are two pages of symbols. Tap 1/2 to view the next page.
- Each key contains a main character or symbol (such as 'a'), plus additional characters (such as @, æ, à, â, etc.). Touch and hold a key to open a small menu of additional characters. (If there is only one additional character (such as the letter 'm' which only has the additional character '~'), that character is automatically selected and entered into your text.)
- Touch and hold the period key to open a small menu of common symbols.

Using Predictive Text

By using Predictive text, you can have next-letter prediction and regional error correction, which compensates for pressing the wrong keys on the QWERTY keyboard.

Note: Enable Predictive text in Samsung keyboard settings. For more information, refer to *"Configuring the Samsung Keyboard"* on page 156.

While entering characters, potential word matches display in the Predictive text area above the keyboard.

Tap a word to insert it into your text.

Tip: Tap \bigcirc to display more words.

Using Google Voice Typing from the Samsung Keyboard

When you enable the Google voice typing setting, you can use your voice to enter text instead of the keyboard.

For more information about enabling Voice input, see "Using Google Voice Typing" on page 42.

Editing Text

You can edit the text you enter in text fields by cutting, copying, or pasting text. These operations can be performed within and across apps. However, some apps do not support editing some or all of the text displayed while others may offer their own way to select text.

To editing existing text:

- Tap the text at the point you want to edit. The Cursor displays at the point you taped.
- 2. Tap and drag the **Cursor** to a better position, if necessary.
- 3. Enter additional text or delete text by repeatedly tapping the 🗠 (Delete) key.

To copy, delete, or replace text:

- Touch and hold the text or word you want to select. The selected text is highlighted between .
- 2. Tap and drag either tab to select more or less text.
- Tip: Tap Select all in the pop-up to select all text in the field. Tap on another area of the screen or tap **Done** to deselect the text.
 - **3.** Depending on the action you want to take for the selected text, in the pop-up tap:
 - Select all to highlight all text in the field.
 - Cut to remove the selected text.
 - Copy to save the selected text to the clipboard.
 - Paste to paste previously copied text.
 - Clipboard to display the text saved to the clipboard.
 - **Translate** to translate the highlighted word. For more information, refer to *"S Translator"* on page 125.

– or –

Enter text by typing or speaking to replace the selection with what you type.

– or –

Tap the \blacksquare (**Delete**) key to delete the selected text.

To paste previously copied text:

1. Tap the text at the point you want to paste the copied text.

The **Cursor** displays at the point you taped.

2. Tap the Cursor.

A pop-up displays.

3. Tap Paste in the pop-up.

To paste text from the clipboard:

- Touch and hold in on the keyboard and then select
 from the pop-up menu to display the text saved to the clipboard.
- 2. Tap a text block to paste that text where the cursor is positioned.

Using the Handwriting Feature

You can enter text simply by using your finger to handwrite letters on your screen.

- From a screen where you can enter text, activate the keyboard by tapping a text input field on the screen. If the Samsung keyboard is not displayed, tap
 (Select input method) on the Notification Panel and then tap Samsung keyboard.
- Touch and hold (Options), then tap
 (Handwriting). The handwriting pad displays.
- 3. Use your finger tip to write out each character.

Note: To properly recognize the written characters, do not use script.

As you write, suggestions are offered in the word options area in case the correct letters were not recognized.

Handwriting tips:

- For uppercase letters, write the letter larger than the lowercase letters.
- Write a dash (horizontal line) to add a space.
- Delete words by sweeping backward across them.
- To display numbers and symbols, tap ^{?#+} and then tap a number or symbol key. Tap the button marked 1/2 or 2/2 to see more symbols and emoticons. Tap 🗙 to exit the numbers and symbols keyboard.
- To return to the Samsung keyboard, tap 📺 (Keyboard).

Handwriting settings:

- 1. While entering text using the Handwriting feature, tap the top of the screen and swipe downward to display the Notifications Panel.
- 2. Tap (Select input method).
- Tap Set up input methods, then tap the next to Samsung keyboard to display Samsung keyboard settings.
- 4. Tap Handwriting.

For more information, refer to *"Configuring the Samsung Keyboard"* on page 156.

5. Tap 📩 (Back) repeatedly to return to your message.

Closing the Keyboard

■ Tap **(Back**) to close the keyboard.

Using Google Voice Typing

You can use your voice to enter text using the Google voice typing feature.

While entering text using the Samsung keyboard:

- 1. Tap 🔮 on the keyboard.
- 2. At the **Tap to speak** prompt, tap ③ and speak clearly and distinctly into the microphone.

The software converts your voice to text, which is displayed in the message.

- 3. Keep speaking to add more text.
- 4. Tap to display the Samsung keyboard.

This section explains how to manage contacts and accounts. Accounts

Your device can synchronize with a variety of accounts. With synchronization, information on your device is updated with any information that changes in your accounts.

- Samsung Account: Add your Samsung account.
- Email: Add an Email account to sync Contacts. For more information, refer to "Email" on page 63.
- Google: Add your Google account to sync your Contacts, Calendar, and Gmail. For more information, refer to "Gmail" on page 66.
- LDAP: Add an LDAP account to find entries in an LDAP directory server.
- Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync: Add your Exchange account to sync Contacts, Calendar, and Email.
- Facebook: Add your Facebook account to sync Contacts.
- TripAdvisor: Add your TripAdvisor account to sync Contacts.

Setting Up Your Accounts

Set up and manage your synchronized accounts with the **Accounts** setting.

- From a Home screen, tap IIII (Apps) → (Settings)
 → Add account.
- 2. Tap the account type.
- **3.** Follow the prompts to enter your account credentials to complete the set-up process.

Your tablet communicates with the appropriate account servers to set up your account. When complete, your account displays in the **Accounts** area of the Settings screen.

Contacts

Store contact information for your friends, family, and colleagues to quickly access information or to send a message.

To access Contacts:

From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow \bigcirc (Contacts).

Creating Contacts

To create a new contact:

1. From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) → \square (Contacts) → \square (Create).

The Save contact to pop-up displays.

2. Tap Device or an account.

– or –

Tap **Add new account** to add a different account. For more information, refer to *"Setting Up Your Accounts"* on page 43.

3. Tap the Contact photo icon to set up a photo to identify the contact.

- **4.** Tap contact fields to display the keyboard and enter information:
 - Some fields have preset values. Tap the field and tap the desired value. For example, tap the ___ (Label) tab and tap a label for the field.
 - Other fields need information to be entered. Tap the field and use the on-screen keyboard to input information.
 - Tapping the check box next to some fields may make additional fields available.
 - Tap (+) to add additional fields. Tap (-) to remove an unused field. Also, tap **Add another field** to add other fields.
 - Tap the screen and swipe up or down to display additional fields or tap **Next** on the keyboard to move to the next field.
 - Tap **(Back)** to remove the keyboard.
- 5. When you finish entering information, tap \checkmark (Save).
- Tip: Display a contact's record and tap the **Email** field to send an email, the **Address** field to display the address on a map, or the **Website** field to link to the website.

Updating Contacts

To update an existing contact:

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow [2] (Contacts).
- 2. Tap a contact in the Contacts list to view its information.
- 3. Tap 🎓 (Edit).
- 4. Continue entering contact information. For more information, refer to "Creating Contacts" on page 44.

Deleting Contacts

To delete a contact:

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare (Apps) \rightarrow \blacksquare (Contacts).
- 2. Tap a contact in the **Contacts** list to view its information.
- 3. Tap 🛅 (Delete).
- 4. At the prompt, tap OK.

Managing Photo IDs

To remove or update a contact's Photo ID:

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow \square (Contacts).
- 2. Tap a contact in the **Contacts** list to view its information.
- 3. Tap 🎓 (Edit).
- 4. Tap the Contact photo, then tap **Remove**, **Image**, **Pictures by people**, or **Take picture**.

Contacts Display Options and Settings

There are various ways to display your Contacts using tabs or settings.

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare (Apps) \rightarrow \square (Contacts).
- 2. Tap the Groups, Favorites, or Contacts tabs above the Contacts List, to view contacts in various ways:
 - Groups: Displays contacts sorted into Groups, such as Not assigned, Co-workers, Family, Friends, and so on. The number of contacts in the group is displayed next to the group name. Tap a group to show only contacts in that group. For more information, refer to "Creating a New Group" on page 48.
 - Favorites: Show only your favorite, or starred, contacts. For more information, refer to "Favorites" on page 50.
 - Contacts: Show all your contacts. Tap the Search field and enter a keyword to list contacts that contain that keyword.
- 3. From the Groups, Favorites, or Contacts list, tap
 [____] (Menu) to display the options for each display.
- From the Contacts list, tap (Menu) and then tap Settings to display and manage Contacts settings.

Linked Contacts

Your device can synchronize with multiple accounts, including Google, Corporate Exchange, and other email providers. When you synchronize contacts from these accounts with your device, you may have multiple contacts for one person.

Linking, or joining, imported contact records allows you to see all the contact's numbers and addresses together in one contact entry. Linking also helps you keep your contacts updated, because any changes that your contacts make to their information in the respective accounts is automatically updated the next time you synchronize with the account.

Linking Contacts

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow **2** (Contacts).
- 2. Tap a contact in the **Contacts** list to view its information.
- 3. Tap (Menu) and then tap Link contact.
- 4. Tap the contact you want to link.

The linked contact's information is displayed with the original contact's information.

5. Repeat Steps 3 and 4 to link other contacts.

Separating Contacts

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare (Apps) \rightarrow \blacksquare (Contacts).
- 2. Tap a contact in the **Contacts** list to view its information.
- 3. Tap the Connection area.

– or –

Tap [[(Menu) and then tap Separate contact.

A list of Joined contacts displays.

 Tap → OK to separate a joined contact. The contact is removed from the list.

Sharing Contact Information

You can send one or more contact's information by way of Bluetooth to other Bluetooth devices or in an Email or Gmail as an attachment.

Note: Not all Bluetooth devices accept contacts and not all devices support transfers of multiple contacts. Check the target device's documentation.

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow \square (Contacts).
- Tap (Menu) and then tap Share namecard via. The Share namecard via pop-up displays.

Tip: Set up a contact record for yourself to share your information with others.

- Tap Selected contact or tap Multiple contacts, tap one or more contacts or tap Select all, and tap Done.
- 4. At the prompt, choose a sending method such as Bluetooth.
- 5. Follow the prompts to send the contact information.

Importing and Exporting Contacts

To back up and restore your contacts information, you can export your contacts list to a storage device, such as a PC, or import your contacts list (previously exported) from a storage device.

- 1. Use the USB cable to connect your device to the storage device.
- **2.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow **2** (Contacts).
- **3.** Tap (Menu) and then tap Import/Export. The Import/Export contacts pop-up displays.
- **4.** Tap an option and then follow the prompts to complete the operation.

Groups

Assign contacts to Groups to make searching for contacts faster or to quickly send messages to group members.

Creating a New Group

Create a new group when you add or edit a contact.

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow \square (Contacts).
- 2. Tap the Groups tab above the Contacts List.
- 3. Tap (Menu) and then tap Create.
- 4. Tap the Group name field and enter a new Group name.
- 5. Tap Message alert, tap a ringtone, and tap OK.
- Tap Add member to add contacts to the new group. For more information, refer to "Adding Group Members" on page 49.
- 7. Tap **Save** to save the new group name.

Tip: Contacts can belong to more than one group. Just tap the contact's **Groups** field and tap each group.

Once you create a new group, the Contacts List can be set to display only the contacts in that group. For more information, refer to *"Contacts Display Options and Settings"* on page 46.

Renaming a Group

To rename a groups that you have created:

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow [2] (Contacts).
- 2. Tap the **Groups** tab and then tap the group you want to rename.
- 3. Tap (Menu) and then tap Edit.
- 4. Tap the Group name field and enter a new Group name.
- 5. Tap Message alert, tap a ringtone, and tap OK.
- 6. Tap \checkmark (Save) to save the new group name.

Deleting Groups

To delete a group that you created:

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow [2] (Contacts).
- 2. Tap the Groups tab.
- 3. Tap **(Delete groups)**. The groups that you have created and can be deleted are displayed.
- 4. Tap Select all or the name of each group to delete.
- Tap (Delete) to delete the groups. Choose from Group only or Group and group members.

Adding Group Members

To add a contact to a group, just Edit a contact's Group field. For more information, refer to *"Updating Contacts"* on page 45.

To add multiple contacts to a group:

- **2.** Tap the **Groups** tab and then tap the group to which you want to add members.
- **3.** Tap **(Add member)**. The contacts that can be added display.
- 4. Tap Select all or the name of each contact to add.
- 5. Tap \checkmark (Done) to add the contacts to the group.

Removing Group Members

To remove contacts from a group:

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare (Apps) \rightarrow \bigcirc (Contacts).

- 3. Tap (Menu) and then tap Remove member.
- 4. Tap Select all or the name of each contact to remove.
- 5. Tap \checkmark (Done) to remove the contacts.

Favorites

Mark contact records with a \bigstar gold star to identify them as favorites.

Adding Favorites

To add a contact to your Favorites list:

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow \bigcirc (Contacts).
- 2. Tap a contact to display it.
- Tap the ☆ (Star) next to the contact name so that it turns gold ★.

Tip: You do not have to edit the contact to change its Starred status.

Accessing Favorites

You can view your favorites two ways for fast viewing or messaging.

To view your Favorites list:

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow [2] (Contacts).
- 2. Tap the Favorites tab above the Contacts List.

Only your starred contacts display.

Note: Tap Groups above the Contacts List and then tap Starred in Android to list your Favorites that are being saved on your Google account.

Removing Favorites

To remove one or more contacts from your Favorites list:

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow \square (Contacts).
- 2. Tap the Favorites tab above the Contacts List.
- 3. Tap (Menu) and then tap Remove from Favorites.
- 4. Tap Select all or the name of each contact to remove.
- 5. Tap 🗸 (Done) to remove the contacts.

To remove a contact from your favorites list:

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow \bigcirc (Contacts).
- 2. Tap a contact to display it.
- 3. Tap the \bigstar (Star) next to the contact's name so that it is no longer gold $\frac{1}{\sqrt{2}}$.

Section 4: Messaging

This section describes how to send and receive messages and other features associated with messaging.

Types of Messages

Your tablet supports these types of messages:

- Text (SMS) and multimedia (MMS) messages
- Email and Gmail messages
- Google+
- Hangouts

Message Icons on the Status Bar

Message icons are displayed on the Status Bar at the top of the display when new messages are received. For more information, refer to *"Status Bar"* on page 26.

Creating and Sending Messages

- 1. From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare (Apps) → \square (Messages) → \square (Compose).
- 2. Tap the Enter recipient field to manually enter a recipient.

– or –

- Tap 🛃 to select from one of the following:
- Groups: Select a recipient from the Group list.
- Favorites: Select a recipient from the Favorites list.
- **Contacts**: Select a recipient from your Contacts list (valid entries must have a wireless phone number or email address).
- If adding a recipient from either Contacts, or Group, tap the contact to place a check mark then tap Done. The contact displays in the recipient field.

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- Note: Delete any unnecessary members by tapping their name/number in the recipient area and selecting **Remove**.
 - Add more recipients by tapping either the Enter recipient field or and selecting recipients.
 - 5. Tap the Enter message field and enter a message.
 - 6. Review your message and tap 🔀 (Send).
 - If you have more than one recipient, the same text message is sent to all recipients in the Enter Recipients field.

Note: If you exit a message before you send it, it will be automatically saved as a draft.

Message Options

Options Before Composing a Message

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare (Apps) $\rightarrow \bigtriangledown$ (Messages).
- Before composing a message, tap i (Menu) from the main Messages screen to display additional messaging options:
 - Text templates: Create and manage text strings that you can add to messages. For more information, refer to "Text Templates" on page 63.
 - Delete threads: Delete a message thread. Select the messages to delete, and then tap Delete.
 - Draft messages: Display the draft messages folder.
 - Locked messages: Display the locked messages folder.
 - Scheduled messages: Display the scheduled messages folder.
 - Spam messages: Display the spam messages folder.
 - Settings: Access message settings. For more information, refer to "Messages Settings" on page 58.

- **3.** From the main Messages screen, touch and hold a message, and then select an option:
 - Add to contacts: Add the sender to either a new or existing Contacts entry.
 - View contact: View the current entry information for the sender.
 - Delete thread: Delete the entire message. For more information, refer to "Deleting Messages" on page 57.
 - Add to spam numbers: Tag a number as spam so that these messages can be directly delivered to your spam folder.

Options While Composing a Message

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (**Apps**) \rightarrow \implies (**Messages**).
- 2. From within an open message, tap (Menu) to display additional messaging options:
 - **Insert smiley**: Add insert smiley icons images (emoticons).
 - **Preview** (only in MMS): allows you to add preview the MMS message prior to delivery.
 - Add text: Add text items from sources such as Memo, Calendar, Location, Contacts, and Text templates.
 - Add to contacts: Add the sender to either a new or existing Contacts entry.
 - View contact: Display the current Contact's details.

- Add slide: Convert an SMS message into an MMS (multimedia) message and which allows you to attach an existing slideshow.
- Remove slide: Remove a previously attached slideshow.
- Add subject: Enter a subject.
- Add recipients: Enter additional recipients to the message.
- Duration (5 sec) (only in MMS): Change the duration of the image slideshow.
- Layout (bottom) (only in MMS): Change the layout.
- Scheduling: Schedule a time for the message to be delivered.
- Add to spam numbers: Tag a number as spam so that these messages can be directly delivered to your spam folder.
- Discard: Close and discard the message.
- **Translate**: Use S Translate to translate the message.

Adding Attachments to a Message

To add an attachment to your message, tap \bigotimes (Attach) and select one of the following options:

- Image: Add an image from the Gallery.
- Take picture: Temporarily exit the message, take a photo with phone's camera, and then add it to your message.
- Video: Add a video from the Gallery.
- Record video: Temporarily exit the message, record a video clip using the phone's camera, and then add it to your message.
- Audio: Add an audio file.
- Memo: Add a Memo.
- Calendar: Add an event or task from your calendar.
- Location: Add a thumbnail of a map showing your location.
- Contacts: Add a Contact as a namecard (.vcf) file.

Adding Additional Text

You can copy text such as names, phone numbers, and events from your Contacts, Calendar, or a Memo.

- 1. While composing a message, tap (Menu) and then tap Add text.
- 2. Select one of the following:
 - Memo: Insert text from an existing Memo.
 - **Calendar**: Add the name, date, and time of a calendar event or task to your message.
 - Location: Add an address and the link to the location using Google Maps.
 - Contacts: Add the name, phone number, and email address of any of your contacts.
 - Text templates: Add pre-defined phrases and sentences. For more information, refer to "Text Templates" on page 63.

Viewing Newly Received Messages

When you receive a message, your phone notifies you by displaying k within the Notifications area at the top left of your Home screen.

To read a message:

 Open the Notification Panel and tap the message. For more information, refer to "Notifications" on page 22. – or –

From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare (Apps) $\rightarrow \bigtriangledown$ (Messages), and then tap the new message to view its contents.

- **2.** Tap \bigcirc to play a multimedia message.
 - To pause playback of the multimedia message, tap II.
- 3. Swipe up or down the page to scroll through the message (if additional pages were added).

Message Threads

Sent and received messages are grouped into message threads. Threaded messages allow you to see all the messages exchanged (similar to a chat program).



To reply to a text message:

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare (**Apps**) $\rightarrow \blacksquare$ (**Messages**).
- 2. While the message is open, tap the **Enter message** field and then type your reply message.
 - Your texts colored blue and the recipient's replies are yellow.
- **3.** Tap **(Send)** to deliver your reply. - or -

Tap (Menu), and then select one of the available message options (page 52).

To access message thread options:

- From the main Messages screen, touch and hold the message to display the following options:
 - View contact: Display the Contact's details.
 - Add to contact: Add the phone number to your Contacts list.
 - Delete thread: Delete the message thread.
 - Add to spam numbers: Add the current sender to a spam list. New texts from this sender are automatically blocked.

To access additional Bubble options:

- Touch and hold the message bubble within an active message conversation to display the following options:
 - **Delete**: Delete the currently selected message bubble from the thread.
 - **Copy text:** Copy the currently selected message bubble from the thread.
 - Lock/Unlock: Lock or unlock the currently selected message bubble from being accidentally deleted.
 - Forward: Forward the currently selected message bubble to an external recipient.
 - Share: Share the selected message bubble with others.
 - **Copy to SIM**: Copy the currently selected message bubble as a single text message within the SIM card.
 - View message details: Display details for the currently selected message bubble.
 - Lock/Unlock: Translate the selected message bubble using S Translator.

Deleting Messages

To delete a single message thread:

- 1. From the Messages screen, touch and hold a message from the Messages list, then select **Delete**.
- 2. At the prompt, tap **OK** to delete or **Cancel** to exit.

To delete multiple message threads:

- 1. From the Messages screen, tap (Menu) and then tap Delete threads.
- 2. Tap each message thread you want to delete. A check mark displays beside each selected message.
- 3. Tap Delete.
- 4. At the prompt, tap **OK** to delete or **Cancel** to end the process.

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To delete a single message bubble:

- 1. From the Messages screen, open a message to reveal the message string.
- 2. Touch and hold a message bubble, then select Delete.
- 3. At the prompt, tap **OK** to delete or **Cancel** to exit.

To delete multiple message bubbles:

- 1. From the Messages screen, open a message to reveal the message string.
- 2. Tap (Delete), and then select each message bubble you want to delete. A check mark displays beside each selected message.
- 3. Tap Delete.

Message Search

You can search through your messages by using the Message Search feature.

- **1.** From the Messages screen, tap \mathbf{Q} (Search).
- Use the on-screen keyboard to enter a word or phrase to search for, and then tap Q on the keyboard.
- **3.** All messages that contain the entered search string display.

Messages Settings

To configure the settings for text messages, multimedia messages, and Push messages.

From the Messages screen, tap (Menu) and then tap Settings.

The following Messages settings are available:

General Settings

- Delete old messages: Delete old messages when the limit is reached, rather than overwriting them.
- Text message limit: Set a limit on how many text messages are allowed in one conversation.
- Multimedia message limit: Set a limit on how many multimedia messages are allowed in one conversation.

Display

- **Bubble style**: Choose from several bubble styles for your messages. Bubbles are the rounded boxes that surround each message.
- Background style: Choose from several background styles for your messages.

Signature Settings

- Add signature: Create a signature at the end of your outgoing text messages.
- Signature text: Enter a desired signature for your message.

Text Message (SMS) Settings

- Delivery reports: Set the the network to inform you whether or not your message was delivered.
- Manage SIM card messages: Manage the messages stored on the SIM card.
- Message center: Enter the number of your message center where your messages reside while the system is attempting to deliver them.
- **Input mode**: Set the input mode for your text messages. Choose from: GSM Alphabet, Unicode, or Automatic.

Multimedia Message (MMS) Settings

- Group messaging: Send a single message to multiple recipients.
- Delivery reports: Set the network to inform you whether or not your message was delivered.
- **Read reports**: Your device receives a request for a read reply along with your message to the recipient.
- Auto retrieve: Set the message system to automatically retrieve messages.
- Roaming auto retrieve: Set the message system to automatically retrieve while roaming.
- **Creation mode**: Select the creation mode: Free, Restricted, or Warning.
 - Restricted: Only create and submit messages with content belonging to the Core MM Content Domain.
 - Warning: Be warned via pop up messages that you are creating a multimedia message which does not fit the Core MM Content Domain.
 - Free: Allow the addition of any content to the message.
- MMS alert: Be warned when the messaging modes changes from an SMS (text) to MMS (multimedia) mode.

Push Message Settings

- Push messages: Receive push messages from the network.
- **Service loading**: Set the type of service loading notification: Always, Prompt, or Never.

Notification Settings

- Notifications: See message notifications on the Status Bar.
- Select ringtone: Set the ringtone for your message notifications.
- Message alert repetition: Set the interval for new message alerts. Choose from: Once, Every 2 minutes, or Every 10 minutes.
- **Preview message**: View a brief preview of new message text on the Status Bar.

Spam Message Settings

- Spam settings: Configure available spam settings such as:
 - Add to spam numbers: Manually enter and assign a phone number as being sent from a spam source.
 - Add to spam phrases: Assign a specific text phrase as belonging to a spam message. Ex: Dear friend.
 - Block unknown senders: Automatically blocks incoming messages from unknown sources or blocked numbers.

Emergency Alert Configuration

This device is designed to receive wireless emergency alerts from the Commercial Mobile Alerting System (CMAS); which may also be known as the Personal Localized Alerting Network (PLAN). If your wireless provider has chosen to participate in CMAS/PLAN, alerts are available while in the provider's coverage area. If you travel outside your provider's coverage area, wireless emergency alerts may not be available. For more information, please contact your wireless provider.

Emergency Alerts allows customers to receive geographically-targeted messages. Alert messages are provided by the US Department of Homeland Security and will alert customers of imminent threats to their safety within their area. There is no charge for receiving an Emergency Alert message.

There are three types of Emergency Alerts:

- · Alerts issued by the President
- Alerts involving imminent threats to safety of life
- AMBER Alerts (missing child alert)

Customers may choose not to receive $\ensuremath{\mathsf{Extreme}}$ Alerts, Severe Alerts, and AMBER Alerts.

Important! Alerts issued by the President can not be disabled.

Assigning Messages as Spam

You can now assign either a phone number as spam or use a key term or phrase. Any message assigned as spam is automatically placed with your Spam messages folder.

To assign a phone number from Messages list as spam:

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare Apps $\rightarrow \bigtriangledown$ (Messages).
- 2. Touch a message from a phone number.
- Tap (Menu), tap Add to spam numbers, and then tap OK.

To assign a phone number manually as spam:

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare **Apps** \rightarrow **(Messages)**.
- 2. Tap (Menu) and then tap Settings.
- 3. Tap the Spam message settings tab and then tap Spam settings.

When enabled, you can configure the available spam settings: Add to spam numbers, Add to spam phrases, and Block unknown senders.

4. Tap Add to spam numbers \rightarrow + (Add).

This function allows you to manually enter and assign a phone number as being sent from a spam source.

5. Tap the **Number** field to manually enter a phone number.

– or –

Tap 🛃 to select from either your existing Logs or Contacts.

- Tap Match criteria and select a parameter that must match for the spam action to take effect. Choose from: Exactly the same as, Starts with (for example, 800 or 888), Ends with, or Includes.
- 7. Tap Save.

To register text phrases as spam:

Some incoming messages might not be associated with a phone number but rather an email address. In these cases, the only way to block those messages, would be assign a key used term or phrase to activate the Spam block. Ex: "Dear friend", "Stock Alert", or "Act Now".

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap **EVALUATE:** Apps $\rightarrow = (Messages)$.
- 2. Tap (Menu) and then tap Settings.
- 3. Tap the Spam message settings tab and then tap Spam settings, if not enabled.
- 4. Tap Add to spam phrases \rightarrow + (Add).

This function allows you to assign a specific text phrase as belonging to a spam message. For example, Dear friend.

- 5. Enter a term or word into the field.
- 6. Tap Save.

To register unknown numbers as spam:

Some incoming messages might not be associated with either a phone number or email address. These incoming messages contain no information as their info is blocked by the sender.

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap **EVALUATE:** Apps $\rightarrow \bigtriangledown$ (Messages).
- 2. Tap (Menu) and then tap Settings.
- 3. Tap the Spam message settings tab and then tap Spam settings, if not enabled.
- 4. Tap Block unknown senders. A green check mark indicates the feature is active.

When active, incoming messages from unknown sources or blocked numbers are automatically blocked.

Note: If an incoming message is designated as coming from an unknown sender, it is automatically assigned as spam and is now located in your Spam folder.

Accessing your Spam Folder

Any message assigned as spam is automatically placed with your Spam messages folder.

 From the Messages screen, tap (Menu) and then tap Spam messages.

Text Templates

This screen displays your available text message reply templates. This is a readily accessible list of both default and user-defined text snippets that can be used to quickly reply to incoming messages.

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap **EXE** Apps \rightarrow **(Messages)**.
- From the Messages list, tap (Menu) and then tap Text templates.
- **3.** Tap a message to immediately insert it into your current message conversation.

To create your own text template:

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare Apps $\rightarrow \bigtriangledown$ (Messages).
- 2. Tap (Menu) and then tap Text templates.
- 3. Tap 🕂 (Create).
- 4. Enter a new text string and tap Save.

Email

Use Email to view and manage all your email accounts in one application.

To access Email:

From a Home screen, tap \implies Apps \rightarrow \bigcirc (Email).

Configuring Email Accounts

You can configure Email for most accounts in just a few steps.

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare Apps \rightarrow o (Email).
- 2. The first time you set up an email account, at the Set up email screen, enter an Email address and Password, then tap Next.

– or –

For additional accounts, tap \blacksquare (Menu) and then tap Settings \rightarrow Add account.

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- **3.** Follow the on-screen instructions to set up your email account.
- Tap Next to go to the next screen or tap Previous to go to the Apps screen.
- Note: For Exchange ActiveSync accounts, the Activate device administrator? screen may appear. Read the information and tap Activate to continue.
 - 5. Enter an account name and Your name, if required.
 - 6. Tap Done.

The device communicates with the appropriate server to set up your account and synchronize your email. When complete, your email appears in the Inbox for the account.

Note: To configure email account settings at any time, tap (Menu) and then tap Settings. Tap the account to display Account settings.

Managing Your Email Accounts

You can view email you receive for all accounts in the **Combined view** screen or you can view email accounts individually.

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare Apps $\rightarrow \bigcirc$ (Email).
- 2. Tap the drop-down menu at the top left of the screen to select:
 - Combined view: View all email in a combined inbox.
 - < Account Name>: View email for the account.

Refreshing Your Email Account

Refresh your account to update your device from the Email servers.

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare Apps $\rightarrow \bigcirc$ (Email).
- 2. Tap 💽 (Refresh) in the Application Bar.

Deleting Email Accounts

To delete an Email account:

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare Apps $\rightarrow \boxed{0}$ (Email).
- Tap (Menu) and then tap Settings → Delete account.

Email Settings

Use the Email Settings to configure your Email preferences.

Note: Available settings depend on the email provider.

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies Apps \rightarrow **or** (Email).
- Tap (Menu) and then tap Settings → General settings.

The following options display:

• **Display**: Configure the way in which your email list is displayed. Options include: Auto fit content, Message preview line, and Title line list.

- Composing and sending: Configure the functions available during both creating and sending emails. Options include: Quick responses, Default image size, Delay email sending.
- Auto advance: Assign an action after an email is deleted. Choose from: Next email, Previous email, or Email list.
- **Confirm deletions**: Requires that you provide confirmation before deleting a selected email.
- Priority senders: Assign Contacts as priority senders, configure a priority sender inbox, assign email notifications, and ringtones for email from these senders.
- Spam addresses: Create a list of spam email addresses.
- Rules for filtering: Create and manage filters for emails. Filter parameters include: Filter name, Subject includes, or From.
- **3.** Tap an account to configure specific settings. Available options depend on the account.

Composing and Sending Email

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare Apps \rightarrow **(Email)**.
- 2. If you have multiple accounts set up, choose an account from the menu at the top of the screen.
- **3.** Tap **Compose**), then tap fields to enter recipients and the email text.
- 4. While composing a message:
 - Tap displayed buttons to set Scheduling options and Priority.
 - Tap \mathcal{O} (Attach) to add a file to the message.
 - Tap (Menu) to set Tracking options and Security options.

Available options depend on the type of email account.

- Tap the body of the email to enter the text of your email. Tap the text option buttons to edit and format your message text.

Tap 📙 (Save) to save the email to the Drafts folder.

Gmail

Send and receive email with Gmail, Google's web-based email.

To access Gmail:

From a Home screen, tap IIIII (Apps) →
 (Google folder) → IIII (Gmail).

Setting Up Your Gmail Account

If you did not set up a Google account during the initial configuration, the first time you launch Gmail, your device prompts you to set up your Google account.

1. From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) → \bigotimes (Google folder) → \bigotimes (Gmail).

The Add a Google Account screen displays.

 Follow the prompts to sign in or create a new account. The device communicates with the Google server to set up your account and synchronize your email. When complete, your Gmail displays in the Inbox.

Note: You can use more than one Google account on your device. To add another account, tap $\boxed{}$ (Menu) and then tap Settings \rightarrow ADD ACCOUNT.

Refreshing Your Gmail Account

Refresh your account to update your device from the Gmail servers.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow \bigotimes (Google folder) \rightarrow \bigotimes (Gmail).
- 2. Tap (Menu) and then tap Refresh.

Gmail Settings

Use the Gmail Settings to configure your Gmail preferences.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow $(Google folder) \rightarrow \bigcirc$ (Gmail).
- 2. Tap (Menu), tap Settings, and follow the on-screen instructions.

Tip: Tap [(Menu) and then tap Help for more information.

Composing and Sending Gmail

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow (Google folder) \rightarrow $\stackrel{\frown}{\longrightarrow}$ (Gmail).
- Tap Compose, then tap fields to compose the message. While composing a message, tap
 (Menu) for options.
- 3. Tap SEND to send this message.

– or –

Tap (Menu) and then tap **Save draft** to save a draft of this message.


Section 5: Multimedia

This section describes the various multimedia applications available on your tablet, such as the Camera and Camcorder, Gallery, Video Player, and Music Player.

Camera

Use your device's built-in camera and camcorder to take photos and record videos.

Settings shortcuts



Taking Photos

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap $\underbrace{\texttt{IEE}}_{\texttt{IEE}}$ (Apps) \rightarrow $\underbrace{\texttt{IEE}}_{\texttt{IEE}}$ (Camera).
- 2. Slide the (Mode) button to (Camera mode).
- To configure settings, see "Camera Settings" on page 69.
- **4.** Using the display as a viewfinder, compose your photo by aiming the lens at the subject.
- 5. To take the photo, tap
- 6. Tap the **Gallery** icon to view your photos with the Gallery application. For more information, refer to *"Gallery"* on page 73.

Camera Settings

Before you start taking photos, use the camera settings to configure the camera for best results. Camera settings are represented by icons on the left side of the screen.

Editing Camera Settings Shortcuts

The first five icons are shortcuts to camera settings:

🔊 (Self-portrait), 🥅 (Shooting mode), 🟠 (Timer),

K (Effects), and K (Brightness). These five shortcuts can be customized to fit your preference.

To customize these shortcuts:

1. Tap $(Settings) \rightarrow Edit shortcuts.$ - or -

Touch and hold any of the shortcut icons to edit them.

2. Touch and hold a setting, then drag and drop it on one of the five settings shortcuts to the left. The replaced setting shortcut displays in the edit list.

Configuring Camera Settings

- While in Camera mode, tap a settings shortcut or tap
 (Settings) to configure the following settings:
 - Edit shortcuts: Customize your settings shortcuts. For more information, refer to "Editing Camera Settings Shortcuts" on page 69.
 - GPS tag: Tap to switch the GPS tag on or off.
 - **Self-portrait**: Tap to switch to the front-facing camera lens and take a photo of yourself.
 - Shooting mode: Choose an automatic shooting mode. Options are: Single shot, Panorama, Share shot, Buddy photo share, and Smile shot.
 - Effects: Apply an effect to photos.
 - Scene mode: Choose a mode to match the kind of pictures you want to take.
 - Brightness: Use the slider to set the brightness value.
 - **Timer**: Set a delay time to wait between tapping the Camera button and taking a photo.
 - **Resolution**: Choose a size for the photo.
 - White balance: Set the light source.
 - Metering: Select a method for measuring light.
 - Multimedia 69

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
- **Guidelines**: Display an on-screen grid to aid in photo composition.
- Shutter sound: Emit a sound when the camera takes a photo.
- **Contextual filename**: Set filenames to include GPS information. GPS tag must be enabled to use contextual filenames.
- Voice control: Access voice control settings for using voice commands to take pictures and record video. For more information, refer to "Voice Control" on page 162.
- Storage: Set whether to store your photos on your device or on your memory card, if one is installed.
- Reset: Set all Camera settings to the defaults.

Camcorder

Use your tablet's camcorder to record high-definition video in 1080p resolution.

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow (Camera).
- Slide the (Mode) button to (Camcorder mode). The Camcorder screen displays.

Settings shortcuts



Recording Videos

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow (Camera).
- 2. Slide the (Mode) button to (Camcorder mode).
- **3.** To configure settings, see *"Camcorder Settings"* on page 71.
- **4.** Using the display as a viewfinder, compose your shot by aiming the lens at the subject.
- To start recording, tap (Record). During recording,
 (Recording Indicator) flashes.
- 6. To pause recording, tap 🔳 (Pause).
- 7. To stop recording, tap 🔳 (Stop).
- 8. Tap the **Gallery** icon to view your photos with the Gallery application. For more information, refer to *"Gallery"* on page 73.

Important! Do not take videos of people without their permission. Do not take videos in places where cameras are not allowed. Do not take videos in places where you may interfere with another person's privacy.

Camcorder Settings

Before you start taking videos, use the camcorder settings to configure the camcorder for best results. Camcorder settings are represented by icons on the left side of the screen.

Editing Camcorder Settings Shortcuts

The first five icons are shortcuts to camcorder settings:

- 💉 (Self-recording), 🏊 (Recording mode), 🎧 (Timer),
- X (Effects), and V (Brightness). These five shortcuts can be customized to fit your preference.

To customize these shortcuts, see *"Editing Camera Settings Shortcuts"* on page 69.

Configuring Camcorder Settings

- While in Camcorder mode, tap a settings shortcut or tap : (Settings) to configure the following Camcorder settings:
 - Edit shortcuts: Customize your settings shortcuts. For more information, refer to "Editing Camera Settings Shortcuts" on page 69.
 - GPS tag: Tap to switch the GPS tag on or off.
 - Self-recording: Switch to the front-facing camera lens and record a video of yourself.
 - Recording mode: Set a recording mode. Options are: Normal and Limit for email, which limits the size of the video to 50 megabytes.
 - Effects: Apply an effect to videos.
 - Brightness: Use the slider to set the brightness value.

- **Timer**: Set a delay to wait between tapping Record and begin recording.
- Resolution: Set a size for the video.
- White balance: Set the light source.
- **Guidelines**: Display an on-screen grid to aid in video composition.
- Contextual filename: Set filenames to include GPS information. GPS tag must be enabled to use contextual filenames.
- **Storage**: Set whether to store your videos on your device or on your memory card.
- Reset: Set all Camera settings to the defaults.

Gallery

Use Gallery to view, capture, and manage photos and videos.

Note: Photos and videos are stored on the device in the /storage/emulated/0/DCIM/Camera folder. Photos are stored as jpg files and videos are stored as mp4 files. For more information, refer to "*My Files*" on page 118.

To access Gallery:

■ From a Home screen, tap IIII (Apps) → [IIII (Gallery).

Selecting Photos and Videos to View

- From a Home screen, tap IIII (Apps) → [IIII (Gallery). All albums display.
- Choose items to display by making selections from the menus in the Application Bar: Albums, All, Time, Locations, People, Favorites, or Spiral.
- **3.** Tap **(Camera**) to launch the Camera app.

- 4. Tap (Menu) to display the following options:
 - Select item: Tap one or more items to share, stream to another device, or delete.
 - Slideshow: View a slideshow of pictures and videos.
 - Sort by oldest/latest: View items sorted by date.
 - Content to display: Select content to display.
 - Scan for nearby devices: Discover and connect directly to nearby devices.
 - Show/Hide nearby devices: Show nearby devices as Albums.
 - Settings: Set your account sync settings and limit syncing to only when your tablet is connected to a Wi-Fi network.
 - Help: Display help on using Gallery.

Viewing Groups of Photos and Videos

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow \implies (Gallery).
- 2. Tap a category and then a group to view it.
- 3. Tap 💽 (Camera) to launch the Camera app.
- 4. Tap 🔚 Add Album to create a new Album.
- 5. Tap (Menu) for these options:
 - Select item: Tap one or more items that you want to share, delete, or use for a slideshow.
 - Slideshow: View a slideshow of pictures and videos.
 - Hide items: Allows you to hide one or more items.
 - Settings: Modify the settings for syncing photos and videos with your accounts, and settings for Tag buddy and Face tag.

Viewing Photos and Videos

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow \implies (Gallery).
- **2.** Tap a category and group to view it, and then tap a photo or video thumbnail.
- 3. Tap the screen to show or hide Gallery options.
- Tap the screen with two fingers or double-tap on the screen to zoom all the way in or out. For more information, refer to "Pinch and Spread" on page 21.
- Sweep across the screen to display the next or previous photo or video. (Videos are indicated by the (Play) button.) The current photo or video is outlined in the thumbnails at the bottom of the screen. Tap a thumbnail to view the photo or video it represents.
- 6. Tap (Change player) to select a DLNA-enabled device.
- Tap < (Share) to share the photo or video. Tap an option, such as Email, and follow the on-screen instructions.

- To delete the photo or video being displayed, tap
 (Delete).
- 9. To launch the Camera app, tap 🗿 (Camera).
- **10.** Tap (Menu) to display the following options for photos and videos (options vary according to item being viewed):
 - Edit: Edit the photo using Photo Editor (available for download from Samsung (Apps)).
 - Favorite: Mark the photo or video as a favorite.
 - Slideshow: View a slideshow of your photos and videos.
 - Photo frame: Add a decorative frame to the photo.
 - Photo note: Write a note on the 'back' of the photo.
 - Copy to clipboard: Copy the photo to the clipboard.
 - Print: Print the photo to a Samsung printer.
 - Rename: Enter a new file name.
 - **Buddy photo share**: Detect the face in this picture and email that person.
 - Rotate left: Allows you to rotate the photo counterclockwise 90 degrees.

- Rotate right: Allows you to rotate the photo clockwise 90 degrees.
- **Crop**: Allows you to crop the image. Tap and drag the crop box or the sides or corners of the crop box to create the crop area, then tap **Done**.
- Set as: Assign the photo as a Contact photo, or as the Home screen and/or Lock screen wallpaper.
- **Details**: Display details about the photo, such as title, time taken, size, etc.
- Settings:
 - Accounts: Manage your account information.
 - SNS data management: Enable Sync only via Wi-Fi to only sync photos and videos when connected to a Wi-Fi network.
 - Tags: Enable Tag buddy and Face tag. Tag buddy identifies each photo with information such as the weather, location, people in the photo, or date created. Face tag scans each photo to detect people's faces, which you can then tag with their name.

Setting a Picture As

You can use the photos you take as a contact's photo or as wallpaper for the Home or Lock screen:

- Tap a category and then a group to view it, and then tap a photo to select it.
- 3. Tap (Menu) and then tap Set as.
- Tap Contact photo and then tap a contact entry.
 or –

Tap Home screen, Lock screen, or Home and lock screens.

 A crop photo screen displays. Tap and drag the crop box or the sides or corners of the crop box to create the crop area, then tap **Done** to save the cropped photo as the contact's icon or wallpaper.

Playing Videos

- **2.** Tap an album or category to display thumbnails, and then tap a video thumbnail to play the video.

Note: Videos are marked with a 💽 (Play) button.

3. The following video controls are available:



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- Pause the video.
- Start the video after being paused.
- Slide the dot along the progress bar to fast forward or rewind the video.
- Touch and hold to rewind the video. Tap to go to previous video.
- Touch and hold to fast-forward the video. Tap to go to next video.
 - Select a DLNA-enabled device.

Volume control.

Adjust the sound quality using SoundAlive.

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- Full-screen in ratio view. The video is enlarged as much as possible without becoming distorted.
- Full-screen view. The entire screen is used, which may cause some minor distortion.
 - Original size view. The video will be played in its original size.
 - Play a video as a small pop-up while viewing another screen. Touch and drag the pop-up video to the desired location on the screen. Double-tap the pop-up to return to full screen mode.

Note: The screen view icons are a four-way toggle. The icon that is displayed, is the mode that will display after the icon is tapped.

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Sharing Photos and Videos

Share photos and videos with your friends.

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow \implies (Gallery).
- 2. Tap an album or category to display thumbnails.
- 3. Tap (Menu) and then tap Select item.
- **4.** Tap one or more photos and videos to highlight them for sharing.
- 5. Tap < (Share via).
- **6.** Tap an option, such as Email, and follow the on-screen instructions.

Section 6: Connections

This section describes the various connections your device can make, including accessing the Internet with your Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, and Connecting to your PC.

Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi is a wireless networking technology that provides access to local area networks. Use your device's Wi-Fi feature to:

- Access the Internet for browsing or to send and receive email.
- Access your corporate network.
- Use hotspots provided by hotels or airports while traveling.

Wi-Fi communication requires access to an existing Wireless Access Point (WAP). WAPs can be Open (unsecured, as with most hotspots) or Secured (requiring you to provide login credentials). Your device supports the 802.11 b/g/n Wi-Fi protocol.

Finding Wi-Fi Networks

You can have your device automatically notify you of available networks. For more information, refer to *"Configuring Wi-Fi Settings"* on page 80.

Turning Wi-Fi On or Off

When you turn Wi-Fi service on, your device automatically searches for available WAPs (Wireless Access Points).

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow (Settings).
- Under Wireless and networks, tap OFF to turn Wi-Fi ON, and then tap ((Wi-Fi)). − or −
- 1. Swipe the top of the screen downward to display the Notification Panel.
- Tap the SWI-FI Quick Setting button to turn Wi-Fi ON/OFF. (When enabled, the Wi-Fi icon is highlighted green.)

Scanning and Connecting to a Wi-Fi Network

When you turn on Wi-Fi, your device searches for available Wi-Fi connections, then displays them on screen.

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare (Apps) \rightarrow (Settings).
- 2. Under *Wireless and networks*, tap **off** to turn Wi-Fi **ON**, and then tap **(Wi-Fi)**.
- Your device automatically scans for available Wireless Access Points. When the scan is complete, tap a Wi-Fi network to connect.
- If the Wi-Fi network is open, your device automatically connects. If the Wi-Fi network is secured, enter the password at the prompt to connect.

Adding a Wi-Fi Network Manually

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow (Settings).
- 2. Under *Wireless and networks*, tap **OFF** to turn Wi-Fi **ON**, and then tap (**WI-Fi**).
- 3. Tap Add Wi-Fi network, then enter network information:
 - Network SSID: Enter the name of the Wi-Fi Wireless Access Point (WAP).
 - Security: Select the type of security used by the WAP.
- Note: Depending on the Security protocol used by the WAP, additional network information may be required, such as a Password.
 - **Password**: If the WAP is secured, enter the password or hex key.
 - · Show advanced options:
 - Proxy settings: If required, select the appropriate proxy setting.

- **IP settings**: If required, select the appropriate IP setting.
- 4. Tap Connect.

Configuring Wi-Fi Settings

Set up and configure advanced Wi-Fi settings.

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow (Settings).
- 2. Under *Wireless and networks*, tap OFF to turn Wi-Fi ON, and then tap <a> (Wi-Fi).
- 3. Tap (Menu) for options:
 - Advanced:
 - Network notification: Have your device alert you to new Wireless Access Points (WAPs).
 - Keep Wi-Fi on during sleep: Specify when to disconnect from Wi-Fi. Option are Always, Only when plugged in, or Never.
 - Auto network switch: Automatically switch between Wi-Fi networks and mobile networks.
 - MAC address: View your device's MAC address, required when connecting to some secured networks (not configurable).
 - IP address: View your device's IP address (not configurable).
 - WPS push button: Set up a connection to a WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup) router or other equipment.
 - WPN PIN entry: View the PIN used by your device to set up a PIN-secured connection to a Wi-Fi router or other equipment.
 - Help: Display information about Wi-Fi.

Wi-Fi Direct

Wi-Fi Direct allows device-to-device connections, allowing you to transfer large amounts of data over a Wi-Fi connection.

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow (Settings).
- 2. Under *Wireless and networks*, tap OFF _____ to turn Wi-Fi ON, and then tap <a>(Wi-Fi).
- 3. Tap Wi-Fi Direct. Your device begins to search for other devices enabled with Wi-Fi Direct.
 - Tap Multi connect to connect with more than one device (each device must support Multi connect).
 - To initiate a new scan, tap **Scan**.
- 4. Enable Wi-Fi Direct on the target device.
- 5. Once the target device is displayed under *Available devices*, tap it.

An Invitation to connect displays on the target device.

- 6. On the target device, tap **Accept** within 30 seconds.
 - Once connected, the target device will be listed under *Connected devices*, and the status Bar.

Sharing Information with a Connected Device

To share videos, photos, or other information with a connected device, follow these steps:

1. View the information that you want to share, and then tap the Share, Share via, or Send via option.

For example, if you want to share a photo, view the photo in Gallery and tap \triangleleft (Share via).

- 2. Tap the Wi-Fi Direct option.
- 3. Tap the target device.
- If the target device is already connected, tap Done.
 or –

If the target devices is not currently connected, an invitation to connect displays on the target device. Tap **Accept** within 30 seconds on the target device.

5. The target device displays a pop-up that indicates it is receiving the file.

Note: Files you received via Wi-Fi Direct can be found in

(My Files) under Device storage/emulated/0/ ShareViaWifi.

Depending on the target device model, the prompts and shared folder information may differ.

End Wi-Fi Direct Connections

To save battery power, be sure to disconnect Wi-Fi Direct when it is not in use.

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow (Settings).
- 2. Under Wireless and networks, tap 🛜 (Wi-Fi).
- Tap Wi-Fi Direct → End connection. All Wi-Fi Direct connections (included all devices using Multi connect) will be terminated.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology for exchanging information over a distance of about 30 feet.

You do not need to line up the devices to send information with Bluetooth. If the devices are in range, you can exchange information between them, even if they are in different rooms.

Turning Bluetooth On or Off

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare (Apps) \rightarrow (Settings).
- Under Wireless and networks, tap OFF to turn Bluetooth ON, or tap ON to turn Bluetooth OFF.
 or –
- 1. Swipe the top of the screen downward to display the Notification Panel.
- Tap the * Bluetooth Quick Setting button to turn Bluetooth ON/OFF. (When enabled, the Bluetooth icon is highlighted green.)

Note: When Bluetooth is on, the Bluetooth icon 👔 displays in the Status Bar.

Pairing with a Bluetooth Device

Search for a Bluetooth device and pair with it to exchange information between your device and the target device.

- Tip: After pairing, your device and the target device recognize each other and exchange information without having to enter a passcode or PIN.
 - **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow (Settings).
 - 2. Under *Wireless and networks*, tap **OFF** to turn Bluetooth **ON**, and then tap **(Bluetooth)**.
 - **3.** Enable the target device's discoverable or visible mode.
 - 4. Tap Scan.
 - **5.** From the list of available devices, tap the target device, then follow the prompts to complete the pairing.
 - If the target device requires a PIN, enter a PIN for the target device and tap **OK**. When prompted, enter the PIN on the target device.
 - If the device allows automatic or smart pairing, your device attempts to pair with the device automatically. Follow the prompts on your device and the target device to complete the pairing.

Options for paired devices:

- Tap 🗱 next to the device in the *Paired devices* list.
 - Tap **Rename** to change the named of the paired device.
 - Tap Unpair to unpair from the paired device.

Sharing Data with a Bluetooth Device

To share videos, photos, or other information with a connected device, follow these steps:

1. View the information that you want to share, and then tap the Share, Share via, or Send via option.

For example, if you want to share a photo, view the photo in Gallery and tap \triangleleft (Share via).

- 2. Tap the Bluetooth option.
- Search for and pair with a Bluetooth device. For more information, refer to "Pairing with a Bluetooth Device" on page 82.
- 4. Follow the prompts to send data to the paired device.

Receiving Data from a Bluetooth Device

To receive data from a Bluetooth device:

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow (Settings).
- 2. Under *Wireless and networks*, tap **off** to turn Bluetooth **ON**, and then tap **(Bluetooth)**.

Note: To select the length of time that your device will be visible, tap (Menu) and then tap Visibility timeout.

3. Pair with the Bluetooth device from which you want to receive data. For more information, refer to *"Pairing with a Bluetooth Device"* on page 82.

A Bluetooth authorization request pop-up displays when a Bluetooth device sends data to your device.

- 4. Select Accept to confirm that you are willing to receive the file.
 - The 🛃 icon will flash while receiving the file.
 - When the **U** icon stops flashing, the file has been received.
- **5.** To open the file, swipe the top of the screen downward to display the Notification Panel, and then tap the relevant notification.

Bluetooth Settings

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare (Apps) \rightarrow (Settings).
- 2. Under *Wireless and networks*, tap **OFF** to turn Bluetooth **ON**, and then tap **(Bluetooth)**.
- 3. Tap (Menu) for options:
 - Visibility timeout: Set the amount of time your device is visible or discoverable to other Bluetooth devices.
 - Received files: Display a list of files received via Bluetooth.
 - Help: Display help on using Bluetooth.

Managing Downloads

Files, apps, and other items you download in Browser, Gmail, Email, or in other ways, are stored on your tablet's internal storage. You can use the Downloads app to view, reopen, or delete what you have downloaded.

To manage the demands on their networks or to help you avoid unexpected charges, some mobile networks place restrictions on the size of the files you can download. When you are connected to such networks, and you try to download an oversized-file, you are asked or required to delay downloading the file until the next time you are connected to a Wi-Fi network. At that time, the download resumes automatically. The Downloads app can also be used to view and manage these queued files.

Downloaded files are stored in the Download directory in your tablet's internal storage. You can view and copy files from this directory when connected to a computer with a USB cable.

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare (Apps) \rightarrow
 - 🛃 (Downloads).
- 2. Tap an item to open it.
- **3.** For more information about using the Downloads app, see "*Downloads*" on page 105.

Uninstalling an App

Many apps come pre-installed on your device, and you can download additional apps from Google Play Store. If you decide to, you can uninstall apps you have downloaded from Google Play Store and other sources.

Note: You cannot uninstall the apps that are included with Android. You can only uninstall the apps you have downloaded.

Uninstall apps with Application Manager

- From a Home screen, tap (Apps) → (Settings)
 → Application manager.
- 2. Tap the DOWNLOADED tab.
- 3. Tap the app you want to uninstall.
- 4. Tap the Uninstall button.
- 5. Tap **OK** to confirm you want to uninstall the app.

Tip: To uninstall updates to pre-installed apps, tap the app and tap Uninstall updates. Tap OK to uninstall the updates.

Uninstall apps with Google Play Store

You can use Google Play Store to uninstall apps you have downloaded from there (see "*Play Store*" on page 124).

Uninstall apps from the Apps screen

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap **EEE** (Apps).
- 2. Tap (Menu) and then tap Uninstall to display the Uninstall screen.

– or –

Tap **Downloaded applications**, tap **(Menu**) and then tap **Uninstall**.

- A 🛑 appears on (Apps) that can be uninstalled.
- **3.** Tap an app's icon and then tap **OK** to uninstall and remove the app from your tablet.

Synchronizing with Windows Media Player

Ensure that Windows Media Player is installed on your PC.

- Attach your device to the computer with the USB cable. Your computer recognizes the connection and displays the Auto Play screen.
- 2. Click the option to Sync digital media files to this device to synchronize music files.
- **3.** Select and drag the music files you want to the sync list and begin synchronizing.
- 4. When finished, exit Windows Media Player and disconnect the USB cable.

Connecting as a Mass Storage Device

You can connect your device to a PC as a removable disk and access the file directory. If you insert a memory card in the device, you can also access the files directory from the memory card by using the device as a memory card reader.

- Note: The file directory will show the memory card as a folder name Card, and the tablet's internal memory as a folder named Tablet.
 - 1. Insert a memory card into the device to transfer files from or to the memory card.
 - 2. Attach your device to the computer with the USB cable. Your computer recognizes the connection and displays the Auto Play screen.
 - Click the option to Open device to view files. You should see a Card and a Tablet folder.
 - 4. Copy files from the PC to the memory card (Card folder).
 - 5. When finished, close the PC folder and disconnect the USB cable.

Kies via Wi-Fi

Samsung Kies is a software that enables you to update your device firmware, synchronize files, and transfer data to and from your device directly by connecting to the PC.

To learn more about Samsung Kies and download the Kies software (for both PC and Macintosh), visit: samsung.com/us/support/downloads.

Connecting with Samsung Kies

1. Install Samsung Kies software on your PC.

Warning! Close any running applications before connecting your device to a PC.

- 2. Run Samsung Kies.
- **3.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow (Settings).
- 4. Tap More settings → Kies via Wi-Fi.
- 5. Tap the computer running Samsung Kies to connect.

Note: Refer to the Samsung Kies software's Help for more information.

Memory Card

Your device supports removable microSD or microSDHC memory cards (not included) for storing music, photos, videos, and files.

Installing a Memory Card

For more information about installing and removing a memory card, see *"Memory Card"* on page 8.

Mounting an SD Card

A memory card must be mounted to your device, creating a connection for transferring data.

- **Note:** When an SD card is installed, it is automatically mounted. You will only need to mount an SD card if you have unmounted it but have not removed it from the device.
 - 1. From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare (Apps) → (Settings) → Storage.
 - 2. Tap Mount SD card.

Unmounting an SD Card

- From a Home screen, tap (Apps) → (Settings)
 → Storage.
- 2. Tap Unmount SD card.
- 3. At the prompt, select **OK** to safely unmount the memory card.
- 4. Remove the SD card from the slot.

Important! Unmounting an SD card will stop some applications from functioning. Applications may not be available until you mount the SD card again.

Formatting a Memory Card

Formatting permanently erases all content from the memory card and prepares it for use with your device.

- From a Home screen, tap (Apps) → (Settings)
 → Storage.
- 2. After mounting the SD card, tap Format SD card.
- Follow the prompts to confirm the formatting of the card.

Removing a Memory Card

- Warning! To prevent damage to information stored on the memory card, always unmount the memory card before removing it from the device.
 - From a Home screen, tap IIII (Apps) → (◊) (Settings) → Storage.
 - 2. Under SD card, tap Unmount SD card and then tap OK.
 - **3.** Open the memory card slot cover and turn to expose the slot.
 - **4.** Gently press in on the memory card so that it pops out from the slot, and carefully pull the card out.
 - 5. Replace the memory card slot cover.

USB Tethering

This feature allows you to share your device's mobile data connection via a direct USB connection between your device and a single computer.

Note: You can not mount your device's microSD card to your computer while using the USB tethering feature. If additional software or USB drivers are required, visit: samsung.com/us/support/downloads.

To connect using USB tethering:

- 1. Connect your computer and your device using a USB cable.
- 2. From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow \implies (Mobile HotSpot).
 - or –

From a Home screen, tap $\boxed{}$ (Menu) and then tap Settings \rightarrow More settings \rightarrow Tethering and Mobile HotSpot.

3. Tap USB tethering. The Tethering active icon is displayed on the Status Bar.

To disconnect USB tethering:

1. From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow \implies (Mobile HotSpot).

- or -

From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare (Menu) and then tap Settings \rightarrow More settings \rightarrow Tethering and Mobile HotSpot.

- 2. Tap to uncheck USB tethering and deactivate the feature.
- 3. Remove the USB cable from the device and computer.

Mobile HotSpot

This feature allows you to share your device's mobile data connection, providing wireless Internet connectivity to multiple devices.

Important! The Mobile HotSpot service cannot be active when the device is connected to Wi-Fi. Please disconnect your Wi-Fi connection prior to activating this service.

Note: You must have a tethering plan on your account in order to use the Mobile HotSpot. You cannot use data on the device while using Mobile HotSpot.

To activate the Mobile HotSpot service:

1. From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow \implies (Mobile HotSpot).

- or -

From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare (Menu) and then tap Settings \rightarrow More settings \rightarrow Tethering and Mobile HotSpot.

- 2. Tap OFF to turn Mobile HotSpot ON.
- 3. Read the on-screen notification regarding data use and tap **OK**.
- 4. Edit the Network SSID name and then write it down.
- Enable the Broadcast network name (SSID) field if you would like to broadcast your SSID name to nearby devices.
- 6. Verify the Security field is set to WPA2 PSK.
- 7. Enter a new password then write it down.
- 8. Tap Save to store the new settings.
- **9.** Confirm the Mobile HotSpot active icon **a**ppears at the top of the screen.

Note: By default, the connection is not secured.

Note: Using your Mobile HotSpot drains your device's battery much faster. The best way to keep using the device as a HotSpot is by connecting to a Charger.

To connect to the HotSpot:

- 1. Enable Wi-Fi (wireless) functionality on your target device (laptop, media device, etc.).
- Scan for Wi-Fi networks from the external device and select your device's Mobile HotSpot name from the network list.
 - The SSID name for your device's hotspot is determined by what you entered into the **Network SSID** field.
 - You can change the name by tapping Configure → Network SSID and changing the entry.
- **3.** Select this HotSpot and follow your on-screen instructions to complete the connection.
- **4.** Launch your Web browser to confirm you have an Internet connection.

To change the Portable HotSpot password:

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow $\widehat{\bigcirc}$ (Mobile HotSpot).
- 2. Tap Mobile HotSpot \rightarrow Configure.
- 3. Tap the Security field and select WPA2 PSK.
- 4. With security enabled, delete the previous password and enter a new one into the **Password** field.
- Important! The more complex the password, the harder it will be for intruders to break your security. It is recommended that you not use names, birthdays, or other personal information.
 - 5. Tap Save to store the new settings.

To manage connected devices:

This feature allows you to provide MAC filtering on your device. This is similar to a "VIP list" where only devices on the list are allowed access.

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare (Apps) \rightarrow
 - (Mobile HotSpot).
- 2. Tap Mobile HotSpot \rightarrow Allowed devices.
- Tap + (Add) to add devices to the allowed for connection list.

Section 7: Applications

This section contains a description of each application that is available on the (**Apps**) screen, its function, and how to navigate through that particular application. If the application is already described in another section of this user manual, then a cross reference to that particular section is provided.

Note: This manual only addresses applications that have been loaded on your device as of the date of purchase. Information concerning third party applications that you may choose to download from the Google Play Store or otherwise should be obtained from the application provider directly.

Tip: To open applications quickly, add the icons of frequentlyused applications to one of the Home screens, if it is not there by default. For details, see "App Shortcuts" on page 27.

You can also add an application icon as a Primary Shortcut that will display on all Home screens. If you add an application as a primary shortcut, the application icon will not be displayed in the Applications menu.

Applications List

The Applications list provides quick access to all the available applications on the device.

Important! Once you log into your Google account, any previously downloaded or purchased applications will be available from the "My Apps" section in the Google Play Store.

Application Screen Menu Settings

When on the Apps screen, the following menu options are available:

- 1. Press (Home) and then tap (Apps).
- 2. Press (Menu) and then select from the following options:
 - Play Store: provides quick access to the Play Store (page 124).
 - Edit: Organize your current applications by moving them around the screen, or edit or delete existing Apps folders.
 - **Create folder**: Create an application folder where you can better organize and group desired apps.

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- View type: Customize the way the Apps menu listing is shown.
- Uninstall: Remove an app that you downloaded to your device. Preloaded apps cannot be uninstalled. Tap \bigoplus to remove the selected app.
- **Downloaded applications**: Display all apps you have downloaded.
- Share apps: Select apps you have downloaded (not available for pre-loaded apps) to share via Bluetooth, Copy to clipboard, Drive, Email, Flipboard, Gmail, Google+, Hangouts, Memo, Messages, or Wi-Fi Direct.
- Hide applications / Show hidden applications: Control whether app icons are visible in Apps. Hiding an icon does not remove the app from your phone.
- 3. Press (Home) to return to the Home screen.

Accessing Recently-Used Apps

1. Press and hold (Home) from any screen to open the recently-used applications window.

Note: The larger the number of applications running on your phone, the larger the energy drain on your battery.

- 2. Tap an icon to open the selected application:
 - Tap to go to the Task manager. For more information, refer to *"Task Manager"* on page 10.

Note: For more information on closing recently opened apps, see "Shutting Down a Currently Active Application" on page 95.

- Tap 👔 to go to Google Search. For more information, refer to *"Google"* on page 107.
- Tap \blacksquare to delete the record of all recently used applications.

Shutting Down a Currently Active Application

- Press and hold (Home), and then tap
 (End all)
 or –
- 1. Press and hold (Home), and then tap (Task manager).
- 2. From the Active applications tab, tap End to close selected applications.

Tap **End all** to close all background running applications.

Customizing the Application Group Names

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap **HE (Apps)**.

Updating Applications

Once you have registered your device (see *"Software Update"* on page 166) and signed into your Google account (see *"Setting Up Your Gmail Account"* on page 66), you may see the New updates notification in the Status Bar if there is a new version of one or more (apps) available or, when you open an application that is preloaded on your device, a New updates message may be displayed.

To update the applications:

GPS Applications

GPS applications allow you to achieve real-time, GPS-enabled, turn-by-turn navigation and to access local searches based on a variety of category parameters.


To receive better GPS signals, avoid using your device in the following conditions:

- inside a building or between buildings
- in a tunnel or underground passage
- in poor weather
- around high-voltage or electromagnetic fields
- in a vehicle with tinted windows

Global GPS turn-by-turn navigation, mapping, and Point of Interest content is available for three continents, including North America (U.S., Canada, and Mexico), Western Europe, and China, where wireless coverage is available.

Important! If you tap or cover the internal GPS antenna while using GPS services, it may impede the GPS signal resulting in the GPS services not working in an optimal manner. Refer to the following diagram to locate the approximate location of the internal GPS antenna.

Your device is equipped with a full HTML Browser that allows you to access the Internet.

From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare (Apps) \rightarrow (Browser).

Navigating the Internet

The following options are available for Internet navigation.

Command Keys

- Tap **Sack** or **C** to return to the previous page.
- Tap \rightarrow Forward to go forward to a recent page.
- Tap C Refresh to reload the current page.

Tapping and Dragging

• Tap and drag your finger on the screen to navigate pages and to reposition pages within the screen.

Entering Text in a Field

• While browsing, tap a text field to display the virtual QWERTY keyboard to enter text.

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Zoom

- Tap the screen twice to zoom in or out.
- Use two fingers, such as your index finger and thumb, to zoom out by making an inward pinching motion on the screen. To zoom in, make an outward stretching motion by sliding your fingers apart.
- Tip: For convenient browsing, you can rotate the device to landscape mode.

Selecting Items On a Page

While browsing, use gestures and menus to navigate:

Browser Quick Controls

Use Quick Controls to maximize your viewing area while browsing the Internet.

1. From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow (Browser).

The Application and URL bars are hidden.

- 3. Tap (Back) to return to the webpage.
- 4. Slowly swipe inward from the **left or right edge** of the screen to access Quick controls.



- **5.** Without lifting your finger, move to an option and then lift your finger to initiate the option.
- To cancel, display the Quick controls and tap
 ✓ (Settings) → Labs and tap Quick controls to uncheck it.

Calculator

The calculator provides the basic arithmetic functions to solve simple arithmetic problems and advanced operators to solve more complex problems.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow (Samsung folder) \rightarrow $\stackrel{\frown}{\subseteq}$ (Calculator).
- 2. Enter the first number using the numeric keys.
- Enter the operation for your calculation by tapping the + (add), - (subtract), × (multiply), or ÷ (divide) key.
- 4. Enter the next number.
- 5. To view the result, tap the = (equals) key.
- 6. Repeat Steps 3 through 5 as many times as required.
- 7. Tap C to clear the result.
- For more advanced problems, rotate your device to landscape mode and use the advanced operators sin, in, cos, log, tan, and so on.
- **9.** Touch and hold entries in the Calculator's display field to copy or cut the contents of the display. Paste the copied value in another app.

Calendar

Your device includes a powerful Calendar to help you organize your schedules more conveniently and effectively. Learn to create and manage events and tasks, and set alarms to remind yourself of important events and tasks.

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap $\underbrace{\text{IIII}}_{31}$ (Calendar).
- 2. Select the drop down list box at the top left side of the display to access the following options:
 - Year: Display all twelve months of this year. Sweep across the years at the bottom of the screen to display another year.
 - **Month**: Display the current month. Tap a month and year at the bottom of the screen to display another month.
 - Week: Display the current week. Tap a week at the bottom of the screen to display another week.
 - **Day**: Display today's schedule by hour. Tap day at the bottom of the screen to display another day.
 - List: Display only event and task names and dates for a selected year. Tap a year at the bottom of the screen to display another year. Tap a date to hide or show the event or task.
 - Task: Display your list of tasks. Tap the sort field to change how your tasks are sorted. Tasks can be sorted by due date, priority, date, week, month, or group.

- 3. Swipe left or right across the screen to view other days or other weeks. Swipe up or down the screen to view other events.
- To find an event or task, tap (Search). Use the on-screen keyboard to enter a search term. Possible events display as you type.

Tap \mathbf{Q} on the keyboard to remove it.

Tap an event to send, edit, or delete the event.

- Tap H (Add event/Add task) and then tap Save to add a new event to your calendar. For more information, refer to "Creating an Event or Task" on page 103.
- 6. Tap (Menu) for these options:
 - **Zoom**: In the Week and Day views, increase or decrease the size of the area being viewed.
 - **Go to**: Use the Set date pop-up to enter a date and then tap Set to display that date on your calendar.

Downloads

Files, apps, and other items you download in Browser, Email, Gmail, or in other ways, are stored on your tablet's internal storage. Use the Downloads app to view, reopen, or delete what you have downloaded.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap \blacksquare (Apps) \rightarrow \blacksquare (Downloads).
- 2. Tap an item to open it.
- To share one or more items, tap items you want to share, to check them, and then tap Share via. Tap an option, such as Bluetooth, and follow the on-screen instructions.

The items are deleted from your tablet.

Gallery

Use Gallery to view, capture, and manage photos and videos. For more information, refer to *"Gallery"* on page 73.

Access social and premium games. Join Game Hub to enjoy free games with your friends.

G+ Photos

This application provides a shortcut to the Photos tab inside the Google+ app.

From a Home screen, tap IIIII (Apps) →

Gmail

Google Mail (Gmail) is a web-based email service. Gmail is configured when you first set up your phone. Depending on your synchronization settings, Gmail can automatically synchronize with your Gmail account on the Web.

For more information, refer to "Gmail" on page 66.

From a Home screen, tap IIIII (Apps) →
 (Google folder) → IIII (Gmail).

Google

Use Google Search to search the Web. Google Now (a part of the Google Search app) recognizes a user's repeated actions performed on the device (including access of common locations, repeated calendar appointments, search queries, etc.). This information is then used to display more relevant information to the user in the form of "cards". These scrollable on-screen cards are displayed when the Google Now application is launched.

These cards are not manually added. The service uses your GPS, Google Search, and usage information to generate these cards automatically.

Tip: Google Search appears by default on all Home screens.

To initially set up Google Now:

 Follow the on-screen instructions to get started. Some initial on-screen "cards" are shown. A default is the Weather card that provides updated weather information in your area. To configure the Google Now settings:

From a Home screen, tap (Apps) →
 (Google folder) → Son (Google+).

Group Play

This application lets you share documents, photos or music in real-time with other connected friends.

Note: Group Play is not the same as Screen mirroring which requires a connection to a Wi-Fi capable Samsung TV or via the use of the AllShare Cast Hub.

To share a Group Play, all users must be connected to the same Wi-Fi access point.

From a Home screen, tap IIII (Apps) →
 (Samsung folder) → IIII (Group Play).

Creating a Group

If you have media you want to share, create a group for other users to join to and then share/collaborate with what you are sharing.

The creator of the group is the leader and it the source of the shared file. All other joined members can then interact with the file being shared.

- Connect to an active Wireless Access Point and confirm your other participants are also connected to this same Wi-Fi.
- From a Home screen, tap IIII (Apps) →
 (Samsung folder) → IIII (Group Play).
 A Disclaimer pop-up displays.
- 3. Read the Disclaimer and tap Agree.
- 4. Tap the **Set group password** field to enable the function, which requires users to enter a password prior to connecting to your new group.
- 5. Tap Create group. If previously selected, enter your group password and tap OK. Mobile AP is enabled.
- 6. Tap one of the media items listed under the Share and play content heading.

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- 7. Tap to select the items you want to share (indicated by a check mark), then tap **Done** or **OK**.
- **8.** Have your friends sign onto Group Play from their devices (see below) and they can view your media using you as a Mobile AP.

Joining a group

A joiner is the participant of an already created group. You can only view and interact with media shared by the leader of an existing group.

- 1. Connect to an active Wireless Access Point and confirm your connection is this same Wi-Fi as the group leader.
- From a Home screen, tap (Apps) →
 (Samsung folder) → Ima (Group Play).
- **3.** Tap **Join group**. Your device then scans for available groups for you to join.
- Select a group to join. Once connected, you can then select the shared content and interact with your group's shared media.
- 5. Tap (Menu) and then tap Help for additional information.

Using Group Play from an Application

While using various applications, such as [M] (Gallery), when you tap \checkmark (Share) to share a file, you see Group Play as an option.

To share a file using Group Play:

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow \implies (Gallery).
- 2. Navigate to the file you want to share and tap
 - \checkmark (Share via) \rightarrow Group Play.

Note: After the initial Group Play request, tap

- 🛃 (Group Play) instead of < (Share).
- Use the keyboard to enter a PIN code and tap Done. This process makes sure only desired recipients can view your shared image.

The Group Play screen displays and the device waits for other connected recipients to accept the connection and enter the PIN on their screens.

You can now interact and draw with the on-screen image, and users will instantaneously see the same gestures and also be able to interact.

Hangouts

Previously known as Google Talk[™], Hangouts is an updated place to hangout, share photos, and even video calls. This is a free web-based application for instant messaging offered by Google. Conversation logs are automatically saved to a Chats area in your Gmail account. This allows you to search a chat log and store them in your Gmail accounts.

WatchOn Settings

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow (\implies (WatchON).
- 2. From the main WatchON screen, tap (Menu) and then select an available on-screen option:
 - Change room: Select a previously configured room.
 - My page: Display your purchased and rented movies and TV shows.
 - Settings: Configure Samsung WatchON settings. Follow the on-screen instructions.
 - Help: Display Samsung WatchON help information.

Add a New Room

Your device can be used to control boxes/receivers from several rooms. You could go from controlling your set top box in your living room and then move into your bedroom to do the same.

- 3. Scroll through the list and tap the city you want to add.

Tip: Tap the first letter of the city's name, to the right of the list, to find the city more quickly.

Tap and turn the globe to locate a city and tap the city you want to add.

- A pop-up displays the city name, the current time and date there, and the GMT offset. To add the city, tap

 (Add) on the pop-up.
- To change the order of the cities, tap : (Reorder). Tap the grid : on an entry and drag the entry to a new position in the list. Tap Done to change the order.
- 6. Tap iii (Delete) to delete entries. Tap the check box next to the cities you want to delete, and then tap Delete.
- 7. Touch and hold an entry to remove it or to set the DST settings (Daylight Savings Time).

YouTube

YouTube is a video sharing website on which users can upload and share videos, and view them in MPEG-4 format.

- **1.** From a Home screen, tap \implies (Apps) \rightarrow (YouTube).
- 2. Tap the search field Q to search for specific videos, scroll down to browse through the main page thumbnails, or scroll to the bottom to explore additional options.
- **3.** To view a video, tap an available preview thumbnail or tap the title link.

To configure YouTube settings:

- Tap (Menu) and then tap Settings to configure the following parameters:
 - General
 - High quality on mobile: When enabled, allows you to start all videos in high quality mode while you are connected to a mobile network.
 - Caption font size: Set the font size used by on-screen captions. Choose from: Small, Medium, Large, or Huge.
 - Uploads: Specifies network preferences for uploads.
 - Content localization: Prioritize channels and videos from a specific country or region.
 - Improve YouTube: Anonymously send YouTube information to help improve the application.
 - Connected TVs
 - Add a TV: Pair this device with your TV.
 - Edit TVs: Rename or remove you paired TV at any time.

- Search
 - Clear search history: Clear previous YouTube searches from showing up in the YouTube search box.
 - Never remember history: Force YouTube to never store search history information.
 - SafeSearch filtering: Configure block settings for videos containing restricted content. This option blocks these videos from appearing within your search results. Choose from: Don't filter or Strict.

Preloading

- Preload subscriptions: Preload (or go get videos while on Wi-Fi and charging) your subscription videos.
- Preload watch later: Enable the preload function on selected videos so you can watch them later. Read the data usage information and tap OK to accept the terms.

Note: Preloading YouTube videos will use some of your device's storage space and may result in additional charges if your Wi-Fi plan is not unlimited.

The Settings Screen

The Settings screen has tabs on the left side of the screen. Information related to the tabs displays on the right side of the screen. There are five major groups of settings:

- Wireless and network
- Device
- Personal
- Accounts
- System

Wireless and Network

Control your device's wireless connections.

Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi is a wireless networking technology that provides access to local area networks.

Wi-Fi communication requires access to an existing Wireless Access Point (WAP). WAPs can be Open (unsecured, as with most hotspots) or Secured (requiring you to provide login credentials). Your device supports the 802.11 b/g/n Wi-Fi protocol.

For more information about using your device's Wi-Fi features, see *"Wi-Fi"* on page 78.

Wi-Fi Direct

Wi-Fi Direct allows device-to-device connections, allowing you to transfer large amounts of data over a Wi-Fi connection.

For more information about using your device's Wi-Fi Direct feature, see *"Wi-Fi Direct"* on page 80.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology for exchanging information over a distance of about 30 feet.

For more information about using Bluetooth, see "Bluetooth" on page 82.

Data Usage

Monitor data usage, and control your device's connection to mobile data service.

- 1. From the 🍥 (Settings) screen, tap Data usage.
- 2. Tap Mobile data to enable or disable the mobile data connection.
- 3. Tap Set mobile data limit to disable your mobile data connection when your specified limit is reached.
- 4. Tap the Data usage cycle drop-down menu and select a date.

The data usage displays as a visual (chart) and also displays a list of each application with a breakdown of data usage by application.

Note: Data is measured by your device. Your service provider may account for data usage differently.

More Settings

This tab displays additional wireless and network features.

 From the () (Settings) screen, tap More settings.
 Options display Airplane mode, Mobile networks, Tethering and Mobile HotSpot, VPN, Nearby devices, and Kies via Wi-Fi.

Airplane Mode

Airplane mode allows you to use many of your tablet's features, such as Camera, Games, etc., when you are in an airplane or other area where accessing data is prohibited.

Important! When your tablet is in Airplane Mode, it cannot access online information or applications.

Tap Airplane mode to enable/disable Airplane mode.
 or –

Press and hold the **Power** button, and then tap **Airplane mode**.

– or –

Tap the top of the screen and swipe downward to display the Notification Panel, then tap the $\blacksquare \supsetneq \rightarrow$ \checkmark (Airplane mode) Quick Setting button to turn Airplane mode **ON/OFF**.

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Mobile Networks

Before you use applications such as Google Maps, you must enable the Mobile networks options.

■ From the (i) (Settings) screen, tap More settings → Mobile networks.

The following options display:

- **Mobile Data**: To enable data access over the mobile network, this option must be selected. It is set on by default.
- Data Roaming: Allows you to connect to your service provider's partner networks and access data services when you are out of your service providers area of coverage.
- Access Point Names: To use Wi-Fi you need access to a wireless access point (hotspot). Tap Access Point Names to display a list of the Access Point names. The active access point displays a green-filled circle to the right of the name.

- Network mode: You can configure your device to either automatically select the LTE option [LTE/WCDMA (auto connect)] or WCDMA only. LTE/WCDMA (auto connect) is the default network mode option. This selection allows the device to choose the fastest connection from among the available connection speeds, including LTE. WCDMA restricts your connection to only the 3G network.
- Network Operators: Using this feature you can view the current network connection. You can also scan and select a network operator manually, or set the network selection to Automatic.

Important! You must deactivate data service prior to searching for an available network.

Note: Connecting to 2G networks slows the data transfer speed and time.

Using the LTE Network Option

To confirm you are always using the fastest possible connection, the device has an automatic detection method where it finds both the fastest and most stable connection/communication method from among this selected set (LTE/4G/3G/2G).

- From the main Settings page, tap More settings → Mobile networks → Network mode.
- Tap LTE/WCDMA (auto connect). A selection indicator displays next to this option to show that it is active.
- **3.** This is the default mode for this device.

Using the WCDMA - 3G Only Network

This option uses a 3G connection only.

- From the main Settings page, tap More settings → Mobile networks → Network mode.
- Tap WCDMA only. A selection indicator displays next to this option to show that it is active. Connecting to 3G networks slows the data transfer speed and time.

Default Setup Options

Your device default is set to Automatic to automatically search for an available network. You can set this option to Manual to select a network each time you connect.

- 1. Tap Network operators.
- 2. Tap Default setup.
- Tap Manual to locate and connect to a network manually or tap Automatic to allow the device to automatically select a network.

Tethering and Mobile HotSpot

Your can share your device's mobile data connection and Internet connectivity with other devices.

- USB tethering: Provide Internet connectivity via a direct USB connection between your device and a single computer.
- Mobile HotSpot: Provide wireless Internet connectivity to multiple devices.

For more information about using USB tethering, see *"USB Tethering"* on page 89.

For more information about using Mobile Hotspot, see *"Mobile HotSpot"* on page 90.

VPN

The VPN settings menu allows you to set up and manage Virtual Private Networks (VPNs).

Important! Before you can use a VPN you must establish and configure one.

Adding a Basic VPN

- Before using VPN, you must first set up a screen unlock PIN or password. For more information, refer to "Screen Lock" on page 151.
- 2. From the O (Settings) screen, tap More settings \rightarrow VPN.
- 3. Tap 🕂 (Add).
- 4. Enter a name for the VPN network in the Name field.
- 5. Select a VPN type from the Type drop-down menu:
 - PPTP (Point-to-Point Tunneling Protocol)
 - L2TP/IPSec PSK (Layer 2 Tunneling Protocol / Internet Protocol Security Pre-Shared Key)
 - L2TP/IPSec RSA
 - IPSec Xauth PSK
 - IPSec Xauth RSA
 - IPSec Hybrid RSA

- 6. Enter the Server address and any other required fields that are dependent upon the **Type** you entered previously.
- 7. Tap the Show advanced options check box to display additional VPN options.
- 8. Tap Save to save your VPN settings.

To delete a VPN:

- 1. From the O (Settings) screen, tap More settings \rightarrow VPN.
- 2. Touch and hold the VPN that you want to delete.
- 3. In the pop-up that opens, tap Delete network.

Nearby Devices

This option allows you to share your media files with nearby DLNA (Digital Living Network Alliance) enabled devices that are connected to the same Wi-Fi.

Warning! If file sharing is enabled, other devices can access your data. Use the Wi-Fi network and this option with care.

To configure this feature:

- Connect to a Wi-Fi network. For more information, refer to "Wi-Fi" on page 78.
- From the () (Settings) screen, tap More settings → Nearby devices.
- Tap the File sharing check box to activate file sharing. The (Nearby devices) icon displays on the Status Bar.
- 4. In the Advanced section, set the following options:
 - Shared contents: Select the media you would like to share.
 - Allowed devices list: Indicate the devices allowed to access your device.

- Not-allowed devices list: Indicate the devices not allowed to access your device.
- **Download to**: Set whether to download data to Device memory or SD card.
- Upload from other devices: If a nearby device attempts to upload data, this setting indicates the response. Options are: Always accept, Always ask, and Always reject.

Kies via Wi-Fi

Samsung Kies is a software that enables you to update your device firmware, synchronize files, and transfer data to and from your device directly by connecting to the PC.

For more information, refer to "Kies via Wi-Fi" on page 87.

Device

Control the screen display, sounds, storage, power and battery usage, and other device features.

Blocking Mode

Disable notifications for selected features.

- From the (Settings) screen, under Wireless and networks, tap OFF to turn Blocking mode ON.
- 2. Tap = (Blocking mode) for options:
 - Turn off notifications: Do not sound/display any notifications.
 - Turn off alarm: Do not sound/display any alarms.
 - To set an time limit for Blocking mode, tap **Always** to enable, and configure the **From** and **To** time fields.

Note: When this option is enabled, 💽 displays in the Status Bar.

Hands-Free Mode

Hands-free mode allows your device to read new notifications and alarms aloud.

- From the () (Settings) screen, under Wireless and networks, tap OFF to turn Hands-free mode ON.
- 2. Tap 🔘 (Hands-free mode) for options:
 - **Message**: read out senders' information when new messages arrive.
 - Alarm: Read out alarm information when alarms sound.
 - **Schedule**: Read out scheduled alarm information when alarms sound.

Note: When this option is enabled, 💽 displays in the Status Bar.

Sound

Volume

Set the volume level for all types of sounds.

- **1.** From the O (Settings) screen, tap Sound \rightarrow Volume.
- 2. Touch and drag the sliders to set the volume for:
 - Music, video, games, and other media: Sounds made by music apps, video apps, and more.
 - Notifications: Sounds for alerts to new messages and other events.
 - **System**: Application sounds and other sounds made by your device.
- Tip: You can also set System volume from the Home screen by pressing the Volume Key.
 - 3. Tap OK to save your settings.

Notifications

Select a default ringtone for message, alarm, and other notifications.

- From the (i) (Settings) screen, tap Sound → Default notification sound.
- 2. Tap a ringtone to hear a sample and select it.
- 3. Tap OK to save the setting.

System

You can activate or deactivate both touch sounds and screen lock sounds.

- 1. From the 🝥 (Settings) screen, tap Sound.
- **2.** Tap the check box next to any of the following options to activate the feature:
 - Touch sounds: Makes a sound when you tap the screen.
 - Screen lock sound: Makes a sound when your screen is locked or unlocked.

Display Wallpaper

You can choose a picture to display on the Home Screen, Lock screen, or to both the Home and lock screens. Choose from preloaded wallpaper images or select a photo you have downloaded or taken with the Camera.

- From the ⁽@)</sup> (Settings) screen, tap Display → Wallpaper.
- 2. Tap Home screen, Lock screen, or Home and lock screens.

The Select wallpaper from screen displays the following options: **Gallery, Live wallpapers, Travel wallpaper,** and **Wallpapers**.

For more information, refer to "Wallpapers" on page 29.

Notification Panel

Customize the Notification panel.

- 1. Tap O Settings \rightarrow Display \rightarrow Notification panel.
- 2. Tap **Brightness adjustment** to adjust the screen brightness from the Notification panel.
- To customize which Quick Setting buttons appear at the top of the notifications panel, touch and drag buttons to reorder them.

Multi Window

Enable or disable the Multi window feature.

- 1. From the 🝥 (Settings) screen, tap Display.
- 2. Tap Multi window to enable/disable this feature.

Brightness

Set the default screen brightness.

- From the (⁽ⁱ⁾) (Settings) screen, tap Display → Brightness.
- 2. Touch and drag the slider to set the brightness or tap Automatic brightness.
- 3. Tap OK to save the setting.

Screen Timeout

Set the length of delay between the last key press or screen tap and the automatic screen timeout (dim and lock).

- 1. From the 🝥 (Settings) screen, tap Display.
- Tap Screen timeout and select the screen delay time. The screen delays shutting off after inactivity for the selected period of time.

Daydream

The Daydream setting controls what the screen displays when the phone is docked, or while charging. You can choose to display a Colors screen, or display photos stored on your phone.

- 1. From the 🝥 (Settings) screen, tap Display.
- 2. Tap OFF to turn Daydream ON.
- 3. Tap Daydream for options:
 - **Colors**: Tap the selector to enable or disable display of a colorful screen.
 - Flipboard: Display pictures from Flipboard. After enabling the option, tap 🗱 to choose pictures to display.
 - **Photo Frame**: Tap the selector to enable or disable display of pictures in a photo frame. After enabling the option, tap 🏠 to choose pictures to display.
 - **Photo Table**: Tap the selector to enable or disable display of pictures in a photo table. After enabling the option, tap 🔅 to choose pictures to display.

Smart Screen

Set the screen to stay on as long as you look at it.

- From the ⁽@)</sup> (Settings) screen, tap Display → Smart screen.
- 2. Tap Smart stay to enable this feature.

Note: When this option is enabled, 🐱 displays in the Status Bar.

Font Style and Size

Set the font for screen displays and the size you want it to display.

- 1. From the 🝥 (Settings) screen, tap Display.
- 2. Tap Font style then tap a font or tap Get fonts online to browse and download a new font.
- 3. Tap Font size and select a font size.
- 4. Tap Increase legibility in enhance clarity of the text.

Show Battery Percentage

Display the battery percentage remaining on the Status Bar.

- 1. From the 🝥 (Settings) screen, tap Display.
- 2. Tap Show battery percentage to enable this feature.

Storage

From this menu you can view the device memory or mount, unmount, or format an SD card.

Device Memory

 From the (() (Settings) screen, tap Storage. The Device memory displays as Total space, System memory, Used space, Cached data, Miscellaneous files, and Available space.

SD Card

Once a memory card has been installed in your device, the SD card memory displays as Total space and Available space.

For more information about mounting, unmounting, and formatting an SD card, see For more information, refer to *"Memory Card"* on page 87.

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Power Saving Mode

When enabled, your device automatically analyzes the screen and adjusts the brightness to conserve battery power.

- 1. From the () (Settings) screen, tap Power saving mode.
- 2. Tap OFF to turn Power saving ON.
- **3.** Tap **CPU power saving** to limit the maximum performance of the CPU.
- 4. Tap Screen power saving to use low power level for the screen.
- 5. Tap Learn about Power saving mode to display more information about saving power mode.

Battery

See how much battery power is used for device activities.

- From the () (Settings) screen, tap Battery. The battery level displays in percentage. The amount of time the battery was used also displays. Battery usage displays in percentages per application.
- 2. Tap Refresh to update the display.
- 3. Tap Show batter percentage to display the remaining percentage of battery charge on the battery icon in the Status Bar.

Note: Other applications may be running that affect battery use.

Application Manager

You can download and install applications from Google Play or create applications using the Android SDK and install them on your device. Use Application manager settings to manage applications.

Warning! Because this device can be configured with system software not provided by or supported by Google or any other company, end-users operate these devices at their own risk.

Memory Usage

See how memory is being used by Downloaded or Running applications.

- 1. From the (i) (Settings) screen, tap Application manager.
- Tap DOWNLOADED, SD CARD, RUNNING, or ALL to display memory usage for that category of applications.

The graph at the bottom of the Downloaded tab shows used and free device memory. The graph at the bottom of the Running tab shows used and free RAM.

Downloaded

Displays apps you have downloaded onto your device.

- From the () (Settings) screen, tap Application manager.
- 2. Tap the **DOWNLOADED** tab to view a list of all the downloaded applications on your device.
- To switch the order of the lists displayed in the Downloaded tabs, tap ((Menu)) and then tap Sort by size or Sort by name.
- 4. To reset your application preferences, tap (Menu) and then tap Reset app preferences.
- 5. Tap an application to view and update information about the application, including memory usage, default settings, and permissions.

Running Services

View and control services running on your device.

- 1. From the (i) (Settings) screen, tap Application manager.
- 2. Tap the RUNNING tab.

All the applications that are currently running on the device display.

- Tap Show cached processes to display all the cached processes that are running. Tap Show services in use to switch back.
- **4.** Tap one of the applications to view application information. The following options display:
 - **Stop**: Stops the application from running on the device. This is usually done prior to uninstalling the application.

Warning! Not all services can be stopped. Stopping services may have undesirable consequences on the application or Android System.

• **Report**: Report failure and other application information.

Note: Options vary by application.

Users

This device can be shared by multiple people by creating User profiles. Users have their own space, which they can customize with their own apps, wallpaper, and so on. Users can also adjust device settings like Wi-Fi that affect everyone.

Change the Owner Nickname

- 1. From the 🝥 (Settings) screen, tap Users.
- 2. Tap Nickname. The Nickname pop-up displays.
- 3. Tap the Nickname field and enter the new nickname.
- 4. Tap OK.

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Add a New User

- 1. From the 🍥 (Settings) screen, tap Users.
- 2. Tap 🛃 (Add user).
- If the new User is able to set up their space now, tap Set up now. Tap Not now to create an empty User space that can be modified later.
- 4. Tap get started and follow the prompts to set up the new User space.

Delete a User

- 1. From the 🝥 (Settings) screen, tap Users.
- 2. Tap the user's profile entry.
- 3. Tap Delete user.

Personal

This section of the Settings screen lets you manage the personal settings for your device.

Location Services

You value your privacy. So, by default, your device only acquires your location when you allow it. To use Location-Based Services, you must first enable location services on your device.

Before you use applications such as Google Maps and find your location or search for places of interest, you must enable the Use wireless networks option or enable the GPS satellites.

- 1. From the 🚳 (Settings) screen, tap Location services.
- 2. Tap Access to my location to allow apps that have asked your permission to use your location information.
- 3. Tap Use GPS satellites to enable the GPS satellite.
- Tap Use wireless networks to enable location information using the wireless network.
- 5. Tap **My places** to save your favorite locations for use with services that require location information.

Lock Screen Screen Lock

Choose settings for unlocking your screen. For more information about using the lock and unlock features, see *"Securing Your Device"* on page 13.

- 1. From the 🝥 (Settings) screen, tap Lock screen.
- 2. Tap Screen lock for these settings:
 - Swipe: Swipe the screen to unlock it.
 - Face unlock: Look at your tablet to unlock it. Follow the on-screen instructions to set up Face unlock.
 - Face and voice: Look at your tablet and speak a phrase to unlock it. Follow the on-screen instructions to set up Face and voice unlock.
 - Pattern: A screen unlock pattern is a tap gesture you create and use to unlock your device. Follow the prompts to create or change your screen unlock pattern.
 - PIN: Select a PIN to use for unlocking the screen.
 - Password: Create a password for unlocking the screen.
 - None: No pattern, PIN, or password is required.

The following options are available depending on the Screen Lock type that you have selected.

Swipe Options

The options available when Screen lock is set to Swipe are:

- Multiple widgets: Display multiple widgets on your lock screen. Appears as an options after a lock mode is enabled.
- Lock screen widgets: Lock the widgets that are displayed on your home screens.
- Shortcuts: Set shortcuts to appear at the bottom of the Lock screen.
- Unlock effect: Set the effect you receive when unlocking the phone. You can select None or Light effect.
- Help text: Show help information on the Lock screen.
- Wake up in lock screen: Unlock the screen using wake-up command when swipe or motion lock is enabled.
- Set wake-up command: Designate your wake-up commands. Tap Set wake-up command and follow the on-screen prompts to create a new verbal command.

Face Unlock/Face and Voice Options

These options are available when Screen lock is set to Face unlock or Face and voice:

- Lock screen widgets: Lock the widgets that are displayed on your home screens.
- Improve facial recognition: Improve your device's face matching capability by capturing your face in different lighting, with or without glasses, and bearded or clean-shaven. Follow the on-screen instructions.
- **Presence check**: Requires that you blink when using the Face unlock feature. This increases the security of the feature.
- Make pattern visible: See the pattern as you draw it.
- Lock automatically: Set how long to wait before your device is locked after the screen automatically turns off.
- Lock instantly with power key: Lock the phone when you press the Power/Lock key.

Pattern Options

These options are available when Screen lock is set to Pattern:

- Lock screen widgets: Lock the widgets that are displayed on your home screens.
- Make pattern visible: See the pattern as you draw it.
- Lock automatically: Set how long to wait before your device is locked after the screen automatically turns off.
- Lock instantly with power key: Lock the phone when you press the Power/Lock key.

PIN and Password Options

These options are available when Screen lock is set to Pin or Password:

- Lock screen widgets: Lock the widgets that are displayed on your home screens.

Security

Encryption

To require a numeric PIN or password to decrypt your tablet each time you power it on:

- 1. From the 🝥 (Settings) screen, tap Security.
- Tap Encrypt device. For more information, read the displayed help screen.
- Tip: Make sure your battery is charged more than 80 percent. Encryption takes an hour or more.

SIM Card Lock

Prevent another user from using your SIM card to make unauthorized calls or from accessing information stored on your SIM card by protecting the information using a PIN code.

- 1. From the 🝥 (Settings) screen, tap Security.
- 2. Tap Set up SIM card lock.
- 3. Tap Lock SIM card, enter your SIM PIN code, and tap OK.

Note: You must activate Lock SIM card before you can change your SIM PIN code.

4. Tap Change SIM PIN.

- Enter your old SIM PIN code and tap **OK**.

An informational pop-up displays.

Read the message and tap **OK** to allow installation of non-Google Play applications.

- Warning! Enabling this option causes your tablet and personal data to be more vulnerable to attack by applications from unknown sources.
 - 4. Tap Verify apps to block or warn before installing apps that may cause harm to the device.

Credential Storage

Trusted Credentials

If a certificate authority (CA) certificate gets compromised or for some other reason you do not trust it, you can disable or remove it.

- 1. From the 🝥 (Settings) screen, tap Security.
- 2. Tap Trusted credentials.

The trusted credentials screen has two tabs:

- **System**: Displays CA certificates that are permanently installed in the ROM of your device.
- **User**: Displays any CA certificates that you installed, for example, in the process of installing a client certificate.
- **3.** Tap a CA certificate to examine its details. A scrolling screen displays the details.
- Scroll to the bottom of the details screen and tap Turn off to disable a System certificate.
- Caution! When you disable a system CA certificate, the Turn off button changes to Turn on, so you can enable the certificate again, if necessary.

- 2. Tap Default and select Samsung keyboard.
- 3. Tap Set up input methods.

Configuring Google Voice Typing

- 1. From the 🝥 (Settings) screen, tap Language and input.
- 2. Tap 🏟 next to Google voice typing.

The following options are available:

• Block offensive words: Enable or disable blocking of recognized offensive words from the results of your voice-input Google searches.

When enabled, a check mark appears in the check box.

• Offline speech recognition: Enable voice input while offline. Tap the All tab to download speech recognition for other languages.

Configuring the Samsung Keyboard

- 1. From the 🝥 (Settings) screen, tap Language and input.
- 2. Tap 🔆 next to Samsung keyboard to display the following options:
 - **Input languages**: Used to set a default text entry language. Tap this field, scroll through the options, and tap the desired input language.

- **Cursor control**: Move the cursor by sliding your finger across the keyboard.

- **Key-tap sound**: Check to play a brief sound each time you tap a key on the on-screen keyboard.
- Handwriting: Tap to display the following options:
 - Recognition type: Set the recognition after each stroke or after completion.
 - Recognition time: Set the recognition time in milliseconds.
 - Pen thickness: Set the pen thickness in pixels.
 - Pen color: Choose a pen color.
 - About: Displays information about the handwriting software.

Accounts

Set up and manage accounts, including your Google accounts, Samsung accounts, and email accounts.

Your device provides the ability to synchronize information from a variety of accounts, including Email, Facebook, Google, and your Samsung account. Depending on the account, you can choose to synchronize your calendar, contacts, and other types of content.

With synchronization, you can ensure that the information on your device is updated with any information that changes in your accounts.

Managing Accounts

To view the accounts you have added:

1. From the ((Settings) screen, tap (account).

The (*account*) is either Google, Samsung account, or some other account you have added, such as Email.

Each of your accounts (Google, Samsung, and so on) are listed under Accounts.

Date and Time

By default, your device receives date and time information from the wireless network. When you are outside network coverage, you may want to set date and time information manually using the Date and time settings.

- **2.** Configure the following settings:
 - Automatic date and time: Allows the network to set the date and time.
 - Set date: Enter the current date (only available when the Automatic setting is disabled).
 - Set time: Enter the current time (only available when the Automatic setting is disabled).
 - Automatic time zone: Allows the network to set the time zone.
 - Select time zone: Choose your local time zone (only available when the Automatic setting is disabled).
 - Use 24-hour format: The tablet default is a 12-hour clock. Use this setting to change to a 24-hour format.

Accessibility

Accessibility services are special features to make using the device easier for those with certain physical disabilities. Use the Accessibility settings to activate these services.

Note: You can download accessibility applications from Google Play and manage their use here.

System

- 2. Configure the following settings:

TalkBack speaks feedback to help blind and low-vision users.

- 2. Tap OFF to turn TalkBack ON.

Important! TalkBack can collect all of the text you enter, except passwords, including personal data and credit card numbers. It may also log your user interface interactions with the device.

Vision

To set vision options:

- 1. From the (in (Settings) screen, tap Accessibility.

- 3. Tap Magnification gestures to enable zooming in and out by triple-tapping the screen.

Recognition

To set recognition options:

- 1. From the 🝥 (Settings) screen, tap Accessibility.
- Tap Interaction control to enable motions, screen timeout, auto-rotate and hard key functions, block areas of the screen from tap interaction, and display notifications on the Notification Panel and Status Bar.

About Device

View information about your device, including status, legal information, hardware and software versions, and battery use.

1. From the 🝥 (Settings) screen, tap About device.

- 2. Tap items to view details:
 - **Software update**: Connect to the network and download new software.
 - **Status**: Display the status of the battery, network, and other information about your device.
 - Legal information: Display Open source licences, Google legal, Samsung legal, and License settings information.
 - Device name: Modify your device's name.
 - Model number: Display your device's model number.
 - Android version: Display the firmware version of your device.
 - **Baseband version**: Display the baseband version loaded on this handset.
 - Kernel version: Display the kernel version of your device.

Software Update

This device is capable of operating in Wi-Fi™ mode in the 2.4 and 5 GHz bands. The FCC requires that devices operating within 5.15-5.25 GHz may only be used indoors, not outside, in order to avoid interference with Mobile Satellite Services (MSS). This section outlines the safety precautions associated with using your Galaxy Tab. The terms "GALAXY" or "mobile device" are used in this section to refer to your Galaxy Tab. **Read this information before using your mobile device.**

Exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) Signals

Although GALAXY is not a cell phone, it can operate on the same network as cell phones and can use the same Radio Frequency (RF) signals to communicate with the network as a cell phone. Therefore, although the following information refers specifically to RF exposure from wireless phones, it may apply similarly to GALAXY when it is being used on a cell phone network.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has published information for consumers relating to Radio Frequency (RF) exposure from wireless phones. The FDA publication includes the following information:

Do cell phones pose a health hazard?

Many people are concerned that cell phone radiation will cause cancer or other serious health hazards. The weight of scientific evidence has not linked cell phones with any health problems.

Cell phones emit low levels of Radio Frequency (RF) energy. Over the past 15 years, scientists have conducted hundreds of studies looking at the biological effects of the radio frequency energy emitted by cell phones. While some researchers have reported biological changes associated with RF energy, these studies have failed to be replicated. The majority of studies published have failed to show an association between exposure to radio frequency from a cell phone and health problems.

The low levels of RF cell phones emit while in use are in the microwave frequency range. They also emit RF at substantially reduced time intervals when in the stand-by

Health and Safety Information Download from Www.Somanuals.com. All Manuals Search And Download. mode. Whereas high levels of RF can produce health effects (by heating tissue), exposure to low level RF that does not produce heating effects causes no known adverse health effects.

The biological effects of radio frequency energy should not be confused with the effects from other types of electromagnetic energy.

Very high levels of electromagnetic energy, such as is found in X-rays and gamma rays, can ionize biological tissues. Ionization is a process where electrons are stripped away from their normal locations in atoms and molecules. It can permanently damage biological tissues including DNA, the genetic material.

The energy levels associated with radio frequency energy, including both radio waves and microwaves, are not great enough to cause ionization of atoms and molecules. Therefore, RF energy is a type of non-ionizing radiation. Other types of non-ionizing radiation include visible light, infrared radiation (heat), and other forms of electromagnetic radiation with relatively low frequencies. While RF energy does not ionize particles, large amounts can increase body temperatures and cause tissue damage. Two areas of the body, the eyes and the testes, are particularly vulnerable to RF heating because there is relatively little blood flow in them to carry away excess heat.

Research Results to Date: Is there a connection between RF and certain health problems?

The results of most studies conducted to date say no. In addition, attempts to replicate and confirm the few studies that have shown a connection have failed.

The scientific community at large therefore believes that the weight of scientific evidence does not show an association between exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) from cell phones and adverse health outcomes. Still the scientific community has supported additional research to address gaps in knowledge. Some of these studies are described below.

Interphone Study

Interphone is a large international study designed to determine whether cell phones increase the risk of head and neck cancer. A report published in the International Journal of Epidemiology (June, 2010) compared cell phone usage for more than 5,000 people with brain tumors (glioma and meningioma) and a similar number of healthy controls.

Results of this study did NOT show that cell phones caused brain cancer. In this study, most people had no increased risk of brain cancer from using cell phones. For people with the heaviest use of cell phones (an average of more than ½ hour per day, every day, for over 10 years) the study suggested a slight increase in brain cancer. However, the authors determined that biases and errors prevented any conclusions being drawn from this data. Additional information about Interphone can be found at

Interphone is the largest cell phone study to date, but it did not answer all questions about cell phone safety. Additional research is being conducted around the world, and the FDA continues to monitor developments in this field.

International Cohort Study on Mobile Phone Users (COSMOS)

The COSMOS study aims to conduct long-term health monitoring of a large group of people to determine if there are any health issues linked to long-term exposure to radio frequency energy from cell phone use. The COSMOS study will follow approximately 300,000 adult cell phone users in Europe for 20 to 30 years. Additional information about the COSMOS study can be found at

Risk of Brain Cancer from Exposure to Radio Frequency Fields in Childhood and Adolescence (MOBI-KIDS)

MOBI-KIDS is an international study investigating the relationship between exposure to radio frequency energy from communication technologies including cell phones and brain cancer in young people. Surveillance, Epidemiology, and End Results (SEER) Program of the National Cancer Institute

The National Cancer Institute (NCI) actively follows cancer statistics in the United States to detect any change in rates of new cases for brain cancer. If cell phones play a role in risk for brain cancer, rates should go up, because heavy cell phone use has been common for quite some time in the U.S. Between 1987 and 2005, the overall age-adjusted incidence of brain cancer did not increase. 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Cell Phone Industry Actions

Although the existing scientific data do not justify FDA regulatory actions, the FDA has urged the cell phone industry to take a number of steps, including the following:

- Support-needed research on possible biological effects of RF for the type of signal emitted by cell phones;
- Design cell phones in a way that minimizes any RF exposure to the user; and
- Cooperate in providing users of cell phones with the current information on cell phone use and human health concerns.

The FDA also is working with voluntary standard-setting bodies such as the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE), the International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP), and others to assure that safety standards continue to adequately protect the public.

Reducing Exposure: Hands-Free Kits and Other Accessories

Steps to Reduce Exposure to Radio Frequency Energy

If there is a risk from being exposed to radio frequency energy (RF) from cell phones - and at this point we do not know that there is - it is probably very small. But, if you are concerned about avoiding even potential risks, you can take a few simple steps to minimize your RF exposure.

- Reduce the amount of time spent using your cell phone;
- Use speaker mode or a headset to place more distance between your head and the cell phone.

Hands-Free Kits

Hands-free kits may include audio or Bluetooth[®] headsets and various types of body-worn accessories such as belt-clips and holsters. Combinations of these can be used to reduce RF energy absorption from cell phones.

Headsets can substantially reduce exposure because the phone is held away from the head in the user's hand or in approved body-worn accessories. Cell phones marketed in the U.S. are required to meet RF exposure compliance requirements when used against the head and against the body.

Because there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from cell phones, there is no reason to believe that hands-free kits reduce risks. Hands-free kits can be used for convenience and comfort. They are also required by law in many states if you want to use your phone while driving.

Cell Phone Accessories that Claim to Shield the Head from RF Radiation

Because there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from cell phones, there is no reason to believe that accessories which claim to shield the head from those emissions reduce risks. Some products that claim to shield the user from RF absorption use special phone cases, while others involve nothing more than a metallic accessory attached to the phone. Studies have shown that these products generally do not work as advertised. Unlike "hands-free" kits, these so-called "shields" may interfere with proper operation of the phone. The phone may be forced to boost its power to compensate, leading to an increase in RF absorption.

Children and Cell Phones

The scientific evidence does not show a danger to any users of cell phones from RF exposure, including children and teenagers. The steps adults can take to reduce RF exposure apply to children and teenagers as well.

- Reduce the amount of time spent on the cell phone;
- Use speaker mode or a headset to place more distance between the head and the cell phone.

Some groups sponsored by other national governments have advised that children be discouraged from using cell phones at all. For example, The Stewart Report from the United Kingdom made such a recommendation in December 2000. In this report, a group of independent experts noted that no evidence exists that using a cell phone causes brain tumors or other ill effects. Their recommendation to limit cell phone use by children was strictly precautionary; it was not based on scientific evidence that any health hazard exists.

Your wireless mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the exposure limits for Radio Frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government.

These FCC RF exposure limits are derived from the recommendations of two expert organizations: the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurement (NCRP) and the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE). In both cases, the recommendations were developed by scientific and engineering experts drawn from industry, government, and academia after extensive reviews of the scientific literature related to the biological effects of RF energy.

The RF exposure limit set by the FCC for wireless mobile devices employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The SAR is a measure of the rate of absorption of RF energy by the human body expressed in units of watts per kilogram (W/kg). The FCC requires wireless devices to comply with a safety limit of 1.6 watts per kilogram (1.6 W/kg). The FCC SAR limit incorporates a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection to the public and to account for any variations in measurements.

SAR tests are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC with the mobile device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the mobile device while operating can be well below the maximum reported value. This is because the mobile device is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output of the mobile device.

Before a new model mobile device is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified to the FCC that it does not exceed the SAR limit established by the FCC. Tests for each model mobile device are performed in positions and locations (e.g. near the body) as required by the FCC.

For typical operations, this mobile device has been tested and meets FCC SAR guidelines. Use of other accessories may not ensure compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines. Operating Environment
