## 1. The Basics

## Front View of Your Phone



## Key Features

1. Earpiece lets you hear the caller and automated prompts.
2. Main LCD (display) displays the phone's main menu, features, modes, etc.
3. Softkey (left) lets you select the menu corresponding to the bottom left line on the Main LCD.
4. Navigation Key lets you navigate quickly and easily through the menu options. You can access the menu shortcuts by pressing Right: Contacts list, Left: My Favorites, Up: Messaging, and Down: My Content.
5. MENU/OK lets you access the phone's menus and select menu options.
6. Camera Key lets you access the Pictures menu and take pictures and videos.
7. TALK Key lets you place or receive calls, answer Call Waiting, or use Three-Way Calling.
8. Microphone to speak into or record your voice.
9. Accessories Connector connects accessories such as the travel charger (included).
10. Keypad lets you enter numbers, letters, and characters, and navigate within menus. Press and hold keys 2-9 for speed dialing.
11. SPEAKER Key lets you place or receive calls in speakerphone mode.
12. END/POWER Key lets you turn the phone on/off, end a call, or return to standby mode.
13. Side Camera/Voice Memo Key lets you activate the camera, video and voice memo mode and take pictures and videos, or record voice memos.
14. BACK Key lets you display the previous page or clear characters from the screen.
15. Side Voice/Call Key lets you place calls by using Automatic Speech Recognition.
16. Softkey (right) lets you select the menu corresponding to the bottom right line on the Main LCD.
17. Accent Plate Release Button lets you remove the accent plate.
18. Camera Lens the built-in camera lens lets you take pictures and videos.
19. Flash the built-in flash lets you take pictures and videos in low light.
20. Normal/Macro Switch lets you switch between normal and macro for close-up shots.
21. Speaker lets you hear different ringers and sounds. You can mute the ringer when receiving incoming calls by pressing ENDO, ore or any of the side keys.
22. LED Indicator shows your phone's connection status at a glance.
23. Sub LCD lets you monitor the phone's status and see who's calling without opening the phone.
24. Antenna fully extend the antenna for the best reception.
25. Headset Jack allows you to plug in an optional headset for convenient, hands-free conversations.
26. 10-4 Button allows you to access the 10-4 List. (See "Displaying the $10-4$ List" on page 101.)
27. Side Volume Key lets you adjust the receiver volume during a call or ringer volume in standby mode. You can also use it to scroll up or down to navigate through the different menu options.

## Turning Your Phone ON and OFF

## Turning Your Phone ON

- Press Endo

Once your phone is ON, it displays "Looking for service..." which indicates that your phone is searching for a signal. When your phone finds a signal, it automatically enters standby mode. At this point, you are ready to begin making and receiving calls.

If your phone is unable to find a signal after 15 minutes of searching, a Power Save feature is automatically activated. When a signal is found, your phone automatically returns to standby mode.

In Power Save mode, your phone searches for a signal periodically without your intervention. You can also initiate a search for service by pressing any key (when your phone is turned ON).

Tip: The Power Save feature helps to save your battery power when you are in an area where there is no signal.

## Turning Your Phone OFF

- Press and hold END/O until you see the powering down animation on the display screen.

Your screen remains blank while your phone is off (unless the battery is charging).

## Using the Battery

## Installing the Battery

- To install, insert the battery into the opening on the back of the phone and gently press down until the latch snaps into place.



## Removing the Battery

1. Make sure the power is off so that you don't lose any stored numbers or messages.
2. Press the battery release latch up and remove the battery from the phone at a 45 -degree angle.


## Charging the Battery

Your phone comes with a rechargeable battery. You should charge the battery as soon as possible so you can begin using your phone.
Keeping track of your battery's charge is important. If your battery level becomes too low, your phone automatically turns off and you will lose all the information you were just working on. For a quick check of your phone's battery level, glance at the battery charge indicator located in the upper-right corner of your phone's display screen. If the battery charge is getting too low, the battery icon $\square$ appears and the phone displays a warning message.

Always use an approved travel charger or vehicle power adapter to charge your battery.

[^0]Note: Long backlight settings, searching for service, vibrate mode, and browser use affect the battery's talk and standby times.

## Using the Travel Charger

1. Plug the travel charger into a wall outlet.
2. Plug the other end of the travel charger into the phone's charger jack (with the battery installed).

- The battery icon turns to when charging is complete.

Tip: Be sure to watch your phone's battery level indicator and charge the battery before it runs out of power.

## Displaying Your Phone Number

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Contacts.
3. Select My Phone\#.
 Menu items may be selected by highlighting them with the navigation key and pressing or you can press the number corresponding to the menu item on your keypad.

## Changing the Accent Plate

- To remove, press the accent plate release button down and remove the accent plate from the phone.

- To install, fit the hooks into the notches on the front of the phone and press down firmly until it snaps into place.



## Making and Answering Calls

## Making Calls

To place a call using your keypad:

1. Make sure your phone is on.
2. Enter a phone number from standby mode. (If you make a mistake while dialing, press ance to erase one digit at a time. Press and hold to erase the entire number.)
3. Press TALK or Grenie
4. When you're finished, press

## Tip: Press ©TALK or Grewir to display the Recent Calls list. Highlight a number and press TALK or बrame to make a call.

Important: When you use your phone to maximize performance, extend the antenna and do not touch the antenna.


## Dialing Options

Dialing options are displayed when you press Options (right softkey) after entering numbers in standby mode.

- Abbrev. Dial to dial the phone number in your Contacts list that ends with the digits you entered. (See "Using Abbreviated Dialing" on page 22.)
- Call to dial the phone number.
- Call:Speaker On to dial the phone number in speakerphone mode.
- Send Message to send a Text SMS message (page 119), or a Picture message (page 138).
- Save Phone\# to save the phone number in your Contacts list. (See "Saving a Phone Number" on page 19.)
- Find to display Contacts list entries that end with the digits you entered. (See "Finding a Phone Number" on page 20.)
- H Hard Pause to insert a hard pause. (See "Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses" on page 20.)
- T 2-Sec. Pause to insert a 2-second pause. (See "Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses" on page 20.)
- Hyphen to insert a hyphen manually where you like.

Tip: To speed dial a phone number, press and hold the appropriate Speed Dial location from 2-9. See page 69 for setting.

## Answering Calls

To answer an incoming call with the flip open:

1. Make sure your phone is on. (If your phone is off, incoming calls go to voicemail.)
2. Press TALK or ©eaker to answer an incoming call. (Depending on your phone's settings, you may also answer incoming calls by opening the phone or by pressing any number key. See "Setting Any Key Answer" on page 48 for more information.)

## To answer an incoming call with the flip closed:

1. Make sure your phone is on. (If your phone is off, incoming calls go to voicemail.)
2. When your phone rings or vibrates, press and hold the Side Voice/Call key ( $\quad$ ) on the right side of the phone. (The call will be answered in speakerphone mode.)

- or -

Open the phone to use the earpiece.
Note: If the setting for Open Flip is set to No Action, opening the phone will not answer the call. (See "Setting the Open/Close Flip Option" on page 49.)

Your phone notifies you of incoming calls in the following ways:

- The phone rings and/or vibrates.
- The LED flashes.
- The backlight illuminates.
- The screen displays an incoming call message.
- If available, the phone number of the caller is displayed.
- If the phone number is in your Contacts list, the contact's name is displayed.

The following options are also displayed by pressing Options (right softkey).

- Answer to answer the call.
- Answer:Speaker to answer the call in speakerphone mode.
- Answer on Hold to put the call on hold. (See "Setting Answer on Hold" on page 14.)
- Screen Call to answer the call by using pre-recorded announcement. See page 97 for setting up.
- Quiet Ringer to mute the ringer. (This feature appears when the ringer is set.)

Note: If your phone is off, incoming calls go to voicemail.

## Setting Answer on Hold

This feature allows you to hold an incoming call when you cannot answer immediately.

To set Answer on Hold:

1. When you receive an incoming call, press Options (right softkey).
2. Select Answer on Hold. (The caller hears a message while waiting for you to answer. $6_{\mathrm{H}}$ will display on the screen while the call is on hold.)

To resume the call:

- Press Answer (left softkey) or TALK.
- Or -

Press Options (right softkey), select Answer or Answer:Speaker.

## Ending a Call

With the flip open:

- Close the phone or press ENDO.

With the flip closed:

- Press and hold ©

Note: If the setting for Close Flip is not set to End, closing the phone will not end the call. (See "Setting the Open/Close Flip Option" on page 49.)

Tip: Time/Date is displayed when you press sacre while the phone is in use.

## Using the Speakerphone

The speakerphone feature lets you hear audio through the speaker and talk without holding the phone. When the speakerphone is activated, use the Side Volume key or press the navigation key up or down to adjust the volume.

To turn the speakerphone on during a call:

- Press SPRAKR
- or -

Press Options (right softkey), select Speaker On.
To turn the speakerphone off during a call:

- Press speakir.
- or -

Press Options (right softkey), select Speaker Off.
Warning! Due to higher volume levels, do not place the phone near your ear during speakerphone use.

## Changing the Ringer Volume

To change the ringer volume, adjust the Side Volume key when the phone is open and in standby mode.

Note: To change the ringer volume from the main menu, see "Adjusting the Phone's Volume Settings" on page 30.

## Adjusting Volume During a Conversation

Whether you need to hear more or less of a conversation, adjust the Side Volume key or press the navigation key up or down during a call.

## Muting a Call

To mute a call:

- Press Options (right softkey), select Mute. (When the phone is muted, "Muted" appears on the display.)

To unmute a call:

- Press Options (right softkey), select Unmute.

Tip: To use this feature with the flip closed, press (located on the side of your phone).

## Displaying the Missed Call Notification

When an incoming call is not answered, the Missed Call log and the icon are displayed on your screen.

To call the Missed Call entry:

- Press talk or speaker.

Tip: If you have two or more notifications, the Missed Alerts list will appear.

To erase the Missed Call log:

- Press Dismiss (right softkey).

Tip: To check the missed notification from standby mode, press and select Missed Alerts.

## Calling Emergency Numbers

You can place calls to 911 (dial © $\mathbf{~ © ~} \mathbf{9} \mathbf{1}$ and press TALK), even if your phone is locked or your account is restricted. Once the dial is made, you will enter Emergency mode.

Press Options (right softkey), select an option.

- Speaker $0 n$ to activate speakerphone mode. (If you are in speakerphone mode, the option will appear as Speaker Off to deactivate.)
- Unlock Phone to unlock your phone (appears only if the phone is locked).
- Close Menu to close the pop-up menu (appears only if the phone is unlocked).

Tip: Press My Phone (left softkey) to display your phone number during Emergency mode.

To exit Emergency mode:

1. Press END/O.
2. Press Options (right softkey) to display the options.
3. Select Exit Emergency.

Note: When you are in Emergency mode, you can only exit from the options menu.

To select Emergency mode options:

1. Press endo during a 911 call.
2. Press Options (right softkey).

- Call911 to call 911.
- Call 911:Speaker to call 911 in speakerphone mode.
- Exit Emergency to exit Emergency mode.

3. Select an option.

## In-Call Options

During a call, your phone displays menu options by pressing Options (right softkey).

- Flash to answer an incoming call while putting the current call in Call Waiting or connect a third party for a Three-Way Call.
- Mute to mute your phone's microphone. Select Unmute to reactivate the microphone.
- Speaker On or Speaker Off to activate or deactivate speakerphone mode.

Warning! Due to higher volume levels, do not place the phone near your ear during speakerphone use.

- Three -Way Call to call a third party.
- Missed Alerts to display missed notifications.
- Call History to access the Call History menu. (See "Managing Call History" on page 61.)
- Contacts to access the Contacts menu. (See "Contacts Directory" on page 65.)
- Messaging to access the Messaging menu. (See "Messaging" on page 117.)
- Tools to access the Tools menu. (See "Personal Organizer" on page 72.)
- Settings to access the Settings menu. (See "Your Phone's Settings" on page 27.)

## End-of-Call Options

To display the following options, press Options (right softkey) within 10 seconds after disconnecting a call.

- Call Again to dial the phone number.
- Call:Speaker On to dial the phone number in speakerphone mode.
- Save Phone\# to save the phone number in your Contacts list. Go to Phone Book appears when the number is already in your Contacts list. (See "Saving a Phone Number" below.)

Note: The End-of-Call options are not displayed for calls identified as No ID or Restricted.

## Saving a Phone Number

Your phone can store up to seven phone numbers in each of 500 Contact entries with up to 700 total numbers. Each entry's name can contain 16 characters. Your phone automatically sorts the Contacts alphabetically.

1. Enter a phone number.
2. Press Options (right softkey).
3. Select Save Phone\#.
4. Select a label.
5. Enter a name and press

Once you have stored an entry in the Contacts list, you are prompted to select the following entry modes:

- New Name to enter a new name.
- From Ph. Book to select a name from the Contacts entry list.

6. Press Save (left softkey).

## Finding a Phone Number

You can search Contacts list entries for phone numbers that contain a specific string of numbers.

1. Enter the last four or more digits of the number and press Options (right softkey). (The more numbers you enter, the more specific the search becomes.)
2. Select Find. (The Contacts entry that ends with the digits you entered appears.)
3. Highlight your desired entry.

Press 앙 to display the entry details.
Press talk or sfeaker to dial.

## Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses

You can dial or save phone numbers with pauses for use with automated systems, such as voicemail or credit card billing numbers.

There are two types of pauses available on your phone:

- Hard Pause sends the next set of numbers when you press talk.
- 2-Sec. Pause automatically sends the next set of numbers after two seconds.

Note: You can have multiple pauses in a phone number and combine 2-second and hard pauses.

1. Enter the phone number and press Options (right softkey).
2. Select either Hard Pause or 2-Sec. Pause. Hard Pauses are displayed as a "H" and 2-second pauses as a "T".
3. Enter additional numbers.
4. To dial the number, press TALK or ©eaker. (When dialing a number with a hard pause, press TALK to send the next set of numbers.)

- or -

To save the number in your Contacts list, press Options (right softkey), select Save Phone\#.

## Dialing From the Contacts Directory

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Contacts.
3. Select Find/Add Entry.

Shortcut: Press the navigation key right to list entries.
4. Use your navigation key to scroll through the Contacts list and select one of the appropriate entries.
5. Highlight the number you wish to call.
6. Press Options (right softkey) for the menu options.
7. Select Call or Call:Speaker On.

Tip: You can also make a call by pressing TALK, Geaker, or Call (left softkey) during step 5 above.

Note: The icon next to each entry represent the Contacts labels (for example, Mobile, Home, Work, etc.). A triangle next to an icon means there is another label for the entry. Press the navigation key right or left to select the desired label.

## Using Speed Dialing

With this feature, you can dial Speed Dial entries using one key press for locations 2-9. (See page 69 for storing a Speed Dial number.)

To use speed dial for voice calls:

- From standby mode, press and hold the appropriate key for approximately two seconds.
- Or -

From standby mode, press the appropriate key and press talk or sfeaker.

The display confirms that the number has been dialed when it shows "Connecting...".

To use speed dial for 10-4 calls:

- From standby mode, press the appropriate key then press $\cdots$. (See "Setting Speed Dialing for 10-4 Entries" on page 113.)

The display confirms that the number has been dialed when it shows " 10-4 calling...".

## Using Abbreviated Dialing

Abbreviated Dialing allows you to dial a number by entering 3-6 digits of any number in your Contacts Directory. (See "Setting Abbreviated Dialing" on page 58.)

1. Dial the last 3-6 digits of a contact's phone number.
2. Press talk or speaker.

Tip: If the Phone Book Match setting is on, you need to select an entry from a list before placing a call. (See page 58 for setting.)

Note: If there is no matched number, your phone dials the number you set for abbreviated dial with the last four or five digits you entered. If there are matched numbers in your Contacts list, the abbreviated dial list will be displayed. To place a call, select a number and press Talk.

## Selecting a Character Input Mode

Your phone provides convenient ways to enter words, letters, punctuation, and numbers whenever you are prompted to enter text (for example, when adding a Contacts entry or when sending Email, text, picture or video messages).

1. When you display a screen where you can enter text, press Mode (right softkey).
2. Select a character input mode:

- Add Word to store words that you use frequently.
- Canned Messages to enter canned messages. (For Text.)
- Recent Messages to enter messages used recently. (For Text Message only.)
- Signature to enter your signature (see page 42).
- T9Word to enter characters using T9 Text Input (see page 24).
- Alphabet to enter characters by using the keypad.
- SYMBOL to enter symbols.
- NUMBER to enter numbers.
- PRESET SUFFIX to enter a preset suffix.
- SMILEYS to enter smiley pictures.
- Emoticons to enter an emotion icon. (For Text Message only.)
- Select Language to select the language (English or French).
- Erase All to erase all text (if applicable).
- Paste to paste copied or cut text (if applicable).
- Select Text to select stored text for copying or cutting.

## Entering Characters Using T9 Text Input

T9 Text Input lets you enter text in your phone by pressing keys just once per letter. (To select the T9Word mode when entering text, see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 23.)

T9 Text Input analyses the letters you enter using an intuitive word database and creates a suitable word. (The word may change as you type.) To accept a word and insert a space, press spece\# or

Tip: The key is available only when the Auto Space setting is on (see page 50).

If you make a mistake, press ancy to erase a single character. Press and hold mack to delete a word.

## Adding a Word to the T9 Database

If a word you want to enter does not display as an option when you are using T9 Text Input, you can add it to the database.

To add a word to theT9Text Input database:

1. Select Add Word mode. (See "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 23.)
2. Enter the word using the keypad (Alphabet) and press

Save (left softkey).

- or -

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Settings.
3. Select Others.
4. Select Text Entry.
5. Select Add Word.
6. Enter the word using the keypad (Alphabet) and press Save (left softkey).

## To edit or erase the words you have added:

1. Follow steps $1-4$ on page 24 .
2. Select My Words.
3. Highlight your desired word and press Options (right softkey).
4. Select an option.

- Edit to edit a word in My Words.
- Erase to erase a word in My Words.


## Customizing the T9 Settings

1. Press 领 to access the main menu.
2. Select Settings.
3. Select Others.
4. Select Text Entry.
5. Select T9 Settings.
6. Select your desired option.

- Predict.Txt Mode to allow T9 text input to recognize words you have added to the T9 database.
- Word Choice List to display word choice list.
- Show aft enter to select digits number (1-3 digits) to display the words choice list. The word choice list will display based on the number of digits you selected.
- Show aft wait to select how many seconds the phone should wait to display the word choice list.


## Entering Characters Using the Keypad

To enter characters using the keypad, select the Alphabet mode (see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 23). Press the corresponding key until the desired character appears. By default, the first letter of a word is capitalized and following letters are lowercase.

- To deactivate this feature, select Normal during step 3 above.

Your phone and TTY device will connect via a special cable that plugs into your phone's headset jack. If this cable was not provided with your TTY device, contact your TTY device manufacturer to purchase the connector cable.

- Home Only: This setting allows you to access the home network only and prevents roaming on other networks.

You＇ll find the Call History feature very helpful．It is a list of the last 20 voice calls and 10－4 calls for each call or 10－4 call that you placed，accepted，or missed．Call History makes redialing a number fast and easy．It is continually updated as new numbers are added to the beginning of the list and the oldest entries are removed from the bottom of the list．

1．Press to access the main menu．

## 2．Select Call History．

3．Select Outgoing，Incoming，Missed，or Recent Calls．
4．Select the entry you wish to view．
Tip：You can switch the Voice Call history to the 10－4 call history by pressing 10－4（left softkey）．To return to the Voice Call history，press Voice Call（left softkey）．

## Setting the Alarm Clock

To set the alarm clock:

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Tools.
3. Select Alarm Clock.

Tip: Press Settings (right softkey) to set the Ringer Length or Snooze Interval.
4. Select the desired entry to access the Alarm Clock menu.
5. Select the box under the following items.

- Description to enter a description of the alarm.
- Time to enter the alarm time. Enter the desired alarm time and press
- Repeat to select the alarm frequency.
- Alarm to set the alarm On or Off.

6. Press Save (left softkey) to save the alarm settings.

Note: Depending on the Power On to Alert setting, the alarm setting will be active even if the phone is turned off. (See "Setting Power On to Alert"on page 47.)

## To stop the alarm:

Tip: Press On/0ff (left softkey) to toggle between countdown alarm on and off.

## Using the Calculator

1. Press
2. Select Tools.

4. Enter numbers using your keypad. Press the left softkey to insert a decimal point.
5. Press the appropriate navigation key for an arithmetic option.
(Up for addition, Down for subtraction, Left for multiplication, Right for division)
6. Enter numbers and press for the result.

- To clear the numbers, press CLR (right softkey).


## Using the World Clock

This feature is available only in digital areas.

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Tools.
3. Select World Clock.
4. The World Clock display appears.

- Press the navigation key right or left for changing city or country.

Tip: Press Summer (left softkey) or Standard (right softkey) for changing between summer and standard time, if applicable. The icon is shown while summer time is displayed.

## Using the Stop Watch

To start the stop watch:

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Tools.
3. Select Stop Watch.

- Press Start (left softkey) to start the stop watch.
- Press Stop (left softkey) to stop the stop watch.
- Press Resume (left softkey) to start the stop watch again.

To record a lap time while the stop watch is running:

- Press Lap (right softkey) to record time of first lap.
- Press Lap (right softkey) again to record next lap. (You may continue this until lap 5.)

To display the stop watch options:

1. During stop watch operation, press Options (right softkey).
2. Select an option.

- Go to Lap List to display a saved Lap List. Press Detail (left softkey) to display the lap list details.
- Save to Lap List to save the recorded lap times.
- Reset to reset the time to zero and clear any recorded lap times.


## Printing Pictures Using PictBridge

Your phone is PictBridge compatible, allowing you to print directly from your phone without connecting to a computer. Simply connect your phone to a PictBridge-enabled printer using the supplied USB cable and enjoy printing your photos.

## Printing Pictures Directly From Your Phone

1. Press to access the main menu. (Make sure your phone is fully charged.)
2. Select Tools.
3. Select PictBridge.
4. Select Yes.
5. Connect your phone to the PictBridge-enabled printer by using the supplied USB cable. (Wait until the connection is completed.)
6. Select the print mode from Default Printer, Standard Print, or Index Print.
7. Set the printer settings using your navigation key.

- Picture to Print: You can select the picture from the In Phone folder. (You can select up to 99 pictures.)
- Number of Copies: You can set the number of copies (1-10). (You cannot specify number of copies when Index Print is selected.)
- Print Size: You can set the print size from Default Printer, 4 "x6", 5 " $\times 7$ ", 8 " $\times 10$ ", or Letter. (Print Size differs depending on the type of printer you have.)
- Date Stamp: You can imprint the date on your pictures. Select On or Off. (Correct Date Stamp may not be placed depending on the type of printer you have.)

8. When you are finished selecting the printer settings, press Print (right softkey).
9. When finished printing, press ENDO or acer.
10. Select Yes. Follow the instructions on the display to unplug the USB cable from the phone.

Note: The Index Print mode lets you print out an index sheet of thumbnail
pictures. You will only be able to print Exif JPEG files.

Note: While you are connected to the printer, your phone's screen will display "Phone Off." You cannot make or receive calls.

Note: Make sure your battery is fully charged before using the PictBridge.

PictBridge Error Messages: From time to time you may encounter printing problems. Any printer error messages will be displayed on your phone, informing you of the specific problems encountered. Please refer to the user's guide that came with your printer for descriptions, explanations, and possible resolutions for any error messages.

## 9. Voice Services <br> Using Automatic Speech Recognition

Your phone is equipped with an Automatic Speech Recognition (ASR) feature. This feature allows you to make calls or use the phone's functions by simply using your voice. All you have to do is to talk into the phone, and the phone will recognize your voice and complete tasks by itself. You can activate Automatic Speech Recognition whether the phone is open or closed.

## Activating Automatic Speech Recognition

## To activateAutomatic Speech Recognition:

- From standby mode, press $\cdot \boldsymbol{m}$.

The phone displays the Command menu and prompts you to say the name of the command you want to use. To complete your task, simply follow the voice prompts. You can speak the command after you hear a beep and your phone displays the 1

The following is a list of availableASR commands:

- Contact to call an entry in your Contacts list. (See page 87 for details.)
- Dial Number to dial a phone number by speaking the number. (See page 88 for details.)
- Find Contact to find an entry stored in your Contacts list. (See page 88 for details.)
- Goto <menu item> to open an item in the main menu. (See page 94 for details.)
- International to make an international call. (See page 91 for details.)
- Call Voice Tag to call the name or phone number stored in the Voice Tag List. (See page 89 for details.)
- Tools to select additional commands from Digit Training, Add Voice Tag, Review Voice Tag, Erase Voice Tag, or Phone Status.
- Help to get instructions for Automatic Speech Recognition. (See page 94 for details.)
- 10-4 to place a 10-4 call from the 10-4 List. (See page 92 for details.)

Tip: You can also activate Automatic Speech Recognition by pressing and holding talk or speake. Say onscreen commands to continue.

Note: If your phone is unable to recognize an ASR command after three attempts, an error message will appear on the display and the phone will return to standby mode.

Note: Use the Automatic Speech Recognition feature in a quiet environment to correctly recognize so it can accurately identify your voice.

Note: When you speak the command, don't get too close to the microphone and make sure you speak clearly and distinctly in your natural voice.

Note: If you want to hear a voice prompts to guide you during an ASR operation, you need to enable voice prompt. (See page 29 for setting.)

## Making a Voice Call by Using ASR

With ASR, you can make a voice call by speaking a name, phone number, or using a voice tag.

To make a voice call by speaking a name:

1. Press $\quad \square$ to activate the Command menu.
2. Say "Contact" to your phone.
3. Say the full name of a contact in your Contacts list (e.g., "John Jones").
4. Say the phone type you'd like to call (e.g., "Mobile").

Shortcut: To execute several commands at a time, you can also say several commands continuously (e.g., "Contact, John Jones, Mobile").
5. The phone will automatically place a call if it recognizes your voice.
6. When you are finished, press ENDO.

Note: If the phone does not recognize the name, the phone will find the closest match in your Contacts list and display a list of up to three names. You will hear the voice prompt "Did you say..." followed by the matched name. You can confirm the name by saying "Yes," or change the selection by saying "No."

Tip: During ASR operation, you can also select your desired items by using the navigation key or pressing available softkeys on the display.

To make a call by speaking a phone number:

1. Press om to activate the Command menu.
2. Say "Dial Number" to your phone.
3. Say the digits of the phone number using a natural voice.

Shortcut: You can also say "Dial Number" followed by the number you want to call.
4. The phone automatically places the call if it recognizes your voice.
5. When you are finished, press END/D.

Note: If the phone does not recognize the number, the phone will find the most likely match number and display a list of up to three numbers. You will hear the voice prompt "Did you say..." followed by the matched number. You can confirm the number by saying "Yes," or say "No" to change the selection.

## Finding Contacts List Entries

This feature allows you to find an entry in your Contacts list by saying the name.

1. Press all to activate the Command menu.
2. Say "Find Contact" to your phone.
3. Say the full name of a contact in your Contacts list (e.g., "John Jones").
4. The phone will display the contact details for the recognized name.
5. To make a call, select the desired number from the list by using your navigation key and press talk or speaker.

## Making a Call Using a Voice Tag

With a voice tag you record, your phone will automatically dial a phone number. Your phone can store up to 20 voice tags. (To create a voice tag, see "Programming a Voice Tag" below.)

1. Press on to activate the Command menu.
2. Say "Call Voice Tag" to your phone.
3. Say your recorded voice tag.
4. The phone automatically places the call if it recognizes your voice.
5. When you are finished, press ENDO.

## Programming a Voice Tag

1. Press $\because 1$
2. Say "Tools."
3. Say "Add Voice Tag."
4. Say the digits of the phone number.
5. Say "Yes" to confirm or "No" to cancel.
6. Say the name you want to add.
7. Respond to the prompt by repeating the name after the beep. (You will hear a confirmation that voice tag has been successfully saved.)

Tip: Record voice tags in a quiet environment.

## Reviewing Voice Tags

1. Press to activate the Command menu.
2. Say "Tools."
3. Say "Review Voice Tag." (A review list will display and you will hear all of the names and phone numbers saved in the voice tag list.)

Tip: During step 3 above, you can make a call to the highlighted number by pressing talk or sfeaker.

## Erasing a Voice Tag

1. Press $\quad m$ to activate the Command menu.
2. Say "Tools."
3. Say "Erase Voice Tag."
4. Say the name you want to erase from your voice tag list. (The name will be repeated and you will be asked to verify it.)
5. Say "Yes" to confirm or "No" to cancel. (You will hear a confirmation that the voice tag has been successfully erased.)

Tip: You can erase all voice tags through your phone's Settings menu. (See "Erasing All Voice Tags" on page 55.)

## Phone Status Command

This feature uses a voice prompt to tell you your phone number and current signal strength.

1. Press $\because$
2. Say "Tools."
3. Say "Phone Status." (You will hear your current phone status and phone number.)

## Making International Calls by Using ASR

Your phone's ASR Dialing feature allows you to make international calls by speaking the digits of the country code.

1. Press on to activate the Command menu.
2. Say "International."
3. Say the digits of the country code.
4. Say the digits of the phone number.
5. The phone automatically places the call if it recognizes your voice.
6. When you are finished, press ENDO.

Note: If the phone does not recognize the country code/number, the phone will find the most likely match code/number and display a list of up to three numbers. You will hear the voice prompt "Did you say..." followed by the matched code/number. You can confirm the number by saying "Yes," or say "No" to change the selection.

## Making a 10-4 Call by Using ASR

You can place a 10-4 call by using automatic speech recognition from your 10-4 List. To make a 10-4 call, your phone's $10-4$ mode must be set to Enable. (See "Setting 10-4 Mode" on page 100 for details.)

To make a 10-4 call:

1. Press to activate the Command menu.
2. Say "10-4." (The Command menu of your 10-4 List will display.)
3. Choose from one of the following options:

- Contact to place a 10-4 call from the Personal List.
- Group to place a 10-4 call from the Personal Groups.
- Company Contact to place a 10-4 call from the Company List (if applicable).
- Company Group to place a 10-4 call from the Company Group List (if applicable).
- Dial Number to place a 10-4 call by speaking a number.
- Help to activate the Automatic Speech Recognition instruction for 10-4 calls.

4. Say "Contact," "Group," "Company Contact," "Company Group," or "Dial Number."
5. Say the contact's name in your 10-4 List or the digits of the 10-4 number. (Wait for the prompt.)
6. Respond to the prompt by saying the name or group name.

- To place the call, press … (See "Making and Receiving a $10-4$ Call" on page 102 for details.)

Tip: If you say "Contact" or "Dial Number" during step 4 above, you can say following commands continuously (e.g., "Contact, John Jones" or "Dial Number, 999-999-9999").

Tip: To redial the last $10-4$ call by using ASR, press and hold $\boldsymbol{\omega}$ on the side of your phone.

Tip: You can also make a 10-4 call by using ASR with the flip closed. Press and hold $\cdots$, and follow the voice prompts.

## Using Digit Training

This feature allows you to train the phone to recognize your voice when speaking a phone number. You can get better recognition accuracy by programming your intonation pattern into your phone.
To program DigitTraining:

1. Press to activate the Command menu.
2. Say "Tools."
3. Say "Digit Training."
4. Say "Start" or press Start (left softkey) to start programming.
5. Follow the voice prompts and recite the digits into your phone's microphone. (A voice prompt will indicate the current rate of adaptation.)
6. Respond to the voice prompt repeatedly until adaptation is complete. (When you are finished training, you will hear a confirmation that the adaptation has been successfully completed.)

Note: Try digit training in a quiet environment for the best results. When you train, make sure you speak clearly and distinctly in your natural voice.

## To activate DigitTraining:

1. Press to activate the Command menu.
2. Say "Tools."

## 3. Say "Digit Training."

4. Say "On" or press On (right softkey) to activate the existing data. (A voice prompt will announce the activation of digit training.)

## To deactivate DigitTraining:

1. Press an to activate the Command menu.
2. Say "Tools."
3. Say "Digit Training."
4. Say "Off" or press Off (right softkey) to deactivate the existing data. (A voice prompt will announce the deactivation of digit training. The adaptation returns to its default setting.)

## Opening the Main Menu by Using ASR

This feature allows you to open an application or access a menu by saying "Goto" followed by an item in the main menu.

1. Press oil to activate the Command menu.
2. Say "Go to" and the menu you want to open (e.g., "Go to Messaging").
3. The main menu you have chosen will open.

## ASR Help Command

This feature will help you learn the basics of using automatic speech recognition.

1. Press aim to activate the Command menu.
2. Say "Help." (You will hear a brief summary of available automatic speech recognition commands.)

## Managing Voice Memos

You can use your phone's Voice Services to record brief memos during a call.

## Displaying the Voice Memo Menu

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Voice Services.
3. Select Voice Memo.

## Recording Voice Memos

To record a voice memo:

1. From the voice memo menu, select Record or Rec.:Speaker.
2. Start recording after the beep.
3. Press ?

To record the other party's voice during a phone call:

1. During a call, press Options (right softkey).
2. Select Tools.
3. Select Voice Services.
4. Select Voice Memo.
5. Select Record.
6. Start recording after the beep.
7. To finish recording and the conversation, press endo.

Note: Your phone can store up to 12 memos and the total available recording time is 72 seconds (maximum of 18 seconds per memo).

## Reviewing Voice Memos

1. From the voice memo menu, select Play or Play:Speaker.
2. Select one memo from the list.

- or -

If you want to play all memos continuously, select All.
3. Press to stop playing.

- You can change the message playing speed by pressing Slow (left softkey) or Fast (right softkey).

Tip: To set the speakerphone mode on or off, press Options (right softkey), select Speaker On/Off during step 2 above.

## Erasing Voice Memos

To erase all voice memos:

1. From the voice memo menu, select Erase All.
2. Highlight Yes.

To erase an individual memo:

1. From the voice memo menu, select Play or Play:Speaker.
2. Highlight the memo you want to erase, and press Options (right softkey).
3. Select Erase.
4. Select Yes.

## Setting Up Screen Call

This feature enables you to answer incoming calls by using prerecorded announcements, either one that is pre-recorded or one that you record.

## Activating Screen Call

To start Screen Call when you have incoming calls:

1. When the phone rings or vibrates, press Options (right softkey) to display the options.
2. Select Screen Call.

To setAuto Screen Call:

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Voice Services.
3. Select Screen Call.
4. Select Auto.
5. Select On.

- If you want to change the answer time, enter your desired number by using numeric keys or pressing the navigation key up or down.

6. Press or (left softkey). The ${ }^{(\sqrt{2})}$ icon is displayed on the Standby display.

Tip: If a new caller's message is waiting, $\boldsymbol{B}$ appears on the display. The memos recorded while activating "Screen Call" are shown with the $d$ or \%icon in the list. (f) once played, 8 : not played yet)

Tip: While the caller is recording: Pressing ENDO stops recording and disconnects the call. Pressing TALK answers the call.

## Selecting an Announcementfor Screen Call

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Voice Services.
3. Select Screen Call.
4. Select Announcement.
5. Depending on your preference, select Pre-Recorded or Custom.

## Recording Name for a Pre-Recorded Announcement

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Voice Services.
3. Select Screen Call.
4. Select Announcement.
5. Highlight Pre-Recorded and press Edit (right softkey).
6. Select Record Name.

- If your name has already been recorded, select Yes or No for overwriting.

7. Press to start the 1st recording.
8. Press to stop recording.
9. After the 1st recording, press again to start the 2nd recording.
10. To stop recording, wait for 12 seconds or press

## Recording a Customized Announcement

1. Follow steps $1-4$ on page 98.
2. Highlight Custom and press Edit (right softkey).
3. Select Record.

- If your announcement has already been recorded, select Yes or No for overwriting.

4. Press to start the 1st recording.
5. Press to stop recording.
6. After the 1 st recording, press again to start the 2nd recording.
7. To stop recording, wait for 12 seconds or press 융

## Reviewing an Announcement

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Voice Services.
3. Select Screen Call.
4. Select Announcement.
5. Highlight Pre-Recorded or Custom and press Edit (right softkey).
6. Select Play or Play:Speaker.

## Erasing an Announcement

1. Follow steps 1-5 above.
2. Select Erase Name to erase name for Pre-Recorded announcement.

- or -

Select Erase to erase message for Custom.
3. Select Yes.

## 10. 10-4

10-4 allows you to enjoy quick, two-way, "walkie-talkie-style" communication with your friends, family, and co-workers. You can make 1-to-1 or 1-to-many calls (up to 5 others on the same call) to any other 10-4 user, anywhere on the Network. You can make and receive 10-4 calls when your phone displays.

## Setting 10-4 Mode

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Settings.
3. Select 10-4.
4. Select Enable/Disable.
5. Select Enable. (The default setting is Disable.)

- Enable: Lets you make or receive 10-4 calls any time your phone is not in use.
- Disable: Disables your phone's 10-4 service; you will not be able to make or receive 10-4 calls or access your 10-4 contacts.


## 10-4 Call Alerts

There are several ways your Phone alerts you during 10-4 calls.
When you make or receive a 10-4 call:

- The phone beeps (depending on the Ringer Type).
- The backlight illuminates.
- The screen displays a 10-4 call message.
- The other party's 10-4 number and name (if available) are displayed.
- The screen displays who has the floor.

The status of a 10-4 call:

- The Green LED On indicates you have the floor and may speak.
- The Red LED On indicates another contact has the floor.
- The LED Off indicates the floor is open. (You can take the floor and speak by pressing and holding $\boldsymbol{\cdots}$.)


## Displaying the 10-4 List

- From standby mode, press 10-4 (left softkey) or the 10-4 button on the side of your phone $(\cdots)$ to access the $10-4$ List.

Tip: The first time you access the list, the 10-4 Help message will appear. Press Yes (left softkey) and Next (left softkey) to read a brief introduction of 10-4.

## Selecting Contacts Lists

When your phone displays a 10-4 List, the left softkey is labeled Goto. To switch to another contacts list, press the left softkey, select your desired list.

- Company List/Company Grps. contain company-provided contacts (up to 200 entries). Your company list can only be created and modified by an authorized administrator on the $10-4$ server. When the lists are empty, Company List/ Company Groups will not appear on the display. You cannot add, edit, or delete Company List items, but you can copy entries to your Personal List/Personal Groups.
- Personal List/Personal Grps. contain your personal 10-4 contact names and numbers, separately or in groups. You can create and edit your own Personal List. Your phone can store a total of 200 entries (you may include up to five contacts per group).
- Outgoing shows the last 20 different 10-4 calls you placed.
- Incoming shows the last 20 different 10-4 calls you accepted.
- Missed shows the last 20 10-4 calls you missed.

Tip: You can also select Enter 10-4\# from Go to option to enter a 10-4 number directly. See page 103 for details.

Note: The icon next to the group name indicates a group.

## Making a 10-4 Call (1-to-1 Call)

You can place a 1-to-1 10-4 call by selecting a contact from the 10-4 List.

1. Press $\cdots$ to access the $10-4$ List.
2. Press Go to (left softkey), select the list from which you want to place a call (Company List, Personal List, Outgoing, Incoming, or Missed).
3. Highlight the contact you want to call, and press and hold $\ldots$ to place the call and get the floor. (You will see $10-4$ calling... and Connecting... followed by "You have floor." You can now begin speaking.)

- or -

Highlight the contact you want to call and press and release $\ldots$ to place the call. (The call will connect as described above, but "Floor is open." will appear on the screen and either you or your contact may press and hold $\boldsymbol{\cdots}$ to take the floor and speak.)

Note: During a 10-4 call, the "floor" is the right to speak. When you see "Floor is open.," the first person to press the 10-4 button ( $\boldsymbol{\omega}$ ) can speak (while holding the button). Only the person who has the floor can speak. The phone beeps if you press the 10-4 button when another contact has the floor.
4. Continue holding $\cdots$ as you speak. When you are finished speaking, release the $10-4$ button to allow other contacts to speak. (When the other party takes the floor, you will see the speaker's name and phone number and the text "has floor.")
5. When you are finished, press

Note: When neither party has the floor during a 10-4 call, "Floor is open." appears on the display. If no one takes the floor for 20 seconds, the 10-4 call ends automatically.

Tip: If you press TALK or Grakis during step 3 above, you can make a standard voice call.

## Making a 10-4 Call (Group Call)

You can make a $10-4$ call to all members in a Group entry, which you have in your 10-4 List. You can communicate with up to five members at a time.

1. Press $\cdots$ to access the $10-4$ List.
2. Press Go to (left softkey), select the list from which you want to make a Group call (Company Grps. or Personal Grps.).
3. Highlight the group you want to call, and press and hold $\cdots$ to place the call and take the floor. (You will see 10-4 calling... and Connecting... followed by "You have floor." Continue with the 10-4 call as described previously.)

- To make a 10-4 call to a group member, select your desired group, highlight your desired group member, and press and hold ...
- The phone beeps if you press the 10-4 button when another contact has the floor.

4. When the call is finished, press END/D.

## Making a 10-4 Call by Entering a Number

1. From standby mode, enter the 10-4 number you want to dial.
2. Press $\cdots$ to place the $10-4$ call.
3. Continue with the $10-4$ call, pressing and holding $\cdots$ to speak and releasing it to allow others to reply.
4. When the call is finished, press END/O.

- Or -

1. Press $\cdots$ to access the $10-4$ List.
2. Press Goto (left softkey), select Enter 10-4\#.
3. Enter the 10-4 number you want to dial.
4. Follow steps 2-4 above.

## Missed Call Notification for 10-4 Calls

When an incoming 10-4 Call is not answered, the Missed Call Notification and the $\mathrm{e}_{4}$ icon are displayed on your screen.

To call the last Missed 10-4 Call:

- Simply press $\cdots$ while the Missed Call Notification is displayed. (Continue with the 10-4 call as described previously.)

To erase the Missed 10-4 Call Log:

- Press Dismiss (right softkey).


## Receiving a 10-4 Call

1. Make sure your phone's $10-4$ mode is enabled (see "Setting $10-4$ Mode" on page 100).
2. When you receive a $10-4$ call from a contact, "10-4 Call," the contact's name, and the 10-4 number appear on the display.

- When you receive a group call, "Group Call" appears.

3. If the person placing the call has kept the floor (held the 10-4 button), you will see the contact name and 10-4 number along with "has floor.," and you will hear the caller speaking.
4. When the caller finishes speaking and releases $\cdots$, you will see "Floor is open." on the display screen. Press and hold $\ldots$ to take the floor and reply to the caller. (You will see "You have floor." and hear a tone confirming that you may speak.)
5. When the conversation is finished, press endo.

Tip: You can also receive a 10-4 call with the flip closed. Press and hold $\ldots$ to take the floor when the floor is open.

## 10-4 Options

When you use 10-4, several user options are available by pressing Options (right softkey).

- Edit to edit a 10-4 number and/or name. (See page 109.)
- Send Message to send a text message, picture, or video. (See page 119 or 138 for details.)
- Copyto Personal to copy a contact to the Personal List. Copy Group appears when you highlight a group. (This option doesn't appear if the entry is already in the Personal List or when you select Personal List/Personal Groups.)
- Copy to Ph. Book to copy a contact to the Contacts List.
- Erase to erase a contact. Erase Group appears when you highlight a group.
- Add Contact to add a new contact. (See page 108 for details.) Add Group appears when you highlight a group list. (See page 109 for details.)
- Erase 10-4 List to erase entries saved in the 10-4 List (except Company List/Company Groups).
- Help to see the 10-4 instruction page.


## Copying an Entry to Personal List or Personal Group List

You can copy an entry to your Personal List/Personal Groups from several different sources. If the selected entry is already stored in the Personal List/Personal Groups, the "copy" option does not appear.

1. Press $\cdots$ to access the $10-4$ List.
2. Press Go to (left softkey), select the list from which you want to copy an entry (Company List, Company Grps., Personal Grps., Outgoing, Incoming, or Missed).
3. Highlight the entry you want to copy (or scroll to highlight the Redial entry at the top of your screen) and press Options (right softkey). Select an option.

- Copy to Personal to copy the contact to the Personal List (if available).
- Copy Group to copy the group to the Personal Group List (if available).

4. If the entry has no name, enter a name.
5. Press Yes (left softkey) to copy and save the entry to your Personal List or Personal Group List.

## Saving a 10-4 Number

You can save a 10-4 number from the ending display to your Personal List/Personal Groups.

1. From the ending display, press Save (right softkey).
2. Enter a name and press
3. Press Save (left softkey).
4. Press Yes (left softkey).

## Finding an Entry in the 10-4 List

You can find your desired entry by entering a few letters.

1. Press $\cdots$ to access the $10-4$ List.
2. Press Go to (left softkey), select your desired list (Company List, Company Grps., Personal List, or Personal Grps.).
3. Enter the first letter or the first few letters of the name.

- The display shows the list beginning with the letter(s) you entered.

4. Scroll through the list and press to select your desired entry.

## Adding a New Contact to Your Personal List

You can store the total of 200 entries in the Personal List/ Personal Groups.

1. Press $\cdots$ to access the $10-4$ List.
2. Press Go to (left softkey), select Personal List.
3. Select <Add Contact>.
4. Enter a name for the new contact and press (This is the name you will see when calling or receiving a call from the contact.)
5. Select the 10-4 Number field, enter the contact's 10 -digit 10-4 number (their phone number) and press
6. Press Save (left softkey) to save the new contact to your Personal List.

## Adding a New Group to Your Personal Group List

You can add new groups to the Personal Group List. Each group can include up to five members. You can enter a group member directly, or select the member from the Company List or Personal List.

1. Press $\cdots$ to access the $10-4$ List.
2. Press Go to (left softkey), select Personal Grps.
3. Select <Add Group>.
4. Enter a Group Name, press (left softkey).
5. To add contacts to the group, press Add (right softkey).
6. Select one item from the following:

- New to add a new contact. See the previous page for details.
- from Company to add a contact from your Company List (if applicable).
- from Personal to add a contact from your Personal List.

7. Scroll to select the contacts you want to add and press or Pick (right softkey) to include the entries.
8. Press Done (left softkey) when you are finished selecting contacts, then press Update (left softkey) to update your Personal Group List with the new group entry.

## Editing a Contact in Your Personal List

1. Follow steps $1-2$ in "Adding a New Contact to Your Personal List" on page 108.
2. Highlight the entry you want to edit and press Options (right softkey).
3. Select Edit.
4. Select the field you want to edit (Name or 10-4 Number).
5. Edit the entry, press $\mathbf{O K}$ (left softkey), and press Save (left softkey) to save your changes.

## Editing a Group in Your Personal Group List

1. Follow steps 1-2 in "Adding a New Group to Your Personal Group List" on the previous page.
2. Highlight the group entry you want to edit and press Options (right softkey).
3. Select Edit.
4. Edit the group name and press or $\mathbf{O K}$ (left softkey).

- If you don't need to edit the group name, press Next (left softkey) during step 4 above and skip step 5.

5. Press Save (left softkey) to save your changes.
6. To edit a group member, highlight the contact you want to edit and press Options (right softkey).

Options:

- Edit to edit a group member's name and 10-4 number.
- Erase to erase the group member.
- Add New to add a new group member in the Personal Group List.
- Add (Company) to add a new group member from the Company List.
- Add (Personal) to add a new group member from the Personal List.
- Details to display a group member's information.

7. Select Edit.
8. Select the field you want to edit (Name or 10-4 Number).
9. Edit the entry, press 0 (left softkey), and press Save (left softkey) to save your changes.
10. Press Update (left softkey) to update your Personal Group List.

## Erasing an Entry in Your Personal List or Personal Group List

To erase a contact or a group:

1. From the 10-4 List, press Go to (left softkey), select Personal List or Personal Grps.
2. Highlight the entry you want to erase and press Options (right softkey).
3. Select Erase.

- Erase Group appears when you select Personal Groups.

4. Select Yes.

To erase a group member:

1. From the $10-4$ List, press Go to (left softkey), select Personal Grps.
2. Select your desired group to display the group members.
3. Highlight the contact you want to erase and press Options (right softkey).
4. Select Erase.
5. Select Yes.
6. Press Update (left softkey) to update your Personal Group List.

## Erasing a 10-4 List

You can erase all entries saved in the 10-4 List (except Company List/Company Groups).

1. From the 10-4 List, press Options (right softkey).
2. Select Erase 10-4 List.
3. Select your desired option.

Options:

- Outgoing to erase all outgoing 10-4 calls.
- Incoming to erase all incoming 10-4 calls.
- Missed to erase all missed 10-4 calls.
- All Calls to erase all 10-4 call history, except redial.
- All Personal Ent. to erase all entries in Personal List and Personal Groups. You are prompted to enter your 4-digit lock code. (See "Unlocking Your Phone" on page 52.)

4. Select Yes.

Tip: The Redial number will not be erased.

## Updating the Company List and Personal List

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Settings.
3. Select 10-4.
4. Select List Update.

## Setting Speed Dialing for 10-4 Entries

1. Press
2. Select Contacts.
3. Select Speed Dial\#s.
4. Select an unassigned number.
5. Press Go to (left softkey), select the list from which you want to set a speed dial (Company List, Company Grps., Personal List, or Personal Grps.).
6. Select the contact.

- or -

Select the group, and select an option.

- Assign to assign the selected group as a speed dial.
- Details to display the group details. You can select the group member from the group list.

To use Speed Dial for a 10-4 entry:

- From standby mode, press the appropriate key and press $\cdots$.


## Setting 10-4 Guard

This feature enables you to display the warning message when you cannot receive 10-4 calls. The warning message appears when you are launching the Web.

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Settings.
3. Select 10-4.
4. Select 10-4 Guard. (A message will appear.)
5. Press 0 (left softkey) to continue.
6. Select On.

## Setting Ringer Types for 10-4 Calls

1. Press
2. Select Settings.
3. Select 10-4
4. Select Sounds.
5. Select Ringer Type.
6. Select 10-4 Calls, 10-4 Missed, or 10-4 Floor Tone.
7. Select your desired ringer type.

## Setting Vibrate Pattern for 10-4 Calls

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Settings.
3. Select 10-4.
4. Select Sounds.
5. Select Vibrate Type.
6. Select 10-4 Calls or 10-4 Missed.
7. Select your desired vibrate pattern.

## Setting an Alert Notification for 10-4 Calls

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Settings.
3. Select 10-4.
4. Select Sounds.
5. Select Alerts.
6. Select an option from the following.

- 10-4 Calls to notify you when you receive a 10-4 call.
- 10-4 Missed to notify you when you missed a 10-4 call.
- Headset Alert to notify you when you take the floor during 10-4 call with your headset.

7. Use the navigation key to select your desired option.

## Setting the Speakerphone for 10-4 Calls

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Settings.
3. Select 10-4.
4. Select Speakerphone.
5. Select On or Off.

Note: If the phone's ringer volume is set to Vibrate, Ringer off, or Silence All, the speakerphone turns off.

## Setting the Default View of the 10-4 List

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Settings.
3. Select 10-4.
4. Select Default View. (The default setting is Personal List.)
5. Select your desired list.

## Setting the Floor Display of the 10-4 Calls

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Settings.
3. Select 10-4.
4. Select Floor Display.
5. Select your desired display.

## 11. Messaging <br> New Messages

To read a message:

- When you receive new messages, the message notification and the $\square$ icon will appear. Press View (left softkey) to display the message details.

To reply to a message:

1. While the message is open, press Reply (left softkey).
2. Select Text.
3. Select Message and compose your reply or press Mode (right softkey) to select a character input mode. (See "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 23.)
4. Review your reply and press Send (left softkey).

## Displaying Messages

To display a Message from the main menu:

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Messaging.

Shortcut: Press the navigation key up to display the Messaging menu.
3. Select Text.
4. Select Inbox, Sent Mail, Pending, Drafts, or your defined folder.
5. Select the header of the message you want to see. (To display the message options, press Options [right softkey].)

To display Web Alerts:

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Messaging.
3. Select Web Alerts.
4. Select the header of the message you want to see. (To display the web alerts options, press Options [right softkey].)

To read other messages:

- Press the navigation key right to read the next message.
- Press the navigation key left to read the previous message.

> Note: Web Alerts include URLs etc. When you buy a ringer or image through your computer for your phone, your phone will receive Web Alerts. Press Go (left softkey) to go to the website and follow steps to download it to your phone.

## Sending a Text Message

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Messaging.
3. Select Send Message.
4. Select Text.
5. Select Phone Book Entry, Mobile or Email to select or enter recipients.

Tip: You can also press Others (right softkey) to select recipients from your desired list during step 5 above (if applicable).
6. Press Next (left softkey) when you are finished selecting/entering recipients (you may include up to 25 recipients).
7. To enter a message, select the box under Message.
8. Use your keypad to enter a text message (or press the right softkey to select from Canned Messages, Recent Messages, or Signature) and press OK (left softkey).
Tip: See page 41 for Canned Messages.
9. To set the message priority, select the box under Priority.
10. Select Normal or Urgent.
11. Press Send (left softkey) to send the message.

To change the recipients or to save the message as a draft, press Options (right softkey) and select Change Recipients or
Save to Drafts during steps 7-10 above.

- Change Recipients to change Recipients.
- Send Callback\# to select from None, My Phone\#, or Other to notify your recipients of your callback number. (See "Setting Your Callback Number" on page 42.)
- Save to Drafts to save the message to a Drafts folder.


## 12. Using your Phone's Camera Taking Pictures

Taking pictures with your phone's built-in camera is as simple as choosing a subject, pointing the lens, and pressing a button. You can activate the phone's camera mode whether the phone is open or closed.

To take a picture with the phone open:

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Pictures.
3. Select Camera to activate camera mode. (Additional camera options are available through the camera mode Options menu. See "Camera Mode Options" on page 122 for more information.)

Shortcut: To activate camera mode, you can also press (0) twice.
4. Using the phone's main LCD as a viewfinder, aim the camera lens at your subject.
5. Press Capture (left softkey), © (0) or the side camera/voice memo key until the shutter sounds. (The picture will automatically be saved in the In Phone folder.)
6. Press Next (right softkey) for more options:

- Take New Picture to return to camera mode to take a new picture.
- Send to Contacts to send your picture. (See page 138 for details.)
- Post to Services to access the available services. Select Update to display the latest services.
- Upload to upload the picture you just took to the online picture/video messaging web site. Depending on your settings, you may be prompted to accept an Internet connection.
- Review Media to go to the In Phone folder to review your saved pictures.
- Delete to delete the picture you just took.
- Set as to assign the picture. Select your desired option.
- Details/Edit to edit or display your picture's details. (See "In Phone folder Options" on page 136 for details.)


## To take a picture with the phone closed:

1. Press the side camera/voice memo key to activate the launch menu.
2. Select Camera.
3. Point the camera lens at the desired subject.

Note: When taking a picture with the phone closed, the subject appears as a mirror reverse image on the external display. The captured image will not be saved in reverse.
4. Press the side camera/voice memo key to take the picture.

## Creating Your Online Picture/Video Messaging Password

The first time you use any of the picture/video management options involving the online picture/video messaging web site, you will need to establish an online picture/video messaging password through your picture/video messaging phone. This password will also allow you to sign in to the online picture/video messaging website at https://mypictures.sasktel.com (for SaskTel customers) and at https://mymobilepictures.aliant.net/login.do (for Aliant customers) to access and manage your uploaded pictures/videos and albums.

1. Press

## 2. Select Pictures.

3. Select My Albums.
4. Select Online Album. (You will be prompted to create a online picture/video messaging password.)
5. Enter a four- to eight-digit password and press (You will be prompted to confirm your password.)
6. Please wait while the system creates your account.

Tip: Write down your online picture/video messaging password in a secure place.

Once you have received confirmation that your account has been successfully registered, you may upload and share pictures and access the online picture/video messaging web site.

## Camera Mode Options

When the phone is open and in camera mode, press Options (right softkey) to display additional camera options:

- Picture Mode to select picture mode from Normal, Beach/Snow, Scenery, Soft Focus, Mirror Image, Night/Dark, or Sharp.
- Flash to activate the flash. (See "Setting the Flash" on page 123 for details.)
- Zoom to zoom in on a subject. (See "Using the Zoom" on page 125 for details.)
- Self-timer to activate the camera's timer. (See "Setting the Selftimer" on page 124 for details.)
- Fun Tools to select an option from the following:
- Stitch Shot to take a stitch shot by stitching separate images together (see page 125).
- Fun Frames to select your favorite fun picture frame to decorate your picture.
- Color Tone to select a wide variety of color tones for the picture.

> Note: Stitch Shot and Fun Frames are not available when the resolution setting is 1.3 M (see "Selecting Camera Settings" on page 127 for details).

- Image Controls to select an option from Brightness or White Balance.
- Camera Settings to select your settings. (See "Selecting Camera Settings" on page 127 for details.)
- Review Media to go to your phone's In Phone folder. (See "In Phone Folder" on page 135 for details.)
- Camcorder Mode to switch to video mode. (See "Recording Videos" on page 129 for details.)
- Key Guidance to indicate the key functions in camera mode.
- Favorite Settings to select your favorite setting. (See "Setting Your Favorite Mode" on page 126.)


## Using the Normal/Macro Switch

The normal/macro switch located on the front of the phone allows you to take close-up shots. Slide the normal/macro switch to switch between Normal and Macro (close-up) modes. When you select Macro mode, the display.


Note: After using the camera for close-up shots ("Macro" mode), it is important to switch the camera back to the "Normal" setting.

Note: Placing the switch in between the macro and normal setting may result in out-of -focus images. For best results, slide the switch completely to one end or the other.

## Setting the Flash

1. From camera mode, press Options (right softkey).
2. Select Flash.
3. Select your desired option.

## Setting the Self-timer

To activate the Self-timer:

1. From camera mode, press Options (right softkey).
2. Select Self-timer.
3. Select the length of delay you want the timer to use ( $\mathbf{1 0}$ seconds or $\mathbf{5}$ seconds).

- To deactivate the Self-timer, select Off.

4. Press Start (left softkey) when you are ready to start the timer. (V) appears on the main LCD during the Self-timer countdown.)
5. Get ready for the picture. (When the timer is down to three seconds, the Self-timer icon will turn red and the phone will begin to beep.)

To cancel the Self-timer after it has started:

- Press Cancel (right softkey).

Note: While the Self-timer is active, all keys are disabled except saxy, END/O, and Cancel (right softkey).

## Taking Stitch Shots

Stitch shot allows you to stitch separate images together. With this feature, your phone's viewfinder is divided in two and you can shoot each part separately. When you shoot the first part, the camera displays a section of the first part, so you can line up the next picture with the first one.

To take a stitch shot:

1. From camera mode, press Options (right softkey).
2. Select Fun Tools.
3. Select Stitch Shot.
4. Select Vertical or Horizontal.

- Use your navigation key to switch the stitch display.

5. To take the first picture, press 엉.
6. To take the second picture, press ©(

> Note: This option is not available when the resolution setting is 1.3 M (see page 127).

## Using the Zoom

This feature allows you to zoom in on an object when you take a picture.

## To use the zoom:

1. From camera mode, press the navigation key right or left, or the Side Volume key to adjust the zoom. (The gauge bar appears.)
2. Press Capture (left softkey), (6) or the side camera/voice memo key to take the picture. (The picture will automatically be saved in the In Phone folder.)

## Using the Mini-Flashlight

This function allows you to use the phone's camera flash as a miniature flashlight. To use this function, your phone must be in standby mode with the Side Key Guard unlocked. (See page 50 for the Side Key Guard.)

To use the mini flashlight:

- With the flip closed and in standby mode, press and hold the Side Volume key ( $\boldsymbol{\sim} \| \boldsymbol{\nabla}$ ).

Note: This function doesn't apply when a Missed Call or Notification is displayed.

## Setting Your Favorite Mode

With your phone, you can customize various camera settings.
This feature allows you to save your favorite setting.

1. From camera mode, select your favorite setting. (See page 122 for Camera mode options and see "Selecting Camera Settings" on page 127.)
2. Press Options (right softkey).
3. Select Favorite Settings.
4. Press the corresponding keypad number or highlight an unassigned number and press Add (right softkey).
5. Select Yes.

Tip: You can also set your favorite mode for camcorder settings. Set your favorite setting in video mode and follow steps 2-6 above.

## Selecting Camera Settings

1. From camera mode, press Options (right softkey).
2. Select Camera Settings.
3. Select one of the following options:

- Resolution to select a picture's file size (1.3M-960x1280, Medium-480x640, or Low-240x320).
- Quality to select the picture quality setting (Fine, Normal, or Economy).
- Shutter Sound to select a shutter sound (see "Setting the Shutter Sound").
- Status Bar to switch the status bar display on or off.


## Setting the Shutter Sound

1. From camera mode, press Options (right softkey).
2. Select Camera Settings.
3. Select Shutter Sound.
4. Select an option from the following.

- Default plays the default shutter sound.
- Say "Cheez" plays a recording of the phrase "Say Cheez."
- "Ready" plays a recording of the word "Ready."
- Off makes no sound.
- Record Your Own allows you to record your own voice.

Press 领 to display options and select Record.
Press 动 to start recording. (Maximum recording time is 3 seconds.) To save the recording, press Save (right softkey).

4. Using the phone's main LCD as a viewfinder, aim the camera lens at your subject.
5. Press Record (left softkey), © (6) or the side camera/voice memo key to begin recording.
6. Press 우 , Stop (right softkey), or the side camera/voice memo key to stop recording. (The video will automatically be saved in the In Phone folder.)
7. Press Next (right softkey) for more options:

- Take New Video to return to video mode to take another video.
- Play to play the video you just took.
- Send to Contacts to send your video. (See page 138 for details.)
- Post to Services to access the available services. Select Update to display the latest services.
- Upload to upload the video you just took to the online picture/video messaging web site.
- Review Media to access the In Phone folder to review your saved videos.
- Delete to delete the video you just took.
- Set as to assign the video. Select your desired option.
- Details/Edit to edit or display your video's details.


## To take a video with the flip closed:

1. Press the side camera/voice memo key to activate launch menu.
2. Using the Side Volume key, select Camcorder.
3. Point the camera lens at the desired subject.

Note: When taking a video with the phone closed, the subject image appears in reverse on the external display. The captured image will not be saved in reverse.
4. Press the side camera/voice memo key to start recording.
5. Press the side camera/voice memo key to stop recording. (Your video will be saved automatically in the In Phone folder.)

## Video Mode Options

Several options are available from video mode.
Press Options (right softkey) to display additional options:

- Video Mode to select video mode from Normal, Beach/Snow, Scenery, Soft Focus, Mirror Image, or Night/Dark.
- Video Light to select a Video Light setting. Select On to light the video light.
- Zoom to zoom in on an object. You can adjust the zoom from 1 x to 20 x .
- Self-timer to activate the timer function. (See "Setting the Selftimer" on page 124 for details.)
- Fun Tools to select an option from the following:
- Color Tone to select a wide variety of color tones for your video.
- Fade Shot to select fade shot setting. (See "Selecting Fade Out Settings" on page 133.)
- Image Controls to select an option from Brightness or White Balance.
- Camcord.Settings to select your settings. (See "Selecting Camcorder Settings" on page 132 for details.)
- Review Media to go to your phone's In Phone folder.
- Camera Mode to switch to camera mode (if applicable).
- Key Guidance to indicate the key functions in video mode.
- Favorite Settings to select your favorite setting. (See "Setting Your Favorite Mode" on page 126.)


## Selecting Camcorder Settings

1. From video mode, press Options (right softkey).

## Storing Pictures and Videos

There are two types of storage areas for your pictures and videos that can be used separately according to your needs:

- In Phone (see below)
- Online Album (see page 141)


## In Phone Folder

The storage area of your phone is called the In Phone folder. From the In Phone folder, you can view saved pictures and videos in your phone, send them to the online picture/video messaging web site, delete images, and access additional options.

To review your stored pictures and videos in the In Phone folder:

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Pictures.
3. Select My Albums.
4. Select In Phone. (Thumbnail stills will display, up to nine at a time.)
5. Use your navigation key to view and scroll through the pictures.

## In Phone Folder Options

When you are viewing the In Phone folder, press Options (right softkey) to display the following options:

- Play to play your videos.
- Send to Contacts to send your pictures and videos. (See page 138 for details.)
- Upload to upload pictures and videos saved in the In Phone folder to the online picture/video messaging web site.
- Post to Services to access the available services. Select Update to display the latest services.
- Set as to assign the picture or video. Select your desired option.
- Delete to delete pictures and videos.

Note: Deleting data will free up memory space in your phone to enable you to take more pictures and videos. Once erased, data cannot be uploaded to your online picture/video messaging account or saved to your phone.

- Details/Edit to display phone information or edit your pictures and videos.
- Camera Mode to activate camera mode.
- Camcorder Mode to activate video mode.


## Assigned Media Folder

When you assign a picture or video, it will automatically be saved in the Assigned Media folder. The folder allows you to store copies of pictures and videos on your phone and to assign pictures and videos to various phone tasks.

To save a picture or video to the Assigned Media folder:

1. From the In Phone folder (see "In Phone Folder" on page 135), select a picture or video you wish to save to the Assigned Media folder.
2. Press Options (right softkey).
3. Select Set as.
4. Select your desired option. (A copy of the picture or video will automatically be saved to the Assigned Media folder.)

To view pictures and videos stored in the Assigned Media folder:

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Tools.
3. Select Assign. Media.
4. Select Picture or Video. (Thumbnails will display, up to nine at a time.)
5. Use your navigation key to view and scroll.

## Sending Pictures/Videos

Once you've taken a picture or video, you can use the messaging capabilities of your phone to instantly share it with family and friends. You can send a picture or video to up to 25 people at a time using their email addresses or their mobile phone number (if compatible phone).

## Sending Pictures/Videos From the In Phone Folder

1. Press (ㄴ) to access the Pictures menu.
2. Select My Albums.
3. Select In Phone.
4. Select a picture or video you wish to send. (You can select multiple pictures and videos.)
5. Press Options (right softkey) to display options.
6. Select Send to Contacts.
7. Select Phone Book Entry, Mobile, or Email to select or enter recipients.

Tip: Press Others (right softkey) to select recipients from your desired list during step 7 above (if applicable).
8. Press Next (left softkey) when you are finished adding recipients. (You may include up to 25 recipients per message.)
9. Follow the system prompts to add data, such as title, message, etc.
10. Press the appropriate softkey to send the pictures and videos.

Tip: If a message fails, you are prompted to send it manually. If you choose to send it later, the message goes to the Pending Picture Message Folder. To access the folder, from the main menu select Pictures $>$ Pic Messaging $>$ Pending.

## Sending Pictures/Videos From Messaging

You can also send picture/video messages from your phone's Messaging menu.

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Messaging.
3. Select Send Message.
4. Select Picture Msg.
5. Select Phone Book Entry, Mobile, or Email to select or enter recipients.
6. Press Next (left softkey).
7. Select In Phone or Online Albums.
8. Select the picture or video you wish to send. (You can select multiple pictures and videos.)
9. Press Next (left softkey).
10. Follow the system prompts to add data, such as title, message, etc.
11. Press the appropriate softkey to send the pictures or videos.

Tip: To take and send a new picture or video from Messaging, select Take New Picture or Take New Video during step 7 above. Then take the new picture or video, and follow the onscreen instructions to complete and send picture/video message.

## Managing Picture/Video Messages Online

## Using the Online Picture/Video Messaging Web Site

Once you have uploaded pictures and videos from your phone to your online picture/video messaging account (see "In Phone Folder Options" on page 136), you can use your personal computer to manage your pictures and videos. From the online picture/video messaging web site, you can share pictures and videos, edit album titles, add captions and organize images.

To access the online picture/video messaging web site:

- From your computer's Internet connection, go to https://mypictures.sasktel.com (for SaskTel customers) and https://mymobilepictures.aliant.net/login.do (for Aliant customers).


## Viewing Picture/Video Messages

When you receive Picture/Video Messages, its summary is automatically saved to your Picture/Video Messages folder. The entire message is saved on the Picture/Video Messages server.

To view the entire message:

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Pictures or Messaging.
3. Select Pic Messaging or Picture Msg.
4. Select Inbox, Sent Msg, or Saved Msg.
5. Select the message you want to display. (To display the message options, press Options [right softkey].)

Note: Your received and sent messages on the server are deleted for a certain fixed time. The in icon appears three days before it is deleted. To prevent deletion, save the message on the server or in your phone from the message options.

## Managing Online Pictures and Videos From Your Phone

You can use your phone to manage, edit, or share pictures and videos you have uploaded to the online picture/video messaging web site.

To view your online pictures and videos from your phone:

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Pictures.

Shortcut: Instead of steps 1 and 2 above, press (6).
3. Select My Albums.
4. Select Online Album.
5. Select an album title to display.
6. Press Options (right softkey) to display your online picture or video options.

## Uploading Pictures and Videos

1. Press to access the Pictures menu.
2. Select My Albums.
3. Select In Phone. (Thumbnail pictures will display.)
4. Select the picture(s) and video(s) you wish to upload and press Options (right softkey).
5. Select Upload.
6. Select This, Selected, or All.
7. Select "Uploads"Area.

- or -

Select Other Albums, and select your desired album.

## Downloading Your Online Pictures and Videos

From your online picture/video messaging albums display, you can select pictures or videos to download to your phone's folder.

1. From the online pictures display, select the pictures and videos you wish to download and press Options (right softkey). (See "Managing Online Pictures and Videos From Your Phone" on page 141.)
2. Select Save to Phone.

## 13. Service Features Using Voicemail

All unanswered calls to your phone are automatically transferred to voicemail, even if your phone is in use or turned off.

## Voicemail Notification

There are several ways your phone alerts you to new voicemail messages:

- By displaying a message on the screen.
- By playing the assigned ringer type.
- By blinking the LED.
- By displaying $\triangle$ at the top of your screen.


## Displaying Voicemail Details

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Messaging.
3. Select Voicemail.
4. Select Details.

## Retrieving Your Voicemail Messages

- Press and hold ■1. (Your phone will dial your voicemail box.)
- or -

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Messaging.
3. Select Voicemail.
4. Select Call Voicemail.

Note: You are charged for airtime minutes when you are accessing your voicemail from your phone.

## Clearing the Message Icon

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Messaging.
3. Select Voicemail.
4. Select Clear Count.
5. Select Yes.

## Editing Your Voicemail Number

To edit your voicemail number:

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Messaging.
3. Select Voicemail.
4. Select Edit Voicemail\#.
5. Edit your voicemail number and press

To reset your voicemail number:

1. Follow steps 1-4 above.
2. Press Options (right softkey).
3. Select Reset Voicemail\#.
4. Select Yes.

## Responding to Call Waiting

When you're on a call, Call Waiting alerts you to incoming calls by sounding beeps. Your phone's screen informs you that another call is coming in and displays the caller's phone number (if it is available and you are in digital mode).

To respond to an incoming call while you're on a call:

- Press Talk (or press Options [right softkey], select Flash or Flash:Speaker). This puts the first caller on hold and answers the second call.

To respond to an incoming call when Answer on Hold is activated:

- Press Talk (or press Options [right softkey], select Flash or Flash:Speaker). (The Answer on Hold will be automatically deactivated. See page 14 for Answer on Hold.)

To switch back to the first caller:

- Press TALK (or press Options [right softkey], highlight Flash and press

## Making a Three-Way Call

With Three-Way Calling, you can talk to two people at the same time. When using this feature, the normal airtime rates will be charged for each of the two calls.

1. Enter a number you wish to call and press talk or sheake.
2. Once you have established the connection, press TALK (or press Options [right softkey], select Three-Way Call) to put the first caller on hold.
3. Enter the second number you wish to call and press TALK (or press Options [right softkey], select Call or Call:Speaker On).
4. When you're connected to the second party, press talk again (or press Options [right softkey], select Flash) to begin your three-way call.

If one of the people you called hangs up during your call, you and the remaining caller stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first to hang up, all three callers are disconnected.

## Web

With Web on your phone, you will be able to browse full-color graphic versions - not just text versions - of your favorite website, making it easier than ever to stay informed while on the go. Check sports scores, trade stocks, and shop all on your phone.

## Launching the Web

- Press Web (right softkey).
- or -

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Web.

## Net Guard

With the Net Guard setting, the confirmation display will appear to connect to the Internet. This feature helps you avoid accidental connections. You can disable the Net Guard in the future by selecting Always Auto-Connect when the Net Guard is displayed.

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select Settings.
3. Select Internet.
4. Select Net Guard.
5. Select 0 n or Off.

- On to make the Net Guard appear when connecting to the Internet.
- Off to avoid the Net Guard when connecting to the Internet.

Note: When enabled, the Net Guard appears only once per session.
The Net Guard does not appear if the phone is merely re-connecting due to a time-out.

## Browsing the Web

## Creating a Bookmark

Bookmarks allow you to store the address of your favorite websites for easy access at a later time.

1. Launch the Web page you want to mark.
2. Press right softkey to go to the browser menu.
3. Select Mark this page.
4. Press $\mathbf{O K}$ (left softkey) to save the bookmark.

Note: Bookmarking a page does not store the page contents, just its address. Some pages cannot be bookmarked. Whether a particular Web page may be marked is controlled by its creator.

## Accessing a Bookmark

1. Access the browser menu by pressing right softkey.
2. Select View Bookmarks.
3. Select the bookmark you'd like to access to go to the website.

## Deleting a Bookmark

1. Access View Bookmarks menu as outlined above in steps 1-2.
2. Highlight the bookmark you wish to erase and press right softkey.
3. Select Delete.
4. Press Yes (right softkey).

## Going to a Specific Website

1. Launch the Web and press right softkey to display the browser menu.
2. Select Go to URL....
3. Select Address.
4. Use your keypad to enter the URL of the website you wish to go to, and press $\mathbf{O K}$ (left softkey).

Note: Not all websites are viewable on your phone.

## Reloading a Web Page

1. Launch the Web and press right softkey to display the browser menu.

## 2. Select Refresh this page.

## Restarting the Web Browser

If the Web browser appears to be malfunctioning or stops responding, you can usually fix the problem by simply restarting the browser.

1. From an active Internet connection, press right softkey to display the browser menu.
2. Select More....
3. Select Restart Browser.

## Adjusting the Browser Sound Volume

1. Launch the Web and press right softkey to display the browser menu.
2. Select More....
3. Select Preferences.
4. Select Sound Volume.
5. Highlight your desired volume level by pressing the navigation key up or down and press

## Downloading through the Wireless Web

Your phone allows you to download images (screen savers), ringers, games, etc., from a website.

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select My Content.

Shortcut: Instead of steps 1 and 2 above, press the navigation key down.
3. Select your desired data folder (for example, Games, Ringers, or ScreenSavers).
4. Select Get New to start up the browser.
5. Select your desired image or ringer file, and follow the system prompts.

## Confirming the Downloaded Data

The downloaded data will be automatically classified as games, ringers, images (screen savers) or an application folder. However, if any data has a different category, it is classified as a Dynamic folder. If data doesn't belong to any of the above categories, it is classified in the Others folder.

1. Press to access the main menu.
2. Select My Content.
3. Select your desired data folder (for example, Games, Ringers, or ScreenSavers).
4. Select the downloaded data you want to confirm.

Tip: The names of dynamic folders are variable depending on data.

## 14. Using your Phone's Media Player

## Your Multimedia Channel Options

Your new phone offers a variety of accessible audio or video channels, depending on your service plan and multimedia subscriptions. Your subscription options include a comprehensive basic service as well as a full menu of a variety of additional channel options.

- Preview Channel: This free channel lets you sample clips from all of the available channels before you make a decision to subscribe. It's like viewing the movie preview before deciding whether you want to spend the money to go see the full motion picture.
- Available Channel Options: You also have the option of subscribing to channels from an extensive menu offering. These channels are available for a monthly subscription fee and allow you unlimited access as long as you continue to pay your monthly subscription fee.


## Accessing Your Media Player's Channel Listings

It's easy to access and view the multimedia Channel Listings on your SCP-7500 by Sanyo from the phone's main menu.

To access your media player and Channel Listings:

1. Press from standby mode to display the phone's main menu.
2. Select Media Player. Your Channel Listings will display.

## Playing a Video or Audio Clip

To select and play a media clip:

1. Press from standby mode to display the phone's main menu.
2. Select Media Player to display your Channel Listings.
3. Use your keypad to enter a channel number (or use your navigation key to scroll to a channel and press 앙)
4. Scroll to the clip you would like to play and press Select (left softkey) or (The clip will automatically load and begin playing.)

Tip: When entering the specific channel number, channels $01-09$ do not require you to enter a " 0 ." For example, to access channel " 07 ," just press the " 7 " key.

## Multimedia FAOs

1. How does my phone's Multimedia Service differ from video messaging?
Multimedia Service lets you access high-quality video and audio clips provided by external sources. Video messaging lets you capture, upload and share videos that you personally create with your phone's built-in camcorder.
2. Will I know if I'm receiving an incoming call while I'm viewing or listening to an audio clip?
No. All incoming calls will roll into voicemail while you are playing a clip. If the caller leaves a voicemail, the voicemail icon will appear on the screen.
3. How long are the clips? Will I know the estimated time it will take to play the clip prior to accessing it?
Once you have selected a channel, you will see a listing of the available clips, with the clip's length appearing after the clip's title. In general, a clip's duration will depend on the story or content being provided, and can be fairly short or as long as a few minutes.
4. Can I access a multimedia clip wherever I am, as long as I have my phone?
As long as you are on the home network, you will have access to the audio and video clips.

Note: Multimedia Service does not work where service is unavailable.
5. How can I easily access a channel without having to scroll through all the channels?
Each channel will have a number to the left of it. You can simply press this number to quickly access the clips located within that channel.

Tip: When entering the specific channel number, channels 01 - 09 do not require you to enter a " 0 ." For example, to access channel " 07 ," just press the "7" key.

## 6. What does it mean when the video pauses and I see the word "loading" at the bottom of the screen?

This happens when the media player is in the process of loading the data necessary to play the clip. It typically occurs when there is heavy traffic on the network.
7. If I place my stereo headphones on and insert them into the phone's headset jack, can I close the flip while I am playing an audio (or video) clip without interrupting the clip?
Yes. When you insert your stereo headset into the phone's headset jack, the phone automatically goes into "headset mode," allowing you to close the flip and continue playing the clip (likewise, if your phone is in "headset mode," a phone call will not become disconnected by closing the flip).
8. Can I surf to a different channel while I am playing a clip? Yes. While you are playing a clip, you can use the up and down navigation keys to surf to a different channel. A small pop-up screen will appear that tells you which channel you are watching as well as other channels you have access to. Use the navigation key to scroll through the different channels. Once you find a channel that you want to watch, scroll to it and press (or simply wait approximately three seconds) and the channel will begin loading.

## 15. Safety Guidelines Maintaining Your Phone's Peak Performance

- Try not to hold, bend, or twist the phone's antenna.
- Don't use the phone if the antenna is damaged.
- Avoid exposing your phone and accessories to rain or liquid spills. If your phone does get wet, turn the power off and immediately remove the battery.


## Using Your Phone While Driving

Talking on your phone while driving (or operating the phone without a hands-free device) is prohibited in some jurisdictions. Laws vary as to specific restrictions.

- Let the person you are speaking to know you are driving; if necessary, suspend the call in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions.
- Do not take notes or look up phone numbers while driving.


## Following Safety Guidelines

To operate your phone safely and efficiently, always follow any special regulations in a given area. Turn your phone off in areas where use is forbidden or when it may cause interference or danger.

## Using Your Phone Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from radiofrequency (RF) signals. However, RF signals from wireless phones may affect inadequately shielded electronic equipment.

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic operating systems and/or entertainment systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or their representative to determine if these systems are adequately shielded from external RF signals. Also check with the manufacturer regarding any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Consult the manufacturer of any personal medical devices, such as pacemakers and hearing aids, to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF signals.

> Note: Always turn off the phone in health care facilities and request permission before using the phone near medical equipment.

## Turning Off Your Phone Before Flying

Turn off your phone or set your phone to Airplane mode before boarding any aircraft. To prevent possible interference with aircraft systems, Transport Canada regulations require you to have permission from a crew member to use your phone while the plane is on the ground.

## Turning Off Your Phone in Dangerous Areas

To avoid interfering with blasting operations, turn your phone off when in a blasting area or in other areas with signs indicating two-way radios should be turned off. Construction crews often use remote-control RF devices to set off explosives.

Turn your phone off when you're in any area that has a potentially explosive atmosphere. Although it's rare, your phone and accessories could generate sparks. Sparks can cause an explosion or fire, resulting in bodily injury or even death. These areas are often, but not always, clearly marked. They include:

- Any area where it is very humid and with inflammables.
- Fueling areas such as gas stations.
- Below deck on boats.
- Fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities.
- Areas where the air contains chemicals or particles such as grain, dust, or metal powders.
- Any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle's engine.

Note: Never transport or store flammable gas, liquid or explosives in the compartment of your vehicle that contains your phone or accessories.

## Restricting Children's Access to Your Phone

Your phone is not a toy. Do not allow children to play with it as they could hurt themselves and others, damage the phone or make calls that increase your telephone bill.

## Protecting Your Battery

The guidelines listed below help you get the most out of your battery's performance.

- Use only approved batteries and chargers. These chargers are designed to maximize battery life. Using other batteries or chargers voids your warranty and may cause damage.
- In order to avoid damage, charge the battery only in temperatures that range from $0^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ to $45^{\circ} \mathrm{C}\left(32^{\circ} \mathrm{F}\right.$ to $\left.113^{\circ} \mathrm{F}\right)$.
- Don't store the battery in a high humidity environment.
- Don't use the battery charger in direct sunlight or in high humidity areas, such as the bathroom.
- Never dispose of the battery by incineration.
- Keep the metal contacts on top of the battery clean.
- Don't attempt to disassemble or short-circuit the battery.
- Don't store the battery in high temperature areas for long periods of time. It's best to follow these storage rules:

Less than one month:
$-20^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ to $60^{\circ} \mathrm{C}\left(-4^{\circ} \mathrm{F}\right.$ to $\left.140^{\circ} \mathrm{F}\right)$
More than one month:
$-20^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ to $45^{\circ} \mathrm{C}\left(-4^{\circ} \mathrm{F}\right.$ to $\left.113^{\circ} \mathrm{F}\right)$

## Disposal of Lithium Ion (Li-Ion) Batteries

For safe disposal options of your Li-Ion batteries, please ensure that disposal of this in accordance with law and regulation.

- Do not dispose of the battery in fire; the cell may explode.
- Do not open or puncture the battery; the released electrolyte is corrosive and may cause damage to the eyes and skin.

Special Note: Be sure to dispose of your battery properly. In some areas, the disposal of batteries in household or business trash may be prohibited.

Note: For safety, do not handle a damaged or leaking Li-Ion battery.

## Cautions

Any changes or modifications to your phone not expressly approved in this document could void your warranty for this equipment and void your authority to operate this equipment. Only use approved batteries, antennas and chargers. The use of any unauthorized accessories may be dangerous and void the phone warranty if said accessories cause damage or a defect to the phone.

Although your phone is quite sturdy, it is a complex piece of equipment and can be broken. Avoid dropping, hitting, bending or sitting on it.

[^1]:    Note: The Flash menu only appears in Call Waiting and in Three-Way Calling.

[^2]:    Tip: When entering text, press the key to change letter capitalization (Abc> ABC> abc).

[^3]:    Tip: You can select Once or Repeat Alert if you select 10-4 Calls, 10-4 Missed, Voicemail, or Messaging. Repeat Alert sounds an alert every two minutes for twenty minutes. (For 10-4 Calls, it sounds for 20 seconds continuously.)

[^4]:    Note: You can insert your signature even when your signature setting is off. Press Mode (right softkey) and select Signature while composing your message.

[^5]:    Note: When you connect TTY devices, your phone will display 會 in TTY mode.

[^6]:    Note: The Close Flip feature does not apply during 10-4 calls or when you are using the speakerphone, a headset, or a car kit.

[^7]:    Note: You cannot make calls from Call History to entries identified as No ID or Restricted.

[^8]:    Note: If the number is already stored in the Personal List/Personal Groups, the "Save" softkey does not appear.

[^9]:    Note: While the phone is open and in camera mode, press『1 switch between flash modes.

[^10]:    Note: Recording time varies depending on the Quality/Length.

[^11]:    Note: Call Waiting may not be available while roaming off the home network.
