

- These safety instructions cover both the camera and its accessories Depending on which product was purchased, the camera specifications and accessories may differ.

#### CAUTIONS CONCERNING BOTH CAMERA AND ACCESSORIES

### WARNING

- If a device emits smoke, makes a strange noise, emits a strange odor, or becomes excessively hot, immediately turn off the power and proceed as follows . If a device is used under these conditions, it may cause a
  - fire or electric shock.
- Turn off the device
  - When use the docking station or AC adaptor/charger, unplug the power cord from the power outlet.
  - ③ Remove the battery. . After completing these actions, wait to make sure no more smoke comes from the device. Then take it to the dealer for
  - service. Do not try to repair or open the device yourself. ■ Do not use during a storm



 To avoid the risk of being struck by lightning, do not use the devices during a thunderstorm. In particular, if used in an open field, you have an increased chance of being struck by lightning. Quickly seek refuge in a place that will protect you

#### ■ Keep the devices out of the reach of children

#### ■ Do not get the camera wet

- This camera is not water-resistant. Do not allow it to get wet, as doing so may cause a fire or electric shock Do not use the camera in a bathroom
  - If the camera gets wet, immediately turn it off and remove the battery. Then take it to a dealer for repair. Using the camera after it has been become wet may cause a fire. electric shock, or other accident.





- Avoid using or storing the cards in places with extremely high or low temperatures, subject to direct sunlight, in a completely closed vehicle, near air conditioners or heaters, or in humid or dusty locations.
- Avoid using or storing the cards in locations where strong static electrical charges or electrical noise can be easily generated.
- Do not allow the edges of the cards to become contaminated with foreign materials. Gently wipe away any contamination with a soft, dry cloth.
- Do not carry the cards in trouser pockets, as the cards may become damaged when you sit down or make other movements that may apply force.

#### CAUTIONS CONCERNING THE BATTERY

#### ■ General precautions concerning the batteries (when using alkaline

#### batteries

- Use only alkaline batteries or other specified batteries in this camera.
   Manganese batteries cannot be used, as they have a short battery life
- and may overheat, causing damage to the digital camera.

  Use of an alkaline battery together with a Ni-Cd battery, or a new battery with an old or consumed battery. may one or a consumed battery. may one or a consumed battery. may one or a cause the batteries to leak.
- resulting in fire, injury or burns, or damage to the camera and any other nearby object.

  Use of batteries without protective casings or other inferior products may
- cause a fire, injury, or burns.

  Do not attempt to recharge dry-cell batteries.
- If the digital camera is not going to be used for a long period of time, remove the batteries and store them in a cool place. (When the batteries are removed for a long period, the time and date settings will be cleared.)
- If using rechargeable batteries instead of alkaline batteries, use after fully recharging with the exclusive battery charger. Be sure to read and understand the instruction manuals that may come with the batteries you purchase, as well as the instruction manual for the battery charger, before use.

### ■ Cautions concerning use and storage of the rechargeable Li-ion battery

- Do not use the battery with the outer covering or label removed, as

- Do not use, leave or store the battery pack near fire or inside a car exposed to the hot sun, etc. (Locations in which the temperature reaches 60°C [140°F] or higher.)
- At high temperatures, the safety mechanisms and protective devices inside
  the battery pack may be damaged by corrosion, causing an abnormal
  chemical reaction to occur, or cause the battery pack to catch fire, explode,
  leak or spew battery fluid, or generate heat. If the safety mechanisms and
  protective devices are damaged, the battery pack will become unusable.
- An environment with extremely high or low temperatures will cause the battery capacity to deteriorate and shorten the usable time, and may even shorten the battery life.
- Avoid storing the battery pack with it near full charge. It is recommended to store the battery pack when it is near fully discharged.
- If the battery pack is completely discharged, it may become unable to be recharged again. To avoid this, charge the battery pack for at least five minutes every six months.

- Please note that photography may be restricted at stage performances, shows or exhibitions, even in presentations whose purpose is entertaining or amusing individuals.
- Also note that images that are intended to be copyrighted cannot be used outside those limits defined by the regulations of the relevant copyright laws

#### ■ Cautions when cleaning the camera

### Cleaning procedure

#### 1) Turn off the camera and remove the battery.

- (For safety, remove the power cord plug of the AC adaptor from the power outlet.)
- @ Remove the dirt with a soft cloth.
- If the camera is extremely dirty,
- ③ Wipe with a soft cloth moistened with a mild detergent diluted with water and wrung dry.

#### CAUTION

- Do not use benzene or thinner products to clean the camera. Doing so may cause deformation, discoloration, or paint peeling. When using a chemically treated cloth, carefully read its instructions and warnings.
- Do not spray insecticides or volatile sprays on the camera. Do not let rubber or vinyl objects contact the camera for a long period. They may cause deformation, discoloration, or paint peeling.
- Wipe the monitor with a soft cloth that has been moistened with water and well wrung out. Wiping with a cloth soaked with a cleaning substance or chemicals will erode the finish or cause it to peel.

#### ■ Caution concerning the battery

 Periodically clean with a dry cloth the terminals (contacts) of the battery. Do not touch the battery terminals with your bare hands. Doing so will allow contaminants from your hands to adhere to the terminals and oxidize, increasing the contact resistance. If the contact resistance increases, the usable life of the batteries will diminish.

#### ■ Caution when cleaning the lens

 If the lens gets dirty, use a commercially available air blower or a cleaning cloth for photographic equipment to clean it.

#### ■ When not using the camera for a long period

- Remove the battery. However, when the battery is removed for a long time, the camera functions may begin to not work properly.
   Periodically reinstall the battery and check the camera functions.
- If the battery is left in the camera, a small amount of power is still used even if the camera is turned off. If rechargeable batteries are left in the camera for a long period, they may become completely discharged and lose their ability to be recharged again.

#### ■ Cautions concerning condensation

#### Using the camera with condensation inside it may damage the camera.

### f condensation seems likely to form

 Place the camera in a plastic bag and seal it, and then wait until the camera has reached the ambient temperature.

### Be careful of condensation under the following conditions

- When moving the camera suddenly from a cold place to a warm place.
   When the ambient temperature changes drastically, such as when a heater is
- turned on to quickly heat the room.
- When the camera is placed in the path of cool air from an air conditioner.
  When the camera is placed in a location of high humidity.

#### ■ Caution concerning undesired interference

 The camera may create undesired interference if used close to a television or radio. To avoid this type of interference, make sure the cores on the supplied cables are not removed.

# **Preparation**

1. Attach the camera strap.




- 2. Open the battery/memory card cover.
- Insert the supplied batteries with correct orientation as shown.
- 4. Insert an SD/SDHC memory card (Optional).
  - The camera has 32MB internal memory (11MB available for image storage), but you can load an SD/SDHC memory card to expand the camera's memory capacity.
  - Be sure to format the memory card with this camera before its initial usage.
- Close the battery/memory card cover and make sure it is locked securely.







- To prevent valuable data from being accidentally erased from an SD/SDHC memory card, you can slide the write protect tab (on the side of the SD/SDHC memory card) to "LOCK".
- To save, edit, or erase data on an SD/SDHC memory card, you must unlock the card.
- To prevent damaging of an SD/SDHC memory card, be sure to turn off the power when inserting or removing the SD/SDHC memory card. If inserting or removing the SD/SDHC memory card with the power on, the camera will automatically turn off.



# Initial Settings

The language & date/time needs to be set if and when:

- The camera is turned on for the first time.



# Capturing Images

Your camera is equipped with a 3.0" full color TFT LCD monitor to help you compose images, playback recorded images/video clips or adjust menu settings.

- 1. Press the **ON/OFF** button to turn the power on.
- Press the SET button, and set the camera mode to [ ].
- 3. Compose your image in the LCD monitor.
  - Pressing the <sup>0</sup>/<sub>⊕</sub> button zooms in on the subject, and enlarges the subject on the LCD monitor.
  - Pressing the <sup>∞</sup> button zooms out on the subject, and provides a wider angle image.
- 4 Press the shutter button
  - Pressing the shutter button down halfway automatically focuses and adjusts the exposure, and pressing the shutter button down fully captures the image.
  - The focus area frame turns green when the camera is in focus and the exposure is calculated
  - When the focus is not suitable, the frame of the focus area turns red



# AF Tracking Mode

Use this option to take pictures of moving subject.

- 1. Press the **SET** button, and set the camera mode to [ **III** ].
- Press the \$\subsetex \text{button, and select [(a)] icon with the 4 / ▶ buttons. Press the SET button.
- 3. To lock the desired tracking subject, press the  $\,\,\blacktriangledown\,$  button.
  - The frame automatically tracks the subject movement to focus on it continuously.
- 4. Press the shutter button down fully to capture your image.
  - When the camera fails to recognize or track the subject, the frame will turns red and blinks. After blinking of the red frame, the camera returns to unlock display.

With the camera's new "smile detection" function, this camera detects smiles so you do not miss those special moments in life.

- 2. Select [Smile Detection] with the ◀ / ▶ / ▲ / ▼ buttons, and press the SET button.
- Compose the image, and press the shutter button down fully.

# Taking and Combining Panoramic Pictures

# Recording Shots using Face Detection Technology

Face Detection Technology can identify and focus on the human faces in the image.



# Recording Video Clips

This mode allows you to record video clips at a resolution of  $320 \times 240 / 640 \times 480 / 720p$  pixels.

  - The recording of the video clip will start.
  - Pressing the shutter button one more time will end the recording of the video clip.
  - The recording time depends on the storage size and the subject of the image to be recorded.



This feature compensates for the unfavorable lighting conditions by brightening underexposed areas and balancing overexposed areas.

- Press the ▶ button.
  - The last image appears on the screen.
- Select the image that you want to edit with the ◀ /
   ▶ buttons
- 3 Press the MENU button
- Select [Dynam. Light.] with the ▲ / ▼ buttons, and press the SET button.
- Select [High] or [Low] with the ◀ / ▶ buttons, and press the SET button.
- 6. View the changes on the corrected image.
- To save your corrected image, select [Confirm] with the ◀ / ► buttons, and press the SET button.
  - When this process ends, this replaces the original image with the corrected image.





# Attaching Voice Memos

A maximum of 30 seconds of audio can be recorded as a memo for captured still images. The voice memo can be recorded only once.

- Press the ▶ button.
  - The last image appears on the screen.
- Select the image to which you want to attach the voice memo with the ◀ / ▶
  huttons
- Press the MENU button.
- 4. Select [Voice Memo] with the ▲ / ▼ buttons, and press the SET button.
- Press the SET button.
  - [a] is displayed on the screen and recording starts.
- 6. To stop recording a voice memo as it is being recorded, press the SET button again.
  - An [♠] icon is displayed with images that have been recorded with a voice memo



RE-REC mode can only be used for the recorded and selected file, and it can record voice memo repeatedly to replace the previous recordings.

A press of the **SET** button displays [ and plays back the voice memo.





Voice memo is only available for still images.



If a printer that supports PictBridge is available, images can be printed by connecting the digital still camera directly to the PictBridge-compatible printer without using a computer.

- Connect the other end of the USB cable to the USB port on the printer.
