

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Safety precautions

Damage



Turn off the power and unplug the power cord from the wall outlet immediately if the TV set begins to make any unusual noises or gives off smoke or an unusual smell. Then call your dealer for service.

Servicing



To reduce the risk of electric shock, do not remove the back of the cabinet. This TV set contains dangerous voltage.

Unstable surface and shocks



Do not place this TV set on an unstable cart, stand, shelf, or table. The TV set may fall, causing serious injury to a child or adult, and serious damage to the set. Sharp recommends securing the TV set to a stable surface or wall to prevent the set from falling due to sudden shocks or impact.

Liquid entry



Do not place a flower vase or anything else containing liquid on the TV set, as liquid spilt on the TV set can cause electrical shock or failure.

Object entry



Never insert or drop any metallic or inflammable objects into the ventilation openings of the TV set, as this can cause fire, electrical shock, or electrical failure.

Water



To prevent fire or electrical shock, do not place the TV set near a bathroom, swimming pool or other area where it may become wet.



Moisture



To prevent electrical shock, do not use the TV set in an excessively damp place.

Power cord protection



To prevent electrical shock, do not subject the AC power cord to damage by bending or twisting it, or by placing heavy items on top of it and do not place the AC power cord under the TV set. If the AC power cord becomes damaged, unplug it from the wall outlet immediately and call your dealer for service.

Ventilation



Do not place this TV set in a confined area, such as on a bookshelf or in a built-in case. Leave adequate space behind the TV for proper ventilation.

TV set position




Do place the TV set onto an even stand, table or track which size is bigger than the TV set.

If the TV set is put onto a smaller size or uneven stand, table or track may cause the TV cabinet distort.

Do not put or insert anything between TV set and the stand, table or track.

Fire prevention



To prevent fire, never place any type of candle or naked flames on the top or near the TV set.

TV set and cart combination



Television equipment and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the equipment and cart combination to overturn.

Antenna connections


Connecting to an antenna

To enjoy a clearer picture, use an outdoor antenna. The following is a brief explanation of the types of connections that are used for coaxial and feeder cables.




If your outdoor antenna uses a 75-ohm coaxial cable with a standard DIN45325 plug (IEC 169-2), plug it into the Antenna In terminal at the rear of the TV set.

If your outdoor antenna uses a 300-ohm twin-lead flat feeder, connect a 300-ohm to 75-ohm impedance converter and plug it into the Antenna In terminal at the rear of the TV set.



Connecting to an antenna via a VCR

You can also connect the TV set to the tuner on a VCR using the connection shown below.



- Remove the power cord from the power outlet before connecting the antenna to the TV set.
- When using the RF terminal connection, set the TV to channel zero to make initial adjustments for the VCR.
- Turn off the power on the TV set and the VCR being connected before making the above connections.
- Be sure the cord plugs are fully inserted in the connection terminals.
- See the operation manual of your VCR for connection details.





- When the Power indicator lights up red, press on the remote control. The Power indicator changes to green and a picture appears.

 The number of oval blocks "1" indicates the volume level. The volume bar disappears approximately three seconds after the volume has been adjusted.


- NOTE > When the Power indicator lights up red, either CH / CH on the TV can be pressed to turn on the power.
 - The channel number is displayed in green for channels tuned by Auto Tuning and displayed in yellow for channels tuned using Fine Tuning.
 - When the Power indicator lights up red, the TV is in Standby mode and power is still supplied to the TV. If you will not watch TV for a while, turn off the main power by pressing _____ on the TV set. Also, if you will not be at home for a considerable length of time, unplug the cord from the power outlet.
 - The AV1 (or SAV1), AV2, AV3 (or SAV3) or COMPONENT input channels cannot be selected using CHA / CHY on the remote control. Use TV/VIDEO to select these channels.
 - Channels that have been skipped cannot be selected. See 20.
 - The TV set and remote control illustrations and the on-screen displays in this manual may differ from their actual appearance.





Using headphones

Insert headphones plug into Headphones jack (Ω) to listen to audio with headphones.

- The audio from the speakers is turned off.
- See 29 for headphones volume adjustment.

- **NOTE** Select an appropriate volume so as not to injure your hearing.
 - To avoid injuring your hearing, do not put on the headphones before plugging them into the Headphones jack and before the power is turned on.
 - The proper impedance for the headphones is 32 ohms.
 - Remove the headphones plug from the Headphones jack when not using the headphones.



Channel/Timer display

Noise might be generated on images when playing deteriorated video tapes or when receiving broadcasts with relatively weak signals. Detail information on each wide mode

PANORAMA

Adapts the broadcast picture to 16:9 format without changing the centre of view. This is especially useful for programmes like the news when the speaker in the centre of the picture needs to be seen clearly.





FULL

Adapts the broadcast picture to 16:9 format while also stretching the centre of view. This is an advantage, for example, when you are watching sports games where there is no real fixed centre of the picture.





NORMAL

Displays 4:3 programmes in the original 4:3 format without distortion.





ZOOM (14:9)

Displays the 14:9 broadcast cinema movies in the original 14:9 format.





CINEMA

Displays the 16:9 broadcast cinema movies in the original 16:9 format.







- NOTE If the video equipment is connected to the rear terminals on the TV set, the video mode will not be automatically selected.
 - If the TV set receives a signal with noise or does not receive a signal even when the video equipment is turned on, the video mode may not be automatically selected.

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Teletext broadcasts

Teletext is an information service, organised like a magazine, which is provided by some television stations in addition to regular television broadcasting. Your television receives special Teletext signals broadcast by a TV station, processes the information and displays it graphically on the screen. News, weather and sports information, stock exchange prices, programme previews and closed captioning for the deaf are among the many services available through Teletext.


Teletext information is organised much like a magazine: according to pages and subpages. The basic unit of displayed information is the page. A sub-page is one of a series of pages.

Teletext reception is controlled by using the remote control. Refer to the appropriate button descriptions for operation of the Teletext functions.


FLOF and LIST

Depending on the TV programme, the Teletext pages are transmitted using different systems. Your SHARP TV is adjusted to receive two Teletext systems, namely FLOF and LIST, which are automatically identified by the receiver.

You can easily identify them by the manner in which they appear on the screen.





(Cancel)

Press to cancel the Teletext mode and restore the normal TV screen. Indication is shown on the screen.

In this position, the TV programme cannot be changed, being in Teletext/ Cancelled mode.

LIST (LIST)

Press to force the Teletext to LIST mode. It means that row 24 (bottom row of Teletext) will not have transmitter information, only the pages that you have previously stored in the memory.
