

W hen you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity M odule, or SIM card, with subscription details, such as your personal identification num ber (PIN) and optional services.



# W hen you turn on yourphone, the following messages may appear:

M essage	Try this to solve the problem :
InsertSIM	Ensure that the SM card is installed connectly.
Phone lock	When the phone lock feature is enabled, you must enter the password you set for the phone.
EnterPIN	W hen using the phone for the first tin e orwhen the PIN requirement is enabled, you must enter the PIN supplied with the SIM card. You can disable this feature by using the PIN lock menu.

M essage	Try this to solve the problem :
EnterPUK	YourSIM card is blocked, usually as a result of entering yourPIN inconectly several times. You must enter the PUK supplied by your service provider.

# Yourphone displays "No service," "Network failure," or "Notdone."

- W hen you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. M ove to another area and try again.
- You cannot access som e options without a subscription. Contact your service provider for m ore details.

### You enter a num ber, but the call is not dialled.

- Ensure that you have pressed the D ialkey: [~].
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone num ber.

### A nother caller cannot reach you.

· Ensure that your phone is turned on.

- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.

## Another caller cannot hearyou speaking.

- Ensure that you are not covering the built-in m icrophone.
- · Ensure that the m icrophone is close to yourm outh.
- If using a headset, ensure that it is properly connected.

### The phone beeps and the battery icon flashes.

Yourbattery is low . Recharge or replace the battery to continue using the phone.

### The audio quality of the call is poor.

• Ensure that you are not blocking the phone's internal antenna.

 W hen you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you m ay lose reception. M ove to another area and try again.

### You select acontact to call, but the call is not dialled.

- Ensure that the correct num ber is stored in the contact list.
- Re-enter and save the num ber, if necessary.

# The battery does not charge properly or sometimes the phone turns itself off.

- The battery term inalsm ay be dirty.W ipe both goldcoloured contacts with a clean, softcloth and try charging the battery again.
- If the battery will no longer charge completely, dispose of the old battery properly and replace it with a new battery.
