### **Operation procedure**

This product can be operated by the following three ways.

- · Press keys to operate.
- Tap keys on tablet keyboard with the attached stylus.
- · Tap buttons, icons and entries on screens with stylus.

This manual explains the basic operation for using keys.

### Operation buttons on the screen

- These buttons, such as "OK button" for executing operation, are indicated as "OK" etc.
- The application icons, such as [Address], are indicated as "Address" etc.

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# Caring for the unit

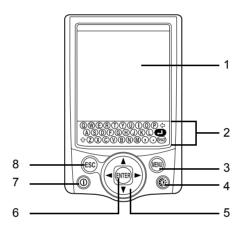
The unit contains sophisticated circuitry and a glass display panel, which can be damaged if not handled with care. A few precautions should be taken regarding the unit's care to ensure it gives you many years of reliable use.

- Keep the unit away from extreme heat. Do not leave it on the dashboard of a car
  or near any heat source. Do not leave it in any place that is extremely damp or
  dusty.
- Do not drop the unit or subject it to severe impact or extreme force.
- Do not use force when pressing on the touch panel. Do not use any sharp or pointed objects, or even your fingernails, to press on it.
- Sharp or hard objects can scratch or damage the unit. Make sure it is adequately
  protected when carried with other objects. Do not carry it loose in a bag or
  briefcase. Put it in a pocket or secure compartment within your bag.
- · Clean the unit only with a soft, dry cloth. Do not use solvents.
- Do not carry the unit in your back pocket, as it may break when you sit down. The
  display is made of glass and is very delicate.

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# **Getting Started**

### Part names and Functions



1. Displays information, selects operations, data

entry, etc.

2. Tablet keyboard: Used to input characters and execute quick

search.

3. Menu key: Opens the application menu window.

4. Backlight key: Turns the backlight on and off.

Scroll keys: Scrolls up, down, left and right through items

(icons). Scrolls index, detailed text view, etc.

6. Enter key: Selects item. Goes to next screen. (Starts

application or displays the Details screen from

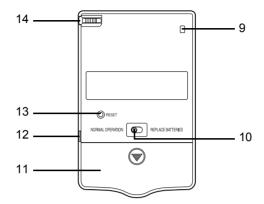
the Index screen etc.)

7. Power (ON/OFF) key: Turns the unit on and off.

8. Esc key: Returns to the previous screen. Closes a

current menu window. Jumps to the Main menu screen when pressed and held for 1

second.



9. Eyelet for the hand strap: Attach the hand strap here.

10. Battery replacement switch: Locks the battery compartment to prevent

access to the batteries.

11. Battery compartment lid: Open it when installing/removing the batteries.

12. PC-Link port: Connects PC-Link cable.

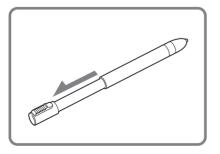
13. RESET button: Resets the unit.

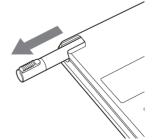
14. Stylus: Use to tap buttons and input data.

# Using the stylus

This unit comes equipped with a telescopic stylus. Remove and extend the stylus as illustrated below. To replace it, insert it until the pointed end locks into place.

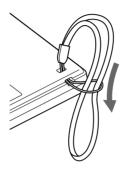






# Attaching the hand strap

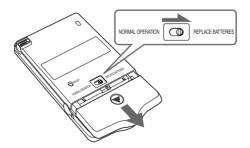
Pass the small loop of the hand strap through the eyelet and pass the other end through the loop as illustrated below.



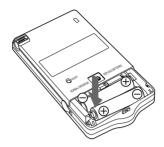
# Installing the batteries and Initializing

### Installing the batteries

- **1.** Slide the battery replacement switch on the back of the unit to the "REPLACE BATTERIES" position.
- **2.** Open the battery compartment lid, then gently remove it.



**3.** Insert two AAA batteries, making sure to position them correctly according to the plus (+) and minus (-) terminals, as illustrated below.



- **4.** Replace the battery compartment lid.
- **5.** Slide the battery replacement switch to the "NORMAL OPERATION" position. Follow the setup procedures described in "Setting up the unit" on page 13.

### Initializing

- **1.** While pressing and holding **ESC**, press and release the RESET button on the back of the unit using the stylus or similar object.
  - A message appears.
- 2. Release ESC.
- **3.** Highlight "OK" by pressing **■** and press **ENTER** (or tap "OK").

<u>Note:</u> The following data will be lost when the batteries are replaced or extremely low. It is recommended to copy important data to the Mybox folder. (See page 34, 50)

- E-Mail messages in the Inbox folder (E-Mail application).
- Attachments in the Inbox folder (Attachment Viewer application).

## Setting up the unit

After battery installation, the unit takes you through various steps needed to setup the unit before use. It is recommended to complete the entire setup procedures described below.

### Adjusting the touch panel

The Calibration screen appears.

- **1.** Tap the center of the target with the stylus.
  - The target moves to another position.
- **2.** Repeat step 1 until you tap the target at the bottom right of the screen.
- **3.** Tap "Q" followed by "P" on the tablet keyboard according to the instructions displayed on the screen.

### Adjusting the LCD contrast

After adjusting the touch panel, the Contrast screen appears.

- **1.** Press **■** or tap icons on the screen to adjust the LCD contrast.
- 2. Tap "NEXT".

### **Setting the CLOCK**

After setting the LCD contrast, the Time/Date Setting screen appears.



#### City:

- **1.** Highlight "City" by pressing and press ENTER.
- 2. Select the desired city by pressing **\( \bar{\mathbb{L}} \) \( \bar{\mathbb{T}} \) and press <b>ENTER**.

<u>Note:</u> If you type the first letter of the desired city on the tablet keyboard, a list of cities that begin with that letter appears.

#### Format:

- **1.** Highlight "Format" by pressing **▼**.
- **2.** Select the desired format by pressing  $\blacksquare$   $\triangleright$ .
- 3. Press ENTER.

#### Date:

- 2. Select the month by tapping "◀" "▶".
- 3. Select the date by using .
- 4. Press ENTER.

#### Time:

- **1.** Highlight "Time" by pressing ▼ and press ENTER.
- **2.** Press **ENTER**, adjust the hour by pressing **I**, then press **ENTER**.
- **3.** Press ▶ ENTER, adjust the first digit of the minute by pressing ▶ ▼, then press ENTER.
- **4.** Press ► ENTER, adjust the second digit of the minute by pressing ▲ ▼, then press ENTER.
- **5.** Press ► ENTER, select AM or PM by pressing ▲ ▼, then press ENTER. (The AM/PM menu does not appear if you have selected "24hr" for format.)
- 6. Press ▼ ENTER.

After setting the above, press ▼ ENTER.

### Turning the unit on and off

- 1. Press POWER to turn the unit on.
- **2.** If you want to turn the unit off, press POWER.

#### Note:

 If you cannot turn the unit on, check that the battery replacement switch is set to the "NORMAL OPERATION" position.

- If a message appears saying there is a problem, see page 123 "Troubleshooting" or page 116 "Battery replacement".
- If you do not tap the screen or operate the buttons and keys for more than the set number of minutes, the unit will automatically turn off to save the battery. For details on setting the Auto-off function, see page 104 "Adjusting the Autooff function:".
- Restarting the unit will restore the most recently used screen to the display when the resume function is turned on.
- Restarting the unit while an entry is edited will restore that entry to the display when the resume function is turned on.

# **Basic Operation**

## **Common operations**

This section explains how to select applications, entries and items, how to enter characters, and how to scroll through screens.

- · Highlight the selected application, entry or item.
- Using the scroll keys moves the highlighted position.
- Pressing ENTER executes the selected operation.
- Pressing ESC returns to the previous screen or closes a current menu window.

The Address Book application is used in the following examples. These techniques can be applied to all of the applications.

### Pressing keys and tapping buttons/icons and tablet keys

You can operate the unit by pressing keys on the unit and selecting commands from menus.

The unit can be operated by pressing the keys or tapping on-screen with the stylus.

### To open an application on the Main menu screen

The Main menu screen displays all major applications.

This outlines, how to display the Main menu screen, and how to select applications are explained here.

<u>Note:</u> You can customize the Main menu screen. See page 31 "Main menu screen" for further details.

1. Press POWER to display the Main menu screen.



**2.** Move the highlight by using ③ to select the desired icon, and press ENTER.

Or

Tap the desired application icon.

The selected application opens.

If you press **ESC**, the screen returns to the Main menu screen.

#### Note:

- If you press and hold ESC for 1 second in any screen, the screen returns to the Main menu screen.
- Pressing ESC on the Main menu screen switches the screen in the following order: Add-on menu screen → My Menu screen → Main menu screen

### **Entering characters**

This section explains general data entry techniques used to edit an existing entry or create a new one in each application.

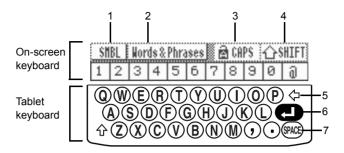
The unit has two types of keyboards: tablet keyboard and on-screen keyboard.

### The Tablet keyboard

You can input alphabet letters, commas and periods by tapping the tablet keyboard. The keyboard corresponds to a QWERTY keyboard.

### The On-screen keyboard

When you tap "New" or "Edit" in an application, the on-screen keyboard appears at the bottom of the screen, allowing you to input certain types of characters and symbols.

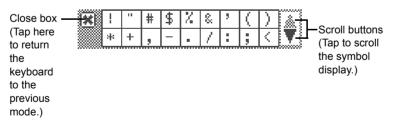


- SMBL: Enters symbols or foreign language characters.
- 2. Words & Phrases: Activates the Words & Phrases function.
- 3. **ACAPS**: Enters uppercase (capital) letters on the tablet keyboard. To cancel the function, tap " **ACAPS**" again.
- 4. SHIFT: Shifts to enter uppercase or lowercase letters when Caps lock is turned on.
- 5.  $\Diamond$  (Back space): Deletes the character to the left of the cursor.
- 6. (Carriage return): Starts a new line.
- 7. SPACE: Inserts a space.

### **Symbols**

Tap "SMBL" to display the symbol keyboard. Select the symbol display containing the desired symbol by tapping "▲" or "▼", then tap on it.

The unit automatically displays the 18 characters most recently selected.



#### Word completion feature

The word completion feature helps you enter characters by giving you four word suggestions that begin with the letters you have entered on the keyboard. In addition to easy character input, you can also store frequently used words and phrases in the user dictionary. See page 103 "Customizing the unit (Settings)" for further details.

#### Words and phrase function

You can enter a word or phrase by selecting from the preset text.

1. Tap "Words & Phrases".

The Words and Phrases screen appears.

**2.** Select the desired word or phrase by pressing **\( \bar{V} \)** and press **ENTER**.

Note: You can quickly find a word or phrase by typing it in the "Find" field.

Adding a new word or phrase:

1. Tap "Words & Phrases".

The Words and Phrases screen appears.

2. Tap "New".

The Enter Word/Phrase screen appears.

- **3.** Enter the word or phrase you want to store.
- 4. Tap "SAVE".

#### The field

Most applications divide the display into field boxes. The number and types of fields varies in each application. The field types include text, date, time, and pop-up menus.

You can enter any character in a text field.

#### The cursor

The cursor indicates the position where text will be entered or deleted.

#### **Text input**

Text input is simple. Tapping a key enters the corresponding standard letter.

To enter a lowercase letter "h", tap H.

To enter an uppercase letter "H", tap ? SHIFT to turn the keyboard to shift mode, then tap H.

**Note:** While Caps lock is active, 
♠ functions in reverse.

#### **Deleting text**

If you make a mistake while entering text, you can erase as follows:

- **1.** Move the cursor to the right of the character to be deleted.
- **2.** Press  $\triangleleft$  to delete a character to the left of the cursor.

#### Working with blocks of text

Working with a block of text is sometimes easier than working with individual characters.

#### Selecting text:

- 1. Drag the stylus over the entire text you want to work with in the Edit screen of an application. The selected text is highlighted.
- **2.** You can now perform the following operations on the highlighted text.

**Note:** While the text is selected:

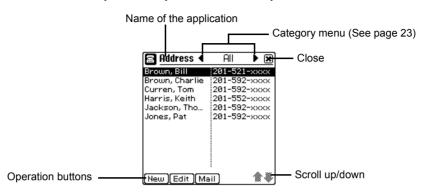
- Pressing deletes the text.
- Entering a character deletes the text and inserts the character.
- · Moving the cursor de-selects the text.

### Screens and elements in applications

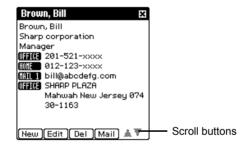
You can switch screens in any application.

For example, you can see the following screens in the Address Book application.

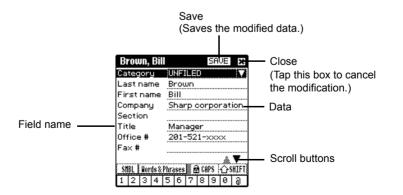
• The Index screen shows a list of entries within the application. This screen allows you to easily find a desired entry.



• The Details screen allows you to see the details of the entry.



The Edit screen allows you to modify an existing entry.



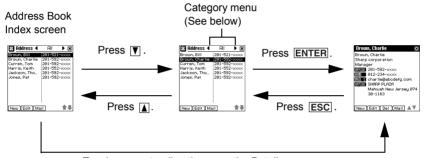
### Operations in the Index screen

When you select the Address Book application from the Main menu screen, the Address Book Index screen appears.

- 1. Highlight an entry by using .
- **2.** Press **ENTER** to open the Details screen of the highlighted entry.

Or

Tapping an entry also opens the Details screen.



Tapping an entry directly opens the Details screen.

- Each time you press \ \ \ \ \ \ \ \, the highlight moves one line at a time up or down.
- Pressing MENU displays the commands of menus available in the present screen.
   (See page 26)
- Tapping the operation button (ex. "New") executes the command (ex. creating a new entry).
- Pressing ESC returns to the Main menu screen.
- Refer to the description of the respective application regarding the screen opened by pressing <u>ENTER</u>.

### Selecting a Category

In the "All" category, all entries are displayed. You can limit the entries displayed by selecting other categories.

**1.** Select categories one by one by pressing **■ .**.

Or

Tap the category menu and then tap a category name.

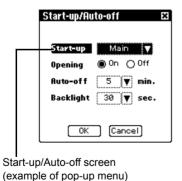
The entries in the selected category appears.

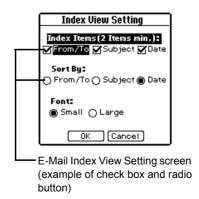
#### Note:

- In the default setting, you can select the categories "All", "UNFILED", "PERSONAL", or "BUSINESS".
- If you are using the E-Mail or Attachment Viewer application, you can select a category only with Mybox folder. To set a category, press MENU and select "Categorize ... ".
- You can create or edit a category. (See page 30)
- If you do not set a category, the category becomes "UNFILED" by default.
- You can also set a category by pressing MENU and selecting "Categorize...".
- You cannot categorize an entry into more than one category.

### Operations for pop-up menu, radio buttons, and check boxes

When you carry out a certain operation, screens that contain pop-up menu, radio buttons and check boxes may appear for selecting settings. For example, the operations in Settings screen are as follows.





#### Pop-up menu

The operations for pop-up menu in the example on the previous page are as follows.

- **1.** Highlight a pop-up menu by using .
- 2. Press ENTER.

Or

Tap the pop-up menu.

The new setting will be activated.

 $\bigcirc$ r

Press **Esc** (or tap "Cancel") to cancel the selected setting.

#### Radio buttons and Check boxes

The operations for radio buttons and check boxes in the example on the previous page are as follows.

**1.** Highlight a check box  $\square$  or a radio button  $\bigcirc$  by using  $\bigcirc$ .

Press ENTER.

Or

Tap the box or the button.

The selected item is turned on  $\nabla$  or  $\bigcirc$ .

2. Highlight "OK" by using (a) and press ENTER (or tap "OK") to store the selected setting.

The new setting will be activated.

Or

Press Esc (or tap "Cancel") to cancel the selected setting.

The former setting will continue to be active.

- In selecting a radio button, you can select only one item out of many. When you select an item , other items become unselectable .
- In selecting a check box, each time you press ENTER it switches between on and off  $\Box$ .

# **Entering data**

### Creating a new entry

1. On the Index or Details screen, tap "New".

The New Entry screen appears.

The following steps vary depending on the applications.

E-Mail application: page 42

Schedule & Calendar application: page 57

Address Book application: page 72 To Do List application: page 81 Memo application: page 88 NotePad application: page 92

### Modifying an entry

1. On the Index screen, highlight the entry you want to modify by using .

Or

Open the Details screen of the entry you want to modify.

2. Tap "Edit".

The Edit screen of the highlighted entry appears.

- Modify the entry.
- **4.** Press ENTER (or tap "SAVE") to store the modification.

If you press [ESC] (or tap the close box), a confirmation message appears asking you if you really want to throw away all of the changes. To cancel the modification, highlight "OK" by pressing 

→ and press ENTER (or tap "OK").

# Operations using the menu

### Operations using the menu

The menu system is a quick way to issue commands and perform operations. Pressing MENU displays the specific menu. Each menu contains various commands.

The menus and commands differ by application or mode currently in use.

1. Press MENU on the Address Book Index screen as an example.

The menu window appears.



2. Select a menu command (ex. "Data Deletion" command) by pressing ▲ ▼ and press ENTER.

Or

Tap a menu command.

If a menu command line has "◀" mark, the sub menu will be displayed.

If a menu command name has an ellipsis "...", the related screen will be displayed.

#### Note:

- Press ESC (or tap the close box or outside of the menu window) to return to the previous screen.
- If the menu window consists of two pages, the 1/2 page is displayed when you press MENU. To display the 2/2 page, press MENU again.

### Copying and moving text

Select the text at first. Then press  $\overline{\text{MENU}}$  and select the following commands by pressing  $\boxed{\bullet}$   $\boxed{\bullet}$  . Then press  $\boxed{\text{ENTER}}$ .

- · Cut: Cuts the selected text.
- Copy: Copies the selected text.
- Paste: Pastes the text that you have copied or cut at a selected point in a field.

### **Duplicating an entry**

You can duplicate an existing entry.

This function is convenient to create a new entry using an existing entry.

1. On the Index screen, highlight the entry you want to duplicate by pressing **★ ▼**.

Or

Display the Details screen of the entry you want to duplicate.

- 2. Press MENU.
- **3.** Select "Duplicate" by pressing **▲** ▼ and press **ENTER**.

The selected entry will be duplicated.

### **Deleting entries**

You can delete unnecessary entries. For example, you can perform the following deletion in the Address Book application for deleting a single entry.

- 2. Press MENU.
- **3.** Select "Data Deletion" by pressing **▶ ▼** and press **ENTER**.

The confirmation message appears before the entry is deleted.

**5.** Highlight "OK" by pressing **■** and press **ENTER** (or tap "OK").

The selected entry will be deleted.

If you press **ESC** (or tap "Cancel"), the deletion is canceled.

**Note:** The sub menus of "Data Deletion" differ by application.

### **Finding entries**

If you know a particular entry is in the unit, but cannot remember where, you can use the Find function.

- 1. Press MENU on the Address Book Index screen as an example.
- 2. Select "Find..." by pressing 

  ▼ and press ENTER.

The Find screen appears.



**3.** Enter the keywords and press **ENTER** to start searching.

The unit will display entries that contain the keywords you entered.

**4.** Select the entry by pressing **▲ ▼** and press **ENTER**.

The Details screen appears.

### Changing the character size

The character size of the Index and Details screens can be changed between Large and Small. The default character size is set to Small.

- **1.** Press MENU on the Address Book Index screen as an example.
- 2. Select "View Setting..." by pressing 

  ▼ and press ENTER.

The Index View Setting screen appears.



- **3.** Highlight "Font" by using ⋄, select the desired font size by pressing ▶, and then press ENTER.
- **4.** Highlight "OK" by using ⊚ and press ENTER (or tap "OK").

The Index View Setting screen returns to the previous screen.

#### Note:

- The font size setting is only active in the current application.
- Font size cannot be changed in some of the applications and screens.

### Setting secret entries

You can mark entries as secret or non-secret.

Secret entries will be hidden from screens ("Lock") in the Secret application. (See page 107)

For example, you can perform the following steps in the Address Book application.

- 1. On the Index screen, select the entry you want to hide from the screen by pressing \ \ \ \ \.
- 2. Press MENU.
- 3. Select "Secret..." by pressing 

  ▼ and press ENTER.
- **4.** Select "ON" by pressing **■** and press **ENTER**.
- **5.** Highlight "OK" by using ③ and press ENTER (or tap "OK").

The secret status icon \( \Pi \) appears to the left of the close box.

### **Editing a Category**

You can classify entries into a category for easy review.

You can also rename an existing category.

"PERSONAL" and "BUSINESS" are default categories and you can use up to 12 categories.

Note: Editing of categories in one application does not affect those in other applications.

### To rename an existing category

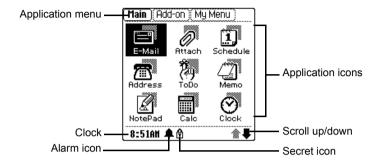
- 1. On the Index, Details screen, press MENU.
- **2.** Select "Edit Categories..." and press **ENTER**.

The Edit Categories screen appears.

- **4.** Rename the category using up to 20 characters.
- **5.** Tap "SAVE" to store the name.

### Main menu screen

The unit displays the Main menu screen when you turn on the unit.

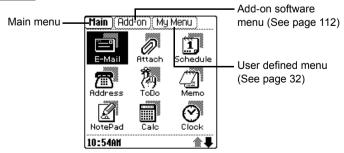


- Press ENTER or tap the desired application icon to launch it.
- Battery indicator appears only when the battery level becomes low. See page 116 "Battery replacement" for further details.
- Alarm icon 
   appears only when a schedule alarm is set in the Schedule & Calendar application.

### **Changing the Application menu**

The unit has three Application menu screens. You can select the desired screen by using the application menu at the top of the screen.

1. Press **POWER** to turn the unit on.



2. Tap the desired application menu.

#### Note:

- You can also select the menu by pressing [ESC]. Each time you press [ESC]. the screen switches in the following order: Add-on menu screen  $\rightarrow$  My Menu screen  $\rightarrow$  Main menu screen
- You can also select the menu by pressing MENU and selecting "Go to Add-on" or "Go to Mv Menu".

### **Customizing My Menu**

You can copy application icons that you frequently use on the Main menu and Addon menu screens into the My Menu screen.

- 1. On the Main menu or Add-on menu screen, highlight the application icon you want to copy by using .
- 2. Press MENU, select "Copy to My Menu" by pressing ▶ ▼, then press ENTER.

A confirmation message appears asking you if you really want to copy the selected application icon to the My Menu screen. Press ENTER (or tap "OK").

The selected application icon is now copied into the My Menu screen. You can confirm it by displaying the My Menu screen.

### Moving application icons on the screen

You can move an application icon on the screen by performing the following steps.

- **1.** Tap and hold the application icon you want to move.
- **2.** Drag the selected icon to the desired position.

When the dragged icon comes to a position where you are able to drop it, a box appears around it.

Release the stylus.

# E-Mail

You can synchronize e-mail messages between the unit and your PC by installing the PC software (OZ-800 Synchronization Software and WIZARD STATION) on the supplied CD-ROM. (See page 113)

You can view e-mail messages or browse the attachments such as Microsoft® Word documents on the unit's display.

# An overview of the E-Mail application

There are three main screens in the E-Mail application.

Index screen - you can check e-mail messages for the Inbox, Outbox, or Mybox folder

Details screen - you can read e-mail messages that are selected on the Index screen.

Edit screen - you can create a new e-mail message or edit an existing one.

### To use the E-Mail application

# Creating an e-mail message

The E-Mail application allows you to create an e-mail message.

- To reply to an e-mail message, open the Index or Details screen of the Inbox folder and tap "Reply".
- To forward an e-mail message, press MENU on the Index or Details screen of the Inbox folder and select "Forward".

**Note:** You can also reply to an e-mail message by selecting "Reply..." from the menu window.

# Creating a new e-mail message

See page 113 "Exchanging Information with Your PC (PC-Link)" and the supplied Quick Start Guide and Software Guide for details on the PC-Link.

You can create new e-mail messages to be sent. To send the message, you must transfer the message to your PC by using the PC software (OZ-800 Synchronization Software and WIZARD STATION), and then send it from your PC. You can also create draft messages.

- 1. Open the Index or Details screen of the Outbox folder or open the Index screen of the Inbox or Mybox folder.
- 2. Tap "New".

The New Message screen appears.

**3.** Enter the following items:

Recipient address (Main recipient)

CC: (Carbon copy) Enter other recipient addresses (Sub recipients), if needed.

BCC: (Blind carbon copy) Can be entered when you press MENU and tap "Enable BCC".

SUB: (Subject) Enter the mail title.

Message: Enter the mail message.

Note: When entering more than one recipient in each recipient field, enter a semicolon (;) between each address.

4. Press ENTER (or tap "SEND").

The e-mail message will be stored in the Outbox folder.

**Note:** If you want to save the e-mail message as a draft, select "Save as Draft" from the menu window

## To enter the e-mail address by using Address Book

Perform steps 1 and 2 in "Creating a new e-mail message" and then carry out the following steps.

<Adding recipients from the Address Book>

- 1. Press MENU.
- **2.** Select "Add Recipients..." and press ENTER.

The Add Recipients screen appears.

The selected recipient will be entered in the "TO" field.

#### Note:

- The recipient selected in step 3 will be entered in the field where the cursor has been placed. If you want to enter the recipient in the "CC" or "BCC" field. move the cursor to the desired field before performing the above steps.
- Tapping the "TO" field in the New Message screen also opens the Add Recipients screen.
- You can guickly find the recipient you are looking for by typing it in the "FIND:"
- Tapping any part of the recipient's entry brings the full-length e-mail address into view

#### <Smart Addressing>

**1.** Input a recipient name using the stylus.

The recipient name that begins with the input character will be found from the Address Book and displayed in the field where the cursor has been placed.

**2.** Press **ENTER** (or tap the return key).

## Replying to a message

You can reply to a message that is stored in the Inbox folder. The reply message you create will be stored in the Outbox folder.

- **1.** Open the Details screen of the Inbox folder.
- 2. Tap "Reply".

The New Message (Reply) screen appears with the "TO" field automatically

3. Create a reply and press ENTER.

#### Note:

- You can also create a reply by selecting "Reply..." from the menu window.
- If you want to reply to all persons who received the e-mail message, press MENU, select "Reply...", and then select "Reply To All" on the Reply screen.

# Forwarding a message

You can forward a message that is stored in the Inbox folder. The forwarded message you create will be stored in the Outbox folder.

- 1. Open the Index or Details screen of the Inbox folder.

- The Edit screen for forwarding appears.

Note: You cannot forward the attachments that accompany the forwarded message.

# Easy reply function

In addition to the one-hand operation of the unit, the words and phrase function provides you with an easy way to reply to messages.

1. Open the Index or Details screen of the Inbox folder.

- 2. Press MENU.
- 3. Select "Reply..." by pressing 

  ▼ and press ENTER.

The Reply screen appears.

**4.** Select "Easy Reply" by pressing 

▼ and press ENTER.

The Words and Phrases screen appears.

**5.** Select the desired word or phrase by pressing \( \bar{\bar} \) and press \( \bar{\bar{ENTER}} \).

The selected word or phrase will be entered in the "Message" field.

- 6. If necessary, tap "Words & Phrases" again and enter another word or phrase or type the sentence(s) using the tablet keyboard to complete the e-mail message.
- 7. Press ENTER (or tap "SEND").

The message will be stored in the Outbox folder.

Note: If you select "Easy Reply To All" in step 4, you can reply to all persons who received the e-mail message.

# Creating PIM data from e-mail messages

You can save time creating PIM data (Schedule & Calendar, Address Book, To Do List, Memo) by copying the desired block of text from an e-mail message to a PIM application.

- **1.** Open the Details screen of the Inbox, Outbox, or Mybox folder.
- 2. Drag the stylus over the desired block of text of the e-mail message and release the stylus.

The pop-up menu appears.

3. Select the application where you want to copy the dragged text by tapping "Create Schedule", "Create Address", "Create ToDo", or "Create Memo".

The Edit screen for a new entry of the selected application appears with the text copied into it.

**4.** Modify the text (if necessary) and create a new entry.

#### Reply...

Creates a reply.

#### Forward

Forwards message stored in the Inbox folder.

#### Add to Address Book

Sender of the selected e-mail message is added to the Address Book.

#### File to "Mybox"

Selected e-mail message in the Inbox or Outbox folder is copied to the Mybox folder.

#### Categorize...

Sets category to the e-mail message selected in the Mybox folder.

#### View Setting...

On the Index screen, selects a sorting order for the e-mail message according to "From/To", "Subject", or "Date", and changes the index item or font size. On the Details screen, changes the header display or the font size.

#### Reply Setting...

Selects whether the original message is included or not.

#### Signature...

Creates a signature and selects whether the created signature is added to the e-mail message or not.

#### Add Recipients...

The selected recipient in the Address Book is entered in the "TO", "CC", or "BCC" field of the Edit screen for a new e-mail message.

#### **Enable BCC**

Enables you to enter the "BCC" field of the Edit screen for a new e-mail message.

#### **Save as Draft**

Saves the e-mail message as a draft.

# **Attachment Viewer**

The Attachment Viewer application allows you to view documents or spreadsheet files attached to e-mail messages.

# An overview of the Attachment Viewer application

There are two main screens in the Attachment Viewer application. Index screen - you can view a list of attachments.

Details screen - you can confirm the details of an attachment.

The following files can be viewed with the Attachment Viewer application.

- If the attachment contains information on a format (leading, track, tab, font, ruled line, etc.) or images that the Attachment Viewer application does not support, the file may be laid out incorrectly.
- If an Excel file has more than one sheet, each sheet is handled as a separate file. (Empty sheets are removed.)
   Title (FileName) field has sheet order and number with original filename. (Example, "1/3-OZ800 spec. xls")

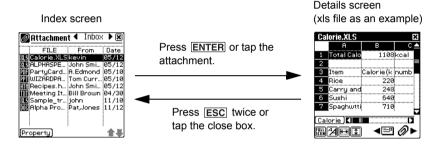

#### Selected Entry

Deletes selected attachment in the Mybox folder.

#### All in this category

Deletes all attachments in the selected category of the Mybox folder.

#### All in Mybox

Displays properties of the selected attachment.

#### File to "Mybox"

Selected attachment in the Inbox folder is copied to the Mybox folder.

# Categorize...

Sets category to the file selected in the Mybox folder.

# View Setting...

Selects a sorting order of the attachment according to "File name", "From", or "Date", and changes the font size on the Index screen.

# Schedule & Calendar

The Schedule & Calendar application allows you to organize your schedule and events.

You can view your schedule by day, week, and month. The built-in alarm reminds you of important appointments and dates.

# An overview of the Schedule & Calendar application

There are five main screens in the Schedule & Calendar application.

Monthly Index screen (Calendar) - you can view the monthly calendar with various icons indicating your schedule.

Daily Index screen - you can view a schedule list on a specified date.

Weekly Index screen - you can view weekly schedules.

Details screen - you can view the details of the schedule entry.

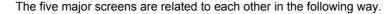
Edit screen - you can create a new entry or modify an existing entry.

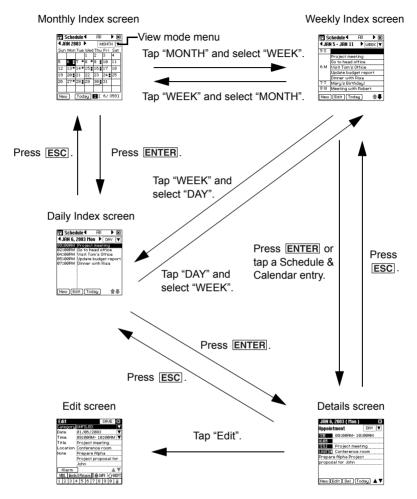
# To use the Schedule & Calendar application

# Address Book

#### When "E" appears

- When any of the following situations occur, the error indicator "E" is displayed and calculations are suspended. To clear the error, tap C.

You can select the start-up screen when the unit is turned on.

- **1.** Highlight "Start-up" by pressing **▲** ▼ and press **ENTER**.
- **2.** Select the desired start-up screen by pressing \( \bar{\mathbb{N}} \) and press \( \bar{\mathbb{ENTER}} \).

#### **Setting the Opening screen:**

You can select whether the opening screen is displayed or not when the unit is turned on.

- **1.** Highlight "Opening" by pressing **\[ \right\]** .
- **2.** Select the "On" or "Off" radio button by pressing **■ ■** and press **ENTER**.

### Adjusting the Auto-off function:

To conserve the battery power, the unit will turn itself off if it has not been used for a set number of minutes.

- **1.** Highlight "Auto-off" by pressing **▲** ▼ and press **ENTER**.
- **2.** Select the desired auto-off time by pressing  $\blacksquare$   $\blacktriangledown$  and press  $\blacksquare$ NTER.

<u>Note:</u> In order to avoid accidentally interrupting data transfers, the Auto-off function is automatically disabled while communicating with your PC.

### **Adjusting the Backlight function**

- **1.** Highlight "Backlight" by pressing **▲** ▼ and press **ENTER**.
- 2. Select the desired backlight time by pressing 🛕 🔻 and press ENTER.

After setting the above, highlight "OK" by pressing 

▼ and press ENTER (or tap "OK"). The screen returns to the Settings screen. Tap "OK" to store the settings.

### Adjusting the sound

- - The Sound Settings screen appears.
- **2.** Tap the Key Sound check box if you want to mute the sound when you press the hardware keys.
- Tap the Schedule Alarm check box if you want to mute the schedule alarm sound.
- **4.** Tap the Daily Alarm check box if you want to mute the daily alarm sound.
- **5.** Highlight "OK" by pressing ▲ ▼ and press ENTER (or tap "OK"). The screen returns to the Settings screen.
- **6.** Tap "OK" to store the settings.

### Adjusting the LCD contrast

- **2.** Press **■ ►** to adjust the LCD contrast.
- **3.** Highlight "OK" by pressing ▲ ▼ and press ENTER (or tap "OK"). The screen returns to the Settings screen.
- **4.** Tap "OK" to store the settings.

### Adjusting the touch panel (Calibration)

- **1.** Highlight "Calibration" by pressing **▲** ▼ and press **ENTER**.
- 2. Tap the center of the target with the stylus.
  - The target moves to another position.
- **3.** Repeat step 2 until you tap the target at the bottom right of the screen.
- **4.** Tap "Q" followed by "P" on the tablet keyboard according to the instructions displayed on the screen.
  - The screen returns to the Settings screen.
- **5.** Tap "OK" to store the settings.

### Adjusting the time format (Formats)

**1.** Highlight "Formats" by pressing **▲ ▼** and press **ENTER**.

The Formats screen appears.

- **2.** Highlight "Date Format" by pressing ▲ ▼, select the "M/D/Y" or "D.M.Y" radio button by pressing ▲ ▶, then press ENTER.
- **3.** Highlight "Weekly Format" by pressing ▲ ▼, select the "SUN" or "MON" radio button by pressing ◀ ▶, then press ENTER.
- **4.** Highlight "Time System" by pressing **■ ▼**, select "12" or "24" radio button by pressing **■ ▶**, then press **ENTER**.
- 5. Highlight "OK" by pressing and press ENTER (or tap "OK").
  The screen returns to the Settings screen.
- **6.** Tap "OK" to store the settings.

### Setting the word completion feature

- **2.** Set each item according to your preference.

#### To store a new word into the user dictionary

**1.** Tap "Add Word to Dictionary".

The User Dictionary screen appears.

- **2.** Type the word or phrase you want to store and tap "Add".
- 3. Press ESC .

The screen returns to the Word Completion Settings screen.

4. Press ▼ ENTER.

The screen returns to the Settings screen.

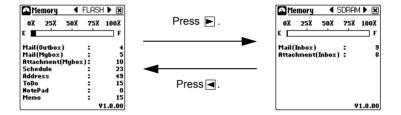
**5.** Tap "OK" to store the settings.

## **Checking memory information (Memory)**

The unit has two types of memory: flash memory and RAM (SDRAM) memory. The flash memory holds the data in Mybox and Outbox folders for both the E-Mail and Attachment Viewer applications as well as the data in another applications. The RAM (SDRAM) memory holds the data in Inbox folder for the E-Mail application and data in Inbox folder for the Attachment Viewer application.

The data stored on the RAM (SDRAM) memory will be lost when the batteries are replaced or the batteries are extremely low. To avoid losing important data in the E-Mail or Attachment Viewer application, it is recommended to copy them to Mybox folder for each application.

The Memory application allows you to check the memory usage of each memory.



### Checking the memory usage

- **1.** Highlight the "Memory" icon on the Main menu screen by using ③.
- 2. Press ENTER.

The Memory screen (FLASH memory) appears.

**3.** Press ▶ to display the Memory screen (RAM memory).

If you press ESC (or tap the close box), the Memory screen returns to the Main menu screen.

## Setting a password (Secret)

The Secret application allows you to keep selected information in the unit secure by locking it with a password that you specify. Entries that you have set as secret cannot be accessed until the unit is unlocked using the password. Individual entries can be set as secret, so that only someone who knows the password can access them by unlocking the unit.

#### Note:

- If you forget the password, but you have not yet turned the unit off, you must delete all secret entries and the password from the unit. As a safeguard, be sure to make a written record of the password.
- If you forget the password and have already turned the unit off, you must do a complete reset of the unit. When you do a complete reset of the unit, all data in the unit will be deleted. See page 115 "All reset operation" for further details.

## To use the Secret application

- **1.** Highlight the "Secret" icon on the Main menu screen by using ③.
- 2. Press ENTER.

The Secret screen appears.



If you press **ESC** (or tap the close box), the Secret screen returns to the Main menu screen.

## Setting a password and locking the unit

- On the Secret screen with "Lock" highlighted, press ENTER (or tap "Lock").
   The Lock screen appears.
- **2.** Enter a password within 20 characters.

Entered characters are displayed as "\*".

Letters, numbers, and symbols can all be used. The text field is case-sensitive, which means that upper and lower case letters are treated differently. The password "SHARP", for example, is different from the passwords "Sharp" or "sharp".

**Note:** Choose your password carefully. If you forget your password, there is no way to bypass the Secret function or enter a new password without losing all data set as secret. It is strongly recommended that you use a password that you will always be able to remember, but which other people will be unable to guess.

#### 3. Press ENTER.

The password confirmation screen appears.

**4.** Enter the password again and press ENTER.

To cancel setting a password, press **ESC**.

#### 5. Press ENTER.

 If you enter an incorrect password in the password confirmation screen, a dialog box appears showing it is incorrect.

Press ENTER and re-enter the password by performing steps 2 to 5.

• When you enter the correct password, a dialog requesting you to memorize the password appears.

Press ENTER.

"Locked." is displayed briefly and the screen returns to the Main menu screen with A displayed at the bottom of it.

**Note:** When you set a password and the security function works (locked status), the following functions are carried out.

- Hides entries you set as secret.
- Prohibits finding secret entries.
- Prohibits synchronization with PC unless the password is authenticated.
- Will not display Schedule & Calendar entries when marked as secret.
- Prohibits deleting entries in an application.

To set each entry secret, see "Setting secret entries" on page 30.

## Unlocking the unit

Entries set as secret are not shown in the unit's display when it is locked, and cannot be accessed using the find function. To be able to recall and access secret entries, the unit must first be unlocked.

1. On the Secret screen with "Unlock" highlighted, press ENTER (or tap "Unlock").



The Unlock screen appears.

- **2.** Enter the password.
- 3. Press ENTER.
- If you enter an incorrect password, a dialog box appears showing it is incorrect.

"Unlocked." is displayed briefly and the screen returns to the Main menu screen.

## Locking the unit again

On the Security screen with "Lock" highlighted, press **ENTER** (or tap "Lock"). The unit is locked again.

<u>Note:</u> The unit will automatically be locked again when the unit is turned off and then turned on.

## Deleting the password

- On the Secret screen with "Lock" or "Unlock" highlighted, highlight "Delete Password" by pressing 
   T.
- 2. Press ENTER.

The Delete Password screen appears.

3. Enter the password.

To cancel deleting the password, press **ESC**.

- **4.** Press **ENTER** to delete the password.
- If you enter an incorrect password, a dialog box appears showing it is incorrect.
   The Delete Password screen returns to the Main menu screen. The unit returns to the status with no password (Unlocked).

<u>Note:</u> To change the password, delete the password first, then set a new password.

## Deleting all secret entries and the password

If you forget the password, you have to delete all secret entries and the password in the following way.

- 2. Press ENTER.

A confirmation dialog box appears.

To cancel deleting all secret entries and the password, press **ESC**.

**3.** Press **■** ENTER.

"Deleted." is displayed briefly and the screen returns to the Main menu screen. The unit returns to the status with no password (Unlocked).

## **Entering owner information**

- 1. Highlight "Owner" icon on the Main menu screen by using ⊚ and press ENTER.
  The Owner Information screen appears.
- 2. Enter each field and tap "SAVE".

The entered information is saved.

## **About Add-on software**

Using PC software (WIZARD STATION), you can install Add-on software from your PC to the unit.

Add-on software will be saved in the Add-on menu on the unit. For details on Add-on software, refer to Software Guide.

## **Exchanging Information with** Your PC (PC-Link)

Using the included OZ-800 PC software (OZ-800 Synchronization Software and WIZARD STATION) and cable, you can exchange data with a PC. This makes it possible to transfer e-mail messages from your PC to the unit and read them while outside your home. You can also install Add-on software from your PC to the unit.

## PC software set up

- **1.** Turn off your PC and unit before connecting them with the supplied cable.
- 2. Connect the standard 9-pin connector of the supplied cable to one of the Serial Ports on your PC.
- **3.** Connect the supplied cable to the PC-Link port of the unit.
- **4.** Turn on the unit and your PC.

The connection between the unit and your PC is automatically established and the unit is now ready to exchange data.

#### Note:

- Press ESC at any time to exit the PC-Link mode. If you leave the unit in PC-Link mode, more power is consumed from the batteries than usual, and the Auto-off function will not work.
  - To conserve battery power, always press ESC to leave the PC-Link mode as soon as you have finished transferring data.
- For e-mail synchronization, only the e-mail message in the Inbox folder will be synchronized between the unit and your PC.
- For details on exchanging information with your PC, refer to the separately supplied Quick Start Guide and Software Guide.

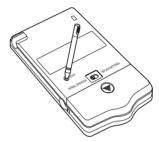

## **Appendix**

## Resetting the unit

A strong impact, exposure to an electrical field, or other unusual conditions may render the unit inoperable, and pressing the keys and tapping the buttons will have no effect. If this occurs, you will have to reset the unit by pressing the RESET button on the back of the unit using the stylus or similar object.



#### Note:

- If the unit becomes inoperable, some or all of the data stored in the memory may be lost.
- Do not use anything with a sharp tip or anything that might break to press the RESET button
- If the unit does not work properly after resetting it, remove the batteries and wait for several seconds before replacing them. Then press the RESET button.

### All reset operation

If the unit still fails to function after it has been reset using the procedure above, or you have forgotten the password to be entered in the start-up display, you will have to reset it using a slightly more complicated method:

<u>Caution:</u> When you do a complete reset of the unit, all data created and all Add-on software installed in the unit will be deleted.

While pressing and holding <u>ESC</u>, press and release the RESET button.
 A message appears.

- 2. Release Esc.
- **3.** Highlight "OK" by pressing ■ and press ENTER (or tap "OK").

## **Battery replacement**

## **General guidelines**

The unit uses the following type of batteries:

There are some important points to remember when installing new batteries:

- Replace both batteries at the same time. Use new batteries of the same type.
- The data stored in RAM memory, such as e-mail messages, will be lost when the batteries are replaced or the batteries are extremely low.

#### Caution:

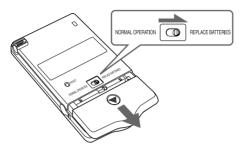
- If fluid from a leaking battery accidentally gets into your eyes, it may result in serious injury. Should this occur, flush your eyes with clean water and consult a physician immediately.
- Should fluid from a leaking battery come into contact with your skin or clothes, immediately wash with clean water.
- If the unit will not be used for an extended period of time, to avoid damaging the unit, remove batteries and store in a safe place.
- Do not leave exhausted batteries inside the unit.
- Do not mix different types of batteries or partially used batteries.
- Keep batteries out of the reach of children.
- Do not dispose of batteries by fire as they may explode.

## Replacing the batteries

If the battery level becomes low when you are using the unit, a warning message and the battery indicator appears on the unit's display. You should replace batteries immediately.

**1.** Turn off the unit.

- Slide the battery replacement switch on the back of the unit to the "REPLACE BATTERIES" position.
- 3. Open the battery compartment lid and gently remove it.



- 4. Remove the old batteries.
- 5. Insert two new batteries, making sure to position them correctly according to the plus (+) and minus (-) terminals, as illustrated below.



- **6.** Replace the battery compartment lid.
- 7. Slide the battery replacement switch to the "NORMAL OPERATION" position.
- **8.** Turn on the unit and follow the setup procedures displayed. (See page 13)

If nothing happens when you press **POWER**:

- Setting the battery replacement switch to "REPLACE BATTERIES" shuts off
  power to the unit. Check that the battery replacement switch is set to "NORMAL
  OPERATION".
- Repeat the above battery replacement procedure step by step.

**Note:** The following data will be lost when the batteries are replaced.

- E-mail messages in the Inbox folder (E-Mail application)
- Attachments in the Inbox folder (Attachment Viewer application)
