PREPARATION FOR USE

Connecting to a TV without A/V Terminals

- Disconnect the AC power cord of the TV from the AC outlet.
- Disconnect the antenna or cable from the TV.
- Connect the antenna or cable to the ANT. IN jack of the VCR.
- Connect the VCR to the TV using the RF cable.
- Plug the AC power cords of the VCR and TV into the AC outlets.



RF Output Channel

If your TV does not have A/V terminals:

Press [PLAY] on the VCR for 3 seconds during playback. The RF output channel will change to CH4 from CH3.

When you want to return to CH3 for RF output channel, press [PLAY] on the VCR for 3 seconds during playback again. (Default setting :CH3)

- There is case that the RF output channel does not change by situation (For example, when you adjust tracking using [CHANNEL (▽/△)].
 - In this case, stop the playback, and start the playback again. After that, press [PLAY] on the VCR for 3 seconds.
- If there is a power failure or the VCR is unplugged for more than 30 seconds, the RF output channel setting will return to CH3.


Using Optional AUDIO/ VIDEO Output Jacks

With this connection, you can get better pictures and sounds when playing back a tape if your TV has A/V Input jacks. Please refer to your TV's owner's manual.

Using AUDIO/VIDEO Input Jacks

You can use the A/V input jacks on the front or the back of the VCR.

- To use the input jacks on the back of the VCR, select "L1" position by pressing [0], [0], [1] on the remote control or [CHANNEL (△/▽)].
- To use the input jacks on the front of the VCR, select "L2" position by pressing [0], [0], [2] on the remote control or [CHANNEL (△/∨)].
- "L1" or "L2" is found before the lowest memorized channel. (Example: CH2)



SETUP

Automatic Channel Set Up

You can automatically program the tuner to scan only the channels you receive in your area.

- Channel memory programming is NOT needed when you connect the VCR to a cable box or satellite box as in "Connect VCR to TV Connection". In this case, select the VCR and TV to channel 3 or 4 the same channel as the RF output channel of the VCR. Then, the channel you want to record or view may be selected at the cable box or satellite box.
- Follow the steps below once. Repeat it only if there is a power failure or if the VCR is unplugged for more than 30 seconds. (In these cases, the programmed channels are erased.)
- You must follow the steps below before attempting to play or record a video tape. If you want to play or record a video tape BEFORE programming the tuner, you can cancel it by pressing [COUNTER RESET/EXIT].
- You need to connect the antenna or cable to the VCR first. Then, connect the VCR power plug into a standard AC outlet.
- Turn on the TV and set the TV to channel 3. If channel 3 is already occupied for broadcasting, change the RF output to CH 4, and change the TV channel to CH4. (See "RF Output Channel" on page 3 for the detail.)
- Turn on the VCR by pressing [POWER]. When the POWER is on, both the POWER and VCR/TV indicator on the VCR will be on.
- Select the On Screen Language
 ("ENGLISH", "FRANCAIS" or
 "ESPAÑOL") by pressing [PLAY] or
 [STOP]. Then, press [F.FWD].



- Begin channel preset by pressing [F.FWD] once. The tuner scans and memorizes all active channels in your area.
 - The VCR distinguishes between standard TV channels and cable channels.



- After scanning, the tuner stops on the lowest memorized channel. The TV screen returns to TV mode.
- If "AUTO SET UP" appears on the TV screen again, check the cable connections. Press [F.FWD] once again and the VCR will begin preset again.

To Select a Desired Channel

You can select the desired channel by using [CHANNEL $(\land \land \lor)$] or directly pressing [Number] on the remote control.

Note for using the Number buttons:

- When selecting cable channels which are higher than 99, enter channel numbers as a three-digit number. (For example: 117, press 1,1,7)
- You must precede single-digit channel numbers with a zero (For example: 02, 03, 04 and so on).

To Preset the Channel Again

- Press [MENU] until the main menu appears.
- Select "CHANNEL SET UP" by pressing [PLAY] or [STOP]. Then, press [F.FWD].
- Select "AUTO SET UP" by pressing [PLAY] or [STOP]. Then, press [F.FWD]. After scanning, the tuner stops on the lowest memorized channel.

To Add/Delete Channels

When the VCR automatically program the tuner to scan only the channels you receive in your area, some channels may be skipped due to weak signal. You can manually add the channel in the VCR memory.

Press [MENU] until the main menu appears.



Select "CHANNEL SET UP" by pressing [PLAY] or [STOP]. Then, press [F.FWD].

Select "MANUAL SET UP" by pressing [PLAY] or [STOP]. Then, press [F.FWD].

Enter the desired channel number by pressing [PLAY] or [STOP].

Add or Delete it from memory by pressing [F.FWD] or [REW] so that "ADD" or "DELETE" flashes on the TV screen accordingly.

Exit the Preset mode by pressing [COUNTER RESET/EXIT].

To Change the On-Screen Language

Press [MENU] until the main menu appears.

Select "LANGUAGE SELECT" by pressing [PLAY] or [STOP]. Then, press [F.FWD].

Select "ENGLISH", "FRANCAIS" or "ESPAÑOL" by pressing [PLAY] or [STOP]. Then, press [COUNTER RESET/EXIT].

To go back one step, press [REW].

Start the clock by pressing [COUNTER RESET/EXIT] or [F.FWD].

PLAYBACK FUNCTION

Normal Playback

Insert the prerecorded tape. The VCR will turn on. If the safety tab has been removed, the VCR will start playback automatically.



Turn on the TV and set the TV to channel 3. If channel 3 is already occupied for broadcasting, change the RF output to CH 4, and change the TV channel to CH4. (See "RF Output Channel" on page 3 for the detail.)

Begin playback by pressing [PLAY].

 Tracking adjustment will be set automatically (Digital Tracking function) when you start playback. To adjust the tracking manually, press [CHANNEL (▽/△)] on the VCR.

You cannot manually adjust the tracking of a Still picture. However, you may press [CHANNEL (▽/△)] on the VCR to remove vertical jitter in a Still picture.

 When a tape has reached the end, the VCR will rewind the tape to the beginning, eject the tape, and turn off the VCR automatically.

To stop playback, press [STOP].

Counter Reset

 You can reset the counter by pressing [COUNTER RESET/EXIT] on the remote control.

Still Picture

Press [PAUSE/STILL] during playback to view a still picture on the TV screen.

- If you press [PAUSE/STILL] to freeze the picture, usually there
 will be noise lines on the TV screen. This is normal, however,
 each time you press [PAUSE/STILL], the lines will change
 position.
- When the picture begins to vibrate vertically, stabilize the picture by pressing [CHANNEL (▽/△)] on the VCR in the Still mode.
- After the VCR has been in Still mode for 5 minutes, it will stop automatically to protect the tape and the video head.
- To return to playback, press [PLALY].

Auto Repeat Playback

This feature allows you to play a tape over and over.

Select main menu by pressing [MENU].

Select "AUTO REPEAT" by pressing [PLAY] or [STOP].

Begin auto repeat playback by pressing [F.FWD] so that [ON] appears next to "AUTO REPEAT".

If the on-screen menu still remains, press [COUNTER RESET/EXIT] to exit the menu.

 You can set AUTO REPEAT to ON or OFF by pressing the [AUTO REPEAT] on the remote control, too.

 When you set the Auto repeat mode to [ON] while the Counter memory mode is ON, the VCR will exit the Counter memory mode automatically.

• To cancel the Auto repeat mode, press [F.FWD] at step [3] so that [OFF] appears next to "AUTO REPEAT".

Search Functions

Picture Search

If you want to skip or repeat a scene during playback, press [F.FWD] or [REW].

 Press it again and the VCR will now search in super high speed. (in the LP/SLP modes only)

Accidental erasure prevention

To prevent accidental recording on a recorded cassette, remove its record safety tab. To record on it later, cover the hole with cellophane tape.



Press [COUNTER MEMORY] on the remote control so that "M" appears on the TV screen.

Record the program.

After recording, press [STOP] then [REW].

- When "0:00:00" is reached, rewinding operation goes to stop. And you can view the recording program.
- [COUNTER MEMORY] does not function if the Auto repeat mode is set to [ON]. In this case, set the Auto repeat mode to [OFF].
- To cancel the Counter memory mode, press [COUNTER MEMORY] so that "M" disappears from the TV screen.



√ Copying a Video Tape

You can make copies of video tapes made by friends or relatives for your enjoyment.

Connect the recording VCR(this unit), the playing VCR (another source) and your TV using the following diagram.



- Insert a pre-recorded tape into the playing VCR.
- 2 Insert a tape with its safety tab into the recording VCR.
- Press [SPEED] on the remote control of the recording VCR to select the desired recording speed (SP/SLP).
- Select the "L1" or "L2" position on the recording VCR. See page 3, under "Using AUDIO/VIDEO Input Jacks".
- Press [REC/OTR] on the recording VCR.
- Begin playback of the tape in the playing VCR.
- For best results during dubbing, use the VCR's front panel controls whenever possible. The remote control might affect the playing VCR's operation.
- Always use video-quality shielded cables with RCA-type connectors. Standard audio cables are not recommended.
- You can use a video disc player, satellite receiver, or other audio/video component with A/V outputs in place of the playing VCR.

To Monitor the Recording

- Turn on the TV and set the TV to channel 3. If channel 3 is already occupied for broadcasting, change the RF output to CH 4, and change the TV channel to CH4. (See "RF Output Channel" on page 3 for the detail.)
- Press [VCR/TV] on the remote control of the recording VCR so that the VCR/TV indicator comes on.

Auto Rewind

When a tape has reached the end during recording, playback, or fast-forward, the tape will automatically rewind to the beginning. After rewinding finishes, the VCR will eject the tape and turn itself to off.

 The VCR will not rewind the tape automatically during timer recording or One Touch Recording.

Real Time Tape Counter

- This shows the elapsed recording or playback time in hours, minutes, and seconds. (The displayed time will not change during blank portions on the tape.)
- The indication will appear when the tape is rewound further than "0:00:00" on the tape counter.


