Where to Install your Executive Shelf System

To take full advantage of your new Executive Shelf System, follow these installation instructions before connecting the unit.


- ♦ Install the system on a flat, stable surface.
- Never place this unit on carpeting.
- Never place this unit in an outdoor area.
- Maintain an open space of approximately 6 inches (15 cm) on the sides and rear of the system, for ventilation purposes.
- Make sure that you have enough room to open the compact disc compartment easily.
- Place the speakers at a reasonable distance on either side of the system to ensure good stereo sound.
- For optimum performance, make sure that both speakers are placed at an equal distance above the floor.



Connecting your System to the Power Supply

The power cord must be plugged into an appropriate electrical outlet.


- Before plugging your system into an electrical outlet, you must check the voltage.
- 1 Plug the power cord (marked AC Cord on the rear of the system) into an appropriate electrical outlet.
- **2** Press the **On/Standby** button to switch your Executive Shelf System on.



Inserting Remote Control Batteries

Insert or replace remote control batteries when you:

- ◆ Purchase the Executive Shelf System
- Find that the remote control is no longer operating correctly
- When replacing the batteries, use a new set of batteries and never mix alkaline and manganese batteries.
- 1 Place your thumb on the position marked on the battery compartment cover (rear of the remote control) and push the cover in the direction of the arrow.
- 2 Insert two AAA or equivalent batteries, matching the polarities:
 - + on the battery against + in the battery compartment
 - ♦ on the battery against in the battery compartment
- **3** Replace the cover by sliding it back until it clicks into position.
- If you will not be using the remote control for a long time, remove the batteries to prevent corrosion.



Connecting to an External Source

The auxiliary input can be used to take advantage of the sound quality of your Executive Shelf System when listening to other sources.


Examples: ♦ A television


- A video disc player
- ♦ A Hi-Fi stereo video cassette recorder
- To connect the external source, the source must have an audio output. In addition, you need an RCA connection cable.
- 1 Set the system to standby mode and disconnect it and the external source from the electrical outlet.
- Connect the audio cable to the rear of the Executive Shelf System.

Connect the	To the connector marked
Red jack-	R (right)
White jack	L (left)

- ➤ For optimum sound quality, do not invert the right and left channels.
- 3 Plug the system back into the electrical outlet and press (**b**) to switch it on.
- Select the AUX source by pressing AUX. Result: AUX is displayed.
- 5 Switch the external source on.
- Adjust the volume and balance as required:
 ♦ Volume
 ♦ Equalizer
 ♦ S.Bass

Example: You can watch a film and take advantage of stereo sound, provided that the original soundtrack is in stereo.






Connecting the Speakers

The System has Main Speaker jacks and Subwoofer Speaker jacks.

- Main Speaker Connection: Connect the Main Speaker cords (red/black) to the Main Speaker jacks of the System
- Subwoofer Speaker Connection: Connect the Subwoofer Speaker cords (blue/black) to the Subwoofer Speaker jacks of the System

For Best Results when Installing Speakers

- Installation near heat sources, in direct sunlight, or in an environment with high humidity may cause performance degradation of the speaker.
- Do not install speakers on a wall or in any unstable place to prevent the speakers from potentially falling.
- Placing speakers near the TV or computer monitor may influence the quality of the screen display.


Connecting the AM Antenna

The AM antenna can be:

- ◆ Placed on a stable surface
- ♦ Fixed to the wall (you must first remove the base)


The AM antenna connector terminals are located on the rear of the system and are marked AM ANT.

To avoid noise interference, check that the speaker wires do not run close to the antenna wires. Always keep them at least 2 inches (5 cm) apart.



Connecting the FM Antenna

- ♦ Connect a 75ž antenna to the FM antenna terminal.
- ♦ Plug the connector on the supplied **FM** antenna into the coaxial socket (75ž) marked **FM** on the rear of the system.
- Follow the instructions on Page 15 to tune into a radio station, and determine the best position for the antenna.
- If reception is poor, you may need to install an outdoor antenna.
 To do so, connect an outdoor FM antenna to the FM socket on the rear of the system using a 75ž coaxial cable (not supplied).




Viewing the Various Functions on Your System

You can view the various functions available on your system.

- Press the Demo button. <u>Result:</u> The various functions available are listed in turn on the display.
- All these functions are described in detail in this guide.

 For instructions on how to use them, refer to the appropriate sections.
- 2 To cancel this function, press **Demo** again.



Setting the Clock

Your system is equipped with a clock, which allows you to turn your system on and off automatically.

You should set the clock:

- ♦ When you first purchase the Executive Shelf System
- ◆ After a power failure
- After unplugging the unit




- For each step, you have a few seconds to set the required options. If you exceed this time, you must start over.
- 1 Switch the system on by pressing On/Standby (\bigcirc / I) on the remote.
- 2 Press Timer/Clock twice to display CLOCK.
- 3 Press Program/Set to display the flashing hour.

When the correct hour is displayed, press **Program/Set**. Result: The minutes will then flash.

- When the correct time is displayed, press Program/Set. Result: The clock starts and is displayed.
- ◆ You can display the time, even when you are using another function, by pressing Timer/Clock once.
 - ♦ You can use the **Multi Jog** dial instead of the | ♣■ / ■➡ buttons in Steps 4,6.




Playing CD/MP3-CD Discs

You can play 12 cm or 8 cm compact discs without an adapter.

This unit has been designed to playback the following types of CDs: Audio CD, CD Text, CD-R and CD-RW.

Continued use of irregular shaped CDs (heart-shape, octagonal, etc.) can damage the unit.

- 1 Select the CD function by pressing the CD button on the front panel.
- Press the Open/Close (▲) button to open the disc compartment.
- 3 Place your disc in the compartment, with the label on the disc facing
- 4 Close the compartment by pressing the Open/Close (▲) button again.
- 5 Press the PLAY/PAUSE(►II) button.
 - ♦ Your CD Player will take a few moments to scan through all the tracks recorded on a particular MP3-CD.
 - The title of the song may be indicated on the display only if directly downloaded from a PC or if the purchased MP3-CD is sorted according to titles (directory).
 - (Other languages besides English may not be indicated.)
 - The title of the track may not be indicated depending on the characteristics of the MP3-CD.
- To stop playback temporarily, press the PLAY/PAUSE (►II) button.
 Press PLAY/PAUSE (►II) again to continue playing the disc.
- **7** Press the STOP (■) button when you have finished.




Selecting a Track

You can select the track you wish to listen to, either when the compact disc player is stopped or when a disc is playing.

Selecting the MP3-CD album and track

You can select the album and track you wish to listen to, either when the compact disc player is stopped or when an MP3-CD disc is playing.


To move the album (directory), turn the **Muiti-Jog** dial to the left or right.



To move the track, press the

buttons.

- ♦ Moves the track within the album.
- ♦ If the I++, ■+ buttons are pressed more than the number of tracks within the title, it moves to the next album.





MP3 means MPEG1 Layer 3, the global standard for audio signal compression technology. It uses digital compression technology to compress original sound data by up to 12 times without sound quality degradation.

File Compatibility

- ◆ The unit will playback files created in MP3 format (Mpeg1.Layer3) with *.mp3 as their extension.
- ♦ Files created in MP2 format (Mpeg1.Layer2) with *.mp2 as their extension can also be played back.
- ♦ Bit rates: 56-320Kbps.

How many MP3 files can a CD-R or CD-RW disc record?


The maximum capacity of one CD-R or CD-RW disc is 680MB.


At 128kbps, one MP3 file has a capacity of 4MB, therefore approximately 170 files can be recorded on a single disc.

Scanning a CD Track

When listening to a compact disc, you can quickly scan a track on the CD

To scan through the tracks	Press and hold down
Forwards	for at least one second
Backwards	for at least one second






Playback sequence of albums and tracks

A Windows Explorer example is shown here.

The arrows indicate playback sequence of albums and tracks.




Skipping 10 tracks at a time

Press the +10 button briefly while playing back a CD. The track 10 tracks after the current one will then be played back.

Example: If you want to select track 47 during playback of track 15, press the +10 button three times, and then press the button two times.

15 > 25 > 35 > 45 > 46 > 47






Random Play Function

You can listen to the tracks on a compact disc in random order.

- 1 Press the Random button.
 - If this button is pressed when the CD is being played back or stopped, any track recorded in the CD may be selected to playback again.
- When you have finished the random playback, press or press the Random button again.
- The Repeat and CD Synchro function is not supported while in Random playback mode.




Repeating One or All Tracks on the Compact Discs

You can repeat indefinitely:

- ♦ A specific track on a compact disc.
- ♦ All tracks on the compact disc selected.

Programming the Order of Playback

- 1 If the CD function is selected, stop the player by pressing \blacksquare .
- 2 Load the selected CD.
- 3 Press Program/Set.


Result: The following indications are displayed:

(01 = Program no., --= Track no. on the disc)

- 4 Select the required track by pressing:
 - ♦ I to move back through the tracks
 - ♦ to move forward through the tracks
- Press Program/Set to confirm your selection. Result: The selection is stored and is displayed.
- 6 To select other tracks, repeat Steps 3-5.
- 7 Press CD (>II) to listen to the tracks in the order programmed.

Checking or Changing Programmed Tracks


You can check or change your selection of programmed tracks at any time.


- 1 Press once if you have started listening to the selection.
- Press Program/Set. Result: The following is displayed:

(01 = Program no., --= Track no. on the disc)

- If you have already programmed 24 tracks, **Check** is displayed instead of **PR** when you press **Program/Set**.
- 3 Press Program/Set one or more times until the track to be changed is displayed.
- 4 Press | ★ | or turn Multi Jog to select a different track.
- 5 Press Program/Set to confirm your change.
- Press CD (►) to start listening to the selection.

 Result: The first track selected is played.





Searching for and Storing Radio Stations

You can store up to:

- ♦ 15 FM stations
- ♦ 15 AM stations
- 1 Switch the system on by pressing On/Standy (6).
- Select the required band by pressing TUNER/Band on the front panel or Band on the remote control.

Result: The appropriate indication is displayed:

- ♦ FM
- **♦** AM




- Select the station to be stored by:
 - Turning the Multi Jog knob to the right or to the left to increase or decrease the frequency respectively.
 - ◆ Pressing the | ■■ or ■■ buttons.
 - ◆ To scroll through the frequencies faster when searching manually, hold down the | ◆● or ▶● buttons.
 - The automatic search procedure may stop on a frequency that does not correspond to a radio station. If this happens, use the manual search mode.
- If you do not want to store the radio station found, revert to Step 4 and search for another station.

Otherwise:

- a Press Program/Set.
 Result: The PRGM is displayed for a few seconds.
- **b** Press **| ••• / ••• |** or turn **Multi Jog** to assign a program number between 1 and 15.
- c Press **Program/Set** to store the radio station.

 <u>Result:</u> **PRGM** is no longer displayed and the station is stored.
- 6 To store any other radio frequencies, repeat Steps 3-5.
- ◆ The PROGRAM function can be used to assign a new station to an existing program number.






Selecting a Preset Station

You can listen to a preset radio station as follows:

- 1 Switch the system on by pressing On/Standby (🖒) .
- 2 Select the required band by pressing TUNER/Band on the front panel
- Select the radio station as follows.



Improving Radio Reception

You can improve the quality of radio reception by rotating the FM or ${\bf AM}$ antenna.

If reception from a specific FM radio station is poor, press Mono/ST to switch from stereo mode to mono. The quality of the sound may be improved.


- Always treat your cassettes with care; refer, if necessary, to the section entitled "Precautions When Using Audio Cassettes" on page 22.
- 1 Switch the system on by pressing On/Standby (🖒).
- 2 Open the cassette deck by pushing on the corner of the cover marked Push Eject (♠) until you hear a click.
 - Insert the pre-recorded cassette with the open edge of the tape facing downwards.
- 3 Close the deck by pushing on the cover until it clicks into place.




Tape Counter

When playing a cassette, a counter is displayed to enable you to note locations on the tape.

The counter is only displayed when a cassette is being played.

Reset the counter by pressing Counter Reset.




Selecting the Cassette Playback Mode

Your Executive Shelf System has three cassette playback modes, which enable you to listen to both sides of a cassette automatically.

Press REV.Mode until the appropriate symbol is displayed.

When the display indicates	The system plays back
=	One side of the selected cassette and then stops.
=	One side of the cassette, followed by the other side of the cassette and then stops.
(Both sides of the cassette indefinitely until you press stop.



Recording a Compact Disc


You can record a compact disc on a cassette in two different ways:

Synchronized recordingDirect recording

Synchronized recording

This feature enables you to synchronize the start of the recording with the start of the disc or track of your choice.


- 1 Switch the system on by pressing On/Standby () .
- 2 Insert a blank cassette in the cassette deck.
- 3 Load a compact disc.
- 4 Press the CD(►) button.
 - ◆ Use the CD selection (,) buttons to select the desired song.
- 5 Press the CD Synchro button.
 - When stopped, press the button to start the recording from the first song.
 - Press the CD Synchro button during the playback of the CD to start the recording from the first part of the song.
- 6 To stop recording, press
 - *This function dose not operate with MP3-CDs.



Direct recording

The direct recording mode enables you to start recording any track on the compact disc.

- ♦ You do not need to adjust the volume, as it has no effect on the recording.
- 1 Switch your system on by pressing On/Standby (🖒) .
- 2 Insert a blank cassette in the cassette deck.
- 3 Load a compact disc.
- 4 Press the CD(►■) button.
 - ♦ Use the CD selection (| ♣■ , ▶■) buttons to select the desired song.
- Press the REC/Pause button. Result: Recording will begin.
- 6 To stop recording, press ■




Recording a Radio Program

You can record a radio program of your choice.

You do not need to adjust the volume, as it has no effect on the recording.



- 1 Switch the system on by pressing On/Standby ((b)).
- 2 Insert a blank cassette in cassette deck.
- 3 Select the TUNER function by pressing TUNER/Band.
- 4 Select the radio station that you wish to record by pressing | ■■ or ■■ .
- Press REC/Pause.
 Result: REC is displayed in red and recording starts.
- 6 To stop recording, press ■.



Timer Function

The timer enables you to switch the system on or off at specific times.

Example: You wish to wake up to music every morning.

- If you no longer want the system to be switched on or off automatically, you must cancel the timer.
- ◆ Before setting the timer, check that the current time is correct.
 - For each step, you have a few seconds to set the required options. If you exceed this time, you must start again.
- 1 Switch the system on by pressing On/Standby (6/1).
- Press Timer/Clock until TIMER is displayed.
- 3 Press Program/Set.

Result: ON TIME is displayed (instead of the equalizer symbols) for a few seconds, followed by the switch-on time already set. You can now set the timer switch-on time.

- 4 Set the timer switch-on time.
 - a Set the hour by pressing | and and
 - Press Program/Set.
 - Result: The minutes flash.
 - c Set the minutes by pressing | and and and are in the control of the control
 - d Press Program/Set.

Result: OFF TIME is displayed (instead of the equalizer symbols) for a few seconds, followed by the switch-off time already set. You can now set the timer switch-off time.


- 5 Set the timer switch-off time.

 - Result: The minutes flash.

Result: VOL 10 is displayed, where 10 corresponds to the volume already set.

- Press | I and III to adjust the volume level and press Program/Set. Result: The source to be selected is displayed.
- Press | and to select the source to be played when the system switches on.

- 8 Press Program/Set to confirm the timer.
- Press on/stanby (O/I) to set the system to standby mode.
 Result: O is displayed to the bottom left of the time, indicating that the timer has been set. The system will switch on and off automatically at the required times.
 - If the timer switch on and off times are identical, the word ERROR is displayed.
 - ◆ You can also use Multi Jog of the | → 1 / buttons in Steps 4, 5, 6, 7.




Cancelling the Timer

After having set the timer, it will start automatically as shown by the TIMER indication on the display. If you no longer wish to use the timer, you must cancel it.

You can stop the timer at any time (with the system on or in standby mode).




Mute Function

You can turn the sound off temporarily on your system. Example: You wish to answer a telephone call.

1 Press Mute.

To switch the sound back on (at the same volume as before), press **Mute** again or the **VOL+/VOL-** buttons.





S. Bass Function

The S.Bass function enhances the bass sound, when enabled.

Turn the S.Bass Level knob.

- ♦ Turn the knob clockwise or counterclockwise to switch between OFF ÷ S.Bass 1 ÷ S.Bass 2 ÷ S.Bass 3.
- ♦ Select the desired level for the bass
- To operate from the remote control unit, press the EQ/S.Bass button to select the desired mode.






Selecting an Equalizer Preset

Your Executive Shelf System is equipped with a preset equalizer that allows you to choose the most appropriate balance between treble and bass frequencies, according to the type of music you are listening to.

Press Sound Mode on the front panel until the desired option is selected.


Press the button repeatedly to select "BASS ½ POP ½ ROCK ½ CLASSIC."

Setting the System to Switch off Automatically


While listening to a compact disc or a cassette, you can set the system to switch off automatically.

Result: The is displayed:



- To cancel the SLEEP function, press Sleep one or more times until OFF is displayed.




Connecting Headphones

You can connect a set of headphones to your Executive Shelf System so that you can listen to music without disturbing other people in the room. The earphones must have a 1/8" jack or an appropriate adapter.


Connect the headphones to the **Phones** jack on the front panel. Result: The loudspeakers are no longer used to output the sound.

Prolonged use of headphones at a high volume may damage your hearing.






Ambient operating conditions:

Do not expose the unit to direct sun radiation or other heat sources. This could lead to overheating and malfunction of the unit.




Do not place potted plants or vases on top of the unit. Moisture entering the unit could lead to dangerous electric shock and can cause equipment damage. In such events immediately disconnect the power cord from the electrical outlet.



During thunderstorms, disconnect the power cord from the electrical outlet.


Main voltage peaks due to lightning could damage the unit.




Remove the batteries from the remote control if will not be used for an extended period.

Leaking batteries can cause serious


damage to the remote control.



When using headphones, take care not to listen at excessive volumes. Extended use of headphones at high volumes may lead to hearing damage.



Do not place heavy items on the power cord. Power cord damage can lead to damage of the equipment (fire hazard) and can cause electric shock.



Do not remove any equipment panels. The inside of the unit contains live components, which cause electric shock.

Cleaning Your Executive Shelf System

To obtain the best possible results from your Executive Shelf System, you should clean the following elements regularly:

- ♦ The outer casing
- The compact disc player
- ◆ The cassette player (heads, rollers and drive capstans)
- Always unplug the system from the wall outlet:
 - Before cleaning it
 - ♦ If you are not going to be using it for a long time

Outer Casing


Clean the outer casing regularly using a soft cloth. Do not use abrasive powders, liquids or aerosol cleaners. Never let any liquids get into the system

Compact Disc Player

- Before playing a compact disc, clean the disc with a special CD cleaning agent. Do not use the same cleaning agents as for vinyl LP records.
 - Carefully wipe the disc from the center outward.
- 2 Regularly clean the player with a special cleaning disc (available from your local dealer).

Cassette Deck

- 1 Press Push Eject(♠) to open the cassette deck.
- 2 Use a cotton swab and a special cassette cleaning agent to clean the:
 - ♦ Head (1)
 - Rollers (2)
 - Drive capstans (3)






- If you will not be using the remote control for a long time, remove the batteries to prevent corrosion.
 - Your system should not be used in an excessively dusty environment or subjected to shocks or extreme heat (close to heating appliances or in direct sunlight, etc.).
 - If the unit emits an unpleasant odor when in use, unplug it from the electrical outlet and contact Customer Service.


Precautions When Using Compact Discs

- Handle your compact discs with care. Always hold them by the edges to avoid leaving fingerprints on the shiny surface.
- When you have finished playing a compact disc, always put it back in its case.
- Do not fix paper or adhesive tape to the discs and do not write on the label
- ♦ Clean discs with a special-purpose cloth.
- Store your compact discs in a clean place, out of direct sunlight, where they will not be exposed to high temperatures.
- ♦ Always use compact discs marked disc



Precautions When Using Audio Cassettes

- ♦ Check that the tape in the cassette is sufficiently taught.
- ♦ To prevent erasing a cassette that you wish to keep, remove the safety tab on the upper edge of the cassette. To record a cassette, where the tab has been broken, simply cover the opening with adhesive tape.
- When you have finished playing a cassette, always put it back in its case.
- Store your cassettes in a clean place, out of direct sunlight, where they will not be exposed to high temperatures.
- Avoid using 120-minute cassettes as they place unnecessary strain on the tape mechanism.
