

Connecting the AC power adaptor. **2** to a wall outlet to DC IN 6V socket

AC power adaptor (supplied)

Using the player on batteries.

Insert four size AA (R6) batteries (not supplied) into the battery compartment.

To release battery

Press the \bigcirc side of the battery and then take out the battery.

If the battery compartment lid comes off

Insert the right corner of the lid and then insert the left corner aligning it to the groove of the battery compartment.

Notes

- To use the player on batteries, disconnect the AC power adaptor from the player. The player does not operate on batteries as long as the AC power adaptor is connected.
- Replace the batteries when the OPR/BATT indicator dims or when the player stops operating. Replace all the batteries with new ones.

Troubleshooting

There is no audio.

- · Connect the AC power adaptor securely. Insert the batteries properly. • Replace all the batteries if they are weak.
- Unplug the headphones.
- · Adjust the volume.

• Set FUNCTION to the position you want to operate.

Cassette cannot be inserted.

· Insert the cassette properly.



 No cassette is in the tape compartment · Make sure the safety tab on the cassette is in place.

Poor playback, recording or erasing quality.

- Dirty heads. Clean the unit (as shown) with a cotton swab slightly moistened with cleaning fluid or alcohol.
- · Demagnetize the heads and all metal parts in the tape path with a commercially available tape head demagnetizer.






Precautions

On safety/power sources

· Should any solid object or liquid fall into the player, unplug the player, and have it checked by qualified personnel before operating it any further.

• For AC operation, use the supplied AC power adaptor:



· Unplug the player from the wall outlet when it is not to be used for an extended period of time.

• For battery operation, use four size AA (R6) batteries.

· When the batteries are not to be used, remove them to avoid damage that can be caused by battery leakage or corrosion.

 The nameplate indicating operating voltage, power consumption, etc. is located at the rear.

On placement/operation

- Do not leave the player in a location near heat sources, or in a place subject to direct sunlight. excessive dust or mechanical shock. • Do not place anything within 10 mm of the side of the cabinet. The ventilation holes must be unobstructed for the player to operate properly and to prolong the life of its components. Since a strong magnet is used for the speakers.
- keep personal credit cards using magnetic coding or spring-wound watches away from the player to prevent possible damage from the magnet.
- If the player has not been used for a long time, set it in the playback mode to warm it up for a few minutes before inserting a cassette.

Notes on cassettes Side A



0 recording, cover the Tab for side A broken tab with Tab for side B adhesive tape. • The use of a cassette with more than 90 minutes of play time is not recommended except for long, continuous recording or playback.





When opening and closing the cassette compartment lid, be sure to hold the player. Otherwise the player may fall over.

Tips

• To listen through the headphones, connect the headphones to Ω (phones).

AM

• For best results, move the player away from the TV.

Listening to the radio

FUNCTION

1 Set FUNCTION to FM or AM.

2 Tune to the station you want.

Set FUNCTION to TAPE/RADIO OFF. To improve broadcast reception

TUNING



Use TYPE I (normal) tape only.

Playing a tape

1 Set FUNCTION to TAPE/RADIO OFF. TAPE/RADIO OFF FUNCTION **2** Insert a recorded tape. With the side you want to play facing forward.



То	Press

Stop playback **STOP**

When the tape ends, the playback stops.


Fast-forward or \blacksquare FF or \blacksquare REW* rewind the tape

* When the tape is wound to the end, press STOP to release \blacksquare FF or \blacksquare REW.

Emphasizing Bass Set MEGA BASS to ON.

Use TYPE I (normal) tape only.

Recording



Tips

• For best results, use the AC power source.

- Adjusting the volume will not affect the recording level.
- If the AM programme makes a whistling sound, set ISS (Interference Suppress Switch) (at the rear) to the position that most decreases the noise. Normally set the switch to "2".

Note

While recording from the built-in microphone, you cannot monitor the sound through the headphones.

Reorient the antenna for FM. Reorient the player itself for AM. FM

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
