
## **Identifying the parts**



#### About descriptions in this manual

The operations described in this manual are based on those with the buttons on the photo frame. When an operation is performed differently, for example, with the remote control and the buttons on the photo frame, it will be explained in a tip.

#### Let's get the photo frame ready

### **Remote control**

Pull out the protective sheet before use as shown in the figure.




Protective sheet

#### Using the remote control

Point the top end of the remote control towards the remote sensor on the photo frame.


### Stand

Push on the ▲ mark on the stand in the direction of arrow (a) and slide the stand in the direction of arrow (a) until it stops, as illustrated below.



**2** Extend the stand by holding the lower part of the stand then place it on a flat surface.

You can adjust the angle of the stand.



#### **□** Notes

#### If the remote control stops working:

Replace the battery (CR2025 lithium battery) with a new one.

 When the lithium battery becomes weak, the operating distance of the remote control may shorten, or the remote control may not function properly. In this case, replace the battery with a Sony CR2025 lithium battery. Use of another battery may present a risk of fire or explosion.

#### Replacing procedures:

#### M WARNING

Battery may explode if mistreated. Do not recharge, disassemble or dispose of in fire.



The  $^{\circlearrowright}$  (standby) button on the remote control cannot be used when the photo frame is powered only by the built-in battery pack. Use the  $^{\circlearrowright}$  (standby) button on the photo frame.

#### Notes

- If you extend the stand in step 1 without sliding it to the limit in the direction of arrow (B), the stand may be damaged.
- Be sure that the stand is set in a stable position when you place the photo frame. It may fall unless the stand is extended to the limit.


#### Ϋ́Tips

## ■ When the photo frame is placed in the portrait orientation

- The display is automatically rotated on the portrait orientation.
- A video file is not rotated automatically even if you change the orientation of the photo frame.


#### ■ Sony logo

When the photo frame is placed in the portrait orientation or when you turn off the power, the Sony logo doesn't light up. You can set the photo frame to portrait or landscape orientation by rotating it without moving the stand.



#### To attach the stand cap

Attach the stand cap to the stand. You can set the photo frame in a stable position either in portrait or landscape orientation if you extend the stand to the limit.




When using the AC adaptor, pass the DC cord through the cutout of the stand.

Detach the stand cap from the stand before folding the stand into the rear of the photo frame.

### **Turning the photo frame on**

- Insert the plug of the AC adaptor into the DC IN 12 V jack on the rear of the photo frame.
- **2** Connect the AC adaptor to the wall outlet. The photo frame is automatically turned on.



## When using the photo frame with the built-in battery pack

Turn on the photo frame with the 1 (standby) button on the photo frame.

If the photo frame is powered only by the built-in battery pack, the  $\bigcirc$  (standby) button on the remote control does not operate.

#### Notes

- The socket outlet should be as close as possible to the unit, and easily accessible.
- Do not place the photo frame on an unsteady or tilted surface.
- Connect the AC adaptor to an easily accessible wall outlet close by. If trouble occurs while using the adaptor, immediately shut off the power by disconnecting the plug from the wall outlet.
- Do not short the plug of the AC adaptor with a metal object. Doing so may cause a malfunction.
- Do not use the AC adaptor placed in a narrow space, such as between a wall and furniture.
- After use, remove the AC adaptor from the DC IN 12 V jack on the photo frame, and remove the AC adaptor from the wall outlet.
- Do not turn the photo frame off or disconnect the AC adaptor from the photo frame while accessing an image. Doing so may damage the photo frame.
- The supplied AC adaptor is designed to be used with this photo frame only. It cannot be used with any other devices.
- The AC plug shape may differ depending on the region you purchase the photo frame.

#### Ϋ́Τips

#### ■ On battery charging

- Charge the battery under ambient temperature within the range of 10 °C to 30 °C (50 °F to 86 °F).
   Under temperature outside the above range, the battery may not be charged efficiently.
- If the usable time of the battery is decreased by nearly half even if it has been fully charged, the battery may be deteriorated. Consult your Sony dealer or Sony service facilities.
- Even if you do not use the photo frame for an extended period of time, fully charge the battery every six months.

#### ■ On battery life

A battery has limited life. Battery life is gradually reduced with frequent use or over time. If the usable time is reduced significantly, battery life may come to an end. Consult your Sony dealer or Sony service facilities.

Battery life varies depending on the status of storage or use, or the environment.

#### About the built-in battery pack

The built-in battery will be fully charged if the remaining battery level is reduced to a certain level whenever the AC adaptor is connected to the photo frame.

The standby indicator is lit in orange during charging and the mark is displayed in the upper right of the screen when the photo frame is in use during charging.


#### Approximate charging time

A drained battery can be fully charged in approximately 180 minutes.\*

\* In a case in which the battery is charged under ambient temperature of 25 °C (77 °F). (It may take longer, depending on the status of use or other circumstances.)

#### To check the remaining battery level


The remaining battery indicator is displayed on the right of the screen.



When the battery charge falls, a message will be displayed to prompt you for charging.


## **Operations in an initial state**

When the photo frame is turned on, the initial display appears.



## **Setting the current time**

1 Press MENU, and ◆/→ to select the (Settings) tab. •/◆ [Date/time Settings] → ENTER



- Press \*/\* to select [Time] → ENTER.

  \*/\* to select a value. → \*/\* (hour, minute, and second)

  Setting complete. → ENTER
- **3** Press MENU.

In the same window, you can use the same procedures as time setting to set the following:

#### Setting items

- •Date
- •Date Display Order (Y-M-D/M-D-Y/D-M-Y)
- •First day of the week (Sunday/Monday)
- •12hr/24hr display (12 hours/24 hours)

#### Ϋ́Tips

## ■ If the photo frame is not operated

If the photo frame is not operated for 10 seconds, the demo mode is displayed.

## ■ Releasing the demonstration mode

If any other button than the power button is pressed, the screen returns to the initial display.

#### Let's view an image

#### Note

When using a memory card of the following types, make sure to insert it in an appropriate adaptor.

If you insert it without an adaptor, you may be unable to remove it. As shown in the right-most illustration below, make sure to insert the following types of memory cards with inserted in the appropriate adaptor.



#### Ϋ́ Tip

- S-Frame fails to auto rotate if:
  - An image file has been shot with a DSC which doesn't support Exif rotate tag recording.
  - An image file is retouched and saved with retouching software which breaks the Exif rotate tag.

## **Inserting a memory card**

- 1 Open the I/O cover.
- 2 Insert a memory card firmly into the corresponding slot with its label side facing toward you (when you are facing the back side of the photo frame).



#### When you insert a memory card

The images on the memory card are automatically displayed.

## If you switch off the power while they are being displayed

If you switch the power back on, the same images continue to be displayed.

#### If the access lamp does not flash

Reinsert the memory card after checking the label side of the memory card.

#### About the A and B slots

If you insert memory cards both into the (a) and (b) slots simultaneously, the photo frame will not work properly.

## **Changing the display**

Press VIEW MODE repeatedly to select the view mode you want to display.




The display changes to the selected view mode.

#### Using the remote control

Press the VIEW MODE button corresponding to the view mode you want to display.

**2** Press ◆/◆/◆/ to select a desired style, and press ENTER.

The view mode screen is displayed.


If you do not operate the photo frame for a certain period of time, the style indicated by the cursor is automatically selected.

#### ⑤Image number (folder-file number)

This is displayed if the image is DCF compliant.

If the image does not comply with DCF, its file name is displayed.

If you named or renamed the file on your computer and the file name includes characters other than alphanumeric characters, the file name may not be able to be displayed properly on the photo frame. Also, for a file created on a computer or other device, a maximum of 10 characters from the beginning of the file name can be displayed.

#### Note

Only alphanumeric characters can be displayed.

#### 6 Shooting date/time

#### 7 Battery remaining indicator

The remaining battery level is indicated. If the battery indicator is not displayed on the screen, press MENU. It will be displayed on the upper right of the menu screen.

### Playing a video file

- 1 Select a video file.
  - ①Press SINGLE.
  - ②Press ◆/◆ to select the desired style and press ENTER.
  - ③ Press \*/\* to advance/reverse the files to select a video file you want to play.

#### Using the Index display

- ①Press **[INDEX**].
- ②Press ◆/◆/◆/♠ to select a video file you want to play.
- **2** Press ENTER.

The selected video file starts playback.

#### To adjust the volume

Press ₹/♠ during playback or playback pause of the video file.

#### To pause playback

Press ENTER during playback of the video file.

To resume playback, press ENTER again.

#### Fast forward/backward playback

Press ◆/→ during playback of the video file. The file is played forward or backward at high speed while you hold down the → or ◆ button. When you release the button, normal playback starts from that point.

Depending on the video file, fast forward/backward playback may not be available with the photo frame.

#### To stop playback

Press BACK while the video file is being played.

#### Note

- You cannot play the following type of video file:
  - Video files processed with other video codec than Motion JPEG
  - Video files that exceed maximum number of pixels either in width or height

(We cannot guarantee operation with video files not mentioned above.)

 Fast forward/backward playback and playback pause are not available during Slideshow display.

#### 🍟 Tips

- To clear the selection, select the file to be cleared then press ENTER. The check mark (✔) next to the selected file disappears.
- To delete a music file imported to internal memory, select [Delete BGM] on the [Slideshow Settings] screen in step 2 then press ENTER. Press ♣/♠ to select the music file you want to delete from the music file list and press ENTER. A check mark will be displayed next to the selected file. Press MENU then press ENTER when the confirmation screen appears. The file will be deleted from the music file list.

#### **□**Notes

- Playback of the imported music file is enabled only as BGM on a slideshow.
- Only music files imported to internal memory can be played as BGM.
- Up to 40 music files can be imported to internal memory of the photo frame.
- Up to 200 music files in the inserted memory card can be displayed.
- A music file shows only the file name. A music title and artist's name cannot be shown.

# Playing a slideshow with background music

#### Importing a music file

- 1 Insert a memory card or connect a USB external device that contains a music file into the photo frame.
- Press MENU, select the (Settings) tab with ◆/◆, then press ◆/◆ to select [Slideshow BGM Settings].
- 3 Press ♦/♠ to select [Import BGM] and press ENTER.
- 4 Press ◆/◆ to select the memory card inserted or the USB external device connected in step 1.
- Select a music file you want to import from the music file list with ♣/♠ and press ENTER.
  A check mark (✔) is displayed next to the selected file.
- **6** Repeat step 5 when you want to select two or more files.
- **7** Press MENU after you finish selecting the music file(s).
- **8** Press ENTER when the confirmation screen is displayed.

The selected music file is imported to internal memory of the photo frame.

#### Selecting a music file to play

- 1 Press MENU, select the (Settings) tab with ◆/→, then press ◆/◆ to select [Slideshow BGM Settings].
- 2 Press ♦/♦ to select [Select BGM] and press ENTER.
- Select a music file you want to play from the imported music file list with ▼/♠ and press ENTER.
  A check mark (✔) is displayed next to the selected file.
- 4 Repeat step 3 if you want to select two or more music files.

#### **5** Press MENU.

When you select (Slideshow) on the view mode screen, the music file with a check mark () is played.

#### Playing background music with a slideshow

- 1 Press MENU, select the (Settings) tab with ◆/→, then press ◆/◆ to select [Slideshow BGM Settings].
- Press ◆/◆ to select [BGM ON/OFF] and press ENTER.

[ON]: Background music is played while a slideshow is run. [OFF]: Background music is not played while a slideshow is run.

#### To adjust the volume

The volume adjustment screen appears on the right of the screen if you press  $\P/\Phi$ .

To increase the volume, press ♠. To decrease the volume, press ♣.

#### Notes

- Fast forward/backward playback of background music is not available. Also, you cannot change the playback order of background music files.
- Background music cannot be played during playback of the video. The sound of the video file is played with the video. The background music for the photo displayed after playback of the video will start playback from the beginning of the next music file.
- If a music file to play is not selected from the imported music file list even if [BGM ON/OFF] is set to [ON], background music will not be played.



You can adjust the volume on the initial display or single image display.

#### Try using various functions

#### Ϋ́ Tips

#### ■ Importing

The number of images to be saved in the internal memory:

- Resize: approx. 4,000 images
- Original: the number of images may vary, depending on the original image file size.

#### Notes

#### **■** Exporting

Any memory card or USB external device that is not recognized by this photo frame is listed in gray and cannot be selected.

#### **■** Importing

Importing video files to internal memory using the buttons on the photo frame is not available. To import a video file, connect a computer to the photo frame and copy a video file on the computer to internal memory on the photo frame. For details, see "Connecting to a computer" (page 29).

#### ■ During exporting/deleting

Avoid doing the following. Doing so may damage this photo frame, memory card, USB external device, or the data:

- · Turning off the power
- · Removing a memory card
- · Removing an USB external device
- · Inserting another card

#### ■ When deleting

If deletion has started, the deleted image cannot be recovered even if you stop deletion.

### **Various functions**

- Importing an image (to Internal memory)
- Exporting an image (from Internal memory)
- · Deleting an image
- · Marking an image
- Press ◆/◆ to select the desired menu item (Import/ Export/Delete/Marking), and press ENTER.
- 3 Press ★/★ to select [ ... this image], [... multiple images] or [... all images], and press ENTER. ("..." stands for each command: "Import", "Export", "Delete", or "Mark".)

#### [... this image]:

Press **₹/**♠ to select the destination, and press ENTER.

#### [... multiple images]:

Press  $\spadesuit/ \to / \Phi / \Phi$  to select a desired image in the image list, and press ENTER to add " $\checkmark$ ".

Repeat this operation to select multiple images.



**To clear the selection:** Select the image and press ENTER. "✔" disappears from the image.

After you finish selecting the images, press MENU and select the destination.

#### [... all images]:

All the images are displayed with "✓".

Press MENU and select the destination.

4 Press ENTER when the confirmation screen is displayed.

### **Sorting images (Filtering)**

- Press **♦/♦** to select [Sort] and press ENTER.
- 3 Select a sort style using ◆/◆ and press ENTER.



- [Sort by date]: Filters by the shooting date.
- [Sort by folder]: Filters by the folder.
- [Sort by vertical/horizontal]: Filters by the image orientation.
- [Sort by mark]: Filters by the mark.
- [Sort by videos/photos]: Filters according to files that contain videos or photos.
- Press ◆/→/•/↑ to select the item you want, then press ENTER.

#### To cancel the sort

Press MENU while the sorted images are displayed, select [Exit sort (show all photos)] and press ENTER.

#### To change the sort style

Press BACK while the sorted images are displayed then select another sort style.

#### Ϋ́Τip

#### ■ Using the remote control

Press SORT when an image is displayed on the screen.

#### Note

During Clock and Calendar display, you cannot select the (Editing) tab.

#### Notes

#### ■ During sorting

Avoid doing the following. Doing so may damage this photo frame, memory card, USB external device, or the data:

- · Turning off the power
- · Removing a memory card
- · Removing an USB external device
- · Inserting another card

## ■ Sort is automatically cancelled

- When the playback device is changed.
- When images on a memory card are sorted and the memory card is removed
- When images on an USB external device are sorted and the USB external device is removed.

## ■ What is "playback device"?

A memory card, a USB external device, or internal memory.

#### Note

During Clock and Calendar display, you cannot select the (Select device) tab.

#### **■** Notes

- Enlarging an image may reduce the quality depending on the image size.
- A video file cannot be enlarged or reduced.

### Specifying the playback device

- 1 Press MENU then select the ▶ (Select device) tab with ◆/◆.
- Press ◆/◆ to select the device you want to display and press ENTER.



#### Using the remote control

Press SELECT DEVICE.

# Adjusting image size and orientation (Zoom in/Zoom out/Rotate)

#### **Enlarging/Reducing**

- 2 Press **♦/♦** to select the enlargement factor and press ENTER.

You can enlarge an image from 1.5 times to 5 times (maximum) the original scale. You can move an enlarged image up, down, left and right.

#### Using the remote control

To enlarge an image, press  $\oplus$  (zoom in) on the remote control in Single view mode. To reduce an enlarged image, press  $\ominus$  (zoom out).

#### Saving an enlarged or a reduced image (Crop and save)

- When you move the enlarged image with ◆/◆/◆/♠ and press MENU, the image is saved in the trimmed size.

#### **Rotating**

Press MENU in Single view mode, ◆/→ to select the (Editing) tab, ◆/◆ to select [Rotate], and press ENTER.



2 Press ★/★ to select the angle of rotation and press ENTER.

You can select an angle of rotation from among 90 degrees, 180 degrees and 270 degrees clockwise.

#### Using the remote control

You can also rotate an image with  $\bigcirc$  (ROTATE) on the remote control. The image rotates 90 degrees counterclockwise every time you press the button.

# Changing the settings of the auto power on/off function

You can use the timer function to turn the photo frame on or off automatically when the photo frame is turned on.

- 1 Press MENU, ◆/→ to select the 

  (Settings) tab.
- 2 Press ◆/◆ to select [Auto Power ON/OFF] and press ENTER.

When displaying the images in the internal memory, the information used to rotate the image is retained even after the power is turned off.





#### **Precautions**

#### Installation

- Avoid placing the photo frame in a location subject to:
  - vibration
  - humidity
  - excessive dust
  - direct sunlight
  - extremely high or low temperatures
- Do not use electrical equipment near the photo frame. The photo frame will not work properly in electromagnetic fields.
- Do not place heavy objects on the photo frame.

#### On the AC adaptor

- The set is not disconnected from the AC power source (mains) as long as it is connected to the wall outlet, even if the set itself has been turned off.
- Be sure to use the AC adaptor supplied with the photo frame. Do not use other AC adaptors, as this may cause a malfunction.
- Do not use the supplied AC adaptor for other devices.
- Do not use an electrical transformer (travel converter), as this may cause overheating or a malfunction.
- In case the cord of the AC adaptor is damaged, do not use it any longer, as this may be dangerous.

#### On moisture condensation

If the photo frame is brought directly from a cold location to a warm location or placed in an extremely warm or humid room, moisture may condense inside the unit. In such cases the photo frame will probably not work properly and may even develop a fault if you persist in using it. If moisture condensation occurs, unplug the AC adaptor of the photo frame and do not use the photo frame for at least one hour.

#### On transport

When you transport the photo frame, remove the memory card, external devices, AC adaptor, and connected cables from the photo frame and put the photo frame and its peripherals in the original box with the protective packaging.

If you no longer have the original box and packing parts, use similar packing material so that the photo frame will not be damaged while being transported.

#### **Cleaning**

Clean the photo frame with a soft dry cloth. Do not use any type of solvent, such as alcohol or benzine, which may damage the finish.

#### **Restrictions on duplication**

TV programs, films, video tapes, portraits of other people, or other materials may be copyrighted. Unauthorized use of such materials may infringe the provisions of the copyright law.

#### Disposing of the photo frame

Even if you perform [Format internal memory], the data in the internal memory may not be erased completely. When you dispose of the photo frame, consult with your Sony dealer or Sony service facilities.
