## **Dividing a Message**

You can divide a message during recording or playback, so that the message is divided into two and the new message number is added to the divided message. By dividing a message, you can easily find the point you want to play back when you make a long recording such as a meeting You can divide messages until the total number of messages in the folder becomes 99

While recording or playing back a message, press DIVIDE at the point you want to divide.

 When you press DIVIDE during recording: The new message number is added at the point you pressed the button, and the new message number and "DIVIDE" flash three times. The message will be divided into two: however, the messages will be recorded without a break. Message 1 Message 2 Message 3




