## **A** Antennas

Find a location and an orientation that provide good reception when you set up the antennas.

Keep the antennas away from the speaker cords, the power cord and the USB cable to avoid picking up noise.

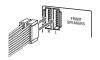

- When connecting speaker cords, insert the connector straight into the terminals.

### - LED SPEAKER terminals

(LBT-GPX77/MHC-GPX88/GPX77 only) Connect the LED SPEAKER connector of the speaker to this terminal.

The lighting on the speakers will react according to the music source. You can select the illumination pattern and color according to your preference (page 29).

## **C** AUDIO IN jacks

Use an audio cord (not supplied) to connect to the audio output jacks of the following equipment. The sound is output through this system.

## - TV/DVD/SAT R/L

Connect to a TV or an audio/video equipment.

## - PC/GAME R/L

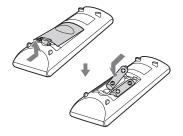
Connect to a computer or gaming device.

## **D** Power

Plug the power cord into a wall socket. The demonstration appears in the display panel. Press I/(b) to turn on the system and the demonstration automatically ends. If the supplied adaptor on the plug does not fit your wall outlet, detach it from the plug (only for models equipped with an adaptor).

## **Inserting batteries**

Insert the two supplied R6 (size AA) batteries, matching the polarities shown below.



### Notes

- Do not mix an old battery with a new one or mix different types of batteries.
- If you do not use the remote control for a long period of time, remove the batteries to avoid damage from battery leakage and corrosion.

## Attaching the speaker pads

## (LBT-GPX77/MHC-GPX88/GPX77 only)

The speaker pads are pre-installed in vertical position to stabilize the speakers and to prevent them from slipping. If you want to place the speakers in horizontal positioning (page 13), attach the supplied speaker pads to the bottom of the speakers as shown below.

## Line Array Speaker System (MHC-GPX88 only)

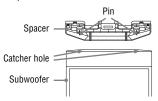
To create a party environment, we recommend you to install your speakers using Line Array Speaker System. It provides a wide sound space for a large room like a hall.

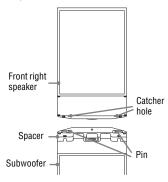


## - Installing

2 Stack the front right speaker on top of the subwoofer. Make sure the catcher holes of the front right speaker is inserted to the pins of the spacer.

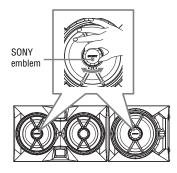

## Setting the clock

You cannot set the clock in Power Saving Mode.

- 1 Press I/ $^{\circ}$  to turn on the system.
- 2 Press TIMER MENU.

If "PLAY SET" appears in the display panel, press ↑/↓ repeatedly to select "CLOCK SET", then press (+).

- 3 Press ↑/→ repeatedly to set the hour, then press ⊕.
- 4 Press ★/★ repeatedly to set the minutes, then press ⊕.

## Disc/USB Playback

## Playing a disc

- 1 Press CD.
- 2 Press OPEN/CLOSE on the unit.
- 3 Load a disc with the label side facing up on the disc tray.

When you play back an 8 cm disc such as a CD single, place it on the inner circle of the tray



4 Press OPEN/CLOSE on the unit to close the disc tray.

Do not forcibly push the disc tray to close it as this may cause a malfunction

5 Press ► to start playback.

# Before using the USB device with this system

Check the websites for the information about compatible USB devices (page 32).

## To select the playback source or transferring destination (USB memory select)

If the USB device has more than one memory (for example, internal memory and a memory card), you can select which memory to use as a playback source or transferring destination.

Use the buttons on the unit to perform this operation.

## Note

You cannot select a memory during playback or transfer. Make sure to select a memory before starting playback or transfer.

- **1** Connect the USB device to the  $\psi$  A or  $\psi$  B port.
- 2 Press USB/USB SELECT repeatedly until "USB A" or "USB B" lights up in the display panel.
- **3** Press OPTIONS when playback is stopped.
- 4 Press ★/★ to select "USB MEM SEL", then press ENTER.
- **5** Press **↑**/**♦** to select the memory you want, then press ENTER.

## Playing a USB device

The audio formats that can be played back by this system are as follows:

- MP3: file extension ".mp3"
- WMA: file extension ".wma"
- AAC: file extension ".m4a", ".mp4" or ".3gp"

If the audio files have the above file extension but are not the respective formats, the system may produce noise or may malfunction.

- 1 Press USB repeatedly until "USB A" or "USB B" lights up in the display panel.
- **2** Connect a USB device to the  $\psi$  A or  $\psi$  B port.



3 Press ►.

The audio files are played back in different orders depending on the play mode.

# Searching a track or audio file

(Track Search)

- 1 Press SEARCH.
- "SEARCH" lights up in the display panel.
- 2 (Audio files only)

  Press ≁/→ to select the folder
  you want, then press ⊕ or ►.
- 3 Press ↑/+ to select the track or audio file you want, then press ⊕ or ►.

The selected track or audio file starts playback.

### Notes on disc

- (For AUDIO CD) This system can recognize up to 99 tracks.
- (For MP3 dics) This system can recognize up to
  - 999 folders (including root folder).
  - 999 MP3 files.
  - 250 MP3 files in a folder.
- 8 folders levels (tree structure of files).
- CD-TEXT information is not supported.

### Notes on USB device

- · This system can recognize up to
  - 250 audio files in a folder.
  - 3,000 audio files in a USB device.
  - 1,000 folders in a USB device (including root folder).

## **Using play mode**

## Playing in original order (Normal Play)

Press PLAY MODE repeatedly when playback is stopped.

## When playing a disc

- · (blank): play a disc
- FLDR\*: play all audio files in the folder on the disc
- \* When playing an AUDIO CD, "FLDR" performs the same operation as "(blank)" play mode.

## When playing a USB device

- · ALL USB: play all USB devices
- 1 USB: play a USB device
- FLDR: play all audio files in the folder on the USB device

## Playing in random order (Shuffle Play)

Press PLAY MODE repeatedly when playback is stopped.

## When playing a disc

- · SHUF: shuffle a disc
- FLDR SHUF\*: shuffle all audio files in the folder on the disc
- \* When playing an AUDIO CD, "FLDR SHUF" performs the same operation as "SHUF" play mode.

## When playing a USB device

- ALL USB SHUF: shuffle all USB devices
- · 1 USB SHUF: shuffle a USB device
- FLDR SHUF: shuffle all audio files in the folder on the USB device

#### Note

When you turn off the system, the selected Shuffle Play is cleared and the play mode returns to Normal Play.

## Creating your own program (Program Play)

You can make a program of up to 25 steps in the order you want them to be played back.

## 1 For CD function:

Press CD to select CD function.

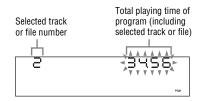
### For USB function:

Press USB repeatedly to select the USB device you want.

- 2 When playback is stopped, press PLAY MODE repeatedly until "PGM" lights up in the display panel.
- 3 (Audio files only)
  Press □ +/- repeatedly to select
  a folder.

If you want to program all files in the folder, press (+).

4 Press I◀◀/▶▶I repeatedly to select the track or audio file you want, then press ⊕.



"---" appears when the total playing time exceeds 100 minutes for an AUDIO CD or when you program an audio file.

- 5 Repeat steps 3 to 4 to program additional tracks or audio files.
- 6 Press ► to start Program Play.

## To cancel Program Play

When playback is stopped, press PLAY MODE repeatedly until "PGM" disappear from the display panel.

## To delete the last step from the program list

Press CLEAR when playback is stopped.

#### Notes

- (CD function only) The program list remains available until you open the disc tray.
- (USB function only) The program list is cleared when you:
  - perform the erase operation.
  - remove the USB device.
  - switch the USB memory select.

## Playing repeatedly (Repeat Play)

Press REPEAT repeatedly.

- : repeat all tracks or audio files on a folder/disc/USB device
- • 1: repeat a track or audio file

#### Notes on the USB device

- The playback order for the system may differ from the playback order of the connected digital music player.
- You cannot erase audio files and folders in Shuffle Play or Program Play.

## **USB Transfer**

## **Transferring music**

You can transfer music from a sound source to a USB device connected to the  $\dot{\Psi}$  B port.

The audio format of files transferred by this system is MP3. However, you can also transfer WMA and AAC files from USB A.

#### Notes

- Do not remove the USB device during transfer or erase operations. Doing so may corrupt the data on the USB device or damage the USB device itself.
- MP3/WMA/AAC files are transferred with the same bit rate as the original files.
- When transferring from an AUDIO CD, TUNER, TV/DVD/SAT or PC/GAME function, you may select the bit rate before transferring.
- USB transfer and erase operations are disabled while the disc tray is open.

## Note on copyright-protected content

The transferred music is limited to private use only. Use of the music beyond this limit requires permission of the copyright holders.

## To select the playback source or transferring destination (USB memory select)

See page 15.

### To select the bit rate

You can select a higher bit rate to transfer music with better quality.

Use the buttons on the unit to perform this operation.

- 1 Press OPTIONS.
- 2 Press ↑/→ repeatedly to select "REC BIT RATE", then press FNTFR.

## 3 Press ♠/♣ repeatedly to select the bit rate you want, then press ENTER.

- 128 kbps: encoded MP3 tracks have smaller file size and lower audio quality.
- 256 kbps: encoded MP3 tracks have bigger file size but higher audio quality.

## Transferring music from a disc or USB device

You can easily transfer all the music on a disc or USB A to USB B (Synchronized Transfer). You can also transfer a single track or audio file during playback (REC1 Transfer).

Use the buttons on the unit to perform this operation.

## 



## 2 For disc:

Press CD and then load the disc.

#### For USB:

Press USB/USB SELECT repeatedly to select "USB A" and then connect a USB device you want to transfer to  $\dot{\Psi}$  A port.

## **3** For Synchronized transfer:

When playback is stopped, press PLAY MODE on the remote control repeatedly to select the play mode you want.

#### Notes

- If you start transferring in Shuffle Play ("FLDR SHUF"), the selected play mode changes to "FLDR" automatically.
- If you start transferring in Shuffle Play (except "FLDR SHUF"), Repeat Play or Program Play with no steps, the selected play mode changes to Normal Play automatically.

### For REC1 transfer:

Select the track or audio file you want to transfer then start playback.

## 4 Press REC TO USB B.

"PUSH ENTER" appears in the display panel.

## **5** Press ENTER.

The transfer starts when "DON'T REMOVE" appears in the display panel.

## For Synchronized transfer:

When the transfer is completed, the transfer source and the USB device stop automatically.

## For REC1 transfer:

When the transfer is completed, the disc or the USB device continues to play.

## Transferring analog audio (Analog Transfer)

You can transfer sound from an analog audio source (other than CD, USB or *Bluetooth* function) to a USB device. Use the buttons on the unit to perform this operation.

- 1 Connect a transferable USB device to the  $\psi$  B port (page 19).
- 2 Press TUNER/BAND or AUDIO IN repeatedly to select the source you want to transfer.
- **3** Press REC TO USB B.

  "PUSH ENTER" appears in the display panel.
- 4 Press ENTER.

The transfer starts when "DON'T REMOVE" appears in the display panel.

**5** Start playback the source.

## To stop transferring

Press .

## To create a new MP3 file

Press REC TO USB B during Analog Transfer.

"NEW TRACK" appears in the display panel.

A new MP3 is also created automatically after approximately 1 hour of transfer.

#### Notes

- When a new MP3 file is created, transfer is disabled for the time being.
- If you press REC TO USB B again after a few seconds, a new MP3 file can be created.

## Erasing audio files or folders from the USB device

Use the buttons on the unit to perform this operation.

- 1 Connect a USB device to the  $\psi$  A or  $\psi$  B port.
- 2 Press USB/USB SELECT repeatedly until "USB A" or "USB B" lights up in the display panel when playback is stopped.
- 3 Press I◄◄/▶►I or ☐ +/repeatedly to select the audio
  file or folder.
- 4 Press OPTIONS.
- 5 Press ★/★ to select "USB ERASE", then press ENTER.

"FOLDER ERASE" or "TRACK ERASE" appears in the display panel.

6 Press ENTER.

"COMPLETE" appears in the display panel.

## Folder and file generation rules

When first transferring to a USB device, a "MUSIC" folder is created directly below the "ROOT" and a transfer mode-oriented folder is created within the "MUSIC" folder. Folders and files are generated within any of the transfer mode-oriented folders as follows.

 Folder and file numbers are assigned serially thereafter.

### Notes on transferring

- While transferring from an MP3 disc, AUDIO CD or USB device, no sound is output.
- CD-TEXT information is not transferred in the created MP3 files.
- The transfer stops automatically if:
  - the USB device runs out of space during transfer
  - the number of audio files and folders on the USB device reaches the limit for the number that the system can recognize.
- If a folder or file that you are trying to transfer already exists on the USB device with the same name, a sequential number is added after the name without overwriting the original folder or file.
- You cannot perform the following operations during transfer:
  - Eject the disc.
  - Select another track or file.
  - Pause playback or find a point in the track or file.
  - Change the function or tuner band.
- When transferring music to a Walkman<sup>®</sup> using "Media Manager for WALKMAN", be sure to transfer in MP3 format.
- When connecting a Walkman<sup>®</sup> to the system, be sure to connect after the display "Creating Library" or "Creating Database" on the Walkman<sup>®</sup> has disappeared.

## Tuner

## Listening to the radio

## 1 Press FUNCTION repeatedly to select FM or AM band.

## **2** For automatic scanning:

Press TUNING MODE repeatedly until "AUTO" lights up in the display panel. Then, press TUNING +/-. Scanning stops automatically when a station is tuned in. Then "TUNED" and "ST" (for FM stereo programs only) light up in the display panel. If "TUNED" does not light up and scanning does not stop, press 
to stop scanning. Then, perform manual tuning (below).

When you tune to an FM station that provides RDS services, information such as the service name or station name is provided by broadcasts. You can check the RDS information by pressing DISPLAY repeatedly.

## For manual tuning:

Press TUNING MODE repeatedly until "AUTO" and "PRESET" disappear from the display panel. Then, press TUNING +/- repeatedly to tune to the station you want.

#### αiT

To reduce static noise on a weak FM stereo station, press FM MODE repeatedly until "MONO" lights up in the display panel.

## To change the AM tuning interval (Except for Saudi Arabian model)

The default setting for AM tuning interval is 9 kHz (or 10 kHz for some areas). You cannot change the AM tuning interval in Power Saving Mode.

Use the buttons on the unit to perform this operation.

- 1 Press TUNER/BAND repeatedly to select AM band.
- 2 Press I/U to turn off the system.
- **3** While holding down ENTER, press 1/(1).

"AM 9K STEP" or "AM 10K STEP" appears in the display panel.
When you change the interval, all the AM preset stations are erased.

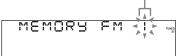

## To tune to a preset station

Press TUNING MODE repeatedly until "PRESET" lights up in the display panel. Then, press TUNING +/- repeatedly to select the preset number you want.

# About the *Bluetooth* wireless technology

Bluetooth wireless technology is a shortrange wireless technology that enables wireless data communication between digital devices. Bluetooth wireless technology operates within a range of about 10 meters (33 feet).

## Supported *Bluetooth* version, profiles and codecs

Supported Bluetooth version:

• Bluetooth Standard version 3.0 + EDR (Enhanced Data Rate)

Supported Bluetooth profiles:

- A2DP (Advanced Audio Distribution Profile)
- AVRCP 1.3 (Audio Video Remote Control Profile)

Supported Bluetooth codecs:

- SBC (Sub Band Codec)
- AAC (Advanced Audio Coding)

## Listening to music wirelessly on a Bluetooth device

You can listen to music from your *Bluetooth* device over a wireless connection.

Check the websites for the information about compatible *Bluetooth* devices (page 32).

## About the BLUETOOTH indicator

The BLUETOOTH indicator lights up or flashes in blue to show the *Bluetooth* status.

System status	Indicator status
Bluetooth standby	Flashes slowly
Bluetooth pairing	Flashes quickly
Bluetooth connecting	Flashes
Bluetooth connection is established	Lights up

## Pairing this system with a Bluetooth device

Pairing is an operation where *Bluetooth* devices register with each other beforehand. Once a pairing operation is performed, it does not need to be performed again. If your device is an NFC-compatible smartphone, the manual pairing procedure is not necessary.

- 1 Place the *Bluetooth* device within 1 meter (3 feet) from the system.
- 2 Press BLUETOOTH on the unit to select *Bluetooth* function.

"BLUETOOTH" appears in the display panel.

#### Note

If the system is connected to a *Bluetooth* device, press BLUETOOTH to disconnect the *Bluetooth* device.

- 3 Hold down BLUETOOTH on the unit for 2 seconds or more.
  - "PAIRING" flashes in the display panel.

## 4 Perform the pairing procedure on the *Bluetooth* device.

For details, refer to the operating instructions of your *Bluetooth* device.

## 5 Select the model number of the unit on the display of the Bluetooth device.

For example, select "SONY MHC-GPX88" (or LBT-GPX77/GPX55/MHC-GPX77/GPX55/GPX33).

If passkey is required on the *Bluetooth* device, enter "0000".

# 6 Perform the *Bluetooth* connection on the *Bluetooth* device.

When pairing is completed and the *Bluetooth* connection is established, *Bluetooth* device name appears in the display panel.

Depending on the *Bluetooth* device, connection may start automatically after pairing is completed.

You can check the *Bluetooth* device address by pressing DISPLAY repeatedly.

#### Notes

- You can pair up to 9 Bluetooth devices. If the 10th Bluetooth device is paired, the least recently connected device will be replaced by the new one.
- "Passkey" may be called "Passcode", "PIN code", "PIN number" or "Password", etc., depending on the device.
- The pairing standby status of the system is canceled after about 5 minutes. If pairing is not successful, repeat from step 1.
- While connected to a Bluetooth device, this system cannot be detected and connection cannot be established from another Bluetooth device which is never paired before.
- If you want to pair with another *Bluetooth* device, repeat steps 1 to 6.

## To cancel pairing operation

Hold down BLUETOOTH on the unit for 2 seconds or more until "BLUETOOTH" appears in the display panel.

## Connecting with a smartphone by one touch (NFC)

By touching the system with an NFCcompatible smartphone, the system is turned on in *Bluetooth* function automatically, and then proceeds to complete pairing and the *Bluetooth* connection automatically.

## What is "NFC"?

NFC (Near Field Communication) is a technology enabling short-range wireless communication between various devices, such as mobile phones and IC tags. Thanks to the NFC function, data communication can be achieved easily just by touching the designated touchpoint on the NFC-compatible devices.

## 1 Download and install the app "NFC Easy Connect".

Download the free Android app from Google Play by searching for "NFC Easy Connect" or access it by using the two-dimensional code below. Data communication fees may be charged.

## Two-dimensional code\* for direct access

\* Use a two-dimensional code reader app.



#### **Notes**

- The app may not be available in some countries/regions.
- Depending on your smartphone, you can use the NFC function without installing the app. In this case, the operations and specifications may be different. For details, refer to the operating instructions of your smartphone.

### Compatible smartphones

Smartphones with a built-in NFC function (OS: Android 2.3.3 or later, excluding Android 3.x)

## 2 Start the app "NFC Easy Connect" on the smartphone.

Make sure that the application screen is displayed.

3 Touch the smartphone to the N-Mark on the system until the smartphone vibrates.



Complete the connection by following the instructions displayed on the smartphone.

When the *Bluetooth* connection is established, the BLUETOOTH indicator stops flashing and remains light up. *Bluetooth* device name appears in the display panel. You can switch the sound source from the smartphone to another NFC-compatible *Bluetooth* device. For details, refer to the operating instructions of your *Bluetooth* device.

## Tip

If pairing and the *Bluetooth* connection fail, do the following.

- Relaunch "NFC Easy Connect" and move the smartphone slowly over the N-Mark.
- Remove the case from the smartphone if using a commercially available smartphone case.

## Playing music from a Bluetooth device

You can operate a *Bluetooth* device by connecting the system and a *Bluetooth* device using AVRCP.

Check the following before playing music:

- The Bluetooth function of the Bluetooth device is turned on.
- Pairing has been completed.

### ■ For a Bluetooth device

## 1 Press BLUETOOTH on the unit to select *Bluetooth* function.

"BLUETOOTH" appears in the display panel.

## 2 Establish connection with the Bluetooth device.

The last connected *Bluetooth* device will be connected automatically. Perform the *Bluetooth* connection from the *Bluetooth* device if the device is not connected.

Once the connection is established, the *Bluetooth* device name appears in the display panel.

## 3 Press ►.

Depending on the Bluetooth device,

- you may have to press ► twice.
- you may need to start playback of an audio source on the *Bluetooth* device.

#### Notes

- When the system is not connected to any Bluetooth device, the system will connect and playback from the last connected Bluetooth device automatically when you press .
- If you try to connect another Bluetooth device to the system, the current connected Bluetooth device will be disconnected.

## ■ For an NFC-compatible smartphone

Touch the smartphone to the N-Mark on the system to establish the *Bluetooth* connection.

Start playback of an audio source on the smartphone. For details on playback, refer to the operating instructions of your smartphone.

## To disconnect the Bluetooth device

## ■ For a Bluetooth device

Press BLUETOOTH on the unit. "BLUETOOTH" appears in the display panel.

Depending on the *Bluetooth* device, the *Bluetooth* connection may be canceled automatically when you stop playback.

## ■ For an NFC-compatible smartphone

Touch the smartphone to the N-Mark on the system again.

## Erasing all the pairing registration information

Use the buttons on the unit to perform this operation.

## 1 Press BLUETOOTH to select Bluetooth function.

"BLUETOOTH" appears in the display panel.

If the system is connected to a Bluetooth device, the Bluetooth device name appears in the display panel. Press BLUETOOTH to disconnect the Bluetooth device.

## 2 Hold down ENTER and PHASER for about 3 seconds.

"PAIR HISTORY" and "CLEAR" appear in the display panel and all the pairing information is erased.

# Setting the *Bluetooth* audio codecs

You can select the *Bluetooth* audio codecs when the connected *Bluetooth* device supports Advanced Audio Coding (AAC).

- 1 Press OPTIONS on the unit.
- 2 Press ↑/♦ repeatedly to select "BT AAC", then press ⊕.
- 3 Press ◆/◆ repeatedly to select "BT AAC ON" or "BT AAC OFF".
  - BT AAC ON: Advanced Audio Coding (AAC) is selected if the Bluetooth device supports AAC.
  - BT AAC OFF: Sub Band Codec (SBC) is selected.

#### Notes

- You can enjoy high quality sound if the AAC is selected. In case you cannot listen to AAC sound from your device, select "BT AAC OFF".
- If you change this setting while the system is connected to a *Bluetooth* device, the *Bluetooth* device will be disconnected. To connect to the *Bluetooth* device, perform the *Bluetooth* connection again.

## Setting/Canceling Bluetooth standby mode

The system goes into *Bluetooth* standby mode and waits for a *Bluetooth* connection, even when the system is turned off.

- 1 Press OPTIONS on the unit.
- 2 Press ★/★ repeatedly to select "BT STANDBY", then press ⊕.
- 3 Press ↑/♦ repeatedly to select "STANDBY ON" or "STANDBY OFF".
- 4 Press I/ to turn off the system.

When *Bluetooth* standby mode is set to on, the system will turn on automatically when you establish the *Bluetooth* connection from the *Bluetooth* device.

#### Note

The system will not enter *Bluetooth* standby mode if you erase the pairing information.

## **Adjusting the sound**

То	Do this
Reinforce the bass and create a more powerful sound	Press BASS BAZUCA on the unit.
Select a preset sound effect	Press MUSIC, MOVIE/ GAME or FOOTBALL. To cancel preset sound effect, press MUSIC repeatedly to select "FLAT".

# To adjust the subwoofer level (LBT-GPX55/MHC-GPX88/GPX55 only)

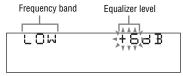
- 1 Press OPTIONS on the unit.
- 2 Press ★/★ repeatedly to select "SUBWOOFER", then press (+).
- 3 Press ◆/◆ repeatedly to select the subwoofer level, then press ⊕.

  To exit the OPTIONS menu, press OPTIONS on the unit.

# Creating your own sound effect

You can raise or lower the levels of specific frequency bands and then store the setting in the memory as "USER EQ".

- 1 Press OPTIONS on the unit.
- 2 Press ★/★ repeatedly to select "EQ EDIT", then press ⊕.
- **3** Press ↑/♦ repeatedly to adjust the equalizer level, then press ⊕.



4 Repeat step 3 to adjust the level of other frequency bands and surround effect.

The user equalizer setting is stored when "USER EQ" appears in the display panel.

## To bring up the user equalizer setting

Press MUSIC repeatedly to select "USER EQ".

# Creating a party atmosphere

(DJ EFFECT)

## 1 Press the following button to select the effect type.

The selected button lights up and the effect is activated.

- FLANGER: Create a deep flanging effect that is similar to the roar of a jet plane.
- ISOLATOR: Isolate a specific frequency band by adjusting the other frequency bands. For example, when you want to focus on vocal and etc.
- SOUND FLASH: Flash the sound output. The sound cuts off periodically.
- PHASER: Create a series of peaks and troughs in the frequency spectrum, like a sweeping effect.

## 2 Press DJ CONTROL +/- to adjust the effect level.

## To turn off the effect

Press the selected effect button again.

#### Notes

- The DJ EFFECT is automatically turned off when you turn off the system or change the function or tuner band.
- If you activate the DJ EFFECT during transfer, the sound effect will not be transferred onto the USB device.
- You cannot use MASTER VOLUME/ DJ CONTROL on the unit to adjust the volume when the DJ EFFECT is activated. Press VOLUME +/- on the remote control to adjust the volume.

## Other Operations

## Singing along

(MHC-GPX88 only)

You can sing along with any audio source that played back on this system.

- 1 Turn MIC LEVEL to MIN to reduce the microphone volume level.
- 2 Connect a microphone to the MIC jack on the unit.
- 3 Start playing the music and adjust the volume.
- 4 Turn MIC LEVEL to adjust the microphone volume.

If acoustic feedback (howling) occurs, reduce the volume, move the microphone away from the speakers, or change the direction of the microphone.

After you have finished, disconnect the microphone.

#### Note

The sound from the microphone will not be transferred onto the USB device during USB transferring.

# Changing the illumination pattern and color

Press LED PATTERN or LED COLOR to select the illumination pattern or color.

(LBT-GPX77/MHC-GPX88/GPX77 only)

Press LED PATTERN or LED COLOR to show current setting. Press again to change the illumination pattern or color on the unit and the speakers instantaneously.

(LBT-GPX55/MHC-GPX55/GPX33 only)

Press LED PATTERN or LED COLOR to show current setting. Press again to change the illumination pattern or color on the unit instantaneously.

To turn off the illumination, press LED PATTERN repeatedly to select "PATTERN OFF".

## **Using the timers**

The system offers three timer functions. You cannot activate both the Play Timer and the Recording Timer at the same time. If you use either with the Sleep Timer, the Sleep Timer has priority.

## **Sleep Timer**

You can fall asleep when listening to music. The system turns off after the preset time.

## Press SLEEP repeatedly.

To cancel Sleep Timer, press SLEEP repeatedly to select "SLEEP OFF".

## Tip

To check the remaining time before the system turns off, press SLEEP.

## **Play Timer/Recording Timer**

Make sure you have set the clock.

## Play Timer:

You can wake up to disc, tuner or USB device at a preset time.

## Recording Timer:

You can transfer music from a preset radio station into a USB device at a specified time.

## **1** For Play Timer:

Prepare the sound source, then press VOLUME +/- to adjust the volume. To start from a specific track or file, create your own program (page 17).

## For Recording Timer:

Tune to the preset radio station (page 22).

- 2 Press TIMER MENU.
- 3 Press ↑/↓ repeatedly to select "PLAY SET" or "REC SET", then press ⊕.
- 4 Set the time to start playback or transferring.

Press  $\bigstar/\bigstar$  repeatedly to set the hour/minute, then press (+).

- 5 Use the same procedure as in step 4 to set the time to stop playback or transferring.
- 6 Press ↑/◆ repeatedly to select the sound source you want, then press ⊕.

## For Recording Timer:

Connect a transferable USB device to the  $\psi$  B port.

7 Press I/U to turn off the system.

## To check the timer setting or activate the timer again

- Press TIMER MENU. "TIMER SELECT" flashes in the display panel.
- 2 Press (+).
- 3 Press ↑/◆ repeatedly to select "PLAY SELECT" or "REC SELECT", then press (+).

## To cancel the timer

Repeat the same procedure as above and select "TIMER OFF" in step 3, and then press +.

#### Notes

- The system turns on before the preset time. If the system is turned on at the preset time or if "STANDBY" flashes in the display panel, the Play Timer and the Recording Timer will not play or transfer.
- Do not operate the system from the time the system turns on until the playback or transferring starts.

## Changing the display

## Changing the display mode

Press DISPLAY repeatedly while the system is turned off.

### Demonstration

The display changes and the indicator flashes even when the system is turned off.

## No display (Power Saving Mode)

The display is turned off to conserve power. The timer and clock continue to operate.

#### Clock

The clock display automatically turns to Power Saving Mode after a few seconds.

## Changing the spectrum pattern of the display panel

- 1 Press OPTIONS on the unit.
- 2 Press ★/★ repeatedly to select "SPECTRUM", then press ⊕.
- 3 Press ◆/◆ repeatedly to select the spectrum pattern you want, then press ⊕.

To exit the OPTIONS menu, press OPTIONS on the unit.

## Viewing information in the display panel

## Press DISPLAY repeatedly when the system is turned on.

You can view the information as follows:

- For AUDIO CD:
  - The elapsed playing time and remaining playing time during playback.
  - The total playing time when playback is stopped.
- · For audio files:
  - The elapsed playing time, file name and folder name.
  - The title, artist and album information.

#### Note

The elapsed playing time of an audio file encoded using a VBR (variable bit rate) is not displayed correctly.

# Using optional equipment

- Press VOLUME repeatedly until "VOLUME MIN" appears in the display panel.
- 2 Connect an optional equipment (page 10).
- 3 Press FUNCTION repeatedly to select the function which corresponds to the connected equipment.
- 4 Start playing the connected equipment.
- 5 Press VOLUME + repeatedly to adjust the volume.

# Deactivating the buttons on the unit

(Child Lock)

You can deactivate the buttons on the unit (except V(b)) for preventing misoperation, such as child mischief.

## Hold down ■ on the unit for more than 5 seconds.

"CHILD LOCK" and "ON" appear in the display panel.

You can only operate the system using the buttons on the remote control.

To cancel, hold down ■ on the unit for more than 5 seconds until "CHILD LOCK" and "OFF" appear in the display panel.

## Note

Child Lock function will be canceled when you disconnect the power cord.

## **Additional Information**

## Playable discs

- AUDIO CD
- CD-R/CD-RW
  - audio data
  - MP3 files that conforms to ISO9660 Level 1/Level 2, or Joliet (expansion format).

### Notes

- MP3 (MPEG 1 Audio Layer-3) is a standard format defined by ISO (International Organization for Standardization) which compresses audio data. MP3 files must be in MPEG 1 Audio Layer-3 format.
- The system can only play back MP3 files that have a file extension of ".mp3".

## Discs that cannot be played back

- CD-ROM
- CD-R/CD-RW which has the following conditions:
  - Recorded in MP3 PRO format
  - Recorded in multisession that have not ended by "closing the session"
  - Recorded with an incompatible recording device
  - Poor recording quality
  - Scratches or dirty
  - Finalized incorrectly
- Discs of non-standard shape (e.g., heart, square, star and etc.)
- Discs that have adhesive tape, paper, or sticker attached to them
- Rental or used discs with attached seals where the glue extends beyond the seal
- Discs that have labels printed using ink that feels tacky when touched

## **Note on DualDiscs**

A DualDiscs is a two sided disc product which mates DVD recorded material on one side with digital audio material on the other side. However, since the audio material side does not conform to the Compact Disc (CD) standard, playback on this product is not guaranteed.

## Music discs encoded with copyright protection technologies

This product is designed to play back discs that conform to the Compact Disc (CD) standard. Recently, various music discs encoded with copyright protection technologies are marketed by some record companies. Please be aware that among those discs, there are some that do not conform to the CD standard and may not be playable by this product.

## Notes on playing multisession discs

- This system can play back multisession discs when an MP3 file is contained in the first session. Any subsequent MP3 files recorded in later sessions can also be played back (If later sessions contain AUDIO CD format, the system cannot play back this multisession discs).
- If the first session is recorded in AUDIO CD format, only the first session will be played back.

## **Troubleshooting**

Should you encounter a problem with your system, find your problem in the troubleshooting checklist below and take the corrective action.

If the problem persists, consult your nearest Sony dealer.

Note that if the service personnel changes some parts during repair, these parts may be retained.

## If "PROTECT EXX" (X is a number) appears in the display panel

Immediately unplug the power cord, and check the following items.

- Are you using only the supplied speakers?
- Is anything blocking the ventilation holes of the unit?

After checking the above items and fixing any problems, plug in the power cord again and turn on the system. If the issue persists, consult your nearest Sony dealer.

## General

## The clock or timer setting is canceled.

 The power cord is disconnected or a power failure occurred. Set the clock (page 14) and timer (page 29) again.

#### There is no sound.

- · Adjust the volume.
- Check the speaker connections (page 10).
- Check the connection of the optional equipment, if any (page 10).
- Turn on the connected equipment.
- There is no audio output during Recording Timer.

## There is no microphone sound. (MHC-GPX88 only)

- Adjust the microphone volume.
- Make sure the microphone is connected to the MIC jack correctly.
- Make sure the microphone is turned on.

### There is severe hum or noise.

- Move the system away from sources of noise.
- Connect the system to a different wall outlet.
- Install a noise filter (commercially available) to the power cord.
- Turn off surrounding electrical equipment.

### The timer does not function.

- Check the timer setting and set the correct time (page 29).
- Cancel the Sleep Timer function (page 29).

### The remote control does not function.

- Remove the obstacles between the remote control and the unit.
- Move the remote control closer to the unit.
- Point the remote control at the unit's sensor.
- Replace the batteries (R6/size AA).
- Move the unit away from the fluorescent light.

#### There is acoustic feedback.

- Reduce the volume.
- (MHC-GPX88 only) Move the microphone away from the speakers or change the direction of the microphone.

## "CHILD LOCK" appears when you press any button on the unit.

• Set the Child Lock function to off (page 31).

## **Speakers**

## Sound comes from one channel or unbalanced left and right volume.

- Place the speakers as symmetrically as possible.
- Check that the speakers are connected securely and correctly.
- The source being played back is monaural.

## There is no sound from a specific speaker.

- Check that the speaker is connected securely and correctly.
- (LBT-GPX55/MHC-GPX88/GPX55 only)
  - Set the subwoofer level to the appropriate level (page 27).

## Disc player

## The disc tray does not open and "LOCKED" appears in the display panel.

 Consult your nearest Sony dealer or local authorized Sony service facility.

### The disc tray does not close.

· Load the disc correctly.

## The disc does not eject.

- Consult your nearest Sony dealer.

## Playback does not start.

- Wipe the disc clean (page 38).
- · Reload the disc.
- Load the disc that this system can play back (page 32).
- Remove the disc and wipe away the moisture on the disc, then leave the system turned on for a few hours until the moisture evaporates.

### The sound skips.

- Wipe the disc clean (page 38).
- · Reload the disc.
- Move the unit to a place with no vibration (e.g., on top of a stable stand).
- Move the speakers away from the unit, or place them on separate stands. When you listen to a track with bass sounds at high volume, the speaker vibration may cause the sound to skip.

## Playback does not start from the first track.

• Set the play mode to Normal Play (page 17).

# The folder name, track name, file name and ID3 tag characters do not appear properly.

- The ID3 tag is not Version 1(1.0/1.1) and Version 2(2.2/2.3).
- The character code that can be displayed by this system are as follows:
  - Upper cases (A to Z)
  - Numbers (0 to 9)
  - Symbols (<> \* +, [ ] \ \_) Other characters appear as "\_".

### **USB** device

### Transferring results in an error.

- You are using an unsupported USB device. Check the information on the websites about compatible USB devices (page 15).
- The USB device is not formatted correctly. Refer to the operating instructions of the USB device on how to format.
- Turn off the system and remove the USB device. If the USB device has a power switch, turn the USB device off and then on again after removing it from the system. Then perform transferring again.

- If the transferring and erase operations are repeated multiple times, the file structure within the USB device becomes fragmented. Refer to the operating instructions supplied with the USB device on how to deal with this problem.
- The USB device was disconnected or the power was turned off during transferring. Delete the partiallytransferred file, and perform transferring again. If this does not fix the problem, the USB device may be broken. Refer to the operating instructions of the USB device on how to deal with this problem.

## Audio files or folders on the USB device cannot be erased.

- Check if the USB device is writeprotected.
- The USB device was disconnected or the power was turned off during the erase operation. Delete the partiallyerased file. If this does not fix the problem, the USB device may be broken. Refer to the operating instructions of the USB device on how to deal with this problem.

### There is no sound.

 The USB device is not connected correctly. Turn off the system and reconnect the USB device, then turn on the system and check if "USB A" or "USB B" lights up in the display panel.

## There is noise, skipping, or distorted sound.

- You are using an unsupported USB device. Check the information on the websites about compatible USB devices (page 15).
- Turn off the system and reconnect the USB device, then turn on the system.
- The music data itself contains noise, or the sound is distorted. Noise may have entered during the transferring process.
   Delete the file, and try transferring again.

 The bit rate used when encoding audio files was low. Send audio files with higher bit rate to the USB device.

# "READING" is displayed for an extended time, or it takes a long time before playback starts.

- The reading process can take a long time in the following cases.
  - There are many folders or files on the USB device (page 16).
  - The file structure is extremely complex.
  - The memory capacity is excessive.
  - The internal memory is fragmented.

## "OVER CURRENT" appears.

• A problem has been detected with the level of electrical current from the  $\psi$  A port or  $\psi$  B port. Turn off the system and remove the USB device from the port. Make sure there is no problem with the USB device. If this display pattern persists, contact your nearest Sony dealer.

## Erroneous display.

- The data stored in the USB device may have been corrupted, perform the transferring again.

## Audio file cannot be played back.

- USB device formatted with file systems other than FAT16 or FAT32 are unsupported.\*

- An AAC audio file that is the AAC DRM or AAC Lossless format cannot be played back.

## When carrying the unit

### Notes on discs

- Before playing, wipe the disc with a cleaning cloth from the center outward to the edge.

- Do not expose discs to direct sunlight or heat sources such as hot air ducts, nor leave it in a car parked in direct sunlight.

## On safety
