





#### Note

When connecting another device to the unit, be sure to connect the unit to the power source after all other connections are completed.

### **Before Installation**

The unit should be installed in an area with good reception.

#### Improving the Reception

FM: The AC power cord functions as an FM antenna.


Extend the AC power cord fully to improve FM reception.

**AM**: When installing the unit, rotate the unit horizontally for optimum reception and then install the unit. A ferrite bar antenna is built into the unit.


## Installing the Unit Under a Cabinet

The unit can be installed without the spacer.


Mark the position of the 4 holes by using the supplied template. Use a drill to make the holes (diameter size-6.5 mm dia., 9/32 inch).



2 When the cabinet door overhangs the shelf and obstructs the unit, you can adjust the unit/shelf height. First set the L mark to the dot which becomes the lowest position, then you can adjust the height in 4 steps (H • • L) by turning the spacer counterclockwise.



## 3 Install the unit with the supplied mounting screws.




#### Cautions

- Since the unit is quite heavy, be careful when installing the unit.
- Hold the unit horizontally when installing it, since the disc tray may open if the unit is shaken.
- To reduce the risk of fire, do not place any heating or cooking appliance beneath this unit.
- Install the unit so that its AC power cord can be connected directly to a wall outlet. Do not use a converter or extension cord.
- Be sure that the AC power cord has no slack when using the unit, since the cord acts as an FM wire antenna. If the AC power cord has some slack, wind up the slack on the cord hook.
- The unit has a built-in ferrite bar antenna for AM radio reception. Check the condition of AM reception before fixing in position.
- Install the unit as far as possible from a source of noise (for example, refrigerator, microwave oven, fluorescent lamp, etc.).

## **Setting the Clock**

- 1 Plug in the unit. "AM 12:00" will flash in the Clock Display Window.
- **2** Press CLOCK for a few seconds. You will hear a beep and the hour digits will start to flash in the Clock Display Window.



- 3 Press RADIO TUNE/TIME SET -, ◄◄(fast reverse) or +, ►►(fast forward) until the correct hour appears in the Clock Display Window.
- **4** Press CLOCK (or ENTER) once. The minute digits will flash.




- 5 Press RADIO TUNE/TIME SET -, ◄◄(fast reverse) or +, ►►(fast forward) until the correct minute appears in the Clock Display Window.
- **6** Press CLOCK (or ENTER) once. You will hear two short beeps and the seconds start counting from zero.

#### Tips

- To set the current time rapidly, hold down RADIO TUNE/TIME SET -, ◄◄ (fast reverse) or +, ►► (fast forward).
- To set the current time exactly to the seconds, adjust the minute function in step 6 and then press CLOCK (or ENTER) to synchronize it with a time signal (such as the telephone time signal).
- In the 12-hour system: "AM 12:00" = midnight.



## Watching the TV

## Setting the monitor


#### Opening the monitor

1 Press DISPLAY RELEASE to open the monitor.

The monitor is released as illustrated.



2 Turn the monitor and adjust the angle to avoid the reflection of light or get a better view of the TV.



## Closing the monitor to its enclosure

Close the monitor until it clicks.

#### Tip

The monitor can be closed with the screen facing either inside or outside.

#### Notes

- Be careful not to catch your finger in the monitor when closing.
- Do not put any foreign objects between the LCD panel and the unit when closing.

## **Setting the Channels**

After you finish connecting the unit, you can run Auto Program to set up your channels. The Initial Setup screen appears when you turn your TV on for the first time.

#### **Using Initial Setup**

To run Initial Setup the first time you turn on your TV.

- 1 Press TV to turn on the TV.
  The Initial Setup screen appears.
- 2 Press TV CH/PRESET +, ▶►I(Next)
  [TUNE/CH +] button to perform Auto
  Program, or press TV CH/PRESET -,
  I◄◄(Previous) [TUNE/CH -] to exit.
  If you select Auto Program, "CABLE" or
  "ANTENNA" appears on the display for
  you to choose.
- 3 Press TV CH/PRESET , I◄◄ (Previous) or +, ▶►I(Next) [TUNE/CH or +] button to select "CABLE" or "ANTENNA".

#### To perform Auto Program again

- 1 Press TV MENU.
- 2 Press TV CH/PRESET , I◄◄ (Previous) or +, ▶►I (Next) [TUNE/CH or +] to select "AUTO PROGRAM", then press ENTER.
- 3 Press TV CH/PRESET , I◄◄ (Previous) or +, ▶►I (Next) [TUNE/CH or +] button to select "YES", then press ENTER.

  Auto Program automatically creates a list of receivable channels. When finished, the lowest numbered channel is displayed.

## Watching the TV

1 Press TV.

2 Select the desired channel using TV CH/
PRESET - , I≪ (Previous) or +,
► I(Next) [TUNE/CH - or +].
When the remote control is used, press 0-9
to select a channel, the channel changes
after 2 seconds. Press ENTER to select
immediately.

Tip
When you press and hold TV CH/PRESET – , I $\blacktriangleleft$ (Previous) or +,  $\blacktriangleright$ ►I (Next) [TUNE/CH – or +], the channel number will change rapidly.

3 Adjust the volume using VOLUME [VOL] + or -.


To turn off the TV Press OFF.

## Setting the screen mode

In addition to the FULL, ZOOM, WIDE, and STANDARD modes are also available.

#### Press MODE/SCREEN SIZE repeatedly.

The current mode is displayed on the screen first. Each time the button is pressed, the screen mode switches in the following sequence:





#### **FULL**

To show an image with an aspect ratio of 16:9.



#### ZOOM

To show an image with an aspect ratio of 4:3 enlarged to the left and right edges of the screen, with the overflowing parts (top and bottom) cut off to fill the screen.



#### WIDE

To show an image with an aspect ratio of 4:3 enlarged to the left and right edges of the screen.



#### STANDARD

To show an image with an aspect ratio of 4:3 (regular image).

**Tip**Images may appear grainy when viewed in the zoom mode.

## To watch CATV channels

You have to subscribe to a CATV company. Note that CATV cannot be received in some areas. This TV receives 1-125 cable TV channels. For details on CATV subscription, consult your nearest CATV company.

#### Note

You cannot receive or set the CATV channels and UHF channels at the same time.

# To display the channel number

Press **DISP** (**Display**) on the remote control. The current channel number appears in the display. Press **DISP** (**Display**) once to turn display off.

## Playing the Radio

## **Manual Tuning**

- 1 Press RADIO ON/BAND [RADIO/BAND] to turn on the radio.
  - "RADIO" appears in the Clock Display Window. The display shows the band and frequency for a few seconds and then changes back to the current time.
- 2 Press RADIO ON/BAND [RADIO/BAND] repeatedly to select the desired band. Each press changes the band as follows:

 FM  $ightharpoonup$  AM  $ightharpoonup$ 

- 3 Press RADIO TUNE/TIME SET ,

  ◄◄(Fast reverse) or +, ▶►(Fast forward) [TUNE/CH or +] to tune in to the desired station.
  - Two short beeps sound when the minimum frequency of each band is received during tuning.
- 4 Adjust the volume using VOLUME [VOL] + or -.

To check the station being received Press RADIO ON/BAND [RADIO/BAND] lightly. The Clock Display Window shows the band and frequency for a few seconds and then changes back to the current time.

To turn off the Radio Press OFF.

# Switching between monaural and stereo

The radio is set for stereo reception at the default setting. If FM stereo reception is poor, set to "FM MONO (monaural)." Noise will be reduced although the sound will not be heard in stereo.

- 1 Press RADIO ON/BAND [RADIO/BAND] to turn on the radio.
- 2 Press RADIO ON/BAND [RADIO/BAND] repeatedly to select FM.
- 3 Press MODE/SCREEN SIZE.

  "Mono(monaural)" or "ST(Stereo)" appears in the Clock Display Window. Each time you press MODE/SCREEN SIZE, the mode changes to either "Mono" or "ST."
- 4 Select Mono or ST.

  The mode you select appears in the Clock
  Display Window for a few seconds and
  returns to the current time.


# **Presetting Your Favorite Stations**

#### **Preset Tuning**

You can preset up to 10 stations for AM, and 20 stations for FM.

### **Presetting a Station**

- 1 Follow steps 1 to 4 in "Manual Tuning" and manually tune in a station you wish to preset.
- 2 Hold down ENTER until the preset number flashes.



3 Press TV CH/PRESET - , I◄◄ (Previous) or +, ►►I(Next) [I◄◄ (Previous)/ ►►I(Next)] to select the number you wish to preset, then press ENTER.

When you press ENTER, the selected preset number lights up in the Clock Display Window.

**Example:** Clock Display Window shows as below when you preset FM 90.0 MHz in preset number 2.



To preset another station, repeat these steps.

To change the preset station, preset a new station. The previous station will be canceled.


## **Tuning in a Preset Station**

- 1 Press RADIO ON/BAND [RADIO/BAND] to turn on the radio.
- 2 Press RADIO ON/BAND [RADIO/BAND] to select the band.
- 3 Press TV CH/PRESET , I◄◄ (Previous) or +, ▶►I(Next) [I◄◄ (Previous)/ ▶►I(Next)] to tune in the desired preset station.
- 4 Adjust the volume using VOLUME [VOL] + or -.



# Playing a disc **DVD VCD**




1 Open and turn the monitor and adjust the tilt and swivel.



2 Press DVD to turn on the player.

## 3 Press OPEN/CLOSE to open the disc tray, and place a disc on the disc tray.



- 4 Press OPEN/CLOSE to close the disc tray.
- DVD/Video CD
   Playback starts automatically.
   If playback does not start automatically, press ►II (Play/Pause) to start playback.
   CD
- The total play time appears. Press ►II (Play/Pause) to start playback.
- 5 Press VOLUME [VOL] + or to adjust the volume.

## To turn off the power Press OFF.

#### Notes

- Read the operating instructions supplied with the disc to play with this unit.
- Depending on the recording method used on the disc, it may take a minute or more before playing.
- Depending on the condition of the disc, it may not play back (page 33).
- "DVD" also appears in the Clock Display Window, if you inserted the disc (DVD/VCD/CD).

#### Operation for playback

Stop playback	Press ■*¹.
Eject the disc	Press ▲ OPEN/ CLOSE on the unit after the disc stops.
Pause	Press ►II *2. Press again to resume playback.
Go to the next chapter, or track	Press ►►I.

No sound is output during fast forward or fast reverse.

## Searching a chapter/title/track directly

#### Use the remote control.

To select the desired chapter/track number Press the number buttons to enter the desired chapter/track number. The chapter/track changes after 2 seconds. Press ENTER to select immediately.

#### To select the desired title

After pressing one of the number buttons, press ◀ within 2 seconds and input the title number desired. The title changes after 2 seconds. Press ENTER to select immediately.

#### Note

On some discs, the title cannot be selected directly by entering the desired title number.

### Resume playback

You can resume playback from the point where the playback has been stopped. The unit memorizes the point even after the power is turned off.







## Using a DVD menu **DVD**

With some DVDs you can use the original menu such as Title menu and DVD menu. In title menu, you can play your favorite scene or song by selecting titles of songs and scenes. You can select an item, subtitle language, audio language etc. by selecting a DVD menu. The contents of title menus and DVD menus differ depending on the DVD. There may be some DVDs which have no recorded menus.



### **Using the TOP MENU button**

Some DVDs have a title menu. From the title menu you can select a title for playback. Titles are the longest sections of a picture or music feature on a DVD, e.g., a movie, or an album for audio software, etc. The **TOP MENU** button is available to display the initial menu screen.

- 1 During DVD playback, press TOP MENU. The title menu\* (top menu) is displayed. \* The contents of the title menu differ, depending on the DVD.
- 2 Press **▲**/**▶**/**▼**/**◄** to select the desired title.
- **3 Press ENTER.** The title you selected starts to play.

### Using the MENU button

Some DVDs have a more comprehensive menu that includes things such as the audio languages, subtitle languages, titles, and chapters, etc.

- 1 During a DVD playback, press MENU. The DVD menu is displayed.
- 2 Press **△**/**▶**/**▼**/**◄** to select the desired item.
- **3** Press ENTER.

  If additional selection screens appear, repeat steps 2 and 3.



- 1 During playback of a DVD having multiple alternative angles recorded, press ANGLE when a notice appears. The number of the currently selected angle is displayed at the upper right.
- 2 Press ANGLE repeatedly to select your favorite angle number, while the angle number is displayed.

Each time you press **ANGLE**, the angle number switches.





- You can switch the angle only if multiple angles are recorded on the DVD.



#### **♦ DIGITAL OUTPUT**

You can set the mode of the audio signals output from the OPTICAL OUTPUT connector.

PCM	Select this when you connect an audio component without a built-in Dolby Digital decoder or DTS decoder. The downmix signal is output.
OFF	No signal is output from OPTICAL OUTPUT connector.

#### Notes

- When "OFF" is selected, no signal is output from the OPTICAL OUTPUT connector.
- When you connect the player and a digital recording device such as an MD player through an optical cable to record the CD contents with that device, the contents will be recorded as one continuous track.
- If noise occurs in peripheral equipment when using DIGITAL OUTPUT, select "OFF" to turn off DIGITAL OUTPUT.





The timer can be set at one minute intervals between 1–120

- 1 Turn TIMER until the desired time appears in the Clock Display Window. "TIMER" will appear in the Clock Display Window when TIMER is turned. After setting the time, the current time is displayed again if you do not perform any operation for more than 65 seconds.
- 2 Push TIMER once.
  Timer indicator lights and beep sounds.

To display the current time, press **CLOCK**.

#### Cooking Timer ON—

When the time has elapsed, the buzzer will sound and the TIMER indicator flashes.



# Preparing the Remote Control

## Installing the batteries into the remote control

Insert two size AA (R6) batteries (not supplied).



### When to replace the batteries

With normal use, the batteries should last for about six months. When the remote control no longer operates the kitchen clock radio, replace all the batteries with new ones.

#### Notes

- · Do not charge the dry batteries.
- When you are not going to use the remote control for a long time, remove the batteries to avoid any damage caused by leakage and corrosion.


### Notes on discs

- To keep the disc clean, do not touch the surface. Handle the disc by its edge.
- Keep your discs in their cases or disc magazines when not in use. Do not subject the discs to heat/high temperature. Avoid leaving them in parked cars or on dashboards/rear trays.

- Discs with non-standard shapes (e.g., heart, square, star) cannot be played on this player. Attempting to do so may damage the player. Do not use such discs.
- Before playing, clean the discs with a commercially available cleaning cloth. Wipe each disc from the center out. Do not use solvents such as benzine, thinner, commercially available cleaners, or antistatic spray intended for analog discs.

## **Troubleshooting**

Should any problem occur with the unit, make the following checks to determine whether or not servicing is required. If the problem persists, consult the nearest Sony dealer.

#### There is no picture.

- Check the AUX, TV and DVD settings
  - → when watching TV, set to TV; when watching video equipment, set to AUX; when watching DVD, set to DVD.

- Try another TV channel; it could be station trouble.

## IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDS

#### INSTALLATION

#### Water and Moisture

Do not use powerline operated appliances near water - for example, near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool, etc.

Do not place the appliance near or over a radiator or heat register, or where it is exposed to direct sunlight.

#### Ventilation

The slots and openings in the cabinet are provided for necessary ventilation. To ensure reliable operation of the appliance, and to protect it from overheating, these slots and openings must never be blocked or covered

-Never cover the slots and openings with a cloth or other materials.

#### Accessories

#### Power Source

#### **Grounding or Polarization**

This appliance is equipped with a polarized AC power cord plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other), or with a three-wire grounding type plug (a plug having a third pin for grounding). Follow the instructions below:

**-For the appliance with a polarized AC power cord plug:** This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. 
#### **Outdoor Antenna Grounding**

An outdoor antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can come in contact with such power lines or circuits. WHEN INSTALLING AN OUTDOOR ANTENNA SYSTEM, EXTREME CARE SHOULD BE TAKEN TO KEEP FROM CONTACTING SUCH POWER LINES OR CIRCUITS AS CONTACT WITH THEM IS ALMOST INVARIABLY FATAL.

Be sure the antenna system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Section 810 of the National Electrical Code provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.

#### SERVICE **Damage Requiring Service**
