
# Package Contents

# **Photo Frame Overview**

The package contents may differ slightly in appearance with the provided images



- 1. Power ( 🖞 ): Press to turn on or turn off the DPF player.
- **2.** ( Image): Move the cursor to the previous icon or skip to the previous picture.
- 3. Play / Pause ( ►II ): Press to enter / confirm; Press to pause when slideshow pictures and press again to continue slideshow.
- 4. ( **>>**I): Move the cursor to the next icon or skip to the next picture.
- 5. ( ( ): Move right (volume up when playing music).
- 6. ( 🔹 ): Move left (volume down when playing music).
- 7. Menu: Back to last step.
- 8. SD/SDHC: Insert a SD/SDHC card.
- 9. USB Host: Insert a USB flash stick.
- 10. USB Device: Connect to computer.
- 11. 5V DC IN: Insert the power adaptor cord to connect the unit with power outlet.

# **Remote Control**

#### Power:

Press to turn on or turn off your DPF player.

#### Setup:

Press to set up picture display.

#### Enter:

Press to enter/confirm; Press to pause when slideshow pictures and press again to continue slideshow.

#### (Navigation buttons:

- ▲ Press to move cursor up.
- Press to move cursor down.
- Press to move cursor left or to the last picture.
- Press to move cursor right or to the next picture.

#### EXIT:

Press to exit from the present interface.

#### ZOOM:

Press to zoom picture when browse pictures.

#### (ROTATE: )

Press to rotate picture when browse pictures except in thumbnail pictures mode and Edit mode.

#### SLIDE SHOW:

Press to slide the pictures in the thumbnail pictures mode.

Note: Remove Insulating Tab to activate battery.



# **Power Connection**




- 1. Connect the power adapter to the DC IN jack on the left side of the frame.
- 2. Plug in the power socket.
- 3. The frame will automatically power on.

# Insert a memory card

Insert card in the direction indicated by the arrow on the top of the card (the side of the memory card on which sticker is affixed face the frame).

### SD/SDHC card is compatible with this unit.


Aligning the memory card upside down may cause user-error damage. This may nullify the warranty.



# Insert a memory card

#### **USB** Removable Storage Devices

Insert USB removable storage device into the USB port on the side of the frame.



NOTE: This device will read USB first and will not recognise the memory card if you Insert a memory card and extra USB memory together at the same time.

### **Removing the Memory Card**

When removing a memory card from the frame, pull the card straight away from the unit. Avoid bending the card.

### Select SD card or USB device

On the main menu, press EXIT, and select to read SD card or USB device.



### **Photos**

### **Display Photos**

**Note:** The frame will display pictures in the memory card or USB device automatically if there is a memory card or USB device is inserted to the frame before connecting power.

In the main menu, select PHOTO icon and press ENTER to enter into the storage selecting mode, select the storage and press ENTER again. Select the desired photo and press ENTER to begin a photo slide show.



## **Photos**

### Thumbnail Mode

When displaying, press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\forall$  to move to previous or next photo, press EXIT to enter into Thumbnail Mode.

Select the Return icon in Thumbnail Mode and press ENTER to return to previous menu.

### **Rotate a Photo**

When displaying images on the Browse Mode, press the ROTATE on the remote control to rotate the displaying photo for 90nce an operation.





### Zoom in/out a photo

Press the shortcut button Zoom on the remote control to zoom in or zoom out the desired photo.

#### Exit

Press EXIT on the remote control or press the **MENU** button on the back of unit to return to the previous menu.

# Videos

# View Videos

1. Select the "Video" icon on the screen.



2. A list of Video files stored on your media will appear on the screen. Use the up and down keys on the remote control to select the desired the video then press **"Enter"**. You can press the (►II) to pause/play.



3. You may zoom in on the video by pressing the **"Zoom"** button on the remote control.

4. The next video will play automatically on the list. You may also select another video using the up and down keys on your remote control.


# Music

# Listen to Music

1. Select the "Music" icon on the screen.



2. A list of MP3 files stored on your media will appear on the screen. Use the up and down keys on the remote control to select the desired the song then press "Enter". You can press the ( $\triangleright$ II) to pause/play.



3. The next song will play automatically on the song list. You may also select another song using the up and down keys on your remote control.

# Calendar

Select the Calendar icon in the main menu, and press **ENTER** to display the calendar. Press the navigation buttons to select the date in further or past. **Press ENTER** to change the display mode.



# Exit

Press EXIT on the remote control to return to the main menu.


Note: After plug off, the calendar and clock need to be reset.

# File

1. Select the "File" icon on the screen.



2. Select the photo you want to copy using the up and down keys on your remote control and press ( $\blacktriangleright$ ) the key. You will see a list on the screen.



3. The list will display **"copying to internal"**, **"delete files"**, **"Cancel"** item for selection.

4. Move cursor to select and press "OK" to confirm your operation.

5. Press "Exit" to return.

# **Enter Setting Interface**

Tip 1. Press the SETUP button on the remote cotrol to enter the Setting interface.

Tip 2. Select Setting icon in the main menu and press ENTER to enter Setting interface.



Tip 3. Choose Photo setup, Calendar setup, Video Setup, Music Setup or System setup, and press ENTER to setup.

# Setting Menu guide

Press "  $\blacktriangle$ " or " $\triangledown$ " to select the setting item, and press "ENTER" to confirm, press " $\blacktriangleleft$ " or " $\triangleright$ " to change the value.

# Photo Set up:



### **Display Mode**

Select to set the display mode to preview photos in slideshow mode, browse mode or Thumbnail mode.

#### Music

Select to play music or not in slideshow mode.

### **Display Ratio**

Select to set the photo displaying type

#### **Slideshow Duration**

Select to set the time the photo remains on the screen in slideshow mode.


### **Slideshow Repeat**

Select to set the date of the unit.

### **Clock Time**

Select to turn on or turn off the alarm function.

### Alarm Time

Select to set the time of the alarm.

### **Alarm Frequency**

Select to set the alarm frequency.

Note: When setting date and time, press" $\blacktriangleleft$ " or " $\blacktriangleright$ " to select date and time, press " $\blacktriangle$ " or " $\blacktriangledown$ " to change the value.

# Troubleshooting

### Some simple checks or a minor adjustment eliminate common problems:

#### No power

- 1.Check the power button is on.
- 2. Check the power outlet is operational.
- 3. Check the power cord is no damanaged.
- 4. Check the power plug is firmly connected to photo frame.

### Can not read the card

- 1. Check the card is no damanaged.
- 2. Check the card is connected the photo frame correctly.
- 3.Pull out the card, and then insert again.

### Photo Frame is not working

Trun off the power, and then turn it on again.
