


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


Important Safeguards

24) Always operate this equipment from a 120 V AC, 60 Hz power source only.



25) Always make sure the antenna system is properly grounded to provide adequate protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges (see Section 810 of the National Electric Code).



## 26) DANGER: RISK OF SERIOUS PERSONAL INJURY OR DEATH!

Use extreme care to make sure you are never in a position where your body (or any item you are in contact with, such as a ladder or screwdriver) can accidentally touch overhead power lines. Never locate the antenna near overhead power lines or other electrical circuits.

#### Care

For better performance and safer operation of your TOSHIBA TV, follow these recommendations and precautions:

- 27) Always sit approximately 10–25 feet away from the TV and as directly in front of it as possible. The picture can appear dull if you sit too far to the left or right of the TV, or if sunlight or room lights reflect on the screen. Turn the TV off to check for reflections on the screen, and then remove the source of reflections while viewing the TV.
- Always unplug the TV before cleaning. Never use liquid or aerosol cleaners.



- 30) [*This item applies to projection TVs only.*] If the air temperature rises suddenly (for example, when the TV is first delivered), condensation may form on the lenses. This can make the picture appear distorted or the color appear faded. If this happens, turn off the TV for 6 to 7 hours to allow the condensation to evaporate.
- 31) For added protection of your TV from lightning and power surges, always unplug the power cord and disconnect the antenna from the TV if you leave the TV unattended or unused for long periods of time.
- 32) During normal use, the TV may make occasional snapping or popping sounds. This is normal, especially when the unit is being turned on or off. If these sounds become frequent or continuous, unplug the power cord and contact a Toshiba Authorized Service Center.

35) If you have the TV serviced:



## Exploring your new TV


You can operate your TV by using the buttons on the front panel or the remote control. The front and back panels provide all the inputs you will need to connect other equipment to your TV.


## Selecting a location for the TV

- Place the TV on the floor or on a sturdy platform in a location where light does not directly hit the screen.
- Place the TV far enough from the walls to allow proper ventilation. Inadequate ventilation may cause overheating, which may damage the TV.



## Connecting your TV

- A coaxial cable is the standard cable that comes in from your antenna or cable converter box. Coaxial cables use "F" connectors.
- Standard A/V (audio/video) cables are usually color coded according to use: yellow for video and red and white for audio. The red audio cable is for the stereo right channel, and the white audio cable is for the stereo left (or mono) channel. If you look at the rear panel of the TV, you will see that the terminals are color coded in the same manner as the cables.
- S-video cables provide better picture performance than standard video cables. S-video cables can only be used with S-video compatible components.
- Component video cables provide better picture performance than S-video cables. Component video cables can only be used with component video compatible components.
- HDMI (High Definition Multimedia Interface) cable is for use with video equipment that has HDMI output (see page 14).



## **Connecting a VCR**

This connection allows you to watch local channels and video programs, play or record on the VCR while watching TV, and record from one channel while watching another channel.

If using a mono VCR, connect L/Mono to VCR Audio OUT using only one audio cable. For better picture quality, if your VCR has S-video, you can use an S-video cable instead of the standard video cable. Do not connect a standard video cable and an S-video cable to VIDEO-1 (or VIDEO-2) simultaneously.

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### Connecting a cable converter box or Antenna

This television has an extended tuning range and can tune most cable channels without using a cable company supplied converter box. Some cable companies offer "premium pay channels" in which the signal is scrambled. Descrambling these signals for normal viewing requires the use of a descrambler device, which is generally provided by the cable company.

#### **Option 1 : For Subscribers to Basic Cable TV Service**

For basic cable service not requiring a Converter/Descrambler box, connect the incoming 75 ohm Coaxial Cable directly to the Antenna Jack on the back of the television.

#### **Option 2 : For Subscribers to Scrambled Cable TV Service**


If you subscribe to a cable service that requires the use of a Converter/ Descrambler box, connect the incoming cable to the Converter/ Descrambler box and connect the output of the box to the Antenna Jack on the back of the television. Follow the connections shown below. Set the television to the output of the Converter/Descrambler box (usually channel 3 or 4) and use the Converter/Descrambler box to select channels.

## Option 3 : For Subscribers to Unscrambled Basic Cable with Scrambled Premium Channels

If you subscribe to a cable service in which basic cable channels are unscrambled and premium channels require the use of a Converter/ Descrambler box, you may wish to use a two-set signal splitter (sometimes called a "two-set coupler") and an A/B Switch box from the cable installer or an electronics supply store. Follow the connections shown below. With the switch in the "B" position, you can directly tune any nonscrambled channels on your TV. With the switch in the "A" position, tune your TV to the output of the Converter/Descrambler box (usually channel 3 or 4) and use the box to tune scrambled channels.

#### Note:


When you use a converter box with your TV, there may be features that you cannot program using the remote control, such as labeling channels, blocking channels, and programming your favorite channels.



## Connecting a DVD player/satellite receiver and a VCR

This connection allows you to watch DVD/satellite, VCR, or TV programs. You can record from the satellite receiver and TV, as well as record one TV channel while watching another channel.

#### From satellite



You will need:

- three coaxial cables
- two sets of standard A/V cables
- one S-video cable
- one pair of standard audio cables

#### Note:

You can use a standard video cable instead of the S-video cable, but the picture quality will decrease. If you use an S-video cable between the TV and DVD player/satellite receiver, make the audio connections but remove the standard video cable. Do not connect both an S-video and a standard video cable to VIDEO1 (or VIDEO2) at the same time or the picture performance will be unacceptable.

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
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## Connecting a DVD player with ColorStream<sup>®</sup> (component video) and a VCR

This connection allows you to watch DVD, VCR, or TV programs and record TV programs. You can record from one source while watching a program from another source. Your TV is capable of using ColorStream (component video.) Connecting your TV to a component video compatible DVD player, such as a Toshiba DVD player with ColorStream<sup>®</sup>, can greatly enhance picture quality and performance.



You will need:

- · two coaxial cables
- one set of standard A/V cables
- one set of component video cables
- one pair of standard audio cables

#### Note:

You can connect the component video cables to either set of ColorStream jacks on the TV (HD-1 or HD-2).

The ColorStream HD-1 and HD-2 jacks can be used with Progressive (480p, 720p) and Interlaced (480i, 1080i) scan systems. A 1080i signal will provide the best picture performance.

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
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## Connecting a DTV receiver / set-top box with ColorStream<sup>®</sup> (component video) and a VCR

This connection allows you to watch DTV (digital TV), VCR, and TV programs, and record DTV and TV programs.

Your TV has ColorStream<sup>®</sup> (component video) inputs. Connecting your TV to a DTV receiver with component video can greatly enhance picture quality and realism.



#### You will need:

- · three coaxial cables
- two sets of standard A/V cables
- · one set of standard audio cables
- · one set of component video cables

#### Note:

You can connect the component video cables to either set of ColorStream jacks on the TV (HD-1 or HD-2.) For HDMI connection see page 14.

The ColorStream HD-1 and HD-2 jacks and HDMI jacks can be used with Progressive (480p, 720p) and Interlaced (480i, 1080i) scan systems. A 1080i signal will provide the best picture performance.

If your DTV receiver does not have component video, use the S-video and standard audio connections instead. Do not connect both an S-video and a standard video cable to VIDEO1 (or VIDEO2) at the same time or the picture performance will be unacceptable.

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
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## **Connecting two VCRs**

This connection allows you to record (dub/edit) from one VCR to another VCR.

You will also be able to record from one TV channel while watching another channel.



You will need:

- two coaxial cables
- two sets of standard A/V cables

#### Note:

Do not connect the same VCR to the output and input jacks on the TV at the same time. For better picture quality, if your VCR has S-video, you can use an S-video cable instead of the standard video cable. Do not connect a standard video cable and an S-video cable to VIDEO-1 (or VIDEO-2) simultaneously.


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Connecting your TV

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This connection allows you to watch videos recorded on a camcorder.



You will need:

- one S-video cable
- one pair of standard audio cables

#### Note:

For better picture quality, if your camcorder has S-video, you can use an S-video cable (plus the standard audio cables) instead of a standard video cable.

Do not connect both a standard video cable and an S-video cable at the same time, or the picture performance will be unacceptable. Welcome to Toshiba

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### Connecting an HDMI<sup>™</sup> or a DVI device to the HDMI input

The HDMI<sup>[1]</sup> input on your TV receives digital audio and uncompressed digital video from an HDMI device or uncompressed digital video from a DVI<sup>[2]</sup> device.

This input is designed to accept HDCP<sup>[3]</sup> program material in digital form from EIA/CEA-861/861B–compliant<sup>[4]</sup> consumer electronic devices (such as a set-top box or DVD player with HDMI or DVI output).

The HDMI input is designed for best performance with high definition video signals. It will accept and display 480i, 480p, 720p and 1080i signals.

## To connect an HDMI device, you will need:

• one HDMI cable (type A connector)


For proper operation, it is recommended that you use as short an HDMI cable as possible. You should not encounter difficulty if you use an HDMI cable that is shorter than 16.4 ft (5m).

HDMI cable transfers both video and audio. Separate analog audio cables are not required (see illustration below).

#### You must set the HDMI audio input setting to "HDMI" in the AUDIO menu (see page 43).

Some CDVs (Video CDs) may not output digital audio signals. In that case, you may hear sound by connecting analog audio cables. If you do use analog audio cables for this reason, you will need to set the HDMI audio input setting to "DVI" to hear the analog audio (see page 43). **Note:** If you connect an HDMI device and analog audio cables and play media with digital audio output, to hear digital audio you must set the HDMI audio input setting to "HDMI" (page 43).

- [1] HDMI = High-Definition Multimedia Interface.
- [2] DVI = Digital Video Interface.
- [3] HDCP = High-bandwidth Digital Content Protection.
- [4] EIA/CEA-861/861B compliance covers the transmission of uncompressed digital video with highbandwidth digital content protection, which is being standardized for reception of high-definition video signals. Because this is an evolving technology, it is possible that some devices may not operate properly with the TV.

#### To ensure that the HDMI or DVI device is reset properly, it is recommended that you follow these procedures:

- When turning on your electronic components, turn on the TV first, and then the HDMI or DVI device.
- When turning off your electronic components, turn off the HDMI or DVI device first, and then the TV.

#### To connect a DVI device, you will need: • one HDMI-to-DVI adapter cable

(HDMI type A connector)


For proper operation, the length of an HDMI-to-DVI adapter cable should not exceed 9.8 ft (3m). The recommended length is 6.6 ft (2m).

• one pair of standard analog audio cables

An HDMI-to-DVI adapter cable transfers only video. Separate analog audio cables are required (see illustration below.)

You must set the HDMI audio input setting to "DVI" in the AUDIO menu (see page 43).

#### **DVI device**



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
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## Connecting an audio system

This connection allows you to use an audio amplifier and external speakers, and adjust the audio level using the TV's remote control. To control the audio, turn on the TV and the stereo amplifier, and turn off the TV's built-in speakers (see "Turning off the built-in speakers" on page 43).

#### Note:

To hear sound when using an external audio amplifier, the volume of both the TV and the amplifier must be set above 0 (zero.) For example, if the volume of the TV is set to 0, you will not be able to hear any sound, even the volume of the amplifier is at its highest level.

### Preparing the remote control for use

Your Toshiba TV remote control has one dedicated TV mode and five universal modes: VCR, Cable/SAT, DVD, Audio1, and Audio2. The target devices and default devices being programmed for each mode are as follows:



Repeatedly press MODE to cycle among the modes. If you own different brands of audio/video devices, you must first program your remote control (see "Programming the remote control for use with your audio/video devices" on page 19).


## Installing the remote control batteries

To install the batteries:

1. Slide the battery cover off the back of the remote control.



2. Install two "AA" size alkaline batteries. Match the + and – signs on the batteries to the signs on the battery compartment.




3. Slide the battery cover back on to the remote control until the lock snaps.

#### Note:

Your TV's remote control may not operate certain features on your VCR, cable TV converter, or other electronic device.

Refer to the owner's manuals for your other devices to determine their available features. If your TV's remote control does not operate a specific feature on a device, use the remote control that came with the device.



#### Caution:

· Never throw batteries into a fire.

### Notes:

- Be sure to use AA size batteries.
- Dispose of batteries in a designated disposal area.
- Batteries should always be disposed of with the environment in mind. Always dispose of batteries in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.
- If the remote control does not operate correctly, or if the operating range becomes reduced, replace batteries with new ones.
- When necessary to replace batteries in the remote control, always replace both batteries with new ones. Never mix battery types or use new and used batteries in combination.
- Always remove batteries from remote control if they are dead or if the remote control is not to be used for an extended period of time. This will prevent battery acid from leaking into the battery compartment.

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Programming the remote control for use with your audio/video devices

#### **Device code setup**

 Refer to the Device code table on pages 21–22 to find the code for your device.

If more than one number is listed, try each one separately until you find one that works.

- 2. Press MODE until the Mode indicator for the device (CABLE/SAT, VCR, DVD, AUDIO1, AUDIO2) lights up.
- While holding down the RECALL button, press the Channel Number buttons to enter the four-digit code of your blank of device.
   If a valid code is entered, the mode indicator will blink twice.
   If an invalid code is entered, the mode indicator will blink one long blink.
- 4. Point the remote control at the device and press POWER to test the code. If the device turns on, you have entered the correct code. If the device does not respond to the remote control, you may have entered the wrong code. Repeat steps 3 and 4 using another code.
- 5. Press MODE to select the TV mode to control the TV.

#### Searching and sampling the code of a device (8500)

If you do not know the device code for a particular target unit, you can cycle the remote control through the available codes for that device mode and sample the functions to find the code that properly operates the target device. The keys available to be sampled, provided they are applicable to that mode, are 0, 1, 2, 3, POWER, VOL  $\blacktriangle$ , CH  $\blacklozenge$ , PLAY and STOP. Invalid keys will be ignored while in program mode. To cycle through each available device code and sample its functions:

- 1. Press MODE to select the mode you want to set up.
- 2. While holding down the RECALL button, press 8 –5 –0 –0. The remote control will enter program mode.
- 3. Point the remote control at the target device and press POWER (or other function buttons that are available to be sampled).
- 4. If the device responds to the remote control:

Press RECALL to store the device code. The mode indicator will blink twice and the remote control will exit the program mode.

- If the device does not respond to the remote control: Press ▲, and then press POWER. Repeat this step until the device responds to the remote control, and then press RECALL.
- **Note:** When a search cycle is completed, the mode indicator will blink three times. The remote control will begin to cycle through the available codes again. If no key is pressed within 10 seconds while programming, the remote control will exit the program mode and return to the previous code.

#### Notes:

- Every time you replace the batteries, you must reprogram the remote control.
- Some newer VCRs are capable of working on either of two remote codes. These VCRs have a switch labeled "VCR1/VCR2." If your VCR has this kind of switch and does not respond to any of the codes for your VCR brand, set the switch to the other position (VCR1 or VCR2) and reprogram the remote control.

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#### Using the volume lock feature (8000)

For the TV, CABLE/SAT, VCR, and DVD modes, the volume controls (VOL  $\blacktriangle \blacksquare$  and MUTE) can be programmed (locked) to the selected device mode. This feature does not apply to the AUDIO1/2 modes.


For example, to lock the volume controls to always jump to the CABLE/ SAT mode:

- 1. Repeatedly press MODE to select the CABLE/SAT mode.
- 2. While holding down the RECALL button, press 8 –0 –0 –0.
- 3. Press VOL A.

To reset the volume controls to the original device code:

1. While holding down the RECALL button, press 8 –0 –0 –0. 2. Press VOL  $\checkmark$ .

The Mode indicator will blink four times (unlocked).

### **Operational feature reset (8900)**

This feature clears all setup features not related to "Device code set up" and resets the Volume Lock to "TV."

#### To reset the features:

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While holding down the RECALL button, press 8 - 9 - 0 - 0. The Mode indicator will blink two times, and then pause and blink two more times.

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Using the Remote Control

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#### Learning about the remote control

The buttons used for operating the TV only are described here. For a complete list of the remote control's functions, see the "Remote control functional key chart" on pages 17-18.

POWER turns the TV on and off

SLEEP allows access to the automatic TV shut-off function (page 40)

LIGHT The first press of the LIGHT button lights the keypad and turns on the Illumination mode. With the Illumination mode on, pressing any other key lights the keypad for 5 seconds (10 seconds if you're in programming mode). Subsequent presses of the LIGHT button toggle between turning the Illumination mode on and off.

CHANNEL NUMBERS (0-9, 100) allow direct access to channels (page 26)

- **MODE** cycles through the six device modes: TV, CABLE/SAT, VCR, DVD, AUDIO1, and AUDIO2. The mode indicator light will remain lit for a few seconds (page 19).
- PIC SIZE cycles through the five pictures sizes: Natural, TheaterWide 1, 2, 3, and Full (page 34)

**MENU** allows access to on-screen programming menus (page 24)

ENTER sets programming menu information (page 24)

▲▼◆ select or adjust programming menus (page 24)

**FAV**▲▼ cycles through favorite channels (page 26)

 $CH \blacksquare \nabla$  cycles through programmed channels (page 26)

 $\mathsf{VOL} \blacktriangle \blacktriangledown$  adjusts the volume level

**EXIT** exits the programming menus (page 24)

**INPUT** selects the video input source (page 32)

MUTE mutes the sound (page 41)

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## Setting up your TV

After you have installed the batteries and programmed the remote control, you need to set some preferences on the TV using the menu system. You can access the menu system with the buttons on the remote control.

- When you make a menu selection, your changes occur immediately. You do not have to press MENU or EXIT to save your changes.
- After 15 seconds, the menu screen will automatically close if you do not make a selection. Your changes will still be saved.
- When you are finished programming the menus, press EXIT.

#### Starting setup

The STARTING SETUP feature appears the first time you turn on the TV, and helps you select the menu language, specify the TV/CABLE setting, and program channels automatically.

IMPORTANT: You must connect an antenna or cable TV system first. See "Connecting your TV" on pages 7-15 for details.

- Press POWER to turn on the TV. The starting setup function begins and the language setup menu appears on the screen. Press ▲ or ▼ to select your desired language, then press ENTER.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select "TV" or "CABLE," then press ENTER.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select "START," then press ENTER. If you select "CANCEL" and press ENTER, the STARTING SETUP stops and changes to the TV screen.

- 4. Now the "AUTO SETUP" starts. After the starting setup is completed, the TV channel appears on the screen.



### Image tilt correction

When you install or change the direction of the TV, the picture may become tilted (caused by the Earth's magnetism). If this happens, use the image tilt correction feature to obtain the best possible picture.

#### To adjust the image tilt:

- 1. Press MENU, then press ◀ or ► until the SETUP menu appears.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight IMAGE TILT.
- Press ◀ or ► to adjust the picture tilt (from -10 to 10.)

## Adding channels to the TV's memory


When you press CH  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\bigtriangledown$ , your TV will stop only on the channels you have programmed into the TV's channel memory. Follow the steps below to program channels into the channel memory.

#### Programming channels automatically

Your TV can automatically detect all active channels and store them in its memory. After the TV has stored the channels in its memory automatically, you can add or erase channels manually.

#### To add channels automatically:

- 1. Press MENU, then press  $\blacktriangleleft$  or  $\blacktriangleright$  to display the SETUP menu.
- 2. Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  until the TV/CABLE
- selection is highlighted.
  Press ◀ or ► to highlight either TV or CABLE, depending on which you use. If you use an antenna, choose TV.



- If you use cable, choose CABLE. 4. Press ▼ until the CH PROGRAM selection is highlighted.
- 5. Press ◀ or ► to start channel programming. The TV will automatically cycle through all the TV or Cable channels (depending on which you selected), and store all active channels in the channel memory. While the TV is cycling through the channels, the message "PROGRAMMING NOW-PLEASE WAIT" appears.
- 6. When channel programming is complete, the message "COMPLETED" appears.
- 7. Press CH  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\triangledown$  to view the programmed channels.

#### Adding and erasing channels manually

After you have programmed the channels automatically, you can add or erase specific channels manually.

#### To add or erase channels manually:

1. Select the channel you want to add or erase. If you are adding a channel, you must select the channel using the Channel Number buttons.

#### Using the LOCKS menu

Note: The V-Chip feature is available for the U.S. V-Chip system only. The Canadian V-Chip system is not supported. You can prevent others from viewing certain programs or channels by blocking them using the V-Chip feature.

### Selecting a password

Before you can use the V-Chip feature to block programs and channels, you must select a password. The password you select prevents others from changing the rating limits you set.

#### To select your password and access the LOCKS menu:



## Using the V-Chip (parental control) feature

When you try to view a program with a ratings block, a message will appear listing the program's ratings. The program can still be viewed if you press MUTE and then enter your password to temporarily bypass the block.

## Locking channels

With the CH LOCK feature, you can lock specific channels. You will not be able to tune locked channels unless you clear the setting. You can choose to lock up to nine TV channels and nine cable channels.

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
# Viewing the wide-screen picture formats (480i and 480p signals only)







#### To select the color temperature:

1. Press MENU, then press ◀ or ► to display the PICTURE menu. 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight COLOR TEMPERATURE.



3. Press ◀ or ► to highlight the mode you prefer.

4. Press EXIT to return to normal viewing.

## Using the CableClear<sup>®</sup> feature

CableClear® reduces visible interference in your TV picture. This is useful when receiving a broadcast with a weak signal (especially a Cable channel) or playing a video cassette or disc damaged by repeated use.

To turn on the CableClear® feature:

1. Press MENU, then press ◀ or ► to display the PICTURE menu. 2. Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  to highlight CableClear.



3. Press ◀ or ► to select ON.

To turn off the CableClear® feature:

Select OFF in step 3.


## Selecting the Scan Velocity Modulation (SVM)

The SVM feature enhances picture contrast and sharpness. This feature has three modes: HIGH, LOW, and OFF.

## To select the SVM feature:

1. Press MENU, then press ◀ or ► to display the PICTURE menu.

2. Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  to highlight SVM.



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

#### To reset your picture adjustments:

- 1. Press MENU, then press ◀ or ► to display the PICTURE menu.

## Setting the sleep timer

You can use the sleep timer to automatically turn off the TV at a set time.

#### To set the sleep timer:

Repeatedly press SLEEP on the remote control to set the length of time until the TV turns off. The clock will increase 10 minutes for each press of the SLEEP button (0h00m, 0h10m, ...1h50m, 2h00m.) After the sleep timer is programmed, the display will appear briefly every ten minutes to remind you that the sleep timer is operating.

#### To confirm the sleep timer setting:

Press SLEEP one time. The remaining time will be momentarily displayed.

To cancel the sleep timer:

Repeatedly press SLEEP until the display turns to 0h00m.

## Using the closed caption feature

The Closed Caption feature has two options:

- Captions—An on-screen display of the dialogue, narration, and sound effects of programs and videos that are closed-captioned (usually identified in your local TV listings as "CC").
- Text—An on-screen display of information not related to the program, such as weather or stock data (if available in your viewing area).

#### To view captions or text:

- 1. Tune the TV to the desired program.
- 2. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ► to display the SETUP menu.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight CLOSED CAPTION.



4. Press ◄ or ► to select the desired Closed Caption mode, as follows:
To view captions, select C1 or C2 (C1 displays translation of the primary language in your area.) Note: If the program or video you selected is not closed-

- captioned, no captions will display on-screen.
- To view text, select T1 or T2. Note: If text is not available in your viewing area, a black rectangle may appear on-screen.
   If this happens, set the Closed Caption feature to OFF.
- To turn the Closed Caption feature off, highlight OFF in the Closed Caption menu.

## Muting the sound

Press MUTE to temporarily turn off the sound. While the sound is off, the screen will display the word MUTE in the lower right-hand corner. To restore the sound, press MUTE again.

## Selecting stereo/SAP broadcasts

The multi-channel TV sound (MTS) feature provides high-fidelity stereo sound. MTS also can transmit a second audio program (SAP) containing a second language or other audio information (when available). *Note:* The MTS feature is not available in VIDEO mode.

When the TV receives a stereo or SAP broadcast, the word "STEREO" or "SAP" displays on-screen every time you turn on the TV, change the channel, or press RECALL.

#### To listen to stereo sound:

- 1. Press MENU, then press deltor or ► to display the AUDIO menu.
- 2. Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  to highlight MTS.
- 3. Press  $\triangleleft$  or  $\triangleright$  to highlight STR (stereo).
  - Note:
    In general, you can leave your TV in stereo mode because the TV automatically outputs the type of sound being broadcast (stereo or mono.)
  - If the stereo sound is noisy, select MONO to reduce the noise.



- 2. Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\triangledown$  to highlight the item you want to adjust.





- makes the sound quality stronger or increases the balance in the right channel, depending on the item selected.

## Note:

A second audio program (SAP) can be heard only on those TV stations that offer it.

For example, a station might broadcast music as a second audio program. If you have SAP on, you will see the current program on the screen but hear music instead of the program's normal audio.

However, if you have SAP on, and the station you are watching is not currently broadcasting a second audio program, the station's normal audio will be output; however, occasionally there is no sound at all in SAP mode. If this happens, set the MTS feature to STEREO mode.



Adjusting the sound quality (bass, treble, and balance) does not affect the sound that is output from the variable audio OUT jacks.






## Using the StableSound<sup>®</sup> feature

The StableSound feature limits the highest volume level to prevent extreme changes in volume when the signal source is changed.

#### To turn on the StableSound® feature:

- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight STABLE SOUND.
- 3. Press ◀ or ► to highlight ON.

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## Auto power off

The TV will automatically turn off after approximately 15 minutes if it is tuned to a vacant channel or a station that completes its broadcast for the day and stops broadcasting on that channel. This feature does not work in VIDEO mode.

## **Understanding the Power Return feature**

If the power is cut off while you are viewing the TV and the power is resupplied, the Power Return feature will turn the TV on automatically.

If the power is going to be off for a long time or you are going to be away from the TV for a long time, unplug the power cord from the wall outlet to prevent the TV from turning on in your absence.

Poor reception of broadcast channels	<ul> <li>The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel.</li> <li>Check the antenna connections.</li> <li>If you are using a video input, make sure the TV/VIDEO button is set correctly.</li> </ul>
Cannot receive above channel 13	Make sure the TV/CABLE feature in the SETUP menu is set to "CABLE."
Unable to select a certain channel	The channel may be blocked by the V-Chip feature or CH LOCK feature, or erased with the add/erase feature.
Cannot access signal input sources (Video1, Video2, Video3, ColorStream HD1, Color- Stream HD2, and HDMI) and/or Channels 3 and 4	Check the VIDEO LOCK feature.
Multiple images	<ul><li>The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel.</li><li>Use a highly directional outdoor antenna.</li></ul>
Poor color or no color	<ul> <li>The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel.</li> <li>Adjust the TINT and/or COLOR in the PICTURE menu.</li> <li>If you change the direction of the TV while it is turned on, the picture could suffer from color shading. If so, turn off the TV and allow it to cool for several hours before turning it on again.</li> </ul>

No stereo or SAP sound from a known MTS broadcast	Make sure the MTS feature (in the AUDIO menu) is set properly.

The front panel buttons do not operate	Check the FRONT PANEL LOCK feature.
