General

General

Battery care and maintenance

Your Toshiba phone is powered by a rechargeable Lithium ion (Li-ion) battery.

The full performance of a new battery is achieved only after two or three complete charge and discharge cycles.

The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but it will eventually wear out. When the talk and standby times are noticeably shorter than normal, it is recommended that you buy a new battery.

- A new battery, or one that has not been used for a long time, could have reduced capacity during initial use.
- Do not leave the battery connected to the charger and power source for longer than necessary. This will result in repeated short charging, which will reduce battery performance and lifespan. Please disconnect the AC charger when the battery is full.
- Do not leave the battery in areas of extreme cold or heat. This could affect the performance of the battery.
- The battery has optimum performance in an ambient temperature of between +5 °C (+41 °F) and +35 °C (+95 °F).

- Only remove the battery with the phone switched off.
- Do not leave the battery empty or disconnected for a long time, as this may cause data to be reset.
- If you are not going to use your phone for a long time, fully charge the battery, then switch off the phone. The phone should be stored in a dry place away from direct sunlight. Recharge the phone approximately every six months.
- Avoid repeated short charging. It is preferable to let the battery go flat and then recharge it completely.

Restarting your Toshiba phone

If you have any problems, such as the phone freezing, restart the phone.

To restart your Toshiba phone:

- 1. Press and hold the Power key.
- 2. Tap Yes to confirm powering off the phone.
- 3. Wait a few seconds, the press and hold the **Power key** to switch on the phone.



IMPORTANT: If you restart your Toshiba phone, data that you have not saved will be lost.

If, after you have restarted your Toshiba phone, there is still a problem:

- Remove the battery (refer to Getting started for instructions).
- Re-insert the battery, then switch on the phone (refer to **Getting started** for instructions).

Resetting your Toshiba phone

If you still have problems after restarting your phone, you can reset the phone.

Resetting your Toshiba phone causes it to restart and adjusts memory allocation. Your phone will return to the same status as the last time you used it, though unsaved data may be lost.

To reset your Toshiba phone:

Using the stylus, press and hold the **Reset button**. The phone will switch on after resetting.



IMPORTANT: If you reset your Toshiba phone, data that you have not saved may be lost.

Reinitialising your Toshiba phone


Reinitialising your Toshiba phone resets all settings to their factory defaults, and deletes all of your data. You should only use this procedure as a last resort. We recommend that you back up all of your data before resetting your Toshiba phone.


If you are experiencing a problem with an application, it is most likely a result of a conflict between installed programs. We recommend uninstalling the most recently added program first. Also verify that the program is designed to be run on your Toshiba phone by comparing the requirements to the information provided with your phone. To view this information:


- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap the System tab.
- 3. Tap About.

To reinitialise your Toshiba phone:

- 1. With your Toshiba phone switched off, press and hold both **Volume keys**.
- While keeping the the Volume keys pressed, press the Power key for approximately three seconds.
- 3. Wait for the touch panel to load.
- Press Y to reinitialise your Toshiba phone, or N to cancel. Your phone will restart.







Installing the SIM card and battery




WARNING: There is a danger of explosion if the battery is incorrectly replaced. To reduce risk of fire or burns, do not disassemble, crush, puncture, short external contacts. expose to temperature above 60°C (140°F), or dispose of battery in fire or water. Replace only with specified batteries according to the local regulations.

- IMPORTANT: The SIM card is easily damaged by scratching and bending, so take care when handling it.
- **IMPORTANT:** Keep SIM card away from static, dust and water.
- IMPORTANT: Power off the phone and disconnect the charger before inserting or removing the SIM card.


To install the SIM card and battery:


1. With the back of the phone facing up, press down on the back cover. Slide the cover as shown in the diagram below, and remove it from the phone.




- If the battery is already installed, lift the tab at the base of the battery. Remove the battery from its compartment.
- With the gold connectors facing downwards, align the SIM card the correct way, as shown in the diagram below. Push down lightly while sliding the SIM card into place.

4. Insert the battery into the battery compartment with the gold connectors facing towards the bottom of the phone. The battery is shaped so that it can only be inserted this way. Gently push on the bottom of the battery (non-connector end) to insert it completely.





5. Gently slide the back cover upward into place.



Installing a microSD card

A microSD card is a removable storage card that can be used to increase the memory of the phone.



IMPORTANT: Do not remove the microSD card while the phone is reading data from, or writing data to, the card.

To install a microSD card:

 With the gold connectors facing upwards, align the microSD card the correct way, as shown in the diagram below.



Gently slide the microSD card into the slot until it clicks into place.

To remove the microSD, gently press it inwards. It will automatically eject.

Removing and reinserting the stylus

- Remove the stylus by pushing it upwards along the side of the phone (from above the Record key) sliding it towards the top of the phone, as shown in the diagram below.
- To reinsert the stylus, slide it downwards along the side of the phone until it clicks into place.



Using the stylus

The stylus is used for menu selection and data input on the touch screen of your Toshiba phone.

- Tap: Touch the screen once with the stylus to open items and select options.
- Drag: Hold the stylus on the screen and drag it to select text and images. Drag in a list to select multiple items.
- Tap and hold: Tap and hold the stylus on an item to see a list of actions available for that item. On the pop-up menu that is displayed, tap the required action.



WARNINGS:

- For touch screen input, use only the included stylus or your finger. Use of other objects can damage the touch screen and will void the warranty.
- If the tip of the stylus is damaged, do not use it. If you use the touch screen with a damaged stylus, the touch screen may be damaged. When the stylus is damaged, please purchase a new one.
- Do not tap hard on the touch screen, as this may cause permanent damage to the screen.

Charging the battery

You will need to fully charge the battery before you can switch your Toshiba phone on for the first time. You can charge your battery in the following two ways:

- Either plug the AC charger into an AC outlet and connect it to the charger connector on your Toshiba phone. When the battery is fully charged, unplug the AC charger from the AC outlet and disconnect it from the phone charger connector by gripping it tightly and pulling gently, or
- · connect your Toshiba phone to a PC with the USB cable.



IMPORTANT: Do not remove the battery while it is charging.

Fully charging the battery may take up to four hours when using the AC charger, or up to eight hours when using the USB cable.

The battery will only achieve optimum performance after two or three complete charges.

When charging is complete, disconnect the AC charger from the power source, or the USB cable from the PC, then disconnect your Toshiba phone.

Low battery

When the battery charge level drops to 20% of its total capacity, an alert message and the low battery icon are displayed.

If the battery charge level runs too low for normal operation, your Toshiba phone will automatically switch off.

Battery information

Battery performance depends on many factors, such as your service provider's network configuration, signal strength, the temperature of the environment in which you operate your Toshiba phone, the features and/or settings you select and use, items attached to your phone's connecting ports, and your voice, data, and other program usage patterns.



NOTE: It is recommended that you save the data in your phone memory to a PC or storage card. The manufacturer is not responsible for data lost or altered due to battery discharge.



TIP: For information on optimising the power performance of your Toshiba phone, refer to Backlight settings and Power settings in Settings.

Managing a low battery

When the low battery alert is displayed, you should do the following:

- 1. Save your current data.
- 2. Charge the battery as soon as possible.
- 3. If you are unable to charge the battery immediately, we recommend that you switch off your phone.

Switching the power on and off

To switch your Toshiba phone on:

- 1. Press and hold the Power key.
- 2. If a PIN or security code is requested, enter the code.



WARNING: The PIN code activates the services in your Toshiba phone and should be provided in the documentation supplied by vour service provider.

If you enter the incorrect PIN for your SIM card three consecutive times, you will need to contact your service provider to obtain the Personal Unblocking Key (PUK). Do not attempt to guess the PUK as your SIM card will be rendered permanently inoperative following ten consecutive unsuccessful attempts.

To switch your Toshiba phone off:

- 1. Press and hold the Power key.
- 2. Tap **Yes** to confirm powering off the phone.

Keypad lock

This feature prevents accidental calls and operations.



NOTE: Emergency calls can be placed at any time, without requiring deactivation of any security feature first.

Locking the keypad

To lock the keypad, on the **Today** screen, tap **Device unlocked**.

Unlocking the keypad

To unlock the keypad, tap the **Unlock** softkey, then tap **Unlock** on the screen.

Auto Configurator

The **Auto Configurator** application provides a quick and easy way to configure service provider settings, including GPRS, WAP, and MMS.

To use Auto Configurator:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start > Programs**.
- 2. Tap AutoConfig.
- 3. Select your country in the Country field.
- Select your service provider in the Operator field.
- 5. Tap **ok**.
- Tap Yes. The configuration is carried out. This may take a few seconds.

TOSHIBA User Interface

Overview

The **TOSHIBA User Interface** provides a customisable user interface and behaviour, while keeping all the advantages of a Windows Mobile device.

The **TOSHIBA User Interface** enables you to access information, run applications, make calls and navigate your Toshiba phone in a simple and flexible manner, even using one hand.

You can customise items such as the **Now Screen**, **Today** plug-in, softkeys, tabs and weather updates.

For details of customising the **TOSHIBA User Interface**, refer to **Spb Mobile Shell for Toshiba** in **Settings**.

The **TOSHIBA User Interface** consists of three main screens:

- Home screen
- Now Screen
- · Quick Dial screen


All of these screens are designed for one-handed stylus-free navigation, and animated transitions are supported.

You can use a left or right gesture, or tap the appropriate icons, to switch between these screens. You can also use a left gesture to return to the previous menu level.

Slide your finger in a downwards gesture or tap the exit icon to return to the **Today** screen or last active application.

Home screen

The **Home** screen adds a fast and convenient way to navigate through your Toshiba phone. It has been designed for one-handed navigation and stylus-free use.



- 1. Smart launcher.
- 2. Menu style icons.
- 3. To access the Now Screen.
- 4. To access the Quick Dial screen.
- To exit the TOSHIBA User Interface.

The **Home** screen consists of two parts - a smart launcher in the top part of the screen, and six menu style items below.

The smart launcher uses an algorithm to display shortcuts for frequently used items. You can tap and hold on any of the smart launcher items to customise the shortcuts.

The six menu style icons enable you to quickly and easily access items available via the standard Windows Mobile user interface, along with some extras such as **Phone Profiles**.

Now Screen

The **Now Screen** displays all of your important information in one place.




- Weather, messaging, call and phone volume information.
- 2. Time, date and calendar information.
- 3. To access the **Home** screen.
- 4. To access the Quick Dial screen.
- 5. To exit the TOSHIBA User Interface.

Quick Dial screen

The Quick Dial screen displays up to sixteen photo contacts of your choice for quick access.

You can also keep a shortcut to all your **Toshiba Contacts** here.



- 1. Contacts for quick access.
- 2. To access the Now Screen.
- 3. To access the Home screen.
- To exit the TOSHIBA User Interface.

You can add your favourite contacts from those stored in **Contacts** on your Toshiba phone. You can also add a shortcut to **Recent Calls**.

Tap and hold on an entry to view the available options.

To make a call from the Quick Dial screen:

- 1. Tap the required Quick Dial entry.
- 2. Tap the phone number to call.

Today plug-in

The TOSHIBA User Interface also contains a Today plug-in that enables you to add TOSHIBA User Interface items to the Today screen. For information on setting up the Today plug-in, refer to Customising the TOSHIBA User Interface in Settings.

Making a call

Before making a call, ensure that your Toshiba phone is switched on, that there is a valid SIM card installed, and that the signal is sufficiently strong.

Making a call from the Phone screen

To make a call from the **Phone** screen:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, press the **Send key** or tap Start > Phone.
- 2. Enter a phone number using the numeric keypad.
- 3. Press the Send key or tap Talk.



TIP: When you tap a key on the numeric keypad, a list of names and/or numbers is displayed. This list shows matching names and numbers from Contacts, Call History, Speed Dial and the SIM card.

> For example, if you tap 2, names beginning with A, B or C and phone numbers beginning with 2 are displayed.

> You can enter more characters to reduce the number of matching entries.

To call an entry, tap it, then tap Call.

Making an emergency call

You can make calls to emergency service numbers under almost any circumstances, even if you have locked your Toshiba phone or if you have not enabled your SIM.

For further information, see Emergency calls in Health and safety.

Making a call from Contacts

To make a call from Contacts:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Contacts or Start > Contacts.
- 2. Scroll to the required contact, then press the Send key.



TIP: If you have a long list of contacts, enter the first few letters of the contact's name. The phone will display only the matching contact. To call the contact, press the **Send kev**.

Making a call to a non-default number

You can assign a work phone number (w), mobile phone number (m) and home phone number (h) to a contact that is saved to the phone.

The mobile phone number is dialled by default.

To make a call to a non-default number:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Contacts or Start > Contacts.
- 2. Tap the required contact.
- 3. Scroll to the required phone number, then press the **Send key** or **Action key**, or tap **Call**.

Making a call from Call History

Call History displays calls you have made, received, and missed recently.

To make a call from the Call History:

- From the Today screen, press the Send key or tap Start > Phone.
- 2. Tap Hide Keypad.
- 3. Tap Call History.
- Scroll to the required name or phone number, then press the Send key or tap Call.

Dialling the last number called

To dial the last number called:

From the **Today** screen, press the **Send key** twice.

Making an international call

To make an international call:

- From the Today screen, press the Send key or tap Start > Phone.
- Tap and hold 0 on the keypad until the + sign is displayed.
- Enter the full phone number, including the country code, area code (without the first 0) and phone number.
- 4. Press the Send key or tap Talk.

Speed Dial

Creating a speed dial

To create a speed dial:

- 1. From the Today screen, press the Send key or tap Start > Phone.
- 2. Tap Hide Keypad.
- 3. Tap Speed Dial.
- 4. Tap Menu > New.
- 5. Tap the required contact.
- 6. In the Location: field, select the speed dial number.
- 7. Tap **ok** twice.



NOTE: The digit 0 is reserved for inserting the + character when dialling an international phone number. The digit 1 is reserved for calling your voice mail mailbox as a speed dial.



TIP: You can also create a speed dial from Contacts. To do this:

- 1. From Contacts, tap the required contact.
- 2. Scroll to the required phone number, then tap Menu > Add to Speed Dial...
- 3. In the **Location:** field, select the speed dial number
- 4. Tap ok twice.

Setting up voice mail speed dial

The voice mail speed dial is normally preconfigured. If it is not preconfigured, you can save your voice mail number to the phone manually.

To set up voice mail speed dial manually:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Settings.
- 2. On the **Personal** tab, tap **Phone**.
- 3. Tap the **Services** tab.
- 4. Tap Voice Mail and Text Messages, then tap Get Settings...
- 5. Enter your voice mail number in the Voice Mail: field. This can be obtained from your service provider.
- 6. Tap ok twice.

Making a call using speed dial

To make a call using speed dial:

- 1. From the Today screen, press the Send key or tap Start > Phone.
- 2. Tap Hide Keypad.
- 3. Tap Speed Dial.
- 4. Scroll to the required speed dial, then press the Send key or tap Call.



TIP: You can also make a call using speed dial from the Phone screen. To do this:

> From the **Phone** screen, tap and hold the required speed dial number on the keypad. If the speed dial number has two digits, tap the first digit, then tap and hold the second digit.

Deleting a speed dial

To delete a speed dial:

- 1. From the Today screen, press the Send key or tap Start > Phone.
- 2. Tap Hide Keypad.
- 3. Tap Speed Dial.
- 4. Scroll to the required speed dial, then tap Menu > Delete.
- 5. Tap Yes to confirm the deletion.
- 6. Tap **ok**.

Receiving a call

Answering or ignoring a call

- To answer an incoming call, press the Send key or tap Answer.
- To ignore an incoming call, press the **End key** or tap **Ignore**.



NOTE: If you choose to ignore a call, the caller will be connected to your voice mail, provided you are subscribed to this service.



TIP: When you have the headset connected to your Toshiba phone, you can do the following:

- · Answer an incoming call by pressing the headset button.
- Ignore an incoming call by pressing and holding the headset button.

Ending a call

To end a call, press the End key or tap End.



TIP: When you have the headset connected to your Toshiba phone, you can end a call by pressing and holding the headset button.

In-call options

Adjusting the volume

To adjust the volume while in a call:

Press the upper volume key to increase the volume, and the lower volume key to decrease the volume.

Putting a call on hold

To put a call on hold, tap **Hold** or **Menu** > **Hold**. To unhold the call, tap **Unhold** or **Menu** > **Unhold**.



TIP: When you have the headset connected to your Toshiba phone, you can place a call on hold by pressing the headset button. To unhold the call, press the button again.

Muting a call

To mute a call, tap **Mute** or **Menu** > **Mute**. To unmute the call, tap Unmute or Menu > Unmute.

Putting a call on speakerphone

To put a call on speakerphone, press and hold the Send key or tap Menu > Turn Speakerphone On. To switch the speakerphone off, press and hold the Send key or tap Menu > Turn Speakerphone Off.



NOTE: The speakerphone is automatically switched off at the end of a call.

Putting a call on hands-free

To put a call on hands-free:

When hands-free equipment is attached to your Toshiba phone, the item Menu > Turn Hands-free On will be enabled.

Making a second call

To make a second call while already in a call:

- 1. Tap **Hold** or **Menu** > **Hold** to put the first call on hold.
- 2. Dial the second number, then press the **Send** key. The first call will remain on hold.

Answering or ignoring a second call

- To answer a second call, press the Send key or tap Answer. The original call will be put on hold.
- To ignore a second call, press the **End key** or tap Ignore.



NOTE: To interact with a second call, you need to have Call Waiting enabled. For information on enabling Call Waiting, see Call Waiting in Settings.

Swapping between calls

To swap between calls, press the **Send key**, or tap **Swap** or **Menu** > **Swap**.

Creating a conference call

To create a conference call:

With two calls active on your Toshiba phone, one active and the other on hold, tap **Menu** > **Conference**. The calls will be joined together, and each party will be able to hear the other.



NOTE: The conference call feature is dependent on your service provider supporting it.

Adding a party to a conference call

To add another party to a conference call:

- Tap Hold or Menu > Hold to put the conference call on hold.
- 2. Dial the number for the new party, then press the **Send key**.
- When the new party has answered, tap Menu > Conference.

Having a private conversation with a conference call party

To have a private conversation with a conference call party, you need to split the conference call. To have a private conversation from a conference call:

- 1. Tap Menu > Private.
- 2. Scroll to the party with whom you wish to have the private conversation, then tap **Private**.

Creating a note

You can create a note from the **Phone** screen during or after a call. The note will be saved as an attachment to the call in the **Call History**.

To create a note:

- 1. While in a call, tap Note.
- 2. Add the required information to the note.
- 3. Tap ok when you have finished.

For more information about **Notes**, see **Notes** in **Applications and multimedia**.

Video telephony

Video calls allow you to enjoy live 'face-to-face' conversations with friends, family and colleagues.



NOTE: Before making a video call, you will need to confirm that the person you are calling has a phone enabled for video telephony.

Making a video call from the Phone screen

To make a video call from the **Phone** screen:

- From the Today screen, press the Send key or tap Start > Phone.
- Enter a phone number using the numeric keypad.
- 3. Tap the video call icon.

Making a video call from Contacts

To make a video call from Contacts:

- From the Today screen, tap Contacts or Start > Contacts.
- Tap and hold the required contact until the popup menu is displayed.
- 3. Tap Video Call.

Making a video call from Call History

To make a video call from the **Call History**:

- From the Today screen, press the Send key or tap Start > Phone.
- 2. Tap Hide Keypad.
- 3. Tap Call History.
- 4. Tap and hold the required entry until the pop-up menu is displayed.
- 5. Tap Video Call.

Answering or ignoring a video call

- To answer an incoming video call, press the Send key or tap Answer.
- To ignore an incoming video call, press the End key or tap Ignore.

Blocking video sending

To block sending of video during a video call: While in a video call, tap **Options** > **Block Video**. The other party will see a blank image.

Tap **Options** > **Unblock Video** to start sending video again.

Sharing images and videos

To share an image or video during a video call:

- 1. Tap Options > Share Image/Share Video.
- 2. Tap the required image or video.

Tap **Options** > **Stop Sharing** to stop sending the image.

Recording video

To record the video received or sent during a video call, tap **Options** > **Recording** > **Record Incoming Video**/**Record Outgoing Video**.

Tap **Options** > **Recording** > **Stop Recording** to stop recording the video.

Call History

Call History displays a list of calls that you have missed, received and dialled recently.

Viewing Call History

To view the Call History:

- From the Today screen, press the Send key or tap Start > Phone.
- Tap Hide Keypad.
- 3. Tap Call History.
- If required, you can filter the list by tapping Menu > Filter > Missed/Outgoing/Incoming.
- 5. To view the details of a call, tap the required call.

Creating a contact from Call History

For details of how to create a contact from Call History, see Creating a new contact in Applications and multimedia.

Deleting a call from Call History

To delete a call from the Call History:


- From the Today screen, press the Send key or tap Start > Phone.
- 2. Tap Hide Keypad.

- 3. Tap Call History.
- 4. Scroll to the required entry in the list, then tap **Menu** > **Delete**.
- 5. Tap Yes to confirm the deletion.

Deleting all calls from Call History

To delete all calls from the Call History:

- From the Today screen, press the Send key or tap Start > Phone.
- 2. Tap Hide Keypad.
- 3. Tap Call History.
- 4. Tap Menu > Delete All Calls.
- 5. Tap Yes to confirm the deletion.



Resetting Call Timers).

Viewing Call Timers

To view Call Timers:

- From the Today screen, press the Send key or tap Start > Phone.
- 2. Tap Hide Keypad.
- 3. Tap Call History.
- 4. Tap Menu > Call Timers...



NOTE: The length of waiting calls is not recorded.

Resetting Call Timers

To reset Call Timers:

- From the Today screen, press the Send key or tap Start > Phone.
- 2. Tap Hide Keypad.
- 3. Tap Call History.
- 4. Tap Menu > Call Timers...
- Tap Reset.

This chapter describes how you can create, send, receive, organise, delete and store the following message types on your Toshiba phone:

- Text messages (SMS, Short Message Service)
- Multimedia messages (MMS)
- F-mail

You can also use **Windows Live** for instant messaging with **Windows Live Messenger** and to access **Hotmail**.

Text messages

Text messaging, or the Short Message Service (SMS), enables you to exchange text messages with other phones. For details on text messages, contact your service provider.

For information on setting up your text message service centre, refer to Viewing and editing text messages service centre in Settings.

Your Toshiba phone supports the sending of more than the standard 160-character limit. If you enter more than 160 characters, the message is split into linked text messages. These linked messages will be sent at the same time.

Creating and sending a text message (SMS)

To create and send a text message:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Messaging.
- 2. Tap Text Messages.
- 3. Tap Menu > New > SMS.
- With the cursor in the To: field, add recipient(s) using one or more of the following methods:
- Press the Action key, then tap a recipient from the list of contacts.

- Tap Menu > Add Recipient..., then tap a recipient from the list of contacts.
- . Enter the first few letters of a name stored in Contacts, then tap Menu > Check Names, If several matches are displayed, select the required one.
- Enter mobile phone number(s) in the **To:** field. Use a semicolon to separate multiple recipients.
- 5. Scroll to the message area and enter your message.



TIP: To save time by inserting predefined l text:

- 1. Tap Menu > Mv Text.
- 2. Select the text to insert.

You can also edit existing My Text items as required.



TIP: To check spelling before sending the message, tap Menu > Spell Check.

6. Tap Send.



TIP: To delete the message without sending it, tap Menu > Cancel Message.

Saving a message as a draft

To save a message as a draft:

From the message creation screen, tap Menu > Save to Drafts.

Requesting delivery notification

To request a delivery notification:

- From the message creation screen, tap Menu > Message Options....
- 2. Press the **Action key** to tick the **Request** message delivery notification checkbox.
- 3. Tap **ok**.

Receiving text messages

Text messages are automatically received when your Toshiba phone is switched on. When your phone is off, messages are held by your service provider until the next time your phone is connected to the network.

Your Toshiba phone will alert you when a new text message arrives.

Replying to a message

To reply to a message:

- From an open message, tap Reply. If you are replying to multiple recipients, tap Menu > Reply > Reply All.
- 2. Enter your message.
- 3. Tap Send.

Forwarding a message

To forward a message:

- From an open message, tap Menu > Reply > Forward.
- Add recipient(s). For details of how to add a recipient, refer to Creating and sending a text message (SMS).
- 3. If required, edit the message in the message area.
- 4. Tap Send.

Deleting messages

To delete a message:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Messaging.
- 2. Tap Text Messages.
- 3. Scroll to the message to delete, then tap **Delete**.

MMS messages

The Multimedia Messaging Service (MMS) enables you to exchange multimedia messages containing data such as text, pictures, sounds, animation and video clips. You can send MMS messages to other mobile phones or to e-mail addresses. For details of MMS, and to enable your account for this service, contact your service provider.


Configuring MMS settings

If your Toshiba phone has not been preconfigured, you will need to manually enter the details of the MMS account. These details are available from your service provider.

To configure MMS settings:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Messaging.
- 2. Tap **Text Messages**.
- 3. Tap Menu > MMS Options...
- 4. Tap the **Servers** tab.
- 5. Tap New.
- 6. Enter the following MMSC details:
- **Server name:** enter a descriptive name, such as the name of your service provider.

- Gateway: enter the WAP gateway to be used for this connection.
- Port number: enter the HTTP port number for connecting to the MMS server and for file transfer.
- Server address: enter the URL address of the MMS server.
- Connect via: select the connection point for the MMS server. This is typically The Internet.
- Send limit: select the maximum MMS message size permitted by your service provider.
- 7. Tap **Done**.



Creating an MMS message

An MMS message can consist of many pages, also known as 'slides'. Each slide can hold an image, a sound and text, but you do not need to set all of these for each message. The maximum amount of content that can be sent in a message is set by your service provider.

To create an MMS message:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Messaging.
- 2. Tap Text Messages.
- 3. Tap Menu > New > MMS.
- With the cursor in the To: field, add recipient(s) using one or more of the following methods:
- Press the Action key, then tap a recipient from the list of contacts.
- Tap Menu > Add Recipient > From Contacts.../From Call History..., then tap a recipient.
- Enter mobile phone number(s) in the To: field.
 Use a semicolon to separate multiple recipients.
- 5. Enter a subject for the message in the **Subject**: field if required.
- 6. Enter a message.
- 7. Tap **Send** when the message is ready.
- TIP: To preview the message before sending, tap the Play icon.
- TIP: To delete the message without sending it, tap Menu > Cancel Message.


Inserting a picture or video


To insert a picture or video in the message:

- 1. Scroll to the **Insert picture/video** area, then press the Action key. A preview of all pictures and videos in the current folder is displayed.
- 2. Either select one of the previewed pictures

launch the **Camera** application and capture a new picture or video.

Once you have selected a picture or video, the message creation screen is displayed again.





Inserting text

To insert text in the message:

- 1. Scroll to the **Insert text here** area, then press the Action key.
- 2. Enter text. To insert predefined text, tap Menu > Insert My Text...
- 3. Tap **Done** when you have finished inserting text.



TIP: You can also insert text from the message creation screen by tapping Menu > Insert > Text...

Inserting audio

To insert audio in the message:

- 1. Scroll to the **Insert audio** area, then press the Action key. A list of all audio files in the current folder is displayed.
- Select one of the audio files.



TIP: You can also insert audio from the message creation screen by tapping Menu > Insert > Audio...

Using and creating templates

To use or create a template:

From the message creation screen, tap **Menu** > Template. Tap Select a Template... to select a template to use for a new MMS message, or Save as Template to save the current MMS message as a template for future use.

Selecting a message background colour

To select a background colour for the message:

- From the message creation screen, tap Menu > Options > Background. A list of colours is displayed.
- 2. Tap the required colour.

Additional MMS message options

You can add recipient(s) in copy (Cc:) or blind copy (Bcc:) to your message.



TIP: Scroll up to view the Cc: and Bcc: fields.

You can also set the priority of the message, a delivery time delay for the sending of the message, an expiry time for the message, and request delivery and read reports.

To set these options, from the message creation screen, tap **Menu** > **Options** > **Send Options...**, then set the options as required.

Receiving MMS messages

Your Toshiba phone will alert you when a new MMS message arrives. Depending on your settings, the message contents may download a few moments later, when the message will be ready to view in your **Inbox**.

E-mail


Before you can send or receive e-mails, you need to set up an e-mail account. Your Toshiba phone supports the following types of e-mail accounts:

- Internet e-mail (POP3/IMAP).
- Exchange server (Outlook).

Setting up an e-mail account automatically

To set up an e-mail account automatically:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Messaging.
- 2. Tap Setup E-mail.
- 3. In the E-mail address: field, enter the e-mail address for this account.
- 4. Enter a password in the Password: field.



5. Tick the Save password checkbox if you wish to save your password to your Toshiba phone. This will mean that you do not need to enter it each time you connect to your e-mail server.

This may or may not be required by your internet service provider (ISP).



WARNING: If you save your password and then lose your Toshiba phone, you run the risk of someone else being able to access vour e-mail account.

- 6. Tap Next.
- 7. Tick the Try to get email settings automatically from the Internet checkbox.
- 8. Tap Next.

If the account has set up successfully, you are prompted to send and receive e-mail.

If the account has not set up successfully, you will need to set up the account manually, as described in the following section.


Setting up an e-mail account manually

If you need to manually enter the details of an e-mail account, you may need to obtain some of these details from your ISP.

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Messaging.
- 2. Tap Setup E-mail.

characters.

- 3. In the E-mail address: field, enter the e-mail address for this account.
- 4. Enter a password in the **Password:** field.



5. Tick the Save password checkbox if you wish to save your password to your Toshiba phone. This will mean that you do not need to enter it each time you connect to your e-mail server. This may or may not be required by your internet service provider (ISP).



WARNING: If you save your password and then lose your Toshiba phone, you run the risk of someone else being able to access vour e-mail account.

- 6. Tap Next.
- 7. Select the required option in the Your e-mail provider: field, then tap Next.
- 8. Enter the name that you want displayed when you send e-mail in the Your name: field.
- 9. Enter a unique name for this account in the Account display name: field, then tap Next. This name cannot be changed later.

- 10. Enter the name of the incoming server in the Incoming mail server: field.
- 11. Select the server type that hosts your e-mail mailbox in the Account type: list (POP3 or IMAP4), then tap Next.
- 12. Enter the user name assigned to you by your ISP or network administrator in the User name: field. This is usually the first part of your e-mail address, before the '@' sign.
- 13. Enter a password in the **Password:** field.
- 14. Tick the Save password checkbox if you wish to save your password to your Toshiba phone.
- 15. Tap Next.
- 16.Enter the name of the outgoing server in the Outgoing (SMTP) mail server: field.
- 17. Tick the Outgoing server requires authentication checkbox if the outgoing server requires authentication. This authentication will use the user name and password that you have already entered.
- 18. Tick the Use the same user name and password for sending e-mail checkbox if required.
- 19. Tap the Advanced Server Settings link to set the following additional settings if required.

Tick the checkboxes if you wish to enable SSL connection.



IMPORTANT: SSL connection enables you to send and/or receive personal information more securely. If you select one or both of these options and your ISP does not support SSL connection, you will not be able to send and/or receive e-mail.

The **Network connection:** field enables you to select the network to which your e-mail server connects.

Tap **Done** when you have finished.

20. Tap Next.

- 21.Select the frequency with which to send and receive your e-mail in the **Automatic Send/ Receive:** field.
- 22. Tap the **Review all download settings** link to set the following additional settings if required: The **Download messages**: field enables you to set the time range for downloading messages from the server.

Tap **Advanced Settings** to edit additional settings for sending, receiving and deleting e-mails if required.

Tap **Done**, then **Next** when you have finished.

- 23.Select the format for sending messages (HTML or Plain Text) in the Message format: field.
- 24. Select the download size limitation in the **Message download limit:** field.
- 25. Tap Finish.

Creating an e-mail

To create an e-mail:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Messaging.
- 2. Tap the e-mail account to use.
- 3. Tap Menu > New.
- With the cursor in the To: field, add recipient(s) using one or more of the following methods:
- Press the Action key, then tap a recipient from the list of contacts.
- Tap Menu > Add Recipient..., then tap a recipient from the list of contacts.
- Enter the first few letters of a name stored in Contacts, then tap Menu > Check Names. If several matches are displayed, select the required one.
- Enter e-mail address(es) in the To: field. Use a semicolon to separate multiple recipients.

5. Add recipients in the Cc: and/or Bcc: fields if required.



TIP: Scroll up to view the Cc: and Bcc: fields.

- 6. Enter a subject for the e-mail in the Subject: field if required.
- 7. Scroll to the message area and enter your message.



TIP: To save time by inserting predefined text:

- 1. Tap Menu > My Text.
- 2. Select the text to insert.

You can also edit existing My Text items as required.



TIP: To check spelling before sending the message, tap Menu > Spell Check.



TIP: To set the priority of the e-mail:

- 1. Tap Menu > Message Options...
 - 2. Select the required option in the Priority: field.
- 8. Tap **Send** when the message is ready. E-mails are stored in your Outbox and are sent to recipients the next time you synchronise or connect to your e-mail server.



TIP: To delete the message without sending it, tap Menu > Cancel Message.

Adding an attachment to an e-mail

To add an attachment to an e-mail:

- 1. Tap Menu > Insert > Picture/Voice Note/File.
- Select the item to add.

Digitally signing an e-mail

Digitally signing an e-mail applies your certificate with the public key to the e-mail. This provides the recipient with proof that the e-mail is from you and not an imposter, and that it has not been altered.

To digitally sign an e-mail:

- 1. Tap Menu > Message Options...
- 2. In the Security: field, select the required security function.



NOTE: S/MIME encryption and digital signatures for Windows Mobile-based devices are available only with Exchange Server 2003 Service Pack 2 or a later version. that supports S/MIME. If you are not using one of these products, or have not yet synchronised, these options will not be available.

Sending and receiving e-mail

To send and receive e-mail:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Messaging.
- 2. Tap the required e-mail account.
- 3. Tap Menu > Send/Receive. Your Toshiba phone connects to your Internet e-mail server and sends and receives your messages.



TIP: To stop this process, tap Menu > Stop Send/Receive.

Downloading a complete e-mail

To download a complete e-mail:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Messaging.
- 2. Tap the required e-mail account.
- 3. Scroll to the required e-mail, then tap Menu > Download Message. The complete message is retrieved the next time you synchronise or connect to your e-mail server to send/receive e-mail.

Downloading an e-mail attachment

To download an e-mail attachment:

From an open message with an attachment, select the attachment. The attachment is downloaded the next time you synchronise or connect to your e-mail server to send/receive e-mail.

Viewing an attachment

To view an attachment:

In an open message containing a downloaded attachment, select the attachment.

General messaging options

You can customise the options for your **Messaging** accounts, message options, addressing, and message storage.

To access the **Messaging** options:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Messaging.
- 2. Scroll to an account, then tap Menu > Options.
- 3. Customise the following options as required:
- Accounts tab Enables you to change the settings for each messaging account.
 For example, tap Text Messages to change the Request delivery notifications and Use Unicode when necessary settings as required.

Tap **New account...** to set up a new messaging account.

Tick the **Display account picker when opening Messaging** checkbox if you would like to select the messaging account each time you open **Messaging**.

- Message tab Enables you to change options for sending and deleting messages.
- Address tab Enables you to select whether to check Contacts as well as any online address books for e-mail addresses.

- You can also add online address books and select which ones to use for e-mail address checking.
- Storage tab Enables you to check the memory space of your phone, storage card and attachments. You can also select whether to store attachments on a storage card, and specify how deleted items are emptied.

Switching between messaging accounts

You can switch between **Text Messages**, **MMS** or any e-mail account.

To switch between messaging accounts:

- From any Messaging folder, tap Menu > Go To.
- 2. Tap the required account.

Switching between messaging folders

For each **Messaging** account, you can switch between the **Deleted Items**, **Drafts**, **Inbox**, **Outbox** and **Sent Items** folders.

To switch between messaging folders:

- From any Messaging folder, tap Menu > Go To > Folders...
- 2. Tap the folder that you want to view.

Inserting a signature

For each **Messaging** account, you can specify a signature to be automatically inserted into messages that you send.

To create a signature and insert it in messages:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Messaging.
- 2. Scroll to an account, then tap Menu > Options.
- 3. On the Accounts tab, tap Signatures...
- In the Select an account: field, select the account for which you are creating the signature.
- Tick the Use signature with this account checkbox.
- To insert a signature in every message you send, tick the Use when replying and forwarding checkbox. If this checkbox is not ticked, the signature is inserted in new messages only.
- 7. Enter the signature.
- 8. Tap ok twice.

Input methods

Your Toshiba phone enables you to enter information in three different ways:

- Typing Using the Input Panel.
- Writing Using the stylus, writing directly on the screen.
- Drawing Using the stylus, drawing directly on the screen.

The **Input Panel** provides various input methods, including **Block Recognizer**, **Keyboard**, **Letter Recognizer** and **Transcriber**.

The **Input Panel** icon is displayed on the command bar when text input is possible.

To open the **Input Panel**, tap the **Input Panel** icon. You can then tap the arrow beside the icon to select other input methods.

When you begin entering a word using any of the input methods except **Transcriber**, your Toshiba phone will suggest possible words. Tap on one of the suggested words to enter it.

Your Toshiba phone will learn words as you use them. They will then be used as suggested words in the future.

Block Recognizer

With **Block Recognizer**, you use a single stroke to write individual letters, numbers and punctuation, which are then converted into typed text.

To use **Block Recognizer**, tap the **Input Panel** selector arrow, then tap **Block Recognizer**.

The handwriting area is divided into two designated parts: **abc** and **123**.

Write characters, numbers, symbols and punctuation in the separate areas:

- Write in the abc area to enter lower case letters.
- Write in the 123 area to enter numbers.
- Tap the button in the bottom right corner labelled "@\$*" to open the table of symbols and punctuation.
- NOTE: Block Recognizer is available when text entry is possible.
 - TIP: For help with using Block Recognizer, tap? in the right corner to see a demo.

Keyboard

With the on-screen keyboard, you use the stylus to tap on the keyboard to enter characters.



TIP: Tap áü to enter miscellaneous letters and symbols.

To use Keyboard, tap the Input Panel selector arrow, then tap Keyboard.

To set the **Keyboard** options:

- 1. Tap the **Input Panel** selector arrow, then tap Options...
- 2. In the Input method: field, tap Keyboard.
- 3. Select the required options by:
 - · tapping Large keys or Small keys to select the size of the buttons on the keyboard.
 - ticking the Use gestures for the following keys: checkbox to enable gesture commands.

Letter Recognizer

With Letter Recognizer, you can write individual letters, numbers and punctuation, which are then converted into typed text.

To use Letter Recognizer, tap the Input Panel selector arrow, then tap Letter Recognizer.

The handwriting area is divided into three designated parts: ABC, abc and 123.

Write characters, numbers, symbols, and punctuation in the separate areas:

- Write in the ABC area to enter upper case letters.
- Write in the abc area to enter lower case letters.
- Write in the 123 area to enter numbers.
- Tap the button in the bottom right corner labelled '@\$*' to open the table of symbols and punctuation.



NOTE: Letter Recognizer is available when text entry is possible.




TIP: For help with using Letter Recognizer. tap? in the right corner to see a demo.

Input Options

To set the input options:

- Tap the Input Panel selector arrow, then tap Options...
- Tap the Word Completion tab to change the settings for suggested words and automatic correction.
- Tap the **Options** tab to change the general input settings, including zoom levels and capitalisation.
- 4. Tap **ok** when you have finished.



Transcriber

Transcriber is a handwriting recognition program that enables you to write in cursive, print, or a combination of both.

Transcriber enables you to write anywhere on the screen using the stylus, just as you would write on paper. Unlike **Block Recognizer** and **Letter Recognizer**, you can write entire sentences. When you pause, **Transcriber** will convert the written text to typed text.

Transcriber works transparently in the background, recognising words with its integrated dictionary. When **Transcriber** is active, it interprets stylus movement anywhere on the screen as handwriting input.

Starting Transcriber

Because Transcriber works transparently in the background of applications that accept text input, you need to have one of these programs open to use Transcriber.

To start Transcriber:

- 1. Start an application such as Word Mobile.
- 2. Tap the Input Panel selector arrow, then tap Transcriber. The Transcriber Intro screen will be displayed.



TIP: To stop the Transcriber Intro screen being displayed each time you use start Transcriber, tick the Don't show this checkbox, then tap ok.

Showing and hiding the Transcriber toolbar

The **Transcriber** toolbar provides easy access to several tools, as well as Enter, Space, and Backspace buttons, and left and right arrow buttons. It is displayed at the bottom of the screen when Transcriber is active.

To show or hide the Transcriber toolbar, tap the Transcriber icon at the bottom of the screen.

Transcriber toolbar functions

Toolbar icon	Description
:=	Displays the Transcriber: Options screen. From here, you can set options such as Writing Direction: , pen settings, Shorthand and Dictionaries .
L!	Displays the Letter Shapes screen. This screen enables you to set your personal writing styles to maximise recognition.
##	Displays the on-screen keyboard. This enables you to quickly enter numbers, punctuation, and other symbols.
а	Toggles between the following character recognition modes: a - default mode for optimum handwriting recognition. 123 - numbers and some letters are allowed. A - all letters are converted to upper case. From A and 123 modes, recognition returns automatically to the default (a) mode when you
	lift the stylus.
spc	Inserts a space at the cursor. Equivalent to the Space key on a keyboard.
4	Inserts a paragraph return at the cursor. Equivalent to the Enter key on a keyboard.
←	Moves the cursor one space to the left.
\rightarrow	Moves the cursor one space to the right.
•	Moves the cursor one space back and erases any text. Equivalent to the Backspace key on a keyboard.




Using the Transcriber keyboard

Transcriber comes with an on-screen keyboard that provides an easy way to add punctuation or a special symbol to existing text.

To access the Transcriber keyboard:

Tap the keyboard button on the **Transcriber** toolbar. The keyboard is displayed until you tap the keyboard button again.





Writing with Transcriber

To write with Transcriber:

- 1. Position the cursor where you want to enter text.
- Using the stylus, write on the screen. The handwriting will be converted to text after you lift the stylus from the screen.

Editing text with Transcriber

To edit text with Transcriber:

- Draw a line across the text you want to edit. After you lift the stylus from the screen, the line will disappear and the selected text will be highlighted.
- 2. Do one of the following:
 - · Rewrite the text.
 - Use gestures to capitalise letters, insert a space, etc.

Using gestures in Transcriber

To use gestures in Transcriber:

Use quick strokes of the stylus to edit your text. Do the Enter, Space, and Tab gestures while writing text to insert returns, spaces, or tabs.

Available gestures are described in the following table.

Name	Action	Description
Enter	•	Inserts a paragraph return at the cursor. The horizontal portion of this gesture must be at least two times longer than the vertical portion.
Space		Inserts a space at the cursor. The horizontal portion of this gesture must be at least two times longer than the vertical portion.

Words		Opens the menu of alternate words if a word is selected, or the on-screen Transcriber keyboard if no text is selected. Do this gesture by drawing a line straight down and back up.
Caps	†	Changes the capitalisation of a selected letter, word, or block of text. Do this gesture by drawing a line straight up.
Undo	$\uparrow \downarrow$	To undo the last action. Do this gesture by drawing a line straight up and back down.
Cut		Cuts the selected text. Do this gesture by drawing a line from right to left and back.

Optimising handwriting recognition for Transcriber

If **Transcriber** does not recognise your handwriting as accurately or quickly as you would like, there are some things you can do to optimise handwriting recognition.

- Select the Writing Direction: picture that best matches the slant of your handwriting.
- Use Letter Shapes to eliminate letter shapes that you do not use or to learn methods of writing characters that will make them easier for Transcriber to recognise.
- Try writing in another format. If you have been printing, try writing cursive, or if you have been writing in both cursive and print, try printing alone.
- Adjust the speed at which Transcriber returns text after you write.

- Add a user dictionary that contains special terms you may be using, such as medical or legal terms.
- Verify that you are using your Letter Shapes user profile.

Drawing and writing on the screen

With your Toshiba phone, you can draw directly on the screen, write on the screen, and save notes in your own handwriting. To do this, you must first set the input mode in **Notes** to **Writing**. If you prefer to use handwriting or frequently add drawings to your notes, you may find it helpful to set Writing as the default input mode. If you prefer typed text, set Typing as the default input mode.

To set the input mode for Notes:

- 1. Tap Start > Programs > Notes.
- 2. Tap Menu > Options...
- 3. In the **Default mode:** field, select one of the following:
 - · Writing if you want to draw or enter handwritten text in a note.
 - Typing if you want to create a typed note.
- 4. Tap **ok**.

To hand write a note:

- 1. Tap Start > Programs > Notes.
- 2. Tap New.
- 3. Tap Menu, and make sure that Draw is ticked.
- Write text on the screen.
- 5. Tap **ok** when you have finished.



NOTE: If a letter crosses three or more ruled lines, it is treated as a drawing rather than text.

To draw on the screen using the stylus:

- 1. Tap Start > Programs > Notes.
- 2. Tap New.
- 3. Tap **Menu**, and make sure that **Draw** is ticked.
- 4. Using the stylus, draw over at least three ruled lines. A box labelled **Drawing** is displayed around the drawing.
- 5. Tap ok when you have finished.



TIP: To select a drawing (for example, to copy or delete it), tap and hold the drawing briefly. When you lift the stylus, the drawing is selected.

Full Screen Keyboard

Full Screen Keyboard enables you to enter text from a full screen keyboard that has keys large enough to be typed with your fingertips. Since the keyboard can be operated with both hands, it is convenient for entering large amounts of text.

To use Full Screen Keyboard:

- Tap the Input Panel selector arrow, then tap Full Screen Keyboard.
- 2. Tap the keyboard icon. The **Full Screen Keyboard** is displayed.
- 3. Enter text.
- 4. Tap the keyboard icon when you have finished.

You can configure **Full Screen Keyboard** to your own requirements and preferences. Items that you can configure include the keyboard skin, character repeat settings, sounds, auto correction settings and dictionaries.

To configure Full Screen Keyboard:

- Tap the Input Panel selector arrow, then tap Options...
- 2. In the **Input method:** field, tap **Full Screen Keyboard**.
- 3. Tap Options...
- 4. Select the required options, then tap **ok** twice.

Office Mobile

To access Office Mobile on your Toshiba phone:

Excel Mobile

With **Excel Mobile** you can work on spreadsheets in the same way as on a PC. You can create new spreadsheets and charts, and open and edit workbooks created on a PC.



NOTE: Excel Mobile does not fully support some features. Refer to the Microsoft website for details.



NOTE: Some data and formatting may be lost when you save a workbook created on a PC to your Toshiba phone. Refer to the Microsoft website for details.

OneNote Mobile

With **OneNote Mobile**, you can gather notes and information in one place.

Notes in **OneNote Mobile** can contain text, images and voice recordings. You can also synchronise the notes with **OneNote** on a PC using **ActiveSync**.

PowerPoint Mobile

With **PowerPoint Mobile**, slide show presentations created on your PC can be opened and viewed on your Toshiba phone.

Slide shows created in *.ppt and *.pps format with PowerPoint '97 and later are supported.

Many presentation elements built into the slide shows, such as slide transitions and animations, will play back on your Toshiba phone. If the presentation is set up as a timed slide show, one slide will advance to the next automatically. Links to URLs are also supported.



NOTE: PowerPoint Mobile does not fully support some features. Refer to the Microsoft website for details.

Word Mobile

With **Word Mobile** you can work on documents in the same way as on a PC. You can create new documents and templates, and open and edit documents created on a PC.



NOTE: Word Mobile does not fully support some features. Refer to the Microsoft website for details.



NOTE: Some data and formatting may be lost when you save the document on your Toshiba phone. Refer to the Microsoft website for details.

Calendar

The **Calendar** application works like an electronic diary. You can keep track of your appointments, including meetings and other events.

You can display reminders on your Toshiba phone, as well as synchronising your phone with Outlook on your PC.

Scheduling an appointment

To schedule a new appointment:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Calendar**.
- 2. Tap Menu > New Appointment.
- 3. Enter details of the appointment, then tap ok.



NOTE: All day events do not occupy blocks of time in the **Calendar** - instead they are displayed as banners at the top of the **Calendar**.

Sending a meeting request

You can use the **Calendar** application to schedule meetings via e-mail with contacts who use Microsoft Outlook or Outlook Mobile.

To send a meeting request:

1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Calendar**.

- 2. Schedule a new appointment or open an existing one.
- 3. Tap Menu > Edit.
- 4. If the appointment is recurring, tap All.
- 5. Tap the Attendees: field.
- Tap Add Required Attendee... or Add Optional Attendee... as required.
- 7. Tap the contact to invite.
- 8. Add more contacts if required.
- Tap ok or Done when you have finished adding attendees.
- 10. Tap ok.
- 11. Tap Yes to save the change and send the meeting request to the attendees. The meeting request will be sent to the attendees when you next synchronise your Toshiba phone with your PC.
- NOTE: When attendees accept the meeting request, the meeting is automatically added to their schedules. When their responses are received, your calendar is updated.

Sending an appointment

You can send an appointment within an MMS message.

To send an appointment:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Calendar**.
- 2. Tap the required appointment.
- 3. Tap Menu > Send as vCalendar.
- 4. Add a recipient to the message, then tap Send.

Updating an appointment

To update an appointment:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Calendar**.
- 2. Tap the required appointment.
- 3. Tap Menu > Edit.
- If the appointment is recurring, tap All to edit all occurrences, or tap One to edit only the next occurrence.
- 5. Update the appointment details, then tap **ok**.

Changing the default reminder time

By default, the reminder time is set to 15 minutes before an appointment.

To change the default reminder time:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Calendar.
- 2. Tap Menu > Tools > Options...
- 3. Tap the Appointments tab.
- Make sure that the Set reminders for new items checkbox is ticked, then change the reminder time.
- 5. Tap **ok**.

Deleting an appointment

To delete an appointment:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Calendar.
- 2. Tap the required appointment.
- 3. Tap Menu > Delete.
- If the appointment is recurring, tap All to delete all occurrences, or tap One to delete only the next occurrence.



NOTE: If an appointment that has been synchronised with your PC is deleted, it will be deleted on the PC the next time you synchronise.

Changing the work week display


To change the work week display:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Calendar.
- 2. Tap Menu > Tools > Options...
- 3. On the **General** tab, set the following as required:
 - In the 1st day of week: field, select Sunday or Monday as required.
 - In the Week view: field, select 5-day week,
 6-day week or 7-day week as required.
- 4. Tap ok when you have finished.

Viewing today's agenda

To view today's agenda:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Calendar > Menu > Go to Today
 or
- From Day, Week, Month or Year view, tap
 Menu > View > Agenda or Agenda.



Viewing your agenda for a specific date

To view your agenda for a specific date:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Calendar**.
- 2. Tap Menu > Go to Date.
- 3. Tap the required date.

Viewing your schedule for the next week

To view your schedule for the next week:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Calendar.
- 2. Tap Menu > View > Week.

Viewing your schedule for the next month

To view your schedule for the next month:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Calendar**.
- 2. Tap Menu > View > Month.

Contacts

You can use the **Contacts** feature to store phone numbers, e-mail addresses, home addresses, and other information relating to a contact. You can also add a picture or assign a ring tone to a contact. If you use **Microsoft Outlook** on a PC, you can synchronise contacts between your Toshiba phone and the PC.

Creating a new contact

To create a new contact:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Contacts** or **Start** > **Contacts**.
- 2. Tap New.
- Tap the contact type to create (Outlook Contact or SIM Contact). Outlook contacts are stored on your Toshiba phone.
- NOTE: SIM contacts (except when using a USIM card) only support a single name and phone number. Contacts stored on a USIM card can include a name, three phone numbers and an e-mail address.
- NOTE: If you move the SIM card to another phone, your SIM contacts are moved as well.
- 4. Enter the details of the new contact.

5. Tap **ok**.



TIP: You can customise Outlook contacts by adding a picture or a ring tone to uniquely identify the person calling you.



TIP: If someone whose phone number isn't stored in Contacts calls you, you can create a contact for that person. To do this:

- 1. From the Today screen, press the Send key or tap Start > Phone.
- 2. Tap Hide Kevpad.
- 3. Tap Call History.
- 4. Scroll to the required call, then tap Menu > Save to Contacts.
- 5. Tap <New Contact>.
- 6. Edit the details of the new contact as required, then tap Save.

Assigning phone numbers to a contact

You can assign a work phone number (w), mobile phone number (m) and home phone number (h) to a contact that is saved to the phone.

The mobile phone number is dialled by default.

For further information, refer to Making a call to a non-default number in Call functions.

Finding a contact

To find a contact by name:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Contacts or Start > Contacts.
- Tap the Enter a name... field.
- 3. Enter the first letter of the name of the contact to find. Matching contacts will be listed.

To find a contact by company:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Contacts or Start > Contacts.
- 2. Tap Menu > View By.
- 3. Tap Company.

Viewing and editing a contact


To view and edit a contact:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Contacts or Start > Contacts.
- 2. Tap the required contact.
- 3. To edit the contact, tap Menu > Edit.
- 4. Tap **ok** when you have finished.

To set the viewing filter:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Contacts or Start > Contacts.
- 2. Tap Menu > Filter.

3. Tap the required filter item.



Adding a picture to a contact

To add a picture to a contact:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Contacts or Start > Contacts.
- 2. Tap the required contact.
- 3. Tap Menu > Edit.
- 4. On the **Details** tab, tap **Select a picture...**
- 5. Tap a picture, or tap **Camera** and capture a photograph.
- 6. Tap ok twice.

Removing a picture from a contact

To remove a picture from a contact:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Contacts** or **Start** > **Contacts**.
- 2. Tap the required contact.
- 3. Tap Menu > Edit.
- 4. Tap Menu > Remove Picture.
- 5. Tap Yes to confirm the removal.
- 6. Tap **ok**.

Assigning a ring tone to a contact

To assign a ring tone to a contact:


- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Contacts** or **Start** > **Contacts**.
- 2. Tap the required contact.
- 3. Tap Menu > Edit.
- 4. On the **Details** tab, tap **Ring tone:**, then tap the required ring tone.

Assigning a category to a contact

You can use categories to help organise your contacts.

To assign a category to a contact:

- From the Today screen, tap Contacts or Start > Contacts.
- 2. Tap the required contact.
- 3. Tap Menu > Edit.
- 4. On the **Details** tab, tap **Categories:**, then tap the required categories.





5. Tap ok twice.



NOTE: Categories are shared between your appointments, **Contacts**, and **Tasks**.



NOTE: If you filter your list of contacts by a category, when you create a new contact, it will be automatically assigned to that category.

Copying contacts

To copy a phone contact to the SIM card:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Contacts or Start > Contacts.
- 2. Tap the required contact.
- 3. Tap Menu > Save to SIM.



NOTE: When copying phone contacts to a SIM card, only the supported fields will be copied.

To copy a SIM contact to the phone:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Contacts or Start > Contacts.
- 2. Tap the required contact.
- 3. Tap Menu > Save to Contacts.

To copy all phone contacts to the SIM card:

1. From the Today screen, tap Contacts or Start

- > Contacts.
- 2. Tap Menu > SIM > Copy all phone contacts to SIM.

To copy all SIM contacts to the phone:

- From the Today screen, tap Contacts or Start > Contacts.
- Tap Menu > SIM > Copy all SIM contacts to phone.

Deleting a contact

To delete a contact:

- From the Today screen, tap Contacts or Start > Contacts.
- 2. Tap the required contact.
- 3. Tap Menu > Delete Contact.
- 4. Tap Yes to confirm the deletion.

Deleting all contacts

To delete all contacts from the phone:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Contacts** or **Start** > **Contacts**.
- 2. Tap Menu > SIM > Delete all phone contacts.
- 3. Tap Yes to confirm the deletion.

To delete all contacts from the SIM card:

- From the Today screen, tap Contacts or Start > Contacts.
- 2. Tap Menu > SIM > Delete all SIM contacts.
- 3. Tap Yes to confirm the deletion.

Sending contact information

You can send contact information in a text message or MMS message, or using Bluetooth.

To send contact information in a text message:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Contacts or Start > Contacts.
- 2. Tap the required contact.
- 3. Tap Menu > Send Contact > Text Messages.
- 4. Select the specific information to send, then tap **Done**.
- 5. Add a recipient to the message, then tap **Send**.

To send contact information in an MMS message:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Contacts or Start > Contacts.
- 2. Tap the required contact.
- 3. Tap Menu > Send as vCard.
- 4. Add a recipient to the message, then tap Send.

Internet Explorer

Internet Explorer Mobile gives quick and easy access to searching using Live Search and web pages in your Favorites and History.

You can also type in an address to access other web pages.

Searching the Internet using Live Search

To search the Internet using Live Search:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Internet Explorer.
- 2. Enter a search term into the search field, then tap the search icon.

Accessing a web page

To access a web page:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Internet Explorer.
- 2. Tap Menu > Address Bar.
- 3. Enter the address of the web page.
- 4. Tap the icon to the right of the address bar (green arrow).

Changing the text size of web pages

To change the text size of a web page:

- 1. From a web page, tap Menu > View > Zoom Level.
- 2. Tap the required size.

Showing or hiding pictures on web pages

To show or hide pictures on a web page: From a web page, tap Menu > View > Show Pictures.

Adding a web page to Favorites

To add a web page to **Favorites**:

- 1. From a web page, tap Menu > Add to Favorites...
- 2. Edit the details if required, then tap Add.



TIP: You can also add Favorites from your PC to your Toshiba phone using **ActiveSync**. For more information, see Microsoft ActiveSync Help on your PC.

Creating a folder in Favorites

To create a folder in Favorites:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Internet Explorer.
- 2. Tap Menu > Favorites...
- 3. Tap the Add / Delete tab.
- 4. Tap New Folder.
- 5. Enter a name for the folder, then tap Add.
- 6. Tap **ok**.

Accessing a web page from Favorites

To access a web page from Favorites:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Internet** Explorer.
- 2. Tap Favorites.
- 3. Tap the required web page in the list.



TIP: You can also select a web page from your Favorites by tapping Menu > Favorites...





To view the History:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start > Internet Explorer**.

Changing the home page

To change the home page:

- From a web page, tap Menu > Tools > Options...
- 2. On the **General** tab, tap the required item for the **Home page**:
 - **Use Current** sets the currently displayed page as your home page.
 - Use Default sets the default home page.
- 3. Tap **ok**.

Changing security settings and clearing cookies

Internet Explorer Mobile supports the protocols used by Secure Sockets Layer (SSL). A connection that uses SSL helps you to send personal information more safely.

Cookies are small files containing information about your identity and preferences so that a page can tailor information to your needs. The page sends the file, and it is stored on your Toshiba phone.

To change cookies and security settings:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Internet Explorer.
- 2. Tap Menu > Tools > Options...

- 3. Tap the Security tab.
- 4. Tick the checkboxes for the required security options.
- 5. Tap **ok**.

To clear cookies:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Internet Explorer.
- 2. Tap Menu > Tools > Options...
- 3. Tap the Security tab.
- 4. Tap Clear Cookies.
- 5. Tap **ok**.

Clearing History and temporary files

When you use the Internet, your Toshiba phone stores data that uses up some of the storage capacity of the phone. You can delete these files to free up storage.

To clear **History** and temporary files:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Internet Explorer.
- 2. Tap Menu > Tools > Options...
- 3. Tap the **Memory** tab.
- 4. Tap **Clear History** to delete web page links stored in the **History**.

- Tap **Delete Files** to delete temporary internet files.
- 6. Tap **ok**.

Sending a link

To send a link using **Messaging**:

- From a web page, tap Menu > Tools > Send Link...
- Select the **Messaging** account to use to send the link. A new message is created with the web page address in the body of the message.
- 3. Add a recipient and edit the message if required.
- 4. Tap Send.

Games

Your Toshiba phone comes preloaded with two games.

To access the games on your Toshiba phone:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap Games.
- 3. Tap the required game.

TOSHIBA User Interface

This application enables you to quickly access all items of the Toshiba UI. For further information on the Toshiba UI, see **TOSHIBA User Interface** in **Getting started**.

ActiveSync

ActiveSync enables you to create a synchronisation relationship between your Toshiba phone and PC, and between your Toshiba phone and your Exchange server. This means that the shared data, such as contacts and tasks, is always consistent. If you make a change, it is automatically made to the corresponding information on the other computer. This is an effective way of keeping your data up-to-date.

The synchronisation relationship is created to manage the data that is copied between your Toshiba phone and PC.

You can connect your Toshiba phone to your PC using the USB cable or over a Bluetooth connection. You can also use **ActiveSync** to connect your Toshiba phone to other resources through your PC. However, you cannot synchronise remotely to a PC using a modem or network connection. You can connect to your Exchange server using a cellular connection, or you can connect your Toshiba phone to your PC as a way of connecting back to the Internet.

Installing and setting up ActiveSync

You can either install **ActiveSync** from your Windows Mobile Getting Started CD or you can download a copy of **ActiveSync** from http://www.microsoft.com/windowsmobile/activesync/activesync45.mspx.

Once the software has been installed and your Toshiba phone is connected to your PC, the ActiveSync Setup Wizard is started. Simply follow the on-screen instructions.



NOTE: If you have a PC which is already fully synchronized with your Exchange server, you should synchronise your Toshiba phone with your PC rather than synchronising your Toshiba phone with the Exchange server. Data will be downloaded via your PC, saving you the charges for traffic volume. In addition, synchronising via your mobile phone network will take longer than it would with your local PC.

If you are not synchronising directly with a Microsoft Exchange server, do not select the option to synchronise directly with a server. The alternative is to synchronise your Toshiba phone with your PC. You cannot do both at the same time.

Changing ActiveSync settings

Once you have set up synchronisation using the ActiveSync Setup Wizard on the PC, you can change your synchronization settings at a later stage:

- If you want to change ActiveSync settings for synchronising with a PC, use ActiveSync on the PC. For more information, see ActiveSync Help on the PC.
- If you want to change ActiveSync settings for synchronising with an Exchange server, use ActiveSync on your Toshiba phone.



NOTE: Disconnect your Toshiba phone from your PC before changing the synchronisation settings.

Starting and stopping synchronisation

To start and stop synchronisation:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Programs**.
- 2. Tap ActiveSync.
- 3. To start synchronisation, tap Sync.
- 4. To stop synchronisation, tap Stop.

A-GPS

A-GPS enables you to regularly download updated GPS satellite data. This can improve the GPS performance.

Using **A-GPS** greatly reduces the time taken by your Toshiba phone to calculate its starting location when first switched on. There will also be improved performance in challenging environments, such as indoors and when surrounded by tall buildings or trees.

You can set **A-GPS** to automatically download updated GPS data, or you can manually update the data.

To access A-GPS:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Programs**.
- 2. Tap **A-GPS**.

AutoConfig

For details of **AutoConfig**, refer to **AutoConfigurator** in **Getting started**.

AutoInstall

AutoInstall enables you to easily install applications loaded on your Toshiba phone.

To install applications using AutoInstall:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap AutoInstall.
- Tick the checkboxes for the applications to install. To select all applications, tap Menu > Select All.
- 4. Tap Next.
- 5. Tap **Yes** to confirm the installation.
- Tap ok when the installation is complete. You may need to restart your Toshiba phone for the changes to take effect.

BlackList

BlackList enables you to allow or block incoming calls from particular contacts or groups. You can set specific times for allowing and blocking callers.

The blocked caller will receive a busy tone when they call you.

The default **BlackList** settings allow the following groups to call you:

- · All all callers.
- Unknown callers with no caller ID.
- All Contacts callers with a phone number that is stored in Contacts.
- Not in Contacts callers with a phone number that is not stored in Contacts.

You can also disable or enable the **BlackList** service.

Allowing and blocking groups

To allow or block the default **BlackList** groups:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Programs**.
- 2. Tap BlackList.
- 3. Tap and hold the required group. The pop-up menu is displayed.
- 4. Select the required action from the following:
 - To allow the group, tap Set Action > Allow.

- To block the group, tap Set Action > Block.
- 5. Tap **ok**.

Setting specific times

To set specific times for allowing or blocking a group:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap BlackList.
- 3. Tap and hold the required group.
- 4. Tap Edit.
- In the Action: field, select whether to Allow or Block the group.
- 6. Tick the Enable during set times checkbox.
- 7. Select the days and times during which you want to allow or block the group.
- If you want to be notified when a call has been blocked, tick the **Show notifications** checkbox.
- 9. Tap Save.
- 10. Tap **ok**.

Adding a block

To add a new block:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Programs**.
- 2. Tap BlackList.

- 3. Tap Menu > New.
- 4. Tap the grey box in the top right corner.
- 5. Select an existing contact or add a new contact to block.
- 6. Edit the settings as required.
- 7. Tap Save.
- 8. Tap **ok**.

Deleting a block

To delete an existing block:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap BlackList.
- 3. Tap and hold the required group.
- 4. Tap Delete.
- 5. Tap **ok**.



TIP: You can only delete groups or contacts that you have added.

Disabling/Re-enabling BlackList

When you disable the BlackList service, all BlackList settings will be ignored.

To disable the BlackList service:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Programs**.
- 2. Tap BlackList.

- 3. Tap Menu > Disable Service.
- 4. Tap **ok**.

To re-enable the BlackList service:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap BlackList.
- 3. Tap Menu > Enable Service.
- 4. Tap **ok**.

Calculator

To access the Calculator:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap Calculator.

Use the Calculator buttons to enter numbers and perform calculations.

Camera

Your Toshiba phone is equipped with a digital camera which can be used to capture photographs and video clips.

Starting the Camera

You can launch the Camera application using one of the following methods:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs > Camera.
- Press the Camera key.

Capturing a photo

To capture a photo:

- Start the Camera.
- 2. Aim the camera at the subject, then press the Action key or Camera key. A preview of the photo is displayed.
- 3. Select the required action by tapping one of the following icons:
 - a to save the photo and return to the main Camera screen.
 - - to send the photo in an e-mail.
 - 6 to beam the photo to another device.
 - a to send the photo in an MMS message.



TIP: You can also send a photo in an MMS message by selecting MMS photo mode (before capturing the photo.

• 📠 - to delete the photo.

To capture a framed photo:

- 1. Tap the mode icon (until framed photo mode (is displayed.
- 2. To change the frame, tap the frame icon (1) until the required frame is displayed.
- 3. Capture the photo by pressing the Action key or Camera key.

Capturing a video

To capture a video:

- 1. Start the Camera.
- 2. Tap the mode icon until video mode () is displayed.
- 3. Aim the camera at the subject, then press the Action key or Camera key to start recording the video.
- 4. Press the Action key or Camera key to stop recording the video.
- 5. Select the required action by tapping one of the icons (see Capturing a photo for details of the icons).



TIP: You can send a video in an MMS message by selecting MMS video mode (E) before capturing the video.



TIP: You can capture a framed video by selecting framed video mode (before capturing the video.

Main Camera screen

The following options are available from the main Camera screen:

- 640×480 to select the required resolution for the photo or video. The default resolution is dependent on the Camera mode.
- NOTE: Images of higher resolution (quality) will use more storage space.
- to activate/deactivate the Camera flash.
- 🔚 to set the storage location for photos and videos if you have a storage card installed.
- x- to exit the **Camera** application.
- to zoom in.
- to zoom out.
- to access the Camera settings. These settings include extra photo and video settings. as well as advanced settings such as colour effects and ambient light settings.

- to access Pictures & Videos.
- to use the front camera (for example, to take a self-portrait photograph).
- to use the rear camera (default).

Tips for using the camera

- Fingerprints or grease sticking to the lens may result in problems such as blurred pictures. If this happens, you should wipe the lens clean with a lens tissue.
- · Try to maintain a steady hand when capturing pictures. Any movement of the phone may lead to blurred pictures.
- Avoid aiming the camera at bright light sources as this will affect the quality of the picture.

Certificate Enrollment

Certificate Enrollment enables you to add or enroll for trusted digital certificates.

To use Certificate Enrollment:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Programs**.
- 2. Tap Certificate Enrollment.
- Enter your user name and password, and the server from which to obtain the certificate.
- 4. Tap **Certificate Fetch**. The certificate request is sent to the server.

File Explorer

File Explorer enables you to view and manage files saved in your Toshiba phone, or on a storage card.

To access File Explorer:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- Tap File Explorer. The My Documents folder is opened by default.

FM Radio

You can listen to FM radio stations on your Toshiba phone using the **FM Radio** application.

You can manually search for new radio stations, save favourite stations, and record current or scheduled radio programmes.




NOTE: You can only use the FM Radio application when the headset is connected.

To access FM Radio:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap FM Radio.


The main **FM Radio** screen is shown opposite. The main items and functions on this screen are as follows:

- 1. Radio signal strength.
- 2. Current radio channel and frequency.
- Frequency slider bar. Drag this bar to change the frequency.
- 4. Current volume.
- Saved radio stations.
- 6. To play a previously saved audio file.
- 7. To skip to the previous radio station in the list.
- 8. To skip to the next radio station in the list.
- 9. To stop playing or recording of an audio file.
- 10. To start recording the current radio station.
- 11. To toggle playback between headset and phone speaker.
- 12. To change the volume.



The following menu items are available when using the **FM Radio** application:

 Auto Scan - starts automatic scanning for radio stations.



- Favourites to add, edit and delete saved radio stations.
- Auto recording to set up recording of a future radio programme.
- Settings to edit the FM Radio settings. These include settings for saved audio files, settings to be used when the signal quality is low, and settings for services such as traffic announcements.
- About to view details of the FM Radio application.
- Exit to exit the FM Radio application.



NOTE: The FM Radio application will be muted during a voice call. When you end the call, the radio will resume.

Full Screen Keyboard

For details of Full Screen Keyboard, refer to Full Screen Keyboard in Text input.

Getting Started

Getting Started gives you step-by-step instructions for carrying out common procedures with your Toshiba phone.

To access Getting Started:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap Getting Started.
- 3. Tap a procedure to view the instructions.

Home

Home enables you to access the Home screen. This is the main Toshiba UI screen. For further information on the Toshiba UI, see TOSHIBA User Interface in Getting started.

Image Editor

Image Editor enables you to easily edit images stored on your Toshiba phone.

To start using Image Editor:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap Image Editor.
- 3. Tap an image to edit.

Image Editor functions

Tap the file icon () to open image files, save edited files, view information about the **Image Editor** application, or exit **Image Editor**.

Tap the edit icon () to access and use the main editing tools, including cropping and transformation tools.

Tap the filter icon () to select and apply filters and colour effects to the image.

Tap the frame icon (to select and add a frame to the image.

Tap the clip art icon (to select and add clip art to the image.

Image To Text

Image To Text is an Optical Character Reader (OCR) application that enables you to scan business cards or documents using the Camera application. You can save the extracted data as a contact or a plain text document.

Saving business card information

To save business card information as a contact:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap Image To Text.
- 3. Tap Business Card Reader.
- 4. Select the source of the image file.
 - Select Camera to start the Camera application. Tap Next, then capture a photograph of the business card.
 - Select **My Pictures** to open the **My Pictures** folder, then tap the required image.
- 5. Tap Next.
- 6. Wait a few seconds while the image is processed.
- 7. Edit details of the contact as required.
- Tap Menu > Save > Outlook Contacts/SIM Contact, depending on where you would like the contact to be stored.

- NOTE: When saving the contact to the SIM card, only the fields supported on the SIM card will be saved
- 9. Tap **ok** when the confirmation is displayed.
- TIP: Depending on the contact details available, you can call the contact, send them a text message or e-mail, or browse the contact's URL using the menu items from the current screen.
- Tap Menu > Back as many times as needed to return to the first Image To Text screen.
- 11. Tap **ok**.

Saving plain text information

To save plain text information from an image:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Programs**.
- 2. Tap Image To Text.
- 3. Tap Newspaper Reader.
- 4. Select the source of the image file.
 - Select Camera to start the Camera application. Tap Next, then capture a photograph of the required text.
 - Select My Pictures to open the My Pictures folder, then tap the required image.
- 5. Tap Next.

- Wait a few seconds while the image is processed.
- 7. Edit the text information as required.
- 8. Tap Menu > File > Save As...
- Edit the name, file type and storage location as required.
- 10. Tap Save.
- 11. Tap ok twice.
- 12. Tap **Menu** > **Back** as many times as needed to return to the first **Image To Text** screen.
- 13. Tap **ok**.

Internet Sharing

For details of **Internet Sharing**, refer to **Internet Sharing** in **Connectivity**.

JBlend

Your Toshiba phone supports Java applications (also known as MIDlets) that are written for mobile devices. Java applications include games and utilities.

Your phone supports Java 2 Edition and J2ME. The **JBlend** application on your Toshiba phone enables you to download, install and manage Java applications.

To access the **JBlend** application:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start > Programs**.
- 2. Tap JBlend.

Installing a Java application

To install a Java application:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Programs**.
- 2. Tap JBlend.
- 3. Tap Install.
- 4. Select where to install the application from:
 - To install from a website, tap **Download**. This
 will launch the default browser. Go to the
 website with the required Java application
 and download the application. It is then
 loaded into the **JBlend** application.

- To install an application stored on your Toshiba phone, tap Local Install. All uninstalled Java applications stored on the phone and the storage card are displayed. Select one to install.
- The details of the selected application will be displayed and you will be prompted to confirm the installation. Tap **Yes** to install the application.
- 6. Wait a few seconds while the application is installed. You can then run the application.

Running a Java application

Once Java applications are successfully installed, they are displayed on the main **JBlend** screen.

To run a Java application:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap JBlend.
- 3. Tap the required application.

Deleting Java applications

You may want to delete Java applications to free up memory.

To delete a single installed Java application:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap JBlend.
- 3. Scroll to the required application, then tap **Menu** > **Application** > **Delete**.
- 4. Tap Yes to confirm the deletion.

To delete all installed Java applications:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap JBlend.
- 3. Tap Menu > Application > Delete All.
- 4. Tap Yes to confirm the deletion.

Exiting the JBlend application

To exit the **JBlend** application:

From the main **JBlend** screen, tap **Menu** > **Exit**.

Messenger

Windows Live Messenger on your Toshiba phone enables you to:

- · send instant messages or join group chats.
- set your status and see the presence of friends and colleagues.
- · send messages via voice as well as text.
- · send pictures and files.
- · use emoticons to express how you feel.

To use **Windows Live Messenger**, you need **Windows Live ID** credentials.

For details of Windows Live ID, go to:

You will also need to sign in to **Windows Live** before you can sign in to **Windows Live Messenger**.

To access Windows Live Messenger:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start > Programs**.
- 2. Tap Messenger.

Notes

With **Notes**, you can quickly capture ideas, questions, reminders, to-do lists and meeting notes by writing, typing or recording your voice in a note. This is especially useful when you don't have a pen and paper to hand.

For further details of Notes, refer to Drawing and writing on the screen in Text input.

Creating a note

To create a note:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Programs**.
- 2. Tap Notes.
- 3. Tap New.
- Change the input method if required. Refer to Input methods in Text input for further details.
- Enter the note using your selected input method.
- 6. Tap ok when you have finished.



NOTE: To record a voice note, use the recording toolbar.

If this bar is not displayed, tap **Menu** > **View Recording Toolbar**.

Viewing or playing a note

To view a or play a note:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap Notes.
- 3. Tap the note to view or play.

Picsel Viewer

Picsel Viewer is a tool used to view documents.

Opening Picsel Viewer

To open Picsel Viewer:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap Picsel Viewer.
- 3. Tap the required document.

Picsel Viewer menu

To access the Picsel Viewer menu:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap Picsel Viewer.
- If the Open screen is displayed, tap the Cancel button.
- 4. Tap Menu.

Picsel Viewer has the following menu items:

- Open File to open the selected file.
- Recent to display the list of recently viewed files.
- Page to rotate or resize the page, or view a different page in the document.
- Settings enables you to clear the history and select the file types to associate with Picsel Viewer. You can also view information about the Picsel Viewer application.
- · Close to close Picsel Viewer.

Pictures & Videos

Viewing pictures and videos

You can view pictures and videos stored on your Toshiba phone or storage card using the **Pictures & Videos** application.

To view pictures and videos:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Programs**.
- 2. Tap Pictures & Videos.
- 3. Tap the required picture or video.

Pictures & Videos menu items

The following menu items are available when a picture is highlighted in the main **Pictures & Videos** screen:

- Send... to send a picture or video in an MMS message or e-mail.
- **Beam...** to send a picture or video over a Bluetooth connection.
- Save to Contact... to save a picture to a contact.
- **Delete** to delete a picture or video.
- Edit enables you to move and copy pictures and videos between folders.

- Play Slide Show to play all pictures in the current folder as a slide show.
- Set as Today Background... to set the picture as the background for the Today screen.
- Go To to view pictures and videos stored in other folders on your Toshiba phone.
- Tools to display file information, sort files, and access settings for configuration of the Pictures & Videos application.
- Send to your space to send a picture to your Windows Live space.

The following menu items are available when viewing a picture:

- Zoom to zoom in or out of the picture.
- Play Slide Show to play all pictures in the current folder as a slide show.
- Set as Today Background... to set the picture as the background for the Today screen.
- Beam picture... to send the picture over a Bluetooth connection.
- Save to save the picture to a contact or rename the picture.
- Edit to edit the picture using the simple tools built in to the Pictures & Videos application.
- Properties displays information about the picture, such as file type and size.

- Options... to access settings for configuration of the Pictures & Videos application.
- Send to your space to send the picture to your Windows Live space.

Search

You can search for files and other items stored on your Toshiba phone in the My Documents folder or on a storage card.

You can search by file name or by keywords located in the item. For example, you can search e-mail messages, notes, appointments, contacts, and tasks as well as in Help.

To search for a file or an item:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap Search.
- 3. In the Search for: field, enter the file name. word, or other information you require.
- 4. If you have searched for an item before, tap the arrow to the right of the Search for: field to find it in the searching history.
- 5. In the **Type:** field, select a data type to help narrow your search.
- 6. Tap Search.

In the **Results** list, you can tap the item you require to open it.



NOTE: The My Documents folder and its subfolders are included in the search.



NOTE: Results found on a storage card are indicated by an icon.

SIM Toolkit

When you install a SIM card that has applications loaded on it, you can run the applications using the **SIM Toolkit** application.

To run an application from the SIM card:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Programs**.
- Tap SIM Toolkit. The list of SIM applications is displayed.
- 3. Select the application that you want to run, then tap **Select**.



NOTE: The **SIM Toolkit** icon () is not displayed when the installed SIM card does not have any applications loaded.

The title of this icon depends on title of the SIM.

Streaming Player

Streaming Player enables you to play live and recorded streaming media on your Toshiba phone.

To use Streaming Player:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap Streaming Player.
- 3. Tap Open.
- 4. Enter the URL of the required media, then tap **Connect**.



NOTE: To access the URL of a streaming media item, your Toshiba phone must connect to the network. For more information about connecting your phone to a network, refer to Internet connections in Connectivity.

To edit the Streaming Player settings:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap Streaming Player.
- 3. Tap Menu > Options.
- 4. Edit the settings as required, then tap Done.

Task Manager

For details of **Task Manager**, refer to **Task Manager** in **Settings**.

Tasks

With the Tasks application, you can create one-off tasks or recurring tasks. You can also set reminders for your tasks, and organise them by category. Overdue tasks will be displayed in red.

Creating a task

To create a new task:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap Tasks.
- 3. Tap Menu > New Task.



TIP: You can also create a task by entering a name for the task in the Tap here to add a new task field, then pressing the Action key. However, using this method you will need to add the details of the task separately.

- 4. Edit the details of the task as required.
- 5. Tap **ok**.



TIP: You can synchronise tasks on your Toshiba phone with your PC. This will keep tasks up to date in both locations.

> If you create a new task with a reminder on your PC and then synchronise tasks with your phone, the reminder is activated at the time set on your PC.

Changing the status of a task

When a new task is created, it will be set as active. When you have completed the task, you can update its status.

To mark a task as completed:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap Tasks.
- 3. Scroll to the required task, then tap Complete.



TIP: If you need to reactivate a task, scroll to the required task, then tap Activate.

Sorting and filtering tasks

To sort and filter tasks:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap Tasks.
- 3. To sort the tasks, tap Menu > Sort By, then select an item by which to sort the list or

to filter the tasks, tap Menu > Filter, then select a filter.



TIP: You can use the filter option for Active Tasks or Completed Tasks at the same time as another filter.

Deleting a task

To delete a task:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap Tasks.
- 3. Tap the required task.
- 4. Tap Menu > Delete.
- 5. Tap Yes to confirm the deletion.

Windows Live

Windows Live gives access to searching using Live Search, as well as access to Windows Live Messenger.

For information on using Live Search, see Searching the Internet using Live Search. For information on Windows Live Messenger, see Messenger.

Windows Media

Overview of Windows Media Player Mobile

You can use Windows Media Player 10 Mobile to play digital audio and video files that are stored on your Toshiba phone, a storage card or on the Internet.

Windows Media Player Mobile can play files with the following extensions by default:

- asf
- .wma
- .wmv
- .mp3.

Your Toshiba phone can also play .mid, .wav, .3gp and .mp4 files.

Overview of screens and menus

Windows Media Player Mobile has three primary screens:

 Library screen - enables quick access of files and playlists. It also includes an item that enables you to switch to the Now Playing screen.

To switch to the **Playback** screen from the **Library** screen, tap **ok**.

The **Library** screen will be the default screen displayed when you first use Windows Media Player Mobile.

- Now Playing screen displays the Now Playing playlist. This shows the file currently playing, as well as any files that are queued up to play next.
- Playback screen displays the playback controls and the video window. You can change the appearance of this screen by selecting a different skin.

Tapping **Menu** from any of these screens will give menu items relevant to the screen.

Library screen menu items

- Queue Up adds the highlighted item to the end of the current playlist.
- **Delete from Library** deletes the highlighted item from the library.
- Now Playing switches to the Now Playing screen.
- Library to switch between libraries.
- **Update Library...** adds new items to the library by searching your Toshiba phone, and storage card if available.
- Open File... enables you to play files that are stored on your phone or storage card but are not in the library.
- Open URL... enables you to play a file stored on a network, such as the Internet.
- **Properties** displays information about the highlighted file.

Now Playing screen menu items

- Library... switches to the Library screen.
- Move Up moves the highlighted item up in the playlist order.
- **Move Down** moves the highlighted item down in the playlist order.
- Remove from Playlist deletes the highlighted item from the playlist.
- Shuffle/Repeat > Shuffle sets items in the playlist to play in a random order.
- Shuffle/Repeat > Repeat sets items in the playlist to play repeatedly.
- Save Playlist... to save the current playlist. You
 can enter a name for the playlist, or a default
 name can be used.
- Clear Now Playing to delete all items from the Now Playing playlist.
- Error Details- displays error information about the highlighted item. An exclamation mark is displayed before the item name if error details are available.
- Properties displays information about the highlighted file.

Playback screen menu items

- Library... switches to the Library screen.
- Play/Pause starts or pauses playback.
- · Stop stops playback.
- Shuffle/Repeat > Shuffle sets items in the playlist to play in a random order.
- Shuffle/Repeat > Repeat sets items in the playlist to play repeatedly.
- Full Screen plays video files in full screen mode.
- Options... enables you to set options for Windows Media Player Mobile, including changing the appearance of the Playback screen.
- · Properties displays information about the current file.
- . About displays information about Windows Media Player Mobile.

Playing items stored on your Toshiba phone

Use the **Library** to find and play music, videos, and playlists that are stored on your Toshiba phone or storage card.

To play an item stored on your Toshiba phone:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap Windows Media.
- 3. If the item is in the Library, scroll to the item, then tap Play.

If the item is not in the Library, tap Menu > Open File... Scroll to the item, then tap Play.



TIP: To add files to the Library, tap Menu > Update Library...

Playing items stored on a network

To play an item stored on a network:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap Windows Media.
- 3. From the **Library** screen, tap **Menu** > **Open** URL...
- 4. Enter the URL of the file, then tap **OK**, or select a URL from the **History**: field.



NOTE: To play an item on a network, your Toshiba phone must connect to the network. For more information about connecting your phone to a network, refer to **Internet connections** in **Connectivity**.

Changing the appearance of the player

You can change the appearance of the **Playback** screen by selecting a new skin.

To select a new skin:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start > Programs**.
- 2. Tap Windows Media.
- 3. Tap Menu > Options...
- 4. Tap the Skins tab.
- 5. Tap the required skin.
- 6. Tap **ok**.



NOTE: To download new skins, access the WMplugins website at: www.wmplugins.com.

After downloading a skin to your computer, use **ActiveSync** to copy the *.skn and *.bmp files to your Toshiba phone. To ensure that the skin is displayed on the **Skins** tab, do not store skin files in the Windows folder on your Toshiba phone.

Wireless Manager

Wireless Manager enables you to easily switch the Phone, Data, Bluetooth and Wi-Fi functionality on or off.

To access Wireless Manager:

- From the Today screen, tap the area displaying the service provider name.
- From the Today screen, tap Start > Settings > Connections > Wireless Manager.

Switching radio transmission on/off

You can switch the telephony radio transmission of your Toshiba phone on and off.

When the radio transmission is off, it is in 'Flight Mode'. In this mode, you will not be able to make or receive calls, send or receive messages, or access the Internet.

To switch radio transmission on/off:

From **Wireless Manager**, tap the **Phone** item. Radio transmission will toggle on or off.

Disconnecting current active data connection

You can disconnect an active data connection without switching off the radio transmission by tapping **Data** from **Wireless Manager**.

However, the data connection will automatically reconnect if you are using Direct Push e-mail. This is because your Toshiba phone must have a connection permanently open to receive e-mails from the e-mail server. To disconnect the data connection in this scenario, you must first disable the Direct Push e-mail.

To disable Direct Push e-mail:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 2. Tap ActiveSync.
- 3. Tap Menu > Schedule...
- Set the Peak times: and Off-peak times: fields to Manually.

To re-enable Direct Push e-mail:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs > ActiveSync.
- 2. Tap Menu > Schedule...
- Set the Peak times: and Off-peak times: fields to As items arrive.

Switching all wireless functions on/ off

To switch all wireless functions on or off at the same time:

From Wireless Manager, tap Switch all Wireless Off.



NOTE: You can conserve battery power by switching off **Bluetooth** and **Wi-Fi** when they are not in use.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology. Devices with Bluetooth capabilities can exchange data over a distance of approximately 10 metres without requiring a wired connection.

Bluetooth on your Toshiba phone has three modes: **Off, On** and **Visible**.

In **Off** mode, you cannot send or receive data using Bluetooth.

In **On** mode, your Toshiba phone can search for and connect to other devices. However, your phone will not be visible in searches by other devices.

In **Visible** mode, your Toshiba phone can search for and connect to other devices. Your phone will also be visible to other devices.

Changing Bluetooth mode

By default, Bluetooth is in **Off** mode. Bluetooth will remain in the same mode when turning your Toshiba phone off and on.

To change Bluetooth mode:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap the Connections tab.
- 3. Tap Bluetooth.
- 4. Tab the Mode tab.

5. To set Bluetooth to Off mode, untick the Turn on Bluetooth checkbox.

To set Bluetooth to On mode, tick the Turn on Bluetooth checkbox.

To set Bluetooth to Visible mode, tick both the the Turn on Bluetooth and Make this device visible to other devices checkboxes.



TIP: You can also toggle Bluetooth mode using Wireless Manager.

Pairing devices

When devices are paired, a relationship is created that enables the exchange of data between the devices.

The pairing can be set up using a passcode, which will ensure that exchanged data is kept secure.

Pairing of devices only needs to be carried out once. After this, the devices can connect to each other and exchange data without the passcode needing to be entered again.

Before pairing your Toshiba phone with another device, ensure that:

- Your Toshiba phone and the other device are within 10 metres of each other.
- Bluetooth on your Toshiba phone is set to **On** or Visible.

- · Bluetooth on the other device is set to Visible. To pair your Toshiba phone with another device:
- From the Today screen, tap Start > Settings.
- 2. Tap the Connections tab.
- 3. Tap Bluetooth.
- 4. On the **Devices** tab, tap **Add new device...** Your Toshiba phone will search for other Bluetooth-enabled devices and display them in a list.
- 5. Tap the required device, then tap Next.
- 6. For enhanced security, enter a passcode in the Passcode: field. This is alphanumeric, and can be between 1 and 16 characters in length.
- 7. Tap Next.
- 8. Wait for the other device to accept the pairing. If a passcode has been set on your Toshiba phone, then it will need to be entered on the other device.
- 9. To edit the settings for the device, tap Advanced. You can then edit the name to be used for the device, and select services to use from the device. Tap Save when you have finished.

To finish the pairing without editing the settings, tap Done.

Connecting a Bluetooth headset

Before connecting a Bluetooth headset to your Toshiba phone, ensure that:

- Bluetooth on your Toshiba phone is set to Visible.
- the Bluetooth headset is set to pairing mode.

To connect a Bluetooth headset:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap the **Connections** tab.
- 3. Tap Bluetooth.
- 4. On the Devices tab, tap Add new device...
- Tap the Bluetooth headset in the list of devices, then tap Next.
- Enter the passcode for the headset. This will be provided with your Bluetooth headset.
- 7. Tap Next.
- 8. Wait for the headset to accept the pairing.
- A confirmation will be displayed when the headset has been connected. Tap Advanced.
- 10. If required, edit the name of the headset.
- 11. Make sure that the **Hands Free** checkbox is ticked. If you are using a stereo Bluetooth headset, also make sure that the **Wireless Stereo** checkbox is ticked.
- 12. Tap Save when you have finished.

Unpairing devices

To unpair your Toshiba phone from another device:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap the **Connections** tab.
- 3. Tap Bluetooth.
- On the **Devices** tab, tap and hold the required device.
- 5. When the options are displayed, tap **Delete**.
- 6. Tap Yes to confirm the deletion.

Bluetooth security

Although your Toshiba phone has security features compliant with the Bluetooth standard specification, this security might not work properly when using your Toshiba phone in a non-secure environment. Take care when using the Bluetooth feature.

Beam

The term 'Beam' is used to describe the short range transfer of data between two devices via a Bluetooth connection.

You can beam **Calendar**, **Contacts**, **Tasks**, and **Pictures & Videos** items, and other files stored on your Toshiba phone, to other devices.



NOTE: Bluetooth must be set to **On** or **Visible** to send beamed items.

To receive beamed items, Bluetooth must be set to **Visible**.

Beaming an item

To beam an item to another device:

- Scroll to the item that you want to beam, then tap Menu > Beam... (This path will vary slightly depending on the type of item that you want to beam.)
- Tap the device to which you want to send the item.

Configuring your Toshiba phone to receive beamed data

To configure your Toshiba phone to receive beamed data:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Settings.
- 2. Tap the Connections tab.
- 3. Tap Beam.
- 4. Tick the **Receive all incoming beams.** checkbox, then tap **ok**.

Cell Broadcast

Cell Broadcast receives broadcast channel information and news from your service provider.



NOTE: This functionality is only available if it is supported by your service provider. Please contact your service provider for further information.

Internet connections

Your Toshiba phone is equipped with powerful networking functions that enable you to connect to the Internet through a General Packet Radio Service (GPRS) or Universal Mobile Telecommunications System (UMTS) network. You can set up connections to the Internet or to a corporate network to browse the Internet, and exchange e-mail or instant messages.

Your phone has two groups of connection settings: My ISP and My Work Network. The My ISP settings are used to connect to the Internet, while My Work Network settings can be used to connect to any private, corporate network.



NOTE: Before you begin, you will need to obtain the following information:

- From your phone service provider data connectivity plan information, access point name, and PAP/CHAP security settings.
- From your ISP or wireless service provider - access point name, user name and password, and other security information.



NOTE: If you connect to the Internet using your service provider's data network, the service may be provided through a GPRS connection (fast, but generally billed by volume of data transferred), or through a Circuit Switched Data (CSD) connection (slow, but generally billed by amount of time connected). You should check with your service provider which connection you will be using on their network.

Setting up a GPRS connection

GPRS is a packet-based wireless communication service which enables data to be sent and received using mobile phones.

You can use GPRS to connect to the Internet or to send and receive MMS messages using your phone. When you use GPRS, you will usually be billed based on the data traffic volume. However. you should check billing information with your service provider.



NOTE: Before setting up a GPRS connection, you will need to obtain the required settings from your service provider. As a minimum, the access point name will be required.



TIP: You can quickly and easily configure your GPRS settings using Auto Configurator. For details, see Auto Configurator in Getting started.

To set up a GPRS connection manually:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap the Connections tab.
- 3. Tap Connections.
- 4. On the Tasks tab, tap Add a new modem **connection** for the required group.
- Enter a name for the connection.

- 6. In the Select a modem: field, select Cellular Line (GPRS).
- 7. Tap Next.
- 8. Enter the GPRS APN for your service provider, then tap Next.
- 9. Enter details for the following fields if they are required by your service provider:
 - User name: your user name for the network.
 - Password: your password.
 - · Domain: domain name.
- 10. If you need to specify extra settings, tap the Advanced... button and enter the following information:
 - . On the TCP/IP tab, tap the Use serverassigned IP address radio button to automatically configure the IP address. Otherwise, tap the Use specific IP address radio button and manually enter the IP address.
 - Tick the Use software compression checkbox if required.
 - Tick the Use IP header compression checkbox if required.
 - · On the Servers tab, tap the Use serverassigned addresses radio button to automatically configure the server address.

Otherwise, tap the **Use specific server** address radio button to manually enter the server address information in the **DNS:**, **Alt DNS:**, **WINS:**, and **Alt WINS:** fields. Tap **ok**.

11. Tap Finish.

Setting up a dial-up connection



NOTE: Before setting up a dial-up connection, you will need to obtain the required settings from your service provider.

To set up a dial-up connection:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap the Connections tab.
- 3. Tap Connections.
- 4. On the **Tasks** tab, tap **Add a new modem connection** for the required group.
- 5. Enter a name for the connection.
- In the Select a modem: field, select Cellular Line.
- Tap Next.
- Enter the phone number used to dial the network, then tap Next.
- Enter the required information. Refer to Setting up a GPRS connection for details.
- 10. Tap Finish.

Setting up a VPN connection



IMPORTANT: Please ensure that you have set up a GPRS connection before attempting to set up a VPN connection. The VPN connection uses the GPRS connection to connect to a network, such as a corporate network.



NOTE: Before setting up a VPN connection, you will need to obtain the required settings.

To set up a VPN connection:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Settings.
- 2. Tap the Connections tab.
- Tap Connections.
- On the Tasks tab, tap Add a new VPN server connection in the My Work Network section.
- 5. Enter the following information:
 - . Name: name for the connection.
 - · Host name/ IP: name of the VPN server.
 - VPN type: select the type of VPN.
- 6. Tap Next.
- If you selected IPSec/L2TP in the VPN type: field, select the type of authentication.
 Enter the pre-shared key if required.
 Tap Next.

- Enter the required information. Refer to Setting up a GPRS connection for details.
- 9. Tap Finish.

Setting up a proxy connection

Depending on your service provider's configuration, you may need to add a proxy connection to allow your Toshiba phone to access the Internet or WAP services.

Your service provider will be able to advise whether you need to create a proxy connection.



NOTE: Before setting up a proxy connection, you will need to obtain the required settings from your service provider.

To set up a proxy connection:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Settings.
- 2. Tap the Connections tab.
- 3. Tap Connections.
- On the Tasks tab, tap Set up my proxy server for the required group.
- In the Proxy Settings tab, tick the This network connects to the Internet and This network uses a proxy server to connect to the Internet checkboxes.
- In the Proxy server: field, enter the name of the proxy server.
- If you need to specify extra settings, tap the Advanced... button and edit the settings as required.

Tap ok when you have finished.

8. Tap **ok**.

Connecting to intranet URLs

Some URLs for corporate intranet pages may use '.' characters, for example:

intranet.companyname.com. To view these pages, you need to set up a URL exception.

To set up a URL exception:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap the **Connections** tab.
- 3. Tap Connections.
- 4. Tap the Advanced tab.
- 5. Tap the **Exceptions...** button.
- 6. Tap Add new URL...
- 7. In the Work URL: field, enter the required URL.
- 8. Tap ok three times.

Advanced settings

Advanced settings allow you to specify the particular connection to be used for different connection types.

You can also specify dialing rules.

To access advanced settings:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap the Connections tab.
- 3. Tap Connections.
- 4. Tap the Advanced tab.

CSD Line

CSD Line enables you to select the line settings for CSD connections.



NOTE: The default setting on your Toshiba phone is set for optimal use. Do not change the CSD line settings unless you are having trouble using the CSD connection.

To edit CSD line settings:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap Start > Settings.
- 2. Tap the Connections tab.
- 3. Tap CSD Line.
- Select the data rate and type of connection, then tap ok.

Domain Enroll

Domain Enroll enables you to enroll your Toshiba phone as a domain member. You can then connect your phone securely to a network, e.g. your work network

To use Domain Enroll:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap the Connections tab.
- 3. Tap **Domain Enroll**.
- 4. Tap Enroll.
- 5. A notification screen is displayed. Tap **Next**.
- Enter your e-mail address for the domain server to which you are enrolling.
- 7. Tap Next.
- 8. If required, enter the name of the domain server.
- 9. Enter the enrollment password, then tap Next.
- 10. Restart your Toshiba phone if requested.

Internet Sharing

Internet Sharing enables you to use your Toshiba phone as a modem for a PC.



NOTE: This functionality is only available if it is supported on your SIM card. Please contact your service provider for further information.

To connect to the Internet using Internet Sharing:

- Connect your Toshiba phone to a PC using the USB cable or Bluetooth.
- 2. From the Today screen, tap Start > Programs.
- 3. Tap Internet Sharing.
- In the PC Connection: field, select the type of connection used for connecting the phone and PC.
- In the Network Connection: field, select the connection to use to connect to the Internet.
- Tap Connect. Once the connection is enabled, you can access the Internet on a PC using your Toshiba phone as a modem.
- 7. When you have finished using the Internet, tap **Disconnect** on your phone.

Network Mode

Network Mode enables you to set the radio system used by your Toshiba phone, and the frequency band.



NOTE: Changing the Network Mode settings may limit the ability of your Toshiba phone to connect to the wireless network, and may result in signal failure.

To change the **Network Mode** settings:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap the **Connections** tab.
- 3. Tap Network Mode.
- Select a network mode from one of the following:
 - Auto selects network mode automatically.
 - GSM selects 2G/2.5G network mode.
 - UMTS selects 3G network mode.
- Select a GSM/UMTS frequency band if required.
- 6. Tap **ok**.

USB to PC

USB to PC enables you to change the type of USB connection used between your Toshiba phone and PC.

To change the **USB to PC** setting:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap the Connections tab.
- 3. Tap USB to PC.
- 4. Tap the required mode, then tap ok.

Wi-Fi


Your Toshiba phone supports Wi-Fi (Wireless LAN), which is IEEE 802.11b/g compliant.

Connecting to a Wi-Fi network

Before connecting to a Wi-Fi network, ensure that Wi-Fi on your Toshiba phone is on.

To connect to a Wi-Fi network:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Settings.
- 2. Tap the Connections tab.
- 3. Tap **Wi-Fi**. Available networks will be displayed on the **Wireless** tab.



 Tap the required network, or add a new network by tapping Menu > Add New... and entering the details of the network.

Configuring a network adapter

To configure a network adaptor:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap the Connections tab.
- 3. Tap Wi-Fi.
- 4. Tap the Network Adapters tab.
- 5. Tap the adaptor to configure.
- On the IP Address tab, tick the Use serverassigned IP address or Use specific IP address radio button.
- 7. On the Name Servers tab, specify DNS:, Alt DNS:, WINS: and Alt WINS:.
- 8. Tap **ok**.

Wi-Fi security

It is possible for an outside party to easily gain unlawful access to your Toshiba phone via Wi-Fi if the security function is not used.

Without this security, your Toshiba phone carries the risk of unlawful access, wiretapping, and loss or destruction of data.

You should set up your Toshiba phone to use the authentication and encryption features in order to prevent such access.

When using a public Wi-Fi access point, your Toshiba phone should be protected from unlawful access by the Windows firewall of Windows Security Centre and the anti-virus software within the firewall feature.

Volume control

You can access the phone sound volume and ringer/call volume settings by tapping the ringer icon on the title bar.

Volume control has the following settings:

- Phone sound volume 6 levels.
- · Ringer/call volume 6 levels.
- Both phone volume and ringer/call volume can be set to On. Vibrate or Off.

You can also change the volume settings by pressing the Volume keys.

Reassigning button functions

There are already applications assigned to the hardware buttons. However, you may want to change some assignments to applications that you use more frequently.

To reassign a button:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. On the Personal tab, tap Buttons. On the Program Buttons tab, a list of buttons and their assigned application is displayed.



TIP: An icon represents the original function of a button. This helps you to identify a button and restore its default

- 3. Tap a button to reassign.
- 4. In the 2. Assign a program: field, select an application for this button.
- Tap **ok**.

Input method settings

For details of changing the input method settings, refer to the **Text input** section.

Security settings

It is advisable to apply certain security features in case your Toshiba phone is lost or stolen.

You can apply the following security to prevent unauthorised use:

 Device lock - using a password, this feature prevents unauthorised use of your Toshiba phone.

When this feature is activated, you will be prompted for a password when you switch on your Toshiba phone, and when you leave it idle for a set period of time.

When this feature is activated, you will need to enter the password before you can use your Toshiba phone.

 Phone lock - using a personal identification number (PIN), this feature prevents unauthorised use of your SIM card in any phone. When this feature is activated, you will be prompted for your PIN when you switch on your Toshiba phone. You cannot use the SIM card until the PIN is entered correctly.



NOTE: Emergency calls can be placed at any time, without requiring deactivation of any security feature first.

Enabling device lock

To enable the device lock:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Settings.
- 2. On the Personal tab, tap Lock.
- On the Password tab, tick the Prompt if device unused for checkbox, and select how long your device can be left idle before a password is required.
- Select a password type.
- 5. Enter and confirm a password.



NOTE: Make a note of the password.

- 6. Enter a hint on the Hint tab if required.
- 7. Tap **ok**.
- 8. Tap Yes to confirm the changes.



IMPORTANT: If you forget your password, you will need to reinitialise your phone. Refer to Reinitialising your Toshiba phone in Care and maintenance for details. This will delete any applications that you have installed. You will also lose all personal data such as music, ringtones and pictures, and will need to restore the data from a backup file.

Changing device lock password

To change the device lock password:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. On the Personal tab, tap Lock.
- 3. Enter your current password, then tap **Unlock**.
- 4. Enter and confirm a new password.
- 5. Tap **ok**.
- 6. Tap Yes to confirm the changes.

Disabling device lock

To disable the device lock:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Settings.
- 2. On the Personal tab, tap Lock.
- 3. Enter your current password, then tap **Unlock**.
- 4. On the Password tab, untick the Prompt if device unused for checkbox.
- 5. Tap **ok**.
- 6. Tap **Yes** to confirm the change.

Enabling phone lock

To enable the phone lock:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. On the Personal tab, tap Phone.
- 3. Tap the Security tab.

- 4. Tick the Require PIN when phone is used checkbox.
- Tap **ok**.

Changing SIM PIN



NOTE: Before you start, you will need to know the SIM PIN. This is provided with your SIM card.

To change the SIM PIN:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Settings.
- 2. On the **Personal** tab, tap **Phone**.
- 3. Tap the **Security** tab.
- 4. Tap Change PIN.
- 5. Enter the old SIM PIN, then tap Enter.



WARNING: If you enter the incorrect PIN for vour SIM card three consecutive times, you will need to contact your service provider to obtain the PUK. Do not attempt to guess the PUK as your SIM card will be rendered permanently inoperative following ten consecutive unsuccessful attempts.

- 6. Enter the new SIM PIN, then tap Enter.
- 7. Confirm the new SIM PIN, then tap Enter.



NOTE: Make a note of the new SIM PIN.

Disabling phone lock

To disable the phone lock:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. On the Personal tab, tap Phone.
- 3. Tap the Security tab.
- 4. Untick the Require PIN when phone is used checkbox.
- 5. Enter the SIM PIN, then tap Enter.



WARNING: If you enter the incorrect PIN for your SIM card three consecutive times, you will need to contact your service provider to obtain the PUK. Do not attempt to guess the PUK as your SIM card will be rendered permanently inoperative following ten consecutive unsuccessful attempts.

6. Tap **ok**.

Changing PIN2



NOTE: You can only change PIN2 if this functionality is enabled on your SIM card.

To change PIN2:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. On the Personal tab. tap Phone.
- 3. Tap the Security tab.

- 4. Tap Change PIN2.
- 5. Enter the old PIN2, then tap Enter.



NOTE: If you enter the incorrect PIN2 for your SIM card three consecutive times, you will need to contact your service provider to obtain the PUK2.

- 6. Enter the new PIN2, then tap Enter.
- 7. Confirm the new PIN2, then tap Enter.



NOTE: Make a note of the new PIN2.

Customising the Start menu

You can select the applications to be displayed in the Start menu. Applications that are not selected can be accessed by tapping Start > Programs from the Today screen.

To customise the Start menu:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Settings.
- 2. On the Personal tab, tap Menus.
- 3. Tick the checkboxes for the required applications, then tap ok.




NOTE: Only seven items can be selected for the Start menu.

Owner Information

Owner Information enables you to enter contact information so that your phone can be easily returned if it is lost.

To enter or edit Owner Information:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap Start > Settings.
- 2. On the **Personal** tab, tap **Owner Information**.
- 3. Enter your contact information on the **Identification** tab. You can also make any important notes on the **Notes** tab. On the **Options** tab, you can select whether to display information from the **Identification** and **Notes** tabs when your Toshiba phone is switched on.



4. Tap **ok** when you have finished.

Phone settings

Setting ring tones

To set a ring tone:


- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. On the Personal tab, tap Phone.
- 3. On the **Phone** tab, select the following:
 - In the Ring type: field, select the required type of tone. This can be ringing, vibration, a combination of ringing and vibration, or none.
 - In the **Ring tone:** field, select the required tone.
- **TIP:** Tap the Play icon to listen to a sample of the selected ring tone.
- 4. Tap **ok**.
- TIP: You can also set the ring tone from the Sounds & Notifications settings.
- TIP: You can also use custom sounds as ring tones. You can copy the files to your phone from your PC using ActiveSync, or download them from the Internet.


Setting keypad tones

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. On the Personal tab, tap Phone.
- On the **Phone** tab, select the required type of keypad tones in the **Keypad**: field. To have no keypad tones, select **Off**.

Call Barring

Call Barring enables you to block certain categories of incoming and outgoing calls (for example, international calls).





To set up Call Barring:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap Start > Settings.
- 2. On the Personal tab, tap Phone.
- 3. Tap the Services tab.
- In the list of services, tap Call Barring, then tap the Get Settings... button. The settings will then be read from the network.
- 5. When the current settings are displayed, select the settings required for blocking incoming and

- outgoing calls.
- 6. Tap **ok**.
- Enter the call barring password, then tap ok. The settings are sent to the network.

Caller ID

Caller ID allows selected call recipients to view your name and phone number information on their phone when you call them.

To configure Caller ID:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. On the Personal tab, tap Phone.
- 3. Tap the Services tab.
- In the list of services, tap Caller ID, then tap the Get Settings... button. The settings will then be read from the network.
- In the Provide my caller ID to: field, select one of the following:
 - Everyone your information will be displayed to everyone that you call.
 - **No one** your information will be hidden from everyone that you call.
 - Only to contacts your information will only be displayed when you call a number stored in Contacts.
- 6. Tap **ok**. The settings are sent to the network.

Call Forwarding


Call Forwarding enables you to forward incoming calls to another number.



NOTE: Call Forwarding is only available if it is supported by your service provider.

To set up Call Forwarding:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Settings.
- 2. On the Personal tab, tap Phone.
- 3. Tap the Services tab.
- In the list of services, tap Call Forwarding, then tap the Get Settings... button. The settings will then be read from the network.
- When the current settings are displayed, select the conditions during which you would like to forward incoming calls. Enter the phone number(s) for forwarded calls.



6. Tap **ok**. The settings are sent to the network.

Call Waiting

Call Waiting notifies you of incoming calls when you are already in a call. You will then have the option to answer or ignore the second call.



NOTE: Call Waiting is only available if it is supported by your service provider.

To enable Call Waiting:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. On the Personal tab, tap Phone.
- 3. Tap the Services tab.
- In the list of services, tap Call Waiting, then tap the Get Settings... button. The settings will then be read from the network.
- When the current settings are displayed, select whether or not you wish to be notified of waiting calls.
- 6. Tap ok. The settings are sent to the network.

Viewing and editing text messages service centre

To view and edit the text messages service centre:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. On the Personal tab, tap Phone.
- 3. Tap the Services tab.

- In the list of services, tap Voice Mail and Text Messages, then tap the Get Settings... button. The settings will then be read from the network.
- Edit the number in the Text messages service center: field if required. This number can be obtained from your service provider.
- 6. Tap **ok**. The settings are sent to the network.

Setting up voice mail

To set up voice mail:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. On the Personal tab, tap Phone.
- 3. Tap the Services tab.
- In the list of services, tap Voice Mail and Text Messages, then tap the Get Settings... button. The settings will then be read from the network.
- Enter your voice mail number in the Voice Mail: field. This can be obtained from your service provider.
- 6. Tap ok. The settings are sent to the network.

Fixed Dialing

Fixed Dialing restricts the numbers that you can call from your Toshiba phone. When Fixed Dialing is activated, you can only call predefined numbers or area codes. These numbers are stored in a list that you can set up and edit using your Toshiba phone.



NOTE: Fixed Dialing is only available if it is supported by your service provider.



NOTE: Before setting up Fixed Dialing, you will need to obtain PIN2 from your service provider.

To set up Fixed Dialing:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. On the Personal tab, tap Phone.
- 3. Tap the Services tab.
- In the list of services, tap Fixed Dialing, then tap the Get Settings... button. The settings will then be read from the network.
- 5. Tick the Enable fixed dialing checkbox.
- 6. Tap Menu > Add.
- In the Add or change the number pattern: field, enter the phone number or area code you want to be able to call.
- 8. Tap Done.

- 9. If required, add more numbers, then tap **Done**.
- 10. Enter PIN2, then tap **Done**. The settings are sent to the network.

Network settings

You can select whether your Toshiba phone will automatically search and select a network to connect to, or whether you will be prompted to select one manually.

You can set up and update a list of **Preferred networks** that your phone will attempt to connect to if your current network becomes unavailable. This setting will also apply if you roam out of the service area of your current network.

You can also search for new networks and select a network to connect to.

For details of setting the network mode, refer to **Network Mode** in **Connectivity**.

Setting the network selection type

To set the network selection type:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Settings.
- 2. On the **Personal** tab, tap **Phone**.
- 3. Tap the **Network** tab.

- In the Network selection field, select Automatic or Manual as required.
- If you select **Automatic**, your Toshiba phone will register to the default network. This network is defined by your SIM card.

Preferred networks

To set up or update the list of **Preferred networks**:

Video Phone settings

Call Barring

Call Barring on the **Video Phone** tab enables you to block certain categories of incoming and outgoing video calls.



NOTE: Call Barring is only available if it is supported by your service provider.



NOTE: Before setting up **Call Barring**, you will need to obtain your call barring password from your service provider.

To set up Call Barring for video calls:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. On the Personal tab, tap Phone.
- 3. Tap the **Video Phone** tab.
- 4. In the list of services, tap **Call Barring**, then tap the **Get Settings...** button. The settings will then be read from the network.
- When the current settings are displayed, select the settings required for blocking incoming and outgoing video calls.
- 6. Tap **ok**.
- 7. Enter the call barring password, then tap **ok**. The settings are sent to the network.

Call Forwarding

Call Forwarding on the **Video Phone** tab enables you to forward incoming video calls to another number.



NOTE: Call Forwarding is only available if it is supported by your service provider.

To set up Call Forwarding for video calls:

- 1. From the Today screen, tap Start > Settings.
- 2. On the Personal tab, tap Phone.
- 3. Tap the Video Phone tab.
- In the list of services, tap Call Forwarding, then tap the Get Settings... button. The settings will then be read from the network.
- When the current settings are displayed, select the conditions during which you would like to forward incoming video calls. Enter the phone number(s) for forwarded calls.
- 6. Tap **ok**. The settings are sent to the network.

Call Waiting

Call Waiting on the **Video Phone** tab notifies you of incoming video calls when you are already in a call. You will then have the option to answer or ignore the second call.



NOTE: Call Waiting is only available if it is supported by your service provider.

To enable Call Waiting for video calls:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. On the Personal tab, tap Phone.
- 3. Tap the Video Phone tab.
- In the list of services, tap Call Waiting, then tap the Get Settings... button. The settings will then be read from the network.
- When the current settings are displayed, select whether or not you wish to be notified of waiting video calls.
- 6. Tap ok. The settings are sent to the network.

Sounds & Notifications

You can set a different sound for different events. The sound can be set to something different for each type of event.



TIP: You can also use custom sounds. You can copy the files to your phone from your PC using ActiveSync, or download them from the Internet.

Setting the sound and notification for an event

To set the sound and notification for an event:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. On the Personal tab, tap Sounds & Notifications.
- 3. On the **Sounds** tab, select the required settings from the following:
 - · Tick the Events checkbox to enable sounds for events such as warnings.
 - Tick the **Programs** checkbox to enable sounds for applications.
 - Select whether to enable sounds for Screen taps or pressing Hardware buttons. You can also specify the level of the sounds.

- 4. On the **Notifications** tab, select the specific sound required for each event, and the way in which you want to be notified of the event. Available items are dependent on the event selected.
- TIP: Tap the Play icon to listen to a sample of the selected sound.
- 5. Tap ok when you have finished.

TIP: Disabling sounds and flashing lights for events will help to conserve battery power.

Customising the Today screen

You can customise the Today screen using:

- A theme. This is a pre-packaged file that includes a picture, colour scheme and new layout. It will be a *.hme or *.cab file type.
- · A picture file. This will only replace the background of the Today screen.

Setting the theme for the Today screen

To set the theme for the **Today** screen:

Setting information displayed on the Today screen

To set the information displayed on the Today screen:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Settings.
- 2. On the **Personal** tab, tap **Today**.
- 3. Tap the Items tab.
- 4. Tick the checkboxes for the items that you want to display on the Today screen. You can also set the order of the items on the screen, and set extra options for some items such as Tasks.
- 5. Tap **ok** when you have finished.

About

The **About** setting enables you to view technical information about your Toshiba phone, including the operating system and memory of the phone. This information is useful when installing new applications on your Toshiba phone.

You can also change the name of your Toshiba phone as it is displayed to other devices (for example, when using Bluetooth).

Viewing phone information

To view the phone information:

- On the **Time** tab, in the **Home** section, you can set the time zone, current time and date for when you are at home.

NOTE: These settings are only lost if you reset your Toshiba phone. Your settings are saved if you power off the phone, or if the battery is fully discharged.

- 3. Tap Clock & Alarms.
- Tap the Alarms tab.
- Untick the checkbox beside the alarm you want to cancel.
- 6. Tap **ok**.

Setting the clock display

To set the clock to be displayed on the title bar at all times:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- Tap the System tab.
- 3. Tap Clock & Alarms.
- 4. Tap the More tab.
- Tick the Display the clock on the title bar in all programs checkbox.
- 6. Tap **ok**.

Customer Feedback

Customer Feedback sends anonymous information to Microsoft for use in helping improve Windows Mobile software.



NOTE: You will not incur any data charges to send this information.

To enable/disable Customer Feedback:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap the System tab.
- 3. Tap Customer Feedback.
- Tap Send Feedback or Don't Send Feedback as required.
- 5. Tap **ok**.

Encryption

This feature allows you to secure sensitive information on your storage card. The data will only be accessible when the card is installed in your Toshiba phone. If the card is lost or stolen, the information remains secure. The contents of the storage card cannot be accessed by anyone else because they are encrypted.

To encrypt the contents of your storage card:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap the System tab.
- 3. Tap Encryption.
- 4. Tick the Encrypt files when placed on a storage card. checkbox.
- Tap **ok**.



WARNING: Anyone in possession of the encryption key can decrypt and access information stored on the storage card.

Error Reporting

Error Reporting sends data from your Toshiba phone to Microsoft technical support groups. The data is used to diagnose program errors for devices running Windows Mobile software.

If a program error occurs, **Error Reporting** starts automatically. The information Microsoft receives is used by programming groups at Microsoft. The data is used for quality control and will not be used for tracking individual users, installations or for any marketing purpose.



NOTE: You will not incur any data charges to send this information.

To enable/disable Error Reporting:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap the System tab.
- 3. Tap Error Reporting.
- Tap Enable error reporting or Disable error reporting as required.
- 5. Tap **ok**.

External GPS

To set up External GPS:

- From the Today screen, tap Start > Settings.
- 2. Tap the **System** tab.
- 3. Tap External GPS.
- 4. On the **Programs** tab, select the port that your Toshiba phone will use to obtain GPS data.
- On the **Hardware** tab, select the hardware port to which your GPS device is connected. You can also set the baud rate.
- On the Access tab, tick the Manage GPS automatically (recommended) checkbox if required. You are strongly advised to use this feature as it will enable Windows Mobile to manage access to your GPS device, and allows multiple programs to obtain GPS data simultaneously.
- 7. Tap **ok** when you have finished.

Headset Volume Limiter

Headset Volume Limiter enables you to set a maximum headset volume to suit your needs.

To set the maximum headset volume:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap the System tab.
- 3. Tap Headset Volume Limiter.
- Slide the marker to change the maximum volume. The dB level for the current setting is displayed. To reset the maximum volume to the default value, tap Reset to Default.
- 5. Tap **ok**.

Memory management settings

To ensure optimum performance of your Toshiba phone, it is necessary to maintain sufficient memory.

Checking memory

To check the memory available on your Toshiba phone:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap the System tab.
- 3. Tap Memory.
- 4. On the **Main** tab, you can view the details of **Storage** and **Program** memory.
- 5. On the **Storage Card** tab, you can view the memory available on the storage card.
- Tap Find large files using storage memory. to search for specific files.

Managed Programs

Managed Programs lists applications that have been installed remotely by your company system administrator. You can view details of these applications.

Power settings

The **Power** settings enable you to check the battery status and configure settings to prolong battery power.

To view and change **Power** settings:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap the **System** tab.
- 3. Tap Power.
- On the **Battery** tab, the remaining battery power is displayed.
- On the Advanced tab, you can select when to turn off the phone when using battery or external power, and specify the time delay.
- 6. Tap \mathbf{ok} when you have finished.

Regional Settings

Regional Settings enables you to specify the styles in which numbers, currency, time and date are displayed.

To change Regional Settings:

- 1. From the **Today** screen, tap **Start** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap the **System** tab.
- 3. Tap Regional Settings.
- On the Region tab, select your region in the drop-down list. Changing this setting automatically updates the styles in which numbers, currency, time and date are displayed to the defaults for the selected region.
- 5. Change specific items on the other tabs if required.
- 6. Tap ok when you have finished.

Remove Programs

Remove Programs enables you to delete applications that you have installed.



NOTE: Programs that were pre-installed on your Toshiba phone cannot be removed in this way.

To remove a program:

- 3. Tap Remove Programs.

Customising the TOSHIBA User Interface

On the **Now Screen** tab, tick the **Show the Now Screen when device wakes up** checkbox to display the **Now Screen** each time your Toshiba phone wakes up from standby mode.

- 3. Tap Task Manager.
- 4. Tap the application to end, then tap End Task. To end all running applications, tap Menu > End All Tasks, then tap Yes to confirm the action.

5. Tap **Menu** > **Exit** when you have finished.

Windows Update

You can use **Windows Update** to update the Microsoft applications on your Toshiba phone.

Setting up Windows Update
