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SETTING UP

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For your safety

This equipment has been designed and manufactured to meet international safety standards but, like any electrical equipment, care must be taken if you are to obtain the best results and safety is to be assured. So, please read the points below for your own safety. They are of a general nature, intended to help you with all your electronic consumer products and some points may not apply to the goods you have just purchased.

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Air Circulation...

Leave at least 10cm clearance around the television to allow adequate ventilation. This will prevent the TV from overheating and consequential possible damage to the TV. Dusty places should also be avoided.

Heat Damage...

Damage may occur if you leave the TV in direct sunlight or near a heater. Avoid places subject to extremely high temperatures or humidity, or locations where the temperature is likely to fall below 5°C (41°F).

Mains Supply...

The mains supply required for this equipment is 230v AC 50Hz. Never connect to a DC supply or any other power source. DO ensure that the TV is not standing on the mains lead. DO NOT cut off the mains plug from this equipment, this incorporates a special Radio Interference Filter, the removal of which will impair its performance. In the UK, the fuse fitted in this plug is 13A, and is approved by ASTA or BSI to *BS1362*. It should only be replaced by a correctly rated and approved type and the fuse cover must be refitted. IF IN DOUBT PLEASE CONSULT A COMPETENT ELECTRICIAN.

Do...

DO read the operating instructions before you attempt to use the equipment.

DO ensure that all electrical connections (including the mains plug, extension leads and inter-connections between pieces of equipment) are properly made and in accordance with the manufacturers' instructions. Switch off and withdraw the mains plug before making or changing connections.

DO consult your dealer if you are ever in doubt about the installation, operation or safety of your equipment.

DO be careful with glass panels or doors on equipment.

Do not...

DON'T remove any fixed cover as this may expose dangerous voltages.

DONT obstruct the ventilation of the equipment, for example, with curtains or soft furnishings. Overheating will cause damage and shorten the life of the equipment.

DON'T allow electrical equipment to be exposed to rain or moisture.

DON'T place hot objects such as candles or nightlights on, or close to, the equipment. High temperatures can melt plastic and lead to fires.

DONT use makeshift stands and NEVER fix legs with wood screws. To ensure complete safety, always fit the manufacturer's approved stand or legs with the fixings provided according to the instructions.

DON'T listen to headphones at high volume, as such use can permanently damage your hearing.

DONT leave equipment switched on when it is unattended, unless it is specifically stated that it is designed for unattended operation or has a standby mode. Switch off using the switch on the equipment and make sure your family know how to do this. Special arrangements may need to be made for infirm or handicapped people.


DON'T continue to operate the equipment if you are in any doubt about it working normally, or it is damaged in any way – switch off, withdraw the mains plug and consult your dealer.

ABOVE ALL – NEVER let anyone, especially children, push anything into holes, slots or any other openings in the case – this could result in a fatal electric shock.


NEVER guess or take chances with electrical equipment of any kind – it is better to be safe than sorry.

The batteries... and the effective range of the remote..




WARNING: do not attempt to <u>share</u> external speakers with your Hi-Fi as serious damage may occur.

Connecting the speakers


In order to enjoy the full benefits of Surround Sound it is necessary to connect two rear surround speakers and two front extension speakers.

When connecting external Hi-Fi speakers, they must be 8 ohm, 10W minimum. The front speakers should be positioned either side of the TV and will deliver the left and right sound. The internal speakers will then deliver the centre channel required to enjoy Dolby Digital.




Connecting and turning on your new TV

To conserve energy it is best to turn your TV off and not to leave it in Standby, unless the timer has been set.



...and switching your new TV on...



On the front of the TV...

If the red power-on light is unlit, press the POWER button on the front of the TV to switch the set on and then press a number button on the remote control to see the screen.

...and with the remote control:

Press the Standby Button : This allows you to put the set

into standby mode when leaving the TV unattended for short periods of time.

To return to TV mode press the

() button, or any of the



numbered buttons on the remote control. The picture may take a few seconds to appear.



Choosing the language and system, Auto tune

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
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The on-screen menus can be viewed in different languages and you will need to choose the system necessary for where you live.



To select your language...

Press the MENU button, and use either the or button to select the FEATURE MENU from the top bar.



Now repeatedly press the v button until Language is highlighted in the FEATURE MENU options.

Press the \langle or \rangle button to view the language options available. As you view each language, the wording on the menus will automatically change for you.

When you have got the right language, press the **EXIT** button. All the displays will now appear in that language.

To select your system... Continental Europe only

Before running Auto tune it is important that you select your desired System as described here. Should you also wish to tune to alternative Systems this must be done manually, after using Auto tune. See page 9.



Press the **MENU** button on the remote control, and then either the \langle or \rangle button to select the **SET UP** option from the top bar.



Now press the \checkmark button to highlight *System* from the **SET UP** menu options and then the \langle or \rangle button repeatedly to select *your System*:

ou can now run Auto tune..

First of all turn on your Set Top Box and tune to a main channel. Also turn on the video recorder and set it to Standby – this will enable your television to identify and allocate the necessary programme positions.



Press the \checkmark button to highlight **Auto tune** while you are in the **SET UP** menu. Press the > button.

You will be informed that all previous settings will be lost.




Press the **ENTER** button on the remote control to begin the search for available stations.

Manually tuning your TV

As an alternative to **Auto tune**, you can tune-in your Toshiba television manually using **Manual tune**. For example: if you have used **Auto tune** but wish to tune-in a station on another **SYSTEM** (see page 7) or, you are unable to connect the TV to your video with a Scart lead.

Swapping programme positions and programme skip

After Auto tune if you want to swap the position of certain programmes you can. Program swap is an easy way of storing each channel on the programme position of your choice. Program skip stops the viewing of certain channels.

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
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With the \checkmark or \land buttons again, move through the list to your preferred position




Press ENTER again. You will see that the programme positions have now been swapped.

Skipping programmes...

To prevent certain programmes from being viewed, for example, a certain film by your children whilst your are out for the evening, you can skip the programme position and take the remote control with you. The television will still function as normal using the controls on the front of it, but the set will not show the skipped programme position.



Using the remote, select the channel to be skipped.



Select the SET UP menu, and then Programme skip.



Press > to turn **Programme skip ON**.

Then press the **EXIT** button. Change to an un-skipped channel before switching off the TV.

It is necessary to repeat from step 1 for all the channels to be skipped. The skipped channels cannot now be selected by the $\mathbf{\nabla} \mathbf{P} \mathbf{A}$ buttons or by the controls on the front of the TV but can still be accessed by the number buttons on the remote control.

> An * on the screen indicates a skipped programme position.



To turn **Programme skip OFF**, repeat the procedure on the chosen channel.

> ...Remember... each channel has to be INDIVIDUALLY selected and set with Programme skip ON or OFF.

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

Selecting and changing programme position..

Enter the desired programme position number using the numbered buttons on the remote control.

For programme positions *below* 10, press the -/-- button to select — on the screen then enter the desired programme position number.

For programme positions above 9, press the -/-- button to select — — then enter the desired two digit programme position number.

You can also change the programme position by using the $\mathbf{\nabla} \mathbf{P} \mathbf{\Delta}$ button or the $\mathbf{\nabla}$ or $\mathbf{\wedge}$ buttons.

The programme position will be displayed on the screen with the Stereo/Mono indicator, described on p21.





WSS – Widescreen Signalling

When this TV receives a true Widescreen picture and WSS is ON, it will automatically be displayed in Widescreen format, irrespective of the TV's previous setting.







Dolby Pro Logic


Dolby Pro Logic – available on many TV broadcasts in addition to video tapes. Uses a combination of 4 speaker channels – front-left, centre, front-right and two rear. If external front speakers are not connected, these channels will be delivered through the speakers in the TV.



SPECIAL SOUND FEATURES

Digital Surround Processor

Please note: Hall, Theatre, Disco, and Stadium effects are only available on a stereo signal. **Pseudo** surround works on both mono and stereo signals. All of the Digital surround modes are adjustable, the method of adjustment being described below, is the same for all the Digital Surround effects.



Surround Sound: Off

Uses only the front left and right speakers. This mode can be selected for watching news broadcasts and the like which require no special sound features.



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Teletext – setting up

Selecting pages

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There are two **Modes:** Auto will display **FASTEXT**, if available. List will display your four favourite pages. In either mode, as an alternative to the coloured buttons you can access a page by entering a 3-digit number, using the buttons on the remote control.

Auto

Press the **TEXT TV** button to access teletext.

In **Auto** mode, if **FASTEXT**, *is* available, you will see four coloured titles at the base of the screen.

To access one of the four given subjects, press the relevant coloured button on the remote control, corresponding to the title.

For further information on your particular text system(s), see the broadcast teletext index page or, consult your local Toshiba dealer.

List

Press the **TEXT TV** button to select teletext.

To programme the set to hold your 4 favourite pages in memory. Select the *LIST* function by pressing the **GREEN** button.

Enter the first page number (*in purple on screen*) then press the **GREEN** button. Repeat for each of the desired 4 pages.

To view these 4 selected pages press the **RED** button for **ROTATE**. An arrow head will point to the page number of the *next* favourite page that will be displayed on pressing the **RED** button again.

On programme positions 0-9 you can pre-programme an **INITIAL** page. Select the **INITIAL** function by pressing the **YELLOW** button. P*** will appear in the top left corner of the screen. Enter the required 3 digit page number. As you key in the desired **INITIAL** page, for example page 220, the numbers will replace the ***.



Stereo and Bilingual transmissions.

If stereo or dual language broadcasts are transmitted the lights on the front of the TV will be lit. The word Stereo or Dual will appear on the screen, disappearing after a few seconds. The display will reappear each time you change programme positions, provided that the broadcast is in stereo. If the broadcast is not in stereo the word Mono will appear.



...and Bilingual

Bilingual transmissions are rare. If they are transmitted the word **Dual** will display.

Choose the required programme number and if the word **Dual** does appear press the Ω I/II button to select between Dual 1, Dual 2 or Mono.

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AV connections and input selection

Defining your INPUT and OUTPUT sockets so that your television recognises connected equipment.



Most video recorders and Set Top Box receivers send a signal through the Scart lead to switch the TV to the correct *Input* socket. Alternatively you may select it with the external source selection button - on the remote control. Press - repeatedly until you see the picture on your equipment.

Digital Audio in the display indicated that the external source has been set as a digital audio input, see below. An **S** in the display, e.g. **EXT2S**, indicates the input is set for an S-Video signal.

Input Selection


SELECTING THE DIGITAL AUDIO SIGNAL

This set is provided with 2 digital audio inputs – DA-1 and DA-2 – so that, for example, a DVD player and a games console can stay permanently connected.

Having connected the video signal from your DVD to, say, COMPONENT VIDEO INPUT (**EXT4**) and from your games console to Scart 3 (**EXT3**) you will now need to connect the audio cables to the inputs on the back of the set, then match the two up.



If you have connected to **DA-1**, select **AV connection** from the **FEATURE MENU** and press the button to highlight **Digital Input 1** then with the or buttons, select the appropriate video input, for example **EXT4** for the DVD player.

Then for the 2nd connection, press the \checkmark button to highlight **Digital Input 2** then with the $\langle \text{ or } \rangle$ buttons, select the appropriate video input, for example, **EXT3** for the games console.



This feature allows you to specify the type of signal going into **Scarts 2** or **3** on the back of the television and the sockets on the front (Input 3). **AV** is the most common and comes from standard video recorders and Set Top Boxes whereas **S-VIDEO** signals are less common. (Please refer to the manufacturer's specification.)



From the FEATURE MENU select AV connection and with the \langle or \rangle button select either AV or S-VIDEO as the required *input* for EXT2 and EXT3.





Selecting the **OUTPUT** signal for Scart 2

This feature enables you to select the source to *output* from Scart 2. e.g. If you connect a stereo Set Top Box to Scart 1 and a stereo video recorder to Scart 2, and select **EXT1** as the **EXT2** output (i.e. you will output the signal received through Scart 1 directly out to Scart 2), you will be able to record the stereo Set Top Box transmission in stereo.

Again, from the **FEATURE MENU** select **AV** connection.



Using the \langle or \rangle buttons change the **EXT2** output option to either **Monitor**, **TV**, **EXT1** or **EXT3**. **Monitor** = The picture on screen **TV** = The last television programme selection. **EXT1** or **3** = the picture from equipment connected to Scart 1 or Scart 3.

Back connections

CONNECTING OTHER EQUIPMENT



On the back of the TV are 3 Scart sockets, and a selection of phono sockets, all of which will enable you to connect a variety of equipment.

DA-1 and DA-2 enable the input of Digital Audio signals.

The phono sockets alongside the COMPONENT VIDEO INPUT sockets will accept L and R audio signals.

In addition there is a fixed external audio output which enables the connection to a suitable Hi-Fi unit. If connecting S-VIDEO equipment, set the **INPUT** for **EXT2** or **EXT3** accordingly. See page 22.

Before connecting any external equipment, turn off all main power switches.

If your TV automatically switches over to monitor the connected equipment you can return to normal TV simply by pressing the desired programme position button.

To recall the connected equipment, press the button repeatedly to select between EXT1, EXT2, EXT3 and EXT4.

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
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Front connections and controls

You can connect a wide variety of external equipment via the sockets located behind the flap on the front of the TV. Press the centre of the flap to open it.




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The on-screen menus










Why is there no Dolby Digital?

... If you are unable to obtain full Dolby Digital check: The Rear Speaker (in Surround set up) says **YES** and the equipment is either connected by a phono or optical link as well as through a Scart socket or COMPONENT VIDEO INPUT. Also check that the correct external source is selected i.e. EXT3 or EXT4 (in AV connections).

If you connect external front left and right speakers, you must set the External speaker switch to EXT to get the full benefit of Dolby Digital - if the switch is left on INT the external speakers will not function. Turn the television off before changing the position of the switch.



Cleaning the screen and cabinet...

After turning off the power, clean the screen and cabinet with a soft, dry cloth. We recommend that you do not use any proprietary polishes or solvents on the screen or cabinet as this may cause damage.

Disposal...

When the set reaches the end of its useful life please dispose of it in accordance with Local Government Regulations or at a recycling centre.
