



23) Always operate this equipment from a 120 VAC, 60 Hz power source only. (



24) Always make sure the antenna system is properly grounded to provide adequate protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges (see Section 810 of the National Electric Code).





Care

For better performance and safer operation of your TOSHIBA TV, follow these recommendations and precautions:

- 26) Always sit approximately 10–25 feet away from the TV and as directly in front of it as possible. The picture can appear dull if you sit too far to the left or right of the TV, or if sunlight or room lights reflect on the screen. Turn the TV off to check for reflections on the screen, and then remove the source of reflections while viewing the TV.
- 27) Always unplug the TV before cleaning. Never use liquid or aerosol cleaners.






- 29) [*This item applies to projection TVs only*.] If the air temperature rises suddenly (for example, when the TV is first delivered), condensation may form on the lenses. This can make the picture appear distorted or the color appear faded. If this happens, turn off the TV for 6 to 7 hours to allow the condensation to evaporate.
- 30) For added protection of your TV from lightning and power surges, always unplug the power cord and disconnect the antenna from the TV if you leave the TV unattended or unused for long periods of time.
- 31) During normal use, the TV may make occasional snapping or popping sounds. This is normal, especially when the unit is being turned on or off. If these sounds become frequent or continuous, unplug the power cord and contact a Toshiba Authorized Service Center.
- 32) Possible Adverse Effects on TV Picture Tube: If a fixed (non-moving) pattern remains on the TV screen for long periods of time, the image can become permanently engrained in the picture tube and cause subtle but permanent ghost images. This type of damage is NOT COVERED BY YOUR WARRANTY. Never leave your TV on for long periods of time while it is displaying the following formats or images:
 - **Fixed Images**, such as PIP/POP windows, stock tickers, video game patterns, TV station logos, and websites.
 - **Special Formats** that do not use the entire screen. For example, viewing letterbox style (16:9) media on a normal (4:3) display (gray bars at top and bottom of screen); or viewing normal style (4:3) media on a widescreen (16:9) display (gray bars on left and right sides of screen).


Exploring your new TV


- You can operate your TV using the buttons on the front panel or remote control.
- The front (VIDEO-3) and back panels provide inputs for connecting other equipment to your TV.

Selecting a location for your TV

- Place the TV either on the floor or on the TV stand listed in the "Specifications" section.
- Place the TV in a location where light does not directly hit the screen.
- Place the TV far enough from the walls to allow proper ventilation. Inadequate ventilation may cause overheating, which can damage the TV.

NOTE: Before installing your TV, please read the important safety information on pages 2–4.

Connecting your TV


Note: Cables are not supplied with your TV.

- **Coaxial cable** is the cable that comes in from your antenna, cable TV service, or cable converter box. Coaxial cable uses "F" connectors.
- Standard stereo A/V cables usually come in sets of three, and are typically color-coded according to use: yellow for video, red for stereo right audio, and white for stereo left (or mono) audio. Your TV's standard A/V inputs are color-coded in the same manner as the cables.
- S-Video cable is for use with video equipment that has S-Video connectors.
- Component video cables come in sets of three (typically color-coded red, green, and blue), and are for use with video equipment that has component video connectors. Your TV's ColorStream[®] (component video) inputs are color-coded in the same manner as the cables.

NOTE REGARDING PICTURE QUALITY

When connecting video equipment to your Toshiba TV:

- For GOOD picture quality: Use a standard yellow video cable.
- For BETTER picture quality: If your equipment has S-video connectors, use an S-video cable *instead of* a standard yellow video cable. (You still must connect the standard red and white audio cables for full system connection, but *do not connect a standard yellow video cable at the same time* or the picture performance will be unacceptable.)
- For BEST picture quality: If your equipment has component video connectors, use component video cables *instead of* a standard yellow video cable or S-video cable. (You still must connect the standard red and white audio cables for full system connection.)



CAUTION: Do not plug in any power cords until you have finished connecting all equipment.

Connecting a VCR

With this connection you can:

- · watch TV channels and videotapes
- record one channel while watching the same or another channel


You will need:

- one coaxial cable
- one pair of audio cables (one single audio cable for a mono VCR)
- one video cable (For video cable type, see "Note Regarding Picture Quality," above.)

Note:

If you have a mono VCR, connect L/Mono to VCR Audio OUT using only one audio cable.

The VIDEO-2 inputs on the back of the TV (and the VIDEO-3 inputs on the front of the TV) can be used for connecting a second (and third) piece of video equipment, such as a DVD player or camcorder (see "Note Regarding Picture Quality" above).



Connecting a cable converter box

With this connection you can:


· watch basic and premium cable channels

Tune the TV to channel 3 or 4 (whichever channel is vacant in your area), and then use the converter box to change channels.

Note:

When you use a converter box with your TV, you may not be able to use the remote control to program certain features (for example, blocking channels).

Connecting a satellite receiver and a VCR

With this connection you can:

- watch videotapes
- watch satellite and TV channels
- record one TV channel while watching the same or another channel


You will need:

- one coaxial cable
- two pairs of audio cables (one single and one pair of audio cables for a mono VCR)
- two video cables (For video cable type, see "Note Regarding Picture Quality" on page 7.)

Note:

To watch satellite programs, the TV must select VIDEO-1 (see page 16).

To watch VCR programs, the TV must select VIDEO-2 (see page 16).



Connecting your TV

Connecting a DVD player with ColorStream® (component video) and a VCR

Your TV has ColorStream® (component video) inputs. Connecting your TV to a component video-compatible DVD player (such as a Toshiba DVD player with ColorStream®) can greatly enhance picture quality and performance.

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With this connection you can:


- watch TV channels, DVDs, and videotapes
- · record TV channels
- record one channel while watching the same or another channel

You will need:

- · one coaxial cable
- two pairs of audio cables (one single and one pair of audio cables for a mono VCR)
- two video cables (If your DVD player has component video, use one standard video or S-video cable from the VCR and one set of component video cables from the DVD player. See "Note Regarding Picture Quality" on page 7.)

Note:

To watch the VCR, the TV must select VIDEO 1 (see page 16). To watch the DVD player, the TV must select VIDEO 2 (see page 16).

Connecting two VCRs

With this connection you can:

- watch TV channels and videotapes
- record TV channels
- · record one TV channel while watching the same or another channel
- record (dub/edit) from one VCR to the other VCR while watching a videotape

You will need:


- · one coaxial cable
- two pairs of audio cables (two single audio cables for mono VCRs)
- two video cables (For video cable type, see "Note Regarding Picture Quality" on page 7.)

Note:

Do not connect the same VCR to both the OUT and the IN connections on the TV at the same time.

To record (dub/edit) from VCR 1 to VCR 2, the TV must select VIDEO 1 (see page 16), and VCR 2 must select LINE IN.

Preparing the remote control for use

Your TV remote control can operate your TV and most VCRs and cable TV converters, even if they are different brands.

If you have a Toshiba VCR or cable TV converter:

Your TV remote control is already programmed to operate it. See page 12.


If you have a non-Toshiba VCR or cable TV converter:

You must first program your remote control so it will operate the other equipment. See pages 12–14.

Installing the remote control batteries

1 Slide the battery cover off the back of the remote control.

2 Install two "AA" size batteries, making sure to match the + and – signs on the batteries to the signs on the battery compartment.

3 Slide the battery cover back onto the remote control until the lock snaps.

Caution:

Dispose of batteries in a designated disposal area. Do not throw batteries into a fire.

Do not mix battery types or combine used batteries with new ones.

Remove dead batteries immediately to prevent battery acid from leaking into the battery compartment.

If you do not intend to use the remote control for a long time, remove the batteries.


Note:

Location of controls on TV and remote control





Using the remote control to operate a VCR or cable TV converter

- If you have a non-Toshiba VCR or cable TV converter, you must first program the remote control to recognize your VCR or converter brand (see pages 13–14).
- To use your TV remote control to operate a VCR, set the **TV/CABLE/VCR** switch to VCR. The shaded buttons in the picture below will then operate the VCR instead of the TV.
- To use your TV remote control to operate a cable TV converter, set the **TV/CABLE/VCR** switch to CABLE. The shaded buttons shown in the picture below will then operate the converter instead of the TV.



ntroduction

Programming the remote control to operate a non-Toshiba VCR or cable TV converter

Your Toshiba TV remote control is preprogrammed to operate Toshiba brand VCRs and cable TV converters. To program your TV remote control to operate a non-Toshiba VCR or a cable TV converter, follow these steps:



1 In the code table on page 14, find the code for your brand of VCR or cable TV converter.

If more than one code is listed, try each one separately until you find one that works.

- 2 Set the **TV/CABLE/VCR** switch to VCR (for a VCR), or CABLE (for a cable TV converter).
- **3** While holding down **RECALL**, press the **Channel Number** buttons to enter the 3-digit code for your brand of VCR or converter.
- 4 To test the code, turn the VCR or converter on, point the remote control at it, and press **POWER**.
 - -If the correct code was entered, the VCR or converter will turn off.
 - -If the VCR or converter does not respond, repeat steps 1–4 using another code.
 - -If the VCR or converter does not respond to a different code, you will need to use the remote control that came with your VCR or converter.
- 5 Set the **TV/CABLE/VCR** switch to TV to control the TV.

Note:

You must reprogram the remote control every time the batteries are changed. Some newer VCRs respond to either of two codes. These VCRs have a switch labeled "VCR1/VCR2." If your VCR has this kind of switch and does not respond to the codes for your VCR brand, set the switch to the other position ("VCR1" or "VCR2") and reprogram the remote control.

Programming the remote control to operate a non-Toshiba VCR or cable TV converter (cont.)

In some rare cases, you may not be able to operate your non-Toshiba equipment with your TV remote control. Your other equipment may use a code that is not recognized by the TV remote control. If this happens, you will need to use the remote control that came with your other equipment.




Menu system (general instructions)

After installing the batteries and programming the remote control, you will need to set some preferences on your TV using the menu system.


You can access the menus using the buttons on the TV front panel or remote control. Following are general instructions for using the menu system:


- 1. Repeatedly press **MENU** to select a menu (Picture, Audio, Setup, Preference, or Closed Caption, as shown in the menu system overview, below).
- Press V or ▲ to select the function you want to adjust in the menu (the V/▲ buttons function as CHANNEL V/▲ buttons when no menu is on-screen).
- 3. Press ◀ or ► to adjust the selected function (the ◀/► buttons function as VOLUME ◀/► buttons when no menu is on-screen).
- When you make a menu selection, your changes occur immediately. You do not have to press MENU or EXIT to save your changes. Note: The TV front panel does not have an EXIT button.
- 5. On-screen menus close automatically if no adjustments are made within 15 seconds. To close an on-screen menu instantly, press **EXIT** on the remote control.

Changing the on-screen display language

Choose from three different languages (English, French, or Spanish) for the on-screen display of menus and messages.

To select an on-screen display language:

- 1. Press **MENU**.
- 2. Press \triangleleft or \triangleright until the SET UP menu appears.
- 3. Press \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown to highlight LANGUAGE.
- 4. Press \blacktriangleleft or \blacktriangleright to highlight your desired language.



Selecting the signal source

Use the **TV/VIDEO** button on the remote control or TV to select the signal source connected to your TV.

To change the signal source:

Repeatedly press **TV/VIDEO** to select either TV, VIDEO 1, VIDEO 2, or VIDEO 3. The selected signal source is highlighted on-screen.

To verify the signal source:

Press RECALL.

Programming channels into the TV's memory

When you press **CHANNEL • v** on the TV or remote control, the TV stops only on the channels stored in the TV's memory.

Note: To tune the TV to a channel not programmed into the memory, use the **CHANNEL NUMBERS** on the remote control.

Follow the steps below and on the next page to program channels into the TV's memory.


Programming channels automatically


Your TV can automatically detect all active channels in your area and store them in the TV's memory. After the channels are stored automatically, you can manually add or erase individual channels (see page 17).

To program channels automatically:

- 1. Press MENU.
- 2. Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to highlight the SET UP menu.
- 3. Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark to highlight TV/CABLE.


TV Front Panel





Setting up vour TV

- Press ◄ or ► to highlight TV (if you use an antenna) or CABLE (if you use cable).
- 5. Press ▼ to highlight CH PROGRAM.




- 6. Press *◄* or *▶* to start automatic channel programming ("CH PROGRAM" displays on-screen). The TV automatically cycles through every TV or cable channel (depending on which you selected), and stores all active channels in the TV's memory.
- 7. When automatic channel programming is complete, the message "CH Programming Completed" appears.
- 8. Press **CHANNEL** \blacktriangle to view the programmed channels.

Adding and erasing channels manually

After you have automatically programmed the channels into the TV's memory, you can manually add and erase individual channels.

To add a channel to or erase a channel from the TV's memory:

- Tune the TV to the channel you want to add or erase. If you are adding a channel, you will need to use the CHANNEL NUMBERS to select the channel.
- 2. Press MENU.
- 3. Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to highlight the SET UP menu.
- 4. Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark to highlight ADD/ERASE.



- 5. Press *◄* or *▶* to highlight ADD or ERASE, whichever function you want to perform.
- 6. Press **MENU**.
- Repeat steps 1–6 for other channels you want to add or erase, or press EXIT to return to normal TV viewing.


Changing channels

To change to the next programmed channel:

Press **CHANNEL** ▲▼.

To change to a specific channel (programmed or unprogrammed):

Press the **CHANNEL NUMBERS** (0–9 and 100). **Note:** For channels 100 and higher, press the 100 button, and then the next two channel numbers (for example, to select channel 100, press 100, 0, 0; to select channel 125, press 100, 2, 5).





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Adjusting the channel settings

Switching between two channels

You can switch between two channels without entering an actual channel number each time.

To switch between two channels:

- 1. Select the first channel you want to view.
- Select a second channel using the CHANNEL NUMBERS (0–9 and 100).

3. Press **CH RTN** (channel return). The previous channel will display. Every time you press **CH RTN**, the TV will switch back and forth between the last two channels you tuned the TV to.

Programming your favorite channels

The Favorite Channel feature allows you to use the **FAV CH** \checkmark buttons on the remote control to cycle through your favorite channels, skipping over channels you do not normally watch. You can program a maximum of 12 favorite channels.

Note: You can still use **CHANNEL** $\blacktriangle \lor$ to cycle through all the channels you previously programmed into the TV's memory (see "Programming channels in to the TV's memory" on page 16).


To program your favorite channels:

- 1. Tune the TV to a channel you want to program as a favorite channel.
- 2. Press MENU.
- 3. Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to highlight the SET UP menu.


Before you can block programs or channels, you must select a personal identification number (PIN) code. Your PIN code allows you to access the V-Chip Control menu, and prevents others from changing the rating and blocking limits you set.

To select your PIN code and access the V-Chip Control menu:

- 1. Press **MENU**.







Blocking programs by ratings

The Motion Picture Association of America (MPAA) uses a rating system to qualify motion picture content. Television broadcasters employ a similar rating system to qualify the content of television programs. The MPAA, Youth TV, and TV ratings work with the V-Chip feature to allow you to block access to programs that exceed the rating limits you set.

Note:

Press **RECALL** to see the rating of the program you are viewing. Not all programs are rated, however. To block programs or movies that are not rated, see "Blocking unrated movies and programs" on page 23.





Blocking channels

You can block a maximum of four TV channels and four cable channels. Blocked channels cannot be viewed, regardless of their programs' ratings. If you try to tune the TV to a blocked channel, the nearest unblocked channel will display.

To block a channel:



To unblock all blocked channels:

Adjusting the picture quality

You can adjust the picture's contrast, brightness, sharpness, color, and tint. Your picture quality adjustments are stored automatically in the TV's memory. You can keep these settings or choose preset options in the PREFERENCE menu (see "Selecting the color temperature" below, and "Adjusting the picture preference" on the next page.)

To adjust the picture quality:

- 1. Press MENU.
- 2. Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to highlight the PICTURE menu.







The off timer automatically turns off the TV after a set amount of time. **To set the off timer:**




Using the closed caption feature

The Closed Caption feature has two options:

- Captions—An on-screen display of the dialogue, narration, and sound effects of programs and videos that are closed-captioned (usually identified in your local TV listing as "CC").
- Text—An on-screen display of information not related to the program, such as weather or stock data (if available in your viewing area).

To view captions or text:


- 1. Tune the TV to the desired program.
- 2. Press **MENU**, and then press *◄* or *▶* to highlight the CLOSED CAPTION menu.
- 3. Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark to highlight CC.




- 4. Press *◄* or *▶* to select the desired Closed Caption mode, as follows:
 - To view captions, select C1, C2, C3, or C4 (C1 displays translation of the primary language in your area). **Note:** If the program or video you selected is not closed-captioned, no captions will display on-screen.



• To view text, select T1, T2, T3, or T4. **Note:** If text is not available in your viewing area, a black rectangle may appear on-screen. If this happens, set the Closed Caption feature to OFF.



• To turn the Closed Caption feature off, highlight OFF in the Closed Caption menu.



Note:

A closed caption signal may not display in the following situations:

- when a videotape has been dubbed
- when the signal reception is weak
- when the signal reception is non-standard

Adjusting the sound

Muting the sound

Press **MUTE** to temporarily turn off the sound. While the sound is off, the screen displays the word "MUTE" in the lower right corner. To restore the sound, press **MUTE** or **VOL** $\triangleleft \triangleright$.

When you press **MUTE**, the Closed Caption feature is automatically activated. To deactivate captions and restore normal sound, press **MUTE** again. This feature works only when the Closed Caption mode is set to OFF. For more information about closed caption settings, see "Using the closed captioned feature" on page 27.

Selecting stereo/SAP broadcasts


The multi-channel TV sound (MTS) feature provides high-fidelity stereo sound. MTS also can transmit a second audio program (SAP) containing a second language or other audio information.

Note: The MTS feature is not available in VIDEO mode.

When the TV receives a stereo or SAP broadcast, the word "STEREO" or "SAP" displays on-screen every time you turn the TV on, change the channel, or press **RECALL**.

To listen to stereo sound:


- 1. Press MENU.
- 2. Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to highlight the AUDIO menu.
- 3. Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark to highlight MTS.
- Press
 If the stereo sound is noisy, select MONO to reduce the noise.



Note: In general, if you leave the TV in stereo (STR) mode, the TV will automatically output the type of sound being broadcast (stereo or mono).

To listen to a second audio program (SAP):

- 1. Press MENU.
- 2. Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to highlight the AUDIO menu.
- 3. Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark to highlight MTS.
- 4. Press *◄* or *▶* to highlight SAP. The TV speakers will output the second audio program (if available), instead of normal audio.




Adjusting the sound quality

You can change the sound quality of your TV by adjusting the bass, treble, and balance.

To adjust the sound quality:

- 1. Press MENU.
- 2. Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to highlight the AUDIO menu.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight the quality you want to adjust (BASS, TREBLE, or BALANCE).
- 4. Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to adjust the level:
 - < makes the sound quality weaker or increases the balance in the right channel, depending on the item selected.
 - The makes the sound quality stronger or increases the balance in the left channel, depending on the item selected.




Using the surround sound feature

The surround sound feature expands the audio listening field wider and deeper to create exceptional sound quality from the TV speakers. This feature uses stereo signals from a TV broadcast or video input.

To turn surround sound on:

- 1. Press **MENU**.
- 2. Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to highlight the AUDIO menu.
- 3. If you have not already done so, select STEREO mode (press ▲ or ▼ to highlight MTS, and then press ◄ or ▶ to highlight STR).
- 4. Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark to highlight SURROUND.
- 5. Press \triangleleft or \triangleright to highlight ON.




To turn surround sound off:

Highlight OFF in step 5 above.

Note: In general, if you leave the surround sound feature ON, the TV will automatically output the type of sound being broadcast (surround stereo or mono).

Note:

To reset the audio adjustments (bass, treble, and balance) to the factory settings, select RESET in the PICTURE menu (see note on page 25).





If the power is cut off while you are viewing the TV, the Last Mode Memory feature automatically turns on the TV when the power is resupplied.

Appendix

Troubleshooting

Before calling service personnel, please check the following chart for a possible cause of the problem you are experiencing. A minor adjustment on your part may eliminate the problem and restore your TV reception.

Problem	Checks and Adjustments		
TV will not turn on	Make sure the power cord is plugged in, and then press POWER.The remote control batteries may be dead. Replace the batteries.		
No picture, no sound	• Check the antenna/cable connections.		
No sound, picture OK	 The sound may be muted. Press VOLUME ►. The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel. Make sure the MTS feature is set correctly. 		
Poor sound, picture OK	 The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel. An appliance near the TV may be causing interference. Move or turn off the appliance. 		
Poor picture, sound OK	 Check the antenna/cable connections. The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel. An appliance near the TV may be causing interference. Move or turn off the appliance. Adjust the Picture menu. 		
Poor reception of broadcast channels	The station may have broadcast difficulties. Try another channel.Check the antenna connections.If using a VCR, make sure the TV/VCR button is set correctly.		
No UHF, VHF OK	• Make sure the TV/CABLE function is set to the mode that corresponds to the signal source type (cable company or outside antenna).
