Care

For better performance and safer operation of your TOSHIBA TV, follow these recommendations and precautions:

- 27) Always sit approximately 10–25 feet away from the TV and as directly in front of it as possible. The picture can appear dull if you sit too far to the left or right of the TV, or if sunlight or room lights reflect on the screen. Turn the TV off to check for reflections on the screen, and then remove the source of reflections while viewing the TV.
- 28) Always unplug the TV before cleaning. Never use liquid or aerosol cleaners.



WARNING: RISK OF ELECTRIC SHOCK!

Never spill liquids or push objects of any kind into the TV cabinet slots.


- 30) [*This item applies to projection TVs only*.] If the air temperature rises suddenly (for example, when the TV is first delivered), condensation may form on the lenses. This can make the picture appear distorted or the color appear faded. If this happens, turn off the TV for 6 to 7 hours to allow the condensation to evaporate.
- 31) For added protection of your TV from lightning and power surges, always unplug the power cord and disconnect the antenna from the TV if you leave the TV unattended or unused for long periods of time.
- 32) During normal use, the TV may make occasional snapping or popping sounds. This is normal, especially when the unit is being turned on or off. If these sounds become frequent or continuous, unplug the power cord and contact a Toshiba Authorized Service Center.
- 33) Possible Adverse Effects on TV Picture Tube: If a fixed (non-moving) pattern remains on the TV screen for long periods of time, the image can become permanently engrained in the picture tube and cause subtle but permanent ghost images. This type of damage is NOT COVERED BY YOUR WARRANTY. Never leave your TV on for long periods of time while it is displaying the following formats or images:
 - Fixed Images, such as PIP/POP windows, stock tickers, video game patterns, TV station logos, and websites.
 - **Special Formats** that do not use the entire screen. For example, viewing letterbox style (16:9) media on a normal (4:3) display (gray bars at top and bottom of screen); or viewing normal style (4:3) media on a widescreen (16:9) display (gray bars on left and right sides of screen).

Introduction

Welcome to Toshiba

Congratulations! You have purchased one of the finest color TVs on the market. The goal of this manual is to guide you through setting up and operating your Toshiba TV as quickly as possible.

This manual applies to model 34HFX83. Before you start reading, check your model number on the back of the TV.

Instructions in this manual are based on using the remote control. You can also use the controls on the TV if they have the same name as those on the remote control.

Please read all the safety and operating instructions carefully, and keep the manual for future reference.

Exploring your new TV

You can operate your TV using the buttons on the front panel or the remote control. The back panel and front panel (behind the door) provide all the terminal connections you will need to connect other equipment to your TV. See "Connecting your TV" on page 7.


Note regarding Quick Connect Guide

The **Quick Connect Guide** automatically appears on-screen the first time the TV is turned on. This feature provides on-screen

instructions to guide you through initial setup of your TV. To stop the **Quick Connect Guide**, either press EXIT or turn off

Note: Cables are not supplied with your TV.

- **Coaxial cable** is the cable that comes in from your antenna, cable TV service, or cable converter box. Coaxial cable uses "F" connectors.
- Standard A/V (audio/video) cables usually come in sets of three, and are typically color-coded according to use: yellow for video, red for stereo right audio, and white for stereo left (or mono) audio. On your TV's back panel, the standard A/V inputs are color-coded in the same manner as the cables.
- S-Video cable is for use with video equipment with S-Video output.
- **Component video cables** come in sets of three (color-coded red, green and blue), and are for use with video equipment with component video outputs. ColorStream[®] is Toshiba's brand of component video.
- **DVI-D digital single-link cable** is for use with video equipment with DVI-D output (see page 13).

NOTE REGARDING PICTURE QUALITY

When connecting video equipment to your Toshiba TV:


- For GOOD picture quality: Use a standard yellow video cable.
- For BETTER picture quality: If your equipment has an S-video input, use an S-video cable *instead of* a standard yellow video cable. (You still must connect the standard red and white audio cables for full system connection, but *do not connect the standard yellow video cable at the same time*, or the picture performance will be unacceptable.)
- For BEST picture quality: If your equipment has component video (or DVI) inputs, use either component video cables (or a DVI cable) *instead* of a standard video or S-video cable. (You still must connect the standard red and white audio cables for full system connection, but *do not connect* the standard yellow video cable or an S-Video cable at the same time.)


Connecting a VCR

This connection allows you to watch local channels and video programs, play or record on the VCR while watching TV, and record from one channel while watching another channel.

You will need:

- two coaxial cables
- one set of standard A/V cables
 - From Cable Box or Antenna





CAUTION:

Do not plug in any power cords until you have finished connecting all equipment.

Note:

If you have a mono VCR, connect L/Mono to VCR Audio OUT using only one audio cable.

If you have a VCR with S-video, use an S-video cable (plus audio cables) instead of the standard video cable for better picture performance.

Do not connect a standard video cable and an S-video cable to VIDEO 1 (or VIDEO 2) at the same time or the picture performance will be unacceptable.

Connecting a cable box


This connection allows you to watch basic and premium cable channels. To watch basic cable and use the TV's features, select ANT-1. To view premium channels, select ANT-2, tune the TV to channel 3 or 4

premium channels, select ANT-2, tune the TV to channel 3 or 4 (whichever channel is vacant in your area), and use the cable box to change channels.

You will need:

• three coaxial cables

Connecting a cable box and VCR


This connection allows you to watch and record basic and premium cable channels, watch videotapes, and record one channel while watching another channel. To watch basic cable and use the TV's features, select ANT-1.

To view premium channels or record with the VCR, select ANT-2, tune the TV to channel 3 or 4 (whichever channel is vacant in your area), and use the cable box to change channels.

You will need:

- four coaxial cables
- one set of standard A/V cables

Note:

When you use a cable box with your TV, the remote control will not operate some features, such as programming your favorite channels, labeling channels, and locking channels.

Note:

If you have a mono VCR, connect L/Mono to VCR Audio OUT using only one audio cable.

If you have a VCR with S-video, use an S-video cable (plus audio cables) instead of a standard video cable. Do not connect a standard video cable and an S-video cable to VIDEO 1 (or VIDEO 2) at the same time or the picture performance will be unacceptable.

When you use a converter box with your TV, the remote control will not operate some features, such as programming your favorite channels, labeling channels, and locking channels.



Setting up vour TV

This connection allows you to watch DVD/satellite, VCR, and TV programs, and record one TV channel while watching another channel.

You will need:

- two coaxial cables (three if satellite receiver is used)
- one set of standard A/V cables
- one pair of audio cables
- one S-video cable (between the TV and DVD player/satellite receiver)



Note:

For the highest possible picture quality from a DVD player/satellite receiver without component video (or DVI/HDCP), use an S-video cable.

If your DVD player or satellite receiver has component video, see page 10.

If your DVD player or satellite receiver has DVI/HDCP, see page 13.

Do not connect an S-video cable and a standard video cable at the same time or the picture performance will be unacceptable.

Do not connect the DVD player/satellite receiver and VCR to the same set of A/V inputs on the TV. (See the illustration which shows the DVD player/satellite receiver connected to VIDEO 1 on the TV, and the VCR connected to VIDEO 2 on the TV.)

Connecting a DVD player (with component video) and a VCR

This connection allows you to watch DVD, VCR, and TV programs, and record TV programs.

Your TV has ColorStream[®] (component video) inputs. Connecting your TV to a DVD player with component video inputs (such as a Toshiba DVD player with ColorStream[®]) can greatly enhance picture quality and realism.

- To record one TV program while watching another TV program, tune the VCR to the channel to record, and tune the TV to the channel to watch.
- To record a TV program while watching a DVD, tune the VCR to the channel to record, and select ColorStream HD-1 on the TV (see "Selecting the antenna input" on page 23).

You will need:

- two coaxial cables
- one set of standard A/V cables
- one pair of audio cables
- one set of component video cables


Note:

For the highest possible picture quality, use component video cables (or a DVI-D singlelink cable) between the TV and DVD player. You can connect component video cables to either set of ColorStream jacks on the TV (HD-1 or HD-2).

The ColorStream HD-1 and HD-2 jacks can be used with Progressive (480p, 720p) and Interlaced (480i, 1080i) scan systems. A 1080i signal will provide the best picture performance.

If your DVD player does not have component video (or DVI/HDCP), use the S-video connections plus the standard audio connections instead. Do not connect both S-Video and standard video cables to VIDEO 1 (or VIDEO 2) at the same time or the picture performance will be unacceptable. See page 9.

For DVI/HDCP connections, see page 13.



DVD Player with component video

This connection allows you to watch DTV (digital TV), VCR, and TV programs, and record DTV and TV programs.

Your TV has ColorStream (component video) inputs. Connecting your TV to a DTV receiver with component video inputs can greatly enhance picture quality and realism.

- To record and watch a DTV program, select LINE IN on the VCR, and select ColorStream HD-2 (or VIDEO 1 for a non-ColorStream connection) on the TV (see "Selecting the antenna input" on page 23).
- To record a TV program while watching a DTV program, tune the VCR to the channel to record, and select ColorStream HD-2 on the TV.
- To record and watch the same TV program, tune the VCR to the channel to record, and select VIDEO 1 on the TV.
- To record one TV program while watching another TV program, tune the VCR to the channel to record, and tune the TV to the channel to watch.

You will need:

- three coaxial cables
- two sets of standard A/V cables
- one pair of audio cables
- one set of component video cables


Note:

For the highest possible picture quality, use component video cables (or a DVI-D singlelink cable) between the TV and DTV receiver. You can connect component video cables to either set of ColorStream jacks on the TV (HD-1 or HD-2).

The ColorStream HD-1 and HD-2 jacks can be used with Progressive (480p, 720p) and Interlaced (480i, 1080i) scan systems. A 1080i signal will provide the best picture performance.

If your DTV receiver does not have component video (or DVI/HDCP video), use the S-video and standard audio connections instead. Do not connect both an S-video and a standard video cable to VIDEO 1 (or VIDEO 2) at the same time or the picture performance will be unacceptable ...



Connecting two VCRs

This connection allows you to record (dub/edit) from one VCR to another VCR while watching a videotape. You can also record from one TV channel while watching another TV channel.

You will need:

- two coaxial cables
- two sets of standard A/V cables




Connecting a camcorder

This connection allows you to watch video materials recorded on a camcorder.

You will need:

• one set of standard A/V cables

Note:

If VCR 1 has S-video, you can use an S-video cable instead of the standard video cable for better picture performance. Do not connect both a standard video cable and an S-video cable to VIDEO 1 (or VIDEO 2) at the same time, or the picture performance will be unacceptable.

Do not connect the same VCR to the output and input jacks on the TV at the same time.

To dub or edit, VCR 2 must select Line IN, and the TV must select VIDEO 1 (see "Selecting the antenna input" on page 23).

The unauthorized recording, use, distribution, or revision of television programs, videotapes, DVDs, and other materials is prohibited under the Copyright Laws of the United States and other countries, and may subject you to civil and criminal liability.

- * The Video OUT jack does not output the POP picture.
- ** The Audio OUT jacks can output the sound of either the Main or POP picture (see "Selecting the Audio OUT sound" on page 56).

Note:

If your camcorder has S-video, You can use an S-video cable instead of the standard video cable for better picture performance. Do not connect both a standard video cable and an S-video cable at the same time, or the picture performance will be unacceptable.

Connecting a device to the DVI/HDCP input

The DVI/HDCP¹ input on your TV is designed to accept HDCP program material in digital form from EIA/CEA-861–compliant² consumer electronic devices, such as a set-top box or DVD player equipped with a DVI-D digital single-link output connection.³


The DVI/HDCP input is designed for best performance with 1080i high-definition video signals. The DVI/HDCP input also will accept and display 480p, 480i and 720p picture signals.

Note: This TV is not intended for connection to and should not be used with a PC (personal computer).

You will need:

- one coaxial cable
- one pair of standard audio cables
- one DVI-D digital single-link cable **Note:** For proper operation, the DVI-D cable length should not exceed 3m (9.8 ft). The recommended length is 2m (6.6 ft).

DVI/HDCP device



Note:

- ¹ DVI/HDCP = Digital Visual Interface/ High-bandwidth Digital Content Protection.
- ² EIA/CEA-861 compliance covers the transmission of uncompressed digital video with high-bandwidth digital content protection, which is being standardized for reception of high-definition video signals.
- ³ Consult your consumer electronics dealer for availability.

Caution:

To ensure that the DVI/HDCP device is reset properly, it is recommended that you follow these procedures:

- When turning on your electronic components, **turn on the TV first**, and then the DVI/HDCP device.
- When turning off your electronic components, turn off the DVI/HDCP device first, and then the TV.

Connecting an audio system

This connection allows you to use external speakers with an external audio amplifier to adjust the sound level.

To control the audio, turn on the TV and the stereo amplifier, and turn off the built-in speakers (see "Turning off the built-in speakers" on page 56).

You will need:

• one pair of audio cables

Note:

To hear sound when using an external audio amplifier, the volume of both the TV and the amplifier must be set to a moderate listening level.


Connecting an A/V receiver

This connection allows you to use an audio/video (A/V) receiver to enhance your TV's sound.

If you have a sound system with Dolby Pro Logic surround sound, you can add to the realism of the sound by using the TV's internal speakers as center channel speakers.

You will need:

- one set of standard A/V cables
- one single standard audio cable for the audio center channel



Note:


Refer to the instructions provided with your A/V receiver for details about your surround sound system.

When the Audio Center Channel ON/OFF switch is in the ON position, the TV speakers will function only as center channel speakers.

Adjust the volume for the center channel speakers using the center level control on the A/V receiver.

To use the TV speakers as normal speakers, set the Audio Center Channel ON/OFF switch to the OFF position.



Using the remote control

Preparing the remote control for use

Your Toshiba TV remote control has one dedicated TV mode and five universal modes: VCR, Cable/SAT, DVD, Audio1, and Audio2. The target devices and default devices being programmed for each mode are as follows:




Installing the remote control batteries

To install the batteries:

1. Slide the battery cover off the back of the remote control.



2. Install two "AA" size alkaline batteries. Match the + and – signs on the batteries to the signs on the battery compartment.




3. Slide the battery cover on to the remote control until the lock snaps.

Note:

Your TV's remote control may not operate certain features on your VCR, cable TV converter, or other electronic device.

Refer to the owner's manuals for your other devices to determine their available features. If your TV's remote control does not operate a specific feature on a device, use the remote control that came with the device.



Caution:

- Dispose of batteries in a designated disposal area.Do not throw batteries into a fire.
- Do not mix battery types or combine used batteries with new ones.
- If the remote control does not operate correctly, or if the operating range becomes reduced, replace both batteries with new ones.
- If the batteries are dead or if you will not use the remote control for a long time, remove the batteries to prevent battery acid from leaking into the battery compartment.


- 2. Press MODE until the Mode indicator of the device (CABLE/ SAT, VCR, DVD, AUDIO1, AUDIO2) lights up.
- 3. While holding down the RECALL button, press the Channel Number buttons to enter the four-digit code of your brand of device. If a valid code is entered, the mode indicator will blink twice. If an invalid code is entered, the mode indicator will blink one long blink.
- 4. Point the remote control at the device and press POWER to test the code.

If the device turns on, you have entered the correct code.

If the device does not respond to the remote control, you may have entered the wrong code. Repeat steps 3 and 4 using another code.

Note: In addition to POWER, confirm that all necessary keys on the TV remote control operate your device. If some keys are not operational, repeat the device code setup using another code (if other codes are listed for your device). If, ^oafter trying all listed codes, the necessary keys do not operate your device, use the device's original remote control.

5. Press MODE to select the TV mode to control the TV.



Note:

- Every time you replace the batteries, you must reprogram the remote control.
- Some newer VCRs are capable of working on either of two remote codes. These VCRs have a switch labeled "VCR1/VCR2." If your VCR has this kind of switch and does not respond to any of the codes for your VCR brand, set the switch to the other position (VCR1 or VCR2) and reprogram the remote control
- Although the remote control for your new TV includes codes for many devices, it may not include codes for some or all of the features on certain devices you want to control. If you are unable to program the

Searching and sampling the code of a device (8500)

If you do not know the device code for a particular target unit, you can cycle the remote control through the available codes for that device mode and sample the functions to find the code that properly operates the target device. The keys available to be sampled, provided they are applicable to that mode, are POWER, 1, VOL \blacktriangle , CH \bigstar , and PLAY. Invalid keys will be ignored while in program mode.

To cycle through each available device code and sample its functions:

- 1. Press MODE to select the mode you want to set up.
- 2. While holding down the RECALL button, press 8 5 0 0. The remote control will enter program mode.
- 3. Point the remote control at the target device and press POWER (or other function buttons that are available to be sampled).
- If the device responds to the remote control: Press RECALL to store the device code. The mode indicator will blink twice and the remote control will exit the program mode.
 - If the device does not respond to the remote control: Press ▲, and then press POWER. Repeat this step until the device responds to the remote control, and then press RECALL.

Using the volume lock feature (8000)

For the TV, CABLE/SAT, VCR, and DVD modes, the volume controls (VOL ▲▼ and MUTE) can be programmed (locked) to the selected device mode. This feature does not apply to the AUDIO1/2 modes.

For example, to lock the volume controls to always jump to the CABLE/SAT mode:

- 1. Repeatedly press MODE to select the CABLE/SAT mode.
- 2. While holding down the RECALL button, press 8 0 0 0.
- 3. Press VOL ▲.

The Mode indicator will blink two times (locked).

To reset the volume controls to the original device code:

- 1. While holding down the RECALL button, press 8 0 0 0.
- 2. Press VOL ▼.

Operational feature reset (8900)


This feature clears all setup features not related to "Device code set up" and resets the Volume Lock to "TV."

To reset the features:

While holding down the RECALL button, press 8 - 9 - 0 - 0. The Mode indicator will blink two times, and then pause and blink two more times.

Note:

When a search cycle is completed, the mode indicator will blink three times. The remote control will begin to cycle through the available codes again. If no key is pressed within 10 seconds while programming, the remote control will exit the program mode and return to the previous code.

Remote Control

Learning about the remote control

The buttons used for operating the TV only are described here. For a complete list of the remote control's functions, see the "Remote Control functional key chart" on pages 16–17.

POWER turns the TV on and off

SLEEP sets the TV to turn off at a specific time (page 50)

LIGHT The first press of the LIGHT button lights the keypad and turns on the Illumination mode. 

- 2. Press \blacktriangleleft or \triangleright to select menu.
- 3. Press \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown select an item.
- 4. Press ◀ or ► to select or adjust a setting.




- Press ENTER to activate the function settings in the menus.
- The main menu display will disappear automatically if you do not make a selection within 15 seconds. If you want to close all the on-screen displays instantly, press EXIT.

Note regarding **Quick Connect Guide**

The Quick Connect Guide automatically appears on-screen the first time the TV is turned on. This feature provides on-screen instructions to guide you through initial setup of your TV.



Programming channels automatically


Your TV can automatically detect all active channels in your area and store them in the channel memory. After the channels are stored automatically, you can manually add or erase individual channels (see "Adding and erasing channels manually," below).

To program channels automatically:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ► until the SET UP menu appears.
- 2. Press \blacktriangle or \triangledown until the TV/CABLE is highlighted.
- 3. Press ◀ or ► to highlight either TV or CABLE, depending on which you use. If you use an antenna, highlight TV; if you use cable, highlight CABLE.



4. Press ▼ to select CH PROGRAM.



5. Press *◄* or *▶* to start channel programming. The TV will automatically cycle through all the TV or Cable channels (depending on which you selected), and store all active channels in the channel memory.

While the TV is cycling through the channels, the message "Programming Now—Please Wait" appears.

- 6. When channel programming is complete, the message "Completed" appears.
- 7. Press Channel \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown to view the programmed channels.

Adding and erasing channels manually

After you have programmed the channels automatically, you can manually add or erase specific channels.

To add or erase channels:



Switching between two channels using Channel Return

The Channel Return feature allows you to switch between two channels without entering an actual channel number each time.

Selecting the cinema mode

Setting the TV None Rating to ON may block the broadcast of emergency information. The menu will display the note, "Enabling this option may block emergency messages" to warn you of this possibility.

Unlocking programs temporarily

If you try to watch a TV program that exceeds the rating limits you set, the TV enters program lock mode. After 4 seconds, the TV starts the auto favorite channel search function (see page 37). You can either unlock the program temporarily or select a non-locked program to watch.



To temporarily unlock the program:

- 1. Press MUTE.
- 2. Press the Number buttons (0-9) to enter your 4-digit PIN code.



3. Press ENTER.

If the correct code is entered, the program lock mode is released and the normal picture appears.

All locking is disabled until the TV is turned off, and will be enabled when the TV is turned on again.


Locking channels

With the CH LOCK feature, you can lock specific channels. You will not be able to tune locked channels with the Channel $\blacktriangle \forall$ buttons or Channel Number buttons unless you clear the setting.


You can lock a maximum of nine channels.

To lock channels:

- 1. From the LOCKS menu, select CH LOCK.
- Press ◀ or ► to display the CH LOCK menu. CH INPUT will be highlighted.
- 3. Press the Channel Number buttons to enter the channel you want to lock.
- 4. Press ENTER.



5. Repeat steps 3 and 4 for other channels.






To select each item:


- 1. From the LOCKS menu, select CH LOCK.
- 2. Press \blacktriangleleft or \blacktriangleright to display the CH LOCK menu.

4. Repeat step 3 for other channels.

To unlock all locked channels at once:

Locking video inputs

With the VIDEO LOCK feature, you can lock out the input sources (VIDEO 1, VIDEO 2, VIDEO 3, ColorStream HD1, ColorStream HD2, DVI/HDCP) and channels 3 and 4.


You will not be able to select the input sources with the TV/VIDEO button or Channel buttons unless you clear the setting.

To set up the video lock:

- 1. From the LOCKS menu, select VIDEO LOCK.
- Press ◀ or ▶ to highlight the level of video locking you want (Video, Video+, or Off), as follows:
 - VIDEO : Locks VIDEO 1, VIDEO 2, VIDEO 3, ColorStream HD1, HD2, and DVI/HDCP.
 - VIDEO+ : Locks VIDEO 1, VIDEO 2, VIDEO 3, ColorStream, HD1/HD2, DVI/HDCP, and channels 3 and 4. This option should be used if you use the antenna terminal to play a video tape.

Note: Make sure the POP is not on channel 3 or 4.

OFF : Unlocks all video input sources.






Using the game timer

You can use the game timer to set a time limit for playing a video game (30-120 minutes). When the game timer is activated, the TV enters VIDEO LOCK mode and locks out the input source for the video game device.

To set the game timer:

- 1. From the LOCKS menu, select GAME TIMER.
- 2. Press \blacktriangleleft or \triangleright to select the length of time until the video mode is blocked from among 30, 60, 90 and 120 minutes. When the number is highlighted, the timer will start countdown.



To cancel the timer:

Select OFF in step 2 above.

Using the front panel lock feature

You can lock the front panel buttons to prevent your settings from being changed accidentally (by children, for example). When the front panel lock is in ON, all control buttons on the TV front panel (except POWER) do not operate.

To lock the front panel:

- 1. From the LOCKS menu, select FRONT PANEL LOCK.
- 2. Press \blacktriangleleft or \blacktriangleright to highlight ON.




If a button on the front panel is pressed, the message "Not Available" appears.

To unlock the front panel:

Highlight OFF in step 2 above, or press and hold the VOL button on the TV for about 10 seconds until the message "Front Panel Lock: Off" appears on the screen.







To select the picture mode:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the PICTURE menu appears.


Adjusting the picture quality

You can adjust the picture quality to your personal preferences, including the contrast, brightness, color, tint, sharpness, flesh tone, noise reduction and color temperature.

To adjust the picture quality:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the PICTURE menu appears.

- 3. Press \blacktriangleleft or \triangleright to adjust the level.





The PICTURE qualities you adjusted can be saved in the TV's memory with the SAVE NEW PREFERENCE feature (see page 45). You can keep these settings or choose factory set options, as described under "Selecting the picture mode" above.

Note:

If you select one of the factory-set picture modes (SPORTS, STANDARDS, or MOVIE) and then change a picture quality setting (for example, increase the contrast), the picture mode automatically changes to PREFERENCE in the Picture menu.

To save your new picture quality settings, you must select SAVE NEW PREFERENCE (see page 45) before closing the Picture menu or the TV will return to the previous picture mode.







Saving your new preferences



Using the flesh tone feature

This feature displays natural flesh tones by correcting the tint.




Using the CableClear[™] DNR feature

This feature allows you to reduce visible interference in your TV picture. This is useful when receiving a broadcast with a weak signal (especially a Cable channel) or playing back a video cassette or disc damaged by repeated use.

To turn on CableClearTM DNR:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the PICTURE menu appears.
- 2. Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark to highlight CableClear DNR.
- 3. Press \blacktriangleleft or \blacktriangleright to highlight AUTO.



Selecting the Scan Velocity Modulation (SVM)

The SVM feature enhances picture contrast and sharpness. This feature has three modes: HIGH, LOW, and OFF.

To select the SVM feature:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the PICTURE menu appears.
- 2. Press \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown to highlight "SVM".
- 3. Press ◀ or ► to highlight the mode you prefer (HIGH, LOW, or OFF).



Selecting the color temperature


Using the closed caption feature

The closed caption feature has two options:

- Captions—An on-screen display of the dialogue, narration, and sound effects of TV programs and videos that are closed captioned (usually labeled "CC").
- Text—An on-screen display of information not related to the current program, such as weather or stock data (when provided by individual stations).

To view captions or text:

- 1. Tune the TV to the desired program.
- 2. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ► to display CUSTOM menu.
- 3. Press \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown to highlight CC.




- Press ◀ or ► to highlight the desired closed caption mode, as follows:
- To view captions, highlight C1, C2, C3, or C4 (C1 displays translation in primary language in your area).

Note: If the program or video you selected is not closed captioned, no captions will display on the screen.




• To view text, highlight T1, T2, T3, or T4.

Note: If text is not available in your area, a black rectangle may appear on your screen. If this happens, turn the Closed Caption feature OFF.

Adjusting the sound

Muting the sound

Press MUTE to temporarily reduce (1/2 MUTE) or turn off (MUTE) the sound. While the sound is muted, the screen will display "1/2 MUTE" or "MUTE" in the lower right corner. Every time you press MUTE, the mute mode will change in the following order.

 \rightarrow Normal \rightarrow 1/2 MUTE \rightarrow MUTE -

When you select "MUTE" mode, the closed caption feature is automatically activated (if the closed caption mode is set to OFF). To deactivate this feature, deactivate MUTE. See "Using the closed caption feature" on page 49 for more information.

Selecting stereo/SAP broadcasts

The multi-channel TV sound (MTS) feature allows you to output high-fidelity stereo sound from your TV's internal speakers. MTS also can transmit a second audio program (SAP) containing a second language, music, or other audio information (when provided by individual stations).

When the TV receives a stereo or SAP broadcast, the word STEREO or SAP appears on-screen every time the TV is turned on, the channel is changed, or the RECALL button is pressed.

The MTS feature is not available when the TV is in VIDEO mode.

To listen to stereo sound:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the AUDIO menu appears.
- 2. Press \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown to highlight MTS.
- 3. Press \blacktriangleleft or \blacktriangleright to highlight STEREO.





You can leave your TV in STEREO mode because it will automatically output the type of sound being broadcast (stereo or monaural). The word "STEREO" or "SAP" displays in yellow in the menu when the TV receives the signal.

If the stereo sound is noisy, select MONO to reduce the noise.

To listen to SAP (if available):

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the AUDIO menu appears.
- 2. Press \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown to highlight MTS.
- 3. Press ◀ or ► to highlight SAP. You will hear the station's second audio program (if available) from the speakers, while viewing the original program's picture (see note at right).





Note :

A second audio program (SAP) can be heard only on those TV stations that offer it.

For example, a station might broadcast music (or another language) as a second audio program. If you have SAP on, you will see the current program on the screen but hear music (or the other language) instead of the program's normal audio.

If you have SAP on and the station you are watching is not broadcasting a second audio program, the station's normal audio will be output.

Occasionally no sound is output in SAP mode at all. If this happens, set the MTS feature to STEREO mode.



The Dolby* Virtual sound feature allows you to enjoy virtual surround sound from the TV's speakers.

• If you connect a device (such as a game console, DVD player, or DTV receiver) with analog audio output to standard (analog) audio terminals on the TV, and the input source is encoded with Dolby Surround DOLODENT Sound or Dolby Digital DOLODENT the Dolby Virtual feature functions as Virtual Dolby Surround MINTAL (VDS). VDS simulates Dolby Surround sound from the TV's speakers.


Using the StableSound® feature

When the signal source is changed, the StableSound[®] feature limits the highest volume level to prevent extreme changes in volume (for example, to prevent the sudden increase in volume that often happens when a TV program switches to a commercial).

To turn on the StableSound[®] feature:


