



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# SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

### SOME DOS AND DON'TS ON THE SAFE USE OF EQUIPMENT

This equipment has been designed and manufactured to meet international safety standards but, like any electrical equipment, care must be taken if you are to obtain the best results and safety is to be assured.

#### \*\*\*\*\*

DO read the operating instructions before you attempt to use the equipment.

**DO** ensure that all electrical connections (including the mains plug, extension leads and inter- connections between the pieces of equipment) are properly made and in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions. Switch off and withdraw the mains plug before making or changing connections.

**DO** consult your dealer if you are ever in doubt about the installation, operation or safety of your equipment. **DO** be careful with glass panels or doors on equipment.

# **Precautions**

### Notes on handling

- When shipping the DVD/VCR, the original shipping carton and packing materials come in handy. For fully protection, repack the unit as it was originally packed at the factory.
- Do not use volatile liquids, such as insect spray, near the DVD/VCR. Do not leave rubber or plastic products in contact with the DVD/VCR for a long time. They will leave marks on the finish.
- The top and rear panels of the DVD/VCR may become warm after a long period of use. This is not a malfunction.
- When the DVD/VCR is not in use, be sure to remove the disc and turn off the power.
- If you do not use the DVD/VCR for a long period, the unit may not function properly in the future. Turn on and use the DVD/VCR occasionally.

### Notes on locating

- Place the DVD/VCR on a level surface. Do not use it on a shaky or unstable surface such as a wobbling table or inclined stand. The loaded disc or video tape may become dis-aligned and damage the DVD/VCR.
- When you place this DVD/VCR near a TV, radio, or VCR, the playback picture may become poor and the sound may be distorted. In this case, place the DVD/ VCR away from the TV, radio, or VCR.

### Notes on cleaning


Use a soft, dry cloth for cleaning.

- Use a dry cloth to wipe.
- Do not use any type of solvent, such as thinner and benzine, as they may damage the surface of the DVD/ VCR.
- If you use a chemical saturated cloth to clean the unit, follow that product's instructions.

### Notes on moisture condensation

## Moisture condensation damages the DVD/VCR. Please read the following carefully.

Moisture condensation occurs, for example, when you pour a cold drink into a glass on a warm day. Drops of water form on the outside of the glass. In the same way, moisture may condense on the head drum or the optical pick-up lens inside this unit, one of the most crucial internal parts of the DVD/VCR.



- Moisture condensation occurs during the following cases:
- When you bring the DVD/VCR directly from a cold place to a warm place.
- When you use the DVD/VCR in a room where you just turned on the heater, or a place where the cold wind from the air conditioner directly hits the unit.
- In summer, when you use the DVD/VCR in a hot and humid place just after you move the unit from an air conditioned room.
- When you use the DVD/VCR in a humid place.



## Do not use the DVD/VCR when moisture condensation may occur.

If you use the DVD/VCR in such a situation, it may damage discs and internal parts. Remove the disc or the video tape, connect the power cord of the DVD/VCR to the wall outlet, turn on the DVD/VCR, and leave it for two or three hours. After two or three hours, the DVD/VCR will have warmed up and evaporated any moisture. Keep the DVD/VCR connected to the wall outlet and moisture condensation will seldom occur.



## Notes on discs

### On handling discs

Do not touch the playback side of the disc.



• Do not attach paper or tape to discs.



### On cleaning discs

Fingerprints and dust on the disc cause picture and sound deterioration. Wipe the disc from the centre outwards with a soft cloth. Always keep the disc clean.



Do not use any type of solvent such as thinner, benzine, commercially available cleaners or antistatic spray for vinyl LPs. It may damage the disc.

### On storing discs

- Do not store discs in a place subject to direct sunlight or near heat sources.
- Do not store discs in places subject to moisture and dust such as a bathroom or near a humidifier.
- Store discs vertically in a case. Stacking or placing objects on discs outside of their case may cause warping.

### Structure of disc contents

Normally, DVD video discs are divided into titles, and the titles are sub-divided into chapters. Video CDs and Audio CDs are divided into tracks.

Each title, chapter or track is assigned a number, which is called "title number", "chapter number" or "track number" respectively.

There may be discs that do not have these numbers.

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## Notes on discs

### About this owner's manual

This owner's manual explains the basic instructions of this DVD/VCR. Some DVD video discs are produced in a manner that allows specific or limited operation during playback. As such, the DVD/VCR may not respond to all operating commands. This is not a defect in the DVD/ VCR. Refer to instruction notes of discs.

The following symbol may appear on the TV screen during operation.



It means that the operation is not permitted by the DVD/ VCR or the disc.

For example, sometimes it is unable to stop the playback of copyright message of the disc when the STOP ( $\blacksquare$ ) button is pressed. Alternatively, this symbol may also indicate that the feature is not available for the disc.

### Notes on region numbers

The region number of this DVD/VCR is 2. If region numbers, which stand for their playable area, are printed on your DVD video disc and you do not find () or (), disc playback will not be allowed by the player. (In this case, the DVD/VCR will display a message on-screen.)

## **On Video CDs**

This DVD/VCR supports Video CDs equipped with the PBC (Version 2.0) function. (PBC is the abbreviation of Playback Control.) You can enjoy two playback variations depending on types of discs.

• Video CD not equipped with PBC function (Version 1.1)

Sound and movie can be played on this DVD/VCR in the same way as an audio CD.

• Video CD equipped with PBC function (Version 2.0)

In addition to operation of a Video CD not equipped with the PBC function, you can enjoy playback of interactive software with search function by using the menu displayed on the TV screen (Menu Playback). Some of the functions described in this owner's manual may not work with some discs.

### **Playable discs**

This DVD/VCR can play the following discs.



The following discs are also available.

- DVD-R/RW discs of DVD video format
- CD-R/CD-RW discs of CD-DA, Video CD, SVCD, MP3, JPEG or DivX<sup>®</sup> format
- Kodak Picture CD and FUJICOLOR CD format
- Some of these discs may be incompatible.
- You cannot play discs other than those listed above.
- You cannot play discs of DVD-RAM, DVD-ROM, Photo CD, etc., or non standardized discs even if they may be labeled as above.
- Some CD-R/RWs cannot be played back depending on the recording conditions.
- This DVD/VCR uses the PAL colour system, and cannot play DVD video discs recorded in any other colour system (SECAM, etc.).
- NTSC DVD or VCD discs will be playback in black and white if PAL only TV is used. In this case, if your TV is RGB compatible, select "RGB" in the "Output" menu (see page 53). Alternatively, use a multi-system TV.
- For MP3/JPEG/DivX<sup>®</sup> CD, see page 43.

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

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## **Remote control**

### How to install the batteries


Use **micro batteries type UM-4** (**R03/AAA-Size**).

These batteries are offered as carbon / zinc-type or as alkaline-type. You may use both, but do not mix types. The alkaline type lasts longer compared to the carbon / zinc type but is more expensive.

Note: Flat, weak batteries will leak. Corrosive electrolyte will damage the remote control handset. Leak proof batteries will not leak immediately when they are flat. As long as the handset is still working, there is no danger of leakage. To prevent damage, remove the batteries if you do not use the handset for several


months.

Damage because of leakage is not covered by the guarantee.



## **Basic connection**

Connect your DVD/VCR to your home's aerial and to your TV-set as shown in the illustration. When you have finished these connections then connect your DVD/VCR to the 230 V / 50 Hz mains.



### Connect a TV with the Scart socket

In addition to the coaxial cable connection, you should also connect the supplied SCART cable from the DVD/VCR to your TV as shown. As well as transferring the high quality pictures and sound to your TV, the SCART connection can automatically switch the TV to its AV channel for playback.

If your TV-set does not switch to video-playback operation automatically, please turn your TV's video switch to VIDEO position manually.

#### Note:


Make sure that both the television and the DVD/VCR are switched off before connecting the cables.

## **Playback connection**

The exact arrangement you use to interconnect various video and audio components to the DVD/VCR is dependent on the model and features of each component. Check the Owner's Manual provided with each component for the location of SCART socket.

### **Connection to a Satellite Receiver**

If a Satellite Receiver is used, we recommend the following configuration:



SCART-cable (not supplied)

To record from Satellite Receiver press **AUX** on the remote control of DVD/VCR. "L1" will appear on the front display. Select the desired TV-program at Satellite Receiver.

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## **Playback connection**

#### Component video outputs/inputs


#### PROGRESSIVE outputs/inputs

Some TVs or monitors are equipped with component video inputs that are capable of reproducing a progressively scanned video signal. Connecting to these inputs allows you to view the highest quality pictures with less flicker.

#### INTERLACED outputs/inputs

Some TVs or monitors are equipped with component video inputs. Connecting to these inputs allows you to enjoy the highest quality DVD picture playback.

### Connecting to an audio system and TV equipped with component video inputs

#### Notes:

- Actual labels for component video inputs may vary depending on the TV manufacturer. (ex. Y, R-Y, B-Y or Y, CB, CR)
- In some TVs or monitors, the colour levels of the playback picture may be reduced slightly or the tint may change. In such a
  case, adjust the TV or monitor for optimum performance.

#### Note:


In connecting to a TV that are not capable of reproducing a progressively scanned video signal using the component sockets, do not select "Progressive" in "Output" menu. If you do it, the component video outputs does not feed the correct signals and you can not see any picture (see page 53).

#### Connect to an AV Amplifier with built-in digital surround

If you are using an Amplifier with a built-in digital surround as follows, you can enjoy the various audio systems such as Dolby Digital and DTS by using the Coaxial Digital Output.

Use this connection to connect an:

- AV amplifier with built-in Dolby Digital decoder
- AV amplifier with built-in DTS decoder



Notes:

- The COAXIAL jack is useful only for DVD section.
- DTS audio will be output only from the COAXIAL output. To hear DTS audio, DTS-Decoder is necessary.
- When playing DTS-encoded CDs, only noise will be heard from the speakers or analogue stereo outputs.
- Some DTS decoders which do not support DVD-DTS interface may not work properly with the unit.

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# Tuning the TV stations and setting the time and date automatically

Plug your DVD/VCR into the mains supply and it will start to automatically tune itself in and set the correct date and time.

#### Preparation

- Make sure that your DVD/VCR is connected properly to the TV.
- Turn on the TV and switch the TV to it's AV channel.
- Plug your DVD/VCR's plug into the mains supply. "Auto" will start to flash in the display. Your DVD/VCR will automatically tune itself in and set the correct

time and date (This may take approx. 4 minutes).



### To skip a channel position

Unwanted channels can be skipped so that they cannot be called up by pressing **CHANNEL**  $\bigvee/\land$ . Select the channel to be skipped, then

press **CANCEL**. This channel's number will be flashing. That way you can cancel further channels one after the other.



#### Notes:

- The DVD/VCR automatically corrects the clock setting every hour and automatically adjusts the clock setting for Daylight Saving Time (see page 16).
- Your DVD/VCR will tune the TV stations as follows.
  - CH 1 BBC 1
    - CH 2 BBC 2
    - CH 3 ITV
    - CH 4 Channel 4
    - CH 5 Channel 5
    - CH 6 Satellite
    - CH 7 etc.
- Skipped channels still may be selected directly through the **Number buttons** (0-9).
- To cancel skipping select the skipped channel using the Number buttons (0-9), then press CANCEL. The channel No. does not blink any longer, and the channel No. now may be selected again using CHANNEL V/A.


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## Setting the on-screen language


Turn on your TV and select the AV input mode. So you can follow the setting on TV screen.

#### Preparation:

- Press the POWER I/& button to turn on the DVD/VCR.
- Press VCR to select the VCR mode. (The VCR indicator will light.)



You can choose from five different languages for the on-screen displays.



4 Press VCR MENU repeatedly until the TV picture appears on the screen.

Notes:

- If the unit does not operate properly, or No key operation (by the unit and/ or the remote control): Static electricity, etc., may affect the player's operation. Disconnect the AC power cord once, then connect it again.
- If no buttons are pressed for more than 60 seconds, the MENU screen will return to normal TV-operation automatically.

#### Notes:

- In case of a power failure, the clock will continue to operate for another 30 minutes with quartz-controlled precision. To indicate that the power failure has lasted for an excessive period of time "--:--" will appear on the display. In this case readjust time and date.
- The AUTO TIME function adjusts the clock only if the error is within 5 minutes.
- The VCR automatically adjusts the clock setting for Daylight Saving Time once you set AUTO TIME to ON.





## Loading and unloading a cassette tape

### Use only video cassette tapes marked VHS.

### Loading

Push the center of the tape until it is automatically inserted.

### **Basic playback**

### **Preparations:**

- . When you want to view a disc, turn on the TV and select the corresponding video input connected to the DVD. This may include S-video or component video inputs which are exclusive to DVD playback.
- · When you want to enjoy the sound of discs from the audio system, turn on the audio system and select the input connected to the DVD/VCR.



## Playing a disc

### To pause playback (still mode)

### Press PAUSE/STEP during playback.



To resume normal playback, press **PLAY**.

### To remove the disc Press OPEN/CLOSE.

- If a non-compatible disc is loaded, "Incorrect Disc", "Region Code Error" or "Parental Error" will appear on the TV screen according to the type of loaded disc. In this case, check your disc again (see page 6 and 52).

- When you set a single-faced disc label downwards (i.e. the wrong way up) and press **OPEN/CLOSE** or **PLAY** on the unit, "Reading" will appear on the display for a few minutes and then "Incorrect Disc" will continue to be displayed.
- · Some discs may not work the resuming facility.
- Resuming cannot function when you play a PBC-featured Video CD while the PBC is on. To turn off the PBC, see page 42.
- Some playback operations of DVDs may be intentionally fixed by software producers. Since this unit plays DVDs according to the disc contents the software producers designed, some playback features may not be available. Also refer to the instructions supplied with the DVDs.
- Do not move the unit during playback. Doing so may damage the disc.
- Use the **OPEN/CLOSE** to open and close the disc tray. Do not push the disc tray while it is moving. Doing so may cause the unit to malfunction.
- Do not push up on the disc tray or put any objects other than discs on the disc tray. Doing so may cause the unit to malfunction.
- In many instances, a menu screen will appear after playback of a movie is completed. Prolonged display of an on-screen menu may damage your television set, permanently etching that image onto its screen. To avoid this, be sure to press **POWER** on your remote control once the movie is completed.
- There may be a slight delay between the button is pressed and the function activates.

### ■ To obtain a higher quality picture

Occasionally, some picture noise not usually visible on the TV screen during a normal broadcast may appear while playing a DVD video disc. It is because due to high resolution pictures on these discs which include a lot of information. The amount of noise depends on the disc you use with this unit. You should generally reduce the sharpness adjustment on your TV when viewing DVD video discs.

### Video head clogging

The video heads are the means by which the DVD/VCR reads the picture from the tape during playback. In the unlikely event that the heads become dirty enough to be clogged, no picture will be played back. This can easily be determined if, during playback of a known good tape, there is good sound, but no picture (picture is extremely snowy). If this is the case, have the DVD/VCR checked by qualified service personnel.
