- When shipping the player, the original shipping carton and packing materials come in handy. For maximum protection, repack the unit as it was originally packaged at the factory.
- Do not use volatile liquids, such as insect spray, near the player. Do not leave rubber or plastic products in contact with the player for a long time. They will leave marks on the finish.
- The top and rear panels of the player may become warm after a long period of use. This is not a malfunction.
- When the player is not in use, be sure to remove the disc and turn off the power.
- If you do not use the player for a long period, the unit may not function properly in the future. Turn on and use the player occasionally.

Notes on locating

■ When you place this player near a TV, radio, or VCR, the playback picture may become poor and the sound may be distorted. In this case, move the player away from the TV, radio, or VCR.

Notes on cleaning

Use a soft, dry cloth for cleaning. For stubborn dirt, soak the cloth in a weak detergent solution, wring well and wipe. Use a dry cloth to wipe it dry.

Do not use any type of solvent, such as thinner and benzine, as they may damage the surface of the player.

If you use a chemical saturated cloth to clean the unit, follow that product's instructions.

■ When cleaning the LCD panel, use a soft, dry cloth.


To obtain a clear picture

The player is a high technology, precision device. If the optical pick-up lens and disc drive parts are dirty or worn down, the picture quality becomes poor. To obtain a clear picture, we recommend regular inspection and maintenance (cleaning or parts replacement) every 1,000 hours of use depending on the operating environment. For details, contact your nearest dealer.

Notes on moisture condensation

Moisture condensation damages the player. Please read the following carefully.

Moisture condensation occurs, for example, when you pour a cold drink into a glass on a warm day. Drops of water form on the outside of the glass. In the same way, moisture may condense on the optical pick-up lens inside this unit, one of the most crucial internal parts of the player.



- Moisture condensation occurs during the following cases.
- When you bring the player directly from a cold place to a warm place.
- When you use the player in a room where you just turned on the heater, or a place where the cold wind from the air conditioner directly hits the unit.
- In summer, when you use the player in a hot and humid place just after you move the unit from an air conditioned room.
- When you use the player in a humid place.



Do not use the player when moisture condensation may occur.

If you use the player in such a situation, it may damage discs and internal parts. Remove the disc, connect the power cord of the player to the wall outlet, turn on the player, and leave it for two or three hours. After two or three hours, the player will have warmed up and evaporated any moisture. Keep the player connected to the wall outlet and moisture condensation will seldom occur.



Notes and Information

On handling discs

Do not touch the playback side of the disc.

Do not attach paper or tape to discs.





On cleaning discs

 Fingerprints and dust on the disc cause picture and sound deterioration. Wipe the disc from the center outwards with a soft cloth. Always keep the disc clean.





- If you cannot wipe off the dust with a soft cloth, wipe the disc lightly with a slightly moistened soft cloth and finish with a dry cloth.
- Do not use any type of solvent such as thinner, benzine, commercially available cleaners or antistatic spray for vinyl LPs. It may damage the disc.


On storing discs

- Do not store discs in a place subject to direct sunlight or near heat sources.
- Do not store discs in places subject to moisture and dust such as a bathroom or near a humidifier.
- Store discs vertically in a case. Stacking or placing objects on discs outside of their case may cause warping.


Structure of disc contents

Normally, DVD video discs are divided into titles, and the titles are sub-divided into chapters. VIDEO CDs and audio CDs are divided into tracks.

Each title, chapter or track is assigned a number, which is called "title number", "chapter number" or "track number" respectively.

There may be discs that do not have these numbers.

About this owner's manual

This owner's manual explains the basic instructions of this player. Some DVD video discs are produced in a manner that allows specific or limited operation during playback. As such, the player may not respond to all operating commands. This is not a defect in the player. Refer to instruction notes of discs.

"O" may appear on the screen during operation. A "O" means that the operation is not permitted by the player or the disc.

Notes on region numbers

The region number of this player is 1. If region numbers, which stand for their playable area, are printed on your DVD video disc and you do not find or , disc playback will not be allowed by the player. (In this case, the player will display a message on-screen.)

On VIDEO CDs

This player supports VIDEO CDs equipped with the PBC (Version 2.0) function. (PBC is the abbreviation of Playback Control.)

You can enjoy two playback variations depending on types of discs.

- VIDEO CD not equipped with PBC function (Version 1.1)
 Sound and movie can be played on this player in the same way as an audio CD.
- VIDEO CD equipped with PBC function (Version 2.0)

In addition to operation of a VIDEO CD not equipped with the PBC function, you can enjoy playback of interactive software with search function by using the menu displayed on the screen (Menu Playback). Some functions described in this owner's manual may not work with all discs.

Loading a battery

While pushing the holder in direction ①, simultaneously slide it out in direction ②.



2 Set a coin-shaped battery (CR2025) with the \oplus side up on the holder.



Keep the holder horizontal so that the battery does not fall through.

3 Push the holder back into its receptacle.





Basic playback

Preparations

- When you want to view a disc on a connected TV or monitor, turn on the equipment and select the video input connected
- When you want to enjoy the sound of discs from an audio system, turn the audio system on and select the input connected to the player.
- If you use the supplied remote control, make sure that batteries are loaded in it. 17
- If you use the headphones, see "Connect to headphones".
- Slide the top cover open button rightwards to open the top cover.

Slide this switch rightwards to open the top cover. SETUP **ENTER** TOP MENU MENU STOP POWER/CHG indicator

Turn on the power.

POWER

Press POWER.



The player turns on and the POWER/CHG indicator on the player illuminates in green.

When the player is turned on for the first time, an initial set-up display appears. See "Initial Setup" and make the proper settings before proceeding to step 2.

Open the disc cover.



Press OPEN on the main unit. The disc cover opens.

The cover is designed to stop at 2 positions. Do not force the cover open further, as it may cause damage to the player.


Set a disc.



Place a disc with the playback side down, and push gently on the center of the disc to affix it to the spindle.

Close the disc cover.

Press CLOSE on the right corner.



■ To obtain a higher quality picture

Occasionally, some picture noise not usually visible during a normal broadcast may appear on the TV screen while playing a DVD video disc because the high resolution pictures on these discs include a lot of information. While the amount of noise depends on the TV you use with this player, you should generally reduce the sharpness adjustment on your TV when viewing DVD video discs.

■ To start playback in the stop mode.

- Do not tilt, shake or move the main unit while playing. It may damage the disc.
- In many instances, a menu screen will appear after playback of a movie is completed. Prolonged display of an on-screen menu may damage your television set, permanently etching that image onto its screen. To avoid this, be sure to press the STOP button once the movie is completed.





- 5 Press ▼ to select "Audio Out Select," and press ENTER.



■ About the screen saver

If you pause a picture of a DVD video disc and leave it still for a long while, the screen saver of the player automatically appears (when "Screen Saver" is set to "On" 49). To turn off the screen saver, press the PLAY button on the main unit or remote control.

Automatic Power Off function

If the player is stopped, or the screen saver is engaged for approximately 20 minutes, the player will automatically turn itself off.


About the LCD

- The color LCD is manufactured using extremely high precision technology, but even so may include certain pixels that do not operate properly (that do not light, that remain lit constantly, etc.). We do our best to keep the number of these defective pixels to a minimum, but please understand that they cannot be completely eliminated even with the most advanced manufacturing technologies available today.
- The fluorescent tube which illuminates the panel from the inside will deteriorate with use. (The standard life length is about 10,000 hours of continuous use at normal temperature.) When the LCD becomes dim, flickers, or does not illuminate, contact your dealer for replacement.

When you view pictures on the LCD of this player, set the "TV Shape" to "16:9 Widescreen". 46

INTERLACED outputs/inputs (ColorStream®)
