



When you place this player near a TV, radio, or VTR, the playback picture may become poor and the sound may be distorted. In this case, move the player away from the TV, radio, or VTR.


Notes on products incorporated laser system

- Never disassemble or modify this product. Changes or modifications may result in exposure to laser radiation.

Notes on moisture condensation

Moisture condensation damages the player. Please read the following carefully.

Moisture condensation occurs, for example, when you pour a cold drink into a glass on a warm day. Drops of water form on the outside of the glass. In the same way, moisture may condense on the optical pick-up lens inside this unit, one of the most crucial internal parts of the player.



- Moisture condensation occurs during the following cases.
- When you transport the player directly from a cold place to a warm place.
- When you use the player in a room where you just turned on the heater, or a place where the cold air from the air conditioner directly hits the unit.
- In summer, when you use the player in a hot and humid place just after you move the unit from an air conditioned room.
- When you use the player in a humid place.



Do not use the player when moisture condensation may occur.

If you use the player in such a situation, it may damage discs and internal parts. Remove the disc, connect the AC adapter, turn on the player, and leave it for two or three hours. After two or three hours, the player will have warmed up and evaporated any moisture.



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Notes and Information

Structure of disc contents

Normally, DVD video discs are divided into titles, and the titles are sub-divided into chapters. VIDEO CDs/audio CDs are divided into tracks.






Each title, chapter, or track is assigned a number, which is called "title number", "chapter number" or "track number" respectively.

There may be discs that do not have these numbers.

On handling discs

• Do not touch the playback side of the disc.



Do not attach paper or tape to discs.



Notes on region numbers

The region number of this player is 2. Region numbers, corresponding to specific geographical playback area, are printed on your DVD video disc. If you do not find or , disc playback will not be allowed by the player. (In this case, the player will display a message on-screen.)

On cleaning discs

 Fingerprints and dust on the disc may cause picture and sound deterioration. Wipe the disc from the center outwards with a soft cloth. Always keep the disc clean



 Do not use any type of solvent such as thinner, benzine, commercially available cleaners or antistatic spray for vinyl LPs. It may damage the disc.

On storing discs

- Do not store discs in a place subject to direct sunlight or near heat sources.
- Do not store discs in places subject to moisture and dust such as a bathroom or near a humidifier.
- Store discs vertically in a case. Stacking or placing objects on discs outside of their case may cause warping.

- VIDEO CD equipped with PBC function (Version 2.0)

MENU button


Use the MENU button to display the menu included on many DVD video discs. To operate a menu, follow the instructions in "Locating a title using the top menu." [24)

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Loading the remote control battery

Gently insert a fingernail in groove ① and pull out the holder in direction ②.



Take care not to break your fingernail.

2 Place a coin-shaped battery (CR2025) with the \oplus side up on the holder.



Keep the holder horizontal so that the battery does not fall through.

3 Push the holder back into its receptacle.




Notes on coin-shaped batteries

- If the remote control does not function correctly or if the operating range becomes reduced, replace the battery with new one.
- See 6 for safety use of coin-shaped batteries.
- Inserting a battery other than the specified one or an object may damage the remote control.

Operating with the remote control

Point the remote control at the remote sensor on the player and press the buttons.



Distance: About 3 m (9.9 feet) from the front of the remote sensor

Angle: About 30° in each direction of the front of the remote sensor

* Do not expose the remote sensor of the player to a strong light source such as direct sunlight or other illumination. If you do so, you may not be able to operate the player via the remote control.

Notes on the remote control

- Aim the remote control at the remote sensor of the player.
- Do not drop or give the remote control a shock.
- Do not leave the remote control near an extremely hot or humid place.


Introduction

Power Connection

Connect the supplied AC adapter to power the player. For mobile use, the battery pack (supplied) is also available. When using the battery pack, follow the instructions on page 60.

CAUTION

- Do not connect the power plug to a power outlet other than that indicated on the label, as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.
- Do not connect or disconnect the power plug with wet hands. Doing so may cause electric shock.





Basic playback

Preparations

- Connect the AC adapter 16 or the battery pack 60 to the player.
- When you want to view a disc on a connected TV or monitor 54, turn on the equipment and select the video input connected to the player.
- When you want to enjoy the sound of discs from an audio system (55), turn the audio system on and select the input connected to the player.
- If you use the supplied remote control, make sure that batteries are loaded in it. [15)
- If you use the headphones, see "Connecting to Headphones". 56>

Turn on the power.

OFF_POWER_ON

Slide the power switch to "ON".

The player turns on and the POWER indicator on the player illuminates in green.

The default setting for the language used to display the OSD of the player is English. You can change the language (English, French, Spanish, German, Duch, Swedish). 20

Open the disc cover.



Press OPEN on the main unit. The disc cover opens.

The disc cover will not open over a certain range. Do not force the cover open further, as it may cause damage to the player.

Set a disc.



Place a disc with the playback side down, and push gently on the center of the disc to affix it to the spindle.

The disc will not be recognized or played correctly, or will be damaged if it is not affixed to the spindle properly.

Close the disc cover.

Press CLOSE on the right corner.

5

Start playback.



Press PLAY.




If you select a DVD video disc that contains a top menu, or select a PBC (Playback Control)-featured VIDEO CD ((9)), a menu may appear. See "Locating a title using the top menu". (24)

 You may need to press the TOP MENU or MENU button to display the disc menu (depending on the actual DVD video disc.)

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■ To obtain a higher quality picture (When connected to a TV)

Occasionally, some picture noise not usually visible during a normal broadcast may appear on the TV screen while playing a DVD video disc because the high resolution pictures on these discs include a lot of information. While the amount of noise depends on the TV you use with this player, you should generally reduce the sharpness adjustment on the connected TV when viewing DVD video discs.

About DVD-V VCD CD

The $NON_{CO} CO$ cons on the heading bar show the playable discs relevant to the function described under each heading.

DVD-V : DVD video discs.

VCD : VIDEO CDs.

CD: Audio CDs.

■ To start playback in the stop mode Press PLAY.





Notes

- Do not put an unplayable disc or any objects other than discs in the disc holder.
- In many instances, a menu screen will appear after playback of a movie is completed. Prolonged display of an on-screen menu may damage your television set, permanently etching that image onto its screen. To avoid this, be sure to press the STOP button once the movie is completed.
