benzene, acidic or alkaline solvent cleaners, abrasive cleaners, or chemical cloths, which may damage the surface. Do not spray volatile compounds such as insecticide on the cabinet. This may cause a discoloration or damage the cabinet.

- 2) The LCD panel contained in this TV is manufactured using an extremely high level of precision technology; however, there may be an occasional pixel (dot of light) that does not operate properly (that does not light, that remains constantly lit, etc.). This is a structural property of LCD technology, is not a sign of malfunction, and is not covered under your warranty. Such pixels are not visible when the picture is viewed from a normal viewing distance.



Precautions

Notes on moisture condensation

Moisture condensation damages the DVD player section. Please read the following carefully.

Moisture condensation occurs, for example, when you pour a cold drink into a glass on a warm day. Drops of water form on the outside of the glass. In the same way, moisture may condense on the optical pick-up lens inside DVD player, one of the most crucial internal parts of the DVD player.



Moisture condensation occurs during the following cases.

- When you bring the TV directly from a cold place to a warm place.
- When you use the TV in a room where you just turned on the heater, or a place where the cold wind from the air conditioner directly hits the TV.
- In summer, when you use the TV in a hot and humid place just after you move the TV from an air conditioned room.
- When you use the TV in a humid place.



Do not use the TV when moisture condensation may occur.


If you use the TV in such a situation, it may damage discs and internal parts. Remove the disc, connect the power cord of the TV to the wall outlet, turn on the TV, and leave it for two or three hours. After two or three hours, the TV will have warmed up and evaporated any moisture. Keep the TV connected to the wall outlet and moisture ondensation will seldom occur.



Notes on discs (DVD player section)

On handling discs

Do not touch the playback side of the disc.
 For example, handle the disc so that it is shown in figure below.



· Do not attach paper or tape to discs.





On cleaning discs

• Fingerprints and dust on the disc cause picture and sound deterioration. Wipe the disc from the center outwards with a soft cloth. Always keep the disc clean.



 Do not use any type of solvent such as thinner, benzine, commercially available cleaners or antistatic spray for vinyl LPs. It may damage the disc.

On storing discs

- Do not store discs in a place subject to direct sunlight or near heat sources.
- Do not store discs in places subject to moisture and dust such as a bathroom or near a humidifier.
- Store discs vertically in a case. Stacking or placing objects on discs outside of their case may cause warping.

On other notes

DISC SLOT

• Keep your fingers well clear of the disc slot as it is closing. It may cause serious personal injury.

VIBRATION

 Vibration or shock may disrupt DVD playback or cause scratches on the disc. Do not move or tilt or otherwise jolt the set when a disc is loaded. The playback sound may skip if the TV is dropped from a height of 4 cm (1.5 in) or more or if the set is installed at a greater angle than recommended.

LASER BEAM

• Do not look into the opening of the disc slot or ventilation opening of the product to see the source of the laser beam. It may cause sight damage.

DISC

• Do not use a cracked, deformed, or repaired disc. These discs are easily broken and may cause serious personal injury and product malfunction.

As such, the DVD player may not respond to all operating commands. This is not a defect in the DVD player. Refer to instruction notes of discs.

"O" may appear on the TV screen during operation.

A " \oslash " means that the operation is not permitted by the DVD player or the disc.

For example, sometimes it is unable to stop the playback of copyright message of the disc when the STOP (\blacksquare) button is pressed. Alternatively, the " \oslash " may also indicate that the feature is not available for the disc.

Notes on region numbers

The region number of this DVD player of the TV is 1. If region numbers, which stand for their playable area, are printed on your DVD video disc and you do not find to real, disc playback will not be allowed by the player. (In this case, the TV will display a message on-screen.)

Some DVDs that have no region code label may still be subject to area restrictions and therefore not playable.

On Video CDs

The DVD player of the TV supports Video CDs equipped with the PBC (Version 2.0) function. (PBC is the abbreviation of Playback Control.) You can enjoy two playback variations depending on types of discs.

• Video CD not equipped with PBC function (Version 1.1)

Sound and movie can be played on this DVD player of the TV in the same way as an audio CD.

Video CD equipped with PBC function (Version 2.0)

In addition to operation of a Video CD not equipped with the PBC function, you can enjoy playback of interactive software with search function by using the menu displayed on the TV screen (Menu Playback).

Some of the functions described in this owner's manual may not work with some discs.






Rear terminal cover

- 4. Close the cover.





Connecting your TV

Note: All required cables, if not provided with your other devices, can be purchased at many electronics accessory suppliers.

- Coaxial (F-type) cable is used for connecting your antenna, cable TV service, and/or cable converter box to the ANT 75 Ω RF input on your TV.
- Standard A/V cables (composite video) usually come in sets of three, and are for use with video devices with standard audio and standard (composite) video output. These cables (and the related inputs on your TV) are typically color-coded according to use: yellow for video, red for stereo right audio, and white for stereo left (or mono) audio.
- S-video cable is for use with video devices with S-video output. Separate audio cables are required for a complete connection. *Note:* An S-video cable provides better picture performance than a standard (composite) video cable.
- **Component video cables** come in sets of three and are for use with video devices with component video output. These cables are typically color-coded red, green, and blue. (ColorStream[®] is Toshiba's brand of component video.) Separate audio cables are required for a complete connection.

Note: Component video cables provide better picture performance than a standard (composite) video or S-video cable.


• HDMI cable is for use with devices with uncompressed HDMI (highdefinition multimedia interface) video and compressed audio output. HDMI cable delivers digital audio and video in its native format (see page 16). This cable carries both video and audio information; therefore, separate audio cables are not required for a complete connection.

Note: HDMI cable provides better picture performance than a standard (composite) video or S-video cable.

- Mini D-sub 15-pin cable is for use with a personal computer with an analog RGB (15-pin) output. A separate audio cable is required for a complete connection.
- **Optical audio cable** is for connecting receivers with PCM (pulse-code modulation) optical audio input to the TV's SPDIF (digital audio out) terminal. See page 17.

Connecting an antenna or cable TV

This connection allows you to watch TV programs or basic cable channels.



Connecting a VCR

This input is designed to accept HDCP^[3] program material in digital form from EIA/CEA-861/861B– compliant^[4] consumer electronic devices (such as a settop box or DVD player with HDMI or DVI output).

The HDMI input is designed for best performance with 1080i high-definition video signals, but will also accept and display 480i, 480p, and 720p signals.

Note: The HDMI jack is not intended for connection to and should not be used with a personal computer. For PC connection, see page 18.


To connect an HDMI device, you will need:

• one HDMI cable (type A connector)

For proper operation, it is recommended that you use a short HDMI cable.

HDMI cable transfers both video and audio. Separate analog audio cables are not required (see illustration below). Some CDVs (Video CDs) may not output digital audio signals, in which case you may be able to hear sound by connecting analog audio cables. However, if you connect analog audio cables with this connection, the HDMI terminal on the TV will not receive the HDMI digital audio signal and you will hear analog audio only.





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Using the V-Chip menu

- 2. Set a four-digit password.
- 3. Select the ratings and categories you want to block.

The multi-channel TV sound (MTS) feature allows you to listen to high-fidelity stereo sound while watching TV. MTS can also transmit a second audio program (SAP) containing a second language, music, or other audio information (when provided by individual stations).

When the TV receives a stereo or SAP broadcast, the word "ST.SAP", "Stereo" or "SAP" appears on-screen every time the TV is turned on, the channel is changed, or DISPLAY is pressed.

The MTS feature is not available when the TV is in Video mode.

To listen to stereo sound:

Repeatedly press AUDIO SELECT to select Stereo.



You can leave your TV in Stereo mode because it will automatically output the type of sound being broadcast (stereo or monaural).


If the stereo sound is noisy, select Mono to reduce the noise.

To listen to SAP (if available):

Press AUDIO SELECT repeatedly to select SAP.



You will hear the station's second audio program (if available) from the speakers, while viewing the original program's picture.



Using the WOW surround sound feature

WOW surround widens and deepens audio listening field to deliver exceptional sound from the TV's speakers. The feature uses stereo signals from a TV broadcast or video input.

To activate the WOW feature:

- 1. Select Stereo mode (see "Selecting stereo/SAP broadcasts" on page 32).
- 2. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ► until the Sound menu appears.
- 3. Press ENTER, and then press \blacktriangle or \triangledown to highlight Sound mode.
- 4. Press ENTER, and then press \blacktriangle or \triangledown to select WOW.



Selecting the sound mode

You can select your desired sound type from six sound modes: WOW, Flat, Hall, Theater, News, or Memory.

To select the sound mode:


- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the Sound menu appears.
- 2. Press ENTER, and then press $\mathbf{\nabla}$ or \mathbf{A} to highlight Sound mode.

If you select one of the factory-set audio modes (WOW, Flat, Hall, Theater, or News) and then change a sound quality setting (for example, increase the bass), the sound mode automatically change to Memory mode.



Adjusting the sound quality

You can change the quality of your TV's sound by adjusting the bass, treble, and balance.

To adjust the sound quality:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the Sound menu appears.
- 2. Press ENTER, and then press ▲ or ▼ to highlight the item you want to adjust.



- 3. Press ENTER.
- 4. Press \blacktriangleleft or \blacktriangleright to adjust the level.



- < makes the sound quality weaker or increases the balance in the left channel, depending on the item selected.
- The makes the sound quality stronger or increases the balance in the right channel, depending on the item selected.


To continue adjusting the other items, press \blacktriangle or \triangledown in step 4.

Using the StableSound® feature


When the signal source is changed, the StableSound feature limits the highest volume level to prevent extreme changes in volume (for example, to prevent the sudden increase in volume that often happens when a TV program switches to a commercial).

To turn on the StableSound feature:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the Sound menu appears.
- 2. Press ENTER, and then press \blacktriangle or \triangledown to highlight StableSound.
- 3. Press ENTER, and then press \blacktriangle or \triangledown to select On.



To turn off the StableSound feature: Select Off in step 3 above.




Using the PC setting feature

You can adjust the horizontal/vertical picture position, clock (to minimize vertical stripes on the screen), and phase (to remove horizontal noise and sharpen the picture).

You can auto-configure and reset these settings.

- 1. Confirm a PC is connected (see "Connecting a personal computer (PC)" on page 18).
- 2. Repeatedly press INPUT on the remote control (or press TV/ VIDEO on the TV top panel) to select PC input mode. (See "Selecting the video input source" on page 24.)
- 3. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the PC menu appears.
- 4. Press ENTER, and then press \blacktriangle or \triangledown to select an item.



- 5. Press Enter.
- 6. Press \blacktriangleleft or \blacktriangleright to make the appropriate adjustments.
 - H-position/V-position

Adjusts picture left/right and up/down. The adjustment range is 0-100. (The adjustable range may vary depending on the input mode.)

• Clock

Minimizes any vertical bars or stripes appearing on the screen background. The adjustment range is 0-100. (The adjustable range may vary depending on the input mode.)

• Phase


Reduces (or minimizes) any horizontal noise and clears up or sharpens the character images. The range adjustment is 0–100. (The adjustable range may vary depending on the input mode.)

• Auto Configure

Automatically adjusts the screen position, clock, and phase. (The displayed image will disappear for a few seconds while auto-configuration is in progress.)

• Reset

Returns to the default settings programmed at the factory. The values in the Reset function cannot be modified.



Using the Game Mode feature

You can use the Game Mode feature for shorter frame delays when playing a video game requiring split-second timing between the onscreen display and input from the controller (such as music creation and high-action games).

To turn on Game Mode:

Press GAME. The TV will switch to the Game Mode when the onscreen display closes.

Note:

If you adjust the volume or make any other adjustments that cause a menu or on-screen control panel to display, the Game Mode will be temporarily suspended until the on-screen display closes.

To turn off Game Mode:

You can change the video input in any of the following ways:

- pressing INPUT.
- changing the channel using the Number buttons or CH $\land \lor$.

Using the Auto off feature

When the Auto off feature is set to On, the TV will automatically turn itself off after approximately 15 minutes if it is tuned to a vacant channel or a station that completes its broadcast for the day. This feature does not work when the Blue screen mode is set to Off.

To activate the Auto off feature:

- 1. Press MENU, and then press ◀ or ▶ until the Special menu appears.
- 2. Press ENTER, and then press \blacktriangle or \triangledown to highlight Auto off.
- 3. Press ENTER, and then press \blacktriangle or \triangledown to Select On.



To deactivate the Auto off feature: Select Off in step 3 above.

Displaying on-screen information

Press DISPLAY to display the following information on-screen:



Understanding the last mode memory feature

If the power is cut off while you are viewing the TV, the Last Mode Memory feature turns on the TV automatically when the power is resupplied.

If the power is going to be off for a long time and you are going to be away from your TV, unplug the power cord to prevent the TV from turning on in your absence.



DVD & VCD Operation

Basic Playback

- 1. Press POWER.
- 2. Slide your chosen disc into the disc slot on the side panel. Be sure to face the top of the disc (with title etc.) toward the front of the screen. Playback starts.
- 3. Press EJECT to remove the disc.

Stop Playback

 - SLOW \blacktriangleright : \blacktriangleright 1/2 \rightarrow \blacktriangleright 1/4 \rightarrow \blacktriangleright 1/8 \rightarrow \blacktriangleright 1/16 \rightarrow 1x.
 - SLOW ◀ : ◀ 1/2 → ◀ 1/4 → ◀ 1/8 → ◀ 1/16 → 1×. (DVD only)
- 2. Press PLAY ► to resume normal playback. *Note:*

There is no sound during fast or slow playback for DVDs or Video CDs.

Skip a Chapter or a Track

- Press SKIP → or SKIP ← to locate a desired chapter during playback. Each time you press the button, a chapter or track is skipped.
 - Press SKIP **>>** to locate succeeding chapters or tracks.
 - Press SKIP **>>** twice in quick succession, playback will start from the beginning of the next chapter or track.
 - Press SKIP 🖂 to go back to the beginning of the current chapter or track.
 - Press SKIP I twice in quick succession, playback will start from the beginning of the previous chapter or track.

Frame by Frame Playback



- 3. Repeatedly press REPEAT A-B again to resume normal playback. "Off" appears on the screen.

JPEG file viewing options
