



# **MAINTENANCE**

### CLEANING THE DISC

A defective or soiled disc inserted into the unit can cause sound to drop out during playback. Handle the disc by holding its inner and outer edges.

- Do NOT touch the surface of the unlabeled side of the disc.
- Do NOT stick paper or tape on the surface.
- Do NOT expose the disc to direct sunlight or excessive heat.
- Clean the disc before playback. Wipe the disc from the center outward with a cleaning cloth.



 NEVER use solvents such as benzine or alcohol to clean the disc.

• Do NOT use irregular shaped discs (example:

heart shaped, octagonal, etc.). They may cause malfunctions.

### **CLEANING THE UNIT**

- Be sure to turn the unit off and disconnect the AC power cord before maintaining the unit.
- Wipe the unit with a dry soft cloth. If the surfaces are extremely dirty, wipe clean with a cloth that has been dipped in a weak soap-and-water solution and wrung out thoroughly. Then wipe with a dry cloth.

# **GETTING STARTED**

### USING THE REMOTE CONTROL

- Point the remote control at the REMOTE SENSOR located on the unit.
- When using this unit in bright light, the infrared REMOTE CONTROL SENSOR may not work properly.
- The recommended effective distance for using the remote control is about 16 feet.

### TO CHANGE REMOTE BATTERY

Open the battery door.



2. Insert one CR2025 (3V) size battery.





### CAUTION:

Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly replaced. Replace only with the same or equivalent type.

Remove the PVC sheet before operating the Remote Control.



### **BATTERY REPLACEMENT**

When the battery becomes weak, the operating distance of the remote control will be greatly reduced and you will need to replace the battery.

- If the remote control is not going to be used for a long time, remove the battery to avoid damage caused by battery leakage corrosion.

# **CONNECTIONS**

### A. Watching a DVD on the Main Unit and the Monitor

You can watch the same DVD on the main unit and the monitor.




- 1. Connect the main unit and the monitor using the included DC-AV Cable.
- 2. Turn on the main unit and the monitor.
- 3. Play a DVD on the main unit; the monitor will play at the same time.

### B. Watching a TV on Main Unit

If your TV has Audio/Video inputs, you can connect the main unit to your TV using a standard A/V cable (not included).





### Watching a DVD on your TV

- 1. Connect your TV to the main unit using a standard AV Cable (not included).
- 2. Turn on the main unit.
- 3. Turn on the TV and follow the instructions included with it to play the DVD.

### Note:

- Make sure to use the correct Audio/Video cable. Connecting the plugs incorrectly may cause a weak signal.
- If your TV does not have Audio/Video inputs, you will need to purchase an RF modulator (sold separately) and follow the instructions included with it to connect the unit to your TV.

### C. Listening to a Stereo Receiver or Amplifier on the Main Unit


The main unit can play two channels Dolby Digital.

### Listening on External Audio Equipment

- 1. Connect the main unit to the left/right Audio In jacks on the other equipment using a standard Audio cable (not included).
- 2. Turn on the main unit.
- 3. Turn on your audio equipment and follow the instructions provided with it to select the AUDIO IN function.

### Note:

- Make sure to use the correct Audio cable. Connecting the plugs incorrectly may cause a weak signal.
- If you have a stereo VCR, make sure you set it to stereo mode.
- Due to copyright protection, DVD movies cannot be copied. If you copy a DVD movie onto a videotape, the resulting copy will be unclear, with poor sound quality. This is NOT caused by a defective DVD system.



### D. Playing a Game System/Video Equipment on the Monitor


You can connect game systems or other video equipment for playback through the monitor only. You cannot connect these systems to the main unit.

### Watching Video Equipment

- 1. Connect the other equipment to the monitor using a standard AV Cable (not included).
- 2. Turn on the monitor.
- 3. Turn on the video equipment and follow the instructions provided with it to playback.



# E. Using the Monitor with Other Equipment while Playing a DVD on the Main Unit

You can use a game console or other video equipment on the monitor while playing a DVD on the main unit.



### Watching Video Equipment with the Monitor while Playing a DVD in the Main Unit

- 1. Connect only the plug connector between the main unit and the monitor. Do not connect the Audio/Video portion of the DC-AV cable.
- 2. Connect the monitor to the other equipment using a standard AV cable (not included).
- 3. Turn on the main unit, the monitor and the other equipment.
- 4. Play a DVD on the main unit.
- 5. Use the monitor for the other equipment.

### Note:

- Make sure to use the correct Audio/Video cable. Connecting the plugs incorrectly may cause a weak signal.
- If you have a mono VCR, the volume level from the speakers will be low.


### F. Using Headphones/Earphones

Turn down the volume before connecting the headphones/earphones. Slowly raise the volume with the headphones on until you reach your desired volume. When headphones are connected, the speaker is automatically disabled.







# **PLACEMENT**

### A. Mounting in the Vehicle

Use the supplied mounting straps to install the main unit and monitor on the back of the vehicle's headrests. Tightly wrap the mounting strap around the headrest.

# **SOUND SYSTEM**

### **DOLBY DIGITAL**

Dolby Digital is a sound system developed by Dolby Laboratories Inc. This unit automatically recognizes DVDs that have been recorded with Dolby Digital.

Not all Dolby Digital sources are recorded with 6 channels.

Some sources marked Dolby Digital may be recorded in Dolby Surround, a 2 channel system. Look for this logo on your unit.

# CD/DVD OPERATION

This owner's manual explains the basic instructions of this unit. Some DVDs are produced to limit operation during playback. For example, many DVDs do not allow users to skip government warnings, or in some cases previews or other features. This is not a defect in the unit. Refer to the instruction notes of discs.

" \overline{\overline{O}}" may appear on the screen during operation. A " \overline{\overline{O}}" means that the desired operation is not permitted by the unit or disc.

### **PLAYING A DISC**

- Slide the STANDBY/ON switch to the ON position. (Slide the ON/OFF switch on the monitor to the ON position.
  - See CUSTOMIZING THE DVD FUNCTION SETTINGS before proceeding to step 2.
- 2. Press the \(\rightarrow\) button and hold the front panel to open the disc door.
- 3. Hold the disc by its edge and gently push it onto the spindle, with the label side facing the front, until you hear a "click".
- 4. Push the disc door gently to close it. It takes a short while for your unit to load the disc. After loading, for most DVDs, the unit will automatically take you to the main menu or start playing. If the unit does not automatically start playing the DVD, press the ► PLAY button.

### PLAYING A PICTURE FILE DISC

This unit can play picture files recorded on CD-R and CD-RW discs.

- 1. Press the \(\rightarrow\) button and hold the front panel to open the disc door.
- 2. Hold the disc by its edge and gently push it onto the spindle, with the label side facing the front, until you hear a "click".
- 3. Push the door gently to close it. The picture files on the disc will be displayed one by one automatically.
- 4. Press the  $\blacksquare$  **STOP** button to go to the folder list.
- 5. Press the ▲ or ▼ button to highlight a file to play. Press the ▶ PLAY button to start playback.

### Note:

- You can press the II PAUSE button to interrupt playback, and press the ► PLAY button to resume playback.
- You also can use the GOTO function or use the numbered buttons to enter the image number to quickly select any image.
- Press the ANGLE button on the remote control to rotate the picture orientation by 90°.

### ANGLE SELECTION (DVD)

Some DVDs contain scenes that have been shot from a number of different angles. For these discs, the same scene can be viewed from each of these different angles.

- While you are playing a DVD with different angles recorded, press the ANGLE button to view the number of current angles available.
- 2. Press the **ANĞLE** button repeatedly to change the scene to the next angle in those recorded.
  - About two seconds later, playback continues from the new angle selected.
  - If no button is pressed within 10 seconds, playback continues without changing the current angle.

# Sequence of angle shots (Example)

### Note:

- This function can only be used for discs on which scenes shot from multiple angles have been recorded.
- If only one angle is recorded, " ∅ " is displayed.

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# SPECIAL FUNCTIONS

### **DISPLAY FUNCTION (DVD)**

While the disc is playing, press the **DISPLAY** button repeatedly to display information on operation status:



### LOCATING A SPECIFIC TITLE (DVD)

If a DVD contains title numbers, you can locate a specific title by directly selecting a title number.

1. In STOP mode, press the **GOTO** button.

Title /03 Chapter 00/00

- Press the ◀ or ▶ button to highlight a specific field and press the corresponding number button(s) for the title you want.
- 3. Press the **ENTER** button to confirm. Playback starts from the selected title.

### LOCATING A SPECIFIC CHAPTER / TRACK

If you know the chapter / track number you want to play, you can locate a specific chapter / track by directly selecting a chapter / track number.

- 1. Press the **GOTO** button to search for your desired chapter / track.
- Title 01/03 Chapter /12
- Press the ◀or ▶ button to highlight a chapter / track then press the corresponding number button(s) for the chapter /track you want.
- 3. Press the **ENTER** button to confirm. Playback starts from the selected chapter / track.

### LOCATING A SPECIFIC TIME

You can move to a specific location by entering its corresponding time (hours, minutes, seconds)

- 1. Press the **GOTO** button twice.
- 2. Press the corresponding number buttons for the setting point you want.
- 3. Press the **ENTER** button to confirm. Playback starts from the selected location.

### Note

- Some discs may not respond to this process.
- Some scenes may not be located as precisely as specified.
- This method for accessing specific locations is available only within the current title of the DVD

## REPEAT PLAYBACK

You can play a specific title or chapter repeatedly. (Chapter repeat, title repeat, A-B repeat)

### **REPEATING A CHAPTER (DVD)**

You can play the same chapter repeatedly.

1. While the disc is playing, press the **REPEAT** button until the "Chapter" indicator displays on the screen. The current chapter is played repeatedly.

### REPEATING A TITLE

You can play the same title repeatedly.

2. While the disc is playing, press the **REPEAT** button until the "Title" indicator displays on the screen. The current title is played repeatedly.

### TO RESUME NORMAL PLAYBACK

3. While the disc is playing, press the **REPEAT** button until the "Repeat Off" indicator displays on the screen.

You can play a single track or an entire disc repeatedly.

### REPEATING A SINGLE TRACK (CD)

You can play the same track repeatedly.

While the disc is playing, press the REPEAT button until the "Repeat One" indicator displays
on the screen. The current track is played repeatedly.

### REPEATING AN ENTIRE DISC

2. While the disc is playing, press the **REPEAT** button until the "Repeat All" indicator displays on the screen. The entire disc is played repeatedly.

### TO RESUME NORMAL PLAYBACK

3. Press the **REPEAT** button until the "Repeat Off" indicator displays on the screen.

### REPEATING A SPECIFIC SECTION (DVD / CD)

You can play a specific section repeatedly.

- 1. While the disc is playing, press the **A-**B button at the beginning of the section (**A** is displayed) you want to play repeatedly.
- 2. Press the **A-B** button again at the end of the section ( AB is displayed) you want to play repeatedly.
- 3. The unit will immediately begin replaying your selection.

### TO RESUME NORMAL PLAYBACK

4. While the disc is playing, press the A-B button until the "♠ AB OFF" indicator displays on the screen.

### Note:

- A-B repeat can only be used within the same title. If the start and end of the section to be repeated are in different titles, A-B repeat is cancelled.
- The A-B repeat function does not operate in scenes where different camera angles are recorded.

# DVD PROGRAMMABLE PLAYBACK

### PROGRAMMABLE MEMORY

The two types of programmed playback provided by this unit is title/chapter programmed playback.

### TITLE/CHAPTER PROGRAMMED PLAYBACK (DVD)

- 1. Press the **MEMORY** button in PLAY mode.
- 2. Input the title (2 digits) and chapter (2 digits) by pressing the number buttons. (For example: 01 02, 02 05, 02 11) It will move to the next item automatically.
- 3. Repeat steps 2 to add additional titles and chapters.
- 4. Press the ► PLAY button to start the programmed playback.



# **CUSTOMIZING THE DVD FUNCTION SETTINGS**

### LANGUAGE SETUP

- 1. In STOP mode, press the **SETUP** button.
- Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select the option (OSD Language, Audio, Subtitle or Disc Menu), then press the ▶ button.
- Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select your preferred language, then press the ENTER button to confirm.

### Pan Scan

### Letter Box

 When wide-screen video is played in this mode on a conventional screen, black bands appear at the top and bottom of the screen.

### Wide screen

 This is the correct mode for playing wide-screen videos on the unit or other external wide-screens.

- The displayable picture size is preset on the DVD. Therefore the playback picture of some DVDs may not conform to the picture size vou select.
- When you play DVDs recorded in the 4:3 aspect ratio, the playback picture will always appears in the 4:3 aspect ratio regardless of the TV TYPE setting.
