

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
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# REMOTE CONTROL


- Point the remote control at the REMOTE SENSOR located on the unit.
- When there is a strong ambient light source, the performance of the infrared REMOTE SENSOR may be degraded, causing unreliable operation.
- The recommended effective distance for remote operation is about 16 feet (5 meters).

#### To Install Batteries

1. Open the battery door.



2. Insert two AAA batteries



## **Battery Replacement**

When the batteries become weak, the operating distance of the remote control is greatly reduced and you will need to replace them.

CAUTION: Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly replaced. Replace only with the same or equivalent type.

## Notes:

- · If the remote control is not going to be used for a long time, remove the batteries to avoid corrosion damage caused by battery leakage.
- . Do not mix old and new batteries. Do not mix ALKALINE, standard (CARBON-ZINC) or rechargeable (NICKEL-CADMIUM) batteries.


# STEP 1: CONNECTIONS

# Option One: Using the RF Cable to Connect a TV

- 1. Connect an antenna cable to the RF IN terminal on the rear of the unit.
- 2. Use the RF cable (included) to connect the unit and TV/Monitor.
- 3. Use the AC adapter (included) to connect a suitable wall outlet. The supplied 9V adapter operates on AC 120V  $\sim$  60Hz.
- 4. Turn on your TV and and switch TV's channel selection to Channel 4.


#### Note:

 If a local TV Station happens to broadcast on Channel 4, we recommend you switch the unit's RF Output Channel to Channel 3 (and switch TV to Channel 3), following the instructions on Page 13.



# Option Two: Using the AV Cable to Connect a TV

- 1. Connect an antenna cable to the RF IN terminal on the rear of the unit.
- 2. Use the AV Cable (not included) to connect the unit and TV/Monitor.
- Use the AC adapter (included) to connect a suitable wall outlet. The supplied 9V adapter operates on AC 120V ~ 60Hz.
- 4. Turn on your TV and follow the instructions included with it to select the "AV IN" function.



Warning: This system does not support cable TV.

# STEP 3: SETTING THE OSD LANGUAGE

- Press the MENU button on the remote control
- Use the ◀/▶ buttons to select the OPTION menu.
- 3. Use the ▼ button to select Language then press the ENTER button or the ▶ button.
- Use the ▲ / ▼ buttons to select English / Español (Spanish) / Français (French).
- Press the EXIT button on the remote control to exit menu.



## STEP 4: SEARCHING FOR CHANNELS AUTOMATICALLY

# STEP 5: VIEWING THE TV CHANNEL



- For channels 10 to 69, enter the two-digit channel number.

## Remote Control



## 1) MUTE Button

Press to turn off the sound.

#### 2) MENU Button

Press to display the on-screen menu or switch back to the previous menu screen.

## 3) CURSOR (▲, ▼, ◄, ▶) Buttons

Use to highlight selections on a menu screen and adjust certain settings.

#### **ENTER Button**

Confirm selection on a menu screen.

#### 4) INFO Button

Press to display information on the current channel

### 5) VOL + / VOL - Button

Press to increase/decrease the volume.

## 6) CC Button

Press to change the Closed Caption appearance. This function only works on programs broadcasted with captions.

## 7) STANDBY/ON Button

Press to turn ON the unit or put it in STANDBY (OFF) mode.

#### 8) EXIT Button

Press to exit from the on-screen menu or a pop-up display.

#### 9) SIGNAL Button

Press to display TV signal quality.

## 10) CH ▲ / CH ▼ Buttons

Press to select the channel upward or downward.

#### 11) NUMERIC Buttons

Press to enter numbers or go directly to a specific channel.


#### 12) LAST CH

Press to switch repeatedly between the last two channels displayed.



#### 1) Remote Sensor

Receives infrared signals from the remote control.

Green: power on Red: standby mode

#### 5) ANTENNA RF IN Terminal

Connect the AIR antenna.

#### 6) TV RF OUT Terminal

Use to connect your TV using a coaxial cable. Analog RF signals output from the TV RF OUT terminal.

#### 7) AUDIO OUT / VIDEO OUT Jacks

Outputs audio/video signals to a connected




Rear of Unit


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# **POWER SUPPLY**

## Using the AC Adapter

The supplied 9V adapter operates on AC 120V ~ 60Hz.

While the AC adapter is connected and the unit is on standby, power will be consumed and the power indicator is RED.



#### Cautions:

- · The AC adapter included with this unit is for its use only. Do not use it with other equipment.
- When the unit is not going to be used for a long period of time, disconnect the AC adapter from the AC power outlet.
- When the AC adapter is plugged in, the apparatus is not completely disconnected from the main power supply, even when the power is turned off.

# Turning on the Unit

Press the **USTANDBY/ON** button to turn on the unit. The power indicator is GREEN.

# **BASIC OPERATION**

## Searching for Channels Automatically

- 1. Press the **MENU** button on the remote control.
- Use the ◀/▶ buttons to select the CHANNEL menu.
- Use the ▼ button to select Channel Scan and press the ENTER button or the ► button to start scanning.

#### Notes:

- The unit MUST be connected to an antenna in order to receive digital TV signals.
- If you wish to stop scanning in the middle of the scanning process, press the ENTER button.



## Viewing the TV Channel

Viewing a television station after searching for channels.

Press the CH ▲ / CH ▼ buttons to select a channel, or press the number button on the remote to select the channel you want to watch.

- · For channels 1 to 9, enter a one-digit channel number.
- · For channels 10 to 69, enter the two-digit channel number.

## Adjusting the Volume

You can control the volume using the buttons on the remote control.

#### VOL-/VOL+ Buttons

Use these buttons to increase or decrease the volume.

#### MUTE Button

This button is used to mute the sound of the unit. No audio will be heard once this button is pressed.

To cancel the mute action, press the MUTE button again.

# Viewing the Information

You can view information for the current TV program by pressing the INFO button on the remote control.

#### The INFO shows:

- The major channel number and the minor channel number if you are viewing a digital channel
- · Current time and date
- · Program title and other information if available
- · The current program's rating
- · Broadcast format of current program
- Multilingual
- Caption

#### To hide INFO:

Press the INFO button again or press the EXIT button.

# Viewing Signal

To view the signal quality, press the **SIGNAL** button on the remote control. A beep sound will be heard.

# **ON-SCREEN MENU - CHANNEL**

Use the menu configuration to set detailed options for each function. Press the **MENU** button on the remote control to open the menu screen.

- To return to the previous menu press the **MENU** button on the remote control.
- To exit the menu screen press the EXIT button on the remote control.

#### Channel Scan

See "Searching for Channels Automatically" for details.

#### Channel Add

- 1. Press the **MENU** button on the remote control.
- Use the ◀/▶ buttons to select the CHANNEL menu.
- 3. Use the ▼ button to select Channel Add then press the ENTER button or the ▶ button.

Note: Valid channels which are already stored before you use Channel Add will be skipped during the channel scan process.



#### Channel Edit

- 1. Press the MENU button on the remote control.
- Use the ◀/▶ buttons to select the CHANNEL menu.
- 3. Use the ▼ button to select Channel Edit then press the **ENTER** button or the ▶ button
- 4. Use the ▲ / ▼ buttons to select the channel number then press the ENTER button.



## Manual Scan

In the case of Terrestrial TV with an indoor/outdoor antenna. Channel Scan may not find all existing channels because a certain channel may require the antenna to be adjusted to different orientation. You can add such a channel by entering the channel number manually.

- 1 Press the MENU button on the remote control
- 2 Use the ◀/▶ buttons to select the CHANNEL menu.
- Use the ▼ button to select Manual Scan then press the ENTER button or the ▶ button.
- 4. Use the ▲ / ▼ buttons to select the channel number then press the ENTER button.



# **ON-SCREEN MENU - CHANNEL**

#### **Output Channel**

You can select NTSC RF output channel.


- 1. Press the MENU button on the remote control.

- 4. Use the ▲ / ▼ buttons to select the channel number.

### Clock

## Aspect Ratio

- 1. Press the MENU button on the remote control.
- Use the ◀/▶ buttons to select the OPTION menu.
- Use the ▼ button to select Aspect Ratio then press the ENTER button or the ► button.
- Use the ▲/▼ buttons to select the options (Set By Program/ Letter Box/Cropped/Squeezed).



Set By Program: Displays all programs based on the aspect ratio of the program.

Letter Box: Displays all programs in 16:9 aspect ratio.

**Cropped:** No change on the ratio, but the picture is cropped. **Squeezed:** All programs are displayed to fit on the screen.

# **ON-SCREEN MENU - OPTION**

#### Language

- 1. Press the **MENU** button on the remote control.
- Use the ◀/▶ buttons to select the OPTION menu.
- Use the ▼ button to select Language then press the ENTER button or the ► button.
- Use the ▲ / ▼ buttons to select English / Español (Spanish) / Français (French).



## Audio Language

When you change the channel on Digital TV, you may be able to listen to the audio in an alternate language by selecting the appropriate language option. If there is no selected audio language, the primary audio signal transmitted by the TV broadcaster is selected automatically.

Note: Not all TV channels broadcast with multiple languages.

- 1. Press the MENU button on the remote control.
- Use the ◀/▶ buttons to select the OPTION menu.
- Use the ▼ button to select Audio Language then press the ENTER button or the ► button.
- Use the ▲ / ▼ buttons to select the audio language (English / Spanish / French).



# Caption Select

- Press the MENU button on the remote control.
- Use the ◀/▶ buttons to select the OPTION menu.
- Use the ▼ button to select Caption Select then press the ENTER button or the ▶ button.
- Use the ▲/▼ buttons to select the options (ACC/DCC/DCC Service). "ACC" is Analog TV Closed Caption. "DCC" is Digital TV Closed Caption.
- Use the ◀/▶ buttons to make adjustments.



Standard: Use the default digital caption style from broadcaster.

Custom: Activate the DCC View item and set your desired font settings.

#### Notes:

- If DCC (Digital Closed Caption) is set to Custom, DCC View is activated.
- Caption is essential for a hearing-impaired person.
- If both ACC (Analog Closed Caption) and DCC are on service and both settings are ON, only DCC is displayed.
- ACC is available only when DCC is OFF.

# **ON-SCREEN MENU - OPTION**

#### DCC View

Use this to set the character font. Only DCC (Digital Closed Caption) is set to Custom, DCC View is activated.

- 1. Press the **MENU** button on the remote control.
- Use the ◀/▶ buttons to select the OPTION menu.
- Use the ▼ button to select DCC View then press the ENTER button or the ► button.
- Use the ▲/▼ buttons to select the options, then use the ◀/► buttons to make adjustments.

#### Notes:

 To activate DCC View, DCC on Caption Select should be set to 'Custom'.



## Sleep Mode (Power Save Mode)

This product is currently set to Power Save Mode (Sleep mode). It will not rececive TV signal after 4 hours of inactivity.

- 1. Press the MENU button on the remote control.
- Use the ◀/▶ buttons to select the OPTION menu.
- Use the ▼ button to select Sleep Mode then press the ENTER button or the ► button.
- Use the ▲ / ▼ buttons to select the options (Off / 1 hour / 2 hours / 4 hours / 8 hours).

# Lock System

- Press the MENU button on the remote control.
- Use the ◀/▶ buttons to select the LOCK menu.
- Use the ▼ button to position the cursor on the input field and enter password. If you have not specified the password, input the factory-default code, "0000".
- 4. Use the ▲ / ▼ buttons to select Lock System then press the ENTER button or the ▶ button.
- Use the ▲ / ▼ buttons to select On/Off.

#### Set Password



## Cleaning the Unit
