


PREPARING THE VIVICAM 8400

Installing the Batteries

You can use 2 AA size batteries to power the ViviCam 8400. Make sure that the power of the ViviCam 8400 is off before inserting or removing the batteries.

- 1. Make sure the ViviCam 8400 is turned off.
- 2. Open the battery cover.
- Insert the batteries in the correct orientation as shown in the illustration.
- 4. Close the battery cover.
 - To remove the batteries, turn the Vivicam 8400 off and hold the camera with the battery compartment facing upward. Then open the battery cover.






- Be careful not to drop the batteries when opening or closing the battery cover.
- While alkaline batteries offer limited use, Ni-MH rechargeable type AA batteries are strongly recommended for performance and economy.

Using the AC Power Adapter (Optional Accessory)

Use of the AC power adapter is recommended if you intend to use the LCD monitor for a long time or connect the ViviCam 8400 to a PC.

- 1. Make sure your ViviCam 8400 is turned off.
- Connect one end of the AC power adapter to the camera jack labeled "DC IN 3.0V".
- 3. Connect the other end to an electrical outlet.






- Make sure to use only the AC power adapter specified for the ViviCam 8400. Damage caused by the use of an incorrect adapter is not covered under the warranty.
- To prevent unexpected auto power off resulting from no battery power left during the process of transferring your images to the computer, use the AC power adapter as a power supply or a freshly-charged pair of Ni-MH batteries.
- The AC power adapter can only be used to power the ViviCam 8400. Batteries cannot be charged inside the ViviCam 8400.

Inserting and Removing an SD Memory Card (Optional Accessory)


The ViviCam 8400 comes with 32MB of internal memory, allowing you to store captured still images or video clips in the ViviCam 8400. You can also expand the memory capacity by using an optional SD (Secure Digital) memory card so that you can store more files.

- Make sure your ViviCam 8400 is turned off before inserting or removing a memory card.
- 2. Open the SD memory card cover.
- Insert an SD memory card in the correct orientation as shown in the illustration and press downward until it clicks into place.
- 4. Close the battery/SD memory card cover.
 - To remove the SD memory card, make sure the ViviCam 8400 is turned off. Press lightly on the edge of the memory card and it will eject.






- Be sure to format an SD memory card with this ViviCam 8400 before using it. Refer to section in the manual titled "Formatting an SD Memory Card or Internal Memory" for further details.
- To prevent valuable data from being accidentally erased from an SD card, you can slide the write protect tab (on the side of the SD memory card) to "LOCK".
- To save, edit, or erase data on an SD memory card, you must unlock the card.
- The ViviCam 8400, like most digital cameras will automatically use a memory card if it is inserted into the memory card slot. This is called "card preference". Data stored in internal memory will not be accessible if a memory card is present. To again access your data stored in internal memory, simply remove the SD card.

- To turn the power off, press the ① button again.

 - The [Set-up1] menu is displayed.
- 2. Use ▼ to select [Language], then press the ® button.
- 3. Use ▲ or ▼ to select the language you want.

Setting the Date and Time

Follow the steps below to set the date display style, current date and time.

- Rotate the mode dial to f and turn your ViviCam 8400 on by pressing the Φ button.
 - The [Set-up1] menu is displayed.
- 2. Use ▼ to select [Date & Time], then press the 🕟 button.
 - You may press or b to switch the date types.
- Press the ◀ / ▶ buttons to select Year, Month, Day and Time fields.
 - To increase a value, press the button.
 - To decrease a value, press the ▼ button.
 - The time is displayed in 24-hour format.
- 4. Press the 🕟 button after all fields are set.





Formatting an SD Memory Card or Internal Memory

The term "Formatting" means preparing an "SD Memory Card" to record images; this process is also called "initialization". This utility formats the internal memory (or memory card) and erases all stored images and data.

- Rotate the mode dial to \$\mathbf{f}\$ and turn your ViviCam 8400 on by pressing the \$\mathbf{O}\$ button.
 - The [Set-up1] menu is displayed.
- 2. Use ▼ to select [Format], then press the ^(N) button.
- 3. Use ▲ or ▼ to select [Yes], then press the ⊚ button to confirm.








- When you format an SD memory card, be aware that all data of which will be permanently erased. Protected images are also erased.
- To format the internal memory, do not insert a memory card into the ViviCam 8400. Otherwise, you will format the memory card.
- Formatting is an irreversible action and data cannot be recovered at a later time.
- An SD memory card having any problem cannot be properly formatted.
- If your SD card cannot be formatted, you should use a different card.

Using the LCD Monitor

Your ViviCam 8400 is equipped with a 2.0" full color TFT LCD monitor to help you compose images, replay recorded images/video clips or adjust menu settings. The mode icons, text and numbers displayed on the monitor may vary according to the current settings.

- 1. Rotate the mode dial to A, P, SCENE, Tv, Av, M or A.
- 2. Press the ① button to turn on the power.
- 3. Compose your scene on the LCD monitor.
- 4. Press the shutter button.





- The LCD monitor darkens in strong sunlight or bright light. This is not a malfunction.
- To prevent your images from being blurred while pressing the shutter button, always hold it carefully. This is especially important when you are shooting under low lighting conditions, when your ViviCam 8400 will select a slower shutter speed to ensure that your images are properly exposed.

PHOTOGRAPHY MODE

Shooting Images - The Basics

- 1. Rotate the mode dial to **A**, **P**, **SCENE**, **Tv**, **Av** or **M** and turn your ViviCam 8400 on by pressing the ① button.
- Compose the image on the monitor screen so that the main subject is within the focus frame.
- 3. Press the shutter button down half way to focus the image.
 - When you press the shutter button down half way, the ViviCam 8400's Auto Focus feature automatically focuses the image and determines the exposure.
- Press the shutter button the rest of the way down to capture the image.





- The actual image will appear to be larger after being captured than it initially looked on the LCD.
- Pressing the m/ |□| button switches the LCD monitor display mode. Each time you press the m/ |□| button, the display changes in the following order: Focus Frame On → Indicators Off → Composition Line On → LCD Off.

Setting Image Resolution and Quality

As you get to know the ViviCam 8400, you can set the image resolution (number of vertical and horizontal pixels) and image quality (compression ratio) based on the types of images you want to shoot. These settings affect the number of images that can be stored in memory, or on a memory card.

Higher resolution and higher quality images provide finer detail but cause the images' file size to be larger.

To change image resolution or image quality, perform these steps below:

- Rotate the mode dial to A , P , SCENE , Tv , Av or M and turn your ViviCam 8400 on by pressing the O button.
- Press the
 ☐ button, then use
 ✓ or
 ▼ to select the [Mode1] / [Mode2] / [Mode3] menu.
 - In A (Auto) Mode, press 🗉 to access in menu directly.
- 3. Use ▼ to select [Image Size], then press the [®] button.
- Use ▲ or ▼ to select the desired setting, then press the leading button to confirm.
- 5. Follow the step 3 and 4 above to set the [Quality].







- The possible number of shots and recording time depend on the storage size, resolution and quality settings and the subject of the image to be captured.
- You can resize the images later. (Please refer to section in this manual titled "Resizing an Image" for further detail.)


Using th∈ Zoom Function

This ViviCam 8400 is equipped with a 3x optical zoom lens allowing you to capture telephoto or wide-angle shots. By using the optical zoom function, images appear closer by pressing the ♣ button, or smaller by pressing the ♣ button.

You can further enlarge the subjects with 4x digital zoom by continuing to hold the zoom button. This can be a useful feature, however the more the image is magnified with the digital zoom, the grainier the resulting image will be.

To capture a zoomed image, perform the following steps:

- 1. Press the ① button to turn on the power.
- 2. Adjust the magnification ratio by using the 4 / 444 button.
 - To access the optical zoom function, press the ∮ button as far as it can go. Press it again to activate the digital zoom.
 - To exit the zoom photography, press continuously the ••••
 button
 - The status of digital magnification is displayed on the LCD monitor.
- 3. Compose your scene and press the shutter button.






- The digital magnification ranges from 1.0x to 4.0x.
- As you record video clips, the zoom function cannot be activated.

Setting Focus

- 1. Rotate the mode dial to A , P , SCENE , Tv , Av or M.
- 2. Press 🛦 / 🚜 🛕.
- 3. Use ▲ or ▼ to select the desired focus mode.
- 4. Compose your scene and press the shutter button.




The table below will help you choose the appropriate focus mode:

Focus mode		Description
*	Macro	Select macro to capture close-up images. When the lens is zoomed to its widest position you may focus on objects as close as 5 cm. When the lens is zoomed to its telephoto position (3x zoom) you can focus as close as 30 cm.
*	Infinity	The infinity setting is useful for shooting through glass and at other times when you wish to lock on a subject at a long distance.
AF	Auto Focus	Select auto focus for most occasions when you want the ViviCam 8400 to automatically determine the focus setting. Using AF, any object at a distance of 50 cm or greater can be in focus.

Using the Flash

The flash is designed to function automatically when lighting conditions warrant the use of flash. The ViviCam 8400 has four flash modes: Auto Flash (default), Red Eye Reduction, Forced Flash and No Flash. You can record an image using a flash mode that best suits your requirements.

- 1. Rotate the mode dial to ${\bf A}$, ${\bf P}$, ${\bf SCENE}$, ${\bf Tv}$, ${\bf Av}$ or ${\bf M}$.
- 2. Press the ① button to turn on the power.
- Toggle ◀ / ¼ until your desired flash mode appears on the LCD monitor.
- 4. Compose your image and press the shutter button.



The table below will help you to choose the appropriate flash mode:


Flash mode	Description
¼A AUTO FLASH	The flash fires automatically to suit the photographic conditions.
## RED EYE REDUCTION	Use this mode to reduce the red-eye effect when you want to take natural-looking photographs of people and animals in low-light conditions. When taking photographs of people, the red-eye effect can be reduced by increasing the room lighting if possible and having your subject not look directly into the camera. The camera's pre-flash and slight delay in this mode will also help to improve your images.
5 FORCED FLASH	The flash will always fire regardless of the surrounding brightness. Select this mode for recording images with high contrast (backlighting) and deep shadows.
③ NO FLASH	Use this mode if the use of flash is prohibited or if the distance to the subject is greater than the flash's maximum range. The camera will adjust its exposure and shutter speed to give the best results. A tripod will improve your images.

Using the Self-Timer

The self-timer can be used in situations such as group shots. When using this option, you should either mount the ViviCam 8400 on a tripod (recommended) or rest it on a flat, level surface.

- 1. Secure the ViviCam 8400 to a tripod or place it on a stable surface.
- 2. Rotate the mode dial to A , P , SCENE , Tv , Av or M.
- 3. Press the 0 button to turn on the power.
- Toggle ► / ७ until your desired self-timer mode appears on the LCD monitor.

- 5. Compose your image and press the shutter button.
 - The self-timer function is activated.
 - The image is recorded after the preset interval.
 - To cancel the self-timer at any time, press the ① button, switch the mode dial to another mode or press ▶ to disrupt the sequence.



- After one shot is taken, the self-timer mode is turned off.
- If you wish to take another image using the self-timer, repeat these steps.

Adjusting the Exposure (EV Compensation)

You can manually adjust the exposure determined by the ViviCam 8400. Use this mode when the proper exposure cannot be obtained, for example, when the contrast (difference between light and dark) between the subject and the background is extremely large. The EV compensation can be adjusted over a range of -2.0EV to +2.0EV.

- 1. Rotate the mode dial to P, SCENE, Tv, Av or M.
- 2. Press the ① button to turn on the power.
- Press ▼/ ☑.
- Use ◀ or ▶ to set the range of EV compensation to a value between -2.0EV and +2.0EV.
- 5. To exit from the menu, press the
 button.



Setting White Balance

This feature lets you make adjustments to compensate for different lighting types according to your shooting conditions.

- 1. Rotate the mode dial to P , SCENE , Tv , Av or M.
- 2. Press the ① button to turn on the power.
- 3. Press [3], then the [Mode1] menu is displayed.
- 4. Use ▼ to select [W. Balance], then press the 🕟 button.
- Use ▲ or ▼ to select the desired setting, then press the lower to confirm.
- 6. To exit from the menu, press the 🗉 button.







USING THE MODE DIAL

Simple Mode [A]

A (Auto) mode is the simplest way which allows you to take still pictures without having to set special functions or manual adjustments. The ViviCam 8400 sets the optimal focusing and exposure.

- Rotate the mode dial to A and turn your ViviCam 8400 on by pressing the O button.
- Compose your image with your main subject in the center of the focus frame
- 3. Press the shutter button down halfway to focus the image.
 - When you press the shutter button down half way, the ViviCam 8400's Auto Focus feature automatically focuses the image. Proper exposure is determined and locked at the same time.
 - With the shutter button held, you can reframe your image and the main subject will still be correctly exposed and in focus.
- 4. Press the shutter button the rest of the way down to capture the image.



Program Mod∈ [P]

In the **P** (Program) mode, the ViviCam 8400 automatically sets the shutter speed and aperture for taking still images. You can adjust other functions, such as flash mode or continuous shooting mode.

- Rotate the mode dial to P and turn your ViviCam 8400 on by pressing the O button.
- Compose your image with your main subject in the center of the focus frame.
- 3. Press the shutter button to capture the image.



Shutter Speed Priority Mode [Tv]

If you set a fast shutter speed, you can capture images of moving subjects that look as if they are still. If you set a slow shutter speed, you can capture images that give the impression that the subject is in motion.

- Rotate the mode dial to Tv and turn your ViviCam 8400 on by pressing the O button. A guide appears for a few seconds.
- 2. Press the button.
- 3. Set the shutter speed with ◀ or ▶, and press the ® button.
- 4. Compose your image on the LCD display.
- 5. Press the shutter button to capture the image.



Aperture Priority Mode [Av]

In this mode, images are captured with the priority given to aperture. The shutter speed is automatically set according to the aperture. The aperture will affect the depth-of-field of the picture.

If you set a large aperture (lower F value), you can capture portrait images with an out-of-focus background. Alternatively, if you set a small aperture (higher F value), both close objects and distant objects will be in focus, for example when capturing subjects in the foreground together with landscape images.

- Rotate the mode dial to Av and turn your ViviCam 8400 on by pressing the O button. A guide appears for a few seconds.
- 2. Press the (button.
- 3. Set the aperture value with ◀ or ▶, and press the ⊚ button.
- 4. Compose your image on the LCD display.
- 5. Press the shutter button to capture the image.



Manual Mode [M]

In manual mode, the aperture value and the shutter speed can be varied individually. This can be useful compensating for tricky lighting conditions, for getting creative results or for capturing night-time scenes.

- Rotate the mode dial to M and turn your ViviCam 8400 on by pressing the O button. A guide appears for a few seconds.
- 2. Press the (button.
- 3. Use ▲ or ▼ to select aperture/shutter speed item.
- 4. Adjust the value with ◀ or ▶, and press the 🕟 button.
- 5. Compose your image on the LCD display.
- 6. Press the shutter button to capture the image.



Scene Mode [SCENE]

You can select the Picture mode according to the shooting scene. There are 4 available modes in Picture mode.

- [👱] Night scene: This mode allows you to take photographs of people against a dusk or night-time background.
- [📤] Landscape: This mode allows you to take photographs of distant scenery or landscapes.
- I A 1 Portrait: Select this mode to make people stand out with the background out-of-focus.
- Sport: This mode allows you to shoot fast moving objects.
- Rotate the mode dial to SCENE and turn your ViviCam 8400 on by pressing the ① button. A guide appears for a few seconds.
- 2. Press the button.
- 3. Use ◀ or ▶ to select the desired scene mode.
- 4. Press the button to confirm the selection.
- 5. Compose your image on the LCD display.
- 6. Press the shutter button to capture the image.





■ Press the shuter button halfway to confirm that the exposure is set correctly on the LCD monitor.

ADVANCED SHOOTING

Burst

This mode is used for continuous shooting. Pictures are taken continuously while the shutter release button is pressed.

- Rotate the mode dial to A , P , SCENE , Tv , Av or M and turn your ViviCam 8400 on by pressing the Φ button.
 - In **A** (Auto) Mode, press 🗉 to access in menu directly.
- 2. Press [□] , then use ▶ to select the [Mode2] menu.
- 3. Use ▼ to select [Capture Mode], then press the

 key button.
- 4. Use ▲ or ▼ to select [Burst], then press the

 button.
- 5. To exit from the menu, press the 🗉 button.
 - The 🔄 indicator is displayed on the monitor screen.
- 6. Press the shutter button halfway to lock the focus.
- 7. Press the shutter button all the way to shoot.
 - Shooting will stop when the shutter button is released.







■ In Burst mode, the flash mode will be set to **OFF** automatically.

Auto Exposure Bracketing (AEB)

In this mode, the ViviCam 8400 automatically varies the exposure within a set range to take three shots after you press the shutter button once. AEB settings can be combined with exposure compensation settings to extend the adjustment range.

- Rotate the mode dial to A, P, SCENE, Tv, Av or M and turn your ViviCam 8400 on by pressing the O button.
 - In A (Auto) Mode, press 🖹 to access in menu directly.
- 2. Press 🖹 , then use ▶ to select the [Mode2] menu.
- 3. Use ▼ to select [Capture Mode], then press the 🕟 button.
- 4. Use ▲ or ▼ to select [AEB], then press the ^(R) button.
- 5. To exit from the menu, press the 🖽 button.
 - The indicator is displayed on the monitor screen.
- 6. Press the shutter button to capture the series of 3 images, each with different exposures.







■ In AEB mode, the flash mode will be set to **OFF** automatically.

Selecting the Metering Mode

You can select the metering mode that sets which part of the subject to measure to determine the exposure.

- 1. Rotate the mode dial to P, SCENE, Tv, Av or M and turn your ViviCam 8400 on by pressing the ① button.
- 2. Press 🖼 . then use ▶ to select the [Mode2] menu.
- 3. Use ▼ to select [Metering], then press the (button.
- - [⊡ Center-Weighted]: Averages the light metered from the entire frame, but gives greater weight to the subject matter at the center
 - [■ Spot]: Meters the area within the spot automatic exposure point frame at the center of the LCD monitor.
- 5. To exit from the menu, press the 🗉 button.
- 6. Compose your image in the LCD display.
- 7. Press the shutter button to capture the image.





PLAYBACK MODE - THE BASICS

Viewing Images

You can display the still images you have just captured.

- 1. Press the ¹ button to turn on the ViviCam 8400.
- 2. Press the (Playback) button.
 - The last recorded image appears on the LCD monitor.
- 3. Use ◀ or ▶ to select the desired images.
 - To view the previous image, press the button.
 - To view the next image, press the ▶ button.





- The playback information displayed on the LCD monitor will disappear after a few seconds.
- If there is no image stored in the internal memory or on the memory card. a [No Image] message will appear on the monitor.

Magnifying Images

While reviewing your images, you may enlarge a selected portion of an image. This magnification allows you to view fine details. The zoom factor displayed on the screen shows the current magnification ratio.

- 1. Press the ▶ (Playback) button.
 - The last recorded image appears on the LCD monitor.
 - To view the previous image, press the button.
 - To view the next image, press the button.
- 2. Adjust the zoom ratio by using the Zoom *** / \$\ddot\$ button.
 - To enlarge the selected image, press the ∮ button.
 - To return to the normal image, press the *** button.
 - The magnification factor is displayed on the LCD monitor.
- To view different portion of the images, press the ▲ / ▼ / ◀ / ▶ button to adjust the display area.





■ The magnification factors range from 1x to 4x (within 7 stages: 1.0x, 1.5x, 2.0x, 2.5x, 3.0x, 3.5x and 4.0x).

Thumbnail Display

This function allows you to view 9 thumbnail images on the LCD monitor simultaneously so you may search for a particular image.

- 1. Press the ▶ (Playback) button.
 - The last recorded image appears on the LCD monitor.
- 2. Press the ## / B button once.
 - Nine thumbnail images are displayed simultaneously.
 - For recorded video clips, the ¥ video mode icon will be displayed.
- Use the ▲ / ▼ / ◀ / ▶ button to move the cursor to select the image to be displayed at regular size.
- 4. Press the w button to display the selected image on full screen.



Slideshow Display

The slide show function enables you to play your images back automatically in sequential order. This is very useful for reviewing recorded images and for presentations.

- 1. Press the 🕑 (Playback) button.
 - The last recorded image appears on the LCD monitor.
- 2. Press [3]. The [Playback1] menu is displayed.
- 3. Use ▼ to select [Slide Show] and press the 🕟 button.
- Use ▲ or ▼ to set the playback interval, then press the ⊗ button.
 - The slide show starts.
 - The video clips display only the first frame image and are not played back.
 - To stop slide show, press the button.







■ You can adjust the slide show display interval within the range of 3 Sec., 5 Sec., 10 Sec.

Resizing an Image

You can change the image size of a captured image to one of the following sizes: 2848 x 2136 pixel, 2272 x 1704 pixel, 1600 x 1200 pixel and 640 x 480 pixel.

- 1. Press the (Playback) button.
 - The last recorded image appears on the LCD monitor.
- 2. In ▶ (Playback) mode, use ◀ or ▶ to select the desired images.
 - To view the previous image, press the ◀ button.
 - To view the next image, press the button.
- 3. Press 🗉 , then use ▶ to select the [Playback2] menu.
- 4. Use ▲ or ▼ to select [Resize] and press the ^(S) button.





VIDEO MODE

Recording Video Clips

This mode allows you to record video clips with sound using the built-in microphone.

- 2. Press the shutter button to start recording.
- 3. To stop recording, press the shutter button again.







- The zoom function of optical zoom (3x) can be activated before you start to record video clips.
- Pressing the m/ |□| button switches the LCD monitor display mode. Each time you press the m/ |□| button, the display changes in the following order: Focus Frame On → Indicators Off → Composition Line On → LCD Off.

Playing Back Video Clips

You can play back recorded video clips. A guide to operation appears on the LCD monitor during the video playback.

- 1. Press the (Playback) button.
- Use ◀ or ▶ to go through the images until the video clip you want to play back is displayed.
 - To view the previous image, press the button.
 - To view the next image, press the button.
- 3. Press the button to start playing back the video clips.
 - To pause or resume video playback, press the
 button again.





- The playback information displayed on the LCD monitor will disappear after a few seconds.
- The zoom function cannot be activated while playing the video clips.
- To playback the video clips on the computer, we recommend using Windows Media Player 9.0 (WMP 9.0).



PLAYBACK MODE - ADVANCED FEATURES

Playing Back Still Images/Video Clips on TV

You can also playback your images on a TV screen. Before connecting to any device, make sure to select NTSC/PAL system to match the video output system of the video equipment you are going to connect to the ViviCam 8400, then turn all devices off.

- Connect one end of the A/V cable to the A/V terminal of the ViviCam 8400.
- 2. Connect the other end to the A/V input jacks of the TV set.
- 3. Turn on the TV and ViviCam 8400.
- 4. Playback the images/video clips.
 - The method of operation is the same as playing back still images and video clips on the ViviCam 8400.





■ The sound recorded with video clips can only be played back on TV or computers.

Deleting Images/Video Clips

Use this function to delete one or all images/video clips stored in the internal memory or memory card. Please note that the deleted images or video clips cannot be recovered. Exercise caution before deleting a file.

- 2. Press the D button.
 - The last recorded image appears on the LCD monitor.
- 3. Use ◀ or ▶ to select the image you want to delete.
- 4. Press the m button.
- Use ▲ or ▼ to select [This Image] or [All Images], then press the ⊗ button.
- - If you wish to cancel the deletion, select [No].







■ Protected images cannot be deleted with the delete function.

Protecting Images/Video Clips

Sets the data to read-only to prevent images from being erased by mistake.

- 1. Press the **(Playback)** button.
 - The last recorded image appears on the LCD monitor.
- 2. In ▶ (Playback) mode, use ◀ or ▶ to select the desired images.
 - To view the previous image, press the ■ button.
 - To view the next image, press the ▶ button.
- 3. Press []. The [Playback1] menu is displayed.
- 4. Use ▼ to select [Protect] and press the 🔊 button.
- 5. Use ▲ or ▼ to choose the desired setting, then press the
 - ® button.
 - [Protect One]: Protect one image/movie.
 - [Protect All]: Protect all images/movies (at once).
- 6. Use ▲ or ▼ to select [Lock], then press the

 button to confirm.
 - Press ত to return to the ▶ (Playback) mode.

 The indicator appears on the selected image.
 - If you wish to cancel the protect function, select [Unlock].







Connecting to a PictBridge Compliant Printer

Even if you do not have a computer, you can connect the camera directly to a printer that supports PictBridge to perform image selection and printing using the camera monitor screen and controls. You may also specify which images you want to print and how many copies of each should be printed.

Connecting the camera to the printer

- Press ► to select the [Set-up2] menu, then use ▼ to select [USB Model.
- 3. Use ▲ or ▼ to select [PictBridge], then press the [®] button.
- 4. Connect your camera and the printer via a supplied USB cable.
 - The screen turns off automatically and the setting screen wil appear on the monitor after a few seconds.



Printing images

When the camera is properly connected to a PictBridge compliant printer, the [Printing Mode Select] screen is displayed on the monitor. Use ▲ or ▼ to select the print mode.




