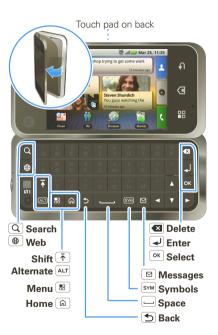
When you open your phone, the screen rotates and you can use the touch pad **on the back of the display** ("BACKTRACK[™] Pad" on page 6):

Start MOTOBLUR

When you first turn on your phone, you need to create or log into **your MOTOBLUR account**. MOTOBLUR brings together your contacts, email, messages, and status information from your other accounts. It then updates all of your accounts when you make changes. There's more about "Your MOTOBLUR Account" on



page 11. Registration is secure and should only take a few minutes:

- 1 Press Power ① on top of your phone to turn it on.
- 2 Select a language.
- 3 Log in or register: Enter your name, your current email address (where MOTOBLUR can send account information), and a new MOTOBLUR account password.

- 4 To add accounts to MOTOBLUR, touch an account and enter the user name or email and password you set up on it.
- 5 After you sign in, touch Contacts, then touch Menu 😁 > More > Settings > Import from SIM card. Touch OK to import your SIM contacts.

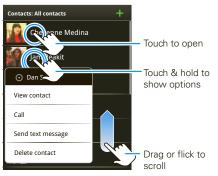


Touchscreen & Keys

Touchscreen Tips

- Touch: Choose an icon or option.
- Touch & Hold: Open options.
- Drag: Scroll or move slowly.
- Flick: Scroll or move quickly.

Tip: If your screen goes to sleep, press Power ① to wake it up.

Home Screen

The *home screen* gives you all your latest information in one place. It's what you see when you turn on the phone or touch Home **(a)** from a menu. It's basically like this:

Widgets

Touch to open, or touch & hold to move or delete.

Flick left or right to open more panels of widgets.

Shortcuts

Open the main menu.

Use & Change Your Home Screen

On your home screen, *shortcuts* are icons that open your favorite apps, Web bookmarks, contacts, mail labels, or music playlists. *Widgets* show you news, weather, messages, and other updates.

Flick the home screen left or right to open other *panels* of shortcuts and widgets.



Home Screen Tips

• To **open** something, touch it. Touch Home (a) to return to the home screen.

To **change** a widget's settings, open it and then touch Menu **S** > **Setup**.

- To add something to the screen, touch and hold an empty spot until the home screen menu opens. From there, you can add shortcuts, widgets, or folders, or change your wallpaper.
- To move or delete something, touch and hold it until you feel a vibration, then drag it to another spot, another panel, or the trash at the bottom of the screen.

Phone Status & Notifications

At the top of the screen, icons on the left notify you about new messages or events (flick the bar down for details). Icons on the right tell you about phone status:

Calls

Find it:

Dialer



During a call, touch Menu 🔠 to choose **Hold**, **New call**, or **Use Bluetooth**. When the touchscreen goes dark, you can press Power **()**, to wake it up.

Voicemail

When you have a new voicemail, ∞ shows at the top of your screen. To hear the voicemail, touch **C Dialer**, then touch and hold **1**

If you need to change your voicemail number, in the home screen touch Menu 📳 > Settings > Call settings > Voicemail.



Social networking

Your MOTOBLUR Account

The first time you turned on your phone, you registered for a MOTOBLUR account that manages your messages, contacts, and more ("Start MOTOBLUR" on page 3). You can log into this account from a computer to upload contacts, reset your password, get help, or even locate your phone: www.motorola.com/mymotoblur

Add Accounts

You can add your **Facebook**, **MySpace**, **Twitter**, or other accounts to your phone. If you don't have accounts, you can visit their Web sites to set them up.

Find it: 💽 > 🌄 Account Settings > Add account

To sign into your account, use the user name or email and password that you set up on that account (the same as on your computer).

Twitter and MySpace messages will always appear as "read" on your phone, but your phone notifies you when you receive a new message. MySpace marks your messages as "read" online.

Group

Press Menu 🔡 to choose which group to show (like All, Favorites, or Facebook).

Create Contacts Contacts List

Touch to view contact information. Touch & hold to edit, delete, and more.

Views

Touch a list view, or flick the display right or left to show:

Tip: No need for a search box; just start typing a name! When you flick or drag this list, a scroll bar appears on the right. Drag the scroll bar to move the list faster.

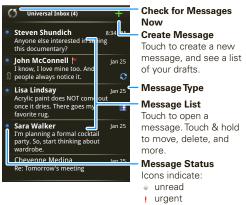

Messaging

Find it: Solution > Messaging > Universal Inbox

Tip: To check for new messages, touch **()**. To see other messages in your inbox, flick or drag up.

Note: Please don't text and drive.



Set Up Email

To add email accounts, touch > C Account Settings > Add account.

 Corporate Sync is for work email accounts on a Microsoft® Exchange Server. Enter your username (username@company.com), password, email address, and server details (server address is the same URL you use to access your company's email using the Web on your computer). Contact your business IT department for server details.

Tip: You might need to enter your domain name with your user name (like *domain/username*).

Note: Some work accounts might require you to add a password lock to your phone, for security.

Email is for most personal email accounts.

To sign into your account, use the user name or email and password that you set up on that account (the same as on your computer). For account details, contact the account provider.

When you sign into your account, you may see your friends and contacts in your **Contacts** list.

To change your settings, touch \bigcirc > \bigcirc Messaging > Menu B, then touch:

- Manage accounts to change your user name or password (or server settings, for email).
- Edit Universal Inbox to choose which accounts show messages in the Universal Inbox.
- Messaging Settings to set the notification for each account type (along with other preferences, for email).

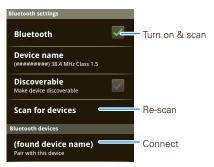

Web

Bluetooth® wireless

Find it: Menu 📳 > Settings > Wireless controls > Bluetooth settings



Turn Bluetooth Power On or Off

Find it: Press and hold Power **O** > Bluetooth

Note: To extend battery life, turn Bluetooth power off when not in use.

Connect New Devices

Note: This feature requires an optional accessory.

To connect with a new device, you need to pair with it. You only need to do this once for each device—to connect again, just turn on the device.



1 Make sure the device you are pairing with is in discoverable mode.

Note: Refer to the guide that came with the device for details.

- 2 Touch Menu 📳 > Settings > Wireless controls > Bluetooth settings.
- **3** Touch **Bluetooth** to turn on and scan. If Bluetooth power is already on, touch **Scan for devices**.
- 4 Touch a device to connect.

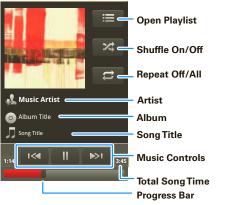

Tips & Tricks

Things You Can Do

Stop pocket dialing	If you put your phone in your pocket, the touchscreen might get touched and accidentally call people.
	To avoid this, press Power 💽 to put the display to sleep. To wake it up, press Power 💽 again.
Go home	Touch Home 🝙 to go to the home screen. There, touch Home 🍙 again to open the app menu.
Call again	Touch C Dialer, then touch the Recent or Frequent tabs.
Open apps again	Touch and hold Home 🝙 to show the last few apps you used.
Open apps on a plane	Press and hold Power ①, then touch Airplane mode in the menu.
Open options	Touch Menu 📳 to open your options for the current screen.
Find stuff	Press Search Q.
Find Wi-Fi stuff	Press and hold Power 🛈 > Wi-Fi .
Let stuff find you	Press and hold Power 🔘 > GPS.



Zoom	In a Web page, touch (to zoom in. It's great for tiny links you want to touch.
Skip	When you're in a list like Contacts , you can press Scroll $\dot{\Phi}$ to scroll up and down. To skip a page at a time, press Shift $\overline{\bullet}$ > Scroll $\dot{\Phi}$. To skip to the top or bottom of the list, press Alternate $\boxed{\mathtt{Att}}$ > Scroll $\dot{\Phi}$.

Battery Tips

Your phone is like a small computer, giving you a lot of information and apps, at 3G speed, with a touch display! Depending on what you use, that can take a lot of power.

To start getting the most out of your battery, touch Menu () > Settings > Battery Manager > Battery Profile. Choose Performance Mode for constant data transfer and battery use, Battery Saver Mode when your battery is low, or Smart Mode if you want to set Battery Profile Options that limit your data and wireless connections during off-peak hours.

The following could reduce battery life between charges:

- recording or watching videos, listening to music, or taking pictures.
- widgets that stream information to your home screen, like news or weather ("Use & Change Your Home Screen" on page 7).
- GPS, Wi-Fi, and Bluetooth[®] use: Press and hold Power (①) to open the Power key menu, then touch items to turn them off or on.



Troubleshooting

FAQs

Why can't I connect my wireless network? Make sure that **Airplane mode** is off in the power menu (press and hold the Power ① button).

Why can't I connect to my 3G network? Try turning your phone off and back on, to make your phone search for the best local network.

Why can't I hear sound? While you are on a call or playing a media file, press the up volume key up.

Crash Recovery

If your phone stops responding, try a quick reset: Remove the battery ("Assemble & Charge" on page 3), then put it back in and turn on your phone.



Specific Absorption Rate (IEEE)

Your model wireless phone meets the governmental requirements for exposure to radio waves. Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured to not exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency. (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government and by the Canadian regulatory authorities. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed for the safety of all persons, regardless of age or health, and to account for any variations in measurements.

The exposure standard for mobile devices employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The IEEE SAR limit set by the FCC and by the Canadian regulatory authorities is 1.6 watts per kilogram (W/kg), averaged over one gram of tissue. Tests for SAR are conducted using procedures accepted by the FCC and by Industry Canada with the mobile device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequencies. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the mobile device while operating can be below the maximum value. This is because the mobile device is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station, the lower the power output.

Before a mobile device is available for sale to the public in the U.S. and Canada, it must be tested and certified to the FCC and Industry Canada that it does not exceed the limit established by each government for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) submitted to the FCC and available for review by Industry Canada. The highest SAR value for this mobile device when tested for use at the ear is 1.37 W/kg, and when worn on the body, as described in this guide, is 0.72 W/kg, The SAR value for this mobile device in its data transmission mode (body-worn use) is



0.72 W/kg. Body-worn measurements can differ, depending upon available accessories and regulatory requirements. The SAR information includes the Motorola testing protocol, assessment procedure, and measurement uncertainty range for this product. While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various mobile devices and at various positions, they meet the governmental requirements for safe exposure. Please note that improvements to this product model could cause differences in the SAR value for later products; in all cases, products are designed to be within the guidelines.
