

# USING THE REMOTE CONTROL

# USING THE REMOTE CONTROL

- This remote control is magnetic and can be attached to most refrigerators. Some refrigerator panels are not metallic. In this case, try attaching the magnetic remote control to the side of the refrigerator.
- Point the remote control at the remote sensor located on the unit.
- When there is a strong ambient light source, the performance of the infrared remote sensor may be degraded, causing unreliable operation.
- The recommended effective distance for remote operation is about 16 feet (5 meters).

# TO INSTALL BATTERIES

1. Open the battery door.



2. Insert 2 "AAA" batteries.



# BATTERY REPLACEMENT

When the batteries become weak, the operating distance of the remote control is greatly reduced and you will need to replace the batteries.




**CAUTION:** Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly replace. Replaced only with the same or equivalent type.

## NOTES

- Do not place the remote control near magnetic devices.
- If the remote control is not going to be used for a long time, remove the batteries to avoid damage caused by battery leakage corrosion.
- Do not mix old and new batteries, Do not mix ALKALINE, standard (CARBON-ZINC) or rechargeable (NICKEL-CADMIUM) batteries.
- Always remove batteries as soon as they become weak.
- Weak batteries can leak and severely damage the remote control.

#### 10. (1) / ON Button

Press to turn ON the unit or put it in STANDBY (OFF) mode.

### 11. LAST CH Button

Press to switch repeatedly between the last two channels displayed.

- 12. MENU Button Press to display the on-screen TV menu.
- 13. MUTE 🛒 Button

Press to turn off the sound.

# 14. SOUND Button


Press to select from preset sound settings to match the type of show you are watching.

# FRONT & BACK VIEWS



- 1. Color LCD Screen

- 4. FUNCTION Button Select TV / AV IN.
- 5. MENU Button Enters the on-screen TV menu.
- O / ON Button Turns the unit on and off.
- 7. TV ANTENNA Terminal Connects a TV antenna or CATV cable

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- 8. Wall Mounting Holes



# CONNECTING TV ANTENNA

To view television channels correctly, a signal must be received from one of the following sources:

- An indoor or outdoor aerial antenna
- A cable system
- A satellite system



## NOTE

For receiving over-the-air TV broadcasts, we recommend that you use an external fixed antenna. Should you require the use of a temporary antenna, please ensure that you purchase an antenna with sufficient ability to receive in weak signal areas. Only when you are in close proximity to a transmitter will a temporary antenna reproduce a signal as strongly as a fixed antenna.

# CONNECTING EQUIPMENT WITH VIDEO OUTPUT


To connect to other equipment such as a VCR, camcorder, video game system, cable or satellite box.

Connecting to a VCR / Camcorder / Video Game System, Cable, Satellite System, etc)

Connect the AUDIO / VIDEO cable (not included) as shown:

Make sure you connect the cable from the other equipment (AUDIO/VIDEO OUT) to this unit (AUDIO/VIDEO IN).



# CONNECTIONS

## CONNECTING THE AC ADAPTER

This AC adapter operates on AC 100-240V.

- 1. Connect the AC adapter a wall outlet.
- Press the ⊕/ON button to turn on the unit.
- Use the ◄ or ► button to select NO, then press ENTER button. (Only apply to the first time POWER ON.)
- Press the FUNCTION button repeatedly to select TV / AV IN mode, then press ENTER button.



#### NOTES

- The included AC adapter is for use with this unit only. Do not use them with other equipment.
- When the AC adapter is plugged in, the unit is not completely disconnected from the main, even when the power is turned off.
- Be sure the AC adapter is disconnected and all functions are off before making connections.
- Make sure that all the components are connected correctly.
- When you are not going to use the unit for a long period of time, disconnect the AC adapter.

# INSTALLATION

## REMOVING THE BASE STAND

WARNING: The LCD display is very fragile, and must be protected at all times when removing the base stand. Be sure that no hard or sharp objects, or anything that could scratch or damage the LCD display, come in contact with it. Do NOT place pressure on the rear of the unit at anytime because the screen could crack.

- 1. Disconnect any cables or cords connected to the unit.
- 2. Remove the rear cover.


- 3. Lay the unit down on a flat surface, so the back side is facing up, making sure to place a soft cushioned material (such as a pillow or thick piece of foam) beneath the screen.
- 4. Remove the 4 screws and then remove the BASE STAND from the unit.

## MOUNTING ON THE WALL

This unit is VESA-compliant, and is designed to be wall-mounted with a VESAcompliant 1.375" x 2.9375" (35mm x 75mm) mounting kit designed for flat-panel TVs (sold separately). Mount this unit according to the directions included with the mounting kit.

#### NOTE

Remove the base stand before mounting the unit on the wall.




# USING HEADPHONES (NOT INCLUDED)

- Turn down the volume before connecting headphones to the unit, then adjust the volume to your desired level.
- When headphones are connected, no sound will come from the front speakers.

#### NOTE

Avoid listening to sound at high levels for prolonged periods of time. This may be harmful to you and may cause hearing loss.




# SCREEN VIEWING ANGLE ADJUSTMENT

The unit is designed to allow users to have a comfortable viewing angle.

- 1. Hold the stand firmly.
- 2. Gently adjust the TV.

#### CAUTION

Do not force the LCD screen over the maximum viewing angle settings as stated above. Attempting this will result in damage to the unit.



# **UNIT OPERATION**

## TURNING THE UNIT ON

When the AC adapter is connected, press the  $\oplus$ /**ON** button to turn it on. Press the **FUNCTION** button to select the desired mode (TV / AV IN).

#### NOTE

When the unit is not going to be used for a long time, disconnect the AC adapter cord from AC wall outlet.

# Connect an antenna or CATV cable or Satellite system to the TV antenna terminal before searching TV channels.

#### Searching for TV channels automatically (Only appears to the first time Power ON)

When this unit is connected to an antenna, or a CATV cable or satellite system, it can automatically search for channels with adequate signal strength.

- 1. Connect the TV antenna.
- 2. Connect the AC adapter.
- 3. Press the (1) / ON button to turn on the unit.
- 4. Press the ENTER button.
- 5. Press the ◀ or ► button to select "Air" or "CATV", then press the ENTER button to start auto scan.
- 6. The unit will immediately search all channels for those with adequate signal strength and store those channels with signals in memory. The unit will take a short minutes to finish auto scan and after this is completed, the unit will switch to the first channel found.

## Manual searching for TV channels

- Press the MENU button, then press the ◄ button to TV CHANNEL SETTING.
- Press the ▼ button to select ANTENNA. Use the ◄ or ▶ button to select AIR or CATV.
- 3. Use the ▼ button to select Auto Scan.
- 4. Press the ENTER button to enter sub menu of Auto Scan.
- 5. Use the ▼ button to select "Start to Scan" in the sub menu.
- 6. Press the ENTER button to start the search for TV channels.
- 7. The screen will show the first received channel when auto search is completed.

## Watching television

Viewing a television station after the auto/manual search for channels.

- 1. Press the **FUNCTION** button to TV mode.
- 2. Press the ▲ CH+ or ▼ CH- button to select a channel, or press the number button on the remote to select the channel you want to watch.
  - For channels 1 to 9, enter one-digit channel number.
  - For channels 10 to 99, enter two-digit channel number.
  - For channels 100 or over, enter three-digit channel number.


When a channel is selected, the channel number is displayed on the top right corner of the screen.
 This number will disappear after a few seconds.

#### ATSC TV mode:

Press the **DISPLAY** button, the upper window will pop up, then press the **DISPLAY** button again, the lower window will pop up. Press the **DISPLAY** button once to exit.

#### NTSC TV mode:

Press the **DISPLAY** button, the upper window will pop up, then press the **DISPLAY** button once to exit.

## PICTURE SETTING

- 1. Press the MENU button.
- Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select the options (Picture Mode / Contrast / Brightness / Sharpness / Tint / Color).
- Use ◄ or ➤ button to make adjustment. The screen will change to your selected mode immediately. Press the MENU button to return to the previous menu.
- 4. Repeat steps 2 and 3 to adjust other options.
- To exit the TV SETUP MENU and return to the normal screen, press the EXIT button on the remote control.

Picture Mode: Select from preset screen display settings to match the type of show you are watching (Standard, Dynamic, Soft & Personal).

**Contrast**: Adjust to sharpen the picture quality. The black portions of the picture become richer in darkness and the white become brighter.

Brightness: Adjust to brighten or darken the whole picture.

- Sharpness: Adjust the sharpness level to improve detail in the picture.
- Tint: Adjust natural skin tones in the picture quality.
- Color: Adjust the color of the picture.

### SOUND SETTING

- 1. Press the MENU button.
- 2. Use the ◀ or ► button to select SOUND SETTING.
- 3. Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select the options (Sound Mode / Bass / Treble / Balance).
- Use the ◄ or ► button to make adjustment. Press the MENU button to return to the previous menu.
- 5. Repeat steps 2 to 4 to adjust other options.
- To exit the TV SETUP MENU and return to the normal screen, press the EXIT button on the remote control.

# TV SETUP

## TIMER SETTING

1. Press the MENU button.

- 2. Use the ◀ or ► button to select TIMER SETTING.
- Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select the options (OSD Duration / Sleep Timer / Time Zone / Day Saving Time).
- Use the ◄ or ► button to make adjustment. Press the MENU button to return to the previous menu.
- 5. Repeat steps 2 to 4 to adjust other options.
- To exit the TV SETUP MENU and return to the normal screen, press the EXIT button on the remote control.
- OSD Duration: Select amount the time of TV menu showing on screen.
- Sleep Timer: Set the LCD TV to turn itself off within a certain time.


## Time Zone / Day Saving Time / Clock

- 1. Set the local Time Zone, eg. Pacific.
- 2. After selecting the time zone, the Day Saving Time must be activated for those areas observing such change.
- 3. The clock will be recoded automatically (for ATSC only).


# MISC SETTING

- 1. Press the MENU button.
- 2. Use the ◄ or ► button to select MISC SETTING.
- Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select the options (Language / Color Mode / Restore Setting).
- Use the ◄ or ➤ button to make adjustment. The screen will change to your selected mode immediately. Press the MENU button to return to the previous menu.
- 5. Repeat steps 2 to 4 to adjust other options.
- 6. To exit the TV SETUP MENU and return to the normal screen, press the **EXIT** button on the remote control.

# TV SETUP

## TV CHANNEL SETTING

- 1. Press the **MENU** button.
- 2. Use the ◄ or ► button to select TV CHANNEL SETTING.
- Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select the options (Antenna / Auto Scan / Auto Scan Add CH / Channel Skip / Channel No. / Channel Label).
- Use the ◄ or ► button to make adjustment. The screen will change to your selected mode immediately. Press the MENU button to return to the previous menu.
- 5. Repeat steps 2 to 4 to adjust other options.
- To exit the TV SETUP MENU and return to the normal screen, press the EXIT button on the remote control.

NOTE

Channel No. : 2-69 Channel for Air, 1-135 Channel for CATV.

Antenna : Select "CATV" to receive cable signal. Select "AIR" to receive air singal.

Auto Scan : Automatically search all channels for those with adequate signal strength.

- Auto Scan Add CH : The stored channels can not be cleared and the Auto Scan Channels will be added. If you has selected CATV in TV CHANNEL SETTING, then you can select Cable System (AUTO/STD/HRC/IRC) in the sub menu as the picture shown.
- Channel Skip: You may switch ON/OFF the skip function of each stored channel by selecting the channel with ▲ / ▼ button (and using ◄ / ▶ button to select page if the amount of stored channels in more than 1 page), and followed with pressing the ENTER button.

Channel Label: You may edit one label for each channel.

- Select the Channel Label item and press the ◄ or ► button to go into the channel label edit screen.
- 2. Use the ▲ or ▼ button to enter the number or letter.
- 3. Use the  $\blacktriangleleft$  or  $\blacktriangleright$  button to move and edit for the next character.
- After editting, press the **DISPLAY** button and the Channel & Channel Label will be shown on the screen.











# TROUBLESHOOTING GUIDE

The remote does not function.	<ul> <li>Remove any obstacles between the remote and the unit.</li> <li>Use the remote near the unit.</li> <li>Point the remote at the remote sensor on the unit.</li> <li>Replace the batteries in the remote with new ones.</li> </ul>
Bad Picture (snow, multipe images, distortion, blurry)	<ul> <li>Check the location of the antenna and adjust it if necessary.</li> <li>Make sure the antenna cable is firmly connected.</li> <li>Make sure all input cables are firmly connected.</li> </ul>
Black and white picture.	<ul> <li>Check the Picturing setting within the TV SETUP MENU.</li> <li>Check to make sure the program you are watching is broadcast in Color and not Black &amp; White.</li> </ul>
No picture or sound.	<ul> <li>Make sure the unit is plugged in and turned on.</li> <li>Make sure that TV mode is selected.</li> <li>Try a new channel to check for possible station trouble.</li> <li>Make sure the antenna is connected properly.</li> <li>Increase the volume.</li> <li>Make sure the antenna or audio video source device is working properly.</li> <li>Make sure all cables are firmly connected.</li> <li>Check for local interference.</li> </ul>
Colored patches of picture.	<ul><li>Make sure there are no unshielded electrical devices nearby that are causing interference.</li><li>Turn the unit off for 30 minutes, then try it again.</li></ul>
