
When playing back a CD-G (Graphics) or CD EXTRA disc, the audio portion will be played, but the graphic images will not be shown.

TITLES. CHAPTERS AND TRACKS

 DVDs are divided into "TITLES" and "CHAPTERS". If the disc has more than one movie on it, each movie would be a separate "TITLE", "CHAPTER" are sections of titles.



 Audio CDs are divided into "TRACKS". A "TRACK" is usually one song on an audio CD.

Numbers identify each title, chapter and track on a disc. Most discs have these numbers record on them, but some do not.

USING OF REMOTE CONTROL

USING THE REMOTE CONTROL

- This remote control is magnetic and can be attached to most refrigerators. Some refrigerator panels are not metallic. In this case, try attaching the magnetic remote control to the side of the refrigerator.
- Point the remote control at the remote sensor located on the unit.
- When there is a strong ambient light source, the performance of the infrared remote sensor may be degraded, causing unreliable operation.
- The recommended effective distance for remote operation is about 16 feet (5 meters).

TO INSTALL BATTERIES

1. Open the battery door.



2. Insert 2 "AAA" batteries.



BATTERY REPLACEMENT

When the batteries become weak, the operating distance of the remote control is greatly reduced and you will need to replace the batteries.









CONNECTIONS

CONNECTING A TV ANTENNA

To view television channels correctly, a signal must be received from one of the following sources:

- An indoor or outdoor aerial antenna
- A cable system
- A satellite system



NOTE

For receiving over-the-air TV broadcasts, we recommend that you use an external fixed antenna. Should you require the use of a temporary antenna, please ensure that you purchase an antenna with sufficient ability to receive in weak signal areas. Only when you are in close proximity to a transmitter will a temporary antenna reproduce a signal as strongly as a fixed antenna.

CONNECTING TO OTHER EQUIPMENT WITH VIDEO OUTPUT

To connect to other equipment such as a VCR, camcorder, video game system, cable or satellite system etc






CONNECTING THE AC POWER CORD

This AC adapter operates on AC 110-240V.

- Connect the AC power cord to the AC adapter.
- 2. Plug the AC adapter cord into the DC-IN 12V on the unit.
- Connect the AC adapter and AC power cord into a wall outlet.

NOTES

- The included AC adapter and AC power cord are for use with this unit only. Do not use them with other equipment.
- TO PREVENT ELECTRIC SHOCK, MATCH WIDE BLADE OF PLUG TO WIDE SLOT OF WALL OUTLET, THEN FULLY INSERT.
- When the AC power cord is plugged in, the unit is not completely disconnected from the main, even when the power is turned off.
- Be sure the AC power cord is disconnected and all functions are off before making connections.
- · Make sure that all the components are connected correctly.
- · When you are not going to use the unit for a long period of time, disconnect the AC power cord.



INSTALLATION

REMOVING THE BASE STAND

WARNING: The LCD display is very fragile, and must be protected at all times when removing the base stand. Be sure that no hard or sharp objects, or anything that could scratch or damage the LCD display, come in contact with it. Do NOT place pressure on the rear of the unit at anytime because the screen could crack.


- 1. Disconnect any cables or cords connected to the unit.
- Lay the unit down on a flat surface, so the back side is facing up, making sure to place a soft cushioned material (such as a pillow or thick piece of foam) beneath the screen.
- Remove the 3 screws and then remove the BASE STAND from the unit.

MOUNTING ON THE WALL

This unit is VESA-compliant, and is designed to be wall-mounted with a VESA-compliant 1.375" x 2.9375" (35mm x 75mm) mounting kit designed for flat-panel TVs (sold separately). Mount this unit according to the directions included with the mounting kit.

NOTE

Remove the base stand before mounting the unit on the wall.





USING HEADPHONES

- Turn down the volume before connecting headphones to the unit, then adjust the volume to your desired level
- When headphones are connected, no sound will come from the front speakers.

NOTE

Avoid listening to sound at high levels for prolonged periods of time. This may be harmful to you and may cause hearing loss.



SCREEN VIEWING ANGLE ADJUSTMENT

The unit is designed to allow users to have a comfortable viewing angle.

- 1. Hold the stand firmly.
- 2. Gently adjust the TV.

CAUTION

Do not force the LCD screen over the maximum viewing angle settings as stated above. Attempting this will result in damage to the unit.



UNIT OPERATION

TURNING THE UNIT ON

When the AC power cord is connected, press the Φ/ON button to turn it on. Press the **FUNCTION** button to select the desired mode (TV / AV IN / DVD). If you select DVD, the DVD logo will appear on the screen.



When the unit is not going to be used for a long time, disconnect the AC power cord from the AC wall outlet.



SOUND SYSTEM

DOLBY DIGITAL (FOR DVD)

Dolby Digital is a sound system developed by Dolby Laboratories Inc. that gives movie theatre ambience to audio output when the unit is connected to a Dolby Digital 5.1 channel processor or amplifier. This unit automatically recognises DVDs that have been recorded with Dolby Digital.

Not all Dolby Digital sources are recorded with 6 channels.

Some sources marked Dolby Digital may be recorded in Dolby Surround, 1 2 channel system. Look for this logo on your unit.

USING THE TV

Connect an antenna or CATV cable or Satellite system to the TV antenna terminal before searching TV channels.

Searching for TV channels automatically (Only appears to the first time Power ON)

- 1. Connect the TV antenna.
- 2. Connect the AC adapter and AC cord.
- 3. Press the 0 / ON button to turn on the unit.
- 4. Press the ENTER button.
- Press the ◀ or ▶ button to select "Air" or "CATV", then press the ENTER button to start auto scan.
- 6. The unit will immediately search all channels for those with adequate signal strength and store those channels with signals in memory. The unit will take a short minutes to finish auto scan and aftter this is completed, the unit will switch to the first channel found.

Manual searching for TV channels

- Press the TV MENU button, then press the ◀ button to TV CHANNEL SETTING.
- Press the ▼ button to select ANTENNA. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to select AIR or CATV.
- 3. Use the ▼ button to select Auto Scan.
- 4. Press the ENTER button to enter sub menu of Auto Scan.
- 5. Use the ▼ button to select "Start to Scan" in the sub menu.
- 6. Press the ENTER button to start the search for TV channels.
- 7. The screen will show the first received channel when auto search is completed.

Watching television

Viewing a television station after the auto/manual search for channels.

- 1. Press the **FUNCTION** button to TV mode.
- 2. Press the ▲ CH+ or ▼ CH- button to select a channel, or press the number button on the remote to select the channel you want to watch.
 - For channels 1 to 9, enter one-digit channel number.
 - For channels 10 to 99, enter two-digit channel number.
 - For channels 100 or over, enter three-digit channel number.

NOTE


When a channel is selected, the channel number is displayed on the top right corner of the screen.
 This number will disappear after a few seconds.

ATSC TV mode:

Press the **DISPLAY** button, the upper window will pop up, then press the **DISPLAY** button again, the lower window will pop up. Press the **DISPLAY** button once to exit.

NTSC TV mode:

Press the **DISPLAY** button, the upper window will pop up, then press the **DISPLAY** button once to exit.





Picture Mode: Select from preset screen display settings to match the type of show you are watching

Contrast: Adjust to sharpen the picture quality. The black portions of the picture become richer in

darkness and the white become brighter.

Brightness: Adjust to brighten or darken the whole picture.

Sharpness: Adjust the sharpness level to improve detail in the picture.

Tint: Adjust natural skin tones in the picture quality.

Color: Adjust the color of the picture.

SOUND SETTING

- 1. Press the TV MENU button.
- 2 Use the ◀ or ▶ button to select SOUND SETTING.
- 3. Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select the options (Sound Mode / Bass / Treble / Balance).



TIMER SETTING

- 1. Press the TV MENU button.
- 2. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to select TIMER SETTING.
- Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select the options (OSD Duration / Sleep Timer / Time Zone / Day Saving Time).
- Use the ◀ or ▶ button to make adjustment.
 Press the TV MENU button to return to the previous menu.
- 5. Repeat steps 2 to 4 to adjust other options.
- To exit the TV SETUP MENU and return to the normal screen, press the EXIT button on the remote control.

OSD Duration: Select amount the time of TV menu showing on screen.

Sleep Timer: Set the LCD TV to turn itself off within a certain time.

Time Zone / Day Saving Time / Clock

- After selecting the time zone, the Day Saving Time must be activated for those areas observing such change.
- 3. The clock will be recoded automatically (for ATSC only).





- 4. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to make adjustment. The screen will change to your selected mode immediately. Press the TV MENU button to return to the previous menu.
- 5. Repeat steps 2 to 4 to adjust other options.
- To exit the TV SETUP MENU and return to the normal screen, press the EXIT button on the remote control.

NOTE

Channel No.: 2-69 Channel for Air, 1-135 Channel for CATV.

Antenna: Select "CATV" to receive cable signal. Select

"AIR" to receive air singal.

Auto Scan: Automatically search all channels for those with adequate signal strength.

Auto Scan Add CH: The stored channels can not be cleared and the Auto Scan Channels will be added.

If you has selected CATV in TV CHANNEL SETTING, then you can select Cable System (AUTO / STD / HRC / IRC) in the sub menu

as the picture shown.

Channel Skip: You may switch ON/OFF the skip function of each stored channel by selecting the channel

with ▲ / ▼ button (and using ◀ / ▶ button to select page if the amount of stored channels in more than 1 page), and followed with pressing

the ENTER button.

Channel Label: You may edit one label for each channel.

- Select the Channel Label item and press the ◀ or ▶ button to go into the channel label edit screen.
- 2. Use the ▲ or ▼ button to enter the number or letter.
- 3. Use the ◀ or ▶ button to move and edit for the next character.
- After editting, press the DISPLAY button and the Channel & Channel Label will be shown on the screen.









PLAYING A DISC

This owner's manual explains the basic instructions of this unit. Some DVDs are produced with limited operation during playback. For example, many DVDs do not allow users to skip government warnings, or in some cases previews or other features. This is not a defect in the unit. Refer to the instruction notes of discs.

"No" may appear on the screen during operation. A "No" means that the desired operation is not permitted by the unit or disc.

PLAYING A DISC

- 1. Press the **O/ON** button to turn on the unit.
- 2. Use the ◀ button to select "NO", then press the ENTER button. (Only appears to the first time Power ON)
- Use FUNCTION button repeatedly to select DVD mode, then press the ENTER button.

See CUSTOMIZING THE FUNCTION SETTINGS before proceeding to step 4.

- Press the ◀ OPEN button to open the disc door.
- Hold the disc by its sides and carefully press onto the central support of compartment with the printed side facing towards you until you hear a "click".
- 6. Push the disc door to close it.

It takes a short while for your unit to load the disc. After loading, the unit will automatically either bring you to the main menu of DVD, or start playing the DVD. If the unit does not automatically start playing the DVD, press the ► PLAY button.

PLAYING A PICTURE FILE DISC

This unit can play JPEG files recorded on a CD-R or CD-ROM disc.

- 1. Press the **◄ OPEN** button to open the disc door.
- Hold a JPEG file disc by its edge and gently push it onto the spindle with label side facing towards you until you hear a "click".
- 3. Push the disc door to close it.
- 4. The unit will load the disc and automatically display the contents of the disc on the screen, while also beginning to play the picture file. These files will then be played back one by one.
- 5. Press the **RETURN** button to folder list.
- Use the ▲, ▼, ◄ or ▶ button to view and select desired file, then press the ENTER button to confirm the selected file.

NOTES

- You can press the ¡¡ PAUSE button to freeze the picture, and press the ► PLAY button to resume slide show.
- You can press the I◄ PREV or ➤ NEXT button to change the picture. Press the I◄ PREV button to view
 the previous picture. Press the ➤ NEXT button to view to the next picture.
- You can press the ANGLE button to rotate direction of the picture by 90°.

PAUSING PLAYBACK (STILL MODE)

Press the II PAUSE button. To resume normal playback, press the ► PLAY button. Each time you press the II PAUSE button, the picture advances one frame.

STOPPING PLAYBACK

Press the ■ STOP button at the location where you want to interrupt playback. To resume playback at the position where the disc was stopped, press the ► PLAY button.

SKIPPING TO A DIFFERENT TRACK

- Press the ► PREV button to skip to the start of the current/previous track.
- Press the MEXT button to skip to the next track.
- · For an audio CD, use the number buttons on the remote control to go directly to the desired track number.

PLAYING A DISC

FAST FORWARD / FAST REVERSE

- Press the SEARCH ◄◄ or ►► SEARCH button when a disc is playing.
 - The disc begins a fast scan at two times normal (x2) speed.
 - Four speeds are available. Each time the SEARCH button is pressed, the speed of the fast scan changes
- Press the ► PLAY button when you have reached the desired point to resume playback at normal speed.

AUDIO SELECTION (DVD)

On some discs, the sound is recorded in two or more formats. Follow the directions below to select the type of playback.

 While a disc is playing, press the AUDIO button to show the current audio format number.



- Press the AUDIO button repeatedly to select the desired audio format. NOTES
- If only one audio format is recorded, the number does not change.
- · About two seconds later, playback continues in the new audio format.

SUBTITLE SELECTION (DVD)

- 1. While a DVD is playing, press the SUBTITLE button to display the current language setting.
- 2. Press the **SUBTITLE** button repeatedly to select the desired subtitle language. NOTES



- If only one language is recorded, the language does not change.
- About two seconds later, playback continues with the new subtitle you selected.
- · The number of languages recorded differs depending on the disc.
- · If no button is pressed within a few seconds, playback continues without changing the current subtitle.
- This function can only be used for discs on which subtitles have been recorded in multiple languages.
- On some DVDs, subtitles are activated from the main menu of the DVD. Press the DVD MENU button
 to activate the main menu.


ANGLE SELECTION (DVD)

Some DVDs contain scenes which have been shot from a number of different angles. For these discs, the same scene can be viewed from each of these different angles.

- While you are playing a DVD with different angles recorded, press the ANGLE button to view the number of the current angle available.
- Press the ANGLE button repeatedly to change the scene to the next angle in those recorded.
 - About two seconds later, playback continues from the new angle you selected.
 - If no button is pressed within 10 seconds, playback continues without changing the current angle.

NOTES


- · This function can only be used for discs on which scenes shot from multiple angles have been recorded.
- If only one angle is recorded, "₱11/1" is displayed.



SPECIAL FUNCTION

DISPLAY

While the disc is playing, press the **DISPLAY** button repeatedly to display information on operation status.



LOCATING A SPECIFIC TITLE (DVD)

If a DVD disc contains title numbers, you can locate a specific title by directly selecting its title number.

- 1. In STOP mode, press the GOTO button.
- 00/21 CH 029/029 00:00:00 Press the ◀ or ▶ button to highlight a specific field and press the corresponding number button(s) for the title you want.
- 3. Press the ENTER button to confirm. The unit will start playback about 3 second later.

LOCATING A SPECIFIC CHAPTER / TRACK

If you know the chapter / track number you want to play, you can locate a specific chapter / track by directly selecting a chapter / track number. 00/34 CH 000/029 00:00:00

- 1. Press the GOTO button to search for your desired chapter / track.
- 2. Press the ◀ or ▶ button to highlight a chapter / track and press the corresponding number button(s) for the chapter / track you want.
- 3. Press the ENTER button to confirm. The unit will start playback about 3 second later.

LOCATING A SPECIFIC TIME

You can move to a specific location by entering its corresponding time (hours, minutes, seconds)

- 1. Press the GOTO button.
- Press the ◀ or ▶ button to highlight a time and press the corresponding number button(s) for the setting point you want.

- 3. Press the ENTER button to confirm. The unit will start playback about 3 second later. NOTES
- Some discs may not respond to this process.
- This method of locating a title/chapter is available only on a DVD disc that contains title/chapter numbers.
- Some scenes may not be located as precisely as you specified.
- This method for accessing specific locations is available only within the current title of the DVD disc.

REPEAT PLAYBACK

You can play a specific title or chapter repeatedly. (Title repeat, chapter repeat)

REPEATING A CHAPTER (DVD)

When you play the same chapter repeatedly.

 While the DVD disc is playing, press the REPEAT button until the "REP: CHAPTER" indicator displays on the screen. The current chapter is played repeatedly.

REPEATING A TITLE

When you play the same title repeatedly.

While the DVD disc is playing, press the REPEAT button until the "REP: TITLE" indicator displays on the screen. The current title is played repeatedly.

To resume normal playback

While the DVD disc is playing, press the REPEAT button until the "REP: OFF" indicator displays on the screen.

You can play a single track or an entire disc repeatedly.

REPEATING A SINGLE TRACK (CD)

You can play the same track repeatedly.

 When the CD disc is playing, press the REPEAT button until the "REP: REP1" indicator displays on the screen. The current track is played repeatedly.

REPEATING AN ENTIRE DISC

While the CD disc is playing, press the REPEAT button until the "REP: REP ALL" indicator displays on the screen. The entire disc is played repeatedly.

To resume normal playback

3. Press the REPEAT button until the "REP: OFF" indicator display on the screen.

DVD / CD PROGRAMMABLE PLAYBACK

PROGRAMMABLE MEMORY

The two types of programmed playback provided by this unit are title/chapter programmed playback and track programmed playback.


Title / chapter programmed playback (DVD)

- 1. In STOP mode, press the **MEMORY** button.
- Enter the title numbers in Use the ◀ or ▶ button to move the highlight to chapter and enter the chapter numbers in ■ ■.
- 3. Use the ◀, ▶, ▲ or ▼ button to move to other fields.
- 4. Repeat steps 2 to 3.
- 5. Press the ▶ PLAY button to start the programmed playback.

Track programmed playback (CD)

- 1. In STOP mode, press the MEMORY button.
- 2. Enter the track numbers in _____.
- 3. Use the ◀, ▶, ▲ or ▼ button to move to other fields.
- 4. Repeat steps 2 to 3.
- 5. Press the ▶ PLAY button to start the programmed playback.





CUSTOMIZING THE FUNCTION SETTINGS

LANGUAGE SETUP

- Press the SETUP button in STOP mode.
- Use the ▶ button to change the highlight cursor. Use the ▲
 or ▼ button to select a language, then press the ENTER
 button The screen will change to your selected language
 immediately.
- To exit the SETUP MENU and return to the normal screen, press the SETUP or RETURN button.



VIDEO SETUP

- 1. Press the SETUP button in STOP mode.
- Use the ▲ button to select LANGUAGE SETUP, then press the ◀ or ▶ button repeatedly until VIDEO SETUP appears.
- 3. Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select the option (BRIGHTNESS or CONTRAST), then press the ▶ button. Use the ▲ or ▼ button to make adjustments, then press the ENTER button. The screen will change to your selected setting.
- 4. Repeat steps 2 and 3 above to adjust other options.
- To exit the SETUP MENU and return to the normal screen, press the SETUP or RETURN button.



CUSTOMIZING THE FUNCTION SETTINGS

SYSTEM SETUP

- 1. Press the SETUP button in STOP mode.
- 2. Use the ▲ button to select LANGUAGE SETUP, then press the ◀ or ▶ button repeatedly until SYSTEM SETUP appears.
- 3. Use the ▲ or ▼ button to select the option (TV TYPE or DEFAULT), then press the ► button. Use the ▲ or ▼ button to make adjustments, then press the ENTER button. The screen will change to your selected setting.
- 4. Repeat steps 2 and 3 above to adjust other options.
- To exit the SETUP MENU and return to the normal screen, press the SETUP or RETURN button.

TV Type Pan Scan

- When wide-screen video is played, this mode clips the right and left sides of the image so that it can be viewed on a conventional screen.
- Some wide-screen DVDs that do not permit Pan Scan playback are automatically played in Letter Box mode (black bands at top and bottom of screen).

Letter Box

 When wide-screen video is played in this mode on a conventional screen, black bands appear at the top and bottom of the screen.

Wide-screen


 This is the correct mode for playing wide-screen videos on a wide-screen.

NOTES

- The displayable picture size is preset on the DVD discs.
 Therefore the playback picture of some DVDs may not conform to the picture size you select.
- When you play DVDs recorded in the 4:3 aspect ratio, the playback picture will always appear in the 4:3 aspect ratio regardless of the TV shape setting.


