



Using the FM and AM Antennas

Before you use your unit, ensure both the FM and AM antennas are positioned properly.

Uncoil the FM antenna at the back of the unit, ensuring it is fully extended (you may even want to tape it to the wall behind the unit if possible. The higher the better.) You'll also need to connect the AM antenna loop to the back of the unit if you listen to AM stations. Rotate the AM loop antenna for better reception.

Connecting the Speakers

Each speaker has a black and a red wire. When connecting the speakers, match the red wires to the red jacks and the black wires to the black jacks.






Release tab to lock wire in the terminal

NOTE: Ensure the insulation is completely removed from the ends of the speaker wires at all connection points





Insert 2 "AAA" ("UM-4"/"R03") batteries to the remote control prior to use.

Setting the Clock

EN

- Press and hold **CLOCK** on the remote control until the hour flashes on the display.
- Press i or → to set the hour and then press CLOCK to shift to minute digits.
- 3. Press id or ►► to set the minute.
- 4. Press **CLOCK** to save settings. Or press **TUNE/PRESET** to cancel the setting.

Timer and Program Recording

You can turn on/off the unit or record TUNER at preset times by setting the timer.

You can use Program Recording to preset the unit to record your favorite radio program. When setting the timer, choose REC TUNER as the source to record radio at the preset time. Ensure there is adequate memory in the USB device connected.

Setting the Timer

- 1. Press and hold **TIMER** on the remote control until Timer On and the clock hour flashes on the display.
- 2. Set the Timer On setting. Press I d or →→I to set the hour and then press TIMER to shift to minute digits.
- 3. Press ⊶ or ►► to set the minute.
- Press TIMER to change to Timer Off setting with clock time flashing. Repeat steps 2 & 3 for timer off time setting.
- 5. Press TIMER to select source. Press I or →I to select DISC/USB/iPod/REC TUNER/ TUNER. If REC TUNER is selected, press I or or →I to select the preset station after pressing TIMER.
- Press TIMER to set volume. Adjust VOLUME CONTROL to select desired volume level.

 Press TIMER to save settings. Press TUNE/PRESET
 to cancel setting. The timer is automatically activated once timer setting is saved.

Activating the Timer

Press **TIMER** to turn on/off the alarm. The timer icon ① is displayed when timer is activated.

Sleep Mode

You can select the time interval in minutes before the unit turns off automatically.

Press **SLEEP** to select among OFF, 120, 90, 60, 45, 30, 15 and 5 minutes.

The **Sleep** icon lights on the display when sleep mode is activated.

View and Adjust Remaining Sleep Time

When sleep is activated, press **SLEEP** once to view remaining sleep time. Press again to change the time.

Note: Sleep is automatically de-activated when the unit is turned off.

Showing Demonstration

Press **DEMO/DIMMER** to turn on/off demonstration mode.

Adjusting Brightness

Press and hold **DEMO/DIMMER** until "**DIMMER X**" displays where "X" represents the brightness level. Press **DEMO/DIMMER** to adjust the brigtness level and press any buttons to save setting and exit.

Sound Features

Volume Control

Turn the volume control on the main unit or press **VOL** \checkmark or \blacktriangle on the remote control to adjust volume level. The volume level shows briefly on the display.

Bass Boost

Press **B.BOOST** to turn on/off boosting the bass frequency. The **B.Boost** icon displays when it is activated.

Muting Sound

Press \mathfrak{A} on the remote to mute the sound. When **MUTE** is on, the symbol flashes.

Using Preset Equalizer Curves

Press **EQ** to toggle among FLAT, JAZZ, CLASSIC, ROCK and CUSTOM. The display shows your selection briefly and the relative icon lights on the display.

Creating a Custom Curve

- 1. Press EQ to select CUSTOM mode.
- While BAS and TRE is displayed, adjust volume control to set the associated gain between -10 - +10.
- 4. Press EQ to save setting and exit.

CD and mp3 Disc Playback

Loading Discs

- 1. Press ▲ on the main unit to open the disc tray.
- 2. Insert a disc with label face up.
- 3. Press ▲ again to close the disc tray..

Play/Pause Discs

Press ►II in stop mode to begin playback. Press ►II during playback to pause disc. Press again to resume.

Stop Playback

During playback, press **TUNE/PRESET** • to stop playback. The unit returns to Navigation mode for 10 seconds before entering stop mode.

Fast Forwarding/Reversing/ Skipping Tracks

- Press and hold in press or press and hold in press or reverse through a CD while it is playing.
- Press i or i to skip to the previous or next track.

Notes:

- In CD stop mode, press SELECT/ ► to enter Navigation mode and show disc menu. In CD Navigation mode, press
 (BACK to return to stop mode.
- Be sure to remove all discs from the disc tray before moving or transporting the unit.
- Do not force the tray to close during tray opening.
- File formats/bitrates supported by the player: mp3: 32 to 320kbps wma: 48 to 160kbps

Important CD and mp3/WMA Information Notes on CD-R/RW Disc

- Some CD-R and CD-RW discs may not be playable due to the state of the disc or the device that was used for recording.
- Do not affix any type of labels to either side (recordable or labeled side) of a CD-R/RW disc as this may result in the unit malfunctioning.
- To avoid damages to the CD-R/RW disc, do not open the disc tray door while the disc is being read.
- Do not load an unrecorded CD-R/RW disc into the unit. This may take a longer time to read the disc.
- Playback capability for CD-RW discs may vary due to variations in the quality of the CD-RW disc and the recorder used to create the disc.

Notes on mp3/WMA Disc

- Use .mp3 as the extension when converting audio files into mp3 for saving onto CD-R(W) or CD-ROM,
 e.g. Abc08.mp3. Do not use any other extension e.g. .doc, .pdf.
- Do not use the .mp3 extension for other text or non-audio data files as this may result in serious malfunction and harmful noise interference.
- For better quality mp3/WMA disc playback, the CD quality should be recorded at 128kbps or 64kbps respectively.
- Disc data size > 650MB is not recommended.
- Total files and folders in the disc should not exceed 250, it also depends on the length of the file/folder names.
- For mixed mode discs, only one mode will be selected for playback depending on the recording format.
- To ensure good performance, wait until the disc changer completely reads the disc before proceeding.
- mp3 files in CD ROM EXTRA format disc are not recognized.

USB Playback

Connecting USB drive to the Main Unit

Lift the cover on the front panel. Connect the USB drive to the main unit's USB Jack on the front panel.

Selecting USB Mode

Press **SOURCE** repeatedly to select USB mode.

USB Playback Features

Start and Pause Playback

Press ►II to start and pause playback.

Stop Playback

Press **TUNE/PRESET** to stop playback. The unit enters the Navigation mode for 10 seconds before entering the stop mode.

Skipping Files/Fast Forwarding/Reversing

- Press and hold in or initial or initial or reverse through a file while it is playing.

Memory Usage

Press **BAND/INFO** on the main unit or **INFO** on the remote control to view memory usage on the USB drive.

Note: Mass Storage Class (MSC) USB devices of up to 20 GB are compatible with this unit. Do not connect other USB devices to this unit.



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Radio

Selecting Tuner Mode

Press SOURCE to enter Tuner mode.

Selecting Tuner Band

In Tuner mode, press **BAND** to select between FM or AM Radio band.

Tune Mode and Preset Mode

The tuner can be in either **TUNE** or **PRESET** mode.

- In PRESET mode, "P: XX" will be displayed where "XX" represents the preset number (1-32).

Tune Mode

In **TUNE** mode, you can press *i* or *b* to select desired frequencies.

- Press ⊶ or → to select frequencies.
- Press and hold idea or ison to scan frequencies.

Preset Mode

In **PRESET** mode, the unit can store up to 32 radio stations in its memory. You can program the presets in two ways:

- Manually setting the by entering every single radio station yourself.
- Perform Auto Preset Programming and the unit can store all available radio stations automatically in ascending order.

Manually Setting Presets

- 1. Press **TUNE/PRESET** to enter TUNE mode.
- 2. Press idea or ►► to adjust the desired frequency.
- Press **PROG** once and the most recently accessed program location flashes on the display.

Radio

EN

- If a different program location is preferred, press i or → i to move to the desired preset number (1-32).
- 5. Press **PROG** to store the selected frequency at that preset.

Auto Preset Programming (FM only) Press and hold the BAND button for 2 seconds to scan stations in the FM band. The stations will then be stored as preset channels. A maximum of 32 stations can be stored. Be careful of your preset channels being erased accidentally because the scanning and storing process is automatic upon pressing the button. You can stop the automatic scan by pressing any button, but the erased stations cannot be recovered.

Using Presets

When in **PRESET** mode, press is or is to access the previous or next preset station.

Suppressing Stereo Signal

Press **FM ST** on the remote control to select between FM mono and stereo mode. **STEREO** is displayed in stereo mode.

Tip: Under PRESET mode, press I ← or → I can only access the preset stations. Manual tuning is not available in this mode.

Recording to the USB drive

An Overview

- You can record CD, Tuner, iPod, USB or AUX files to the MSC device which connected to the USB Jack.
- Recording function always records what is being played. Press SOURCE to select the source you want to record from.
- In general, recording starts instantly when RECORD is pressed. It stops when TUNE/PRESET
 or RECORD is pressed.
- During recording, **REC** icon lights.

Recording CD to USB drive

- 1. Connect the USB drive to the unit's USB jack.
- In CD stop mode, press **RECORD**. Playback and recording start automatically and the **REC** icon lights.
- Press TUNE/PRESET
 or RECORD to stop recording.

Recording any passage from a CD (except for mp3 CD)

- 1. Play the CD.
- 2. Press **RECORD** when you want to start recording.
- Press TUNE/PRESET
 or RECORD when you want to stop recording. You can start whenever you want.

Note: When recording from an mp3 CD, recording always begin at the beginning of the song even wher started from a mid-song location.

Record only selected tracks from a CD

- 1. Create a CD program by following the instructions under "Setting Up a Program List" on page 14.
- In CD stop mode, press PROG and then RECORD. Playback and recording start automatically. The Program icon lights and REC icon lights on the display.
- Recording stops automatically when the program is finished.

Recording iPod/Tuner/AUX to USB drive

- Press SOURCE to select the source you want to record from. If you selects Tuner mode, select the station to record (refer to page 10 – 11 for details).
- Press RECORD to start recording.
- Press TUNE/PRESET
 or RECORD to stop recording.

Program Recording

Refer to "Setting the Timer" on page 7.

Deleting Files from USB drive

- In USB Navigation mode, select the file for deletion using the navigation buttons (Refer to "Advanced Navigation Controls" on page 15 – 16 for details.)
- 2. Press **DELETE** on the main unit or **DEL** on the remote control.
- Turn VOLUME CONTROL knob on the main unit or press ▲ or ▼ on the remote control to select Yes to delete or No to cancel.
- Press SELECT on the main unit or press ► on the remote control to confirm selection.

If Yes is selected, the display shows memory usage information after deleting selected file. For a few seconds, the unit will return to the Navigation mode.

Deleting All Files

- In Navigation and mp3 stop modes, press and hold **DELETE** on the main unit, or press **DEL** on the remote control.
- Turn VOLUME CONTROL knob on the main unit or press ▲ or ▼ on the remote control to select Yes to delete or No to cancel. All files on the USB drive will be deleted once you select Yes.
- 3. Press **SELECT** on the main unit or press ► on the remote control to confirm selection.

Tips:

- If CD playback is already started, recording will begin instantly when
 RECORD is pressed (except for mp3
 CD). If CD playback is stopped, playback and recording will start simultaneously when RECORD is pressed.
- Recording stops automatically when CD stops.
- To view recording time and remaining time, press BAND/INFO on the main unit or INFO on the remote during recording.

iPod Mode

In iPod mode, you can navigate and playback music on your iPod.

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Connecting your iPod to the Unit

- Ensure the iPod dock is connected to the unit as described on page 3.
- Turn off your iPod or put it in Pause Mode.
- Place the iPod on the iPod dock and press **SOURCE** to select iPod mode.
- "iPod Connecting" displays on the main unit. "No iPod" will be displayed if no iPod is connected to the unit. "iPod mode" will be displayed if the connection is successful and iPod will start playback.
- Once connected, the iPod will resume playback from where it last stopped.

Navigate and Playback Audio Files on your iPod

Once docked, navigate and playback your iPod using the unit's buttons and remote control.

The iPod's buttons are copied to the unit allowing you to experience the same control as the iPod's own control.

Shuffle and Repeat Modes

You control the shuffle and repeat modes by pressing (and **REPEAT** on the remote control.

Charging your iPod

Your iPod is charged whenever it is docked to the main unit.

Disconnecting your iPod

Stop the iPod playback before disconnecting it from the dock.

Notes:



- This model includes adapters for most of the common iPod models. If you have an iPod that requires a different adapter, use the adapter shipped with your iPod.
- Do not connect your iPod to the main unit's USB jack. It is recommended to connect your iPod to the iPod dock provided.
- The volume setting of the iPod could not be controlled by the main unit or the remote control.

Advanced Playback Controls

In CD and USB mode, advanced playback controls allow you to sample, repeat and random playback files and set up a Program List. In USB mode, it allows you to rename tracks.

Sampling Tracks

Press **INTRO** on the remote control to play the first 10 seconds of each track on the current disc or turn intro mode off. **Intro** is displayed when sampling is activated.

Repeat

Press **REPEAT** on the remote control to select repeat options: Repeat the current track (REPEAT 1) or Repeat all tracks in USB mode (REPEAT ALL).

Random Playback

Press (a) on the remote control to turn on/off random playback. (b) is displayed when it is activated.

Setting Up a Program List

- In CD navigation mode, use the navigation buttons to select the track to add to Program List.
- Press ADD on the remote control to add selected track into the next available program location.
- 3. Repeat steps 1 to 3 to store more tracks into program memory.
- 4. Wait for a few seconds timeout to return to Navigation mode.

Playing a Program List

In CD stop mode, press **PROG** to enter program mode and then press **>u** . Program playback will begin. **Program** is displayed.

Display Program List

- While the CD playback is stopped, press PROG to enter PROGRAM mode. To display program list, press TUNE/PRESET .
- Press ▲ or ▼ repeatedly to view each track assignment in the program list.

Deleting from Program List

- While in PROGRAM mode, press ▲ or ▼ to select the program to delete.
- 2. Press **DELETE** on the unit or **DEL** on the remote control.
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select between "No" to cancel and "Yes" to confirm.
- 4. Press ► to confirm selection.

Notes:



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- You can create a program of up to 32 tracks.
- In Program stop mode, press STOP twice to turn off Program mode.

Deleting the Entire Program List

Follow the above steps by pressing and holding **DELETE** on the unit or **DEL** on the remote control instead of pressing and releasing.

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Advanced Playback Controls

Renaming Tracks

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You can rename files in the USB drive.

- 1. In the USB stop mode, press ◀ or ► to select folder.
- 2. Press ◀ or ► to select the file in the current folder.
- 3. Press PROG to enter rename mode.
- Press ▲ or ▼ on the remote control or VOLUME CONTROL on the main unit to select the first letter of the new file name.
- 5. Press ► to confirm the current letter and move to the next letter.
- 6. Press < to modify the previous letter.
- Press **PROG** again to confirm and store the new file name after entering the last letter of the file name (maximum seven letters).







Tips on Playback Sequence of Disc

- Check that the mp3/WMA disc is created with a single folder structure. Refer to the diagram below for playback sequence details on multi-level folder structure.
 For example, the folders and songs from level 2 are played before moving to play
- folders and songs from level 3.
- Folder playback sequence is indicated by the letters A to G.
- Song playback sequence is indicated by the numbers (1 to 15) in front of the song name.



Troubleshooting Tips

Unit will not turn on

- Check the power cord for a secure connection.
- Unplug the unit for a moment, and then plug into power source again.
- Check the outlet by plugging in another device.

No sound

- Increase the volume setting.
- Check the connection to speakers.
- Check that you have selected the
- appropriate function: CD, Tuner.Make sure the mute is off.
- Make sure the headphones are not
- plugged in.

Poor radio reception

- Check the antenna connection.
- Move antenna.
- Turn off nearby electrical appliances, such as hair dryer, vacuum cleaner, microwave and fluorescent lights.

CD does not play

- Check that the CD is in the tray.
- Check that the CD label is facing up.
- Check that PAUSE mode is not on.
- Check that the CD function is selected.
- Use the CD lens cleaner.
- Clean the disc.
- Try another CD.

CD sound skips

- Clean the disc.
- Check the disc for warping, scratches, or other damage.
- Check if something is causing the unit to vibrate. If so, move the unit.
- Make sure the speakers are at least 3 feet away or on a different surface from the main unit.

CD button will not respond

• Switch to another function (Tuner) and then back to CD.

Remote control does not work

- Check that the batteries are properly installed.
- Replace any weak batteries.
- Check the unit is plugged into power source.
- Point the remote directly at the unit's front panel.
- Move closer to the unit.
- Remove any obstacles between the remote and the unit.

Maintenance

Disconnect the unit from the power source before performing any maintenance.



Cleaning

Clean the exterior of the unit using a soft dust cloth.

CD Player

CAUTION! This unit operates with a laser. It must be opened by only a qualified technician.

Handling CDs

- Do not touch the signal surfaces. Hold the CD by the edges, or by one edge and the hole.
- Do not affix labels or adhesive tapes to the label surfaces.
- Do not scratch or damage the label.
- Do not use damaged (cracked or warped) CDs.

Cleaning CDs

- Dirty CDs can cause poor sound quality. Always keep CDs clean by wiping them gently with a soft cloth from the inner edge toward the outer perimeter.
- If a CD becomes dirty, wipe the dirt away gently with a soft damp cloth and then remove any water droplets with a dry cloth.
- Do not use record cleaning sprays or antistatic agents on CDs. Also, never clean CDs with benzene, thinner, or other volatile solvents which may cause damage to the disc surface.
