

Thank you for purchasing a RadioShack Ford F-150. Your truck can make you a winner! With its proportional speed and precise steering, you can drive the truck almost anywhere. Built to  $^{1}/_{8}$  scale, it can reach speeds of up to 1,200 feet per minute and climb hills up to  $45^{\circ}$ .

Four Frequencies — let you race against other radio-controlled vehicles. Check your truck's box to see which frequency it

Supplied Box Wrench — lets you easily remove and replace the truck's wheels. Be careful not to discard the wrench when you unpack the truck.



Double Wishbone Front and Rear Suspension and High-Performance Tires — give it good traction on almost any terrain. The front- and rear-wheel differential gears let you take smooth, sharp corners.



# ATTACHING THE ANTENNAS

## ON THE TRUCK

The antenna tube holds up the truck's antenna wire for the best reception and range. Route the antenna wire's loose end through the tube. Then insert the tube securely into the truck's antenna tube holder.





## /N WARNING /N

Dispose of old batteries and the battery pack promptly and properly; do not burn or bury them

#### CAUTION W

- Use only fresh battery of the required size and recommended type.
- If you will not be using the truck for a week or more, remove the battery from the transmitter and the battery pack from the truck.
  Batteries can leak chemicals that can damage electronic parts.
- Never leave dead or weak batteries in the truck or transmitter.

## ON THE TRANSMITTER

Thread the antenna into the transmitter's antenna connector. Make sure the connection is tight.

# INSTALLING BATTERIES

You need one 9-volt battery for the transmitter, at least one 7.2-volt battery pack for the truck, and a battery pack charger (all available at your local RadioShack store or online at www.radioshack.com).

# IN THE TRANSMITTER

The transmitter requires one 9-volt battery. For the best performance and longest life, we recommend a RadioShack alkaline battery.


- 1. Slide the transmitter's ON/OFF switch to OFF.
- 2. Press down the battery compartment cover and slide it off in the direction of the arrow.
- 3. Put the battery in the compartment as indicated by the polarity symbols (+ and -) marked inside.
- 4. Replace the battery compartment cover.

If the transmitter's range decreases, replace the battery.

## INTHETRUCK

Your truck requires a rechargeable 7.2-volt battery pack. Before you use the battery pack, you must charge it using a special battery charger. Follow the charger's instructions to charge the battery pack.

- Slide the truck's ON/OFF switch under the truck to OFF.
- 2. Lift the battery compartment's tab and slide the cover in the direction of the arrow marked on it. Then lift off the cover.



- Place the battery pack between the compartment door and the body of the truck. The battery pack's connector must be on the same side as the truck's matching connector.
- 4. Attach the battery pack's connector to the truck's matching connector. Do not force them. They only fit together one way.
- 5. Close the cover.

If the truck loses power or does not respond to the transmitter, recharge the battery pack.

To remove the battery pack, unplug the connectors and open the cover as described in Step 2. Then slide the pack toward the pack's connector and lift the other side of the battery pack.  $\triangle$ 

To obtain the longest life from your truck, let the truck cool for at least 10 minutes before installing a new or newly charged battery pack.

## RECYCLING NI-CD BATTERIES

The EPA certified RBRC® Battery Recycling Seal on the nickel-cadmium (Ni-Cd) battery indicates RadioShack is voluntarily participating in an industry program to collect and recycle these batteries at the end of their useful life, when taken out of service in the United States or Canada. Do not touch the motor immediately after using the truck, as it might become hot during use.

## **CAUTION**


- Be sure the connector and wires do not touch any of the truck's moving parts.
- Use only the recommended battery pack and charger.
- Do not charge or recharge the battery pack while it is in the truck.
- After you charge or recharge the battery pack, disconnect it from the charger.
  Overcharging the battery pack could damage it.
- When you disconnect the battery pack from the charger, do not pull on the connector's wires. You might damage the battery pack.
- Do not play with your truck in the street.


# ☑ NOTE ☑

- Occasionally, let the battery pack fully discharge before recharging it. Otherwise, the battery pack loses its ability to fully charge.
- To run your truck for extended periods of time, we suggest you purchase an extra battery pack. You can charge one while you use the other

# DRIVING THE TRUCK

- 1. Extend the transmitter's antenna to its full length.
- 2. Slide the ON/OFF switches on the transmitter and the truck to ON.





3. Hold the transmitter in your left hand. With your left index finger in the trigger mechanism and the controls facing you, use the transmitter's trigger and wheel to drive and steer the truck.

## Steering Control Wheel

- · Turn left to move left.
- · Turn right to move right.
- Release to go straight.

## Speed Control Trigger

- Pull the trigger left to move forward.
  Increasing the pull increases the truck's speed.
- Push the trigger right to move backward.
- Release to stop.



This truck can reach much higher speeds than most radiocontrolled vehicles. Avoid highimpact collisions with people and objects.

# ADJUSTING THE TRIM CONTROLS

The neutral trim control (TRIM II above the ON/OFF switch) lets you fine-tune

the speed control so the truck stops completely when you release the speed control.



The steering trim control (TRIM I above the ON/OFF switch) lets you fine-tune the steering so the truck drives in a straight line when you set the

steering control to its center position.  $\lor$ 

- 1. Place the truck on a block or turn it over so the tires do not touch the ground.  $\checkmark$
- 2. Slide the ON/OFF switches on the transmitter and truck to ON. vehicles. If the tires move, turn TRIM II until the tires stop.
- 3. If the front tires angle left or right, turn TRIM I until they point directly forward.
- When you finish the adjustment, slide the ON/OFF switches on the transmitter and the truck to OFF.

## HELPFUL HINTS

These hints can help you get the most enjoyment from your truck.

- If someone uses a CB nearby, it might interfere with control of the truck. If this happens, move the truck and transmitter away from the CB.
- If the truck moves slowly and you have installed a fully charged battery pack, check the wheel mechanisms for lint, thread, hair, truck or dust.



- Do not touch the tires while adjusting the trim controls.
- You might have to further fine-tune TRIM I after using the truck for a while.

## CAUTION W

Never set TRIM II to make the truck continually move.

# RACING TWO OR MORE VEHICLES TOGETHER

The truck and other radio-controlled vehicles use specific frequencies to operate. vehicles with different control frequencies can race together without interference. Vehicles with the same frequency cannot.

The following chart shows the available control frequencies for your truck, based on its ribbon color. If you buy more than one truck and you plan to race them, check the stickers on the boxes to be sure they are different band numbers/colors for different frequencies.

Band	Frequency	Ribbon Color
1	26.995MHz	Brown
2	27.045MHz	Red
3	27.095MHz	Orange
5	27.195MHz	Green

# THE FCC WANTS YOUTO KNOW

Your truck or transmitter might cause TV or radio interference even when it is operating properly. To determine whether your truck or transmitter is causing the interference, turn off your truck and the transmitter. If the interference goes away, your truck or transmitter is causing it. Try to eliminate the interference by:

- moving your truck and transmitter away from the TV or radio.
- · Contacting your local RadioShack store for help.

If you cannot eliminate the interference, the FCC requires that you stop using your truck.

# CARE

Keep the truck dry; if it gets wet, wipe it dry immediately. Use and store the truck only in normal temperature environments. Handle the truck carefully; do not drop it. Keep the truck away from dust and dirt, and wipe it with a damp cloth occasionally to keep it looking new.

# SERVICE AND REPAIR

If your truck is not performing as it should, take it to your local RadioShack store for assistance. Modifying or tampering with the truck's internal components can cause a malfunction and might invalidate its warranty and void your FCC authorization to operate it.

You will be charged for repair or replacement of the product made after the expiration of the warranty period.

This warranty does not cover: (a) damage or failure caused by or attributable to acts of God, abuse, accident, misuse, improper or abnormal usage, failure to follow instructions, improper installation or maintenance, alteration, lightning or other incidence of excess voltage or current; (b) any repairs other than those provided by a RadioShack Authorized Service Facility; (c) consumables such as fuses or batteries; (d) cosmetic damage; (e) transportation, shipping or insurance costs; or (f) costs of product removal, installation, set-up service adjustment or reinstallation.
