let you power the player using either your car's DC power source or household AC power.

5.8" TFT Flat LCD Color Monitor —

makes the DVD player more compact and use less power than a standard picture tube.

Remote Control — lets you conveniently control the DVD player.

Dual Headphones Jacks — let you connect the supplied headphones for private listening.

Audio/Video Input Jacks — let you connect a video game console, camcorder, or digital camera.

Audio/Video Output Jacks — let you connect to an external TV.

- CD-RW A re-writable disc. You can write information onto this type of disc more than once. For example, if you have previously downloaded MP3 files to a CD-RW disc, you can write information to the disc again, after it erases the previously written information.





A QUICK LOOK AT THE REMOTE CONTROL

DISPLAY — Press during playback to briefly display the elapsed time and disc remaining time.

ANGLE — Press to access various camera angles on a disc. If the disc does not contain multiple camera angles, appears.

SUBTITLE — Press to briefly show the subtitle banner. If the disc was not created with subtitles, **P** appears.

AUDIO — Lets you select a different language during DVD playback. If the disc was authored without multiple languages, appears.

ZOOM — Press to enlarge a picture to 1.25, 2, 3, or 4 times ' the original size.

RETURN — Returns you to the normal display from the screen saver mode.

A-B — Lets you repeat a portion of the disc from a designated point (A) to another designated point (B).

REW/[◀] — Press during playback to fast reverse through a disc.

FF/→ — Press during playback to fast forward through a disc.

SLOW — Advances picture slowly.

***STOP/■** — Press to stop disc play.

PAUSE/II — Press to pause disc play. For audio CDs, a second press resumes playback.

Number Buttons — Use to input information such as chapter numbers, track numbers, or to make selections on some menu screens.

SETUP — Press to display the setup menu main page.

▲/ ▼/ ◀/ ► — Use to move through the onscreen menus. To highlight a menu item, press ▲, ▼, ◀, or ►. Then press ENTER to select it.

MENU — Displays the DVD player's root menu.

REPEAT — Press to display the Repeat info banner. You can repeat part or all of a chapter, track, or disc.

*SKIP+/> — Press to search forward through a disc during playback. Advances forward one chapter or track at a time.

***SKIP-/**^I — Press to search backward through a disc during playback. Advances backward one chapter or track at a time.

*PLAY/ — Press to begin disc play and select menu items.

Y NOTES 🛛

- Make sure there is a clear path between the remote and the DVD player so the signal is not blocked.
- \star indicates the control has the same function as the controls on the DVD player.
- Your remote is shipped with a vinyl insulation slip to prevent battery drain. Pull out the insulation slip before using the remote.
- When you press STOP / ■, the zoom feature turns off.

INCLUDED ACCESSORIES

Your DVD player includes the following accessories.

Carrying Case — protects the DVD player and lets you easily carry it (and all of the accessories) anywhere. An accessory pouch is also included.



Shoulder Strap — Attaches to the carrying case (Clip hooks on both ends).



DC Adapter — lets you power the DVD player from your vehicle's cigarette lighter socket.



Two (2) Pairs of Earbuds — for private listening.



AC Adapter — lets you power the DVD player from a standard AC outlet.



Audio/Video Cables — let you connect the DVD player to a TV, amplifier, video game, or camcorder.



Four (4) Straps for Vehicle Installation — let you install the DVD player securely in your vehicle (Clip the hook on one end and the "S" hook on the other).



BASIC INSTALLATION

For a graphical view of the installation, see the Quick Start.

INSTALLING THE **DVD P**LAYER IN A VEHICLE

- 1. Make sure the DVD player is securely fastened in the carrying case.
- 2. Pull down the panel on the back of the carrying case and reattach it, aligning the velcro strip to the catch panel.
- 3. Attach one of the supplied straps to the carrying case and hang the strap over the back of the headrest.
- 4. Attach one strap to each loop on the bottom of each side of the carrying case.
- 5. Wrap the straps around the bottom front of your seat and attach them together. The configuration varies depending on your car seat.
- 6. Secure the DVD player by adjusting the straps to the appropriate length for your car seat.

CONNECTING VEHICLE BATTERY POWER

You can power the DVD player from your vehicle's 12V power source (such as a cigarette-lighter socket) using the supplied DC adapter. \check{Z}

- 1. Unzip the middle zipper on the carrying case to insert the adapter plug into the jack.
- 2. Connect the supplied DC adapter cord's barrel plug to the **DC IN** jack on the back of the DVD player.
- 3. Connect the other end of the adapter to the vehicle's cigarette lighter socket.

CONNECTING HEADPHONES

The DVD player has two $^{1}/_{8}$ -inch (3.5 mm) headphones jacks on the right side of the screen panel for private listening. Connect the supplied stereo headphones' $^{1}/_{8}$ inch (3.5 mm) plug(s) into the 1 and/or 2 jack(s).

\check{Z} caution \check{Z}

 You must use a power source that supplies 9V–12V DC and delivers at least 1.2A. Its center tip must be set to positive and its plug must fit the DVD player's DC IN 9V–12V jack. The supplied adapter meets these specifications. Using an adapter that does not meet these specifications could damage the DVD player or the adapter.

! IMPORTANT **!**

To avoid draining your car's battery power, do not leave the DVD player on or the DC adapter connected to the cigarette lighter when your vehicle is not running.

🕑 NOTE 🕑

The built-in speakers are disabled when you plug a headphone into $\mathbf{01}$, but not when you plug a headphone into $\mathbf{02}$.

Listening Safely

To protect your hearing, follow these guidelines when you use headphones.

- Set the volume to the lowest setting before you begin listening. After you begin listening, adjust the volume to a comfortable level.
- Do not listen at extremely high volume levels. Extended high-volume listening can lead to permanent hearing loss.
- Once you set the volume, do not increase it. Over time, your ears adapt to the volume level, so a volume level that does not cause discomfort might still damage your hearing.

Traffic Safety

- Do not wear headphones while operating a motor vehicle or riding a bicycle. This can create a traffic hazard and could be illegal in some areas.
- Even though some headphones let you hear some outside sounds when listening at normal volume levels, they still can present a traffic hazard.

BASIC OPERATION

LOADING AND PLAYING A DVD

Compatible Disc Types

Your DVD player plays DVD discs, Audio CD discs, and most CD-R discs/CD-RW discs. Before you load a disc, make sure it is compatible with the player.

The following discs cannot be used with this player:

- Video CD discs
- · Laserdiscs and mini discs
- CD-I, CD-ROM (computer-only discs), DVD-ROM
- Discs recorded using other broadcast standards (PAL or SECAM).
- CD-G discs play audio only, not graphics.

Loading and Playing a Disc

- 1. Slide the DVD's locking latch in the direction of the arrow, and lift up the DVD player's upper case.
- 2. To turn the power on, slide **POWER** to **ON**. The DVD player's POWER indicator lights.
- 3. Open the disc tray by pressing **OPEN** at the lower right of the disc tray.
- 4. Place a disc in the tray with the disc's label facing up (double-sided discs have content on both sides, so you can place either side up). Make sure the disc fully seats on the tray's spindle.
- 5. Press **CLOSE** at the right side of the tray door until it clicks shut.
- Press PLAY ▶, located on the right side of the disc tray or on the remote. The DVD player reads the disc's table of contents, and then one of following happens depending on how the disc was programmed:
 - The disc starts playing.
 - The disc menu appears on the screen. One of the options starts disc play. Highlight that option using

 ▲ /▼/ ◀or ►. Press ENTER on the remote.
- 7. Rotate **BRIGHT** and **VOLUME** to adjust the LCD's brightness and the DVD player's volume.
- 8. To stop playing a disc, press STOP ■.

- When you stop playing a disc, the DVD player remembers where you stopped.
- When you press PLAY ► to start playing the disc again, the player picks up where you left off unless you press STOP ■ again, removed the disc, or unplugged the DVD player.
- 9. To turn off the DVD player, press **POWER** on the DVD player. The DVD player's POWER indicator turns off.

Removing a Disc

To remove a disc, use your thumb to hold down the spindle while placing other fingers on the recess at the upper right and lifting up the edge of the disc.

OTHER CONNECTIONS


You can connect your DVD player to a TV, a TV and Audio/ Video receiver, a camcorder, a game system console, or a digital camera.

CONNECTING TO A TV

Position cables properly to avoid audio interference.

- Insert each cable firmly into the designated jack.
- If you place components above the TV, route all cables down the side of the back of the TV instead of straight down the middle of the back of the TV.
- If your antenna uses 300-ohm twin lead cables, do not coil the cables. Also, keep the twin lead cables away from audio/video cables.
- Connect the supplied A/V cable's twoplug end to the OUTPUT VIDEO / AUDIO jacks on the back of the DVD player. The yellow plug is VIDEO. Black is AUDIO.
- 2. Connect the supplied A/V cable's three-plug end to an A/V cable (not supplied) connected to your TV. Match the cable by color code if possible.

TV MONITOR




🕑 NOTE 📝

- Some TVs do not have an RCA or S-Video jack, they only have a coaxial antenna jack. In this case, you must purchase an RF modulator (not supplied, available at your local RadioShack store).
- When you connect the DVD player to a TV, the DVD player's display and speakers remain on. To turn off the display, slide OFF/ ON under the screen to OFF.
- You may turn the DVD player's volume to the minimum level when listening to the TV's speaker.

CONNECTING TO A TV AND AMPLIFIER

You can also connect the DVD player to a TV and to a stereo amplifier to enjoy high quality stereo sound.

- Connect the supplied A/V cable's two-plug end to the OUTPUT VIDEO / AUDIO jacks on the back of the DVD player.
- Connect the supplied A/V cable's three-plug end to an A/V cable (not supplied). Connect the yellow (VIDEO) cable to VIDEO IN on your TV. Connect the red connector (AUDIO RIGHT) and white connector (AUDIO LEFT) to your A/V receiver.



Other Connections


CONNECTING TO A CAMCORDER, GAME CONSOLE, OR DIGITAL CAMERA

You can connect a camcorder for video playback, or a digital camera to view pictures. For this connection, if you have not connected the **OUTPUT** jacks to a TV, use the supplied audio/video cable for this connection.

- Connect the supplied A/V cable's two-plug end to the INPUT VIDEO / AUDIO jacks on the back of the DVD player. When you plug into VIDEO (INPUT), the DVD player will be disabled.
- 2. Connect the supplied A/V cable's three-plug end to an A/V cable (not supplied). Connect the yellow (VIDEO) cable to VIDEO OUT on your Camcorder, digital camera, or game console. Connect the red connector (AUDIO RIGHT) and white connector (AUDIO LEFT) to the device's AUDIO OUT.

Y NOTE 📝

Some game systems have a proprietary output cable. Follow your game system's hookup instructions to send audio/video to the DVD player.



Connecting a Game Console

If you are connecting a game system console, you may need to connect a DC to AC inverter (not supplied, available from RadioShack). \square

CONNECTING AC POWER FOR INDOOR USE

You can power the DVD player using the supplied 9V, 1.2 A AC adapter. ${ar Z}$

- 1. To use the DVD player indoors, connect the supplied AC adapter's barrel plug into the **DC IN** jack.
- 2. Lift up the AC plug module's two blades and insert the AC plug to a standard AC outlet.

Ž caution Ž

You must use a Class 2 or ITE power source that supplies 9–12V DC and delivers at least 1.2 Amps. Its center tip must be set to positive and its plug must fit the DVD player's **DC IN 9–12V** jack. The supplied adapter meets these specifications. Using an adapter that does not meet these specifications could damage the DVD player or the adapter.

ADVANCED FEATURES

Menus

Using Different Menus

Each disc is programmed with different features. There are three separate menu paths that you can use to access features:

- The Disc menu The Disc menu is part of each disc and is separate from the DVD player's menu. The contents of each Disc menu varies according to how the disc was authored and what features are included. Press MENU on the remote (while a disc is playing) to view the the Disc menu. Press MENU again to turn off the Disc menu.
- The DVD player's Info Display The Info Display appears across the top of the screen when a disc is playing. It can only be accessed while you are playing a disc. Press DISPLAY on the remote to turn Info Display on and off.
- The DVD player menu The DVD player's menu system is accessed only when a disc isn't playing. It appears automatically when you press STOP/= on the remote or the DVD player.

A feature only works if the disc was programmed with that feature. For example, if you choose subtitles on the Info Display, the subtitles only appear if the disc was created with subtitles. If a menu item is "grayed out", that feature is not available.

Using a Disc Menu

A disc may have an on-screen menu that is separate from the DVD player's menu system and on-screen Info Display. The disc menu might only contain a list of the titles and chapters, or it may allow you to change features such as language and playback settings.

Although the content and operation of disc menus vary from disc to disc, the following example gives you an idea of what to expect.

- 1. While the disc is playing, press **MENU** on the remote. The disc menu appears.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight the section of the disc menu you want to choose, and press ENTER on the remote.

- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select a language, and press ENTER on the remote.
- 4. Press MENU on the remote to resume playback. $\mathcal V$

DVD PLAYBACK FEATURES

Fast Motion Playback (Picture Scan)

You can search in forward or reverse mode.

- 1. Press ◄ (reverse) or ➡ (forward) on the remote during playback to search through a disc.
- 2. Press the button again on the remote to search at the next speed. Picture Scan has 5 speeds. With each consecutive press of the button, the search speed increases.
- 3. Press **PLAY**/ ► on the remote to resume normal playback.

Freeze Frame

- 1. Press **II PAUSE** on the remote once to freeze playback.
- 2. Press PLAY/ ► to resume normal playback.

Slow Motion Playback

Press **SLOW** on the remote for slow motion playback.

Press the button again to decrease the speed. Each time you press **SLOW**, the playback speed decreases (see "Playback Speed" to the right).

You may also press **PLAY**/ ► to return to normal speed.

Skipping Chapters

Use **SKIP** + \bowtie to go to the next chapter and **SKIP** - \bowtie to go to the previous chapter.

Subtitles

When a DVD is recorded with subtitles, you can use the Subtitle feature to view the subtitles on-screen. To turn subtitles on:

- Press SUBTITLE on the remote. The Info banner displays the default subtitle language and the number of subtitle languages available. If no subtitles are available, Papears.
- 2. Press **SUBTITLE** again to turn subtitles on. The subtitles appear in the default language. To see subtitles in a

Any settings you change on the disc menu override the default settings in the DVD player's menu temporarily. Default settings are can be changed in the DVD player's menu system. To change the default settings, see "Setting Up Defaults" on Page 20.

Changing the Audio Language

When you play a disc, the player's default audio language is selected. If the disc does not contain this language, the disc's default language is automatically selected. This feature is disc-dependent, and may not work with all DVDs.

Changing the Camera Angle

• This feature only works when a DVD has been recorded with a multi-camera angle system.

different language, press **SUBTITLE** to scroll through the available subtitles.

3. To turn subtitles off, press **SUBTITLE** until the subtitles disappear.

Changing the Audio Language

When a DVD is recorded with multiple sound tracks, you can use the Audio feature to temporarily change the audio language (the language of the sound track).

- 2. Continue pressing AUDIO to scroll through available languages. $\ensuremath{\mathcal{V}}$

Changing the Camera Angle

Some DVDs contain multiple angles of a particular scene or sequence. Follow these steps to change the camera angle.

1. During disc playback, press **ANGLE** on the remote. The current and total angle numbers appear.

If no camera angle is available, \bigcirc appears. If multiple camera angles are available, 24 appears and shows the current angle number and the number of angles available. For example, 1/4 indicates that angle one is being displayed, and there are four different angles available.

- 2. Press **ANGLE** again to go to the next camera angle.
- 3. Continue to press **ANGLE** to resume normal playback. \mathcal{V}

Using the Repeat Feature

There are four repeat options:

- Chapter repeats the chapter that is playing
- Title repeats the title that is playing
- All repeats all the titles that have been played
- A-B Repeat repeats a selected segment of the disc

To Repeat a Chapter, Title or All

REPEAT on the remote toggles between CHAPTER REPEAT, TITLE REPERT, ALL REPEAT and REPEAT OFF.

Playing JPEG Discs

- 1. While a disc is playing, press **REPEAT** to turn on chapter repeat.
 CHRPTER appears. The current chapter repeats.
- 3. To turn repeat off, press **REPEAT** until \bigcirc **OFF** appears.

Pressing **STOP** on the DVD turns off the repeat function.

A-B Repeat

A-B Repeat lets you repeat a specific segment on the DVD that you define.

- 2. Allow the movie to play to the end of the segment you want to mark. You must let the movie play in standard playback mode to set the B point in A-B Repeat. If you reverse or fast-forward, A-B Repeat is cancelled.
- 3. Press A-B again to set the B point. ⊂⊃ **R** -B appears onscreen.
- The segment you set plays until you turn off A-B Repeat. To turn A-B Repeat off, press A-B to resume normal playback. <□ OFF appears.

PLAYING JPEG DISCS

After loading a JPEG disc, the JPEG main menu page displays. Use \blacktriangleleft , \blacktriangle , \triangleright , or \lor and **ENTER** on the remote to select the picture you want to display.

During playback, use \blacktriangleleft , \blacklozenge , \triangleright , and \triangledown to rotate the picture.

Use **ZOOM**, and then **FF** or **REW** \triangleleft on the remote to shrink or enlarge the picture to 50%, 75%, 100%, 125%, 150%, or 200%. While you enlarge the photo (Zooming in), use \triangleleft , \blacktriangle , \triangleright , and \triangledown to pan up, down, left or right to view the whole picture. To exit zoom mode, press **PLAY**/ \triangleright , **SKIP** + \bowtie , or **SKIP** - \bowtie .

Press **STOP/■** to go to the JPEG submenu pages. Use ◀, ▲, ▶, or ▼ and **ENTER** to select the desired function. To return to the JPEG main menu page, press **STOP/■** again.

PLAYING AUDIO CDs

LOADING AND PLAYING AN AUDIO CD

- 1. Press **OPEN** at the front right of the DVD player.
- 2. Place a disc into the tray with the disc's label facing up. Make sure the disc fully seats onto the spindle.
- Press down on CLOSE at the lower right side of the tray door to close the tray. The DVD player reads the disc's table of contents and the current track number/total track number appears (TRACK01/(total track number) Track 1 begins playing automatically, and the elapsed time displays on the right of the screen.
- 4. Press **STOP/** to stop playback.

AUDIO CD PLAYBACK FEATURES

When playing audio CDs, your DVD player has many of the same features that a CD player has, including track skip and repeat play.

Skipping Tracks

Press **SKIP** + \bowtie to go to the next track and **SKIP** – \bowtie to go to the previous track.

Using the Repeat Feature

There are three repeat options:

- Track repeats the track that is playing
- ALL repeats the entire disc
- A-B Repeat repeats a selected segment of the disc

To Repeat a Track or Disc:

- 1. While a disc is playing, press **REPEAT** on the remote.
- 2. To repeat the entire disc, press **REPEAT** again. \bigcirc **RLL** appears.
- 3. To turn repeat off, press **REPEAT** until 🗂 **OFF** appears.

A-B Repeat

A-B Repeat lets you repeat a specific segment on the disc. See "A-B Repeat" on Page 17 to use A-B Repeat with an Audio disc.

Using the Display Function

While an audio CD is playing, consecutively press **DISPLAY** on the remote. The following displays appear briefly on the screen in this sequence:

- SINGLE ELRPSED time for a song
- SINGLE REMAIN time for a song
- TOTAL ELAPSED time for the entire disc
- TOTAL REMAIN time for the entire disc
- DISPLAY OFF

PLAYING MP3 DISCs

 This DVD player only plays discs containing MP3 files
 recorded from your CD-R and CD-RW drives. Though it plays most MP3 files, it may not play them all.

When you play an MP3 disc, the MP3 menu appears.

- 1. Press **OPEN** on the front right of the DVD player.
- 2. Insert an MP3 disc into the tray with the disc's label facing up.
- 3. Press **CLOSE** at the right side of the tray door until it clicks shut.
- 4. Press PLAY. Track 1 begins playing.
- 5. Press **STOP/** to stop playback.

Selecting Tracks

If the MP3 files are stored in a folder, use \blacktriangle and \lor on the remote to select the folder. Then press **ENTER**. The track list appears. Press \triangleright , and then \blacklozenge , \heartsuit , **SKIP** – \bowtie , or **SKIP** + \rightarrowtail to select a track. Press **PLAY**/ \triangleright to play the track. The player will continue from that track to the last track in the folder and then stop. \heartsuit

SKIPPING TRACKS

To skip forward to the beginning of the next song on an MP3 disc, press **SKIP** + → on the remote or the front of the player.

To skip backward to the beginning of the previous track on an MP3 disc, press **SKIP** – I^I on the remote or the front of the player.

Playing MP3 Discs



▲ and ▼ move through the track list one track at a time. SKIP + ^{▶▶} and SKIP – ^{▶▲} move through the list one page at a time.

TO REPEAT AN MP3 TRACK OR DISC

- 1. While a disc is playing, press **REPEAT** on the remote. **REPERT-ONE** appears. The current track repeats.
- 2. To repeat the entire folder, press **REPEAT** again. **REPERT-FOLDER** appears.
- 3. To turn repeat off, press REPEAT until FOLDER appears.

USING THE DISPLAY FUNCTION

While a disc is playing, press **DISPLAY** to display single track elapsed time. **SINGLE ELRPSED** displays briefly.

SETTING UP DEFAULTS General Setup

Press SETUP on the remote to view the SETUP MEAU MRIN PRSE.

Select **GENERAL SETUP** using \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown on the remote and then press **ENTER** to enter the General Setup page.

TV DISPLRY: Select **TV DISPLRY** using $\blacktriangle / \lor / \lhd$ or \triangleright on the remote, and then press \triangleright to enter the submenu. Press \blacktriangle / \lor on the remote to select one of the following then press **ENTER** to confirm the setting.

- **NORMRL/PS:** When watching a DVD with wide picture on a normal TV (not wide one), a portion may be cut off automatically to fit the screen.
- **NORMRL/LB:** When watching a DVD with wide picture on a normal TV (not wide one), a black strip at both top and bottom screen appear to fit the screen.
- **WIDE:** When the player is connected to a wide screen TV, a wide picture is then shown on the full screen.

RNGLE MARK: Select **RNGLE MARK** using $\blacktriangle / \lor / \triangleleft$ or \triangleright on the remote and then press \triangleright to enter the submenu.

Some DVDs may contain scenes shot simultaneously from different angles. For these discs, the same scene can be viewed from each of these different angles using **ANGLE**. The recorded angles differ depending on the disc. \swarrow

Choose **Angle Mark** on the screen **ON/OFF** using ▲ or ▼.
 Then press **ENTER** to confirm the following setting:
 O1: shows angle mark on the screen

OFF: does not show the Angle mark on the screen

MAIN PRGE: Select **MAIN PRGE** using $\blacktriangle / \checkmark / \triangleleft$ or \triangleright on the remote, and then press **ENTER** to return to the main page.

To resume play, press **SETUP**.

SETTING PREFERENCES

When there is no disc inside the player, press **SETUP** to display the **MRIN PRGE**. Use \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown on the remote to select **Preferences Setup**. Then press **ENTER** to enter the preferences page.

DISC RUDIO: Select DISC RUDIO using ◄, ▲, ►, or ▼ on the remote, and then press ► to enter the submenu.

Select the audio language you desire using ▲ or ▼ (ENGLISH, FRENCH, SPRNISH, CHINESE, or JRPRNESE). Then press ENTER to confirm the setting. Press ◄ to return to the menu.

SUBTITLE: Select SUBTITLE using ◄, ▲, ▶, or ▼ on the remote, and then press ▶ to enter the submenu.

Select the subtitle language you desire using \blacktriangle or \lor on the remote (ENGLISH, FRENCH, SPRNISH, CHINESE, JRPANESE or OFF). Then press ENTER to confirm the setting. Press \triangleleft to return to the menu.

DISC MENU: Select DISC MENU using ◄, ▲, ►, or ▼ on the remote and then ► to enter the submenu.

Select the disc menu language you desire using \blacktriangle or \checkmark (EnGLISH, FRENCH, SPANISH, CHINESE, or JAPANESE). Then press ENTER to confirm the setting. Press \blacktriangleleft to return to the menu. \heartsuit

- DEFRULT: Select DEFRULT using ◄, ▲, ►, or ▼ on the remote, and then press ► to enter the submenu. Press ENTER to return to the factory-preset mode.
- **MRIN PRGE:** Select **MRIN PRGE** using ◄, ▲, ►, or ▼ on the remote and then press **ENTER** to return to the main page.



REPLACING THE REMOTE'S BATTERY

Your remote control requires one CR2025 lithium button cell battery for power. Batteries are available at your local RadioShack store or online at www.radioshack.com. $\Delta \check{Z}$

 Press the tab on the battery compartment tray, to the right and slide the battery compartment tray out.



- Remove the old battery and insert a new CR2025
 button cell Lithium battery in the battery compartment tray, + side up.

Press **ENTER** to enter the password verify page. Input the password in 4 digits, and then press **ENTER** to store the parental level setting.

CHANGING THE PASSWORD

PRSSWORD: Select **PRSSWORD** using \blacktriangleleft , \blacklozenge , \triangleright , or \lor on the remote and then press \triangleright to enter the submenu. Press **ENTER** to enter the password change page. Input the old password, the new password, and the confirmed new password. Press **ENTER** to store the change. Press \blacktriangleleft to return to the previous menu. \heartsuit

The default password is 3308 and this password is always effective whether you have changed it to a new one or not, just in case that you forget the new password. To avoid others using it to set the parental level and change the password, you may note this default password by other means and delete it from this manual. \mathbf{K}



Some discs let you set limits depending on the age of users while other discs do not.

CARE

Keep the DVD player dry; if it gets wet, wipe it dry immediately. Use and store the DVD player only in normal temperature environments. Handle the DVD player carefully; do not drop it. Keep the DVD player away from dust and dirt, and wipe it with a damp cloth occasionally to keep it looking new.

HANDLING CAUTIONS

Before connecting other components to this player, be sure to turn all components off.

Do not place anything other than the disc in the disc tray.

Exterior influences such as lightning and static electricity can affect normal operation of this player. If this occurs, turn the player off and on again using **POWER** on the player, or disconnect and then reconnect the AC power cord to the AC power outlet.

Remove the disc and turn off the player after use.

CASE MAINTENANCE

For safety reasons, when cleaning the case be sure to disconnect the AC power cord from the AC outlet.

- Do not use benzene, thinner, or other solvents for cleaning.
- Wipe the case with a soft cloth.

FORMATION OF CONDENSATION

Due to sharp changes in temperature and humidity, condensation may form if warm air comes in contact with any cold parts inside the player.

When condensation forms inside the player, the player may not operate correctly. If this occurs, leave the player at room temperature until the inside of the player becomes dry and operational.

If condensation forms on a disc, wipe the disc with a soft, dry cloth by moving the cloth from the center hole toward the outer edge.

HANDLING DISCS

- Do not touch the disc's signal surfaces. Hold by the edges or by one edge and the hole in the center.
- Do not affix labels or adhesive tape to label surfaces. Don't scratch or damage the label.
- Do not use damaged (cracked or warped) discs.

CLEANING DISCS

- Dirty discs can cause reduced video and audio performance. Always keep discs clean by wiping them gently with a soft cloth from the inner edge toward the outer perimeter.
- If a disc becomes very dirty, wet a soft cloth in water, and wring it out well. Wipe the dirt away gently, and remove any water drops with a dry cloth.
- Do not use record-cleaning sprays or anti-static agents on discs. Also, never clean the discs with benzene, thinner, or other volatile solvents which may cause damage to the disc surface.
