FCC Information

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Important

Your pager is capable of storing messages and telephone numbers totaling up to 100,000 characters. To prevent the loss of important data due to battery failure, replace the battery before the power level becomes too low. Battery life will vary depending on several factors, including:

- The amount of time the Clearvue illuminated display is active.
- The amount of time the pager is "ON."

Using this Owners Guide


- When you see the word "press," press and release the specified key. If needed to "press and hold," you will be prompted to do so.
- The displays in this owners manual are general representations of what you will see. Your paging service provider may change the wording.

Installing the Battery

Your pager requires one 1.5 VDC, AAA battery for power.

Caution: Only use the battery specified above.


1. Release the battery compartment lock. Slide and lift off the battery cover.



2. Insert the AAA battery into the compartment according to the polarity symbols (+) and (-) marked inside.



Match the dots on the pager and battery cover.Slide the battery cover on, then slide the lock-tab down.



Turning Your Pager On

Press and hold for approximately two seconds. The display will temporarily go blank and then show the standby display (see page 6).

Turning Your Pager Off

- At the standby display, press to go the Function menu (page 9).
- 2. Press ➤ to select POWER OFF (♠).
- Press again and your pager is in the standby mode.

Low Battery Warning


When battery power is low, this symbol (□) appears in the bottom center of the display, and – once every 30 minutes – a low beep sounds that lasts four seconds. When this happens:

- Replace the battery as soon as possible to prevent data loss.
- You will have to press twice (instead of normally pressing once) at the Standby display to go to the Function menu (page 9).




The built-in memory saver will store messages and settings for approximately two minutes while you change the battery - or after the battery loses power.

Standby Display



1. Time

- Message Status Displays CALL, MAIL, Low Battery
 , and FULL. This symbol (-----) indicates no
 messages or calls. This symbol (0000) indicates all
 messages have been read.
- 3. Alarm () Indicates an alarm has been set.
- 4. Audio Alert (♣) This displays when a tone has been selected for message alert. The Silent Alert (♣) and Vibrate (♣) icons are also displayed here.
- Signal Meter Strength ('1') Flashes when there is no signal.
- Carrier Logo The logo of the assigned carrier is displayed here.

Clearvue Illuminated Display

Your pager is equipped with the Clearvue illuminated display. To activate this display, perform the following steps:

- The backlight illuminates and remains on for approximately 20 seconds.



Pressing any key during this 20 second period keeps the display illuminated. If no key is pressed for 20 seconds, the illuminated display shuts off.



Frequent use of the illuminated display will shorten the battery life.

Receiving and Displaying Personal Messages

Your pager can store up to 40 messages in the order that they're received. If the memory is full when a new message arrives, FULL appears in the bottom center of the display. The newest message then replaces the oldest in memory.

- If Quickview is off when a message is received, your pager will sound an alarm. You will then need to press or to display the personal message menu. A cursor will appear to the left of the first new message.
- If Quickview is on when a message is received, your pager will sound an alarm (if the alarm is on) and the message will be displayed immediately.
- Move through your message line by line (with the ▼▲ keys) or page by page (with the ▼▲ keys).
- Be sure to delete (or move to a folder) unwanted messages after you've read them. Your pager starts replacing the oldest messages when the memory becomes full.

The Function Menu

There are ten choices in the Function menu:



- Return Returns to the previous menu.
- **Select Alert** Changes the alert type.
- **Power Off** Turns the unit off.
- **Set Alarm** Sets the alarm for time, day, and/or date.
- Folders Stores up to 25 messages in each of 10 folders.
- **Mail Drop History** Stores up to three over-flow messages from normal mail drops.
- Phone Directory Stores up to 128 names and numbers.
- Setup Options Set time/date, label folders, mail drop, reminders, quickview, font size and contrast.
- Delete All Deletes all read messages.
 - **Set Silent Time** Set times with no alerts.

Choosing the Alert Type

- 1. At the standby display, press
- Press
 to choose SELECT ALERT
 then press
 . ,
- 3. Cycle through the alert types with the ► **k**eys (sample alert tones will sound).
- 4. Select the alert type you like, then press •.
- 5. The selected alert will sound and the standby display appears showing the selected audio alert (), vibrating alert (), or silent alert () icon in the bottom right of the display.

Power On and Off

Refer to page 4.

Setting the Alarms

Your pager can be set to sound an audible or vibrating alarm at any time, on any day, on any date. Even if the pager is off, it will still sound a unique tone or vibrate for approximately 20 seconds. To stop the alarm sooner, press any key.

Setting a Daily Alarm

To set the alarm for a specific time. For example, every day at 1:00 p.m.

- 1. At the standby display, press —.
- 2. At the Function menu, press ➤ to select SET ALARM ♣, then press ►.
- 3. Select TIME ALARM with the \blacktriangledown key, then press \frown .
- Press again and the cursor advances to the alarm start time.
- 6. To store your selection and return to the standby display, press •.

Setting a Weekly Alarm

To set an alarm for a specific day of the week. For example, every Wednesday at 1:00 p.m.

- 1. At the standby display, press —.
- 2. At the Function menu, press \longrightarrow to select SET ALARM \clubsuit , then press \frown .
- Select TIME ALARM with the ▼ key, then press ●.
 Press to advance the cursor to the alarm start time.
- 4. Press
 to advance the cursor to the alarm start time.
- To store your selection and return to the standby display, press

Setting a Date Alarm

To set an alarm for a specific date and time. For example, Friday, November 22, at 1:40 p.m.

- 1. At the standby display, press —.
- 2. At the Function menu press ► to select SET ALf I, then press ►.
- 3. Select DATE ALARM, with the \bigvee key, then press \bigcirc .
- 4. Press to advance the cursor to the start time.
- 6. To store your selection and return to the standby display, press •.

Using Folders

Your pager has ten folders that are used to store up to 25 personal or mail drop messages each. Each folder can be assigned a 10 character label. You can change this label at any time (see page 22).

Viewing a Folder's Contents

- 1. At the Function menu, press ► to select FOLDERS 📛, then press ► .
- 2. Press ▼ to move the cursor to the desired folder.
- 3. Press to view the folder's contents.
- The message displays. Press ▼ to scroll through the message line by line.
- 5. Press to scroll through the message page by page.

Moving a Message To Another Folder

- 1. View the message by following the steps in "Viewing a Folder's Contents" (see page 14), then press —.
- Press
 to select MOVE TO FOLDER ☐, then press
 .
- 3. Select the folder where you want to move the message by pressing ▼.
- Press again to return to the message menu.
 If the selected folder is full, MEMORY FULL will be displayed.

Deleting a Message From a Folder

- 1. View the message by following the steps in "Viewing a Folder's Contents" (see page 14), then press —.
- 2. Press ► to select DELETE MESSAGE , then press ►.
- 3. Press , and MESSAGE: ## DELETED displays.

Deleting All Messages From a Folder

- 1. View the message by following the steps in "Viewing a Folder's Contents" (see page 14), then press —.
- 2. Press ► to select DELETE ALL IN FOLDER ②, then press ►.
- Press , ALL MESSAGES IN FOLDER ____:## DELETED displays.

Mail Drop History

Mail Drops are messages from services that are updated periodically (news, weather). When you receive a Mail Drop message, MAIL appears in the standby display. Each mail drop history folder holds up to three messages.

- 1. At the standby display, press -.
- 2. Press ➤ to select MAIL DROP HISTORY #, then press ➤.
- 3. Press ▼ to select the desired Mail History folder.
- Press

 and the most recent Mail Drop messages appear.
- 5. Select a message with the $\bigvee A$ keys, then press \frown .
- Press ▼ to scroll through the message line by line.
 Press ► to scroll through the message page by page.
- 7. Press —, and RETURN displays.
- 8. Press again to go to the message menu.



From the Message menu, if no key is pressed for eight seconds, the display will return to standby

Moving, Deleting, and Deleting All Mail Drop Messages

Please see "Moving," "Deleting," and "Deleting All Messages" on pages 14 and 15. These instructions about folders are also applicable to Mail Drop Messages. Perform the same steps, only this time select the Mail Drop History icon instead of the folders icon (where applicable).

Using The Phone Directory

Entering Names and Numbers

Your phone directory can store up to 128 names and numbers. Names can be up to 15 characters long, and numbers can be up to 17 characters long. All entries are sorted alphabetically.

- 1. Press at the standby display.
- 2. Press ► to select PHONE DIRECTORY ☐.
- 3. Press -.
- 4. Press ► to select NEW ENTRY ☐, then press ►.

 The cursor moves to the beginning of the NAME line, then starts blinking.
- 5. Select any letter, number, or symbol with the $\bigvee \triangle$ keys.
- 6. Press

 to move the cursor to the next position for character entry.
- When finished entering the name, press
 until the cursor moves to the number entry (__:) line.



The cursor MUST be at the last space of any entry line before it can move to the next line. However, all spaces do not have to be filled.

8. Select the entry type with the **▼**▲ keys.




Entry types are two letter codes that represent the "type" of number you will be entering (PH = Phone, FX = Fax, PG = Pager, etc.).

- 9. Press \longrightarrow , then select the numbers with the $\blacktriangledown \blacktriangle$ keys.
- 10. Press to move the cursor to the next space.
- 11. Once finished, press until the cursor moves to line three.
- 12. Repeat steps eight and nine to enter the type and number. Press to record your entry.
- 13. Press twice to return to the standby display.

Editing the Phone Directory

- At the Function menu, press
 to select
 PHONE DIRECTORY
 , then press
 .
 The first name in the directory displays.
- 2. Press •.
- 3. Press ► to select EDIT ENTRY ☐, then press ►.




Deleting Numbers From the Directory

- 1. At the Function menu, press ► to select PHONE DIRECTORY ☐, then press ►.
- 2. Use the ▲▼ keys to display the entry you wish to delete, then press —.
- 3. Press ► to select DELETE ENTRY Ū, then press ►.
- 4. Press ■.

 PHONE ENTRY DELETED displays.

The Setup Options Menu

There are eight choices in the Setup Options menu:



SETUP OPTIONS

- **Return** Returns to previous/standby menu.
- **Set Time and Date** Sets time and date.
- Folder Labels Changes a folder's character labels.
- Mail Drop Options Sets mail drop options.
- **T** Reminder Alerts you when a new message is not read immediately.
- Quickview Turns Quickview off/on, and controls delay settings.
- Font Size Controls the display font size.
- **Contrast** Controls the display contrast settings.

Setting the Time, Day and Date

- 1. At the Function menu, press

 to select SETUP OPTIONS

 , then press

 .
- 2. Press ► to select SET TIME AND DATE 🕒, then press ►.
- 3. Use the

 keys to select the minutes, 12/24 hr, or day/date mode.

 Change the values with the

 keys.
- 4. Press to store your selection.

Changing Folder Labels

- 1. At the Function menu, press ► to select SETUP OPTIONS ♣, then press ►.
- Press
 to select FOLDER LABELS
 then press
 .
- Press ▼ to select the folder you wish to change, then press ●.
- 4. Highlight the character(s) you wish to change with the keys.
- Change the character with the ▼▲ keys.
- 6. Press when finished.

Mail Drop Options

You can set your pager to scroll selected mail drop messages in a "ticker" fashion across the standby display as they are received.

- 1. At the Function menu, press ➤ to select SETUP OPTIONS ♣, then press ►.
- Press to select MAIL DROP OPTIONS, then press .
- 3. Press ▼ to select the folder, then press ●.
- 4. Press \longrightarrow to select the "alarm off" symbol ($\mbox{$\rlap{\downarrow}$}$).
- When the symbol begins blinking, select an alarm with the ▼▲ key.



If you don't have a maildrop service, only RETURN in the menu displays.

- 6. Press ► (OFF will begin blinking).
- Press ▼ to select ON, then press to enter your selection.

Reminder Function

Your pager will remind you when you have new messages that haven't been checked. To turn this function Off or On, perform the following steps.

- 2. Press **t** to select **REMINDER 1**, then press **.**
- 3. Press to enter your selection.
- Press again, or wait eight seconds to return to the Function menu.

Turning Quickview Off or On

Quickview lets you set your pager to automatically display messages as they are received. To enable or disable this function, perform the following steps.

- At the Function menu, select SETUP OPTIONS, then press
- 2. Press ➤ to select QUICKVIEW 🕻, then press 🥌.
- Select OFF or ON with the ▼▲ keys.
- 4. You can then adjust the scroll speed with the ightharpoons keys.
- Press to enter your selection and return to the Setup Options menu.

Changing the Display Font Size

- 1. At the Function menu, press

 to select SETUP OPTIONS

 to select

 to sel
- 2. Press to select FONT SIZE , then press .
- 3. Select the desired font size with the $\nabla \triangle$ keys.
- 4. Press to enter your selection.

Adjusting The Display Contrast

- 1. At the Function menu, press ► to select SETUP OPTIONS ♣, then press ►.
- 2. Press \longrightarrow to select CONTRAST \square , then press \bigcirc .
- 3. Select the level of contrast with the
 keys.
- 4. Press to enter your selection.

Managing Message Files

There are two types of messages:


- Personal Messages: Your pager holds up to 40 in memory. You can move or delete these messages.
- Information Service (Mail Drop) Messages: Your pager has up to 20 different mail drops. You can add an alert to, move, or delete these messages.



Messages can be stored (Mail Drop and Personal) in up to 10 different Folders. Each folder holds up to 25 messages.

Understanding the Memory Status Reminder

Unread Personal Messages (◆).



• Unread Mail Drop Messages (





If you have unread personal AND mail drop messages, the standby display will flash between CALL and MAIL.

- The CALL display.
- The MAIL display.
- Your pager's memory is FULL. You need to read and/or delete your messages.









Unreadable Messages

If a message is received that is partially or totally unreadable, the unreadable characters are replaced with square dots (\blacksquare) .

Tone Only

A TONE ONLY message has no numeric characters. It could be an unreadable message, an error, or a preset message that alerts you to check your voice mail.

Time and Day Stamp

The time and day stamp is always turned on and appears at the end of each message.

Deleting All Messages That Have Been Read for Personal, Maildrop, and Maildrop History


The cursor appears at the default of YES.

2. Press — and ALL MESSAGES DELETED displays.

Silent Time

You can set a range of time when your pager will not sound any alarms. For example, if you are in a meeting from 8:00 to 10:00 a.m. and do not wish to be disturbed by your pager.

- 1. At the Function menu, press ► to select SET SILENT TIME 🐧, then press ►.
- 2. Press and the cursor jumps to the current start time.
- Change the hour that silent time will begin with the ▼▲ keys.
- 4. When finished setting the hours, move the cursor to the minutes by pressing ►.
- Change the minutes silent time will begin with the ▲▼ keys.
- Press to move the cursor to the ending period for silent time.
- 7. Repeat steps 3, 4, and 5 to set the ending period for silent time.
- 8. Press to return to the standby display.



- Slide the pager into the holster, then press until it snaps into place.
- Use the spring clip (on back of the holster) to attach the holster to your belt or pocket.
- Messages can be viewed while the pager is in the holster.

Care and Maintenance

- Keep your pager dry. If it gets wet, wipe it dry immediately.
- Use and store your pager only in normal temperature environments.
- Keep your pager away from dust and dirt.
- To clean your pager, wipe it with a damp cloth. Never use harsh chemicals.
